INSIDE THE TRIBE

THE GAME

W&M will look to secure its fifth consecutive winning season when it concludes its conference slate at Hampton on Saturday at 1 p.m. The contest will also be W&M's final CAA contest, as it will join the Patriot League next season as an associate member. The game will be televised regionally on Monumental Sports Network and streamed on FloCollege, while fans can also listen to a live audio broadcast over the airwaves locally on The Tide 92.3 FM and 107.9 FM and via the Internet at TideRadio.com.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

Having won four of its last five games, W&M enters Saturday's contest with a 6-4 overall record and a 5-2 mark in conference play. Led by quarterback Tyler Hughes who ranks third in the CAA in passing efficiency (148.0) and has not thrown an interception in his last 262 passing attempts (school record), the Tribe is averaging 30.4 points per game during the last seven contests and leads the nation in fewest turnovers (4). Additionally, W&M is coming off a tremendous performance offensively in last week's win at Campbell when it posted a season-high 505 yards of total offense. Defensively, W&M has forced at least one turnover in 18 of the last 20 contests, while linebacker Luke Banbury ranks fifth nationally in tackles per game (11.3).

SCOUTING THE PIRATES

Currently on a four-game losing streak, Hampton owns a 2-8 overall record and a 0-6 mark in CAA play. HU's wins have come against Elizabeth City State (33-30) and Norfolk State (41-34). Braden Davis has handled the majority of the quarterbacking duties and completed 90-of-146 passes for 970 yards with four touchdowns and seven interceptions, while Jah'Kei Chavis leads the Pirates in rushing with 351 yards and three touchdowns. Defensively, Harold O'Neal III has totaled a team-high 101 tackles with 7.0 TFL.

ABOUT THE SERIES

Saturday's game between W&M and Hampton will mark the 11th meeting between the two programs, as the Tribe has won all 10 of previous matchups. The Tribe is 5-0 versus the Pirates at Armstrong Stadium and earned a 49-7 win at home last season.

■ TEAM NOTES

LAST MEETING

The No. 11/12 W&M rushed for 434 yards and scored 49 unanswered points en route to a dominant 49-7 victory against Hampton in its 2024 CAA opener in front of a Family Weekend crowd of 11,317 at Zable Stadium. Four Tribe players rushed for more than 80 yards to help W&M post the third-best rushing performance in school history. Quarterback Tyler Hughes rushed for a career-high 130 yards (on just three carries) with two touchdowns in the fourth quarter, while running back Bronson Yoder eclipsed 100 yards for the third-consecutive game, finishing with 117 yards on 19 carries and a score. Running back Malachi Imoh also came up big with 95 yards on 12 carries and two touchdowns, as he moved into 10th on W&M's all-time list for rushing touchdown (21). Quarterback Darius Wilson was tremendously efficient and completed 16-of-19 yards for 198 yards with a touchdown, while he rushed for 82 yards on 11 carries with a score.

WINNING SEASONS

With a win at Hampton on Saturday, W&M can secure its fifth consecutive winning season.

The Tribe's last stretch of at least five straight winning campaigns came from 1992-99 when it recorded eight consecutive winning seasons.

END OF AN ERA

Saturday's game at Hampton will mark W&M's final game as a member of CAA Football. Since playing in the conference's inaugural contest versus Delaware in 2007, W&M has won three CAA titles (2010, 2015, 2022).

W&M will join the Patriot League next season as an associate member.

SECOND HALF COMEBACKS

W&M has overcome halftime deficits in four of its wins this season, while three of those have come when it trailed entering the fourth quarter.

Additionally, the Tribe trailed by double digits during the second half in three of those victories (Maine, NC A&T, Campbell). The win at Campbell highlighted the comeback victories, as the Tribe rallied back from 11 down with less than two minutes remaining.

OVERTIME SUCCESS

W&M'S 30-27 overtime victory against marked the Tribe's fourth consecutive win in OT. Overall, W&M has posted a 10-4 record in overtime.

CLOSE CALLS

Six of the Tribe's games have been decided by no more than a score, as it defeated Maine (28-27), NC A&T (38-34), Elon (26-21) and Campbell (30-27, OT), while it was edged by Furman (23-21) and then-No. 20/22 Villanova (31-24).

STACKING WINS

In just his seventh season as head coach at W&M, Coach London already ranks third on the program's all-times wins list (42) and trails only Rube McCray (46) and Jimmye Laycock (249).

W&M Head Coach Mike London earned his

100th career victory with the Tribe's 34-7 win against Charleston Southern. In additions to the victories at W&M, London also accumulated wins as the head coach at Richmond, Virginia and Howard.

LIMITING PENALTIES

W&M is among the nation's least penalized teams this season, as it currently ranks third in fewest penalties per game (3.9) and sixth fewest penalty yards per game (35.0).

TURNOVER MARGIN

In addition to being one of the nation's least penalized teams, W&M is also among the country's best in turnover margin and ranks 15th (+6).

SUCCESS AT HOME

W&M has posted a 5-0 record at home this season and has won 17 of its last 20 games at Zable Stadium during the last four seasons.

W&M ranks second in the CAA and 16th nationally (FCS) in average home attendance (10,431).

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 46-13 record during the last eight seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

During the last five seasons, W&M is 35-10 in such contests.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last eight seasons, W&M is 29-5 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 5-18 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

EARLY LEADS

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 44 of its last 53 games when leading at halftime.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 62-7 record when leading after three quarters.

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

W&M has won 45 of its last 48 games against non-conference FCS opponents during the regular season. The only losses during that span are Lafayette (2012), Colgate (2018) and Furman (2025).

Additionally W&M owns a 48-4 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

Four W&M standouts recently earned preseason All-America honors from various organizations, as cornerback Jalen Jones, offensive lineman Ryan McKenna, linebacker Luke Banbury and fullback/halfback Trey McDonald all garnered national recognition.

PRESEASON ALL-CAA SELECTIONS

Eight W&M standouts earned preseason all-conference honors this year, as cornerback Jalen Jones, defensive lineman Davin Dzidzienyo, linebacker Luke Banbury, fullback/halfback Trey McDonald and punt returner Carson Jenkins garnered first-team distinction, while tight end Sean

McElwain, offensive lineman Ryan McKenna and defensive lineman Ty Gordon earned honorable mention accolades.

The Tribe's three first-team selections on defense were the most of any team in the league.

W&M was picked to finish seventh in the preseason poll.

Both the preseason all-conference team and preseason poll were selected based on a vote by the CAA's 14 head coaches.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are four standouts - DL Davin Dzidzienyo, CB Jalen Jones, TE Trey McDonald and OL Ryan McKenna, who is a two-time team captain.

PATRIOT LEAGUE IN 2026

The 2025 campaign will mark W&M football's final season as a member of CAA Football, as it will join the Patriot League next season as an associate member.

The Patriot League's football members include Bucknell University, Colgate University, Fordham University, Georgetown University, The College of the Holy Cross, Lafayette College, Lehigh University and University of Richmond. Villanova University football will begin play in the Patriot League in 2026.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Six former Tribe standouts were in NFL preseason camps this year - offensive lineman Charles Grant (Raiders), linebacker/defensive end Nate Lynn (Lions), All-Pro long snapper Luke Rhodes (Colts), offensive lineman Bill Murray (Bears), offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal (Lions) and running back Owen Wright (Buccaneers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills).

New York Giants head coach Brian Daboll was an assistant on W&M's staff in 1997, while Washington Commanders head coach Dan Quinn was an assistant with the Tribe in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

500+

W&M's season-high 505 yards of total offense at Campbell marked just the seventh time since 2000 that the Tribe has recorded more than 500 yards in a road game.

LIMITING TURNOVERS

W&M currently leads the nation in fewest turnovers (4) - two interceptions, two fumbles.

INCREASED OFFENSIVE OUTPUT

W&M is averaging 30.4 points per game during its last seven contests and currently ranks fourth in the CAA in scoring (27.8).

PASSING GAME SUCCESS

W&M has thrown for more than 200 yards in seven of the last eight games, averaging 242.5 yards per game through the air during the recent stretch.

GROUND GAME MOMENTUM

After averaging just 130.1 rushing yards per game through the first seven contests, W&M is averaging 195.3 rushing yards per game in its last three matchups.

THIRD DOWN CONVERSIONS

W&M currently ranks third in the CAA and 29th nationally in third down conversion percentage (44.0).

LOTS OF OPTIONS

A season-high 13 different W&M players recorded at least one reception in the win against UAlbany.

In total, 17 Tribe players have recorded a catch this season.

BALANCED PRODUCTION

In addition to scoring at least one touchdown on the ground and through the air in all but one game this season, W&M has found balanced scoring with 18 rushing touchdowns and 16 passing touchdowns.

TDs THROUGH THE AIR

W&M's four touchdown passes in the win against Charleston Southern marked the most by the program since also throwing four in the NCAA Playoff win versus Gardner-Webb in 2022. Additionally, it marked the first time a W&M quarterback (Tyler Hughes) threw four touchdown passes in a game since 2012 versus Old Dominion (Michael Graham).

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 112 times and posted an 100-12 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 60-12 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 16-28 mark in such contests.

However, the Tribe is 4-2 in those games this season.



■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

BALL HAWKS

Dating back to last season, W&M has forced at least one turnover in 18 of the last 20 games.

PASS DEFENSE

During the last two contests, W&M has not allowed a passing touchdown and has limited opponents to just 152.0 yards per game through the air.

W&M currently ranks fifth in the CAA in passing defense (187.0) and has limited a pair of opponents - Maine (97), Charleston Southern (86) - to fewer than 100 passing yards.

SCORING WITH DEFENSE & SPECIAL TEAMS

W&M has totaled seven non-offensive scores this season, highlighted by four in the win against UAlbany - three safeties on blocked punts and a 5-yd TD run on a fake field goal.

Both the three blocked punts and three safeties were one shy of NCAA FCS records. Following the outstanding performance versus UAlbany, W&M (as a team) was honored as the Stats Perform FCS Special Teams Players of the Week.

Dating back to 2007, the Tribe has generated 53 non-offensive touchdowns.

STRONG START TO STRONG FINISHES

After limiting opponents to just six touchdowns and 50 points during the fourth quarter last season, W&M has allowed just three touchdowns in the fourth quarter this season.

Additionally, W&M has allowed just 10 touchdowns during the second half this season.

IMPRESSIVE PERFORMANCES

W&M held three of its opponents to fewer than 250 total yards this season - UAlbany (232), Furman (237), Charleston Southern (239).

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 204 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 16 times.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 103 games, just 35 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.8 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 87 games (1,641 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M is 59-28 at home during that span.

After leading the William & Mary football team to four consecutive winning campaigns for the first time in 25 years, Head Coach Mike London returns for his seventh season at the helm of the Tribe.

W&M ascended as high as No. 10 in the national rankings in 2024, marking the fourth straight season in which the Tribe garnered a national ranking and the third straight year in which it appeared in the top 10.

During the recent stretch of success, London has helped Tribe standouts garner 44 All-CAA honors during the last four seasons, highlighted by 17 first-team selections. Additionally, 17 W&M players have combined to earn 65 All-America honors during London's tenure.

In addition to the numerous accolades, London has overseen the development of six former Tribe standouts who have signed NFL contracts – Charles Grant (Raiders), Nate Lynn (Lions), Colby Sorsdal (Lions), Owen Wright (Ravens), Andrew Trainer (Chargers) and Bill Murray (Patriots).

Numerous achievements highlighted the Tribe's most recent campaign last fall. In addition to extending the program's streak of winning seasons and once again appearing in the national polls, five W&M standouts combined to earn 20 All-America honors – highlighted by offensive lineman Charles Grant, who was a consensus first-team honoree and a third-round draft pick by the Las Vegas Raiders. In addition to Grant, three other standouts earned NFL rookie minicamp invites – Hollis Mathis (Steelers), Marcus Barnes (Bengals) and Matthew Akuchie (Colts) – while 12 members of the Tribe garnered All-CAA accolades.

W&M also continued its tradition of boasting one of the nation's top rushing attacks as it ranked fourth in the country in yards per game on the ground (232.8). Additionally, it marked the second time in the last three seasons W&M ranked among the nation's top four and the fourth-straight year in which it ranked among the top 17.

Members of the squad also excelled in the classroom as 55 standouts earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll recognition during the fall semester.

In 2025 London was honored for the tremendous success on and off the field with the prestigious W&M Plumeri Award, which recognizes and rewards the core values that distinguish outstanding faculty members and coaches who define excellence.

Following a successful 2023 campaign five W&M standouts combined to earn 13 All-America honors, while 10 members of the Tribe garnered All-CAA accolades. Highlighting the impressive group was All-America defensive end Nate Lynn, who signed a free agent contract with the Detroit Lions.

One of the country's top teams defensively, W&M ranked 10th nationally in total defense (303.8), 12th in scoring defense (18.5) and fourth in passing defense (153.5).

Under London's leadership, W&M catapulted to the national forefront in 2022 as it secured a share of the CAA title, earned a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Playoffs and advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals. Additionally, W&M equaled a school record for wins (11) and posted program records for regular season victories (10) and road triumphs (6). Highlighting the wins were three victories against nationally ranked opponents and a lopsided season-

opening triumph at FBS opponent Charlotte.

W&M's success was recognized at the national level, as London was selected as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, which honors the FCS National Coach of the Year, and finished fourth in the final voting. Additionally, London was selected as the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Richmond and the VaSID (Virginia Sports Information Directors) Coach of the Year.

In addition to the team's success, a number of Tribe standouts were recognized with national honors for their outstanding individual contributions. Highlighting an impressive group of six players who earned All-America recognition were linebacker John Pius, offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal and cornerback Jalen Jones. Pius was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award (FCS National Defensive Player of the Year) and finished second in the final voting, while Jones was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award (FCS Freshman of the Year). Sorsdal garnered consensus All-America distinction and was invited to the East-West Shrine Bowl before being selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

Additionally, 13 Tribe standouts combined to earn 15 all-conference honors, highlighted by a school-record tying seven first-team selections, including the CAA Defensive Player of the Year, John Pius, and the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year, Jalen Jones.

W&M also rewrote its record book in 2022, as it set single-season school records for rushing yards (3,455), rushing yards per game (265.8) and rushing yards per carry (5.9). Additionally, the Tribe's points per game (33.5), rushing touchdowns (35) and total yards per game (448.8) all ranked among the program's top five. Defensively, W&M's 33 sacks also ranked as the seventh-best total in school history.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmie Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

Prior to his two-year stint at HU, London served as an associate head coach/defensive line coach at the University of Maryland in 2016 where he helped lead the Terps to an appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.
