INSIDE THE TRIBE

THE GAME

W&M will begin a new era of the program's storied history when it opens the 2026 season as a member of the Patriot League with a conference matchup at No. 8/7 Villanova on Friday at 6 p.m. The contest will also be Villanova's inaugural game as a member of the PL. The contest will be broadcast on ESPN+, while fans can also listen to a live audio broadcast over the airwaves locally on The Tide 92.3 FM and 107.9 FM and via the Internet at TideRadio.com.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

W&M enters the 2026 campaign having posted five consecutive winning seasons, marking the program's longest stretch of winning ledgers since the 1990s. Picked to finish tied for third in the Patriot League by the conference's head coaches, the Tribe is receiving votes in both national polls. Leading W&M will be a quartet of preseason all-conference standouts in TE Sean McElwain, DL Davin Dzidzienyo, DB Bryce Barnes and special teams non-specialist Stephon Hicks. W&M, which will open on the road for the fifth time in the last six seasons, will look to secure a season-opening win for the fourth time in the last five years.

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

Chosen as the Patriot League preseason favorites by the conference's head coaches, No. 8/7 Villanova is coming off a 12-3 campaign in 2025 in which it advanced to the NCAA Semifinals. The Wildcats are led by a quintet of preseason all-conference honorees – RB Ja'brriel Mace, OL Chris McCullers, WR Braden Reed, LB Omari Bursey and DL Capri Martin.

NEW ERA, FAMILIAR FOE

Although W&M enters its first season in the Patriot League, it will do so against a familiar conference opponent in Villanova. Both programs previously competed as members of the CAA prior to this season, and Friday's game will mark the 39th meeting between the long-time rivals. The Tribe owns a 20-17-1 all-time record against the Wildcats. After losing six consecutive contests to VU from 2005-09, W&M has won six of the last 10 matchups.

■ TEAM NOTES

LAST MEETING

W&M nearly rallied back from a two-touchdown deficit late in the fourth quarter but fell at No. 20/22 Villanova, 31-24, on Sept. 27, 2025. After quarterback Tyler Hughes narrowed the margin to a single score with a 1-yard touchdown run at 4:38 remaining, W&M reclaimed possession following a missed 36-yard field goal by Villanova's Jack Barnum with 1:05 left. The Tribe drove to midfield but time expired before it could advance into Wildcat territory. W&M led 17-14 at halftime, but VU rattled off 17 consecutive points before Hughes' late score. Villanova's Ja'briel Mace opened the third quarter with a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, while David Avit's third rushing touchdown of the afternoon early in the fourth quarter punctuated the Wildcats' scoring.

RUSHING DEFENSE IS KEY

A key to the Tribe's last six victories against Villanova has been its ability to slow down the Wildcats' rushing attack, as it has allowed just 116.8 rushing yards per game (701 yds). Conversely, the Tribe has allowed 182.3 rushing yards per game (574 yds) in its last two losses versus VU.

NATIONAL RANKING

Although not ranked in either of the two major national preseason polls, W&M received votes in both the media poll and coaches poll.

TOP-10 WIN

With a win at No. 8/7 Villanova, W&M will secure its first victory against a top-10 opponent since defeating No. 6 Delaware in 2022. The Tribe's last road win against a top-10 opponent came at No. 4 Villanova in 2021.

SEASON OPENERS

W&M will look to secure a season-opening win for the fourth time in the last five years when it travels to Villanova on Friday. The Tribe began the fall with victories at Charlotte (2022), at Campbell (2023) and vs. VMI (2024), winning by an average margin of 20.3. Additionally, it scored 38.7 points per game in those victories. The lone season-opening setback during the recent stretch came last year at Furman, 23-21. Excluding the three-game spring season in 2021, W&M has won five of its last seven season openers.

OPENING ON THE ROAD

Friday's game at Villanova will mark the fifth time in the last six seasons W&M has opened its season on the road.

CONFERENCE OPENERS

W&M will look to open its conference slate with a victory for the fourth consecutive season. Friday's game will mark the sixth time in the last nine seasons that the Tribe has begun league play on the road.

PRESEASON ALL-PATRIOT LEAGUE

Four W&M standouts earned preseason all-conference honors this year, as TE Sean McElwain,

DL Davin Dzidzienyo, DB Bryce Barnes and special teams non-specialist Stephon Hicks earned the distinction.

The Patriot League's preseason poll was also announced and the Tribe was picked to finish tied for third. Both the preseason all-conference team and preseason poll were selected based on a vote by the league's 10 head coaches.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

In just eight seasons as head coach at W&M, Coach London already ranks third on the program's all-times wins list (43) and trails only Rube McCray (46) and Jimmie Laycock (249). W&M Head Coach Mike London earned his 100th career victory with the Tribe's 34-7 win against Charleston Southern last season. In additions to the victories at W&M, London also accumulated wins as the head coach at Richmond, Virginia and Howard.

COACHING CONTINUITY

In addition to building a winning culture and piling up the victories, Head Coach Mike London has also built extraordinary continuity among his coaching staff as all 10 of his full-time assistants from last season returned this fall.

WINNING FOOTBALL

After posting a 7-5 record in 2025, W&M secured its fifth consecutive winning season. The Tribe's last stretch of at least five straight winning campaigns came from 1992-99 when it recorded eight consecutive winning seasons.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are three standouts - DL Davin Dzidzienyo, TE Sean McElwain and LB Harrison Johnson. Dzidzienyo is a two-time team captain.

ESPN+

Tribe football fans will have an exciting new way to follow the action this season as 10 W&M games are scheduled to be broadcast on ESPN+. In addition to all nine of W&M's Patriot League contests, the Tribe's non-conference home matchup versus Delaware State will also air on the platform.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Six former Tribe standouts were in NFL preseason camps this year - OL Charles Grant (Las Vegas Raiders), LB Nate Lynn (New York Jets), OL Bill Murray (Los Angeles Rams), all-pro long snapper Luke Rhodes (Indianapolis Colts), OL Colby Sorsdal (Detroit Lions) and RB Owen Wright (Houston Texans). In addition to the impressive list of active players, a number of former W&M student-athletes and assistant coaches are also currently on NFL coaching staffs, highlighted by Buffalo Bills Head Coach Joe Brady '13. A pair of NFL head coaches last season - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills) - played football at W&M, while current Washington Commanders head coach Dan Quinn was an assistant with the Tribe in 1994 and former New York Giants head coach Brian Daboll was an assistant on W&M's staff in 1997. Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head

coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

LOU HOLTZ TRIBUTE

W&M will honor legendary former Tribe head coach Lou Holtz during its home opener against Delaware State at Zable Stadium on Sept. 5.

A member of the College Football Hall of Fame, Holtz's first head coaching job was at W&M from 1969-71 and helped launch an incredible career that included stints at NC State, Arkansas, Minnesota, Notre Dame and South Carolina - as well as a season in the NFL with the New York Jets. Prior to becoming the Tribe's head coach, he served a three-year stint as an assistant with the program from 1961-63.

One of the greatest coaches in college football history, Holtz was elected to the College Football Hall of Fame in 2008 and awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2020.

VOICE OF THE TRIBE

Longtime voice of the Tribe Jay Colley is closing in on a remarkable milestone, as he will broadcast his 500th W&M football game when the Tribe plays at Duke on Sept. 26. Since securing the mic in 1982, Colley has missed just three games (and both Bowl games played in Japan).

LIMITING PENALTIES

W&M ranked among the nation's least penalized teams last season, as it was sixth in fewest penalties per game (4.2) and seventh in fewest penalty yards per game (38.3).

TURNOVER MARGIN

In addition to being one of the nation's least penalized teams in 2025, W&M also ranked among the country's best in turnover margin and ranked 18th (+6).

SUCCESS AT HOME

W&M has posted a 5-1 record at home last season and has won 17 of its last 21 games at Zable Stadium during the last four seasons enter the 2026 campaign.

OVERTIME SUCCESS

W&M'S 30-27 overtime victory against Campbell last season marked the Tribe's fourth consecutive win in OT. Overall, W&M has posted a 10-4 record in overtime.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

Entering the 2026 campaign, W&M owns an 47-14 record during the last eight seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

During the last five seasons, W&M is 36-11 in such contests.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last eight seasons entering this fall, W&M is 29-5 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 5-18 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

EARLY LEADS

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 45 of its last 55 games when leading at halftime.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 63-7 record when leading after three quarters.

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

W&M has won 45 of its last 48 games against non-conference FCS opponents during the regular season. The only losses during that span are Lafayette (2012), Colgate (2018) and Furman (2025).

Additionally W&M owns a 48-4 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

NEW LOOK

W&M's offense will feature six players making their first career starts at Villanova on Friday - QB Carter Carroll or Winston Watkins, WR Alfred Honesty, WR Kai Austin, LG James Spainhour, C Charles Stewart and RT Matt McElwain.

Additionally, RB Andrew King will make his first start at W&M after earning one start during his first two seasons at Richmond.

DYNAMIC DUO AT TIGHT END

W&M boasts perhaps the best tight end duo in the country, as all-conference standouts Sean McElwain and Jackson Blee return this season.

During the preseason, HERO Sports ranked McElwain as the nation's sixth-best tight end and Blee as the 10th-best.

FOOTBALL FAMILY

W&M's starting offense will feature siblings this week, as all-conference TE Sean McElwain will be joined by his brother Matt, who will be making his first career start at RT.

FIRST START AT QB

Regardless of who earns the starting quarterback role at Villanova, Carter Carroll or Winston Watkins will make their first career start on Friday. Carroll, a record-setting quarterback at Boston College HS, did not play during his freshman year, while Watkins transferred from Towson after appearing in 11 games as a reserve the past two seasons.

RUNNING BACK TANDEM

After a pair of transfers led W&M's running back room last season - Rashad Raymond and Tariq Sims - another dynamic duo joined the Tribe during the offseason and enter the fall atop the depth chart. Andrew King comes to W&M from Richmond, where he totaled 586 total yards and five touchdowns during the past two seasons, while Jah'Kei Chavis led Hampton in rushing last year with 354 rushing yards and three touchdowns.



OLINE OUTLOOK

While LT Kamron Frye and RG Hayden Raley both enter their third seasons as starters, the Tribe's other top three offensive linemen - LG James Spainhour, C Charles Stewart and RT Matt McElwain - will all make their first career starts at Villanova.

BREAKOUT CANDIDATES AT WR

Although W&M will replace its top five wide receivers in terms of yardage production from last season, the wide receiving corps features a number of talented players who are expected to make an impact. Carson Jenkins was a first-team all-conference punt returner in 2024 before missing most of last season with an injury. Alfred Honesty also showed flashed in the three games he appeared last season, averaging 18.7 yards per catch, while Kai Austin contributed as well in limited action as a freshman in 2025.

LIMITING TURNOVERS

W&M led the nation last season in fewest turnovers (6) - three interceptions, three fumbles.

STRONG FINISH TO 2025

W&M averaged 35.7 points per game during its final four games last season.

BALANCED PRODUCTION

In addition to scoring at least one touchdown on the ground and through the air in all but two games last season, W&M found balanced scoring with 22 rushing touchdowns and 21 passing touchdowns.

TDs THROUGH THE AIR

W&M's 21 touchdown passes last season were the program's most since 2008 (24).

RED ZONE EFFICIENCY

W&M was among the nation's most productive teams in the red zone last season and ranked ninth in the country in red zone conversion percentage, scoring on 91.1 percent of its trips inside its opponents' 20-yard line.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 113 times and posted an 101-12 record in those contests. Additionally, W&M is 61-12 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 16-28 mark in such contests.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

DEPTH ON THE DLINE

W&M boasts an extremely talented, experienced and deep defensive line this season. Led by team captain and preseason all-conference honoree DE Davin Dzidzienyo, the projected starters also feature DE Ty Gordon and NT Gerald Williams. Gordon, a former freshman All-America, enters his third season as a starter and has totaled 10 sacks the past two seasons. Williams was limited to just four games last season because of injury, but he started seven of the nine games he played in 2024. The talented group also features Brady Echols, who started all 12 games last fall en route to earning freshman All-America distinction.

BALL HAWKS

Dating back to 2024, W&M has forced at least one turnover in 20 of the last 22 games.

PASS DEFENSE

W&M ranked among the nation's best in passing defense last season, as it allowed just 179.8 yards per game through the air - a figure that ranked 15th in the country.

SCORING WITH DEFENSE & SPECIAL TEAMS

W&M totaled eight non-offensive scores last season, highlighted by four in the win against UAlbany - three safeties on blocked punts and a 5-yd TD run on a fake field goal.

Both the three blocked punts and three safeties were one shy of NCAA FCS records. Following the outstanding performance versus UAlbany, W&M (as a team) was honored as the Stats Perform FCS Special Teams Players of the Week.

Dating back to 2007, the Tribe has generated 54 non-offensive touchdowns.

LEADING THE NATION

After blocking a punt - that was returned for a touchdown - in the late-season win at Hampton last fall, W&M concluded the 2025 campaign ranked first nationally in blocked punts (6).

FORCING FUMBLES

W&M was extremely effective in forcing fumbles last season, as it totaled 10.

STRONG FINISHES

Dating back to the beginning of the 2024 season (24 games), W&M has allowed just 11 touchdowns during the fourth quarter.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 206 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 16 times.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 105 games, just 36 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

After leading the William & Mary football team to five consecutive winning campaigns for the first time in nearly three decades, Head Coach Mike London returns for his eighth season at the helm of the Tribe.

In just seven seasons, London has already established himself as one of the most successful head coaches in the program's 132-year history. In addition to ranking as the third-winningest head coach at W&M (43) and earning 105 career victories, he has helped the Tribe break into the national rankings four of the past five seasons. Additionally, W&M ascended into the nation's top 10 three of the last four years.

During the recent stretch of success, which includes an appearance in the 2022 NCAA Quarterfinals, London has helped Tribe standouts garner 55 All-CAA honors during the last five seasons, highlighted by 21 first-team selections. Additionally, 22 W&M players have combined to earn 81 All-America honors during London's tenure.

In addition to the numerous accolades, London has overseen the development of six former Tribe standouts who have signed NFL contracts – Charles Grant (Raiders), Nate Lynn (Lions), Colby Sorsdal (Lions), Owen Wright (Ravens), Andrew Trainer (Chargers) and Bill Murray (Patriots).

Numerous achievements highlighted the Tribe's most recent campaign last fall. In addition to extending the program's streak of winning seasons and securing his 100th career victory as a head coach in the triumph against Charleston Southern, six W&M standouts combined to earn 16 All-America honors – highlighted by a pair of finalists for the Buck Buchanan Award, Jalen Jones and Luke Banbury, who earned NFL Rookie minicamp invites with the Commanders and Ravens, respectively. The duo was also among a group of 11 Tribe players who earned All-CAA accolades, including four first-team selections.

Collectively, W&M led the nation in fewest turnovers (6) in 2025 and ranked among the country's top 10 in fewest penalties per game and fewest penalty yards per game.

The 2024 campaign marked W&M's fourth consecutive winning season. Five Tribe standouts combined to earn 20 All-America honors – highlighted by offensive lineman Charles Grant, who was a consensus first-team honoree and a third-round draft pick by the Las Vegas Raiders. In addition to Grant, three other standouts earned NFL rookie minicamp invites – Hollis Mathis (Steelers), Marcus Barnes (Bengals) and Matthew Akuchie (Colts) – while 12 members of the Tribe garnered All-CAA accolades.

W&M also continued its tradition of boasting one of the nation's top rushing attacks as it ranked fourth in the country in yards per game on the ground (232.8). Additionally, it marked the second time in the last three seasons W&M ranked among the nation's top four and the fourth-straight year in which it ranked among the top 17.

London was honored for the tremendous success on and off the field with the prestigious W&M Plumeri Award following the 2024 season, as the honor recognizes and rewards the core values that distinguish outstanding faculty members and coaches who define excellence.

Following a successful 2023 campaign five W&M standouts combined to earn 13 All-America honors, while 10 members of the Tribe garnered All-CAA accolades. Highlighting the impressive group was All-America defensive end Nate Lynn, who signed a free agent contract with the Detroit Lions.

One of the country's top teams defensively, W&M ranked 10th nationally in total defense (303.8), 12th in scoring defense (18.5) and fourth in passing defense (153.5).

Under London's leadership, W&M catapulted to the national forefront in 2022 as it secured a share of the CAA title, earned a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Playoffs and advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals. Additionally, W&M equaled a school record for wins (11) and posted program records for regular season victories (10) and road triumphs (6). Highlighting the wins were three victories against nationally ranked opponents and a lopsided season-opening triumph at FBS opponent Charlotte.

W&M's success was recognized at the national level, as London was selected as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, which honors the FCS National Coach of the Year, and finished fourth in the final voting. Additionally, London was selected as the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Richmond and the VaSID (Virginia Sports Information Directors) Coach of the Year.

In addition to the team's success, a number of Tribe standouts were recognized with national honors for their outstanding individual contributions. Highlighting an impressive group of six players who earned All-America recognition were linebacker John Pius, offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal and cornerback Jalen Jones. Pius was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award (FCS National Defensive Player of the Year) and finished second in the final voting, while Jones was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award (FCS Freshman of the Year). Sorsdal garnered consensus All-America distinction and was invited to the East-West Shrine Bowl before being selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

Additionally, 13 Tribe standouts combined to earn 15 all-conference honors, highlighted by a school-record tying seven first-team selections, including the CAA Defensive Player of the Year, John Pius, and the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year, Jalen Jones.

W&M also rewrote its record book in 2022, as it set single-season school records for rushing yards (3,455), rushing yards per game (265.8) and rushing yards per carry (5.9). Additionally, the Tribe's points per game (33.5), rushing touchdowns (35) and total yards per game (448.8) all ranked among the program's top five. Defensively, W&M's 33 sacks also ranked as the seventh-best total in school history.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmie Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).
