THE GAME

No. 16 W&M will look to improve to 3-0 for the third time in the last five seasons when it plays at No. 9/8 Lehigh on Saturday at 2 p.m. The contest will be the Tribe's second road game against a top-10 opponent this season, as it won at then-No. 8/7 Villanova in its opener. The contest will be streamed on ESPN+, while fans can also listen to a live audio broadcast over the airwaves locally on The Tide 92.3 FM and 107.9 FM and via the Internet at TideRadio.com.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

After earning a 22-15 win against Delaware State in its last outing, W&M ascended to No. 16 in both national polls this week. The Tribe has forced 10 turnovers through the first two games and leads the nation in the category, while its +8 turnover margin is also the country's best. In addition leading the nation with six interceptions, W&M also leads the Patriot League and ranks 10th nationally in team passing efficiency defense (121.4) and has allowed just one passing touchdown.

SCOUTING THE MOUNTAIN HAWKS

Off to a 2-0 start with lopsided wins against Holy Cross and Georgetown, Lehigh enters Saturday's contest ranked No. 9/8 nationally. The Mountain Hawks currently rank fifth nationally in rushing (291.5) and are also among the country's top 10 in passing efficiency (182.4). Additionally, LU is allowing just 12.0 points per game – a figure that ranks eighth nationally.

ABOUT THE SERIES

W&M leads the all-time series against Lehigh, 8-1, and has won three of the four games played in Bethlehem. The Tribe won the last meeting, 26-13, at Zable Stadium in 1992, while Lehigh claimed the last matchup in Bethlehem, 41-37, in 1991. All nine previous matchups came in consecutive years, spanning from 1984-92.

■ TEAM NOTES

TOUGH COMPETITION

Saturday's game at No. 9/8 Lehigh will mark the second time in the first three weeks that W&M has gone on the road to play a top-10 opponent.

The Tribe opened its season with a 35-32 win at then-No. 8/7 Villanova on Aug. 29, which marked the program's first road win against a top-10 opponent since defeating the No. 4 Wildcats in 2021.

Additionally, it was the Tribe's first victory against a top-10 opponent since defeating No. 6 Delaware in 2022.

W&M last earned multiple wins against top-10 opponents in 2010 (3), while it has never recorded multiple road victories against top-10 opponents during the same season.

RISING IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

With last week's win against Delaware State, W&M ascended to No. 16 in both the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 Poll and in the AFCA FCS Coaches Top 25 Poll.

It marks the Tribe's highest ranking in both national polls since 2024.

STRONG START

W&M will look to improve to 3-0 for the third time in the last five years when it squares off against Lehigh this Saturday.

The Tribe last opened its season with three straight wins in 2023 when it won its first four contests.

TURNOVER MARGIN

In addition to being one of the nation's least penalized teams in 2025, W&M also ranked among the country's best in turnover margin and ranked 18th (+6).

The Tribe has continued that trend this season and currently leads the nation with a +8 turnover margin through two games.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last nine seasons, W&M is 31-5 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 5-18 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 49-14 record during the last nine seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

During the last six seasons, W&M is 38-11 in such contests.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

In just nine seasons as head coach at W&M, Coach London already ranks third on the program's all-times wins list (45) and trails only Rube McCray (46) and Jimmye Laycock (249).

W&M Head Coach Mike London earned his 100th career victory with the Tribe's 34-7 win against Charleston Southern last season. In additions to the victories at W&M, London also accumulated wins as the head coach at Richmond, Virginia and Howard.

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

W&M has won 46 of its last 49 games against non-conference FCS opponents during the regular season. The only losses during that span are Lafayette (2012), Colgate (2018) and Furman (2025).

Additionally W&M owns a 49-4 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

SUCCESS AT HOME

After earning a 22-15 win against Delaware State in its home opener, W&M has now won 18 of its last 22 games at Zable Stadium during the last five seasons.

EARLY LEADS

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 46 of its last 56 games when leading at halftime.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 65-7 record when leading after three quarters.

COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

W&M earned one of its most remarkable comeback victories in the program's 133 history in the season-opening win at then-No. 8/7 Villanova. The Tribe scored 13 points in the final 0:53 to rally back from a 10-point deficit in the final minute. Kicker Max Lipinski connected on a career-long 45-yard field goal as time expired after safety Cade Ellis set up the game-winning score with his second interception of the contest. Following a successful onside kick by Sam Braidwood (recovered by Jackson Blee), quarterback Winston Watkins connected on a 37-yard touchdown pass to Kai Austin with 0:22 remaining to even the score.

SECOND HALF COMEBACKS

W&M's comeback win at Villanova marked the fourth time during the last two seasons that the Tribe has rallied back from a double-digit second half deficit.

NATIONAL ATTENTION

Numerous national media outlets took notice of W&M's Patriot League debut and highlighted the Tribe's season-opening win at No. 8/7 Villanova.

In addition to earning more than 4 million views on SportsCenter X account, the game generated an audience of 43.5 million online impressions on various media outlets, including ESPN, The New York Times, CNN and Yahoo.

NATIONAL HONORS

A trio of Tribe standouts earned weekly honors after posting tremendous season-opening performances in the win at No. 8/7 Villanova. Kicker Max Lipinski was honored as the Stats Perform FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week and the Patriot League Special Teams Player of the Week. Safety Cade Ellis was honored as the Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week and Rookie of the Week, while he also earned Stats Perform FCS National Rookie of the Week honorable mention distinction. Quarterback Winston Watkins earned Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week honorable mention accolades.

PRESEASON ALL-PATRIOT LEAGUE

Four W&M standouts earned preseason all-conference honors this year, as TE Sean McElwain, DL Davin Dzidzienyo, DB Bryce Barnes and special teams non-specialist Stephon Hicks earned the distinction.

The Patriot League's preseason poll was also announced and the Tribe was picked to finish tied for third. Both the preseason all-conference team and preseason poll were selected based on a vote by the league's 10 head coaches.

COACHING CONTINUITY

In addition to building a winning culture and piling up the victories, Head Coach Mike London has also built extraordinary continuity among his coaching staff as all 10 of his full-time assistants from last season returned this fall.

WINNING FOOTBALL

After posting a 7-5 record in 2025, W&M secured its fifth consecutive winning season.

The Tribe's last stretch of at least five straight winning campaigns came from 1992-99 when it recorded eight consecutive winning seasons.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are three standouts - DL Davin Dzidzienyo, TE Sean McElwain and LB Harrison Johnson. Dzidzienyo is a two-time team captain.

ESPN+

Tribe football fans will have an exciting new way to follow the action this season as 11 W&M games are scheduled to be broadcast on ESPN+. In addition to all nine of W&M's Patriot League contests, the Tribe's non-conference matchups versus Delaware State and NC Central will also air on the platform.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Six former Tribe standouts were in NFL preseason camps this year - OL Charles Grant (Las Vegas Raiders), LB Nate Lynn (New York Jets), OL Bill Murray (Los Angeles Rams), all-pro long snapper Luke Rhodes (Indianapolis Colts), OL Colby Sorsdal (Detroit Lions) and RB Owen Wright (Houston Texans). Grant, Murray and Rhodes made the initial 53-man rosters, while Lynn signed to the Jets practice squad.

In addition to the impressive list of active players, a number of former W&M student-athletes and assistant coaches are also currently on NFL coaching staffs, highlighted by Buffalo Bills Head Coach Joe Brady '13.

A pair of NFL head coaches last season - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills) - played football at W&M, while current Washington Commanders head coach Dan Quinn was an assistant with the Tribe in 1994 and former New York Giants head coach Brian Daboll was an assistant on W&M's staff in 1997.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

VOICE OF THE TRIBE

Longtime voice of the Tribe Jay Colley is closing in on a remarkable milestone, as he will broadcast his 500th W&M football game when the Tribe plays at Duke on Sept. 26. Since securing the mic in 1982, Colley has missed just three games (and both Bowl games played in Japan).

OVERTIME SUCCESS

W&M'S 30-27 overtime victory against Campbell last season marked the Tribe's fourth consecutive win in OT. Overall, W&M has posted a 10-4 record in overtime.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

PATRIOT LEAGUE ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

After helping lead W&M to a 22-15 win against Delaware State, freshman wide receiver Khyliil Johnson was honored as the Patriot League Rookie of the Week. Johnson totaled a team-best four catches for 83 yards, highlighted by a 63-yard reception that set up the Tribe's first score.

RED ZONE EFFICIENCY

W&M was among the nation's most productive teams in the red zone last season and ranked ninth in the country in red zone conversion percentage, scoring on 91.1 percent of its trips inside its opponents' 20-yard line.

Through two games, the Tribe has scored on six of its seven trips into the red zone.

3 SCORES IN 53 SECONDS

En route to securing its thrilling comeback win in the season opener at Villanova, W&M accomplished a rare feat - scoring three times in the final 53 seconds. A 40-yard field goal by Max Lipinski got things started, and after Jackson Blee recovered Sam Braidwood's ensuing onside kick, QB Winston Watkins connected with Kai Austin on a 37-yard touchdown pass with just 0:22 remaining. Moments later safety Cade Ellis recorded his second interception of the contest, returning it 24 yards to set up Lipinski's game-winning, career-long 45-yard field goal as time expired.

BIG PLAYS

A key to the Tribe's offensive success in the win at Villanova was its ability to produce big plays, as W&M recorded four plays of at least 34 yards. The longest came on a 68-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Winston Watkins to wideout Carson Jenkins in the first quarter to get W&M on the scoreboard, while Watkins' game-tying pass to Kai Austin with 0:22 remaining in the fourth quarter covered 37 yards.

The Tribe also registered a 63-yard strike in the win against Delaware State, as Winston Watkins connected with Khyliil Johnson during W&M's first scoring drive.

IMPRESSIVE DEBUT

Quarterback Winston Watkins was outstanding in his W&M debut in the season-opening win at Villanova, as the junior completed 19-of-33 passes



for 254 yards with two touchdowns in his first-career start. Additionally, he rushed for a team-high 72 yards with a touchdown en route to earning Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week honorable mention distinction.

AIR ATTACK

In addition to Watkins' impressive performance at quarterback, a trio of wide receivers were outstanding in W&M's season-opening win at Villanova. Kai Austin, who made his first career start, led the team with four catches for 76 yards - highlighted by his 37-yard game-tying touchdown with 0:22 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Freshman Khyllil Johnson also came up big with four receptions for 75 yards, while senior Carson Jenkins hauled in his first-career touchdown reception - a 68-yard catch in the first quarter.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 113 times and posted an 101-12 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 61-12 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

DYNAMIC DUO AT TIGHT END

W&M boasts perhaps the best tight end duo in the country, as all-conference standouts Sean McElwain and Jackson Blee return this season.

During the preseason, HERO Sports ranked McElwain as the nation's sixth-best tight end and Blee as the 10th-best.

FOOTBALL FAMILY

W&M's starting offense features siblings this week, as all-conference TE Sean McElwain will be joined by his brother Matt, who made his first career start in the season-opening win at Villanova.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

LEADING THE NATION

W&M currently leads the nation (FCS & FBS) in forced turnovers, as its 10 are three more than the next best team in the FCS.

Additionally, W&M's six interceptions are No. 1 nationally, while its four recovered fumbles are tied for first in the country.

BALL HAWKS

Dating back to 2024, W&M has forced at least one turnover in 22 of the last 24 games.

FOURTH DOWN STOPS

W&M has successfully stopped opponents on fourth down this season, limiting the opposition to just a 25 percent success rate (1-of-4).

NO FLY ZONE

In addition to totaling a nation-leading six interceptions, W&M leads the Patriot League and ranks 10th nationally in team passing efficiency defense (121.4).

RED ZONE DEFENSE

Through the first two games, W&M has not allowed any points in the third quarter.

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 107 games, just 36 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

This season, W&M has allowed just one touchdown pass through the air.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 208 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 16 times.

SCORING WITH DEFENSE & SPECIAL TEAMS

W&M totaled eight non-offensive scores last season, highlighted by four in the win against UAlbany - three safeties on blocked punts and a 5-yd TD run on a fake field goal.

Both the three blocked punts and three safeties were one shy of NCAA FCS records. Following the outstanding performance versus UAlbany, W&M (as a team) was honored as the Stats Perform FCS Special Teams Players of the Week.

Dating back to 2007, the Tribe has generated 54 non-offensive touchdowns.

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.9 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 89 games (1,684 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M is 60-29 at home during that span.

After leading the William & Mary football team to five consecutive winning campaigns for the first time in nearly three decades, Head Coach Mike London returns for his eighth season at the helm of the Tribe.

In just seven seasons, London has already established himself as one of the most successful head coaches in the program's 132-year history. In addition to ranking as the third-winningest head coach at W&M (43) and earning 105 career victories, he has helped the Tribe break into the national rankings four of the past five seasons. Additionally, W&M ascended into the nation's top 10 three of the last four years.

During the recent stretch of success, which includes an appearance in the 2022 NCAA Quarterfinals, London has helped Tribe standouts garner 55 All-CAA honors during the last five seasons, highlighted by 21 first-team selections. Additionally, 22 W&M players have combined to earn 81 All-America honors during London's tenure.

In addition to the numerous accolades, London has overseen the development of six former Tribe standouts who have signed NFL contracts – Charles Grant (Raiders), Nate Lynn (Lions), Colby Sorsdal (Lions), Owen Wright (Ravens), Andrew Trainer (Chargers) and Bill Murray (Patriots).

Numerous achievements highlighted the Tribe's most recent campaign last fall. In addition to extending the program's streak of winning seasons and securing his 100th career victory as a head coach in the triumph against Charleston Southern, six W&M standouts combined to earn 16 All-America honors – highlighted by a pair of finalists for the Buck Buchanan Award, Jalen Jones and Luke Banbury, who earned NFL Rookie minicamp invites with the Commanders and Ravens, respectively. The duo was also among a group of 11 Tribe players who earned All-CAA accolades, including four first-team selections.

Collectively, W&M led the nation in fewest turnovers (6) in 2025 and ranked among the country's top 10 in fewest penalties per game and fewest penalty yards per game.

The 2024 campaign marked W&M's fourth consecutive winning season. Five Tribe standouts combined to earn 20 All-America honors – highlighted by offensive lineman Charles Grant, who was a consensus first-team honoree and a third-round draft pick by the Las Vegas Raiders. In addition to Grant, three other standouts earned NFL rookie minicamp invites – Hollis Mathis (Steelers), Marcus Barnes (Bengals) and Matthew Akuchie (Colts) – while 12 members of the Tribe garnered All-CAA accolades.

W&M also continued its tradition of boasting one of the nation's top rushing attacks as it ranked fourth in the country in yards per game on the ground (232.8). Additionally, it marked the second time in the last three seasons W&M ranked among the nation's top four and the fourth-straight year in which it ranked among the top 17.

London was honored for the tremendous success on and off the field with the prestigious W&M Plumeri Award following the 2024 season, as the honor recognizes and rewards the core values that distinguish outstanding faculty members and coaches who define excellence.

Following a successful 2023 campaign five W&M standouts combined to earn 13 All-America honors, while 10 members of the Tribe garnered All-CAA accolades. Highlighting the impressive group was All-America defensive end Nate Lynn, who signed a free agent contract with the Detroit Lions.

One of the country's top teams defensively, W&M ranked 10th nationally in total defense (303.8), 12th in scoring defense (18.5) and fourth in passing defense (153.5).

Under London's leadership, W&M catapulted to the national forefront in 2022 as it secured a share of the CAA title, earned a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Playoffs and advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals. Additionally, W&M equaled a school record for wins (11) and posted program records for regular season victories (10) and road triumphs (6). Highlighting the wins were three victories against nationally ranked opponents and a lopsided season-opening triumph at FBS opponent Charlotte.

W&M's success was recognized at the national level, as London was selected as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, which honors the FCS National Coach of the Year, and finished fourth in the final voting. Additionally, London was selected as the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Richmond and the VaSID (Virginia Sports Information Directors) Coach of the Year.

In addition to the team's success, a number of Tribe standouts were recognized with national honors for their outstanding individual contributions. Highlighting an impressive group of six players who earned All-America recognition were linebacker John Pius, offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal and cornerback Jalen Jones. Pius was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award (FCS National Defensive Player of the Year) and finished second in the final voting, while Jones was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award (FCS Freshman of the Year). Sorsdal garnered consensus All-America distinction and was invited to the East-West Shrine Bowl before being selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

Additionally, 13 Tribe standouts combined to earn 15 all-conference honors, highlighted by a school-record tying seven first-team selections, including the CAA Defensive Player of the Year, John Pius, and the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year, Jalen Jones.

W&M also rewrote its record book in 2022, as it set single-season school records for rushing yards (3,455), rushing yards per game (265.8) and rushing yards per carry (5.9). Additionally, the Tribe's points per game (33.5), rushing touchdowns (35) and total yards per game (448.8) all ranked among the program's top five. Defensively, W&M's 33 sacks also ranked as the seventh-best total in school history.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmie Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).
