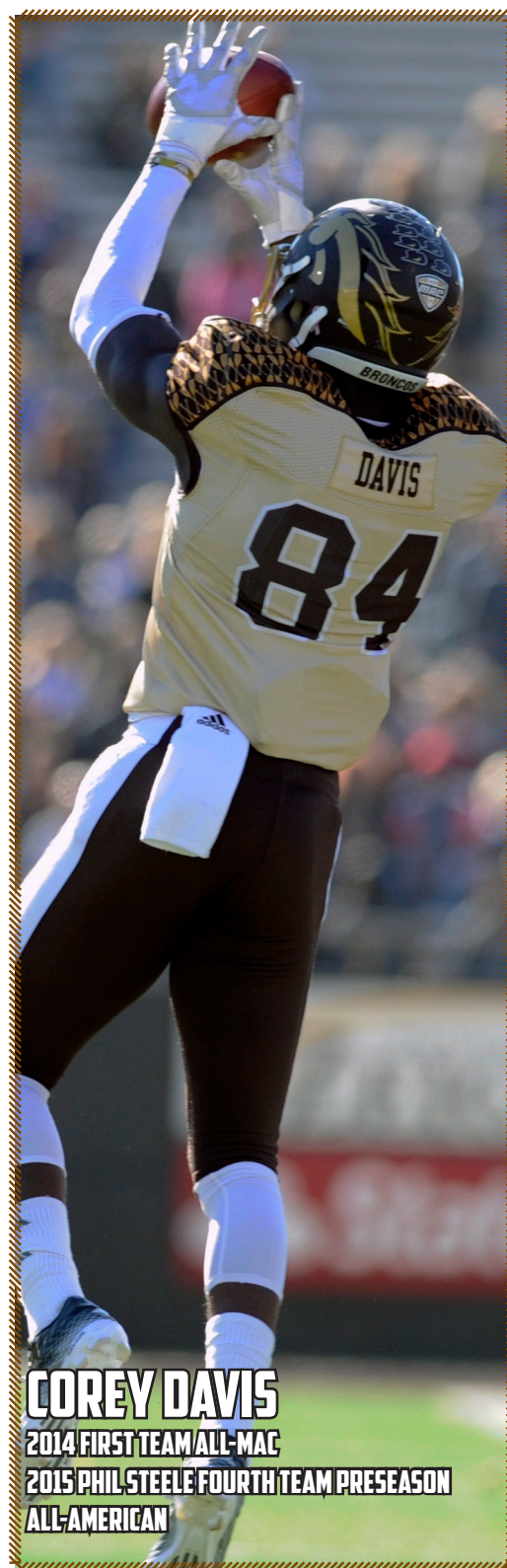

P.J. (Philip John) Fleck was announced as the 15th Head Coach in the 108 year history of the Western Michigan football program on Tuesday, December 18, 2012 to rebuild the program. Coach Fleck has received the reputation of being a program “turn around” coach by being under the tutelage of proven program builders including: Joe Novak (retired- Northern Illinois), Jerry Kill (Minnesota, Southern Illinois, Northern Illinois, Emporia State, Saginaw Valley State), Greg Schiano (Rutgers), and Jim Tressel (Youngstown State, Ohio St.). He is distinguished as one of three Head Coaches (along with Steve Spurrier and John Harbaugh) currently in college football (FBS) that has played and coached in the NFL. Coach Fleck is currently the youngest Head Coach in college football at the FBS level.

2014: Coach Fleck engineered the single greatest turnaround in WMU football history and the second-best turnaround in MAC history after leading the team to an 8-5 record overall, a 6-2 record in the MAC and a berth in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl. Fleck was named Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year and was also a semifinalist for the Maxwell National Coach of the Year award. His recruiting expertise produced the MAC Offensive Player of the Year, MAC Freshman of the Year and USA Today Freshman All-American running back Jarvion Franklin. In total, 11 Broncos were named All-MAC, including First Team selections Franklin, Corey Davis, Donald Celiscar. Celiscar and Third Team All-MAC selection Ronald Zamort ended the season as NCAA Statistical Champions for passes defended. The countless hours of charity in the community continued under Fleck as did excellence in the classroom with nine Academic All-MAC selections and three MAC Distinguished Scholar-Athlete selections. The team boasted a GPA of 2.91, the second-highest recorded GPA in program history.

2013: Under the leadership of Coach Fleck WMU had three All-Mid-American Conference selections, including MAC Freshman of the Year WR Corey Davis, Davis was also selected for All-MAC Second Team Offense. Linebacker Travonte Boles was selected for the All-MAC Second Team Defense. Defensive Back Donald Celiscar was selected for the All-MAC Third team. In the classroom Coach Fleck had 17 Academic All- MAC players including: Kyle Lark, Justin Currie, Chris Prom, Leo Alba, Andrew Aurand, Darrin Duncan, Brian Fields, Jon Hoffing, Taylor Moton, Alec Moulton, Clark Mussman, Kirk Nakama, J. Schroeder, Cory Sueing, Zach Terrell, Tyler Van Tubbergen, and Zack Wynn. Coach Fleck orchestrated the best recruiting class in the history of the MAC, ranking 58th nationally according to Rivals.com. It was the highest ranked recruiting class amongst all non-power five conference schools. Sporting News named Coach Fleck the “Best Head Coach Recruiter”, and Sports Illustrated’s “Campus Union” blog named him the “Best Hire” of 2013. Fleck campaigned for funds which brought new turf for Waldo Stadium and the Seelye Center, WMU’s indoor practice facility, and a complete renovation of the team’s locker room and The Bill Brown Alumni Football Center. After the season Coach Fleck was inducted into the Kaneland High School Hall of Fame class of 2014 for his personal achievements.

2012: Coach Fleck followed Rutgers head Coach Greg Schiano into the NFL with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. After just one season with Fleck as a wide receivers coach both Mike Williams and Vincent Jackson had the best seasons of their careers with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Jackson ranked fifth in the NFL in receiving yards (1,226), ninth in TDs (8) and fifth in receiving yards per game (87.6). Jackson went on to start for the NFC in the 2012 Pro Bowl for the first time in his career. Williams set a new career-best with 996 yards receiving and signed a multi-year deal worth approximately 46 million dollars in the off-season.

2010-11: The pipeline to the next level as a wide receivers coach continued for Fleck at Rutgers under Coach Schiano. Mohamed Sanu (Cincinnati Bengals), Quon Pratt (Philadelphia Eagles), Mark Harrison (Kansas City Chiefs), Brandon Coleman (New Orleans Saints), and Tim Wright (Tampa Bay Buccaneers, New England Patriots) all saw success at Rutgers before heading to glory in the NFL. Sanu finished the 2011 season setting both a school and Big East Conference record with 115 receptions for 1,206 yards and seven touchdowns, earning All-Big East honors and becoming one of the top-rated prospects in the 2012 NFL Draft.

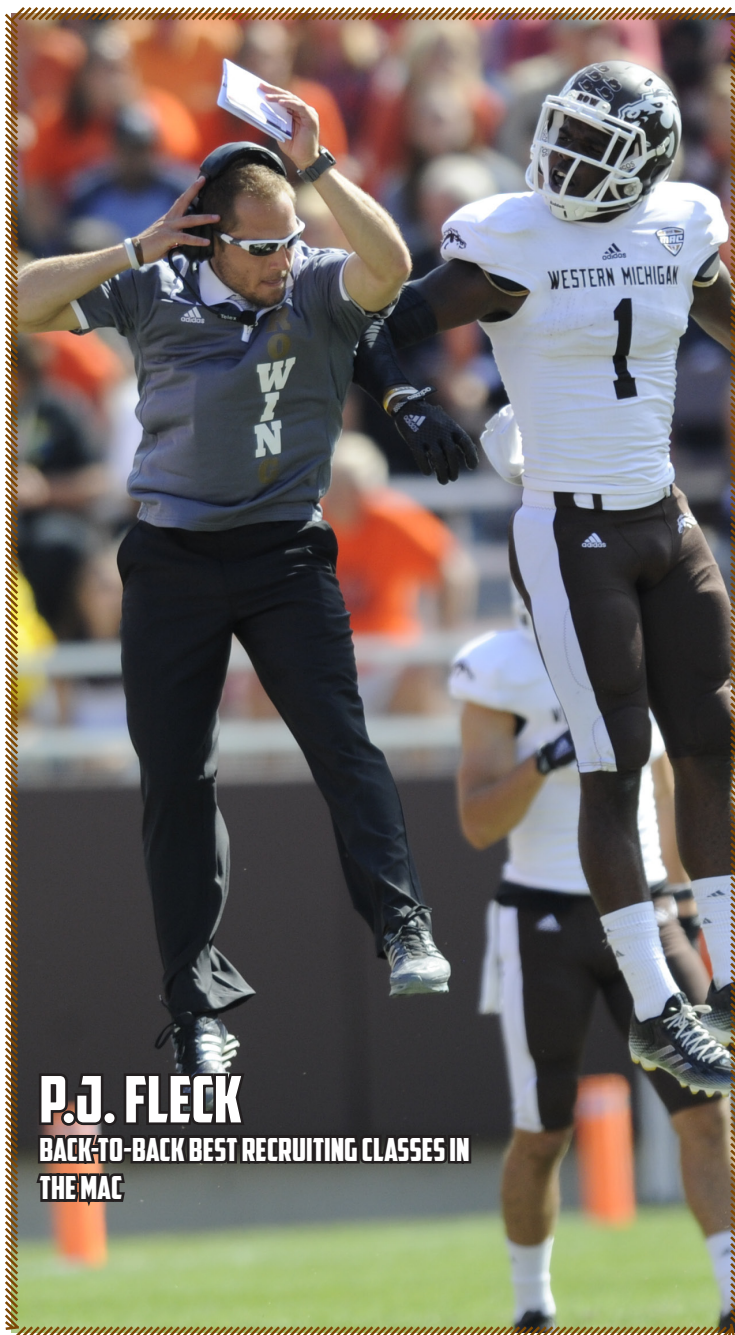
2007-09: Coach Fleck returned to his alma mater, Northern Illinois, for three seasons as the wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator (2009). The recruiting classes that Coach Fleck put together went on to have record-breaking success with players such as Jordan Lynch, Martell Moore (Atlanta Falcons), Perez Ashford (New England Patriots, Cleveland Browns, Seattle Seahawks), and Cameron Stingily. Under his tutelage, Wide Receivers Britt Davis (New York Jets, Denver Broncos, New England Patriots), current WMU wide receivers coach Matt Simon (New Orleans Saints), Nathan Palmer (San Francisco 49ers, Indianapolis Colts, Miami Dolphins, Denver Broncos) and Landon Cox (Tampa Bay Buccaneers) all advanced on to the

2006: Coach Fleck was an offensive graduate assistant with Ohio State for their Big Ten Championship season. The Buckeyes went 8-0 in conference play and 12-1 overall with a trip to the BCS National Championship Game. Fleck worked with wide receivers Ted Ginn Jr. (Miami Dolphins, San Francisco 49ers, Carolina Panthers, Arizona Cardinals), Anthony Gonzalez (Indianapolis Colts, New England Patriots), Brian Hartline (Miami Dolphins), Roy Hall (Indianapolis Colts, New Orleans Saints, Detroit Lions) and Brian Robiskie (Cleveland Browns, Jacksonville Jaguars, Detroit Lions, Atlanta Falcons, Tennessee Titans), all of which went on to substantial careers in the NFL.

NFL Playing Career

2004-2005: Fleck played for two seasons with the San Francisco 49ers (2004-05). After signing with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004, he spent most of that season on the practice squad before making an appearance versus the New England Patriots late in the year. He was placed on the injured reserve roster in 2005. In 2006, he left the 49ers to begin his coaching career.

Collegiate Playing Career (1999-2003): Coach Fleck played from 1999-2003 at Northern Illinois, capping his collegiate career with the Huskies defeating Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State, rising to a No. 10 national ranking en route to a 10-2 mark. He ranks third in career receptions (179) and fourth in career receiving yards (2,162) in NIU history. Fleck has the second most receptions in a season (77) and led the Huskies in receiving yards in both 2001 (732) and 2003 (1,028). He holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716) in a career. Fleck was named the National Player of the Week against Ohio University in 2003. In that game Coach Fleck had 14 receptions for 234 yards which ranks as the second best single game performance in NIU history.

Fleck earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 along with being named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. Fleck showed his propensity for winning at the high school level (Maple Kaneland), winning 2 state championships in football. He was awarded all-state honors in three different sports three years in a row (football, basketball, and track).

Fleck (34/DOB: 11-29-1980) has three children, a son, Carter and two daughters, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

Kirk Ciarrocca (shuh-ROCK-uh) was officially named offensive coordinator of the Western Michigan football program on January 7, 2013. He also handles quarterback coaching duties as well.

In his second season with the Broncos he helped lead one of the most prolific offense's in program history. Under his guidance the team produced MAC Player of the Year and MAC Freshman of the Year in running back Jarvion Franklin. WMU also produced All-MAC honorees in Franklin (1st), Corey Davis (1st), Willie Beavers (2nd), Zach Terrell (2nd), Daniel Braverman (3rd) and James Kristoff (3rd). The Broncos had the second-highest scoring offense in the MAC at 33.8 points per game and had the fourth-ranked total offense at 438.2 yards per game.

Ciarrocca, a graduate of Temple University, brings over 20 years of coaching experience to Western Michigan. He was instrumental in the development of Joe Flacco during his six previous seasons at the University of Delaware and was a member of the 2003 National Championship staff. Ciarrocca's Blue Hen 2007 offense ranked in the top 10 nationally in in scoring, total offense, passing offense, third down conversion and red-zone scoring. He had a pair of quarterbacks drafted into the NFL during his first stint with the Blue Hens.

Ciarrocca's coaching career began at his alma mater where he assisted the offensive staff and served as the on-campus recruiting coordinator from 1990-91. He stayed on the East Coast, working with Western Connecticut State as the passing game coordinator in 1992, at Delaware Valley College, also as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks/receivers coach in 1993. He returned to Western Connecticut as the offensive coordinator for two seasons before heading to coach in the Ivy League for seven seasons. He first coached the wide receivers at Princeton from 1996-99 and then did the same at the University of Pennsylvania from 2000-02 where the Quakers boasted the top ranked passing offense and claimed the 2000 Ivy League championship.

Ciarrocca worked with Fleck during his time at Rutgers when he was the co-offensive coordinator from 2009-10 also coaching the quarterbacks. He most recently served as the QB coach at Richmond in 2011 before returning to Delaware to coach running backs last season.

Ciarrocca (50/DOB: 8-12-1965) and his wife Kim have two children, a daughter named Colby and a son named Cade.

Ed Pinkham was officially announced as the defensive coordinator for WMU football on January 7, 2013.

In Pinkham's second season the Broncos produced three All-MAC honorees in Donald Celiscar (1st), Justin Currie (3rd) and Ronald Zamort (3rd). Celiscar and Zamort went on to be NCAA Statistical Champions i passes defended, after averaging 1.6 per game. WMU had the third-ranked scoring defense in the MAC at 24.9 points per game and second in total defense at 371.2 yards per game.

Coach Pinkham brings 30 years of experience as a defensive coordinator to the Bronco football program. Prior to coaching Elon's defense over the past two seasons, he served in the same capacity at Rutgers in 2009-10. In his first season as co-defensive coordinator, Pinkham helped the Rutgers defense reach great heights as the Scarlet Knights ranked in the top-20 in five categories, including leading the nation in tackles for loss and ranking second in turnover margin. Rutgers was 15th in the country in rushing defense, 16th in scoring defense and 18th in total defense.

Pinkham's return to the FCS level saw his defensive unit rate third nationally against the pass as Elon allowed an average of just 153.55 yards per game through the air. The unit also rated in the top 40 nationally in total defense. The Phoenix defense amassed 17 sacks, besting its total from the previous season by four.

Pinkham led the defense at Colgate from 1996 through 2008. During his tenure at Colgate, the Raiders captured five Patriot League titles and earned five trips to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision playoffs. The defensive unit led the Patriot League in total defense in 1999, 2003, 2004 and 2006, and three times paced the league in rushing defense.

Pinkham's defensive unit ranked top-10 in the nation in rushing defense three times, twice in passing defense and once in total defense. The Raiders were fifth in the nation in pass efficiency defense and ninth in total defense in 2004. In 1999, he directed the Raiders to one of their greatest defensive efforts while setting the school record for fewest total yards and rushing yards allowed in a season.

Prior to Colgate, Pinkham was defensive coordinator and associate head coach at the College of the Holy Cross for four seasons. For the first two seasons he coached the outside linebackers, before moving over to the secondary. He also enjoyed a 12-year stint at the University of New Hampshire, where he was secondary coach during his entire stay and defensive coordinator the last seven seasons. In 1989, he joined the staff at the University of Minnesota as secondary coach.

Pinkham (61/DOB: 9-6-1953) and his wife Karen have three grown children, Matthew, Kelly and Jessica.

Brian Callahan was officially announced as Western Michigan's offensive line coach on Jan. 11, 2013. Callahan returns to the Mid-American Conference after coaching the offensive line at Akron from 2004-09.

In his second season Callahan helped produce All-MAC honorees in Willie Beavers (2nd) and James Kristof (3rd) that anchored an offensive line that also helped produce the MAC Freshman/Offensive Player of the Year in Jarvion Franklin.

Callahan comes to WMU from his alma mater, coaching at Eastern Illinois since the 2010 season. He helped lead the Panthers to the 2012 Ohio Valley Conference Championship and into the Division I FCS Playoffs. EIU finished seventh in the total offense, sixth in passing offense and eighth in scoring offense in 2012.

While at Akron, Callahan helped the Zips to their first ever MAC Championship in 2005 and a berth in the 2005 Motor City Bowl. He was the program's run game coordinator from 2005-09, helping the Zips to a win over North Carolina State in 2006 and the most improved offense in the nation in 2008.

Callahan has coached and/or recruited three players that have gone on to be NFL draft selections during his time at UTEP and Akron. He started his coaching career in 1992 at the high school level and quickly rose through the ranks spending time at Louisville, Oklahoma and Pittsburgh.

Mike Hart was announced as the running backs coach for WMU football on February 4, 2014.

In his first season Hart helped produce MAC Freshman of the Year, MAC Offensive Player of the Year and USA Today Freshman All-American Jarvion Franklin. Franklin had the second-most rushing yards in the nation amongst freshman under Hart, also breaking the WMU single-season points and rushing touchdown records.

Hart spent three seasons as the running backs coach at Eastern Michigan University and four years overall in Ypsilanti. The University of Michigan football program's all-time leading rusher spent the 2011 campaign as the Eagles' offensive quality control assistant.

During the 2013 campaign, Hart oversaw an EMU rushing attack that racked up 1,896 yards on the ground, the 12th-most in EMU history. Individually, running back Bronson Hill ranked 31st nationally in rushing, surpassing the 1,000-yard mark for the first time in his career. A third team All-Mid-American Conference selection, Hill became the first EMU running back to rush for over 1,000 yards in a season since 2003.

In helping the Eagle offense during the 2012 season, EMU rushed for 1,960 yards and 13 touchdowns on 448 carries for the 61st-best ground attack in the nation. The performance marked the third consecutive season that the Eagles had rushed for more than 1,900 yards.

Additionally, Hill was also selected the National Running Back of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards, as he turned in the best single-game rushing performance in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) with 283 yards gained on 28 rushes to go along with an EMU record-tying four touchdown runs against the University of Toledo, Oct. 13.

In 2011, Eastern Michigan rushed for 2,620 yards and 16 touchdowns on 575 carries for the 14th-best ground attack in the nation. The total was the second most in program history, trailing only the 1987 team that captured the Mid-American Conference title by running the ball 610 times for a total of 2,701 yards.

Prior to coming to EMU, the 27-year-old Hart spent three seasons in the National Football League (NFL) on the roster of the Indianapolis Colts. A sixth-round draft choice in 2008, Hart carried the ball a total of 71 times in 21 games through three injury-plagued seasons as a Colt. He gained 185 yards in seven games during the 2010 season.

Prior to the NFL, Hart set school records for carries (1,015) and rushing yards (5,040) at Michigan between 2004-07. A four-year starter for the Wolverines, Hart's 41 career touchdowns rank third in U-M history. Additionally, he ranks fourth all-time in the Big Ten Conference in career rushes and yards gained, while ranking 11th in touchdowns.

A 2006 and 2007 Doak Walker Award finalist, Hart finished fifth in Heisman Trophy voting in 2006. He broke on to the national scene in 2004, setting school freshman rushing records with 282 carries for 1,455 yards and nine touchdowns. The totals ranked as the second highest single-season rushing total by a freshman in Big Ten history. He became just the third "true" freshman in conference history to lead the league in rushing, joining Ron Dayne (Wisconsin, 1996) and Darrel Thompson (Minnesota, 1986).

A native of Syracuse, N.Y., Hart graduated from Onondaga Central High School in 2004. While playing for the Tigers, he set the national career record for rushing touchdowns (204) and finished second in career rushing yards (11,045). Onondaga Central went 46-1 and won three state championships during Hart's career.

Bill Kenney brings nearly three decades of experience at the Big Ten level to the Western Michigan football program as the offensive tackles/tight ends coach for the Broncos.

In his second season Kenney's work with the offensive tackles and tight ends helped produce the MAC's Offensive Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year in Jarvion Franklin. The potent running attack proved too much for several opponents as the Broncos had one of the top running attacks in the MAC.

Kenney brings 30 years of coaching experience to the Broncos with a bulk of that coming at Penn State University where he began as a graduate assistant (1988) and worked with the offensive line from 1989-2011. He took on the role of recruiting coordinator in 1992-95 and worked directly with offensive tackles and tight ends from 2000-11.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Kenney coached six All-Americans and 18 All-Big Ten players. He coached 10 Academic All-Americans and 47 Academic All-Big Ten players.

Kenney developed 30 NFL players, 25 draft picks and five free agents, all whom received their degrees from PSU. He recruited 32 NFL draft picks, including five first round picks. His offensive line paved the way for Larry Johnson to rush for a program record 2,587 yards and helped produce eight 1,000-yard rushers since 2002.

His offensive line ranked fourth nationally in sacks allowed in 2008, allowing just 13 sacks. In 2005 the Penn State offensive line allowed fewer than 15 sacks and finished second in the Big Ten in rushing and scoring.

Prior to joining Penn State, Kenney served as a graduate assistant at Nebraska (1986-87) and worked at his alma mater, Norwich University, in the offensive backfield in 1982. Kenney was a three-year starter at Norwich as a tight end/fullback and was team co-captain in 1981.

Kenney and his wife, Kathryn, have three children, Joseph, Matthew and Jacqueline.

McGarigle's third season saw great success amongst his linebacker corp. DIII transfer Grant DePalma was plugged in at the middle linebacker spot and led the position in tackles in spite of having never played a game at the DI level prior to the season. Freshman Robert Spillane came on strong later on in the season and ended up starting eight games on the season and making 67 tackles.

McGarigle spent the last two seasons leading the WMU linebackers and boasting Third Team All-Mid-American Conference linebacker Desmond Bozeman in 2012.

McGarigle came to Western Michigan has the college game's greatest tackler, holding the FBS career record at 545 total tackles during his time as a Northwestern Wildcat. He was semifinalist for both the Dick Butkus and Chuck Bednarik Awards in 2005, while earning All-Big Ten honors in 2004 and 2005.

The Chicago native was drafted in the seventh round of the 2006 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams and played three seasons. During that time he was named NFL Special Teams Player of the Week against the Arizona Cardinals on Oct. 7, 2007 and was named the team's Iron Man following the 2007 off-season for superior achievement and dedication during team workouts. McGarigle also played two seasons in the United Football League for the Florida Tuskers.

McGarigle (31/DOB: 10-25-83), a 2006 Northwestern graduate with a bachelors in communications studies, returned to his alma mater in 2011 and served as the defensive quality control assistant and graduate assistant for the Wildcats as he pursued his masters in sports administration. He assisted in all phases of coaching the Northwestern linebackers as well as aided the special teams units.

WMU's receivers flourish under Simon in his first season. Corey Davis was named First Team All-MAC, while Daniel Braverman was named Second Team All-MAC. Both had career-best seasons in every statistical category. Heading into the 2015 season Davis was named a Presason All-American by Phil Steele.

Simon, who spent two seasons at Rutgers, is rejoined with WMU head coach P.J. Fleck, who was the Edina, Minn., native's position coach at Northern Illinois.

In 2012 with the Scarlet Knights, Simon assisted the coaching and academic personnel in day-to-day duties, also aiding with special teams film breakdown and game plans. He worked with the scout team by utilizing weekly scouting reports on upcoming opponents. Simon helped with calls and adjustments during games. He racked up a team-best 969 yards on 52 catches in 2007, ranking seventh on NIU's single-season receiving yards list. During his senior year, he was one of only 22 players in nation selected to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for leadership and work in the community.

After graduating with a bachelor's degree as a science in organizational management major, Simon (28/DOB: 12-4-85) signed a contract with the New Orleans Saints and spent six months on the practice squad.

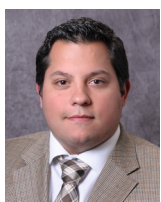

Harbaugh earned a bachelors in sport management from Averett University in 2009.

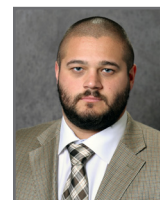

Kathy Beauregard, the Director of Athletics at Western Michigan University, has been involved with the Broncos in several capacities over the course of the past 32 years. She is the longest serving athletic director in the Mid-American Conference. Beauregard arrived in Kalamazoo as a coach before moving into administration and 2014-15 marks her 18th season as mentor of one of the top programs in the MAC.

Two more Bronco teams captured team championships in 2013-14 as men's basketball claimed the MAC regular season and tournament title for the first time since 2004, participating in the NCAA Tournament against Syracuse. Women's soccer captured its first team title since 2003 and made the most of its postseason bid. The Broncos defeated No. 2 seed Marquette in the first round of the 2013 NCAA Tournament, the largest upset in terms of seed in tournament history. Academically, the Broncos performed excellently hitting a combined GPA of over 3.00 yet again and seeing four programs (men's basketball, men's tennis, golf and gymnastics) earn APR honors for finishing in the Top 10 percent.

Over 2012-13 the Broncos saw continued success in the classroom with three programs (women's soccer, men's tennis and women's tennis) ranked in the top 10 percent in the nation in APR and the women's gymnastics program boasted eight individuals to carry a 4.00 GPA during the spring semester.

On the mat, WMU gymnastics captured the 2013 MAC title to join the men's tennis program in earning a conference crown as the Broncos won the regular season title in men's tennis.

WMU boasted 31 All-MAC selections in 2012-13, including eight first team honorees, and garnered 26 Academic All-MAC nods. The Broncos brought the Men's FAR Award back to Kalamazoo for the fourth time in six years in 2012-13. WMU had nine Player of the Year honorees spanned across hockey, volleyball, football, men's basketball and gymnastics.

During the spring of 2012, Beauregard was awarded the 2012 YWCA Lifetime Achievement Award, given to a woman in the community who has demonstrated a lifetime of outstanding contributions to the well-being of the community, state or nation, and has a record of accomplishment, leadership and positive role modeling as a volunteer and/or in a career.

The Broncos captured Mid-American Conference titles in both gymnastics and men's tennis in 2012-13. WMU Athletics solidified its presence on the national stage as volleyball and ice hockey made return trips to their respective NCAA tournaments in 2011-12. It was the second at-large invitation for WMU volleyball since the 2008 season, while hockey earned the automatic bid into the NCAA West Regional by capturing the 2012 CCHA Tournament championship. The Broncos defeated the seventh and third ranked teams in the country en route to hoisting the Mason Cup.

Men's and women's soccer made back-to-back trips to the MAC Championship game during the fall of 2011 and football played in its third postseason bowl game since the 2006. The Bronco football team also boasted a pair of All-Americans in 2011 with Jordan White, who led the nation in receptions and receiving yards per game, becoming the program's first ever Consensus All-American. The Broncos succeeded again in the classroom in 2011 with a 3.14 combined GPA.

Western Michigan's success on and off the field under Beauregard's leadership was recognized immediately following the 2010-11 season. She herself was recognized by NACDA last June at the national convention, receiving the Under

Armour Award. The department captured the 2010-11 Jacoby Trophy, recognizing the most successful women's athletic program overall. The Broncos also finished second in Reese Trophy voting (the men's athletics equivalent of the Jacoby) in 2010-11. Those two milestones along with WMU's success in the classroom and in the Kalamazoo was reason enough for the Mid-American Conference to award Western Michigan the Cartwright Award during the fall of 2011.

Four more student-athletes were named Capital One Academic All-America over the past two years (2010-11, 2011-12). Phil Swanson, football's second two-time honoree, and Allyson Doyle (volleyball) were honored in 2010-11. John Potter (football) and Anina Cicerone (women's soccer) added their names to the list of Broncos to reach this academic height during Beauregard's tenure.

WMU athletic facilities have greatly improved under Beauregard's leadership. The \$8-million dollar Bill Brown Football Alumni Center and the \$21-million Seelye Athletic Indoor Center have benefited numerous sports teams and provide top-notch facilities for Bronco student-athletes. The locker rooms at Lawson Ice Arena were renovated and completed over the past year and the department continues to raise funds for the Hyames Field Renovation Project, a two million dollar project to renovate the historic venue into a state-of-the-art facility. Field Turf was also installed at Waldo Stadium during the Summer of 2006.

Heavily involved in her profession, Beauregard assumed the chair position of the NCAA Olympic Sports Liaison Committee in 2001, a position which she held for two years. She represented WMU as a member of the NCAA Championships Cabinet and NCAA Football Bowl Certification Committee and currently serves on the NCAA Diversity and Inclusion Committee.

Beauregard, after the 2010-11 sporting year, was named named Athletic Director of the Year for the Football Subdivision in the Central Region by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics.

The beginning of 2010 marked the beginning of a new era in WMU baseball with the addition of new baseball coach Billy Gernon. Success was found on the soccer field in 2010 as well with both the men and women's programs reaching the MAC Championship match, with the men falling to eventual national champion Akron.

The 2008-09 year saw the Bronco volleyball and men's tennis programs capture regular season MAC crowns. The volleyball team advanced to the round of 16 at the NCAA Tournament, while the Bronco football team participated in its second bowl in three seasons and the men's basketball team won yet another MAC West title.

The 2007-08 academic year saw success within the department, on the playing field and in the classroom. WMU Athletics announced the renovation of historic Hyames Field. Heading into the future, the facility will be known as Robert J. Bobb Stadium and will undergo \$2.0 million of work over the next year. Renovations to Sorensen Courts, Fran Ebert Field and upcoming work to the men's basketball locker rooms all highlight Beauregard's dedication to moving WMU Athletics forward.

Athletically, WMU's tennis programs found success yet again with both winning a regular season MAC title and the men's program capturing the tournament title to earn a berth in the 2008 NCAA Tournament. Both Dave Morin and Besty Kuhle were named MAC Coaches of the Year for the second-straight season. The men's basketball and women's volleyball programs captured MAC West titles during the past athletic season. A pair of Bronco track student-athletes earned All-America honors with Becky Horn earning the nod during the indoor and outdoor seasons and finishing third in the 800m at the 2008 NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Academically, WMU boasted a pair of Academic All-Americans in Anthony Gebhart (first team) and Joe Reitz (second team). Gebhart was the first football representative since 1998. Volleyball, baseball and gymnastics finished in the top 10 among other like programs in the APR and WMU football had the highest APR score in the MAC for the 2006-07 campaign. Overall, 415 student-athletes finished 2007-08 with a 3.0 or better cumulative GPA.

In 2006-07, men's and women's tennis not only repeated as MAC Tournament champions

but captured regular season titles as well. Both Morin and Kuhle earned MAC Coach of the Year honors. The WMU football team participated in the program's first post-season bowl game since 1988. The Broncos boasted three NCAA statistical championships in five categories — Ameer Ismail (FB - sacks and tackles for loss); Carrie Moore (WBB - points per game) and Mark Letestu (HOCKEY - freshman scoring and short-handed goals).

Western Michigan continued to pursue excellence in the classroom in 2006-07 as 26 student-athletes in 14 sports earned Academic All-MAC status. WMU had five of its programs honored as being in the top-10 percent in their respective sport in the announcement for their excellence in the classroom over the years identified in the most recent APR; baseball, men's basketball, gymnastics, women's tennis and volleyball. The Broncos boasted five academic all-district selections and a pair of academic all-americans in Joe Reitz and Carrie Moore.

Moore and Ismail earned All-America status in their respective sports with Moore receiving honorable mention for Kodak All-American and Ismail earning Second Team AP All-American.

In 2005-06, Beauregard oversaw a department that captured the Jacoby Cup Trophy, awarded to the top women's program in the MAC based on sports standings. WMU has now won the Jacoby and Reese (men's overall sports award) trophies during Beauregard's tenure. The Broncos garnered three regular season titles — gymnastics, softball and women's tennis and two MAC Tournament titles — gymnastics and women's tennis. Under Beauregard's direction, WMU also won its 100th MAC title all-time in 2005-06.

The 2004-05 athletic campaign continued what has become common place at Western Michigan. Team and individual success began in the fall and continued through the spring, highlighted by a MAC Championship in women's tennis. The strength of the women's programs as a group allowed WMU to finish second in the Jacoby Cup.

Along with four MAC titles (men's basketball, men's and women's soccer and men's tennis) in 2003-04, the Broncos also enjoyed an increased level of success in the classroom. WMU's graduation rate of 83 percent in 2003 ranked eighth nationally and featured a program grade point average of nearly 3.00.

On the playing field in 2002-03, the athletics campaign was highlighted by a pair of conference titles in women's basketball and softball. The men's basketball team also made a postseason appearance, competing in the National Invitation Tournament. Postseason appearances by the WMU football, volleyball and men's tennis team highlighted the program's 2000-01 athletic competition.

The 1999-2000 campaign was highlighted by the football team's West Division title and trip to the MAC Championship. The women's tennis squad captured the MAC Tourney title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second-straight year and the women's basketball squad made its second-consecutive appearance in the WNIT.

In just her second year (1998-99), Beauregard provided support which helped the Bronco men's athletic squads jump from 10th to first place in the Reese Cup standings, giving Western Michigan a share of its first all-sports trophy in 17 years.

Previously the senior associate athletic director (1993-97), she supervised all revenue sports, the University's compliance with NCAA rules, academic services, student-athlete welfare, and athletic marketing and communications.

Beauregard initially came to WMU in 1979 as head women's gymnastics coach. In nine seasons (1980-88), she produced two MAC title teams and was twice named the conference's coach of the year.

Beauregard has been active in numerous community service organizations, including the American Cancer Society, Go Red for Women, the American Heart Association,

Big Brothers/Big Sisters and the Glowing Embers Girl Scouts Council and the Boys & Girls Club.

Honored by numerous organizations throughout her career, Beauregard was awarded both the Woman of Achievement Award (YWCA) and Athena Award (Kalamazoo Chamber of Commerce) in 2002.

Beauregard is a native of Kalamazoo and graduate of Loy Norrix High School. She earned a bachelor's degree from Hope College in 1979 and a master's degree from WMU in 1981.

In 2000, Beauregard received the Hope College Distinguished Alumni Award from her alma mater.

She and husband, Rick, have a 22-year-old son, Brad, who is pursuing his masters degree at WMU, is an equipment manager on the WMU football team. Rick retired from Kalamazoo Public Schools after 32 years of service and began Beauregard Home Services in the Fall of 2006.

MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE

THIS IS THE MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE

Providing leadership in education and diversity, the Mid-American Conference moves into its 70th year of service to our students.

Since its inception in 1946, the Mid-American Conference has progressively grown and developed into one of the most aggressive Division I conferences in the country. One of only 10 football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences, the MAC named Dr. Jon A. Steinbrecher as its eighth commissioner in March of 2009.

The league has grown its commitment to championships by expanding its commitment to neutral site post-season events – football (Ford Field, Detroit), men's and women's basketball (Quicken Loans Arena, Cleveland), softball (Firestone Stadium, Akron) and baseball (All Pro Freight Stadium, Avon, Ohio). The MAC secured a four-year contract extension with Ford Field to host the Marathon MAC Football Championship Game through the 2019 football season, anchored a six-year contract extension for the MAC Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments at Quicken Loans Arena through the 2023 season, and stabilized a five year contract extension through the 2020 season for the MAC Baseball Tournament at All Pro Freight Stadium in Avon, Ohio.

In addition to growing its commitment to MAC championships, Steinbrecher has strategically positioned the MAC's participation in hosting NCAA events and championships. The MAC recently served as the host for the 2015 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Midwest Regional at Quicken Loans Arena in Cleveland and will also serve as host of the 2018 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships, also at Quicken Loans Arena. The MAC has previously hosted both the 2012 and 2014 NCAA Women's Bowling Championships under Steinbrecher's direction.

In the summer of 2014, the MAC and ESPN announced a historic 13-year rights extension deal through the 2026-27 season for expanded national television and digital distribution. This is the largest and most extensive agreement in the history of the Conference and brings long-term security for the MAC through the 2026-27 academic year.

ESPN has exclusive television and digital distribution rights for all MAC sporting events, and guarantees coverage of every football game, and select men's and women's basketball and Olympic sporting events. The MAC and ESPN will establish on-campus production capabilities that will provide a significant increase in the national coverage of baseball, softball, soccer, volleyball, wrestling and Olympic sports on ESPN3. This will open up nearly 92 million households from ESPN3 for exposure to MAC sports for the first time in Conference history. Through this ESPN partnership, the MAC and CBS Sports Network announced a four-year sub-licensing agreement to expand its national coverage of football and basketball through the 2018-19 season.

Last season the MAC had five programs receive football bowl invitations: Northern Illinois (Boca Raton Bowl), Bowling Green (Raycom Media Camellia Bowl), Toledo (GoDaddy Bowl), Central Michigan (Popeyes Bahamas Bowl) and Western Michigan (Famous Idaho Potato Bowl).

In December of 2013, former Northern Illinois quarterback Jordan Lynch finished third overall in the Heisman Trophy voting, the highest ever finish by a MAC student. Lynch was invited to the Heisman Trophy Award ceremony in New York City and became only the third MAC student-athlete to receive an invitation to the ceremony – Marshall QB Chad Pennington (1999) and Marshall WR Randy Moss (1997).

During the 2014 NFL Draft, Buffalo Bulls linebacker Khalil Mack was the fifth overall selection by the Oakland Raiders. Mack's selection was the highest-ever for the Buffalo program and the second highest ever selection for a MAC student. This marked the second consecutive year for the MAC to have its two highest ever selections in the NFL Draft. In the 2013 NFL Draft, Central Michigan offensive tackle Eric Fisher was selected as the first overall selection by the Kansas City Chiefs, making Fisher the first-ever football player from the MAC selected first overall in the NFL Draft.

In 2012, the MAC witnessed a record setting seven teams receive bowl invitations, including the first ever BCS Bowl invitation with Northern Illinois playing in the Discover Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 2013. The MAC also had four football programs ranked in the top 25 of national polls – Northern Illinois, Kent State, Toledo and Ohio—as the BCS Standings had two MAC programs in the Top 25 at the end of the regular season with No. 15 Northern Illinois and No. 25 Kent State. The MAC also set a conference record for the most wins against FBS opponents with 16 victories.

In the fall of 2013, the MAC announced the creation of newly created bowl games in Boca

Raton, Fla., Nassau, Bahamas, Miami Beach, Fla., and Montgomery, Ala. for a six-year period (2014-2019). The creation of the Boca Raton, Popeyes Bahamas and Miami Beach Bowls is the centerpiece of a joint agreement between several FBS conferences and will be supported by several FBS conferences on a six-year rotating basis.

The Boca Raton Bowl will be owned and operated by ESPN and will be played at FAU Stadium, an open air stadium which seats nearly 30,000 fans on the campus of Florida Atlantic University. The Popeyes Bahamas Bowl will be played at Thomas A. Robinson Stadium. The Miami Beach Bowl will be played at Marlins Park. The Camellia Bowl, based in Montgomery, Ala., is owned and operated by ESPN and will be played in the Cramton Bowl, a 25,000 seat stadium.

The MAC is also a partner with the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl as a primary partner in 2017 and 2019, and a secondary partner in 2015, 2016 and 2018 bowl seasons. The MAC will play the Mountain West in both the 2017 and 2019 bowl seasons, played at Qualcomm Stadium in San Diego.

Each football season the MAC has a minimum five guaranteed bowl opportunities. The MAC has long-term primary contracts with the GoDaddy Bowl (based in Mobile, Ala.) through the 2017 season and Famous Idaho Potato Bowl (based in Boise, Ida.) through the 2019 season.

During the 2014 football season, NIU won the Marathon MAC Football Championship for the third time in the last four years. Kent State safety Jordan Italiano and Bowling Green kicker Tyler Tate were named CoSIDA Capital One First Team Academic All-Americans, while Central Michigan quarterback Cooper Rush added Second Team recognition. Western Michigan freshman running back Jarvion Franklin was named USA Today Freshman All-American. Toledo senior center Greg Mancz was named by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) as Second Team All-American. The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame named 25 MAC students as members of the 2015 Hampshire Honor Society, which recognizes college football players that maintained a 3.20 GPA or better throughout their college career. Four more MAC students were drafted into the NFL, including MAC Defensive Player of the Year and Miami defensive back Quinten Rollins by the Green Bay Packers in the second round.

In men's basketball, the MAC witnessed the No. 2 seed Buffalo Bulls win its first ever MAC Tournament Championship. The MAC had six programs invited to postseason tournaments (NCAA-Buffalo; NIT-Central Michigan; CIT-Bowling Green, Kent State and Western Michigan; CBI-Eastern Michigan). Kent State advanced to the CIT Quarterfinals with wins over Middle Tennessee State and Texas A&M Corpus Christi.

During the 2014-15 academic year, Akron men's soccer team won its 11th MAC Championship, third consecutive and seventh overall in the last eight years. Akron made its 29th NCAA Tournament berth, however it ended as Ohio State advanced on penalty kicks after 15 rounds in a 1-1 tie. Western Michigan's Andy Bevin was named Capital One Academic All-American. Bowling Green assistant coach Eric Reed was named Great Lakes Region Assistant Coach of the Year by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA). NSCAA also named Akron's Adam Najem, Bowling Green's Pat Flynn and West Virginia's Andy Bevin First Team recognition, while Akron's Saad Abdul-Salaam (Second Team) and Bowling Green's Ryan James (Third Team) also received recognition. Akron senior Saad Abdul-Salaam became the tenth Zip to be selected in the first round of the MLS SuperDraft with his 12th overall selection by Sporting Kansas City. West Virginia's Andy Bevin was drafted in the fourth round, 80th overall, in the MLS SuperDraft by the Seattle Sounders FC.

In wrestling, Missouri won its third consecutive MAC Tournament Championship and finished fourth overall at the NCAA Wrestling Championships. Missouri senior Drake Houdashelt won the National Championship at the 149-lb. weight class becoming the tenth MAC National Champion in wrestling, including the third in the last five years. The MAC had 38 wrestlers invited to the 2015 NCAA Wrestling Championships, where eight wrestlers were named All-Americans – Drake Houdashelt, Missouri (1st place at 149); Alan Waters, Missouri (3rd place at 125); Ian Miller, Kent State (5th place at 157); J'Den Cox, Missouri (5th place at 197); Chris Mecate, Old Dominion (6th place at 141); Lavion Mayes, Missouri (7th place at 141); Alexander Richardson, Old Dominion (7th place at 149) and Willie Miklus, Missouri (7th place at 184).

Eastern Michigan claimed its 19th MAC Championship in men's cross country, while Miami's Joe Stewart placed eighth at the Great Lakes Regional and was the first RedHawk to qualify for the national meet since 2008. Eastern Michigan won its 32nd swimming & diving championship. In men's tennis, Buffalo won its first ever MAC title. In men's golf, Miami ended Kent State's six-year reign as the RedHawks won its 13th MAC Tournament title in program history.

Akron won its second consecutive MAC Indoor Track and Field Championship and its fourth title

in the last five years. Akron junior Shawn Barber won his second consecutive indoor National Championship in the pole vault and also set a new indoor NCAA Championship record. Barber was also named a finalist for the prestigious Sullivan Award. Akron's Clayton Murphy was named USTFCCA Great Lakes Region Track Athlete of the Year, while Zips Coach Dennis Mitchell was named Coach of the Year. Buffalo's Jonathan Jones was named Field Athlete of the Year, while 10 MAC students were named USTFCCA All-Americans, including six first team and four second team.

In men's outdoor track and field, Eastern Michigan won its 23rd Conference Championship in program history and a total of 62 male athletes from the MAC participated in the 2015 NCAA Men's Track & Field Preliminary Championships, while twenty male athletes advanced and qualified for the NCAA Track & Field Championships.

Buffalo senior Jonathan Jones won the gold in the shot put and became the first National Champion in Buffalo's Division I history with a 20.78-meter heave. Akron junior pole vaulter Shawn Barber won his first-ever NCAA Outdoor Championship as he surpassed 18-4.50 (5.50m) to win his school-record third overall NCAA Championship and in the process become a six-time All-American. The U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCA) named five MAC students as First-Team All-Americans – Shawn Barber, Akron (Pole Vault); Clayton Murphy, Akron (800 Meters); Jonathan Jones, Buffalo (Shot Put); Donald Scott, Eastern Michigan (Triple Jump); Matthias Tayala, Kent State (Hammer) and four students as Second-Team All-Americans – Miles Dunlap, Kent State (4×400 Relay); Andrew O'Leary, Kent State (4×400 Relay); Matthew Tobin, Kent State (4×400 Relay) and Danny Young, Kent State (4×400 Relay).

In baseball, Ohio won the MAC Tournament Championship for the first time since 1997. Ohio's Connor Sitz threw a no hitter to lead Ohio to a 6-0 win over Bowling Green in the MAC Baseball Tournament, while his no hitter was the first no hitter for the Ohio baseball program since 1996 and is the first no hitter against a Division I program in school history. His no hitter was also the first ever no hitter in MAC Baseball Tournament history. Ball State outfielder Alex Call, Eastern Michigan infielder John Rubino and Kent State pitcher Jared Skolnicki earned Capital One Academic All-America Third Team honors. Ten MAC students were selected in the 2015 MLB Draft – including Akron pitcher J.T. Brubaker, selected by the Pittsburgh Pirates in the sixth round, and Bowling Green catcher Trey Keegan, selected by the Atlanta Braves also in the sixth round.

Women's athletics continued to shine for the MAC this past year. In women's basketball, Ohio won its third MAC Tournament Championship. Seven programs were invited to postseason tournaments (NCAA-Ohio; including a MAC record six to the WNIT-Akron, Ball State, Buffalo, Eastern Michigan, Toledo and Western Michigan). Central Michigan's Crystal Bradford became the highest ever drafted women's basketball player in MAC history as Bradford was selected seventh overall by the WNBA's Los Angeles Sparks.

In volleyball, Western Michigan won its fifth MAC Championship and first title since 2000, before falling to Wisconsin in the NCAA Tournament First Round. Eastern Michigan's Jill Briner and Miami's Meg Riley earned CoSIDA Capital One All-Americans. NIU's Mackenzie Roddy and Ohio's Abby Gilleland were named American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) First Team Midwest Region, while Ball State's Hayley Benson and Ohio's Kelly Lamberti were named Honorable Mention.

In women's soccer, Buffalo won its first MAC Tournament Championship. Buffalo suffered a 4-1 loss to Penn State in the programs first ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament First Round. Eastern Michigan's Emily Dzik was named to the Capital One Academic All-America Second Team and CLASS First Team Senior All-American.

In women's cross country, Toledo captured its sixth MAC Championship in program history. Toledo received one of 13 at-large bids for the championships meet after placing third at the Great Lakes Regional.

In field hockey, Kent State won the MAC Championship. The Golden Flashes won the program's first NCAA Tournament game in program history as they defeated Delaware in the NCAA Tournament First Round, before losing to defending national champion, UConn.

Akron won its second consecutive MAC Swimming Championship. Miami's Pei Lin finished second in the three-meter dive and 10th in the one-meter dive at the NCAA Division I Swimming & Diving Championships.

In gymnastics, Kent State won its fifth consecutive MAC Tournament Championship. Central Michigan was selected to compete as a team at the NCAA Regionals. Six additional gymnasts from the MAC were also invited to the Regionals as Bowling Green's Alyssa Nocella finished

sixth all-around.

In women's indoor track and field, Eastern Michigan won its fourth MAC Championship in program history. Six MAC student-athletes were named USTFCCA All-Americans, including four first team and two second team.

In women's outdoor track and field, Akron claimed the women's MAC Title. A total of 61 women athletes from the MAC participated in the 2015 NCAA Women's NCAA Track & Field Preliminary Championships, while fourteen women qualified for the NCAA Track & Field Championships.

The U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCA) named three MAC students as First-Team All-Americans – Alexis Cookes, Akron (Shot Put and Discus); Claudia Garcia Jou, Akron (High Jump); Brooke Pleger, Bowling Green (Hammer) and nine MAC students as Second-Team All-Americans – Alexis Cookes, Akron (Hammer); Caroline Hasse, Akron (Pole Vault); Devene Brown, Central Michigan (Discus); Sarah Chauchard, Eastern Michigan (Hep-tathlon); Dace Dreimane, Eastern Michigan (Triple Jump); Victoria Voronko, Eastern Michigan (Steeplechase); Jackie Leppelmeier, Kent State (Hammer); Danniell Thomas, Kent State (Shot Put) and Amelia Strickler, Miami (Shot Put).

In women's tennis, Miami won its third consecutive MAC Tournament Championship. In women's golf, Kent State won its 17th consecutive MAC Tournament Championship and finished ninth at the NCAA Regional.

In softball, Ball State won the MAC Tournament Championship. The Cardinals won their first NCAA Regional victory in program history with a 6-3 win over Notre Dame. Ball State's Loren Cihlar, Buffalo's Alexis Curtiss, Kent State's Emma Johnson and Northern Illinois' Emily Naegel were named to the Capital One Academic All-District First Team. Eleven MAC student-athletes were named to the 2015 National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Division I All-Region Team.

From two-time Super Bowl quarterback winning Ben Roethlisberger (Miami University), NFL Defensive MVP James Harrison (Kent State University), NFL Pro Bowlers (OT Joe Staley, TE Antonio Gates, WR Antonio Brown), British Open winner Ben Curtis (Kent State University), World Series winning manager Bob Brenly (Ohio University) and Olympic bobsled team member Brock Kreitzburg (University of Toledo), the Mid-American Conference continues to excel in producing leaders in the world of athletics.

History of the MAC

Based in Cleveland since July 1999 following a 15-year stay in Toledo, Ohio, the MAC has established historic measurements in both football and men's and women's basketball since moving to Northeast Ohio. The MAC was founded as a five-school league on February 24, 1946 in Columbus, Ohio with Ohio, Butler, Cincinnati, Wayne State and Western Reserve admitted as charter members. The Mid-American Conference membership consists of 12 universities across five states (Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, New York and Ohio).

In 1946 men's basketball was the first competitive sport in the MAC, which now sponsors a total 23 sports. Women's sports were brought into the conference's structure in 1980. For men, there are 11 championships sponsored in football, basketball, baseball, cross country, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, wrestling, golf and tennis. For women, 12 championships are sponsored in basketball, softball, volleyball, cross country, field hockey, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, gymnastics, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and tennis.

DR. JON STEINBRECHER — MAC COMMISSIONER

Steinbrecher has expanded bowl opportunities for the conference and stabilized conference membership, increased television exposure with a historic national television and digital distribution rights deal with ESPN, launched the conference's first-ever digital network, renegotiated the conference marketing rights agreement with IMG College and enhanced neutral site conference championships in basketball and baseball.

Steinbrecher played an integral role in the development of the new College Football Playoff and serves on the Administrative Committee and the Site Selection Committee. Steinbrecher led the MAC bid to host the 2015 NCAA Men's Basketball Midwest Regional at Quicken Loans Arena and also developed and implemented a new MAC Coaches Orientation program. He was recently named to the newly formed NCAA Football Oversight Committee.

In the summer of 2014, Steinbrecher announced a historic 13-year rights extension agreement with ESPN through the 2026-27 season and brings long-term security for the Conference. This agreement provides ESPN with exclusive television and digital distribution rights for all MAC sporting events, guarantees coverage of home football and men's basketball games, and select women's basketball and Olympic sporting events.

In addition, the MAC and its member institutions, with assistance from ESPN, will establish on-campus production capabilities that will provide a significant increase in the national coverage of baseball, softball, soccer, volleyball, wrestling and Olympic sports on ESPN3. In June of 2015, the MAC announced a four-year sub-licensing agreement with CBS Sports Network to expand its national exposure in football and basketball.

Specifically in football, Steinbrecher has overseen historic achievements in

the overall growth of MAC football within the FBS level. Over the last three seasons ten different MAC programs have appeared in a bowl game. Also, the MAC became the first non-AQ conference in the BCS era to have two teams vying for a BCS berth in the same year without an undefeated season. In 2012, both Northern Illinois and Kent State entered the Marathon MAC Football Championship Game with 11-1 records and ranked in the BCS Top 25.

In January, 2013, Steinbrecher witnessed Northern Illinois earn the first ever BCS bowl berth by a MAC member in the Discover Orange Bowl and during the 2012 bowl season a conference record seven teams receive bowl invitations.

Last season, Steinbrecher had five different MAC programs receive bowl invitations – Northern Illinois (Boca Raton Bowl); Bowling Green (Raycom Media Camellia Bowl); Toledo (GoDaddy Bowl); Central Michigan (Popeyes Bahamas Bowl) and Western Michigan (Famous Idaho Potato Bowl).

Steinbrecher orchestrated the creation of four new bowl games in 2014 – the Raycom Media Camellia Bowl (Montgomery, Ala.), the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl (Nassau, Bahamas), the Boca Raton Bowl (Boca Raton, Fla.) and the Miami Beach Bowl (Miami, Fla.).

Steinbrecher has built the MAC primary bowl agreements this year to a conference-best five guaranteed bowl games (GoDaddy Bowl; Famous Idaho Potato Bowl; Raycom Media Camellia Bowl; Popeyes Bahamas Bowl and Boca Raton Bowl) and three additional secondary agreements (San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl; Detroit-based Quick Lane Bowl and ESPN owned bowl games such as the Birmingham Bowl and St. Petersburg Bowl).

These bowl agreements provide the MAC the opportunity to build on relationships with multiple bowl partners, expand national television exposure and broaden geographical opportunities to perform against peer FBS conferences.

Steinbrecher directed a strategic planning process for the MAC, increased national exposure for the conference, as well as new opportunities for the conference in the areas of a new regional television network deal, marketing and sponsorships and securing long-term partnerships for MAC neutral site championship events.

Steinbrecher launched the first-ever MAC Digital Network in 2011 and re-launched the MAC Digital Network with a new partnership with SIDEARM. The Digital Network provides the conference with a new website, enhanced live streaming and programming, mobile platforms via the iPhone, iPad and Android.

In 2011, Steinbrecher also negotiated a new marketing agreement with ISP for the conference marketing and sponsorship rights through 2019. ISP merged with IMG and this long-term deal solidified the conference marketing partnership with the new IMG College brand.

Steinbrecher negotiated a four-year contract extension with Ford Field as the site to host the Marathon MAC Football Championship Game through the 2019 season. He secured a six-year contract extension with Cleveland's Quicken Loans Arena to host the MAC Men's and Women's Basketball Conference Tournament through 2023. The contract extension guarantees the continuation of the conference tournament at the same neutral site since 2000. In addition, Steinbrecher also signed a five-year contract extension for the MAC Baseball Tournament to be played at All Pro Freight Stadium in Avon, Ohio through the 2020 season.

DR. JON STEINBRECHER — MAC COMMISSIONER

He joined the MAC after serving six years as commissioner of the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC). Prior to the OVC, Steinbrecher served as commissioner of the Mid-Continent Conference (the Summit League). He is the only person to serve as commissioner in all three NCAA Division I Subdivisions (FBS, FCS, DI).

In six years with the OVC, Steinbrecher significantly increased the league's exposure through additional television coverage at the regional and national level. In 2005, he negotiated a five-year contract with ESPN that secured increased exposure for the league. That included being the first conference to sign a deal to have games appear on ESPN2, the OVC had the first sporting event telecast on that network (the 2005 OVC Men's Basketball Tournament Semifinal).

Steinbrecher secured an invitation for the OVC to participate in ESPN's BracketBusters event. He also implemented conference merchandising and corporate partner programs and in 2008 negotiated a five-year agreement with IMG College to manage the OVC's multimedia rights and sponsorship sales.

In July 2006, Steinbrecher helped spearhead a venture into streaming video with the launch of OVCSports.TV. The multimedia platform provided live and on-demand coverage of OVC football and men's and women's basketball games as well as selected other sports, coaches' shows, press conferences and special events. In its first two years of existence, OVCSports.TV streamed over 800 events and recorded nearly 5,000 paid subscribers.

Under his leadership, the OVC re-emphasized its commitment to sportsmanship by implementing a series of good sports initiatives, including sportsmanship affidavits signed by coaches and administrators, student-athlete ethical conduct orientation and an institutional and team sportsmanship awards. Steinbrecher also initiated a Conference Basketball Issues Committee and oversaw increased promotional efforts for the OVC Basketball Tournament, which resulted in an increase in ticket sales revenue. He also spearheaded the efforts in bidding for, and ultimately securing, the 2014 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Final Four for Nashville.

Prior to being named Mid-Continent Conference Commissioner in Nov. 1994, Dr. Steinbrecher had previously served the league as Director of Communications, Director of Marketing and Communications and Assistant Commissioner. He joined the Mid-Con staff in 1989 after previously serving in the athletics departments at Houston Baptist University, Indiana University and Davidson College.

Steinbrecher has served on a number of prominent NCAA committees, including the Division I Basketball Issues Committee, serving as a member of subcommittees for both men's and women's basketball, and in 1999 he became the first non-Division I-A commissioner elected as president of the Collegiate Commissioner's Association (CCA). In June 2007, he was appointed to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Academic Enhancement Group by the late NCAA President Myles Brand. He has served on the NCAA Division I Legislative Council, the NCAA Championship Cabinet, the NCAA Committee on Athletics Certification and the NCAA Men's Basketball Issues Committee.

Steinbrecher is currently Chair of the College Football Officiating Board of Managers and the NCAA Playing Rules Oversight Panel.

Steinbrecher has also served as Division I-AAA vice president of the CCA and as a member of the National Invitation Tournament's District IV Advisory Board.

Steinbrecher is a 1983 graduate of Valparaiso University, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education and journalism. In 2006, he was bestowed an Alumni Achievement Award from his alma mater and in 2014 was inducted into the Valparaiso Athletics Hall of Fame. Steinbrecher graduated with a master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University in 1984, and he was awarded the doctorate of physical education in sports administration from Indiana University in 1989.

An all-conference and academic all-conference selection in football and a conference champion in tennis, Steinbrecher was named Valparaiso's and the Heartland Collegiate Conference's Student-Athlete of the Year in 1983. In 2006, he was inducted into the Watauga County (N.C.) Sports Hall of Fame.

Steinbrecher and his wife Anne have three children, daughter Grace and twin sons Matt and Will.

Steinbrecher follows Rick Chryst, who served as MAC Commissioner (1999-2009). David Reese served as the first commissioner from 1946-64, followed by Bob James (1964-71), Fred Jacoby (1971-82), Jim Lessig (1982-90), Karl Benson (1990-94), Jerry Ippoliti (1994-99).

1961 AVIATION BOWL

New Mexico 28, Western Michigan 12

Western Michigan made its postseason debut in the inaugural Aviation bowl on Dec. 9, 1961. The Broncos were led by quarterback Ed Chlebek, who completed 18 passes for 207 yards and one touchdown.

WMU fell behind 14-0 but bounced back on a Bob White scoring run from four yards out. New Mexico added two more scores before Chlebek found Dave Cooke in the end zone from five yards out for the final score of the game.

1988 CALIFORNIA BOWL

Fresno State 35, Western Michigan 30

Twenty-seven years after its first bowl trip, WMU made its second after winning the only outright Mid-American Conference title in program history and capturing a program-record nine wins.

For the second time in a bowl game, WMU fell behind by two scores but this time, the Broncos fought back to take a 17-14 lead into halftime. Robert Oliver hauled in a 31-yard pass from Tony Kimbrough for the team's first score. Robert Davis followed with a 51-yard scoring run to tie the game. It is still the longest rush in WMU bowl history. John Creek made good on his only field goal of the game to give the Broncos its first lead of the game.

Fresno State outscored the Broncos, 21-7, in the third quarter to put the game away. WMU's Kimbrough ran in a score from six yards out late in the game. He accounted for all but one of Western Michigan's touchdowns on the day.

2007 INTERNATIONAL BOWL

Cincinnati 27, Western Michigan 24

The Broncos played in the second inaugural bowl game in program history, taking on Big East opponent Cincinnati in the 2007 International Bowl. For the third time in as many postseason games, WMU fell behind 14-0 early and had to climb out from behind the eight ball.

Western Michigan eventually dug itself into a 24-point hole before getting its offense kick started. Cornerback E.J. Biggers and Jamarko Simmons connected on a 76-yard touchdown completion, the longest in WMU bowl history, for WMU's first score. The Broncos bounced back with another TD through the air, this time on a Ryan Cubit to Herb Martin hook up from 30 yards out. WMU scored 17 points in the second quarter to pull within a score at the break.

Brandon West tied the game at 24-all with a seven-yard run at the 10:53 mark of the fourth quarter, but the Bearcats punched in a 33-yard field goal to take the lead back four minutes later. A field goal attempt from 51 yards out went begging as the Broncos were dealt their closest bowl loss in program history.

2008 TEXAS BOWL

Rice 38, Western Michigan 14

Western Michigan played in front of the second-largest bowl crowd in Mid-American Conference history against Rice in the Texas Bowl. The game marked the second postseason appearance for the Broncos in the last three seasons.

Rice's offense put Western Michigan too far behind, scoring 24 points in the first half and 14 more in the second before the Broncos' first score. Tim Hiller found senior Kirk Elsworth from two yards out for WMU's first points of the game in the fourth quarter. He hooked up with Schneider Julien near the game's end for another touchdown, giving two on the day to tie a WMU bowl record.

2011 LITTLE CAESARS PIZZA BOWL

Purdue 37, Western Michigan 32

Western Michigan's offense was on the national stage in the program's fifth bowl game and third in the past six seasons. The Broncos posted 485 yards of offense in a narrow loss to Purdue in the 2011 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl.

Jordan White set a MAC bowl record with 265 receiving yards and his one-handed grab in the second half was the top play on that night's SportsCenter. Alex Carder threw for over 400 yards in a game for the fifth time in 2011, racking up 439 yards through the air but turnovers proved to be too costly for WMU in the end.

In all WMU set or matched 12 program bowl records in the LCPB and grabbed the Broncos' first ever lead in a bowl game on the first score of the game, a 49-yard pass from Carder to White on a flea flicker at the 9:14 mark of the opening quarter.

2014 FAMOUS IDAHO POTATO BOWL

Air Force 38, Western Michigan 24

Western Michigan's was rewarded with its sixth bowl appearance in program history after an historic turnaround from 1-11 to 8-4 heading into the bowl game. The Broncos displayed a prolific offense with Corey Davis setting a WMU bowl record with 176 yards receiving and 3 touchdown catches. He was named WMU's MVP for the game.

The Air Force Falcons proved to be a tough opponent and grinded out over 300 yards on the ground and were able to convert off of key Bronco turnovers to pull away in the game.
