## SUZIE GRECH

### HEAD COACH

Suzie Grech enters her third season as the head of the Western Michigan women's soccer program. Originally Grech was named interim head coach of the Western Michigan women's soccer program on July 13, 2009, after two seasons as an assistant coach for the Broncos and then promoted to head coach shortly after the season's end. Grech has coached at both the high school and collegiate levels and was a standout goalkeeper at the University of Michigan.

In her second season she took the Broncos to the MAC Tournament Championship game after finishing in fifth place in the MAC. WMU finished with an overall record of 11-7-5, the most wins since 2004, with a 5-2-4 record in the MAC. Grech coached a team that finished the season undefeated at home with a 5-0-2 record and only surrendering two goals at the WMU Soccer Complex. Under Grech, Stephanie Skowneski was named MAC Offensive Player of the Year, becoming the first Bronco in program history to win the award.

The 2010 season saw Skowneski and Nicole Dulyea named First Team All-MAC and Nikolette Rivera Second Team All-MAC. River and Skowneski also went on to be named Academic All-MAC. Dulyea, along with senior goalie Julia Francy and Anina Cicerone were also named to the MAC All-Tournament Team.

The 2010 Broncos got it done on the field but also in the classroom under Grech. The team received the National Soccer Coaches Association of American Team Academic Award for having a semester GPA of 3.47. The Broncos had 21 of its 24 student-athletes register a GPA of 3.0 or higher, with 13 of them with a 3.5 or higher.

In her first season the Broncos finished with a record of 6-8-5 and finishing in eighth place in the MAC. The season saw two Broncos receive All-MAC honors as sophomore Nikolette Rivera was named Second Team All-MAC and Anina Cicerone was named to the MAC All-Freshman team. Rivera was the first Bronco to be named to the All-MAC team since 2005, ending a four-year drought.

The Philadelphia, Pa., native is the third coach in school history and will be involved in all facets of the program at WMU, and brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to the goalkeeping unit.

Grech arrived in Kalamazoo after spending the 2007 preseason with her alma mater as a volunteer assistant coach. She also served as the assistant girl's soccer coach at Pioneer High School during the 2007 season.

Prior to the 2008 season Grech spent a week in Belize with Peacework, an organization in Blacksburg, Va. Grech and others helped out with construction projects for schools and helped coached students. She helped out with three other coaches, Matt Gwilliam (Virginia Tech), Erica Demers (Grand Valley State), and Scott Letts (Marshall). In addition to their coaching duties, they also passed out soccer equipment to the kids provided by Peacework.

Prior to her stint around Ann Arbor, Grech was an assistant at Marshall for two seasons, acting as the goalkeeper coach. With the Thundering Herd, she was in charge of technical and tactical training of the goalies and assisted with on-field instruction. She also was highly involved in recruiting, travel and other administrative duties.

Grech played at Michigan from 2000-2003, and left the women's soccer program as the all-time leader in goals-against average and shutouts, ending her Wolverine career with a record of 36-18-3. Her Michigan teams made four NCAA appearances in 2000, 2001, 2002 (Elite Eight) and 2003 (Sweet Sixteen), and in 2001, she earned Second Team All-Big Ten and All-Great Lakes Region honors.

Grech also participated internationally for Spain, where she earned a silver medal at the European Women's U-18 Championships in 1999 and 2000. She garnered six International Caps with the full national team, and 14 International Caps with the U-18 national team.

From 2003 to 2005, she coached at Brighton High School in Brighton, Mich., and served as an assistant coach for the University of Michigan's Soccer Club.

Grech graduated from the University of Michigan with a bachelor's degree in physical education in 2005 and received her master's degree in sports administration from Marshall in 2006. She holds a United States Soccer Federation (USSF) National "B" License and has a National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) advanced national goalkeeping diploma.



Andy McCaslin was announced as the women's soccer assistant coach on April 6, 2011, joining head coach Suzie Grech's staff in her third year at the helm.

Most recently McCaslin held the same position with both the men's and women's teams for one season at Saint Mary's University in Minnesota. In his one year at SMU he helped lead the Cardinal women's team to its first regional rankings in 14 years. He trained the keeper on the women's team that led the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference with eight shutouts and fourth best in school history. Under McCaslin, the women's team improved both their scoring and defense, increasing their goals per game and decreasing their goals allowed. With McCaslin's help, five student-athletes received MIAC awards.

Before his stint at SMU he was an assistant coach of the men's soccer team at Valparaiso from 2008-2010. McCaslin assisted head coach Mike Avery in rebuilding the program. In the two seasons McCaslin assisted, the Crusaders posted a 16-17-4 record and a program best record of 10-7-2 in 2009. They posted the best goals against average in program history during the 2009 season and saw the program earn its first ever Horizon League Athlete of the Week. He also coached eight student-athletes to All-Horizon League honors, including the 2009 Goalkeeper of the Year.

McCaslin was the head coach of the 1997 boys team of the Minnesota Olympic Development Program. He received a bachelor's degree in English from DePauw University in 2004 and a master's in sports administration from Valparaiso in 2010. McCaslin played for DePauw from 2000 to 2002, earning three varsity letters. He played a part in DePauw's 2000 NCAA Tournament team and was awarded the Men's Soccer Mental Attitude award in 2001.
