ANDY MURRAY

HEAD COACH • FIRST SEASON

Andy Murray was announced as the sixth head coach in the history of the Western Michigan men's ice hockey program on Jul 26, 2011.

Murray comes to WMU with an extensive resume earned at the highest level of professional hockey. He is one of only 39 coaches in NHL history to reach 300 wins with a career record of 333-278-58-71. Murray has 10 years of NHL head coaching experience, spending six seasons at the helm of the Los Angeles Kings and four with the St. Louis Blues. Murray is the Kings' All-Time franchise leader in wins with 215 and led Los Angeles to three 90-point seasons in his tenure. During the 2008-09 season with St. Louis he was a finalist for the Jack Adams Coach of the Year Award after guiding the Blues to a third place finish in the Central Division.

Murray has spent a total of 20 years as either a head or assistant coach in the NHL. He held assistant coaching positions with the Winnipeg Jets, Minnesota North Stars and Philadelphia Flyers. While he has not coached in college hockey in the United States he did coach at Brandon University, a Canadian college, for three seasons. In his short time he was able to turn Brandon into the top ranked program in all of Canadian college hockey.

To go with his extensive professional coaching background, Murray also brings international experience. He coached Team Canada to gold medals at the 2007, 2003 and 1997 World Hockey Championships. He is the only Canadian coach in history to win three World Championships and he also held the highest winning percentage as a coach (64-percent) in the history of the Canadian Men's National Team. He also holds six Spengler Cup Titles (an annual tournament in Switzerland) for Team Canada, a record for the country. Murray was also a head coach in Europe, coaching three Swiss professional teams (EV Zug, Zurcher Schlittschuh, and EHC Kloten) and a German team, EHC Berlin, in the early 80's and early 90's.

A native of Souris, Manitoba, Murray and his wife, Ruth, have three children, all of which play professional hockey in Switzerland. His youngest son Jordy played for the University of Wisconsin and his oldest son Brady played for North Dakota. His daughter Sarah played Division I college hockey at Minnesota-Duluth, where she was a part of two National Championship teams.

PAT FERSCHWEILER

ASSISTANT COACH

Second Season
Western Michigan '93

Pat Ferschweiler was hired to the position of assistant hockey coach on July 7, 2010, marking his return to Western Michigan after playing for the Broncos from 1990-93.

In his first season as assistant the Broncos improved greatly from previous season, finishing in fourth place in the CCHA with an overall record of 19-13-10 and a bid to the NCAA Tournament. As director of skill development he helped several players post career-best point totals. In total, the Broncos earned six CCHA Player of the Week awards in various categories. With Ferschweiler's help the Broncos also had two CCHA All-Rookie Team selections in Dan DeKeyser and Chase Balisy, who also went on to be named

Freshman All-Americans by Inside College Hockey.

Before joining the WMU coaching staff he built the Russell Stover AAA Hockey program in Overland, Kan., from the ground up in August 2004 and has coached the U-18 team through 2010. Under Ferschweiler, Russell Stover has become one of the elite hockey programs in the country, winning several Midwest Regional Championships and competing for national championships. Ferschweiler's most recent Stover team finished in third place at the 2010 USA Hockey Tier I 18U National Tournament. He was also the director of hockey for the Kansas City Stars youth organization from 2005-2009. Under his guidance the Stars membership grew from 35 players to 360. He also trained Stars coaches at both the travel and house level, as well as teaching coaching classes designed to improve their understanding of hockey and their ability to teach the game.

As a player Ferschweiler, 40, suited up for the Brown & Gold in 116 total games and amassed 95 points on 30 goals and 65 assists. He was awarded the Rob Hodge Most Valuable Player for the 1992-93 season in which he tallied 35 points including a career-best 15 goals. He was also named the CCHA's Best Defensive Forward for the 1991-92 season. Ferschweiler played professionally for 11 seasons, five of which with the Kansas City Blades of the International Hockey League, back when the IHL was one of the top minor-pro leagues in the nation. He received a bachelor's degree in finance from Western Michigan University in 1993.

Ferschweiler resides in Kalamazoo with his wife Stacie and daughters Mia (7) and Avery (5).



ROB FACCA

ASSISTANT COACH

First Season
Nebraska-Omaha '00

Rob Facca was hired to the position of assistant hockey coach on July 7, 2010, joining head coach Jeff Blashill's staff for his first year at the helm.

In his first season on the job the Broncos improved greatly from the previous season, finishing in fourth place in the CCHA with an overall record of 19-13-10. As WMU's recruiting coordinator Facca helped the Broncos sign a total of 12 student-athletes to national letters of intent, with the incoming class of 2011-12 defined by then head coach Jeff Blashill as an "elite class." Facca came to Western Michigan after spending three seasons as an assistant coach with Northern Michigan under head coach Walt Kyle. At NMU Facca managed the Wildcats' comprehensive international recruiting program and also worked with skill development, assisted with scheduling and helped coach the forwards. With Facca's help, the Wildcats produced a two-time All-American defenseman in Erik Gustafsson, now with the Philadelphia Flyers organization, and All-American and First Team All-CCHA member Mark Olver, a member of the Colorado Avalanche organization.

The Wildcats advanced to the CCHA Tournament Semifinals the past three seasons and lost to Michigan in the finals of the 2009-10 tournament. With Facca's help the Wildcats made the NCAA Tournament for the first time in over a decade. The Nebraska-Omaha alum also spent two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach at his alma mater from 2005-07. Prior to UNO, Facca spent two seasons as an assistant coach for the Lincoln Stars of the United States Hockey League. He graduated from the University of Nebraska-Omaha in December of 2000 with a bachelors of science in journalism and communications.

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Facca, 33, resides in Kalamazoo with his wife Nicole, son Louie (4) and newborn daughter Bella (2).



SPIROS ANASTAS

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH

First Season
Lebanon Valley College '10

As a dual sport student-athlete at Lebanon Valley College, Anastas competed in Track & Field and Captained the Hockey team for all four seasons. He was a MAC Conference Championship qualifier in the 4x400 relay and received MAC Honor Roll recognition for Track & Field. He was a three time ECAC West All-Academic team member for Hockey.

Anastas had a lengthy Junior A Hockey career in the OPJHL with the Bancroft Hawks, Huntsville Otters, and Vaughn Vipers. In 2001 he was a participant at the Ontario U17 camp and attended OHL camps with the Kingston Frontenacs and Owen Sound Attack.

As an all around athlete, Anastas picked up Athlete of the Year recognition while competing in Hockey, Football, Baseball, Soccer, and Basketball at Lorne Park Secondary School.

Anastas graduated Magna Cum Laude from Lebanon Valley College with a BA in Economics and a BSc in Business Administration and Accounting. At the end of the fall semester, he will receive his MSc in Sports Administration from Canisius College.

Spiros Anastas begins his first season with the Broncos as the Volunteer Assistant Hockey Coach. His primary responsibilities include oversight of video break down and analysis for team systems and opponent scouting reports, assisting in player development, practice and game planning, organizing team travel, and working closely with community service, charity, and alumni events.

The Mississauga, Ontario native began his Coaching career at DIII Lebanon Valley College in January 2010 when he took over as Student-Coach after the resignation of the Head Coach in his senior season. He led the team to some of their best performances in the very competitive ECAC West. He returned to Lebanon Valley for the 2010-2011 season as an Assistant Coach under NHL alumnus, Tony Horacek. He helped lead the team to a 21-4-2 record during their transition from the ECAC West to the ACHA. Outside of the arena, Anastas was responsible for a number of community service events with Habitat for Humanity, and organized Lebanon Valley's first ever Wounded Warrior Military Appreciation Night, which generated over 2,500 fans and \$23,000 raised for the Wounded Warrior Project. He holds USA Hockey Level III certification and has instructed for a number of Hockey Schools, Camps and Youth Teams in both Canada and the United States.

Brian Bauer has been with the athletic training staff at WMU since 2002, and as assistant director of medical services since 2007. He is responsible for the care of the ice hockey team as well as assisting with the football team.

Brian attended Indiana State University in Terre Haute, Ind., where he received a bachelor of science degree in athletic training in 1999. He received his master's degree from Grand Valley State University in Allendale, Mich., in 2001 where he served as a graduate assistant athletic trainer for the Lakers from 1999-2001.

Brian was the medical coordinator and host for the 2010 NCAA Men's Ice Hockey Frozen Four which was held in Detroit, Mich. He has also coordinated and hosted the NCAA Men's Ice Hockey Midwest Regional four times, which has been held in Grand Rapids, Mich.

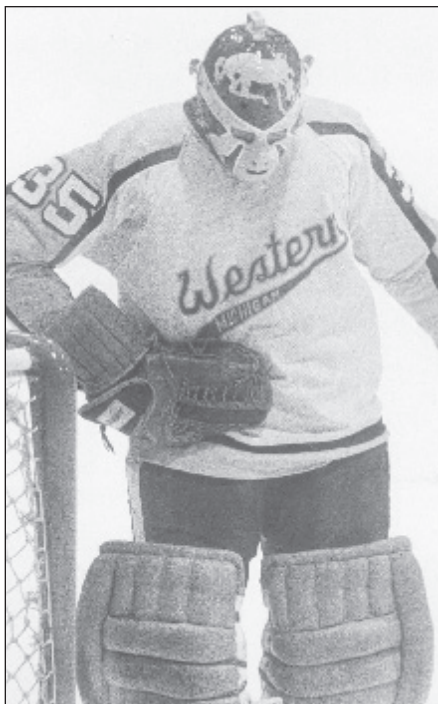

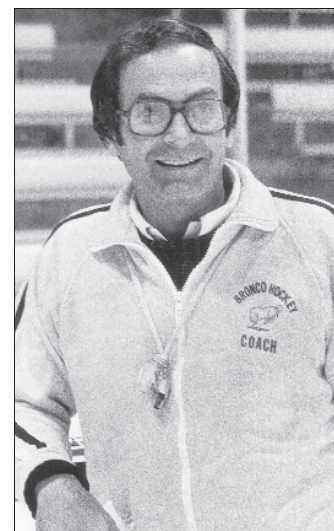

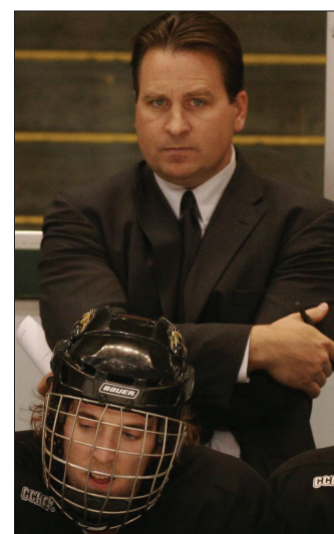
