WESTERN MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY

Western Michigan University provides the resources of a globally engaged national research university, plus the personal attention and support associated with many small private colleges. It is known for preparing students to immediately enter graduate school or the workplace, as well as for innovations such as the establishment of the WMU Homer Stryker M.D. School of Medicine in Kalamazoo.

WMU prides itself on being learner centered, discovery driven and globally engaged, and its appeal begins with its strong sense of place. Nearly 24,000 students from some 90 nations are enrolled at the University, which is located close to downtown Kalamazoo. Its highly-rated engineering campus and Business Technology and Research Park are located three miles away, while its nationally recognized aviation college is based in Battle Creek. WMU also extends its reach by offering quality academic and professional development programs online and at eight regional locations in the Michigan cities of Battle Creek, Benton Harbor, Grand Rapids, Lansing, Muskegon, Royal Oak and Traverse City.

The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching has classified WMU as one of the nation's major public research universities. It offers an academic climate with the top-notch programs, faculty, facilities and hands-on learning opportunities that students need to prepare for and excel in graduate school or the work place.

The University is large enough to provide the resources of a large research institution and still small enough to allow students one-on-one interaction with some of the world's leading scholars. Despite the University's size and complexity, students who attend WMU expect and receive personal attention from senior-level faculty. A full two-thirds of undergraduate classes have 30 or fewer students.

WMU offers more than 250 academic programs from which to choose. The University is recognized around the country as one of the best places to study in disciplines ranging from jazz studies and engineering management to creative writing, marketing, aviation and audiology.

WMU is listed as a top-100 public university by U.S. News & World Report and is one of fewer than 100 public institutions to be granted a charter by Phi Beta Kappa, America's premier honor society.

PRESIDENT



DR. EDWARD MONTGOMERY

Western Michigan President | 1st Year

Dr. Edward B. Montgomery became the ninth president of Western Michigan University on Aug. 1, 2017. He came to WMU from Georgetown University, where he had served as dean and professor of economics at that university's McCourt School of Public Policy since 2010.

Montgomery earned a bachelor's degree in economics, with honors, from Pennsylvania State University and both master's and doctoral degrees in economics from Harvard University.

During a more than 35-year academic career, Montgomery has held faculty positions at Carnegie Mellon and Michigan State universities as well as the University of Maryland, winning teaching awards some five times over the years. During his tenure at Maryland, he served for six years—2003-2009—as dean of the College of Behavioral and Social Sciences.

During President William Clinton's administration, Montgomery served as chief economist, then counselor and assistant secretary for the Department of Labor, before being named deputy secretary of labor. In the latter role, the department's second highest position, he oversaw operations of a \$33 billion federal department. During President Barack Obama's administration, Montgomery was a member of the president's auto task force and led the inter-agency White House Council for Auto Communities and Workers. That position put him in a role national media dubbed "the Auto Czar."

As a researcher, Montgomery has focused on state and local economic growth, wage and pension determination, savings behavior, productivity and economic dynamics, social insurance programs, and unions. For more than two decades, he has been a research associate at the National Bureau of Economic Research, and since 2006, he has been a fellow of Stanford University's Center for the Study of Poverty and Inequality.

Since 2011, he has served on the Comptroller General's Educators Advisory Committee in Washington's General Accountability Office. In 2011, he was elected a fellow of the

National Academy of Public Administration. He serves on the board of directors of the Center for Law and Social Policy. He also serves on the Committee on Economic Statistics for the American Economic Association.

Montgomery and his wife, Kari, a Michigan native, have three grown children—Lindsay, Elizabeth and Edward.

KATHY BEAUREGARD

Western Michigan Athletic Director | 21st Year

Kathy Beauregard, the Director of Athletics at Western Michigan University, has been involved with the Broncos in several capacities over the course of the past 36 years and begins her 21st season as Athletic Director in 2017-18

Beauregard is the longest serving athletic director in the Mid-American Conference and is just one of eight female Athletic Directors at the 128 Football Bowl Subdivision schools.

During her tenure as an Athletic Director, which began in 1997-98, Western Michigan has won 51 conference championships. Beauregard initially came to WMU in 1979 as head women's gymnastics coach. In nine seasons (1980-88), she produced two MAC title teams and was twice named the conference's coach of the year.

Last year was one of the best in history for the University as the department won the conference championship in football, and finished the season ranked 10th in the country in hockey and No. 15 in football.

Under Beauregard Bronco student-athletes have posted 21 consecutive semesters of a combined overall GPA above 3.00. The student-athlete population, in any given year, ranges from between 350-400 students.

Beauregard has received several notable recognitions for her work in college athletics and the community. In 2011, she was named the Athletic Director of the Year for the Football Subdivision in the Central Region by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA). In 2012, she became the first woman ever to receive the Gerald R. Ford Award from the Michigan Sports Hall of Fame. In 2012, she was also the recipient of the YWCA Lifetime Achievement Award. In 2000, Beauregard received the Hope College Distinguished Alumni Award from her alma mater.

Beauregard is a native of Kalamazoo and graduate of Loy Norrix High School. She earned a bachelor's degree from Hope College in 1979 and a master's degree from Western Michigan in 1981. She and husband, Rick, have a son, Brad, who graduated from WMU. Rick retired from Kalamazoo Public Schools after 32 years of service.

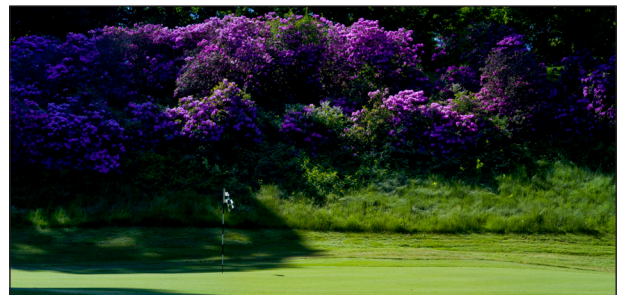

51.) ATTENDANCE RECORD

Broncos fill up the Boatyard. Western Michigan set a new single-season attendance record at Waldo Stadium and was near sell-out capacity at every home game.



22.) TWO POWER 5 WINS

The game is won in the trenches. WMU's 34-10 win at Illinois gave the Broncos their second Power 5 win. WMU dominated the running game, racking up 287 rushing yards while holding the Illini to 3 yards. WMU's offensive line pictured here.



63.) COTTON BOWL

A true classic. Western Michigan became the first team from the Mid-American Conference to play in the Cotton Bowl when the Broncos took on the Wisconsin Badgers on Jan. 2.



34.) COLLEGE GAMEDAY

Corso and crew visit Kalamazoo. WMU was chosen to host ESPN College GameDay on Nov. 19, prior to the Buffalo game, becoming just the second ever MAC school to host CGD. Corso picked the Broncos & former WMU WR Greg Jennings was the celebrity picker.



64.) CAMPBELL TROPHY

A leader on the field & in the classroom. QB Zach Terrell is WMU's second NFF National Scholar-Athlete in program history and first ever Campbell Trophy recipient. Terrell is currently pursuing his MBA after graduating with a 3.66 GPA in finance last December.



44.) 14 ALL-MAC SELECTIONS

Respect among your peers. WMU had a school-record 14 All-Mid-American Conference recognitions - 4 first team, 8 second team & 2 third team. Earning first team honors were Corey Davis, Taylor Moton, Chukwuma Okorfor and Darius Phillips.



69.) CONSENSUS ALL-AMERICAN

No argument here. WR Corey Davis became WMU's first Consensus All-American after receiving first-team All-America honors from the Associated Press, American Football Coaches Association and Football Writers Association of America.



46.) FBS RECEIVING YDS LEADER

The GOAT. Senior WR Corey Davis is the career FBS leader in yards receiving, breaking the previous record of 5,005 yards set by Trevor Insley (Nevada) against Toledo on Nov. 25. Davis finished his career with 5,285 career receiving yards.



74.) DAVIS DRAFTED NO. 5

Corey goes to Nashville. Wide receiver Corey Davis became the first wide receiver taken in the 2017 NFL Draft. He was taken No. 5 overall by the Tennessee Titans, the second-highest draft pick in Mid-American Conference history.

2017 Season Preview



Quarterback

Western Michigan enters a familiar, albeit new, era under-center in 2017. The Broncos have been used to a lineage of four-year starters at quarterback and recently had the latest four-year QB graduate as Zach Terrell ended his WMU career in 2016-17 as the all-time leading passer in program history. Terrell finished his career with 12,104 passing yards from 2013-16 and with 96 career TD passes, second most at Western Michigan.

This territory is one the Broncos have grown accustomed to having to replace legendary quarterbacks, dating back to when current head coach Tim Lester was setting records from 1996-99. Lester ended his career with 11,299 passing yards and 87 career TD passes, both third most at Western Michigan. Lester was succeeded by future quarterbacks such as Tim Hiller (2005-09) and Alex Carder (2009-12) before Terrell took the reins for the last four years. Now Lester will be charged with grooming the next leader for the Bronco offense.

The top choice for the 2017 season is redshirt sophomore **Jon Wassink**. Wassink has yet to see the field, but was highly heralded coming out of Grand Rapids Christian in 2015. He was a three-star prospect coming out of high school and was ranked No. 33 in the state by the Detroit News. He racked up 34 total touchdowns with 2,178 passing yards while rushing for 900 yards in 2014.

Providing depth for the Broncos will be redshirt sophomore **Alex Mussat** who transferred from Illinois prior to last season and redshirt freshman **Brendan Tabone** along with incoming freshman **Reece Goddard** who broke Jeremy Maclin's record with 44 touchdowns, leading Kirkwood to the Class 6 state championship.

Also serving as a walk-on will be **Chris Riddle** who comes to Kalamazoo after playing his prep career in Jacksonville, Fla., and later at the Atlanta Sports Academy. He was recruited by schools such as LSU, Florida State and Boston College before suffering an injury as a junior.



Running back

The most important thing for a young quarterback to have is a running game to help lean on as the passing game gains experience. Good news for the Broncos that their backfield was ranked No. 7 in the country this summer by Bleacher Report.

Jarvion Franklin enters 2017 as the all-time leader for rushing touchdowns at Western Michigan with 41. He is also among the top active running backs in the country entering 2017 in both yards and touchdowns. He ranks second in the nation with his 41 rushing TDs, and third in the country with 3,639. Last year against Akron, Franklin set the WMU single-game rushing record with 281 yards against the Zips. He finished the season with 1,300 yards and 12 TDs.

Jamauri Bogan was in and out of the lineup in 2016, missing six games in MAC play with a hurt ankle. He made his impact felt when he was healthy, leading the Broncos to their 38-0 win over Illinois with 24 carries for 189 yards and two TDs in Champaign. Following his injury he came back in the regular season finale to carry the ball a career-high 31 times for 198 yards and a touchdown vs. Toledo. Bogan ended the season with 179 carries for 923 yards and eight touchdowns. He now ranks sixth at Western Michigan with 24 career TDs.

LeVante Bellamy was hurt in the aforementioned game against Illinois. Prior to the injury he had 20 carries for 133 yards and a touchdown, good for a yards per carry average of 6.7. His performance in the spring has elevated him atop the depth chart of what is a crowded backfield.

Getting his most extensive playing time to date last season was redshirt sophomore **Davon Tucker**. Tucker played in 10 games, carrying the ball 44 times for 210 yards including his first career touchdown vs. UNC Central. He eclipsed 50 yards in back-to-back games against Northern Illinois and Akron.

Redshirt freshman **Matt Falcon** is a bigger back like Franklin, standing at 6-1, 210 pounds. He was ranked as the No. 12 running back in the country coming out of high school in 2016 and the 10th best overall prospect in the state of Michigan. He totaled 1,100 yards of offense and 10 touchdowns in just six games in 2014.

Blocking for the backs will be returner **Leo Ekwoke** who led the Broncos to convert four straight 4th-and-1 situations in the season opener vs. Northwestern last year.

Joining the ranks this fall will be **Prince Walker** who led his team to the state championship in 2015 after rushing for 1,399 yards and 22 touchdowns.



Wide Receiver

Much like the quarterback position, the Broncos will be looking to replace a legend at wide receiver. Corey Davis became the all-time leading receiver in college football history with 5,285 receiving yards and is second in the history of the game with 52 touchdowns. Those accolades led him to become the No. 5 pick in the NFL Draft in April, as he was taken by the Tennessee Titans. Along with losing Davis, the Broncos must also replace starters Michael Henry and Carrington Thompson who combined for 105 catches, 1,416 yards and 10 touchdowns.

With departures comes opportunity and there is no shortage of candidates to take over the roles vacated by the three aforementioned receivers. The Broncos return 59 catches from a year ago for about 600 yards and four touchdowns. The leading receiver out of that bunch is actually running back **Jarvion Franklin** who had 25 catches for 288 yards and two TDs. Sophomore **D'Wayne Eskridge** leads the effort among those slotted for wide receiver after totaling 17 catches for 121 yards and a touchdown as a true freshman. He was also used out of the slot on jet sweeps, carrying the ball six times for 60 yards.

Keishawn Watson is a redshirt sophomore who had an impressive catch last year in the rivalry game at Central Michigan. Watson was able to convert a 3rd-and-7 from the slot for 16 yards, leading the Broncos to their first score en route to a 49-10 win in Mt. Pleasant. Watson is slated for the slot receiver role, which has high standards after previously being held by Daniel Braverman and Henry.

Fellow redshirt sophomores **Anton Curtis** and **Givoanni Ricci** will join the group of those who played last season. Ricci is one of the bigger receivers on the roster at 6-3, 205 pounds. Curtis has had his standout moments in practice and is currently a leader to fill the spot left by Davis.

Another speedster who will look to make a name for himself this fall is redshirt freshman **Rodney Graves**. He was ranked the 52nd overall prospect in Michigan coming out of high school in 2016. He has been timed at a 4.40 40-yard dash. He will be joined by fellow redshirt freshmen **Hunter Broersma**, **Jaret Cutis** and **Ra'Sean Davie**.

Coming in this fall to provide immediate competition will be a group of tall receivers. **Tyron Arnett**, **Jaylen Hall** and **Luke Sanders** are each over 6-1 while a fourth receiver, **Ryan Lezzer** stands at 5-11, coming from Clearfield, Pa., where he was named All-State after playing both on offense and defense.

2017 Season Preview



Offensive Line/Tight End

WMU will be faced with the task of replacing an NFL offensive lineman for the second straight year after senior Taylor Moton was selected by the Carolina Panthers in the second round of April's NFL Draft. Moton's tenure in the NFL begins a year after the Broncos had Willie Beavers drafted by the Minnesota Vikings in the fourth round of the 2016 draft.

Fortunately for the Broncos, they could potentially have the best offensive lineman in recent history still on the team. Senior left tackle **Chukwuma "Chukes" Okorafor** was ranked as the No. 4 tackle entering the 2017 season by Mel Kiper. Okorafor measures in at 6-6, 330 pounds and was a First-Team All-MAC selection in 2016. Okorafor anchors a line that was ranked No. 4 in the country last season by *Pro Football Focus*.

The brains of the operation up front is junior center **John Keenoy**. Keenoy has started nearly every game each of his first two seasons. He was named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List in May following a season in which he was named a Second-Team All-MAC selection. He boasts a 3.7 GPA, good enough to be selected for the 2016 Academic All-MAC Team and a 2016 Distinguished Scholar Athlete.

The third returner along the offensive line will be right guard sophomore **Luke Juriga** who started all 14 games last season. He was part of a group that allowed the Broncos to rush for over 300 yards three times last season and allow just 16 sacks, 13th fewest in the country.

There will be a number of contenders to fill the spots left by Moton and left guard Jackson Day. First in line to take the place of Moton at right tackle entering will be **Zach Novoselsky**. The 6-5 redshirt junior from Lincolnshire, Ill., played in all 14 games last season on special teams. The other newcomer on the line following spring practice is **Curtis Doyle**. Another 6-5 redshirt junior, Doyle played in three games each of the last two seasons.

The Broncos have a plethora of redshirt freshmen waiting for their opportunity including **Jordan Asbury**, **Mark Brooks**, **Mike Caliendo**, **Spencer Kanz** and **Jaylon Moore** who each came in last season. Veterans waiting in the wings include 6-6 **Jonathan Todd**, **Wesley French** and **Alex Keys**.

WMU will be joined this fall by newcomers **Trevor Campbell**, **Dylan Deatherage**, **Zenden Delinger**, **Mohammad Elazazy** and **Tom O'Mara**.

Assisting in the blocking up front will be the tight end group led by all-conference tight end **Donnie Ernsberger** who also got into the passing game towards the end of the season with over 100 yards. He is backed up by veterans **Odell Miller** and **Lucas Bezerra** along with redshirt freshmen **Brett Borske** and **Mitch Heimbuch**.



Defensive Line

The Broncos' defensive line is the third unit on the team that will be looking to replace an NFL draft pick as Keion Adams was a seventh round selection in April to the Pittsburgh Steelers. He led the MAC in 2016 in tackles for loss with 18.0 while recording 7.5 sacks. His departure along with that of nose tackle David Curle gives the team two spots to fill along the front four.

The primary player who will be looking to fill Adams' shoes will be junior **Eric Assoua** who had 6.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks last season. His breakout game came against Illinois where he had 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble. He also added two of the team's eight sacks at rival Central Michigan.

The other returner on the defensive line is tackle **Andre Turner**. He had 35 tackles and 4.0 tackles for loss to go along with 2.0 sacks providing an inside rush. He joined in the sack fest at Central, picking up his first sack of the year, one of seven total tackles.

Candidates to fill the spots vacated by Adams and Curle are **Nick Matich** inside and **Antonio Balabani** on the end. Matich missed last season with an injury. He totaled 16 tackles as a freshman in 2014. Balabani played in spot duty last season.

Players hoping to see more extensive time on the field this year are ends **DeShawn Foster** and **Daniel Jackson** along with tackles **Ken Finley**, **Ken Aguirre** and **Kailen Guillory**. Finley and Aguirre each provide size in the middle with Finley coming in at 6-2 290 pounds while Aguirre is 6-1 300 pounds. Guillory is the tallest of the group, standing at 6-5.

The Broncos will have a lot of options from the incoming freshmen as well as the team will see three new linemen join the group. **Ali Fayad** is an end from Dearborn where he had 17.0 sacks last season. **Ralph Holly** is one of the bigger freshmen at 6-2, 270 pounds. He led St. Mary's Prep to three straight state championships. Rounding out the trio is **Dez Lance** who showed a propensity for the end zone, recording a touchdown on offense and defense.



Linebackers

Like the running backs mentioned for the offense, Western Michigan's most stable position on defense is the linebacking core that could feature three seniors starting. **Robert Spillane**, who made two of the most iconic plays in program history, forcing a fumble at Northwestern and intercepting a pass in the final seconds to clinch the MAC Championship vs. Ohio, will be back for his fourth season. He joins **Caleb Bailey** and **Asantay Brown** in the team's 4-3 setup.

Spillane finished the season with a team-high 111 tackles, including 10.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks. His interception vs. Ohio was one of three on the year for him. He ended the season being named to the All-MAC Second-Team and was MAC Defensive Player of the Week four times.

Brown joined Spillane with another memorable interception on the season. Facing Toledo in a battle of undefeated teams in MAC play in the regular season finale, Brown picked off a Rocket pass on the first play from scrimmage and took it back 21 yards for a touchdown. He made the conversion from safety to linebacker last fall and acclimated nicely, finishing the 2016 season with 95 tackles, second most on the team. He also had 8.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks.

Bailey continued his steady play through his first three seasons. A year after being among the tops in the MAC in tackles for loss, Bailey also generated sacks to his resume, getting one in each of the first two games of the season. His third sack of the season came in the Cotton Bowl vs. Wisconsin. He ended the year fourth on the team with 71 tackles, 9.0 tackles for loss and the 3.0 sacks.

Two players who will be right behind the starting three will be redshirt sophomore **Alex Grace** who can fill multiple positions in the linebacking core along with one of the best athletes on the team in sophomore **Drake Spears**. Grace played in 12 games last season, totaling 12 tackles and a tackle for loss. Spears started as a special teams ace before seeing time in base defense later in the season. He finished the year with 10 tackles. Also fighting to see the field is redshirt freshman Joseph Miller whose father Doug was on the 1988 MAC Championship team.

The Broncos have a plethora of freshmen coming in to fill the spots in the future which will be left by the three starting seniors. Six linebackers will come into the fold this season two of which came in January, transfer **Najee Clayton** from Rutgers and **Treshaun Hayward**. Joining that duo will be **Dwayne Chapman**, **Derrick Hubbard**, **Corvin Moment** and **Tanner Motz**.

2017 Season Preview



Defensive Backs

The third level of the defense, the secondary, was a big reason the Broncos led the nation in turnover margin last season at +18. The group finished the season with 15 interceptions, 22nd most in the country. Leading the charge was **Darius Phillips** who had four to lead all Broncos. Three of those interceptions were returned for touchdowns, giving him four for his career. Both his single season and career marks are MAC records.

Phillips is one of three returning starters in the secondary, joining fellow cornerback, junior **Sam Beal** and redshirt sophomore safety **Justin Tranquill**. Beal provides one of the bigger frames in the MAC for a cornerback, standing at 6-1. He had eight pass breakups last season. Tranquill was third on the team in tackles in his first season of extensive playing time, totaling 89 tackles to go along with 2.0 tackles for loss. He also stood out in the classroom as he was named a 2016 Distinguished Scholar Athlete.

Joining the three aforementioned starters in the secondary will be redshirt sophomore **Davotae Ginwright** who had three starts of his own last season. Ginwright burst on the scene in the season opener at Northwestern with three pass breakups. He provides length at safety, measuring at 6-2.

Looking to push the starters will be corners **Emanuel Jackson** and **Obbie Jackson**. Obbie played in the nickel packages last year and will battle with Beal for the starting spot opposite Phillips. In his 14 games last year Obbie registered four pass breakups.

Backing up the safeties will be a pair of sophomores in **Stefan Claiborne** and **Brad Tanner** who were able to see the field in their first year on campus last season. Claiborne played in nine games while Tanner played in 12 games. Both registered six tackles.

Other players looking to make their mark include **Malik Rucker**, **Dontre Boyd**, **Calin Crawford** and **Latrell Levanduski**. They will be competing for spots along with incoming freshmen **K.J. Anderson** and **A.J. Thomas**.



Special Teams

Along with being a leader for the Bronco secondary, senior **Darius Phillips** is also a leader for the team's special teams unit. He was named the 2016 MAC Special Teams Player of the Year after returning a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown. He now has four kickoff returns for a touchdown in his career while the punt return for a TD came in just his second career opportunity. For the season Phillips averaged 22.5 yards per kick return and 11.7 yards per punt return.

The team also returns its punter/holder from last season in redshirt junior **Derrick Mitchell** who was an Academic All-MAC selection. The former professional baseball player had 17 punts for an average of 41.3 yards last season as he split duties with James Coleman who graduated. Mitchell also served as the team's primary kickoff specialist when healthy, as he totaled 21 touchbacks in 58 attempts.

Mitchell will be holding for a new kicker on field goal attempts this season following the departure of freshman Butch Hampton who was named a freshman all-american after going 5-for-5 in the MAC Championship on field goal attempts. Western Michigan signed **Josh Grant** from Flower Mound, Texas in February and should be in good position to replace Hampton's productivity from last season as Grant was ranked the No. 9 kicker in the nation coming out of high school.

Providing Grant with competition will be **Austin Regan** who served as the kicker for the team during spring practice. Regan has been on the team for each of the last three seasons and has a strong leg.

Leading the field goal operation is long snapper **Wyatt Pfeifer** who is entering his senior year. He has been the snapper for every game each of the last three seasons and was an All-MAC nominee last season.



Coaching Staff

Returning to Kalamazoo for his third term as a Bronco is the newest head coach of Western Michigan, **Tim Lester**. Lester was a quarterback from WMU from 1996-99 where he put up the third most passing yards in program history (11,299) and the third most TD passes with 87. Following graduation he came back in 2005 as a quarterback coach. He has also been a head coach at Saint Joseph's and Elmhurst College prior to being a quarterback coach/offensive coordinator at Syracuse and Purdue. As a head coach at Saint Joseph's and Elmhurst he had a combined record of 40-23.

Lester's favorite passing target while playing was tight end **Jake Moreland** and Moreland now also comes back to WMU for his third stint as a Bronco. He also played from 1996-99 and then was the tight ends coach for the team from 2005-11. Upon leaving WMU in 2011 he was the tight ends coach at Syracuse and Air Force. He will now serve as co-offensive coordinator/offensive line coach for the Broncos.

Other former assistant coaches to return to Western Michigan are **Tim Daoust (DC)** and **Lou Esposito (Co-DC/DL)**. Daoust was an assistant at WMU from 2006-09 before going to Syracuse and most recently Ball State where he was defensive coordinator. Esposito was in Kalamazoo from 2010-12 and then went on to become the first head coach in the history of Davenport University.

New faces to the program include offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Kevin Johns** who was the OC at Indiana. While there the Hoosiers became the fourth team in FBS history with a 3,500 yard passer, two 1,000-yard rushers and one 1,000-yard receiver.

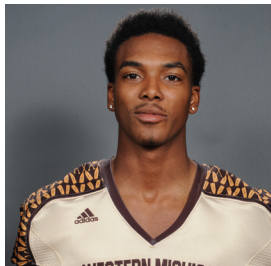
Running backs coach **Eric Evans** comes to the Broncos from Dayton where he was offensive coordinator for three years. He led the Flyers to a 19-4 record over the past two seasons and finished top-10 in numerous offensive categories.

Wide receivers coach **Ashton Aikens** was most recently at Southern Illinois for three seasons. He played his college ball at Northwestern hauling in 70 receptions for 733 yards.

Defensive backs coach **Cory Sanders** played for Lester at Saint Joseph's College. He was most recently the defensive coordinator for West Florida where the team ranked 11th in the country. He was head coach for his alma mater in 2011, leading the Pumas to a 24-19 record.

Familiar faces staying on with the Broncos include **Bill Kenney (TE)** and **David Duggan (LB/ST)**. Kenney has been with the Broncos since 2013 while Duggan came prior to the start of last season.

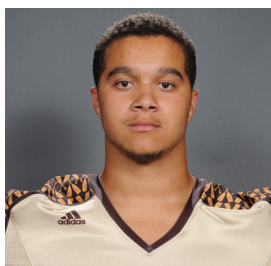

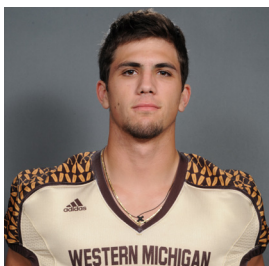

Tim Lester was named the 16th head football coach in school history on Friday, Jan. 13, 2017.

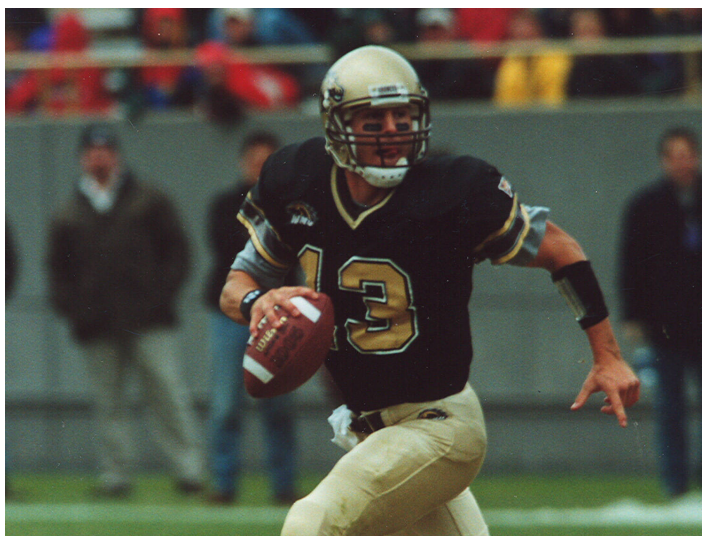
Lester has risen through the coaching ranks after completing a Hall of Fame playing career at Western Michigan. Lester was a four-year starter at quarterback at WMU from 1996-99, leading the Broncos to a Mid-American Conference championship appearance his senior season. Lester also made a stop as an assistant coach at his alma mater during the 2005 and 2006 seasons.

Lester began his coaching career in 2003 and most recently was the quarterbacks coach at Purdue this past season where he mentored sophomore signal-caller David Blough. Blough threw for 25 touchdowns and 3,352 yards, averaging over 279 yards passing a game in 2016.

Lester came to the Boilermakers from Syracuse, where he served as quarterbacks coach from 2013 to 2015 and doubled as offensive coordinator in 2014 and 2015 as well.

Prior to working at Syracuse, Lester was the head coach at Division III Elmhurst (Illinois) College from 2008 to 2012. Over five seasons, he posted a 33-19 record for a .635 winning percentage, second highest in school history. In his final season in 2012, he led the Blue Jays to a 10-2 record and a CCIW conference championship as well as Elmhurst's first-ever NCAA playoff appearance. It was just the third championship in school history and the first title since 1980. Lester was named the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin Coach of the Year that season.

Lester served as an assistant at North Central College (2007) and Elmhurst (2002-03). He was the head coach at Division II Saint Joseph's College in 2004, leading the Pumas to a five-game improvement his first season from the year prior (2-9

to 7-4 record) on his way to Independent Football Alliance Coach of the Year honors. In addition, Lester coached at the prep level, serving as offensive coordinator at Saint Benedict High School in 2001 and at his alma mater, Wheaton Warrenville South High School in 2000.

Lester began his playing career at Western Michigan earning MAC Freshman of the Year honors in 1996. He would be a Second Team All-MAC selection his junior and senior seasons.

Lester finished his WMU career ranked fourth in FBS history in passing yards (11,299) and sixth in touchdown passes (89). Lester set 17 school passing records and eight MAC records. Following his senior season, in which he threw for 3,639 yards and 34 touchdowns, Lester participated in the 1999 Blue-Gray Classic.

As an assistant coach at WMU he coached quarterback Tim Hiller to MAC Freshman of the Year accolades in 2005. Lester was WMU's first QB to throw for over 11,000 career yards and Hiller went on to become the second.

After college, Lester played with the Chicago Enforcers of the XFL in 2001, the Nashville Kats and Carolina Cobras of the Arena Football League in 2001, and the Memphis Xplorers of the Arena Football League 2 in 2002.

A native of Wheaton, Illinois, Lester earned his bachelor's degree in mathematics from Western Michigan in 2000. He was inducted into the Western Michigan Athletic Hall of Fame in 2011.

Kevin Johns is in his first season as the offensive coordinator/quarterback coach at Western Michigan after spending six seasons at Indiana University, including three as the offensive coordinator after three years as co-offensive coordinator.

During his career, Johns was named the top wide receivers coach in the Big Ten in 2011 by Rivals.com. He mentored notable receivers such as Cody Latimer who went on to be selected in the second round of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Denver Broncos. Another receiver, Shane Wynn, ended his career tied for second in receptions (189), third in kick return yardage (1,854) tied for third in receiving touchdowns (20), fourth in all-purpose yardage (4,429), seventh in receiving yardage (2,198) and tied for eighth in total touchdowns (25) on the IU career lists and went on to play for the Jacksonville Jaguars.

Johns also coached quarterbacks at IU, where he had the opportunity to coach Nate Sudfeld who became the first Hoosier quarterback to be drafted since 2003 when he was drafted in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft by the Washington Redskins.

Sudfeld finished his career first in passing touchdowns (61), passing yardage (7,879), 350-yard games (6), 300-yard games (11), 250-yard games (13), 200-yard games (19), four-touchdown games (5) and three-touchdown games (10), tied for first in 400-yard games (1), second in completion percentage (60.3) and completions (593), third in total offense (8,011) and fourth in attempts (983) on IU's career lists in 37 games (26 starts).

During his tenure at Indiana, the Hoosiers offense set 54 school records, including points, total yardage, passing yardage and rushing yardage in a single season. His unit topped the Big Ten in passing offense in 2012, 2013 and 2015. From 2012-15, IU was first in the Big Ten in passing yardage, second in total yardage, and fourth in rushing yardage per game. In 2016, the team was second in passing and third in total yardage.

Johns showed the ability to create a balanced offense in 2015 when the Hoosiers became the fourth team in FBS history with a 3,500-yard passer, two 1,000-yard rushers and one 1,000-yard receiver in the same year. That year, IU led the Big Ten in total offense, scoring offense and passing offense, becoming the first B1G team since Ohio State in 1995 to do so.

In 2014, Johns' unit set the program single-season record with 3,163 rushing yards and averaged 263.6 rushing yards per game (ninth nationally, and third in the Big Ten) in 2014. It came a year after the Hoosiers were one of six teams (Baylor, Colorado State, Florida State, Marshall and Oregon) nationally to rank in the top 30 in scoring, total, passing and rushing offense and one of three programs (Baylor and Florida State) to average over 300 passing yards and 200 rushing yards in 2013.

The 2013 Hoosier offense also became the first team in Big Ten history and the only team in the FBS with five 1,000-yard pass-catchers playing together at one time led by Latimer who earned second team All-Big Ten honors and closed out his career tied for fourth in

100-yard games (7th) and seventh in yardage (2,042) and catches (135) on the Indiana all-time lists. Wynn finished second in the B1G and tied for 19th nationally with 11 touchdowns, which ranks third on the IU single-season chart.

Prior to his time in Bloomington, Ind., Johns spent the 2004-10 seasons at Northwestern University, including the last five as wide receivers coach. He was running backs coach in 2004 and 2005 and was appointed recruiting coordinator in July of 2006, a position he held until January of 2008, when he assumed the role of passing game coordinator. He also served as NU's offensive graduate assistant for three seasons from 1999-2001 under former Indiana head coach Kevin Wilson, who served as offensive coordinator.

Between stints at Northwestern, Johns worked as the University of Richmond's receivers coach for the 2002 and 2003 seasons.

During his playing days, he was a starting quarterback at the University of Dayton, Johns recorded a 20-1 record and was named a Division I-AA All-American. Johns graduated from Dayton with a bachelor of science degree in mathematics in 1998. In August 2001, he received his master's degree from Northwestern's School of Education and Social Policy.

Kevin and his wife, Krista, have twin sons, Logan and Tyler, and a third son, Carter.

Tim Daoust is in his first season as Western Michigan's defensive coordinator. This is his second stint with the Broncos after coaching the defensive line and secondary from 2006-09. Daoust most recently comes to Kalamazoo from Ball State where he was for the 2016 season.

During the 2016 season he led the Cardinals to its best single-game performance in 10 years when it sacked Eastern Kentucky eight times. In that game, Ball State allowed just three rushing yards, the fewest since Nov. 24, 2007. For the season, the Cardinals created pressure, finishing in the top-30 in the FBS and second in the MAC in both sacks and tackles for loss

Prior to going to Muncie, Daoust was at Syracuse from 2011-15, serving as the defensive line coach and special teams coordinator. While there he helped the Orangemen win two bowl games, the 2012 Pinstripe Bowl and 2013 Texas Bowl and capture a share of the 2012 Big East Championship.

He coached two Orange players who were later drafted in the NFL Draft - defensive lineman Jason Bromley in the third round of the 2013 draft by the N.Y. Giants and defensive lineman Chandler Jones in the first round of the 2012 draft by the New England Patriots. He also mentored the No. 2 ranked punt returner in the nation in 2015, in Brisly Estime who averaged 18.1 yards per return. In 2015, Syracuse's defense scored the most non-offensive touchdowns in the ACC in 2015 (six).

In his first stint in Kalamazoo, Daoust was part of a Bronco staff that set the previous high for most wins in a season in 2008 with nine, before being broken in 2016. His 2006 squad led the nation in both interceptions (24) and sacks (46).

During his coaching career he has also spent time at Central Michigan, Cincinnati, Illinois State and Northern Illinois.

Daoust played four years of collegiate football at Wittenberg as a defensive end (1998-01). While there, he posted 27.5 career sacks, second most in school history. He was a two-time captain and had a four-year record of 45-5 with four league titles and four appearances in NCAA Division III national playoffs.

Jake Moreland is in his first season as offensive line coach at Western Michigan. Moreland is no stranger to Kalamazoo, as he owns the second-most receiving yards by a tight end in program history (1,414) after playing at WMU from 1996-99. This will also mark his second coaching stint at Western Michigan after serving as an assistant coach from 2004-12.

Moreland returns to Kalamazoo after coaching stints at Syracuse and two at Air Force, first from 2012-14 and again last season. During his tenure in Colorado Springs, Moreland oversaw the development of several key contributors to a 10-win team including the Arizona Bowl Championship. Players he developed include Garrett Griffin who signed with the New Orleans Saints last summer.

Throughout his coaching career, tight ends have had a period of success under Moreland, with three becoming semifinalists for the John Mackey Award given to the nation's top tight end. In 2008, Brandon Ledbetter finished his career with the most TDs by a tight end in program history (20) and recorded three consecutive seasons with at least six TDs. Three different tight ends scored six TDs in 2009.

In 2007, tight ends accounted for 10 of WMU's 23 scoring strikes (43 percent). Tight ends accounted for nearly 22 percent of the Broncos' aerial scores in 2008 and helped the offensive line block for the program's 15th 1,000-yard rusher. During his first season back with the Broncos, Moreland had Tony Scheffler, ranked fourth in Mackey Award voting and a first-team All-MAC offense honoree, at his disposal and he came through with 670 yards and nine scoring grabs. The tight end arsenal did not end there for Moreland as Ledbetter also came through in 2005 with a pair of touchdowns on 11 catches.

Scheffler was selected 61st overall in the 2006 NFL Draft by the Denver Broncos. In two seasons, Scheffler hauled in 67 receptions for 835 yards and nine touchdowns. He grabbed five scoring receptions in 2007, bettering his rookie mark by one.

Moreland served as special teams coordinator and offensive assistant for Saint Joseph's College in 2004. During his tutelage, the Pumas set school records in seven offensive categories. Prior to arriving in Rensselaer, Moreland made his coaching debut at Elmhurst College in 2003. Working with tight ends, Moreland helped Elmhurst set 11 offensive records and record its first winning season in 15 years.

Moreland lettered four seasons with the Broncos (1996-99), and caught more passes (143) than any other tight end in school history and is tied for second in TDs (13) among tight ends. Moreland earned All-MAC second-team honors and was tabbed WMU's offensive MVP in 1999. Moreland made the All-MAC first team in 1998. Moreland went on to a pro-

Eric Evans is in his first season at Western Michigan as the running backs coach. Evans comes to Kalamazoo after coaching for three years as the Dayton offensive coordinator.

He had two stints at Dayton, with the first coming as a graduate assistant from 2004-06. During his most recent stop, the Flyers went a combined 19-4 over the last two seasons and finished in the top 10 in numerous offensive categories. While also serving as quarterback coach, he developed Alex Jeske into a Pioneer Football League all-conference selection.

In 2014 he worked with quarterback Will Bardo who finished second in Dayton history in career yardage. Bardo upped his completion percentage by 10 points in one season after working with Evans.

In addition to working at Dayton, Evans also coached at Northwestern, UAB and Albany. At Northwestern, he was a graduate assistant for two years. He assisted with the quarterbacks, wide receivers and tight ends and helped build the Big Ten Conference's top passing offense at 307.9 yards per game.

He was at Albany for five seasons where he coached wide receivers and handled offensive quality control. Two of his wideouts, Ryan Kirchner and Tim Bush, finished first and second in career receptions at Albany. The Great Danes won Northeast Conference championships three times in those five years. They won the Gridiron Classic in 2008 and played in the NCAA FCS playoffs in 2011. Also in 2011, Evans participated at the NCAA Coaches' Academy.

During his first term at Dayton, Evans coached tight ends and was part of the offensive staff that transitioned the Flyer attack from running the option out of the I formation to its current spread passing attack. One of Evans' pupils, Matt Champa, was Dayton's first tight end All-American in 55 years.

Before going back to Dayton, Evans also spent one season at UAB. As the running back coach for the Blazers, he coached Jordan Howard, who finished second nationally in rushing yards by a freshman. Howard would go on to be drafted by the Chicago Bears in the 2016 NFL Draft. Another one of his pupils, Darrin Reaves, signed in 2014 with the Carolina Panthers as an undrafted free agent.

As an undergraduate at DePauw University in Indiana, Evans spent four years as a student assistant. He was involved in game preparation and gained experience coaching tight ends, wide receivers and quarterbacks. He was the 2003 recipient of DePauw's Kenneth Brooks Holland Memorial Award.

He received his B.A. in kinesiology with a minor in history. A

TIGHT ENDS / OFFENSIVE TACKLES COACH

5TH SEASON
NORWICH, 1982

Bill Kenney brings nearly three decades of experience at the Big Ten level to the Western Michigan football program as the tight ends/offensive tackles coach for the Broncos.

Last season, Kenney saw improvement out of both the tight ends and the offensive tackles, with two-first team selections to the All-MAC team for left tackle Chukwuma Okorafor and right tackle Taylor Moton. Tight end Donnie Ernsberger earned third-team honors after improving his receiving game, totaling nine catches in 2016.

Moton got even more praise after the year, being named an all-american and drafted in the second round by the Carolina Panthers.

Kenney coached left tackle Willie Beavers to All-MAC First-Team honors in 2015. It makes him the first Bronco offensive lineman since 2012 to earn first-team honors.

Individually, Beavers was invited to the Reese's Senior Bowl and NFL Combine after the season. *NFL.com* projected Beavers as the fifth best tackle in the draft. The Broncos had not had an offensive lineman drafted since 1995 prior to Beavers being selected in the fourth round in May by the Minnesota Vikings.

As a team Kenney coached the tackles and tight ends, led by Ernsberger, to propel a Bronco rushing attack that ran for 204.2 yards per game, 29th in the country and second in the MAC. The team also ran it in 28 times for TDs which ranked 30th nationally with an average of 2.2 times per game.

In his second season Kenney's work with the offensive tackles and tight ends helped produce the MAC's Offensive Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year in Jarvion Franklin. The potent running attack proved too much for several opponents as the Broncos had one of the top running attacks in the MAC.

Kenney brings 31 years of coaching experience to the Broncos with a bulk of that coming at Penn State University where he began as a graduate assistant (1988) and worked with the offensive line from 1989-2011. He took on the role of recruiting coordinator in 1992-95 and worked directly with offensive tackles and tight ends from 2000-11.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Kenney coached six All-Americans and 18 All-Big Ten players. He coached 10 Academic All-Americans and 47 Academic All-Big Ten players.

Kenney developed 30 NFL players, 25 draft picks and five free agents, all of whom received their degrees from PSU. He recruited 32 NFL draft picks, including five first round picks. His offensive line paved the way for Larry Johnson to rush for a program record 2,587 yards and helped produce

eight 1,000-yard rushers since 2002.

His offensive line ranked fourth nationally in sacks allowed in 2008, allowing just 13 sacks. In 2005 the Penn State offensive line allowed fewer than 15 sacks and finished second in the Big Ten in rushing and scoring.

Prior to joining Penn State, Kenney served as a graduate assistant at Nebraska (1986-87) and worked at his alma mater, Norwich University, in the offensive backfield in 1982. Kenney was a three-year starter at Norwich as a tight end/fullback and was team co-captain in 1981.

Kenney (56/DOB: 10/3/60) and his wife, Kathryn, have three children, Joseph, Matthew and Jacqueline.

WIDE RECEIVERS COACH

1ST SEASON
NORTHWESTERN, 2005

Ashton Aikens is in his first season as Western Michigan’s wide receiver coach. He comes to the Broncos after serving as the Southern Illinois wide receiver coach for three years.

While with the Salukis, Aikens saw the offense explode nationally, ranking in the top 10 each of the last two seasons in passing offense. The team was tops in the Missouri Valley Conference in both total offense and scoring offense the last two seasons.

In 2016, Southern Illinois was the only program in FCS football with four 500-yard receivers during the regular season. Under Aikens’s guidance, Billy Reed became a two-time All-MVFC receiver on the field and a two-time Academic All-District selection for his work in the classroom. Reed ended his career ninth at SIU in career receptions and sixth in career receiving yards.

In his first season at SIU, Southern Illinois caught a program record 29 touchdowns. The next season, the Salukis broke the program record for receiving yards per game in 2015 and then broke that record again just one year later.

Receiver Jimmy Jones earned a spot on the MVFC All-Newcomer team in 2015. Jones led all MVFC freshmen in receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns per game.

In his first season at Southern, Aikens helped a pair of the best receivers in school history cap historic careers. LaSteven McKinney finished his career third in program history with 149 receptions, while MyCole Pruitt set the school record with 221. Pruitt ranks second in school history with 2,601 career receiving yards, and McKinney ranks 12th with 1,407.

Prior to going to SIU, Aikens spent the previous two years coaching at Northwestern in charge of special teams quality control. A four-year letterwinner at wide receiver for Northwestern, Aikens brings with him eight years of coaching and playing experience at the collegiate level.

In 2013, Aikens coached Northwestern kicker Jeff Budzien, who was a second-team Walter Camp All-American, a first-team All-Big Ten selection and received the Big Ten’s Bakken-Andersen kicker of the year award. In 2012 he worked with All-American punt returner Venric Mark at Northwestern. Mark led the nation with an average of 20.1 yards per return. The 2012 Wildcats won 10 games and defeated Mississippi State in the Gator Bowl. That year’s team ranked third in the Big Ten in net punting.

Prior to his return to Northwestern, Aikens spent two years as an assistant coach at Trinity International University in Deerfield, Ill. He spent his first year there as a graduate assistant coach working with wide receivers and tight ends and also assisting with special teams coordination. In 2011, he

became a full-time assistant as the wide receivers coach and special teams coordinator.

Aikens was a four-year wide out at Northwestern under head coach Randy Walker after playing running back at Detroit Country Day High School. Aikens hauled in 70 receptions for 733 yards in his career at NU. As a senior, he had 32 catches for 401 yards and received Northwestern’s Rashidi Wheeler Award, which is given annually to the player who best embodies the spirit and enthusiasm of the late Northwestern safety.

He and his wife, Carla, were married in July of 2011. They have two sons, Ashton and Robert.

DAVID DUGGAN

SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR/LINEBACKERS COACH

2ND SEASON
NEW HAMPSHIRE, 1986

David Duggan is in his second season at Western Michigan coaching the linebackers. This season he will also add the duty of being the special teams coordinator. He comes to Kalamazoo after a few seasons at Southern Miss.

Last year he helped improve the Bronco defense dramatically. Robert Spillane, who was coming off a knee injury that ended his 2015 season, leads the Broncos in tackles with 105. He made the two most critical plays of the year defensively, forcing a fumble on Northwestern's final drive and intercepting Ohio with a minute to go to preserve the perfect 13-0 regular season.

Asantay Brown has also received All-MAC recognition this year. He had the highlight of the night vs. Toledo, intercepting a pass on the first play of the game and returning it 21 yards for a touchdown.

At his second stop with Southern Miss from 2013-15, Duggan recently led one of the best turnarounds in the FBS in the 2015 season, taking the Golden Eagles from a 3-9 record in 2014 to a 9-5 record in 2015 which included a berth in the Conference USA Championship game as well as a berth in the Heart of Dallas Bowl against the University of Washington. His defense ranked third in C-USA along with the top ranked player in interceptions as Kalan Reed had four.

Prior to returning to Southern Miss, Duggan was at North Carolina in 2012 where he was the outline linebackers coach and special teams coordinator with the Tar Heels. He helped lead the team to an 8-4 finish, the best winning percentage in the program since 1997. The team blocked three punts and returned a kickoff for a touchdown.

His first stop in Hattiesburg had the Golden Eagles set an NCAA record for most interceptions returned for touchdowns with 12. He coached eventual NFL draft pick Jamie Collins who went to the New England Patriots.

Aside from his college days, Duggan was the head coach of the Cologne Centurions of NFL Europe from 2006-07. His defense ranked No. 1 in the overseas league both seasons. He spent a total of six seasons in NFL Europe with Cologne along with the Berlin Thunder. He was a member of the staff that won the World Bowl in 2001 and 2002 with Berlin.

Duggan also had multiple stops in the northeast, coaching at Brown, Colgate, Holy Cross, New Hampshire and Alleghany College. He earned his Bachelor's degree from New Hampshire in 1986 where he played from 1982-86.

Duggan and his wife, Lynn, have two daughters Olivia and Grace.

LOU ESPOSITO

CO-DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR/DEFENSIVE LINE COACH

4TH SEASON
MEMPHIS, 2001

Lou Esposito begins his second stint at Western Michigan as the defensive coordinator/defensive line coach. He comes back to Kalamazoo after serving as the first head coach in Davenport University's program since 2014. He compiled a 6-5 record in the team's inaugural season this past year.

During his first stop in Kalamazoo from 2010-12, Esposito coached the defensive line. While working with the unit, he coached the MAC Defensive Player of the Year, Drew Nowak, in 2011. Nowak led the league in sacks with 2011. Nowak went on to be named a Phil Steele All-American. Esposito also coached Freddie Bishop who went on to play for the New York Jets in the NFL.

At Davenport, the Panthers played their inaugural season in 2016, going 6-5. The team ranked first in the Wolverine Hoosier Athletic Conference in kickoff returns and second in rush defense. Off the field he was in charge of recruiting 125 student-athletes in two years to establish the program and oversee a multi-million-dollar fundraising campaign for the new football facility.

Prior to his time at Davenport, Esposito was defensive coordinator at Ferris State University. While there he improved the rush defense from 13th in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference to first in a single season and ranked in the top-25 in two of the national polls. He led a defense that finished in the Top-5 in many GLIAC statistical categories under his guidance in 2013. Ferris State led the GLIAC in total defense (356.5 ypg) along with rushing defense (136.1 ypg) and team passing efficiency defense (115.30)

A past Division I offensive lineman at the University of Memphis, Esposito spent five years as the head coach at Division II Saint Joseph's (Ind.) before moving to Western Michigan. At St. Joseph's, Esposito was the Great Lakes Football Conference Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2009 and posted a 30-25 record while recording a 100% graduation rate for four year athletes in his six years guiding the program. He led the team to a pair of GLFC championships in 2006 and 2009.

He coached 23 All-GLFC student-athletes in 2009 alone, ranking first in both rushing offense and defense. The Pumas also had the top-ranked red zone offense in the GLFC, boasting the 2009 GLFC Offensive Player of the Year and an unblemished record in conference play.

During his playing days at Memphis, Esposito was a 4-year letterwinner on the offensive line and served as the team captain in 1999 and 2000. Upon graduation, Lou signed a professional contract with the Arena Football League's Memphis Explorers and went on to coach on the Xplorers'

DEFENSIVE BACKS COACH

1ST SEASON
SAINT JOSEPH'S, 2007

Cory Sanders is in his first season as Western Michigan's defensive back coach. Sanders comes to Western Michigan after serving as the University of West Florida's first defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach beginning in 2014.

Sanders comes to WMU with 11 years of coaching experience at the college level, including four as a Division II head coach.

In 2016, Sanders' attacking defense ranked 11th in the country with 3.6 sacks per game and 26th with 8.2 tackles for loss. The Argonauts' front four was particularly strong against the run, yielding 130 yards per game to rank fourth in the Gulf South Conference and 50th nationally.

UWF totaled 21 turnovers with 16 interceptions and five fumble recoveries. The Argos ranked 31st in Division 2 in INTs.

UWF finished its inaugural season with a 5-6 mark - the most for a first-year Division 2 program in a decade. The Argonauts also collected a pair of shutouts and held opponents to four scores or less four times.

Safety Trent Archie was named the GSC Defensive Freshman of the Year and later grabbed a spot on the All-Super Region 2 second team.

Prior to his arrival in Pensacola, Sanders spent the previous five years with the coaching staff at his alma mater, Saint Joseph's College in Rensselaer, Ind. He was the team's defensive coordinator in 2010 before being promoted to head coach in 2011. During his four years as head coach, the Pumas went 24-19 with a mark of 15-8 in the Great Lakes Valley Conference. In his second year in 2012, he led the team to a 6-5 record to mark the team's first winning record since 2006.

Sanders finished his time at Saint Joseph's on a high note, leading the team to eight wins in each of his last two seasons. The team boasted one of the top defenses in Division II over those last two years, ranking 15th in scoring defense in 2014 (17.9 points allowed per game) and 14th in total defense in 2013 (305.4 yards allowed per game). The Pumas also broke the school record for total offense (4,594 yards) in 2013 and ranked 14th in the nation in rushing offense (242.6 yards per game) in 2014. During his time as head coach, he had 36 players earn All-GLVC awards.

Sanders started his coaching career in 2007 as a defensive backs coach at North Central College, a Division III school in Naperville, Ill. After one season at North Central, he moved on to coach defensive backs at Elmhurst College, a Division III school in Elmhurst, Ill. At both of those stops he helped develop weekly game plans with the defensive coordinator, and he was also Elmhurst's video coordinator.

As a student-athlete at Saint Joseph's, Sanders was a three-time

He helped lead the Pumas to two conference championships, and he was the team's Defensive Most Valuable Player in 2005. He appeared in 44 games in his career, totaling 240 tackles and 10.5 sacks. He ranks fifth in school history with 30.5 tackles for loss.

Sanders received his bachelor's degree in business administration with a minor in mass communications from Saint Joseph's College in 2007.

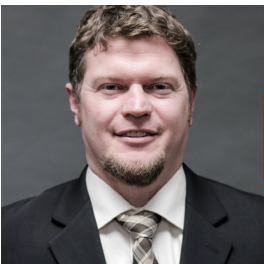

Gavin Roberts is in his first season as the assistant director of strength and conditioning at Western Michigan. Roberts comes to Kalamazoo after serving as an assistant strength and conditioning coach at Purdue.

Roberts worked with the Boilermakers since 2013 following his playing days as a running back for the University from 2008-12. As part of the strength and conditioning program he designed, implemented and participated in training programs for baseball, basketball and football. He also worked with them on rehabilitation from minor injuries.

Away from Purdue, Roberts also worked at Bommartio's Performance Systems where NFL stars such as Leveon Bell, Jordan Reed, Tyrod Taylor, Ezekiel Elliot and Lawrence Timmons train in the offseason and for combine preparations.

Roberts has his masters from Purdue and is a NSCA certified strength and conditioning specialist.

This is the Mid-American Conference

Providing leadership in education and diversity, the Mid-American Conference moves into its 72nd year of service to our students.

Since its inception in 1946, the Mid-American Conference has progressively grown and developed into one of the most aggressive Division I conferences in the country. One of only 10 football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences, the MAC named Dr. Jon A. Steinbrecher as its eighth commissioner in March of 2009.

The league has grown its commitment to championship events as it hosts championships in 23 sports, including neutral site events at some of the finest facilities in the nation – football (Ford Field, Detroit), men's and women's basketball (Quicken Loans Arena, Cleveland), softball (Firestone Stadium, Akron) and baseball (All Pro Freight Stadium, Avon, Ohio). The MAC secured a four-year contract extension with Ford Field to host the MAC Football Championship Game through the 2019 football season, anchored a six-year contract extension for the MAC Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments at Quicken Loans Arena through the 2023 season, and stabilized a five-year contract extension through the 2020 season for the MAC Baseball Tournament at All Pro Freight Stadium in Avon, Ohio.

In addition to growing its commitment to MAC championships, Steinbrecher has strategically positioned the MAC's participation in hosting NCAA events and championships. The MAC recently served as the host for the 2015 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Midwest Regional at Quicken Loans Arena in Cleveland and will also serve as host of the 2018 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships and the 2020 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament First and Second Rounds, also at Quicken Loans Arena. The MAC has previously hosted both the 2012 and 2014 NCAA Women's Bowling Championships, and will also host the 2019 NCAA Women's Bowling Championships under Steinbrecher's direction.

In the summer of 2014, the MAC and ESPN announced a historic 13-year rights extension deal through the 2026-27 season for expanded national television and digital distribution. This is the largest and most extensive agreement in the history of the Conference and brings long-term security for the MAC through the 2026-27 academic year.

ESPN has exclusive television and digital distribution rights for all MAC sporting events, and guarantees coverage of every football game, and select men's and women's basketball and Olympic sporting events. The MAC and ESPN will establish on-campus production capabilities that will provide a significant increase in the national coverage of baseball, softball, soccer, volleyball, wrestling and Olympic sports on ESPN3. This will open up nearly 92 million households from ESPN3 for exposure to MAC sports for the first time in Conference history. Through this ESPN partnership, the MAC and CBS Sports Network announced a four-year sublicensing agreement to expand its national coverage of football and basketball through the 2018-19 season.

For the second time in Mid-American Conference history a member institution will be playing in one of the prestigious New Year's Six Bowl Games, as MAC Champion Western Michigan will face Wisconsin in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic on Jan. 2 at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

During the 2016 season, the MAC witnessed six members accept bowl invitations. Western Michigan (Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Arlington, Texas), Ohio (Dollar General Bowl, Mobile, Ala.), Toledo (Raycom Media Camellia Bowl, Montgomery, Ala.), Central Michigan (Miami Beach Bowl, Miami, Fla.), Miami (St. Petersburg Bowl, St. Petersburg, Fla.) and Eastern Michigan (Popeyes Bahamas Bowl, Nassau, Bahamas) represented the MAC in bowl games during the 2016 bowl season.

The six bowl invitations are one shy of the MAC single-season record of seven bowl invitations during the 2012 and 2016 bowl seasons. This also marks the ninth time in MAC history to have five or more programs receive a bowl invitation (2004, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016) in a single-season. In the previous six bowl seasons, the MAC has a record of 11-24 in 35 bowl games – 2016 (0-6); 2015 (3-4); 2014 (2-3); 2013 (0-5); 2012 (2-5); 2011 (4-1).

In December of 2016, Western Michigan head coach P.J. Fleck was named MAC Head Coach of the Year, Broncos WR Corey Davis as the MAC Offensive Player of the Year and KR Darius Phillips was named MAC Special Teams Player of the Year. Also receiving accolades, Ohio DE Tarell Basham earned MAC Defensive Player of the Year, while Bobcats S Javon Hagan was named MAC Freshman of the Year. Western Michigan senior QB Zach Terrell was named the league's Vern Smith Leadership Award winner and was also named the winner of the 2016 William V. Campbell Trophy by the National Football Foundation as the best football scholar athlete in the nation.

In December of 2013, former Northern Illinois quarterback Jordan Lynch finished third overall in the Heisman Trophy voting, the highest ever finish by

a MAC student. Lynch was invited to the Heisman Trophy Award ceremony in New York City and became only the third MAC student-athlete to receive an invitation to the ceremony – Marshall QB Chad Pennington (1999) and Marshall WR Randy Moss (1997).

During the 2017 NFL Draft, Western Michigan wide receiver Corey Davis was the fifth overall selection by the Tennessee Titans. Davis' selection was the highest ever for the Broncos program and tied the second-highest ever draft selection by a student from the MAC. It also marked the third MAC football student selected in the top five of the NFL draft over the last five seasons. In the 2014 NFL Draft, Buffalo Bulls linebacker Khalil Mack was the fifth overall selection by the Oakland Raiders. Mack's selection was the highest-ever for the Buffalo program and the second highest ever selection for a MAC student. In the 2013 NFL Draft, Central Michigan offensive tackle Eric Fisher was selected as the first overall selection by the Kansas City Chiefs, making Fisher the first-ever football player from the MAC selected first overall in the NFL Draft.

Each football season the MAC has a minimum five guaranteed bowl opportunities. The MAC has long-term primary contracts with the Dollar General Bowl (based in Mobile, Ala.) through the 2017 season and Famous Idaho Potato Bowl (based in Boise, Ida.) through the 2019 season.

During the 2016 football season, Western Michigan won the 2016 Marathon MAC Football Championship Game with a 29-23 win over Ohio on Dec. 2. The win was Western Michigan's first championship since 1988 and the second football title in program history. Western Michigan entered the bowl season ranked No. 12 in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll and No. 14 in the Amway/USA Today Coaches Poll. The No. 12 AP ranking was the highest in the MAC since Ball State was ranked No. 12 on Nov. 30, 2008 after a 12-0 start. Western Michigan lost a 24-16 decision to No. 8 Wisconsin in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic on Jan. 2. Western Michigan ended the season ranked No. 15 in the AP Poll with a 13-1 record. The Broncos were also ranked No. 15 in the sixth and final College Football Playoff ranking on Dec. 4. Western Michigan was bowl eligible for the third straight year. Western Michigan's 13-0 mark after the Marathon MAC Football Championship was the first for the MAC since former member Marshall finished the 1999 season with a 13-0 record and a No. 10 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll.

During Western Michigan's historic 2016 season, ESPN's College Game Day, college football's longest-running and most-celebrated pregame show, came to the campus of Western Michigan University in Kalamazoo on Nov. 19 for the No. 14-ranked Broncos home game vs. Buffalo on ESPNU. This marked only the second time in MAC history for ESPN College GameDay to visit a MAC campus. The previous visit came in 2003 with Northern Illinois at Bowling Green.

Western Michigan wide receiver Corey Davis posted his third straight 1,400-yard season as he finished 2016 with a career-high 97 catches for 1,500 yards and 19 touchdowns, which led all FBS in receiving touchdowns. Davis is the all-time leading FBS receiver in history with 5,285 yards in four seasons and is the first receiver in FBS history with four seasons of 900+ yards. Davis ended 2016 as the all-time leading receiver in FBS history with 5,285 yards. He ended his college career with 332 receptions for 5,285 and 52 touchdowns. He is the only player in FBS history with 300 catches, 5,000+ yards and 50+ TDs. All are MAC records.

Davis earned the title of NCAA Consensus All-American after being named to the first team in three of the five official organizations used to determine the honor. Davis becomes the first player in Western Michigan history and the first from the MAC since Dri Archer of Kent State in 2012 to earn the honor and the eighth league selection in MAC history.

In addition, Toledo tight end Michael Roberts was named First Team All-American by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), while Western Michigan offensive tackle Taylor Moton was named Second Team by the FWAA and AFCA.

History of the MAC

Based in Cleveland since July 1999 following a 15-year stay in Toledo, Ohio, the MAC has established historic measurements in both football and men's and women's basketball since moving to Northeast Ohio. The MAC was founded as a five-school league on February 24, 1946 in Columbus, Ohio with Ohio, Butler, Cincinnati, Wayne State and Western Reserve admitted as charter members. The Mid-American Conference membership consists of 12 universities across five states (Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, New York and Ohio).

Steinbrecher has expanded bowl opportunities for the Conference and stabilized membership, increased television exposure with a historic national television and digital distribution rights deal

with ESPN, renegotiated a marketing rights agreement with IMG College, spearheaded a \$50,000 donation to the Bahamas Red Cross for relief efforts from Hurricane Matthew, which was matched by The Atlantis, and guided a messaging program to define the MACtion brand.

Steinbrecher orchestrated the development of the first of its kind Conference-wide Mental Health Program, which includes a bi-annual Mental Health Summit to focus on student well-being, specifically with interactive discussion topics in mental health ranging from identifying problems, discussing solutions and highlighting best practices, along with grassroots efforts with a Mental Health Awareness Week on each member campus.

He also established a Conference-wide comprehensive Diversity & Inclusion Program to accelerate the growth of minority candidates for collegiate job opportunities in coaching and administration. His leadership on the issue of inclusion and diversity includes the development of an internship and mentoring program, bi-annual summit, resource website and annual recognition platform.

Steinbrecher also created the MAC Academic Consortium, which integrates across Conference membership the next generation of leaders in higher education, providing leadership development opportunities among faculty and administration.

Steinbrecher played an integral role in the development of the College Football Playoff and serves on the Administrative Executive Committee and the Site Selection Committee. Steinbrecher led the MAC bid to host the 2015 NCAA Men's Basketball Midwest Regional, and the MAC will host the 2018 NCAA Wrestling Championships and 2020 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament First and Second Rounds at Quicken Loans Arena.

He also developed and implemented a MAC new Coaches Orientation program. He was recently appointed to the newly formed NCAA Football Oversight Committee, NCAA Football Competition Committee and the NCAA Transfer Working Group.

In the summer of 2014, Steinbrecher announced a historic 13-year rights extension agreement with ESPN through the 2026-27 season and brings long-term security for the Conference. This agreement provides ESPN with exclusive television and digital distribution rights for all MAC sporting events, guarantees coverage of home football and men's basketball games, and select women's basketball and Olympic sporting events.

During his tenure, the MAC has witnessed historic achievements in the overall growth of MAC football. Over the last six seasons every MAC football program has appeared in a bowl game and during the last five seasons the MAC has twice set the Conference single-season bowl record with seven programs receiving a bowl invitation in both the 2012 and 2015 bowl seasons.

In 2016, the MAC received its first invitation to the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas as Western Michigan earned its first-ever New Year's Six Bowl invitation.

Last season, Steinbrecher had six different MAC programs receive bowl invitations -- Western Michigan (Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic), Ohio (Dollar General Bowl), Toledo (Raycom Media Camellia Bowl), Eastern Michigan (Popeyes Bahamas Bowl), Central Michigan (Miami Beach Bowl) and Miami (St. Petersburg Bowl) represented the MAC the 2016 bowl season.

In January of 2013, Steinbrecher witnessed Northern Illinois participate in the first ever BCS bowl berth by a MAC member with an invitation to the Discover Orange Bowl and during the 2012 bowl season, the MAC set a Conference record with seven teams to receive a bowl invitation.

Steinbrecher orchestrated the creation of three new bowl games in 2014 - the Raycom Media Camellia Bowl (Montgomery, Ala.), the Bahamas Bowl (Nassau, Bahamas) and the Marmot Boca Raton Bowl (Boca Raton, Fla.).

Steinbrecher has built the MAC primary bowl agreements to a conference-best five guaranteed bowl games (Dollar General Bowl; Famous Idaho Potato Bowl; Raycom Media Camellia Bowl; Bahamas Bowl and Marmot Boca Raton Bowl) and three additional secondary agreements (Detroit-based Quick Lane Bowl, Frisco Bowl in Frisco, Texas and ESPN owned bowl games such as the Birmingham Bowl and St. Petersburg Bowl).

Steinbrecher launched the first-ever MAC Digital Network in 2011 and re-launched the MAC Digital Network with a new partnership with SIDEARM.

The Digital Network provides the conference with a new website, enhanced live streaming and programming, mobile platforms via the iPhone, iPad and Android.

In 2011, Steinbrecher also negotiated a new marketing agreement with ISP for the conference marketing and sponsorship rights through 2019. ISP merged with IMG and this long-term deal solidified the conference marketing partnership with the new IMG College brand.

Steinbrecher negotiated a four-year contract extension with Ford Field as the site to host the MAC Football Championship Game through the 2019 season. He secured a six-year contract extension with Cleveland's Quicken Loans Arena to host the MAC Men's and Women's Basketball Conference Tournament through 2023. The contract extension guarantees the continuation of the conference tournament at the same neutral site since 2000. In addition, Steinbrecher also signed a five-year contract extension for the MAC Baseball Tournament to be played at Sprenger Stadium in Avon, Ohio through the 2020 season.

He joined the MAC after serving six years as commissioner of the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC). Prior to the OVC, Steinbrecher served for nine years as the commissioner of the Mid-Continent Conference (the Summit League). He is the only person to serve as commissioner in all three NCAA Division I Subdivisions (FBS, FCS, DI).

In six years with the OVC, Steinbrecher significantly increased the league's exposure through additional television coverage at the regional and national level. In 2005, he negotiated a five-year contract with ESPN that secured increased exposure for the league. That included being the first conference to sign a deal to have games appear on ESPNU; the OVC had the first sporting event telecast on that network (the 2005 OVC Men's Basketball Tournament Semifinals).

Under his leadership, the OVC strengthened its commitment to sportsmanship by implementing a series of good sports initiatives, including sportsmanship affidavits signed by coaches and administrators, student-athlete ethical conduct orientation and an institutional and team sportsmanship awards. Steinbrecher also initiated a Conference Basketball Issues Committee and oversaw increased promotional efforts for the OVC Basketball Tournament, which resulted in an increase in ticket revenue. He also spearheaded the efforts in bidding for, and ultimately securing, the 2014 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Final Four for Nashville.

Prior to being named Mid-Continent Conference Commissioner in Nov. 1994, Dr. Steinbrecher had previously served the league as Director of Communications, Director of Marketing and Communications and Assistant Commissioner. He joined the Mid-Con staff in 1989 after previously serving in the athletics departments at Houston Baptist University, Indiana University and Davidson College.

Steinbrecher has served on numerous NCAA committees, including the Division I Basketball Issues Committee, serving as a member of subcommittees for both men's and women's basketball, and in 1999 he became the first non-Division I-A commissioner elected as president of the Collegiate Commissioner's Association (CCA). In June 2007, he was appointed to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Academic Enhancement Group by the late NCAA President Myles Brand. He has served on the NCAA Division I Legislative Council, the NCAA Championship Cabinet, the NCAA Committee on Athletics Certification and the NCAA Men's Basketball Issues Committee.

Steinbrecher is currently Chair of the College Football Officiating Board of Managers and serves on the NCAA Football Oversight Committee, NCAA Football Competition Committee and NCAA Transfer Working Group.

Steinbrecher has also served as Division I-AAA vice president of the CCA and as a member of the National Invitation Tournament's District IV Advisory Board. He was the first non-FBS commissioner to serve as President of the CCA from 1997-99.

Steinbrecher is a 1983 graduate of Valparaiso University, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education and journalism. In 2006, he was bestowed an Alumni Achievement Award from his alma mater and in 2014 was inducted into the Valparaiso University Athletics Hall of Fame. Steinbrecher graduated with a master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University in 1984, and he was awarded the doctorate of physical education in sports administration from Indiana University in 1989.

An all-conference and academic all-conference selection in football and a conference champion in tennis, Steinbrecher was named Valparaiso's and the Heartland Collegiate Conference's Student-Athlete of the Year in 1983. In 2006, he was inducted into the Watauga County (N.C.) Sports Hall of Fame.

Steinbrecher and his wife Anne have three children, daughter Grace and twin sons Matt and Will.

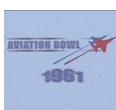

1961 AVIATION BOWL

New Mexico 28, Western Michigan 12

Western Michigan made its postseason debut in the inaugural Aviation bowl on Dec. 9, 1961. The Broncos were led by quarterback Ed Chlebek, who completed 18 passes for 207 yards and one touchdown.

WMU fell behind 14-0 but bounced back on a Bob White scoring run from four yards out. New Mexico added two more scores before Chlebek found Dave Cooke in the end zone from five yards out for the final score of the game.



1988 CALIFORNIA BOWL

Fresno State 35, Western Michigan 30

Twenty-seven years after its first bowl trip, WMU made its second after winning the only outright Mid-American Conference title in program history and capturing nine wins.

For the second time in a bowl game, WMU fell behind by two scores but this time, the Broncos fought back to take a 17-14 lead into halftime. Robert Oliver hauled in a 31-yard pass from Tony Kimbrough for the team's first score. Robert Davis followed with a 51-yard scoring run to tie the game. John Creek made good on his only field goal of the game to give the Broncos its first lead of the game. Unfortunately, Fresno State outscored the Broncos, 21-7, in the third quarter to finish on top.



2007 INTERNATIONAL BOWL

Cincinnati 27, Western Michigan 24

The Broncos played in the second inaugural bowl game in program history, taking on Big East opponent Cincinnati in the 2007 International Bowl. WMU fell behind 14-0 early and had to climb out from behind the eight ball.

Western Michigan eventually dug itself into a 24-point hole before getting its offense kick started. Cornerback E.J. Biggers and Jamarco Simmons connected on a 76-yard touchdown completion, the longest in WMU bowl history, for WMU's first score. The Broncos bounced back with another TD through the air, this time on a Ryan Cubit to Herb Martin hook up from 30 yards out. WMU scored 17 points in the second quarter to pull within a score at half. Cincinnati kicked a field goal with six minutes to go in the fourth to seal the win.

2008 TEXAS BOWL

Rice 38, Western Michigan 14



Western Michigan played in front of the second-largest bowl crowd in Mid-American Conference history against Rice in the Texas Bowl.

Rice jumped out to a big lead early before the Broncos responded. Tim Hiller found senior Kirk Elsworth from two yards out for WMU's first points of the game in the fourth quarter. He hooked up with Schneider Julien near the game's end for another touchdown, giving two on the day to tie a WMU bowl record.



2011 LITTLE CAESARS PIZZA BOWL

Purdue 37, Western Michigan 32

Western Michigan's offense was on the national stage in the program's fifth bowl game and third in the past six seasons. The Broncos posted 485 yards of offense in a narrow loss to Purdue in the 2011 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl.

Jordan White set a MAC bowl record with 265 receiving yards and his one-handed grab in the second half was the top play on that night's SportsCenter. Alex Carder threw for over 400 yards in a game for the fifth time in 2011, racking up 439 yards.

Air Force 38, Western Michigan 24

Western Michigan's was rewarded with its sixth bowl appearance in program history after an historic turnaround from 1-11 to 8-4 heading into the bowl game. The Broncos displayed a prolific offense with Corey Davis setting a WMU bowl record with 176 yards receiving and three touchdown catches. He was named WMU's MVP for the game.

Air Force grinded out over 300 yards on the ground and converted off of key Bronco turnovers to pull away in the game.



2015 POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL

Western Michigan 45, Middle Tennessee State 31

The Western Michigan football team captured the first bowl victory in school history, defeating Middle Tennessee State, 45-31, in the Popeye's Bahamas Bowl at Thomas Robinson Stadium.

The game started and ended nothing short of an old-fashioned shootout. The two teams combined for 34 points and 475 yards in the first quarter alone and the score was tied 17-17 at the half.

Western Michigan pulled away in the fourth quarter, taking a 14-point lead after back-to-back touchdown runs by MAC Freshman of the Year and the 2015 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl Offensive MVP Jamauri Bogan.

Playing in its first New Year's Six bowl game in program history, Western Michigan came up just short vs. Wisconsin, 24-16.

Wisconsin went up 14-0 after the first two drives before the Broncos fought back. WMU held the Badgers to just seven points in the second half and were able to get within a possession with 3:27 to go in the fourth quarter as Zach Terrell hit Corey Davis on fourth down, throwing an 11-yard fade in the corner of the end zone.
