• **THIS WEEK'S DRIP:** Western Michigan will wear gold helmets, black jerseys and black pants in its home opener against Toledo.

• Western Michigan owns an all-time record of 578-459-24 in 114 seasons.

• Last Wednesday's win over Akron was the first win over the Zips for head coach Tim Lester. WMU's 58-13 victory also marked the fifth time the Broncos have put up 50 or more points.

• Two Broncos, running backs La'Darius Jefferson and Jaxson Kincaide, scored touchdowns in their WMU debuts. Jefferson, a transfer from Michigan State, led the team with 70 yards on nine carries and one touchdown. Kincaide, a transfer from Nevada, had seven rushes for 42 yards, one rushing touchdown and one reception for 13 yards.

• In 2019, the Broncos went 7-6 overall and 5-3 in MAC play ... Western Michigan went 2-2 in conference play with home wins over Monmouth and Georgia State, while falling on the road to No. 19 Michigan State and Syracuse ... WMU defended the Battle of the Cannon, beating rival Central Michigan 31-15 to open MAC play, also claiming conference wins over Miami, Bowling Green, Ball State, and Ohio ... for the second straight year the Broncos earned a bowl bid but fell in to Western Kentucky, 23-20, in the SERVPRO

First Responder Bowl.

• The Broncos have reached bowl eligibility in six consecutive seasons, the longest streak in program history.

• Under head coach **Tim Lester**, the Broncos are now 2-2 in season openers and have won two straight with last season's victory over Monmouth.

• **POLLING PLACES:** The Broncos were picked to finish second in the MAC West in the MAC Coaches Poll and fourth in the West in the MAC Media Poll. WMU received two first place votes in the coaches poll and three in the media poll.

Toledo and Miami were picked to win their divisions by the coaches, while Central Michigan and Buffalo were picked by the media.

BRONCOS BY THE NUMBERS

235 - All purpose yards in D'Wayne Eskridge's first game back since his injury at Syracuse on Sept. 21, 2019. Eskridge had 114 receiving yards on three catches, with two touchdowns, and 121 yards off of four kickoff returns.

58 - Yes, it's been just one game but the Broncos lead the nation in scoring at 58 points per game. It's also the most points in a regulation MAC win by WMU since a 58-28 win over Eastern Michigan on Oct. 29, 2015.

55 - The number of points scored by the Broncos after Akron took a 7-3 lead after the Zips' opening drive.

21.8 - Yards per completion by redshirt sophomore quarterback Kaleb Eleby. Eleby finished the night with 262 yards on 12-for-16 passing with three touchdowns.

5 - The number of different Broncos that rushed or caught touchdown passes in the win over Akron. La'Darius Jefferson, Sean Tyler and Jaxson Kincaide all rushed for touchdowns while D'Wayne Eskridge and Jayden Hall caught touchdown passes.

TEAM NOTES

WESTERN MICHIGAN VS. TOLEDO

- Wednesday's game is the 75th all-time meeting between Western Michigan and Toledo.
- The Rockets hold a 44-30 edge in the series and won each of the last three.
- WMU head coach Tim Lester is searching for his first coaching win over UT, currently with an 0-3 record.
- Redshirt sophomore quarterback Kaleb Eleby made his collegiate debut against the Rockets back on Oct. 25, 2018. Eleby came on after Jon Wassink suffered an injury in the first quarter. Eleby completed 23-of-28 passes for 293 yards and two touchdowns. His 293 yards remain a career high.

BACK ON THE ESPN

- Wednesday's game will be the third time a Tim Lester coached WMU team has a game on ESPN. The previous two were both of the Broncos' bowl games under Lester.

THE WATCH LISTERS

- Six Broncos are on watch lists for seven awards this season.
- Senior linebacker **Treshaun Heyward** is up for both the Butkus Award for the nation's top linebacker and the Nagurski Award for the nation's top defensive player.
- Sophomore wide receiver **Sky Moore** was named to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List for the nation's top receiver.
- Senior offensive linemen **Mike Caliendo** is up for three awards. He's on the watch list for the Outland Trophy for the nation's best interior lineman, the Wuerffel Trophy watch list and is also a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy.
- Senior offensive lineman **Jaylon Moore** is also up for the Outland Trophy.
- Senior wide receiver and defensive back **D'Wayne Eskridge** is on the watch list for the Paul Hornung Award, given to the nation's most versatile player.
- Senior offensive lineman **Wesley French** is on the Rimington Award Watch List for the nation's top center.

NEW FACES ON THE SIDELINES

- WMU and Lester welcomed the addition of three new assistant coaches to the staff for the 2020 season.
- **Greg Harbaugh Jr.** (pronounced HAR-bow) returns to Western Michigan to coach the wide receivers. Harbaugh was recently the quality control coach at Minnesota after spending the 2018 season as the receivers coach at UT Chattanooga. He was on WMU's coaching staff during the 2015 and 2016 seasons as a graduate assistant coach.
- **Marvin Cleidor** will coach the Bronco cornerbacks after spending three seasons at Princeton as the co-defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach.
- **David Denham** will work with WMU's defensive tackles and also serve as the team's assistant special teams coordinator. Denham was most recently at the University of Indianapolis as the defensive line coach and special teams coordinator.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

THREE-PRONGED ATTACK

- Western Michigan running backs La'Darius Jefferson, Sean Tyler and Jaxson Kincaide combined to produce 180 yards on the ground on 25 carries. The trio averaged 7.2 yards per carry and each found the endzone.

DIDN'T MISS A BEAT

- Senior wide receiver D'Wayne Eskridge returned to action against Akron for the first time since suffering a season-ending injury against Syracuse on Sept. 21, 2019.
- Eskridge returned to old form, producing 235 all-purpose yards. He caught three passes for 114 yards, with two going for touchdowns, including one for 76 yards. He also returned four kickoffs for 121 yards.

EFFICIENT OFFENSE

- The Broncos only ran 58 plays on offense in the 58-13 win over the Zips. WMU averaged 8.3 yards per play.
- Redshirt sophomore quarterback Kaleb Eleby went 12-for-16 through the air for a completion percentage of 75 percent.

Eleby racked up 262 yards passing and had a career-high three touchdowns.

- The Broncos also had four plays of at least 20 yards in the win.

FINDING A NEW WORKHORSE

- The Broncos must replace workhorse running back **LeVante Bellamy**, now a member of the Denver Broncos, in 2020. Bellamy combined for 1,527 total yards and 23 touchdowns on offense en route to winning MAC Offensive Player of the Year. WMU has quite a few options.
- Sophomore wide receiver **Sky Moore** is the top returning player on offense in terms of production. Moore had 802 yards receiving as a freshman and caught three touchdown passes, while rushing for one.
- In the backfield sophomore running back **Sean Tyler** produced 390 yards on the ground on 68 carries, averaging a team-best 5.7 yards per carry. Tyler found the endzone five times on the ground, while chipping in with six receptions for 45 yards.
- Also in the mix is graduate transfer **Jaxson Kincaide**. Kincaide played four seasons at Nevada, racking up 894 career yards on the ground on 199 carries, averaging 4.5 yards per carry and six scores. Kincaide also provides an option out of the backfield with 38 career receptions.

BACK UNDER CENTER

- Redshirt sophomore **Kaleb Eleby** is the projected starter at quarterback heading into the 2020 season.
- Eleby, who switched his number from 9 to 5, redshirted last season with **Jon Wassink** back healthy for the entire 2019 season.
- The Maryland Heights, Mo., native played in five games, starting in four, during the 2018 season. He threw for 1,092 yards and four touchdowns, while rushing for three. Eleby finished the season with a 62.6 completion percentage.

THERE AND BACK AGAIN:

A LINEMAN'S TALE

- With **Luke Juriga** gone on to the NFL, the Broncos have a new center in former offensive lineman, converted defensive tackle and converted back to offensive lineman **Wesley French**.
- The Benton Harbor, Mich., native began his career as an offensive lineman in 2015 before switching to defense in 2016. He switched back to the OL in 2017, but then played two seasons (2018-19) as a defensive tackle. He played in all 13 games last season, recording 22 total tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss.

SKYY'S THE LIMIT

- **Skyy Moore** had a breakout season in 2019, leading to MAC All-Freshman honors and a First Team All-MAC selection.
- The New Kensington, Pa., native tied for the team lead with 51 receptions and had a team-best 802 yards receiving, with three touchdowns.
- Moore's receiving yards were the most by a Bronco freshman wide receiver since Bronco great and current Tennessee Titan **Corey Davis**. Davis put up 941 yards during his first season back in 2013, en route to winning the MAC Freshman of the Year Award.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

TWO IN A ROW

- In his first career game at linebacker, former safety **A.J. Thomas** stepped in front of a pass by Akron quarterback Zach Gibson in the first quarter and returned it for 38 yards for his first career pick six.
- The pick six was the second-straight game the Broncos had returned an interception back for a touchdown, reaching back to the 2019 SERVPRO First Responder's bowl. In the bowl game, Kareem Ali returned an interception 88 yards to the house.

WELCOME BACK

- Linebacker Covin Moment returned to action for WMU after having to sit out the 2019 season, starting at middle linebacker against Akron.
- Moment made five tackles on the night, while helping hold the Zips to just 256 total yards on offense.

TRESHAUN HAYWARD - THE ALL- EVERYTHING LINEBACKER

- Senior linebacker **Treshaun Hayward** had his coming out party in 2019. After starting just one game in his first two seasons, the Ypsilanti, Mich., native started 11 of the 13 in 2019.
- Hayward had double-digit tackles in nine of the 13 games, including career-high 18 against Eastern Michigan. After just 37 total tackles his first two seasons he finished last year with a MAC-best 142 and was named the MAC Defensive Player of the Year.
- Hayward was also named an All-American by The Sporting News (second team) and Phil Steele (fourth team).

KEY RETURNERS

- Along with Hayward, the Broncos also return a lot of key pieces on defense in linebacker **A.J. Thomas**, cornerback **Patrick Lupro**, defensive end **Ali Fayad** and defensive tackle **Ralph Holley**.
- Hayward led the team in tackles with 142, Lupro led the team in pass breakups with seven and interceptions with three, Fayad had a team-high in tackles for loss with 15, sacks with 6.5 and quarterback hurries with nine.
- The trio of Hayward, Fayad and Holley combined for 16 total sacks and 36 tackles for loss.

SECOND YEAR UNDER ESPOSITO

- WMU's defense will be under the direction of defensive coordinator **Lou Esposito** for the second-straight full season. Esposito took over the role toward the end of the 2018 season.
- The defense saw big improvements in several areas from 2018 to 2019 under Esposito.
 - WMU allowed 25.9 points per game in 2019, a reduction of 8.6 from the previous year.
 - The Bronco's sack total went up from 32

A GOOD WAY TO START

- Senior kicker Thiago Kapps spent most of WMU's win over Akron kicking extra points, but he was first called into action on the Broncos' opening drive.
- The Brazil native booted a career-long 48-yard field goal to give WMU a 3-0 lead. It was the only field goal attempt needed by the Broncos.

JUST ONE

- Junior punter Nick Mihalic was called on to punt just once in the win over the Zips. Mihalic's only punt went for 38 yards.

PLUS FIVE

- Five yards. That was the difference in average yards per punt for junior Nick Mihalic from his first two seasons. As a freshman he averaged 37.3 yards per punt and

WESTERN MICHIGAN HEAD COACH TIM LESTER

Tim Lester was named the 16th head football coach in school history on Friday, January 13, 2017.

Lester has risen through the coaching ranks after completing a Hall of Fame playing career at Western Michigan. He was a four-year starter at quarterback at WMU from 1996-99, leading the Broncos to a Mid-American Conference championship appearance his senior season. Lester also made a stop as an assistant coach at his alma mater during the 2005 and 2006 seasons. A native of Wheaton, Ill., Lester earned his bachelor's degree in mathematics from Western Michigan in 2000 and was inducted into the Western Michigan Athletic Hall of Fame in 2011.

His third season as head coach on the sidelines at Western Michigan featured an All-America line-backer, the MAC MVP, the league's offensive and defensive players of the year and the sixth consecutive year of bowl eligibility for the Broncos. WMU finished second in the MAC West Division and visited Dallas for the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl.

Under Lester's guidance, running back LeVante Bellamy led the nation in rushing touchdowns with 23 and was selected as the MAC's most valuable player and offensive player of the year. Second team All-America linebacker Treshaun Hayward was tabbed the league's defensive player of the year after leading the Broncos with 142 tackles, the most in the league and third most nationally. In all, 12 student-athletes received 13 All-MAC honors and three Broncos received East-West Shrine Bowl invitations: Bellamy, center Luke Juriga and tight end Giovanni Ricci. Bellamy also represented Western Michigan at the NFL Combine in Indianapolis from February 23 - March 2, 2020.

Off the field, 2019 was highlighted by quarterback Jon Wassink receiving the Wuerffel Trophy for his community service efforts and football performance, as well as being selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) National Scholar-Athlete, making him a finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, commonly referred to as the Academic Heisman. Wassink was also named the NFF State of Michigan Chapter Michael R. Sadler D1 Scholar Athlete of the Year award winner.

The Broncos had 17 placed on the Football Academic All-MAC Team, and Wassink and offensive lineman Mike Caliendo received CoSIDA Academic All-District accolades. Since Lester took over the program in 2017, WMU leads the conference in Academic All-MAC selections with 53. Western Michigan had an additional six selections to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society, tied for the second most among Group of Five conferences. The Broncos have at least four players on the NFF Hampshire Honor Society in each of the last four seasons.

During the 2018 campaign, Lester guided the Broncos to bowl eligibility for the fifth-straight season, a program record, and a trip to the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl. Five Broncos earned All-MAC honors, including first team selections Bellamy and Juriga. WMU paced the conference in Academic All-MAC selections with 20, and five of them went on to earn MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete honors.

In Lester's first season as head coach at Western Michigan, in 2017, the Broncos led the league with 12 all-conference selections and had 16 Academic All-MAC selections, five MAC Distinguished Scholar Athletes and a CoSIDA Academic All-District selection. As a team, the Broncos posted a 3.08 GPA. Offensive lineman Chukwuma Okorafor collected six All-America honors and Wyatt Pfeifer was an All-America long snapper.

Several school records were broken as running back Jarvion Franklin became WMU's all-time leading rusher with 4,867 career yards, and also set a school record for most career touchdowns with 56. Darius Phillips became the FBS all-time leader for career returns for TDs with 12 and tied the FBS record with five career interceptions returned for touchdowns. Phillips was named MAC Special Teams Player of the Year for the second-straight season and had 100-yard kickoff returns in back-to-back weeks to open the season at No. 4 Southern California and Michigan State.

Both Okorafor (3rd round, Pittsburgh) and Phillips (5th round, Cincinnati), as well as defensive back Sam Beal (3rd round, New York Giants), were NFL Draft picks.

Prior to taking the head coaching position at Western Michigan Lester was the quarterbacks coach at Purdue in 2016, mentoring sophomore signal-caller David Blough to 25 touchdown passes and 3,352 yards, averaging more than 279 yards passing per game.

Lester served as Syracuse's quarterbacks coach from 2013 to 2015 and doubled as offensive coordinator in 2014 and 2015.

Prior to working at Syracuse, Lester was the head coach at Division III Elmhurst (Illinois) College from 2008 to 2012. Over five seasons, he posted a 33-19 record for a .635 winning percentage, second highest in school history. In his final season in 2012, he led the Bluejays to a 10-2 record and a College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) championship as well as Elmhurst's first NCAA playoff appearance. Lester was named the CCIW Coach of the Year that season.

Lester also served as an assistant at North Central College (2007) and Elmhurst (2002-03). He was the head coach at Division II Saint Joseph's College in 2004, receiving Independent Football Alliance Coach of the Year honors.

Lester started his playing career at Western Michigan with a bang, earning MAC Freshman of the Year honors in 1996. He was a Second Team All-MAC selection his junior and senior seasons. He finished his Bronco career ranked fourth in FBS history in passing yards (11,299) and sixth in touchdown passes (87). Lester set 17 school passing records and eight MAC records.

Lester and his wife, Dawn, have three sons, Camden, Carter and Cooper. Lester's oldest son, Quinn, is a three-year letterman (2018-19-20) on the Ball State men's volleyball team.
