### THIS WEEK

Western Michigan will play at Lawson for the final time in 2025, hosting Minnesota Duluth for a weekend series. The opener is set for Friday at 7 PM.

### LAST TIME OUT

The Broncos picked up a weekend sweep at Omaha, downing the Mavericks 7-2 and 4-2. Saturday's win was WMU's fourth in a row.

Zaccharya Wisdom had four points in the series, notching three goals and one assist. Samuel Sjolund chipped in three points, handing out three assists.

Hampton Slukinsky was strong in net, boasting a 2.00 goals against average and .923 save percentage. He stopped 48 of 52 shots on the weekend.

### DON'T I KNOW YOU?

Junior forward Cole Spicer was given eligibility by the NCAA prior to WMU's last series at Omaha, helping him play in his first NCAA game since Dec. 9, 2023 at Miami (OH).

Spicer didn't disappoint in his Western Michigan debut, as the Grand Forks, N.D. native concluded the weekend with a goal and an assist. His tally on Saturday night was the game winner and marked his first since Dec. 8, 2023.

The Boston Bruins draft pick will now square off with his former team, as Spicer spent the 2022-23 and 2023-24 seasons with Minnesota Duluth. In his time with the Bulldogs, he collected 15 points on eight goals and seven assists.

### WISDOM'S WONDERFUL WEEKEND

Zaccharya Wisdom had his best series as a Bronco, tallying three goals and one assist in a series sweep over Omaha back on Nov. 21-22.

For his dominance, the Seattle Kraken draft pick was named the NCHC Forward of the Week on Nov. 25. It was the second NCHC weekly honor of his career.

The Canadian winger led the NCHC in goals (3) and plus/minus (+4) for the week. He produced two points in each game against the Mavericks at Baxter Arena.

Wisdom is now up to 10 points on six goals and four assists, including five goals and one assist against conference foes.

### TY'S TAKEOVER

Coming to the program as a highly-touted recruit, forward Ty Henricks had flashes of brilliance during WMU's championship run in 2024-25. Of those moments, the biggest was scoring the game-winning goal in the National Championship win over Boston University. He finished his rookie season with 13 points on eight goals and five assists in 41 games.

Now in a new year with a new role, Henricks has taken his game to another level and has the Broncos looking like contenders yet again. Despite playing in just 14 games so far this season, the New York Rangers draft pick has been able to produce 12 points on seven goals and five assists. He is second on the team in goals and third in points.

The bruising forward stepped up to WMU's top line with Owen Michaels and William Whitelaw a few weeks ago, averaging a point per game with his new linemates. Over that six-game stretch, Henricks has produced five goals and one assist. The Broncos are 4-2-0 since moving him to the top line.

### OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

After a slow start to the month of November on offense, Western Michigan has found its footing over the last four games. The Broncos are 4-0-0 in that stretch, averaging 5.5 goals per game.

Eight of the team's nine wins this season have come with four goals or more. The Broncos are averaging 5.22 goals per game in wins and just 1.40 in losses.

Overall, the Brown and Gold rank sixth in the nation in scoring offense so far this season, notching 3.86 goals per game. WMU has four players with six or more goals, with Liam Valente leading the way at eight in 14 games.

Western Michigan has been top 10 in scoring offense every season under Pat Ferschweiler. The Broncos were the top scoring team in the nation during last year's National Championship run.

### DOMINATING THE DOT

WMU has been sensational in the faceoff dot this season, winning draws at a 53.7 percent clip. That is good for third in the NCHC and eighth in the nation.

Owen Michaels has led the way for the Brown and Gold, boasting a 60.2 percent win rate. He is 10th in the nation in total faceoffs won and sits in third in the NCHC in win percentage.

Ryan Kusler and Grant Slukynsky have helped in the dot as well. Kusler has a 57.1 percent win rate, while Slukynsky is winning draws at a 53.0 percent clip. Making his WMU debut against Omaha back on Nov. 21-22, Cole Spicer won 13 of his 21 draws, which was good for 61.9 percent.

The Broncos have had the NCHC's leader in faceoff winning percentage each of the last three seasons.

### SCOUTING THE BULLDOGS

Minnesota Duluth is off to a fantastic start to the 2025-26 season, holding a 12-4-0 overall record and 5-3-0 NCHC mark. The Bulldogs have gone 3-2-0 over their last five outings.

WMU is 20-28-3 all time against UMD, including a 9-12-1 record in Kalamazoo. However, the Broncos have had the upper hand lately, winning six of the last seven meetings. Western Michigan won both matchups last season by three goals.

Max Plante, Zam Plante and Jayson Shaugabay make up one of the best lines in college hockey, combining for 69 points on 25 goals and 44 assists. The Plante brothers are both top five in the nation in points this season.

Goaltending has also been a strength, with Adam Gajan starting all 16 games for UMD so far this season. He enters the weekend series with a 12-4-0 record, 1.78 goals against average and .925 save percentage. Gajan has two shutouts and 345 total saves this season.

### CONSISTENCY IS KEY

Since the start of the 2021-22 season, Western Michigan has been consistently among the top teams in the nation, and the polls reflect that. The Broncos have now made four straight NCAA Tournaments and sit at No. 7 in the national polls. The Broncos have been ranked in the top 20 since Oct. 11, 2021.

# PAT FERSCHWEILER

## HEAD COACH // FIFTH SEASON // WESTERN MICHIGAN '93

Pat Ferschweiler was named Western Michigan head hockey coach on Aug. 3, 2021 after spending two seasons as an associate head coach with the program (2019-21). It was his second stint with the Broncos after he spent four years as an assistant coach for the Detroit Red Wings under former WMU head coach Jeff Blashill. Prior to entering the professional coaching ranks, Ferschweiler was an assistant coach/associate head coach for WMU from 2010-2014.

He also has extensive international coaching experience, winning a gold medal as the head coach of the US U-17 Team at the Five Nations Tournament in 2017. He served as an assistant coach with the US U-18 Team at the Hlinka Gretzky Cup in 2018 and then served as the team's head coach for the 2019 Tournament. He was also an assistant coach for the United States at the 2023 IIHF World Junior Championship, earning a bronze medal with the team.

In his time as WMU's head coach, Ferschweiler has accumulated 113 wins, including 64 victories in conference play. In four seasons, he has coached four All-Americans, 12 All-Conference players, nine NCHC individual award winners, two national goal leaders and one Hobey Baker Finalist. Off the ice, Ferschweiler has seen the Broncos amass 99 NCHC Academic All-Conference honors and 62 NCHC Distinguished Scholar Athletes. The Broncos had a program-high 21 players earn NCHC Academic All-Conference honors in 2021-22. Nationally, 11 players have secured All-American Scholar status. In terms of development, 27 players have gone on to sign professional contracts during his time with the program.

Ferschweiler took the Broncos to new heights in 2024-25, leading the program to its first ever National Championship. The Broncos defeated Boston University 6-2 in the title game on April 12 in St. Louis, Mo. The Broncos beat Denver (3-2 2OT), UMass (2-1) and Minnesota State (2-1 2OT) in the NCAA Tournament during the run to the championship. Along with that, Ferschweiler guided the Brown and Gold to a program record 34 victories, including 10 in a row to end the season.

The Rochester, Minn. native also helped Western Michigan claim its first ever Penrose Cup and NCHC Frozen Faceoff championship. WMU secured the regular season title with a 6-4 win over North Dakota on Feb. 28 and beat Denver 4-3 in double overtime on March 22 to claim the conference tournament title. The Broncos went 19-4-1 in NCHC play, losing just once in regulation throughout the league season.

For his efforts, Ferschweiler was named the Spencer Penrose Award winner, which is given annually to the Division 1 National Coach of the Year. He was also named the College Hockey News and USCHO Coach of the Year. The NCHC selected him as the league's Coach of the Year for the second time in the last three seasons. The Broncos had four All-NCHC standouts (Alex Bump, Hampton Slukynsky, Joona Väistönen and Cameron Rowe) and three individual award winners. To close out the season, Alex Bump was named a First Team All-American by the American Hockey Coaches Association.

Ferschweiler and the Broncos were ranked No. 1 in the final poll of the season, receiving every first-place vote available. It marked the second time in program history that the Brown and Gold reached No. 1 in the polls, with the other happening earlier in the 2024-25 campaign. Western Michigan led the nation in goals per game (3.98), scoring margin (+1.93) and winning percentage (.821).

During the 2023-24 season, Ferschweiler guided the Broncos to a third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance for the first time in program history. The Brown and Gold finished the season with 21 wins, which included going unbeaten in non-conference play. With another strong season, WMU was ranked in the USCHO and USA Hockey top 20 throughout the entire season.

Along with that, Ferschweiler helped Luke Grainger and Sam Colangelo earn All-NCHC honors to go along with Alex Bump's All-Rookie Team status. Grainger would go on to be named the NCHC's Senior Scholar Athlete Award winner at the league's annual awards banquet in St. Paul. Following the season, eight players signed professional contracts.

In 2022-23, Ferschweiler coached the Broncos to a historic season, as the team won 23 overall games, including 15 in conference play. WMU's 15 NCHC wins helped secure a second-place league finish, which is the highest NCHC finish in program history. Additionally, Western Michigan made its eighth appearance in the NCAA Tournament and second consecutive trip to the big dance.

The Broncos' leader was named the NCHC's Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the National Coach of the Year award. Under his tutelage, Jason Polin was able to shine in his senior season, earning NCHC Player of the Year and Forward of the Year honors. Polin went on to break the single-season NCHC scoring record and led the nation with 30 goals. He was a finalist for the Hobey Baker Award and was tabbed as an All-American following the season.

Ryan McAllister joined Polin as an All-NCHC performer and was a near unanimous choice for the All-Rookie Team. Western Michigan's top line of Polin, McAllister and Max Sasson produced 138 points on 58 goals and 80 assists. All three signed NHL entry-level contracts at the end of the season.

In his first season as head coach (2021-22), Ferschweiler helped the Broncos pick up 26 wins, which was the most victories in a season since the 1995-96 campaign. Western Michigan would go on to make its first NCHC Frozen Faceoff Championship appearance and earned a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

In just his first season as the head coach, Ferschweiler helped WMU pick up its first ever NCAA Tournament victory. The Broncos defeated Northeastern, 2-1, in the Worcester Regional Semifinals. Luke Grainger notched the game-winning goal in overtime.

The Brown and Gold had four All-Conference performers in Ethen Frank (First Team), Ronnie Attard (First Team), Drew Worrad (Second Team) and Michael Joyaux (Honorable Mention). Attard would go on to win the NCHC's Offensive Defenseman of the Year award, while Worrad claimed the league's Senior Scholar Athlete Award. Attard and Frank were named All-Americans following the season. Frank led the nation in goals, while Attard was one of the top scoring defensemen in the country.

As a player Ferschweiler suited up for the Brown & Gold in 116 total games and amassed 95 points on 30 goals and 65 assists. He was awarded the Rob Hodge Most Valuable Player for the 1992-93 season in which he tallied 35 points including a career-best 15 goals. He was also named the CCHA's Best Defensive Forward for the 1991-92 season. Ferschweiler played professionally for 11 seasons, five of which came with the Kansas City Blades of the International Hockey League, back when the IHL was one of the top minor-pro leagues in the nation. He received a bachelor's degree in finance from Western Michigan University in 1993.
