ATHLETIC ADMINISTRATION

Scott Woodard, Athletic Director



Western New Mexico (WNMU) Director of Athletics Scott Woodard has spent more than half his life at the University as a student, athlete, coach, and administrator. He also has held nearly every job in the department, including sports information, game management, compliance, eligibility, and bus driver, prior to his appointment as the leader in 1996. Top that off with stints as a head baseball coach, assistant football coach, and head softball coach makes Woodard the most qualified individual to lead the Mustang Department of Athletics.

Woodard received his Bachelor of Science in Biology from WNMU while playing baseball for the Mustangs. He was part of the first baseball team to win a Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Championship and was twice named First Team All-Conference as a shortstop. While working on his Master of Arts in School Administration, also from WNMU, he was an assistant coach for the program. Woodard helped lead the team to national recognition, a No. 3 ranking, and was one game shy of going to the NAIA World Series.

Woodard took a short five-year hiatus from WNMU to teach and coach at Tularosa and Deming High Schools in New Mexico. He then came back to Silver City in 1992 to take over as the head coach for the baseball program, but his tenure was cut short as the program was dropped after the 1993 season. Woodard stayed on as an Assistant Athletic Director to WNMU coaching legend Dick Drangmeister, who eventually retired and turned the department over to Woodard.

During his 15 years as Director of Athletics, Woodard has been involved in numerous athletic facility improvements, including building the softball field and renovations to the basketball facility. He also was instrumental in overseeing the building of Altamirano Football Stadium and the Fox Complex, which houses locker rooms, a weight room, and a fitness center. Woodard also supervised the addition of three tennis courts, which allows the women's and men's tennis teams to host home contests. Scott Park Golf Course also received a practice facility that included a new driving range, chipping and putting area, coach's facility, and restrooms to the course.

Although Woodard's philosophy of athletic success does not rely solely on wins and losses, he has seen many successes on the field, court, and course since he took over. NCAA Division II National Championship appearances by the softball, women's and men's golf, and the men's tennis teams have highlighted his most successful seasons in the Department of Athletics. Volleyball has also been to regional postseason play a number of times since joining NCAA Division II in 1996.

Victoria Stimac, Senior Woman Administrator/Assistant Athletic Director of Media Relations



Victoria Stimac headed south to take the reins of the newly created Assistant Athletic Director of Media Relations in the spring of 2007. Stimac handles the duties of sports information director as well as senior woman administrator.

Prior to Western New Mexico, Stimac served as assistant athletic director, senior woman administrator (SWA), sports information director, and head women's volleyball coach at Finlandia University in Hancock, Michigan. Over her four years at Finlandia University, she monitored and recorded all budget activity of 13 NCAA Division III intercollegiate athletic programs. She also supervised, maintained, and educated all aspects of institutional and NCAA regulations to coaches, staff, administration, student-athletes, and the Finlandia University community.

Stimac was the third head volleyball coach in Finlandia volleyball history. She helped lead the Lions to the University's first post season opportunity in 2005. The team qualified for the NCAA Division III Independent Tournament held in Troy, New York and advanced to the championship match before falling to Russell Sage College in four games.

As the SWA at Finlandia University and now at Western New Mexico University, Stimac has demonstrated the ability to direct the daily operations of a department while managing staff, coaches, and programs. She also has worked to bridge the gap between the Department of Athletics and the community at both universities. At WNMU, she has worked alongside a public relations firm and the university's Public Information Office to present the overall message of Western New Mexico University and have been involved with the university's strategic planning and institutional advancement committees.

Stimac, originally from Cedar Grove, Wisconsin, played volleyball at Cardinal Stritch University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where she was a three-year volleyball starter as a middle hitter and co-captain her final season. She majored in business in marketing. Stimac's previous work experience includes coaching volleyball to youth ages 13 to 17 at South Shore Volleyball Club, marketing at Ottawa University, teaching English as a second language in Japan, and admissions at her alma mater.

Stimac is actively involved in the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletics Administrators (NACWAA) and the Collegiate Sports Information Directors Association (CoSida).

ATHLETIC ADMINISTRATION

Kent Beatty, Assistant Athletic Director



In 2008, head golf coach Kent Beatty was promoted to assistant athletic director. Beatty oversees all game day planning and management. He will also work directly with the maintenance department and athletic training staff.

Success has followed Kent Beatty during his coaching career. Named head coach in 1997, Beatty has learned many of the tricks it takes to lead a successful program, and it shows. Both his men's and women's teams are regular participants in the post season, an accomplishment which has been instrumental in giving WNMU's other athletic programs the confidence to succeed.

The fact that Beatty's position at WNMU is full-time is an indicator that WNMU is committed to its golf program. The majority of small-school college golf coaches are employed elsewhere or are instructors at their respective universities, and WNMU's commitment to golf and it's athletes has paid great dividends over the past few years.

In addition to 21 NCAA post season tournament appearances and six conference championships in his 11 years at the school, Coach Beatty has mentored five all-Americans, seven academic all-Americans and five PGA golf professionals. He, himself, was also named RMAC Women's Golf Coach of the Century in May 2009.

Beatty's teams at WNMU have continued to improve with each passing season. The quality recruits who commit to WNMU and Beatty's no-nonsense approach to athletics and academics seems to be a popular one for newcomers — stressing that great golf, solid classroom performance, and learning people skills will increase his players chances of success — is the cornerstone of the Beatty philosophy.

A Class A member of the PGA of America, Coach Beatty started one of New Mexico's golf dynasties at Ruidoso High School, a team that has captured five state championship trophies in recent years and continues to churn out top players that are also excellent students. Beatty also serves on the NGCA All-American Committee and was the NMAA High School Golf Committee's chairman for seven years.

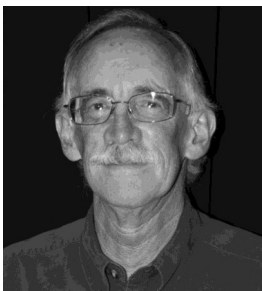
Dr. Claudia Leonard, Faculty Athletic Representative



Dr. Leonard joined Mustang Athletics in 2007. An associate professor in the Department of Allied Health, Leonard first came to WNMU in 1997 and then took a break for two and a half years from WNMU before returning again in the fall of 2005. She currently serves as program director for the Master of Occupational Therapy program.

Dr. Leonard received her Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy from Eastern Michigan University in 1983. She then went on to earn her master's degree in business from WNMU in 2001. In 2007, she completed her Doctorate in Occupational Therapy at the University of St. Augustine.

Dr. Roland Shook, Compliance Coordinator



Dr. Roland Shook held the Faculty Athletic Representative post starting in 1993 and was an integral part of the Athletic Department as well as the university's academic department. Now in his retirement, Dr. Shook took on the responsibility of the being the Mustangs' compliance coordinator in 2007. His responsibilities as the compliance coordinator include scrutinizing each athlete's transcript, signing off on their eligibility status, and acting as arbitrator and investigator when student-athlete, coaching, or other athletic-related issues arise.

Joining the Mustang's media program in 2009, Tana Holtorf is the newest member of the media relations staff. A former Grand Canyon Antelope, Holtorf brings a strong academic background and athletic experience to the Mustang staff.

Holtorf graduated from Grand Canyon University in Phoenix, Arizona in May 2009. She earned a degree in secondary education as well as physical education. She graduated Summa Cum Laude and awarded a Ray Maben award (highest honor given at GCU). Holtorf was an Academic All-American for all four years while playing NCAA competitive Division II softball. She maintained a 3.9 GPA throughout her career.

Holtorf was a four-year starter in the outfield for the Antelopes. She was Second Team All-PacWest in 2008 and 2009.

Holtorf prides herself in hard work and strives for perfection in all aspects of her life.

Terra Strain, Women's Athletic Trainer



Terra Strain returned to Silver City and WNMU in 2007 after seven years away. For her first three years back, she assisted the volleyball team and was a full-time athletic trainer. Starting in 2010, Strain will be in the athletic training room the entire time where she will continue to work with the Western New Mexico women's programs.

Strain, a graduate of the movement science program at WNMU, wore a Mustang volleyball jersey from 1996-2000. During her four years, she was on the Gold Honor board each semester. She also was named to the Pac-West All-Conference Academic Team in 1999.

After WNMU, Strain attended Montana State University - Billings where she received her Master of Science in Athletic Training degree in 2006. She also was an assistant volleyball coach for the Yellowjackets

for one year.

Most recently, Strain worked as an athletic trainer and head girl's volleyball coach at Bradshaw Mountain High School. The Virden, New Mexico native also coached for the Arizona Mile High Volleyball Club for one year and three years at Holbrook High School in Arizona. At Holbrook, she was the 3A North Co-Coach of the Year in 2002 and the 1A-3A All-Star Coach in 2004.

A graduate of Colorado State University – Pueblo, Chris Mondragon is well acquainted with the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. He rejoins the conference after a six-year hiatus as the newest athletic trainer for the Mustangs.

Mondragon graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science and Health Promotion with an emphasis in Athletic Training from CSU – Pueblo in 2004. While there, he worked with the United States Air Force Academy's NCAA Division I football program along with the ThunderWolves' 12 programs.

In 2005, Mondragon went on to the University of Louisiana at Monroe to earn a Master of Science in Exercise Physiology. He assisted primarily with the men's and women's track and field programs as well as women's soccer.

After he earned his degree in 2006, Mondragon returned to Colorado to work for Northglenn High School. He worked there for the next four years. He also found time to work for the Colorado Ice, an indoor football team, during the 2009 and 2010 seasons. Also in 2009, Mondragon was the United States wrestling team's athletic trainer when they traveled to Poland.

Mondragon is originally from Antonito, Colorado.

FOOTBALL COACHING STAFF

Adam Clark, Head Coach



Adam Clark has spent his entire football career as both a player and a coach with winning programs. He has won eight or more games nine out of the last 10 years at the college level. He has also won seven conference championships and had two runner-up conference finishes as a player and as a coach during that span.

Clark came to WNMU as the defensive coordinator in February 2010 and named head coach three months later after back-to-back second place finishes in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference at the Colorado School of Mines where he was the defensive line coach and strength and conditioning coordinator.

Clark help build the Orediggers to an RMAC powerhouse, finishing just one game behind conference champions the University of Nebraska-Kearney last season. While at Mines, Clark coached the RMAC Defensive Player of the Year and three all-conference defensive linemen selections in 2009. The team also finished ranked in the top 25 in the nation in run defense the past two seasons. Mines head coach Bob Stitt credited Clark's strength program as a major reason for Mines' success.

Prior to Mines, Clark spent the 2007 season as the defensive coordinator/assistant head coach at St. Ambrose University, where Clark was selected as the MSFA Assistant Coach of the Year. Clark's 2007 defense was ranked in the top five nationally in four categories, including scoring (fourth, 12.8 points per game), pass defense (second, 134 yards per game), pass defense efficiency (second, 80.6) and turnovers forced (fourth, 38). Clark helped guide the Fighting Bees to a final national ranking of No. 9 in the country.

Clark also spent three seasons (2004-2006) as the defensive secondary and strength and conditioning coach at Graceland University. In 2005, the Jackets finished 9-3, won the school's first conference championship in 30 years, and advanced to their first-ever national playoff. Clark also coached the Defensive Player of the Year in the Heart of America Conference in 2005.

A 2002 graduate of St. Ambrose University, Clark earned his bachelor's degree in sociology. Clark, who went on to earn his master's degree in organizational leadership from St. Ambrose, also served as a graduate assistant for his alma mater from 2002-2004.

Clark was a two-year letterwinner on the St. Ambrose football team during his undergraduate career. During his time with the Fighting Bees, Clark raked in all-conference and all-American honors. Prior to attending St. Ambrose, Clark played football at Grossmont Junior College for two years, earning all-conference and all-state accolades.

Brad Cook, Offensive Line Coach/Video Coordinator/Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach



Brad Cook comes to Western New Mexico University after three seasons coaching (2007-2010) and four season playing (2003-2006) at St. Ambrose University, Clark's alma mater. Most recently as the offensive line and tight ends coach, recruiting coordinator, and video coordinator, Cook coached two All-Americans and seven All-Mid-States Football Association Midwest League (MSFA) offensive linemen along with two all-league tight ends.

As a player, Cook was a four-year starting center for the Fighting Bees and a member of two Mid-States Football Association Midwest League conference championships (2003 and 2006). The Fighting Bees were a perfect 10-0 through the 2006 regular season. Cook helped St. Ambrose qualify for the playoffs in 2003, 2005, and 2006.

Cook was a Victory Sports Network First Team All-American in 2006 and was an All-MSFA selection in 2005 and 2006. He was a two-time Academic All-American and a three-time All-MSFA Academic Team pick. In 2006, Cook was one of 17 football players from all collegiate levels selected to the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame's National Scholar-Athlete Class. That year, he also became the first athlete at St. Ambrose to be a finalist for the Draddy Award, given to the nation's top football scholar-athlete.

Cook graduated from St. Ambrose with a bachelor's degree in finance and economics in 2007. He went on to achieve a master's degree in business administration also at St. Ambrose in 2009.

FOOTBALL COACHING STAFF

Brandon Guzman, Running Backs and Tight Ends Coach/Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach



Brandon Guzman enters his second year at WNMU, now coaching the running backs and tight ends after coaching the offensive line last season. Guzman began his coaching career at Scottsdale Community College coaching linebackers in 2008.

Guzman starred at Winslow High School in Winslow, Arizona, as an offensive and defensive lineman. Guzman excelled on the field being a 4-year letterman, 2-year team captain, an all-state and all-conference player, and played in the Arizona High School 2A-3A All-Star Football Game.

After high school, Guzman attended Scottsdale Community College where he was a two-year starter as a guard and center. He helped lead the Artichokes to a 9-1 record and a conference championship in 2004.

Guzman transferred to Southern Utah University and started at right guard, while obtaining a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education and Human Performance.

Chuck Kelly, Defensive Line Coach



Coach Kelly has been a staple at WNMU for the last 33 years as an assistant football coach. At Western New Mexico University, Kelly has worked with the linebackers and defensive line during his tenure. This season he will work specifically with the defensive line.

Kelly started his coaching career at the famous Mt. Carmel High School in the tough Chicago Catholic League. He was selected the Coach of the Year. After a short stint at Wausau High School (Wisconsin) as a football coach and head wrestling coach, he joined the college ranks. Kelly worked with the linebackers at New Mexico State University and then went on to become the offensive coordinator for the Aggies under Coach Jim Bradley.

Kelly grew up in Chicago, Illinois and attended high school at the first place he coached, Mt. Carmel High School. He started on the "City Champion" football team and was selected as an all-city linebacker.

After high school, he headed west to attend the University of New Mexico where he was a three-year starting linebacker on the three-time WAC Champion Lobo football team. He can proudly say he was a significant part of one of the best teams in the history of UNM football. Kelly was a Second-Team All-WAC selection during his term there.

Kelly is now retired after 32 years as the WNMU financial aid director.

Nick Lucey, Acting Offensive Coordinator



Growing up as the son of a high school football coach, Nick Lucey is no stranger to a football field. Lucey enters his first season with the Mustangs as acting offensive coordinator.

Prior to WNMU, Lucey was the head coach for the Esbjerg Hurricanes, a semi-professional team in Denmark for one season. Before joining the Hurricanes, Lucey served as the offensive graduate assistant at Washington State University from 2006 to 2009 and worked with the wide receivers, quarterbacks, and offensive line as well as special teams.

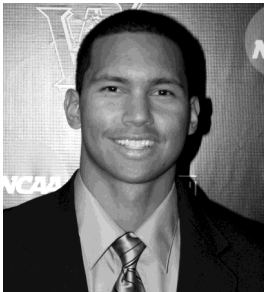
Lucey began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Curtis High School in Washington for one season (2002), followed by three seasons at Pullman High School (2003-2005). He helped lead Pullman to the Washington State 2A Championship in 2005 and runner-up finish in 2003.

A three-sport letterman and 1999 graduate of Curtis High School in University Place, Washington, Lucey went on to play quarterback and punter for one season at Western State College of Colorado before transferring to the University of Puget Sound in Washington and playing for two seasons.

Lucey completed his bachelor's in health and fitness from Washington State University (2006) as well as his master's in higher education administration (2009).

FOOTBALL COACHING STAFF

Kamalei Magnani, Linebackers Coach/Strength and Conditioning Coach



Kamalei Magnani returned to WNMU in 2009 to coach the linebackers. Magnani starred at Palo Verde High School in Tucson, Arizona as a running back and safety. Excelling in the classroom and on the field, he was an honor roll student and played in the Arizona High School 4A-5A All-Star Football Game.

After high school, Magnani attended Arizona Western College where he started as a freshman at fullback. His sophomore year he started at safety and made the Academic All-American Team.

Prior to arriving back at WNMU, Magnani worked as a sports performance coach at Ikei Sports Performance located in Scottsdale, AZ. While assisting well-known strength coach Chad Ikei, he worked with all levels of athletes including youth, high school, collegiate, and professional. Magnani is also certified by the National Strength and Conditioning Association and currently obtains his Collegiate Strength and Conditioning Specialist certificate.

Magnani transferred to WNMU and started as an outside linebacker and fullback while obtaining his degree in kinesiology.

On top of coaching the linebackers, Magnani runs the strength and conditioning program this fall.

Ronnie McDougale, Defensive Backs Coach



Head football coach Adam Clark connected with another former St. Ambrose University coach to help complete his coaching staff in the fall of 2010. Ronnie McDougale, who will work with the defensive backs at WNMU, was with the St. Ambrose Fighting Bees for the 2007 season – the same season Clark was the team's defensive coordinator. Most recently, McDougale was a graduate assistant at the University of South Dakota. His focus was defensive backs and wide receivers.

McDougale began his college playing career as a receiver at the University of South Dakota where he caught 31 passes for 429 yards and three touchdowns. He also averaged 11 yards per punt return and 22 yards per kick return.

McDougale then transferred to the University of Sioux Falls where he excelled as a defensive back for two seasons. He racked up 87 tackles, nine interceptions, 29 pass break-ups, two forced fumbles, and six blocked kicks for the University of Sioux Falls in 2003 and 2004. He was selected All-Great Plains Athletic Conference First Team in 2004 and All-Great Plains Athletic Conference Second Team in 2003. During the 2004 season, McDougale was also an honorable mention All-American and Academic All-American Fourth Team.

McDougale's talents were not limited to just the football field as he also was an NCAA All-American track athlete in the 200 meters at the University of South Dakota, clocking a career best time of 20.8 seconds. McDougale continued his football career at the professional level, playing Arena2 Football with the Quad City Steam Wheelers as a defensive back and wide receiver.

McDougale possesses a Bachelor of Education degree with a coaching endorsement from the University of Sioux Falls (2005) and a Master of Arts in Health, Physical Education, and Special Education from the University of South Dakota (2009).

James Thomas, Wide Receivers Coach



James Thomas comes to WNMU from Graceland University in Iowa where he coached defensive backs as a graduate assistant during the 2009 season. Thomas spent four years prior to the 2009 season as an undergraduate student-athlete. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Physical Education and Health and an endorsement in Coaching.

Over his five years at Graceland, Thomas gained a reputation as being a stellar athlete. Thomas was a four-year starting cornerback and was a three-year all-conference performer. As a freshman and sophomore player, he was under the management of current WNMU head coach Adam Clark.

In the football offseason, Thomas excelled on the track, becoming an indoor track All-American in the 60-meter dash and set the Graceland University record in the 100-meter dash with a time of 10.52.

At WNMU, Thomas is in charge of the wide receivers and working towards a master's degree in educational leadership.

Frank Allison, Assistant Outside Linebackers Coach



Frank Allison enters his first season with the Mustangs as their defensive student assistant coach, working with the outside linebackers and coordinating special teams and offense scout teams.

A native of Deming, New Mexico, Allison graduated from Deming High School in 2003. He went on to Eastern New Mexico University but then transferred to Western New Mexico after one year to play football as a linebacker on the 2005 team.

Allison will graduate with a bachelor's degree in history in May.

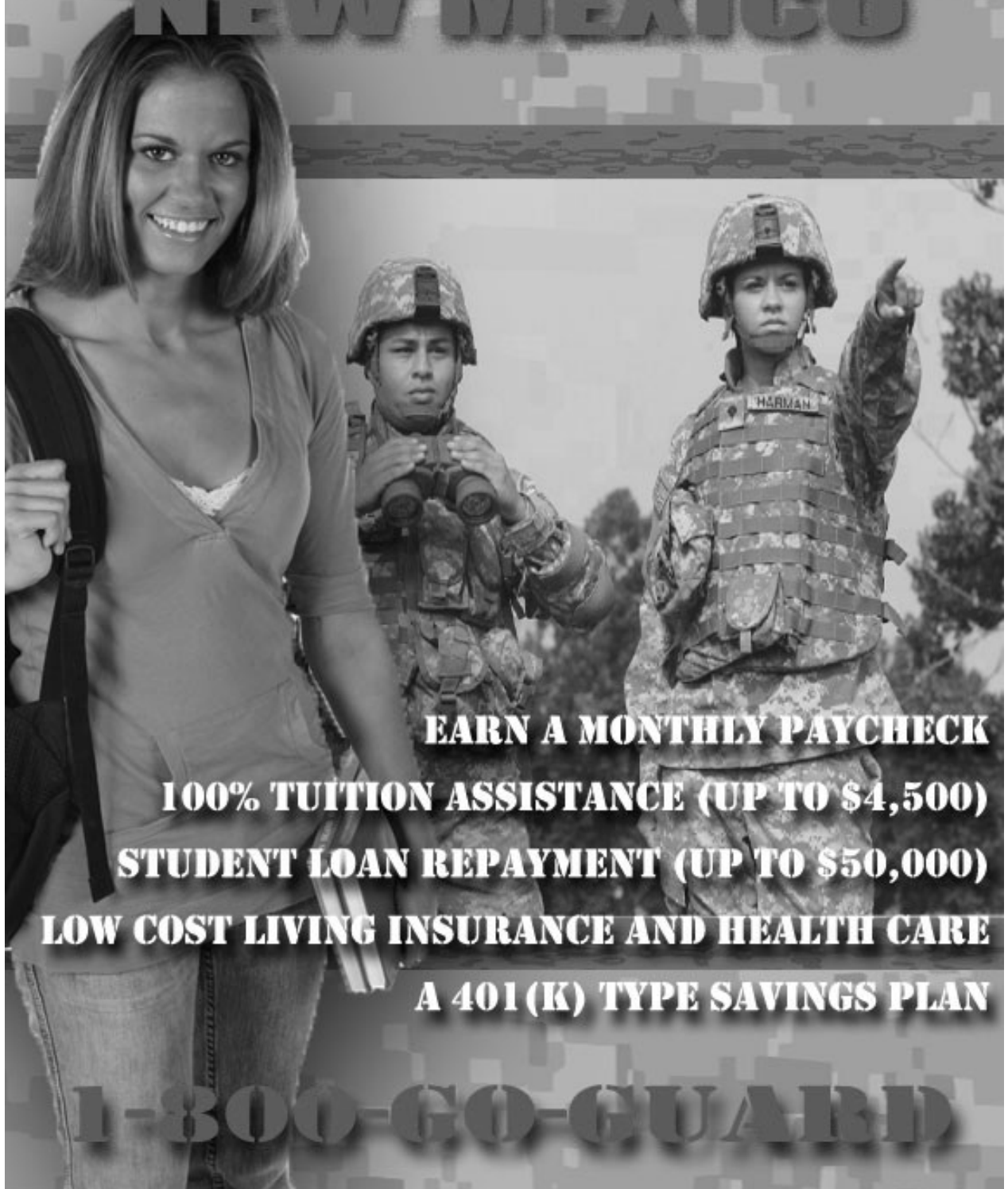

TEAM OUTLOOK

From Coach Clark

It is tough to lift a team that is coming off of back-to-back 2-8 seasons, but with new leadership, a new desire, and strong persistence and discipline, it can be done. Under new head coach Adam Clark, the team has made huge strides to already turn a divided and lackluster team into a team that plays as one and that has a bit of sheen to it, and the team has not even played a first down yet.

"Our only goals are to continually improve and develop as a team, as individual players, and as people. To achieve these goals, we have to approach every day with the conscious effort of being disciplined and functioning in a manner that allows us to reach our potential," comments Clark. "We want to

establish a culture of discipline within our program. We want our players to understand the focus, dedication, and discipline required to be successful."

The student-athletes – and Clark emphasizes the "student" part of being a "student-athlete" – have responded well to Clark's coaching style rather quickly. Emphasizing the importance of fundamentals and roles, the new leader is sure he has a solid core who can achieve success. "Every year new players must step into important roles and perform in order to achieve success. We have a number of talented returning players and some new ones who will be expected to play major roles for us this season and fill any void left by players from last year."

Offense

Despite only starting one game in the 2009 season, Chris Voller (Albuquerque, NM, Valley High School) returns as a quarterback veteran who saw time in every game last season and started in every game in 2008. "He is our starting quarterback right now and has a lot of game experience and a good amount of success in his career," comments Clark. "He is going to need to take that next step to being a consistent player who can lead our team by making great decisions and not turning the ball over."

Voller finished the 2010 season averaging 60.1 yards per game in the air while completing 51 of 104 attempts. He did throw, however, four of the team's 13 interceptions on the year. During the 2008 season, Voller was the head honcho in the quarterback spot as a redshirt freshman. He notched 206.9 yards per game while completing 193 of 388 attempts. He led the team in total offense and threw 13 of the team's 19 touchdowns.

Playing in his final season, Kevin Breaker (Stockton, CA, Lincoln High School, Delta College) hopes to have a solid senior year in the running back position like he started his junior year. Versus Sul Ross State University, Breaker broke tackles left and right to post 177 yards and two touchdowns. He also had two other games with 100-plus yards. Breaker finished the season with 838 all-purpose yards. Seven hundred and twelve were from rushing. He averaged 5.0 yards per carry, 5.5 yards per catch, 83.8 all-purpose yards per game, and 71.2 yards of total offense per game.

"Breaker is a very good running back," states Clark, "who had a good year last year and who we think can be even more productive this year. He has good vision, is very quick, and runs hard." Returner James Brown (Tallahassee, FL, Amos P. Godby High School, New Mexico Military Institute), along with Donald Askew (Mesa, AZ, Agua Fria High School, Scottsdale Community College) and Mario Wren (Bessemer, AL, Bessemer City High School), will also fight for playing time in the running back slot.

To provide the holes for Breaker, Brown, Askew, and Wren to

run through this season are returners Diego Gonzalez (Phoenix, AZ, Trevor G. Browne High School), Sunia Vaitai (Waianae, HI, Waianae High School, New Mexico State University), James Lake (Mesa, AZ, Dobson High School), Sosaia Vaitai (Waianae, HI, Waianae High School, Eastern Arizona College), and Stuart Wheat (Wimberley, TX, Wimberley High School, Hardin Simmons University). "All of these people bring starting experience so we hope that experience makes for a strong group up front," states Clark. "As a group, we have pretty good size and athleticism. Specifically, Gonzales worked hard in the weight room over the last year and has really developed nicely."

Andrew Perez (Carson, CA, Century High School, El Camino College), Eric Hall (Harbor City, CA, Narbonne High School, LA Harbor College), and Brian Flores (Winnetka, CA, Cleveland High School, Pierce College), all transfers, also will fight for starting roles on the offensive line but will also add the much needed depth the Mustangs have not seen in recent years. Last season WNMU averaged only 137.3 yards rushing per game and 368.7 yards of offense per game. Their opponents, on the other hand, posted 212.2 yards on the ground and 480.2 yards per game.

WNMU has four of their top eight receivers returning from last year. Salvador Garcia (Anthony, TX, Anthony High School), the Mustangs' newest All-American, was one of those team's leading receivers last season. Garcia's efforts paid off as he was listed on the 2009 Don Hansen's Football Gazette All-Super Region Three. He also was placed on the 2009 All-RMAC football teams twice.

Markis Sumpter (Oceanside, CA, Fallbrook High School), Christopher Miranda (Peoria, AZ, Peoria High School, Phoenix Community College), and CJ Gardner (Safford, AZ, Safford High School, Arizona State University), the other three top returning receivers, will provide the experience to fill the other receiving spots. All three combined for 66.0 receiving yards per game last year. "They give us a number of explosive receivers to go to," comments Clark.

TEAM OUTLOOK

Defense

The Mustangs were among the top five in nearly every offensive category in the RMAC in 2009. The same was not the case for the WNMU defense. That was one reason for the hiring of Clark, who started as the team's defensive coordinator and then made the transition to head coach. With Clark's tactics and teaching of fundamentals and strategy, the Mustangs hope to be in the top half of the conference once again.

The Mustangs return a number of players defensively, but the players have been asked to change positions or learn a new style of play. Chris Collins (San Jose, CA, Silver Creek High School, San Jose City College), who played safety last season, will play linebacker this season. "He brings athleticism to the table," says Clark. Collins played in all ten games in 2009. His best showing was against Mesa State, the third game of the season, when he produced five solo tackles, five assist tackles, and one tackle for a loss of five yards.

Also in the linebackers spot are returners Ryan Nolan (Tempe, AZ, Corona Del Sol High School) and Eric Zuniga (Rio Rico, AZ, Nogales High School). Both played in the majority of the games last season. "Each has their own strengths. Ryan is pretty athletic and can do a lot as well. Eric is a sharp guy who plays pretty consistent," notes Clark. Clark also expects junior college transfers Jacob Cross (Bakersfield, CA, Centennial High School, Bakersfield Junior College), Joey Bertrand (Bakersfield, CA, Centennial High School, Bakersfield Junior College), and Niko Skawinski (San Diego, CA, Poway High School, San Diego Mesa College) to make a major impact at the linebacker spot. "All three of those guys are very good players who run around and hit people," he continues.

On the defensive line, Clark has Jarret Yargus (Bagdad, AZ, Bagdad High School) and Aaron Kleinpeter (Phoenix, AZ, Red Mountain High School, Mesa Community College) to rely on as veterans. "Expect big things from both of them. Aaron has a tremendous motor and is very explosive. He did not play a ton last year because he had been moved to linebacker. We put him back at his natural defensive end position, and he has excelled there. He is a starter there, and we expect big things from him. Jarret plays very hard and is typically a very consistent player," comments Clark.

Yargus and Kleinpeter cannot and will not manage the d-line all on their own however. Mitch Knoy (Bakersfield, CA, Bakersfield High School, Bakersfield Junior College) and Jordan Hamill (Oceanside, CA, El Camino High School, College

of the Redwoods/St. Ambrose University) will all compete for significant playing time.

Top defenseman, Derrick Perrault (San Diego, CA, Helix High School, Southwestern College) who posted 75 tackles during the 2009 season, returns as Clark's top player in the secondary. "He is one of our best players. He is smart and a physical player as well," says Clark. Perrault also had five tackles for a loss of 23 yards, two sacks for 13 yards, four breakups, one forced fumble, and one recovered fumble.

Also in the secondary is Terence Brannic (Oceanside, CA, El Camino High School, Santa Rosa Junior College). He returns for his second season in a Mustang jersey. Brannic comes off of a successful first season when he played nine games and produced 29 tackles. Fernie De La Rosa (Vinton, TX, Canutillo High School) and Cooper Bowman (Los Lunas, NM, Los Lunas High School, University of New Mexico), also returners, will challenge Perrault and Brannic for playing time. The two played in nearly every game last season with Bowman producing the second most tackles for the team with 57.

To round out the defense, Terron Sumpter, Jr. (Fallbrook, CA, Fallbrook High School) and Jordon Dancer (Peoria, AZ, Peoria High School, Jamestown College) expect to fill the corner spots with Kameron Drawhorn (San Diego, CA, Fallbrook High School), Anthony Phillips (Houston, TX, Dobie High School), and David Le'Gall (Antioch, CA, Deer Valley High School, Contra Costa College) looking on to contend for a starting spot. Sumpter had 45 tackles on the last season, fourth on the team, along with four tackles for a loss, one interception, and six breakups. Dancer had equally impressive numbers with 34 tackles, two tackles for a loss, one interception and seven breakups.

"We want our players to understand focus, dedication, and discipline required to be successful," says Clark. "We will focus on the process of each repetition, each day, each week, and so on. These types of concepts are the team's most important concern." If Clark can accomplish this, it will help the Mustangs climb up the defensive ladder in the RMAC.

TEAM OUTLOOK

Special Teams

Playing both offense and special teams, Garcia will be the Mustangs' go-to person for kick returns and punt returns. The junior comes off a spectacular season when he earned nods on the RMAC Second Team – Special Teams for his work as a kick returner. He averaged 26.7 yards each return this season to lead the conference. Overall, Garcia had 26 returns for 695 yards. He also was named to the Third Team – Special Teams for his punt return effort. In this category, he posted a 16.6 yard average for a total of 216 yards. He finished the season with 1334 all-purpose yards to rank him third in the RMAC. The Mustangs did not attempt very many field goals last season

(4-7) despite having Colin Lund (Mililani, HI, Mililani High School, New Mexico State University) who made one field goal from the 42-yard line. Lund also did much of the punting for the purple and gold. He punted 45 times, averaging 38.9 yards per launch, and had five go 50-plus yards and eight inside the 20-yard line. Lund returns again this year and hopes to have more opportunities putting three points on the scoreboard.

Conclusion

The Mustangs kick off their season at NCAA Division I Northern Arizona University on September 2. NAU leads the series 15-6 -1 and last met in the 2007 season (L, 47-0). "They are a very good team, very explosive on offense, fast on defense, and will be a great challenge," says Clark.

The team will then take on NCAA Division III Sul Ross State University in Alpine, Texas the following week. The Mustangs hosted the Lobos last season and walked away with their first

of two wins on the season (48-33). The purple and gold then move on to conference play when they host Fort Lewis College. "There are a lot of good teams in the RMAC that are well coached and play tough physical football. We will have to play at a consistently high level to be successful in the RMAC. The schedule is a good one with a lot of tough games and good challenges," concludes Clark.

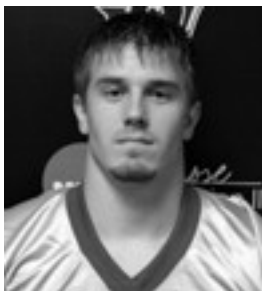

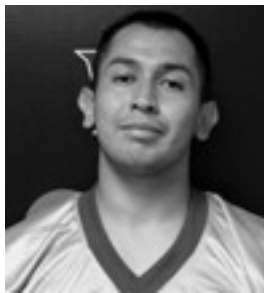
