GAME 8: Winona State (5-2, 2-1 NSIC South) at Wayne State (3-4, 2-1 NSIC South)

THE GAME: Wayne State hosts Winona State Saturday in an NSIC South Division clash that is also the 28th annual Egg Bowl Game with kickoff slated for 1 p.m. at Bob Cunningham Field in Wayne.

The game can be heard on the Wildcat Sports Network and flagship radio station KTCH FM-104.9 in Wayne. Aaron Scheffler and Justin Raulston will call the action this weekend with an extensive pregame show featuring interviews and more starting at 12:30 p.m.

Fans outside of the KTCH listening area can listen to the game by logging onto the internet broadcast link at www.wscwildcats.com and http://www.waynedailynews.com/streaming/.

A free video internet broadcast is available through Stretch Internet at http://client.stretchinternet.com/client/wsc.portal# and live stats of all NSIC games can be found at http://www.nsicscores.com/livecentral.htm.

The game can also be seen on live TV across northeast Nebraska on Nebraska News Channel, channel 99 at the American Broadband Wayne cable system. Former Wildcat tight end Grant Otten and Brandon Aksamit will deliver the play-by-play action.

Saturday's game can also be heard and watched locally on campus radio/TV station KWSC 91.9 FM 'The Cat' and KWSC-TV Channel 6 in Wayne.

SERIES HISTORY: Winona State holds a 16-4 lead in the all-time series vs. Wayne State that began in the 1994 season. The Warriors have won five of the last six meetings, including a 45-31 victory in Winona last year. Wayne State won two years ago in Wayne 27-7. WSC also won back-to-back meetings against the Warriors in 2008 (55-18) and 2009 (48-25). The 2011, 2012 and 2013 meetings were each decided by four points or less.

LAST WEEK: Junior quarterback Zach Osborn accounted for 431 yards of total offense and five touchdowns to lead Wayne State in a wild 41-39 win at Southwest Minnesota State. It was the sixth time in the last seven trips to Marshall that WSC came home with a win. The 'Cats gained 485 yards of total offense for a second straight game and converted 10 of 14 on third-down conversions in the road victory. WSC also dominated the time of possession in the contest - 36:47 to 23:13.

Osborn, who was named Monday the NSIC Offensive Player of the Week, completed 23 of 33 passes for 348 yards and four touchdowns while rushing for another 83 yards on 11 carries and one score. Sophomore Shymere Williams had seven catches for a career-high 163 yards and two TD's to lead Wildcat receivers followed by freshman Willie Walton with seven grabs for 72 yards. Junior Nate Rogers added three catches for 63 yards and one TD while senior Nick Roth also hauled in a TD reception.

Junior linebacker Emeka Etta notched a season-high 12 tackles followed by Glenn Harris with seven stops. WSC punted just once in the contest.

DID YOU KNOW???:

***Home teams were just 2-6 last weekend in the NSIC, bringing this season's home record for NSIC football teams to 31-25 (.554).

***Wayne State's offense has gained 485 yards of total offense in each of the last two games after averaging 343.4 yards per game in the first five contests.

***Wayne State has just six seniors on this year's roster.

***Eight of Wayne State's 11 opponents this season had winning records last year while three of the teams - Sioux Falls, Augustana and Minnesota State - advanced to the NCAA Division II playoffs.

WAYNE STATE HEAD COACH DAN MCLAUGHLIN: Dan McLaughlin is in his 12th year as head football coach at Wayne State College. Heading into Saturday's home game vs. Winona State, McLaughlin has a career record of 66-64 (.508) overall and 62-53 (.539) in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. Inheriting a struggling program, McLaughlin turned Wayne State into a constant winner that included six straight winning seasons (2007-12), a feat never achieved in the program's 100-year history.



McLaughlin became Wayne State's all-time win's leader on October 24, 2015 following a 20-17 at home win over Concordia-St. Paul. It was his 63rd win as Wildcat head coach, surpassing Del Stoltenberg who was 62-70-5 in his 14 years as head coach at WSC from 1969-82. Entering his 12th season, McLaughlin is the second longest tenured coach in school history and he is now the second longest tenured coach in the NSIC trailing only Winona State's Tom Sawyer who is entering his 21st season.

Under McLaughlin in 2015, Wayne State finished 4-7 overall and 1-6 in the NSIC South Division.

Wayne State finished the 2014 season at 5-6 overall and tied for fourth in the NSIC South Division with a 3-4 record. Marquee wins during the year included a 27-7 rout of #25 Winona State on homecoming and a wild 48-45 overtime win at Southwest Minnesota State.

Wayne State finished with a 2-9 record under McLaughlin in the 2013 season, the Wildcats' first losing mark in seven seasons. WSC dropped five games by seven points or less.

Under McLaughlin in 2012, the Wildcats recorded a 6-5 record for a sixth straight winning season. Three of the team's five losses were by seven points or less. For the fifth straight season, Wildcat football had at least one player receive All-America honors under McLaughlin as senior punter Randy Weich was named to six different All-America teams.

In 2011, Wayne State finished with a record of 7-4 overall and 7-3 in the NSIC. The Wildcats were nationally ranked for a fourth straight season with the team's signature win coming in a 7-0 triumph over #1 ranked and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth ending the Bulldogs 31-game win streak against NSIC opponents.

The Wildcats were 6-5 overall and 5-5 in the NSIC during the 2010 season. WSC was ranked for part of the season and was as high as 18th in the AFCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll. Two of the Wildcat wins were over top 15 teams that made the playoffs, beating #13 Nebraska-Kearney and #7 Augustana, handing the Vikings their lone loss during the regular season.

McLaughlin's 2009 team was 8-3 and ranked a majority of the season - as high 11th in the D2Football.com and 14th in the AFCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll.

Predicted for a seventh place finish out of 14 teams in the NSIC for the 2008 season, McLaughlin coached the Wildcats to a 9-3 record and the school's first-ever berth in the NCAA Division II playoffs. The Wildcats won seven straight games to finish the regular season and earned a share of the NSIC South Division title with Minnesota State, going 8-2 in league play.

The nine wins in 2008 tied the school record, matching the 1949 (9-0) and 1993 (9-1) teams that also won nine games in a season. WSC finished the regular season ranked 22nd in NCAA Division II, the first national ranking for a WSC football team since 1995. For leading WSC to a 9-3 season, McLaughlin was named the AFCA (American Football Coaches Association) NCAA Division II Region V Football Coach of the Year.

The Wildcats posted a 7-5 overall record in 2007, the first winning season by a WSC football team since 1995. Wayne State finished second place in the Northern Sun Conference with a 7-2 league mark despite a predicted fifth place finish in the NSIC preseason poll. It was the best-ever finish in conference play for the Wildcat football team since joining the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference in 1999 and resulted in McLaughlin being named the 2007 NSIC Football Coach of the Year.

The Wildcats' second place finish in the NSIC resulted in just the second-ever post season bowl appearance in 91 years of football for the school as Wayne State represented the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference in the Mineral Water Bowl played in Excelsior Springs, Missouri on December 1, 2007. Other milestones accomplished in the 2007 season under McLaughlin included the school's first six-game win streak on the gridiron since 1993 and the first regional ranking (10th in the Northwest Region) for a Wildcat football team since 1993 when WSC was ranked as high as fourth in the former Midwest Region.

Under McLaughlin in 2006, the Wildcats went 5-6 with three of the losses by a combined nine points. WSC amassed a 4-7 mark under McLaughlin in his first season at the school in 2005 and the teams' 4-3 mark in the NSIC that season was the school's first-ever winning mark in football since joining the league in 1999.

Dan McLaughlin was hired as the 21st head football coach at Wayne State College on Dec. 9, 2004. He came to Wayne State after spending one season as offensive coordinator at Minnesota State in Mankato, Minnesota where he helped the Mavericks to a 6-5 record in 2004 after the team went 0-11 in 2003. It was Minnesota State's first winning season in football since 1994. He also served as offensive line coach with the Mavericks under head coach Jeff Jamrog. In 2003, McLaughlin was a graduate assistant coach at the University of Nebraska, working as an assistant offensive line coach and assistant special teams coach while coordinating Nebraska's walk-on program.

Before moving to the college ranks, McLaughlin achieved success at the high school level in Nebraska by winning state championships at three different schools. He was the head coach at Millard West from 1995 to 2002, guiding the Wildcats to seven consecutive playoff appearances. His 2001 team went 12-1 and captured the Class A state title. McLaughlin was the head coach at Norfolk High School from 1988 to 1994, leading the Panthers to the Class A state title in 1994. He also coached at Broken Bow High School in 1987 and led the school to the Class B state crown in his only season at Broken Bow.

Believed to be the only head coach in Nebraska high school football history to win state titles at three different schools, McLaughlin compiled a high school coaching record of 110-59. McLaughlin earned his master's degree from Wayne State College in 1992. He is a native of Sheridan, Montana and is a 1982 graduate of Bellevue College. Dan and his wife Nadine have two sons, Scott and Sean, and reside in Wayne, Neb.

EGG BOWL HISTORY: Saturday marks the 28th annual Egg Bowl Game at Cunningham Field in Wayne. Michael Foods of Wakefield, formerly the Milton G. Waldbaum Company, is the primary sponsor of the event. Michael Foods is one of the world's largest processors in the egg industry and at the same time a long-time supporter of Wayne State College athletics.

The event annually raises approximately \$10,000 each year for the WSC Student Athlete Scholarship Fund.

A commemorative game ball is presented to an MVP from each team at the end of the game as voted on by members of the media covering the contest.

WSC is 16-11 all-time in Egg Bowl games, but has dropped five straight. Last season, Upper Iowa posted a 34-31 double overtime victory over the Wildcats while two years ago #1 Minnesota State blanked WSC 49-0. Wayne State's last win in an Egg Bowl Game was 2010 when the 'Cats beat #7 Augustana 26-14.

ABOUT WAYNE STATE: The Wildcats won a wild 41-39 shootout at Southwest Minnesota State last Saturday night to improve to 3-4 overall and 2-1 in the NSIC South. It was the seventh win in the last eight trips to Marshall for WSC, now 2-2 in road games and 1-2 at home this season.

Wayne State ranks 10th in the NSIC in scoring offense (27.9) and 11th in scoring defense allowing 31.6 a contest. The 'Cats are 10th in total offense at 383.9 yards per game while ranking sixth in total defense giving up 396.9.

The Wildcats are eighth in the league in passing offense (250.1) and 12th in rushing offense at 133.7 yards per game while ranking fifth in rushing defense (129.4) and 13th in pass defense allowing 267.4 yards a contest. WSC is second in the NSIC in net punting average (40.1) and tied for 10th in turnover margin at -2. The 'Cats are tied for 12th with 10 sacks and 15th in kickoff return average (14.4).

Individually, junior quarterback Zach Osborn, the NSIC Offensive Player of the Week, leads the Wildcat offense completing 141 of 252 passes for 1,677 yards and 19 TD's with 10 interceptions. He ranks sixth in the league in passing yards per game (239.6), eighth in total offense (263.7) and 10th in pass efficiency (128.8).

The Wildcat rushing attack is led by junior Rashad Trimble with 434 yards on 109 carries (4.0 avg.) while junior Arelious Burns adds 314 yards on 83 attempts and two scores.

Wayne State's top receiver is junior Nate Rogers, who has 40 catches for 530 yards and nine TD's. He is tied for eighth in the league in receptions per game (5.71) and scoring (TD's) while ranking ninth in receiving yards per game (75.7). Sophomore Shymere Williams follows with 26 catches for 461 yards (17.7 avg.) and four TD's. Senior Nick Roth has 13 catches for 112 yards and three scores.

On special teams, sophomore punter Cody Netusil ranks second in the NSIC with an average of 42.2 yards per kick while freshman placekicker Ethan Knudson is second in the league in field goals made with seven, going 7 for 8 on the season along with 22 of 24

The Wildcat defense is paced by senior defensive back Cam Montgomery with a teamhigh 43 tackles (31 solo) and four interceptions, which is tied for the NSIC lead. Redshirt freshman linebacker Tyler Thomsen adds 40 tackles followed by junior linebacker Emeka Etta with 36. Glenn Harris and Jamaal Conway-Smith each have two interceptions while five different players have one fumble recovery apiece. Jonathan Bland is tied for the team lead in sacks (2.5) and tackles for loss (4.5) while Randy Bryan also has 2.5 sacks.

SCOUTING WINONA STATE: The Warriors are 5-2 on the season and 2-1 in the NSIC South Division following last weekend's 41-30 home loss to #6 Sioux Falls that snapped a four-game win streak. Winona State is 3-1 at home and 2-1 in road games this year.

Winona State tops the NSIC in several defensive categories, leading the league in scoring defense (18.0), total defense (296.3) and pass defense (165.0). The Warriors are also tied for second in the league in turnover margin at +5 through seven games and rank sixth in rushing defense (131.3).

Offensively, Winona State is sixth in the league in scoring offense (38.1) and sixth in total offense at 453.9 yards per game. The Warriors are fourth in pass offense (299.7) and 10th in rushing offense at 154.1 yards a contest. Winona State is fifth in the league in kickoff return average (24.5) and 11th in net punting average (32.6).

Senior running back Paul Preston ranks second in the NSIC in rushing yards per game (111.7) and leads the league in all-purpose yards per game (179.3). He has rushed for 670 yards on 113 carries (5.9 avg) with eight TD's and has 16 catches for 155 yards.

Senior quarterback Jack Nelson has completed 145 of 238 passes for 2,041 yards and 18 TD's with five interceptions. He ranks third in the NSIC in passing yards per game (291.6), sixth in total offense (282.6) and fifth in pass efficiency (153.7).

Senior wide receiver Cameron Johnson hauls in 49 catches for 920 yards (18.8 avg) with 10 TD's, ranking second in the league in catches per game (7.00) and receiving yards per game (131.4) and is sixth in touchdowns with 10.

Freshman Jake Balliu leads the NSIC in both kickoff and punt return average. He averages 23.4 yards per punt return with one TD and has a 32.4 yard average on kick returns. Junior placekicker Carter McCauley has an NSIC leading eight field goals (8-13) and is 18 for 22 on PAT kicks.

Junior free safety Andrew Spencer leads the Winona State defense with 51 tackles and two interceptions to go with two blocked kicks. Junior middle linebacker Mike Imperiale adds 44 tackles, a team-high six tackles for loss with three sacks and three interceptions.

WINONA STATE HEAD COACH TOM SAWYER: Sawyer is the longest-tenured head football coach in the NSIC in his 21st season at Winona State. He has led the Warriors to records of 161-75 overall (.682) and 133-45 (.747) in the NSIC and ranks sixth in total victories and 12th in winning percentage among active NCAA Division II coaches at the start of this season. Last season. Winona State was 5-6 overall and 3-4 in the NSIC South.

Sawyer has coached the Warriors to five NCAA Division II playoff appearances and three trips to the Mineral Water Bowl while recording five 10-win seasons. The most recent 10-win season was in 2012 when the Warriors went 10-2 and made the Mineral Water Bowl.

Before being named head coach in 1996, Sawyer served as an assistant coach at Winona State from 1987-89 and 1991-94. He is a 1983 graduate of Winona State and earned his master's degree from Winona State in 1989.
