**ABOUT THE WILDCATS:** Wayne State enters the 2022 NCAA Division II Central Regional as the top seed after posting a 29-2 regular season record. The Wildcats, ranked second in this week's AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll, captured its first-ever NSIC regular season title with a 19-1 league record this season.

WSC is a perfect 11-0 at home this season, 12-1 in road matches and 6-1 on a neutral court. The 'Cats are 20-0 in 3-set matches, 6-0 in 4-set contests and 3-2 in 5-set matches this year.

**STATISTICALLY SPEAKING:** Wayne State ranks first in the NSIC in opponent hitting percentage (.150) and blocks per set (2.31) and is second in the league in hitting percentage (.285) and digs per set (16.65). Nationally, WSC is fourth in hitting percentage.

The 'Cats are seventh in the NSIC in kills per set (13.23) and eighth in service aces (1.52).

Sophomore middle hitter Taya Beller, the NSIC Offensive Player of the Year, leads Wayne State in hitting with 3.91 kills per set (3rd-NSIC). She also ranks second in the league and sixth in NCAA Division II in hitting percentage (.407), fourth in points per set (4.48) and ninth in blocks (0.97).

First Team All-NSIC junior outside hitter Kelsie Cada has 14 doubles-doubles and is averaging 3.50 kills and 2.98 digs per set. She is sixth in the league in kills and points per set (4.08) and leads the team in service aces with 33.

Sophomore middle hitter Maggie Brahmer, a First Team All-NSIC honoree, leads the NSIC and is third in NCAA Division II in hitting percentage (.451). She ranks second in blocks per set (1.16), seventh in points per set (3.99) and 10th in kills (3.30).

Rachel Walker, a junior setter and First Team All-NSIC selection, ranks sixth in the NSIC with 10.60 assists and has 12 double-doubles. Senior libero Jessie Brandl, a Second Team All-NSIC honoree, is sixth in the league in digs per set (4.10).

**WSC HISTORY IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT:** The Wayne State College volleyball team is making its 12th appearance in the NCAA Division II National Tournament and first since 2016. The Wildcats are 7-11 all-time in NCAA Tournament play, highlighted by a 2015 NCAA Central Region title and trip to the Final Four in Tampa, Florida.

**WSC HEAD COACH SCOTT KNEIFL:** Scott Kneifl is in his 18th year (2022) as head volleyball coach at Wayne State College. He has led the Wildcat program to unprecedented success resulting in 11 NCAA Division II Tournament appearances, 15 20-win seasons, one NCAA Central Region Title, one national semifinal appearance and one NSIC Tournament title (2007).

During his 16 years on the Wildcat bench (2020 season canceled due to COVID-19), Kneifl has accumulated career records of 390-139 overall (.737) and 224-86 (.723) in the Northern Sun Conference. He achieved his 300th career win on November 5th, 2016 at University of Mary.

Wayne State recorded a 22-8 record in the 2021 season, placing fourth in the NSIC with a 14-6 league mark. The 'Cats closed the 2021 campaign ranked 18th in the final AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll, marking the 12th time in the last 15 years WSC ended the year ranked in the top 25.

WSC volleyball continues to excel in the classroom under Kneifl, posting a stellar 3.82 cumulative grade point average to receive the AVCA Team Academic Award for a 20th straight year, the longest active streak in NCAA Division II. Wildcat volleyball also ranked as one of the top Division II programs for home attendance, ranking seventh nationally during the 2021 season with an average of 634 fans per home match. It's the 13th straight year that WSC has ranked in the top 15 in NCAA Division II home attendance.

Under Kneifl in 2019, WSC finished 24-7 overall and 14-6 in the NSIC. The Wildcats ended the year ranked 13th in the final AVCA Division II Top-25 Coaches Poll, marking the 11th time in the last 14 years the Wildcats ended the season with a Top-25 national ranking. Senior middle hitter Tarrin Beller earned AVCA All-American Third Team honors, marking the fourth different player under Kneifl to receive AVCA All-American accolades.

Kneifl coached the Wildcats to a 22-9 record in 2018, including a 13-7 mark in the rugged Northern Sun Conference. WSC led the NSIC in blocks per set (2.56), tied for sixth in NCAA Division II, and led the NSIC in opponent hitting percentage (.151). WSC was ranked in the AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll for the first four weeks of the season, marking every year since 2006 that the Wildcat program has been nationally ranked.

WSC volleyball continues to excel in the classroom under Kneifl, posting a stellar 3.85 cumulative grade point average to receive the AVCA Team Academic Award for a 16th straight year. Senior setter Megan Gebhardt was named Google Cloud Academic All-American First Team with a perfect 4.00 grade point average, marking the second straight season she received Academic All-American honors.

In 2017, Wayne State posted records of 19-12 overall and 12-8 (tie for seventh) in the NSIC. The Wildcats were ranked in every regular season AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches' Poll and battled eventual national champion Concordia-St. Paul before falling in five sets in the NSIC

Tournament opener.

Under Kneifl in 2016, the Wildcats finished 24-8 overall and 6th in the NSIC with a 14-6 league mark. WSC qualified for the NCAA Division II National Tournament for the 11th time in the last 12 years after posting a dramatic come-from-behind victory over #2 Minnesota Duluth. The Wildcats rallied from a two-set deficit and a 12-7 fifth-set deficit to win 15-13. WSC ended the 2016 season ranked 12th in the final AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll, marking the ninth straight year that the Wildcats finished with a Top 25 national ranking. The Wildcat program has been nationally ranked for 102 consecutive polls dating back to September, 2009.

The Wildcats made school history in the 2015 season by winning the NCAA Central Region title for the first time and advancing to the Elite Eight. WSC finished with records of 28-8 overall and third place in the NSIC with a 16-4 league mark. It was the 10th time in the past 11 seasons that Wayne State College advanced to the NCAA Division II National Tournament.

At the NCAA Central Regional, Kneifl coached the Wildcats to wins over three of the top 10 teams in the country (#8 Central Missouri, #4 Southwest Minnesota State and #1 Concordia-St. Paul) to capture the schools' first-ever NCAA regional championship. WSC then defeated Carson-Newman (Tenn.) 3-1 in the national quarterfinals in Tampa, Florida before falling to Palm Beach Atlantic 3-0 in the national semi-finals to close out the memorable 2015 campaign.

The Wildcats ended 2015 ranked third in the AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll – the highest-ever national ranking to end the season.

Kneifl coached the Wildcats to a 27-7 record in the 2014 season, finishing third in the NSIC with a 16-4 league mark. WSC advanced to the NSIC Tournament title match and reached the NCAA Division II National Tournament defeating Central Missouri in the first round before failing to top-seed Minnesota Duluth to end the season.

The Wildcats finished the 2014 season ranked sixth in the final AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll.

Under Kneifl in 2013, the Wildcats posted a 22-10 overall record and a 12-8 mark in the NSIC. Wayne State finished the year ranked 21st in the final AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll. It marked the fifth straight year in seven of the last nine that the Wildcat program has ended the season ranked in the top 25.

Kneifl coached the Wildcats to a 22-10 overall record in the 2012 season, placing fourth in the NSIC with a 14-6 league mark. WSC ended the season in the NCAA Tournament for an eighth straight year and was ranked 18th in the final AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches' Poll. It was the fifth straight season and sixth of the last seven that the Wildcats ended the year ranked in the top 25. Wayne State's signature win in the 2012 season came against #1 Nebraska-Kearney where the Wildcats defeated the Lopers 3-1 before a crowd of 1,411, the second-largest crowd to ever watch a WSC volleyball match.

In 2011 Kneifl led Wayne State to a 23-8 record, 16-4 in the Northern Sun Conference (4th place). WSC was ranked in the AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches' Poll the entire season, ranked as high as ninth and never below 13th before finishing the season ranked 10th in the nation.

Kneifl coached the Wildcats to a 26-4 record in 2010, going 17-3 in the NSIC to finish in third place. The Wildcats set a new school record with 16 straight wins to open the season and earned the school's first ever #1 national ranking twice during the season. WSC beat #1 Minnesota Duluth 3-1 in Wayne on October 1, 2010 and three days later was voted the top team in the country, marking the first time a Wayne State team received a #1 national ranking.

WSC finished the 2010 season with its then-highest ever national ranking to end the year, ninth in the AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll. The Wildcats also had another banner year with home attendance drawing an all-time high 8,329 fans to Rice Auditorium for an average of 757 fans per home match ranking fifth in NCAA Division II.

In 2009, the Wildcats were 29-8 overall going 16-4 in the NSIC for a second place finish that resulted in Coach Kneifl being named the 2009 NSIC Coach of the Year. The Wildcats won 15 consecutive matches from August 29th through September 25th. WSC advanced to the NCAA Tournament and defeated Minnesota State in the first round of the Central Regional before falling to eventual national champion Concordia-St. Paul in the regional semi-finals.

In 2008, the Wildcats posted a 23-10 overall record to qualify for the NCAA Division II Central Regional Tournament. WSC finished the 2008 season with a 12-8 mark in the Northern Sun Conference, finishing sixth in league play. The Wildcats ended the season ranked 25th in the final Bison/AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll.

Kneifl coached Wayne State to a 24-12 record in 2007 and a third place finish in the Northern Sun Conference with a 13-5 league mark. The Wildcats peaked at the end of the season and captured the school's first-ever Northern Sun Conference Volleyball Tournament title as the Wildcats defeated MSU Moorhead 3-1 in the title match.

The Wildcats recorded a stellar 30-8 mark in 2006, advancing to the NCAA Division II North Central Regional Tournament and reaching the semi-finals for the first time in school history. Kneifl also coached the schools' first-ever All-American as junior middle hitter Emily Schroeder received Second Team All-American honors from AVCA and Daktronics.

In his first season as head coach in 2005, Kneifl directed the Wildcats to a 25-10 overall record and the teams' first-ever berth in the NCAA Division II North Central Regional Volleyball Tournament. WSC finished tied for second in the Northern Sun Conference with a 10-4 league mark and for his efforts, Kneifl was awarded the NSIC Co-Coach of the Year Award.

Kneifl coached at both the high school and college level prior to becoming head coach of the Wildcat program. He served as assistant coach with the Wildcat volleyball program for two seasons before moving up to the head coaching position in 2005. The Wildcats made a 10-game improvement from 2003 to 2004 under the assistance of Kneifl, going from 10-24 in 2003 to 20-14 in 2004.

Scott earned his bachelor's degree from Wayne State in 1995 and achieved his master's degree in 2004 in sport management, also from Wayne State College. He and his wife Jennifer have three sons, Jacob, (18) Brooks, (16), and Jaxson (13) and they reside in Wayne.

**ABOUT HARDING:** The Lady Bisons are 30-1 overall and swept the regular season and tournament titles in the Great American Conference to reach the NCAA Division II Tournament for the sixth time overall and first since 2018.

Harding is ranked 24th in this week's AVCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll with the only loss this season coming to Barry (Fla.) by a 3-0 score on August 27th at the St. Edwards Tournament in Texas.

Senior middle blocker Kelli McKinnon was named GAC Player of the Year after averaging 3.35 kills and 0.94 blocks per set with a .343 hitting percentage this season.

Senior setter Sarah Morehead was named GAC Setter of the Year, averaging 10.74 assists per set to go with 2.81 digs and 0.58 blocks.

Logan Smith, a senior outside hitter, earned All-GAC honors for a third time after recording 2.96 kills and 2.65 digs per set. Senior defensive specialist was named All-GAC honorable mention after averaging 4.81 digs per set this season.

As a team, Harding hits .228 while holding opponents to a .121 hitting percentage (9th in NCAA Division II). The Lady Bisons average 14.2 kills per set (11th-NCAA Division II), 2.00 blocks per set and 19.6 digs per set (3rd NCAA Division II).

## FIVE WILDCATS NAMED TO ALL-NSIC VOLLEYBALL TEAM – BELLER OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR AND KNEIFL COACH OF THE YEAR:

Wayne State College had five players named to the 2022 NSIC All-Conference Volleyball Team announced by the league office in Burnsville, Minnesota last Thursday afternoon. Sophomore middle hitter Taya Beller was voted Offensive Player of the Year, the first-ever player in school history to be named Player of the Year in the NSIC, while head coach Scott Kneifl received Coach of the Year honors. Juniors Kelsie Cada and Rachel Walker along with sophomore Maggie Brahmer were voted First Team All-NSIC while senior Jessie Brandl was a Second Team selection.

Beller, a 6-2 sophomore middle hitter from Lindsay (Humphrey HS), was voted Offensive Player of the Year and earned First Team All-NSIC honors for a second straight season. She is averaging 3.91 kills and 0.99 blocks per set with a .410 hitting percentage this season, ranking second in the league and eighth in NCAA Division II in hitting percentage, fourth in kills and points per set (4.49) and eighth in blocks. Beller has two NSIC Player of the Week honors this season (9/26 and 10/10) and was named GameChanger/AVCA Division II National Player of the Week September 26th.

Brahmer, a 6-0 sophomore middle hitter from Pierce (Pierce HS), is another repeat First Team All-NSIC selection for the Wildcats while averaging 3.29 kills and 1.18 blocks per set with a .464 hitting percentage this season. She leads the NSIC and ranks second nationally in hitting percentage, is second in blocks per set, eighth in points per set (3.99) and 11th in kills. Brahmer has earned three NSIC Player of the Week honors this season, earning Offensive POW honors September 6 and October 31 to go with Defensive Player of the Week honors September 26 and was named Most Valuable Player of the Colorado Premier Challenge.

Cada, a 6-0 junior outside hitter from Wahoo (Bishop Neumann HS), is a First Team All-NSIC selection after earning Second Team honors last season. She is averaging 3.64 kills and 3.03 digs per set with 11 double-doubles this season. Cada ranks fifth in the NSIC in kills and points per set (4.27) and leads the Wildcats in service aces with 32. She was named NSIC Offensive Player of the Week October 17th after averaging 4.67 kills per set in home wins over UMary and Minot State. Cada has a career-high 21 kills twice this season – vs. UMary (10/14) and vs. Sioux Falls (10/20) – while also notching a career-best 20 digs vs. #12 West Texas A&M (9/3).

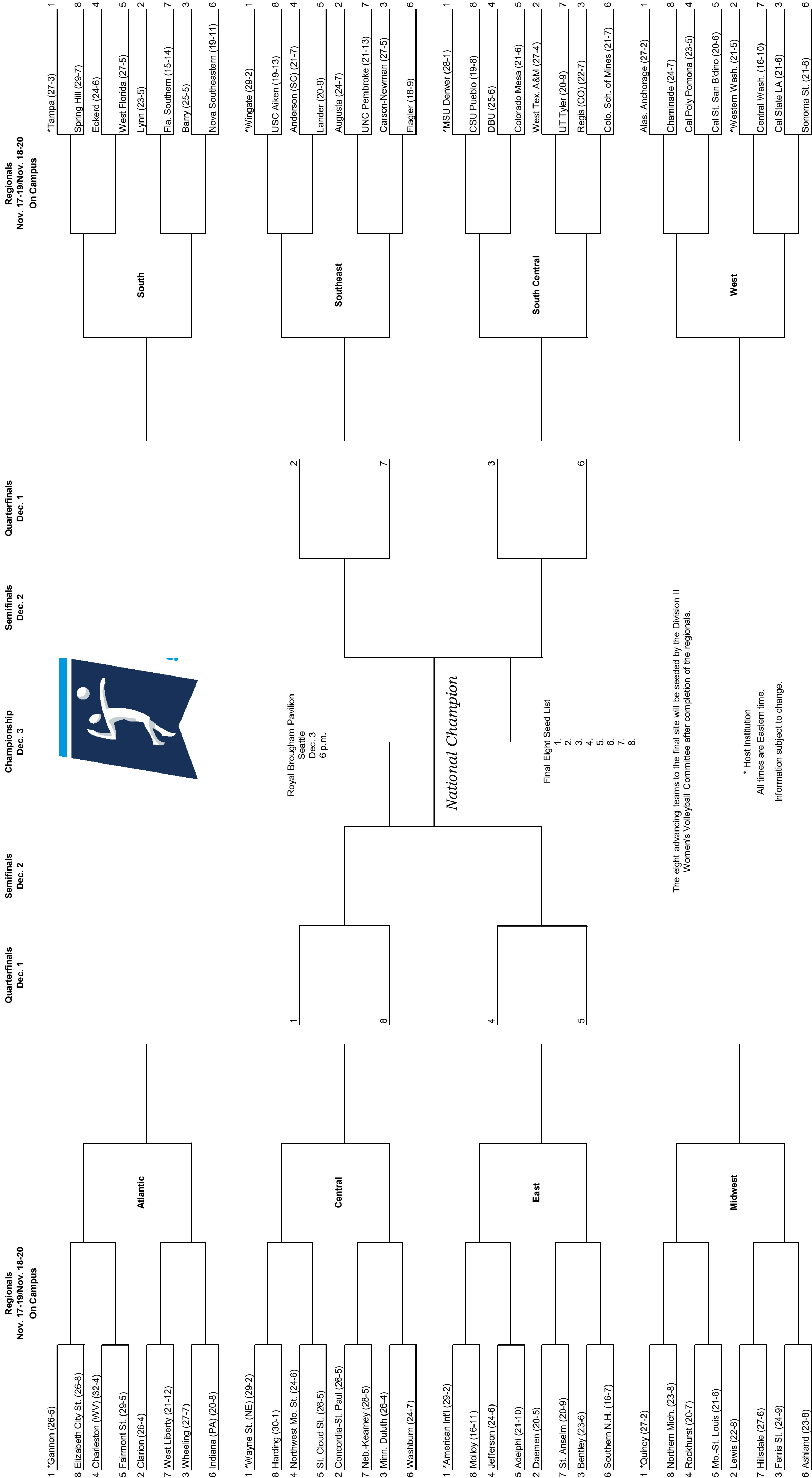
Walker, a 5-9 junior setter from Lincoln (Southwest HS), was a First Team All-NSIC choice after collecting Second Team honors one year ago. She is averaging 10.73 assists and 2.46 digs per set this season, ranking fifth in the NSIC in assists per set. Walker has nine double-doubles on the season and was named NSIC Setter of the Week October 17th. She was credited with a season-high 48 set assists in a 3-2 win over #12 West Texas A&M on September 3 and had a career-high 21 digs in a 3-1 win over Sioux Falls October 20th.

Brandl, a 5-8 senior libero from Stanton (Stanton HS), ranks seventh in the NSIC this season averaging 4.01 digs per set while ranking fifth on the team with 19 service aces. She has recorded 10 or more digs in 24 of 28 matches this season, highlighted by back-to-back career-bests of 24 digs in wins at Upper Iowa (9/16) and at Winona State (9/17).

Kneifl was named NSIC Coach of the Year after leading the Wildcats to a #1 national ranking this season and a school-record 24 match win streak to open the season. It's the third time he has received the honor after being named Co-Coach of the Year in 2005 and Coach of the Year in 2009.
