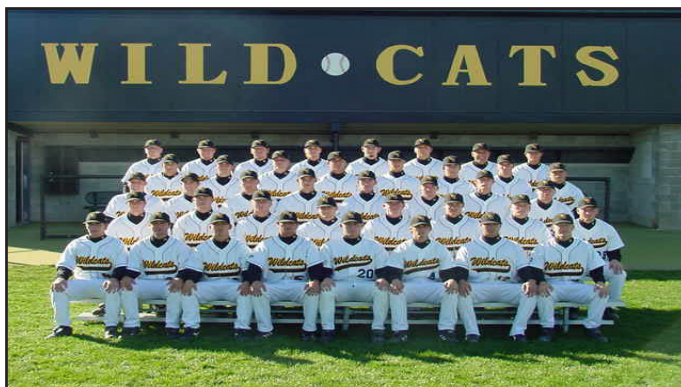
WILDCAT SCRAPBOOK



2001 - The Wildcats won the Northern Sun Conference Tournament and appeared in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history, finishing the season with a 35-10 record.



2003 - Wayne State went 2-0 in the rain-shortened NSIC Tournament held in Duluth, Minnesota and was named NSIC co-champion with Concordia-St. Paul (2-1). The Wildcats finished the 2003 season with a 26-13 record.



2004 - Wayne State hosted the NSIC Tournament for the first time in school history, going 44-18 overall while advancing to the NCAA Central Regional championship game against Central Missouri State.



2005 - The Wayne State baseball team set a new school record for wins in a season, going 45-14 overall. The Wildcats captured the NSIC title and appeared in the NCAA Central Regional for the third time in five years.

Founded in 1891 as Nebraska Normal College, Wayne State College, in Wayne, Neb. earned a distinguished reputation as a teachers' college from its early days. We're still a great teachers' college—but so much more!

Innovative Programs

Wayne State's four academic schools—Arts and Humanities, Business and Technology, Education and Counseling, and Natural and Social Sciences—offer a comprehensive selection of courses. You'll find over 150 majors and minors ranging from pre-professional studies to criminal justice to a nationally accredited undergraduate sports management program, and many others in 14 academic departments across campus.

The Rural Health Opportunities Program (RHOP) at Wayne State College provides pre-professional training in medicine, pharmacy and dentistry in cooperation with the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Students who successfully complete the program at WSC are automatically accepted into medical, pharmacy, or dental school at UNMC.

Upper-level education majors at Wayne State have the opportunity to participate in the Northeast Nebraska Teacher Academy (NENTA), the first of its kind in the nation, where WSC students receive classroom experience with participating K-12 schools in the region.

Through WSC WebCat On-line, students can register for class, check on grades and student accounts, from the convenience of their home or residence hall room.

Excellent Career Preparation

Whether students plan to be accountants or wildlife biologists, they receive the preparation they need at Wayne State College. In addition to classes taught by experts in their fields, Wayne State College provides internship and cooperative programs for students in a number of majors. Many regional businesses actively recruit Wayne State students for internships, with many of these internships resulting in full-time employment after graduation.

The WSC Career Services office assists students with career exploration, job preparation skills, interviews, as well as arranging internships and cooperative experiences.

Personal Attention

Students at Wayne State College don't get lost in the crowd. With an average class size of 21 and a student/faculty ratio of 20:1, WSC students get to know their professors and classmates. Eighty percent of Wayne State professors have the highest degree in their field—and most teach first-year as well as upper-level classes. You will find dedicated professors and instructors at Wayne State College where teaching is their life's work and their enthusiasm is contagious.



Wayne State College offers a variety of support services and programs to students. The heart of the WSC campus is the Student Center, where academic and personal support services are located. The Learning Center and Peer Tutoring Program are designed to help all students achieve the highest possible level of success in their studies.

Active Campus Life

With more than 90 clubs and organizations on campus, Wayne State College students have many opportunities to be involved in campus and community life.

Wayne State College has an active Greek life, with Greek Olympics being held at Homecoming each fall, as well as other social and service activities. The Student Activities Board (SAB) plans a variety of special programs each year, bringing musical groups such as Dierks Bentley, Three Doors Down, Terri Clark, Vertical Horizon, Five for Fighting, Goo Goo Dolls, Sawyer Brown, Blackhawk, Firehouse, Jason Aldean, Blake Shelton and others to campus. Comedian Adam Sandler and other national performers have performed on campus.

The Multicultural Center, one of the newest campus programs, provides outreach and support to Wayne State College students and the region through special events during the year.

Wayne State College competes in NCAA Division II, and is a member of the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. Competitive sports include football, volleyball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's track and field (indoor and outdoor), men's and women's cross country, baseball, softball and women's soccer. Two new sports were added in the 2019-20 school year with the re-instatement of women's golf and the addition of beach volleyball.

Scenic Surroundings

You'll feel right at home on Wayne State's beautiful, historic campus located in the northeast Nebraska community of Wayne. The campus combines stately, historic buildings with the newly renovated Willow Bowl, Student Center, Ramsey Theatre, Studio Arts Building and Connell Hall.

A new state-of-the-art press box was completed in the summer of 2018 at Bob Cunningham Field while field turf was installed in the summer of 2013 to complete a \$1.3 million athletic renovation. In the last two years, Rice Auditorium has installed a videoboard and new branded playing surface to enhance the Wildcat fan experience.

Wayne State College's seven residence halls provide students with a comfortable, affordable and convenient place to live with easy access to the entire campus community. Each hall has lounges and recreation areas, laundry facilities, mail service, academic tutors and study areas.





WAYNE STATE ADMINISTRATION



Dr. Marysz Rames *President*

Dr. Marysz Rames was appointed the 13th president of Wayne State College by the Nebraska State College System Board of Trustees on June 18, 2015. She came to Wayne State from Dakota State University in Madison, S.D., where she had served as interim president since Aug. 15, 2014.

Rames earned her education doctorate in adult and higher education in 1997 from the University of South Dakota in Vermillion. She earned her bachelor of science degree in business administration and communication studies, with a minor in economics, in 1982, and her master's degree in educational administration in 1986, from University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, Colorado.

She spent one year (2014-15) as interim president at Dakota State University (DSU) in Madison, South Dakota. During this time she was instrumental in promoting a strong shared governance system, finalizing the university's five-year strategic plan, revitalizing the university's Foundation and actively raising funds to increase scholarships. Rames also worked with the legislature and others in several major new construction and renovation projects.

Prior to her interim appointment, Rames served as the vice president for student affairs from 2000 until June 2015 at South Dakota State University (SDSU) in Brookings. As the senior student affairs officer, Rames oversaw numerous university divisions and initiatives, including, but not limited to, enrollment management, student success, strategic planning, fundraising/fiscal management, diversity and inclusion, collaborative partnerships, leadership development, and increasing efficiency and effectiveness for students.

Rames served as an assistant professor of education at SDSU, teaching courses in administration and leadership in student affairs; serving on master's and doctoral students' graduate committees; and conducting research in financial trends in higher education, student retention and completion, and affordability and access to higher education. Rames also served as the interim associate vice president of student affairs (1997-1999) and the interim director for diversity enhancement (1999) at SDSU.

Prior to her arrival at SDSU, Rames worked at Aims Community College in Greeley, Colo., and the University of Wyoming in Laramie. Her scholarly presentations include topics such as student services, retention efforts, and working with today's college students.

Rames and her husband, Steve, have two children - Matthew and Jessica.



Mike Powicki *Director of Athletics*

Mike Powicki is in his 10th year (2021-22) as Athletic Director at Wayne State College. Powicki began his duties at Wayne State College on July 23, 2012 and has been instrumental in improvements to athletic facilities and staffing during his first eight years at the institution.

Over the past nine years at WSC, over \$9 million has been invested in facility improvements, staffing and operations enhancements.

Wildcat student-athletes continued to excel in the classroom during the 2020-21 school year. All 15 sports at Wayne State posted a cumulative grade point average over 3.00 during the COVID-19 pandemic. WSC had 244 Presidential Scholar Athletes and 139 NSIC All-Academic selections with 54 student-athletes posting a perfect 4.00 GPA in either the 2020 spring and/or fall semester. Wildcat athletics also recorded an all-time high 16 seniors who received the NSIC Myles Brand All-Academic With Distinction Award and for a 16th straight season Wayne State athletics had an Academic All-American (Erin Norling - Women's Basketball).

Powicki was instrumental in the addition of two sports to Wayne State athletics in 2019-20 with the addition of beach volleyball and the re-instatement of the women's golf program. He also orchestrated the renovation of the former natatorium into the Kirk Gardner Indoor Athletic Complex that will benefit all Wildcat athletic programs. Powicki also helped orchestrate the largest single scholarship gift in the history of Wayne State as the Gardner Foundation announced on October 3, 2019 a \$1.8 million

gift to the school. Included in the gift was a one-time donation of \$300,000 toward the Indoor Athletic Complex along with \$150,000 toward athletic operations and \$925,000 toward athletic scholarships to WSC.

Wildcat student-athletes continued to excel in the classroom during the 2019-20 school year. 11 of the 13 sports at Wayne State posting a cumulative grade point average over 3.00. WSC had 212 Presidential Scholar Athletes and 142 NSIC All-Academic selections with 47 student-athletes posting a perfect 4.00 GPA in either the 2019 spring and/or fall semester. Wildcat athletics also produced an all-time high six Academic All-Americans in the 2019-20 school year and had one NSIC Elite 18 Award winner (Aaron Ras was a repeat selection in baseball).

In the summer of 2019, Rice Auditorium benefitted with the addition of several upgrades that included new (hanging) baskets, hallway graphics of current and past Wildcat athletes to enhance the look of Rice Auditorium and a newly designed floor/playing surface.

The Bob Cunningham Field Press Box Replacement project covering \$3.9 million was done in 2018. The project increased the amount of work space for media and staff working home events at Cunningham Field. The new facility also provides universal space on the lower level that will give WSC athletics an opportunity to host special events and create additional revenue through corporate sponsorships and donor stewardship.

In the fall of 2018 new Daktronics video scoreboards and a sound system totaling over \$200,000 were installed in Rice Auditorium to enhance the game day experience for Wildcat fans and student-athletes.

The first major athletic project that was completed under the guidance of Powicki was the Bob Cunningham Field/Memorial Stadium Renovation project. The project began in May, 2013 and was highlighted by installation of artificial turf, ornamental fencing, press box graphics and new goal posts. The \$1.6 million project also included the widening, lengthening and re-sodding of the Wildcat Soccer Pitch, along with installing new irrigation, facility fencing, scoreboard and making the facility ADA accessible. The Dr. LeRoy Simpson Track at Memorial Stadium was re-surfaced and painted in the summer of 2014 as the final phase of the project.

Powicki currently serves on the NCAA Division II Athletic Directors Association Board, NCAA Division II Central Regional Advisory Committee for baseball and is on the Northern Sun Conference Hall of Fame Committee. He also serves locally as the Wayne Kiwanis Board President, Vice President of the Wayne Area Economic Development Board of Directors and Revitalize Wayne Committee.

Powicki currently serves on the NCAA Division II Athletic Directors Association Board, NCAA Central Regional Advisory Committee for baseball and is on the Northern Sun Conference Hall of Fame Committee. He also serves locally as the Wayne Kiwanis Board President along with the Wayne Area Economic Development Board of Directors and Revitalize Wayne Committees.

Prior to arriving at Wayne State, Powicki served as Assistant Athletic Director at Minnesota State University in Mankato, Minnesota. He was the Assistant Athletic Director for Marketing and Corporate Partnerships from 2008-10 and was promoted to Assistant Director of Athletics for Development and Strategic Partnerships in 2010 where he served in that role until July 2012 when he arrived at Wayne State.

While at MSU, Powicki successfully developed and executed the athletics department revenue generation plan, responsible for generating \$1.7 million annually. Powicki managed all fundraising, development and marketing operations while overseeing the athletic department marketing/fundraising staff. Powicki also served as the athletic department's senior development officer functioning as a liaison to the MSU Foundation and the Vice President for Advancement, focusing on major gifts and special projects.

Powicki also served as Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs at Upper Iowa University from 2004-2008 where he was a part of the Peacocks transition from NCAA Division III to NCAA Division II status and into the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. While at Upper Iowa, Powicki monitored all team operations, recruiting and fundraising budgets. Powicki oversaw the UIU Recreation and Fitness Center staff, budget and overall operation.

In his time at Upper Iowa he created and sold athletic corporate sponsorship opportunities, supervised and coordinated all athletic department fundraising activities, developed and implemented the Peacock Club for donors and successfully completed the "Road to Glory" athletic facility capital improvement project. He also served as tournament director for various national and regional NCAA Division II Championship events.

During his tenure at UIU, Powicki served as an adjunct professor for the Exercise and Sports Studies within the Department of Education. Powicki obtained his bachelor degree from the University of Iowa in exercise science and earned his masters degree in exercise and sport science/sport administration from Wisconsin-La Crosse.

Mike has two daughters - Faith and Elle (pronounced L) - and resides in Wayne.



PETE CHAPMAN BASEBALL COMPLEX



Located north of Memorial Stadium, the baseball and softball complex opened in the spring of 1996 and provides a picturesque setting for Wildcat baseball and softball games.

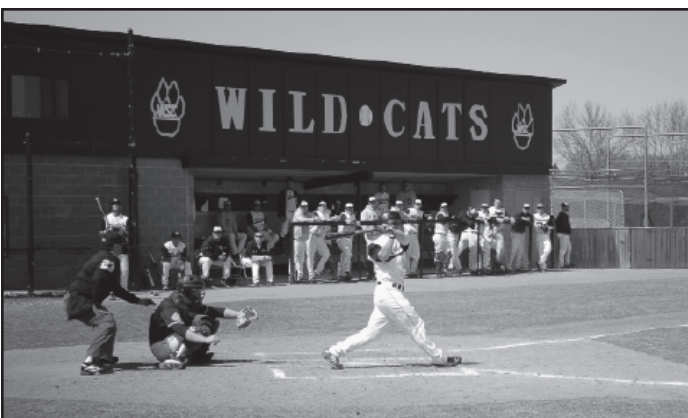
The baseball field received a face lift in the summer of 2004 with the additions of locker rooms, rest rooms, a concession stand and press box. A new wood fence was installed on the baseball field prior to the start of the 2005 season.

In the spring of 2006, the facility was named the Pete Chapman Baseball/Softball Complex in honor of the late Wayne State College athletic director/football coach and his contributions to the Wildcat athletic department. In the fall of 2006, a locker room/press box was constructed at the softball field, giving softball players their own locker room facilities. Prior to the start of the 2007 season, a new 10-inning electronic scoreboard was installed at the baseball field.

In the fall of 2007, a concrete pad and walkway was installed from the Recreation Center parking lot to the baseball/softball complex. The concrete walkway replaced the previous hard rock path, making it easier for fans and the handicapped to watch Wildcat softball action. A large concrete pad was also poured between the softball and baseball fields and the area between the clubhouses had new sod installed, making the Pete Chapman Complex even more fan-friendly.

In the spring/summer of 2008, batting cages and an enclosed pitching cage/bullpen area were also constructed north of the softball clubhouse giving Wildcat softball players more tools to work on their skills. The summer of 2009 saw a new wood fence installed in the outfield for softball.

The Pete Chapman Softball Complex hosted the 2010 NCAA Division II Central Regional and a new digital scoreboard was installed at the softball field in the spring of 2011, making the the Pete Chapman Complex one of the premier softball/baseball facilities in the Central Region.





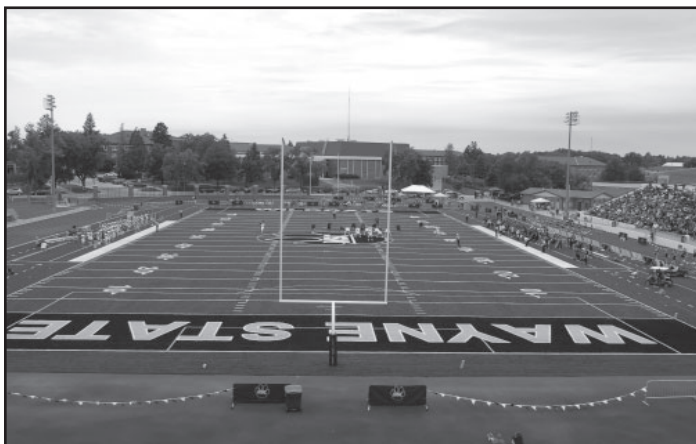
WAYNE STATE FACILITIES



Rice Auditorium

Rice Auditorium serves as the home for the Wildcat men's and women's basketball teams as well as the volleyball squad. Recent upgrades to the arena include: new baskets and rebranded playing surface in 2019, a new scoreboard, videoboard and sound system installed in the fall of 2018, new lights in 2011 and renovated offices and locker rooms.

The gymnasium area seats approximately 2,500 for basketball games and volleyball matches. Named for John D. Rice, Wayne State College's president from 1951-56, Rice Auditorium was the site of the 1999 NCAA Division II North Central Regional Men's Basketball Championships, the 2006 NSIC Red Baron Women's Basketball Classic and the 2012 NCAA Division II Central Regional Women's Basketball Championships.



Memorial Stadium / Bob Cunningham Field

Memorial Stadium has been "Home of the Wildcats" since 1931 when the college purchased 11 acres of land for athletic fields. The grandstand was constructed in 1933. The stadium was officially designated Memorial Stadium followed World War II in honor of the Wayne State students who served in the war. Bob Cunningham Field was named in 1993 for the WSC three-sport Hall of Fame standout (1936-39).

The press box underwent a complete replacement with a new structure built in 2018. The new press box is 5,220 square feet and includes an elevator along with a club level for corporate events.

The main stadium has seating for 2,500 fans while the bleachers on the east side of the field can seat an additional 750 fans. In the fall of 2010, Cunningham Field had new chairback seats installed in the middle three sections of the west stadium bleachers while the remaining bleacher seats in the west stadium were also replaced. The fall of 2011 saw the installation of a new scoreboard and videoboard and in the summer of 2013, Cunningham Field underwent a renovation with synthetic field turf replacing the grass surface.



Recreation Center

The Wayne State College Recreation Center opened in 1987. It is the college's main facility for student recreation and selected activities.

The main area in the Recreation Center provides a six-lane running track that was resurfaced in 2001 and has three full-size courts for basketball, volleyball, tennis and badminton. Racquetball, weight training, aerobics, gymnastics, wrestling and sauna facilities are all available to WSC students, faculty and staff as well as residents of the Wayne community.

The Recreation Center also houses locker rooms for Wildcat athletic teams and offices for the WSC athletic department.

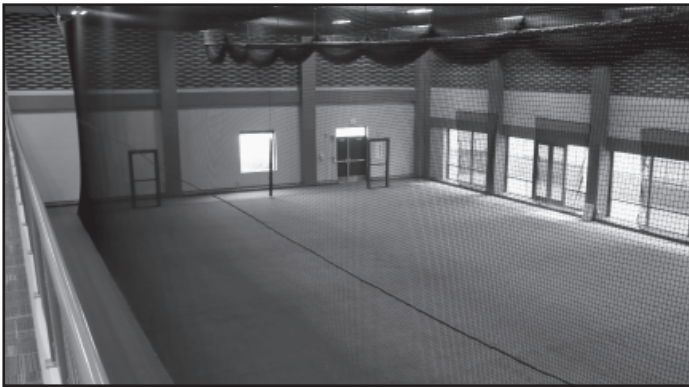


Wildcat Strength/Conditioning Center

Recognizing the importance of first-class facilities for their student athletes, the Wayne State College athletic department completed a state-of-the-art renovation to its athletic facilities in the fall of 2008, building a new weight room at Memorial Stadium.

All Wayne State student athletes have utilized the benefits of new weight room equipment that features 18 platforms and racks, dumbbells and selectorized machines. The facility allows 72 student athletes to work out at the same time.

The project has enhanced Wayne State's ability to attract high quality student athletes and provide current team members the resources necessary to compete at the NCAA Division II level.



Kirk Gardner Indoor Athletic Complex

The Kirk Gardner Indoor Athletic Complex was completed in September, 2020 and has benefitted all athletic teams at Wayne State. The space in the former Carlson Natatorium turned the former indoor swimming pool area into an indoor turf sports facility.

The facility features three batting cages along with putting greens and volleyball net hookups along with employee offices on the balcony above that overlooks the practice area.



Wayne State Soccer Complex

Located east of Memorial Stadium and adjacent to the Pete Chapman Baseball Complex, the WSC Soccer Complex made its debut in the fall of 1997, in time for the inaugural Wildcat soccer season. Prior to becoming the varsity soccer venue, the field was used as an athletic practice facility and an intramural playing field.

During the spring and summer of 2013, the Wayne State Soccer Complex underwent major renovations that were part of the \$1.5 million athletic improvement project. Improvements to the soccer field included a new scoreboard, fencing and widened playing surface.



Pete Chapman Softball Complex

Located north of Memorial Stadium, the softball complex opened in the spring of 1996. In the spring of 2006, the facility was named the Pete Chapman Softball Complex in honor of the late Wayne State College athletic director/football coach and his contributions to the Wildcat athletic department.

The Pete Chapman Softball Complex has evolved into one of the nicest facilities in the Central Region. Improvements made over the years include a concrete pad/walkway to the facility from the Rec Center parking lot, enclosed pitching cage and bullpen areas for both teams, a new wood fence in the summer of 2009 and digital scoreboard for the 2011 season.

The Pete Chapman Softball Complex hosted the 2010 NCAA Central Regional Softball Tournament.

Muffin Morris *Head Athletic Trainer*



Dr. Muffin Morris is in her 14th year (2021-22) at Wayne State College as the Head Athletic Trainer. She oversees athletic training for all 15 sports at Wayne State College and is the head athletic trainer for football and men's basketball.

She also serves as an advisor to the WSC Student Athlete Advisory Committee and worked three years (2013-16) as senior women's administrator.

Prior to arriving at Wayne State, Morris worked four years at the University of South Dakota. She served as a graduate assistant athletic trainer and worked with football, swimming/diving, track and field/cross country and volleyball programs with the Coyotes.

Morris, a native of Chariton, Iowa, earned her bachelor's degree from Buena Vista University in athletic training in 2004. She received her master's degree from the University of South Dakota in 2006 in health, physical education and recreation and obtained her doctorate degree in adult/higher education from the University of South Dakota on July 31, 2008.

Morris resides in Wayne.

Wildcat Sports Medicine Center

The Wildcat Sports Medicine Center, which opened December 1, 2005, is a 4,000 square foot state-of-the-art facility. The center is located next to the Wayne State College Recreation Center and serves as the hub for therapy and athletic training services.

Dedicated to quality care, the Wildcat Sports Medicine Center provides the finest in sports rehabilitation, physical therapy and athletic training services to Wayne State College student-athletes, campus community.

The Wildcat Sports Medicine Center represents excellence - a total commitment by Wayne State College to the health of its' students and student athletes.

Dr. Joseph Carreau *Board Eligible Orthopaedic Surgeon*



Dr. Joseph Carreau joined CNOS in 2016 after completing fellowship in Orthopaedic Sports Medicine at the University of Iowa. He is originally from Colorado where he attended Colorado State University for his undergraduate education. Thereafter, he pursued medical school at Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska and in 2005 traveled to San Diego to complete his orthopaedic surgery residency at the University of California, San Diego. There he received extensive training in adult and pediatric trauma and joint replacement surgery. He developed a special interest in advanced arthroscopy and the treatment of athletic injuries, thus chose to pursue fellowship training in Sports Medicine through the University of Iowa.

At the University of Iowa, Dr. Carreau was trained by national leaders in the practice of advanced arthroscopic techniques, cartilage transplantation, shoulder instability, patellofemoral problems, ligamentous injury of the knee and shoulder replacement surgery. He also received extensive training in the treatment of all athletes at the University of Iowa and was assistant team physician to the Hawkeye Football Team during their historic 2015 season.

Carreau currently serves as Orthopaedic team physician to the Wayne State Wildcats and assists with multiple local high schools. Dr. Carreau has published papers on various orthopaedic topics and is a member of the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgery, the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine and the Arthroscopy Association of North America. Dr. Carreau and his wife have four children. He is an avid fisherman and enjoys the outdoors.

Dr. Michael Nguyen *Team Orthopedist*



Dr. Michael Nguyen joined CNOS as a Primary Care Sports Medicine Physician after completing his fellowship training in Sports Medicine at Morristown Medical Center in Morristown, N.J. He initially trained in family medicine in Waterloo, Iowa through the University of Iowa. He worked as an ER physician at Grundy Memorial Hospital in Grundy Center, Iowa and Waverly Health Center in Waverly, Iowa as well as several other towns across the state.





WILDCAT HEAD COACH ALEX KOCH



Alex Koch *Head Coach*



Alex Koch is in his eighth season (2021-22) as Head Baseball Coach at Wayne State College. He was introduced as the 14th head coach in the program's 55-year history on July 3, 2014. In his seven years as leader of the Wildcat program, Koch has records of 144-149 overall (.491) and 109-92 (.542) in Northern Sun Conference play.

Under Koch in 2021, the Wildcats went 12-22 overall and 11-19 in the NSIC. Junior second baseman Alex Logelin earned All-NSIC Second

Team honors for the 'Cats.

Wayne State had a 8-7 record in the 2020 season until COVID-19 canceled the remainder of the season.

The 2019 season saw the Wildcats make an 11-win improvement, finishing 32-18 overall and 23-12 (5th place) in the Northern Sun Conference. WSC improved dramatically on the mound, recording a 3 run improvement in ERA from 2018 to 2019 (7.22 to 4.17). The Cats had a 10 game win streak in late March and won 18 of 20 games from March 22nd to April 14th. WSC ended the season with six players receiving All NSIC honors and three earning All Region recognition.

In 2018 the Wildcats finished 21-26 overall and seventh place in the NSIC with an 18-16 league mark.

Koch led the Wildcats to a 29-24 overall record and a fourth place finish in the NSIC with a 23-15 league mark in 2017. The Wildcats were 14-6 in games decided by two runs or less and made a dramatic improvement in pitching from the previous season as the team's ERA went from 8.22 to 4.97 in the 2017 season. WSC tied for first in the league with 14 team saves and the Wildcat pitching staff allowed just 20 home runs all season to tie for second in the league.

Under Koch in 2016, Wildcats were 15-28 on the season and ninth in the NSIC with a 12-16 league record. WSC suffered numerous close losses, going 1-8 in one run games and 2-3 in two run decisions. Offensively, WSC ranked fourth in the NSIC with a .331 batting average - the team's highest batting average since the 2009 season - and was also fourth in slugging percentage (.519) and on-base percentage (.411).

In his first season as leader of the Wildcats, Koch led Wayne State to a 27-24 overall record and a 22-14 mark (fifth place) in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. It was the 18th straight winning season for Wayne State College baseball.

Koch (pronounced cook) has been associated with the Wildcat baseball program as a player and coach since 2006. He served three seasons as an assistant coach with Wayne State from 2010-12 and was a volunteer assistant with the program from 2012-14 after he accepted the position as director of the Wayne Community Activity Center in February, 2012.

A graduate of Millard South High School, Koch was a standout player for Wayne State from 2006-09, earning First Team All-NSIC honors three seasons (2007, '08 and '09) and was a two-time ABCA/Rawlings All-Central Region selection (Second Team in 2008 and First Team in 2009). Koch ranks second at Wayne State in career doubles (53), third in career RBI's (181) and tied for sixth in career hits with 217. He played on four NSIC regular season championship teams and four NCAA Tournament teams, including the 2009 team that reached the NCAA Central Regional final.

Alex is married to former Wayne State softball player Kiley Peterson and the couple resides in Wayne with their sons Kash and Knox and daughter Kollins.

Tyler Vaughn is in his second year (2021-22) as pitching coach for the Wayne State baseball team.

Vaughn is familiar with the NSIC, having played at Augustana and coached at Southwest Minnesota State prior to becoming the pitcher coach at Luther College in Iowa.

A native of Fort Dodge, Iowa, Vaughn spent 1 1/2 years as pitching coach at Luther College before coming to Wayne State.

Prior to that, Vaughn served as a graduate assistant/pitching coach at Southwest Minnesota State for two years. With Vaughn as pitching coach in 2018, SMSU recorded 293 strikeouts in just 40 games, the second highest single season total in school history. While in Marshall, he also worked as an assistant coach for the Marshall American Legion and Junior Legion baseball teams for two years.

Vaughn had a four-year playing career as a pitcher spending two years at Iowa Central Community College before transferring to Augustana. At Augustana as a senior in 2017, Vaughn had a 6-1 record with a 2.31 ERA fanning 49 batters in 46 2/3 innings work.

Vaughn earned a business degree from Augustana in 2017 and obtained his master's degree from Southwest Minnesota State.

Ford Schroeder is in his first season (2022) as a graduate assistant baseball coach at Wayne State College.

Schroeder comes to WSC following a successful playing career at Augustana University where he was a member of the Viking baseball team for five years as a utility player. He was a member of the 2018 NCAA Division II national championship team that was 52-9 and played on two NCAA Central Region championship teams, two NSIC tournament championship teams and one NSIC regular season championship team.

Schroeder is a graduate of Minnehaha Academy in Minneapolis, Minnesota and earned a bachelor degree in sport management at Augustana in May, 2020. He is currently pursuing a master's degree at Wayne State in organizational management.

Longtime Wildcat baseball coach John Manganaro was inducted into the NSIC Hall of Fame during a ceremony held in Burnsville, Minnesota July 12th, 2016. Manganaro was 506-309-1 in his 17 years as head coach at Wayne State from 1993-2009, leading the 'Cats to seven trips in a nine year span to the NCAA Tournament with six NSIC regular season titles. He was a four-time NSIC Coach of the Year and led WSC to five NSIC Tournament titles.



2022 WILDCAT SEASON PREVIEW



Wayne State looks to improve on last year's 12-22 record where the Wildcats placed 11th in the NSIC with an 11-19 mark. The 'Cats struggled in close games (3-6 in one-run contests) and was just 6-14 in home games last season. Eighth year head coach Alex Koch returns four position starters along with two starting pitchers and a strong group of relievers.

"Our group of guys this year have worked extremely hard," remarked Coach Koch, who is 144-149 overall and 109-92 in NSIC games entering this season. "They continually strive to improve and play for each other everyday. We have a good mix of older experienced players and young talent that push each other everyday."

Senior outfielder Alex Logelin, an All-NSIC Second Team selection last season, headlines a quartet of returning starters after leading the team last season with a .381 average.



He tied for second in the NSIC in doubles (13), was sixth in batting average and eighth in on-base percentage (.465). Logelin had 10 multi-hit games and was second on the team in hits (37) despite missing seven games.

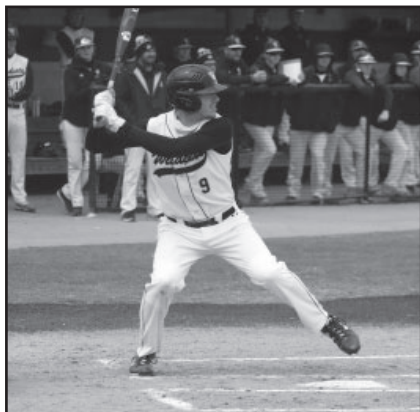
"Alex has been an impact player for us since his freshmen year," stated Koch. "He is a hard nosed grinder that works his tail off everyday. He will be a

dynamic man in the lineup that can get it done in all aspects."

Another senior outfielder, Andrew Hanson, is a two-time All-NSIC selection and had eight home runs with a team high 18 stolen bases last season.

Other returning starters include senior infielder Noah Roberts (team-high 19 walks last season) and senior catcher Conner Fiene (34 starts).

Key additions to the Wildcat field include Northeast Community College transfers Colin Lynam and Cade Lynam. Colin collected NJCAA Division II Third Team All-American honors in 2021 as a sophomore for the Hawks, batting .391



with 13 home runs, 56 RBI and 16 stolen bases while Cade hit .292 as a sophomore for the Hawks, helping Northeast CC to a 37-24 record.

Returning players expected to compete for playing time in the field include seniors Travis Baily and Chris Cornish, juniors Nate Sailors, Garrett Svoboda, Nick Barnett and Hunter Babe.

The pitching staff will be led by sophomore Brody Sintek and junior Ryan Obrecht, the two returning starters from last season and looks to improve on last year's 8.15 ERA.

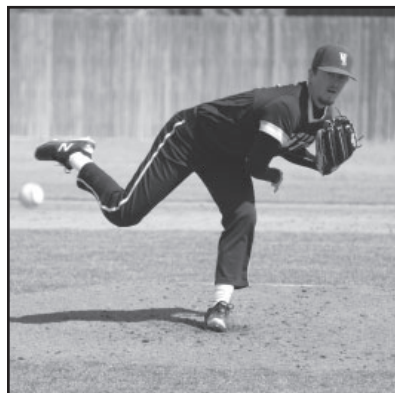
After a slow start, Sintek had a strong finish to the season as the right hander from Fremont was 2-3 last season with a 6.62 ERA in nine games and six starts with

one complete game and one shutout. He ranked second on the team in innings pitched (35.1) and strikeouts (30).

"Brody is entering his second year of eligibility and is looking to build off of what he did last year. He is a kid with great pitchability that keeps kids off balance. Looking to see him have lots of consistency in our weekend rotation."

Obrecht has a 12-4 career record with the Wildcats and is expected to be a starter on the weekend for the 'Cats.

Top returners on the mound include senior left handed relievers Ryan Petersen and Andrew Staebell (team-high 14 appearances last season). Key right handed pitchers back for the Wildcats this season are sophomore Kean Allen (6.87 ERA in eight appearances and two starts), senior reliever



Grant Carl (5.79 ERA in six appearances) and Nathan Anderson (5.40 ERA in six appearances).

11 signings - two transfers and nine freshmen - will also come in and add depth with some players expected to contribute to the field and pitching staff this season.

Wayne State was picked to finish eighth in the NSIC Preseason

Baseball Coaches Poll released January 19th.

The Wildcats are scheduled to open the 2022 season on Friday, February 18th at Pittsburg State in Kansas. After a one-year hiatus due to COVID-19 and a reduced schedule Wayne State resumes its annual spring break trip with five games in Florida during the second week in March.

Northern Sun Conference play is scheduled to open March 19th when the Wildcats host Southwest Minnesota State.

THE NORTHERN SUN INTERCOLLEGIATE CONFERENCE



From its modest origin as a six-team alliance over eight decades ago, the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference has matured into a 16-team union of upper Midwest colleges and universities to form arguably the strongest affiliation in NCAA Division II.

The NSIC can trace its roots to 1932 when six schools, including Bemidji State University, Minnesota State University, Mankato, Minnesota State University Moorhead, St. Cloud State University, University of Minnesota Duluth and Winona State University signed on as charter members. All remain active subscribers of the league today. Southwest Minnesota State University was added in 1969, followed by Northern State University in 1978, Wayne State College (NE) in 1998, Concordia University-St. Paul and the University of Minnesota Crookston in 1999, the University of Mary and Upper Iowa University in 2006, Augustana College in 2008 and Minot State University and the University of Sioux Falls in 2012. Minnesota State, St. Cloud State and Minnesota Duluth left the league to join the North Central Conference but returned to the NSIC in 2008. University of Minnesota, Morris and Michigan Tech University were once part of the NSIC family as well.

In 1992 the NSIC became a true athletic showcase for both men and women with the merger of the traditional Northern Intercollegiate Conference (NIC) and the Northern Sun Conference (NSC), the home of women's athletics since 1979. Before NSIC affiliates became certified for championship competition in the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) in 1995, its member institutions filled prominent roles in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). NIC and NSC clubs annually dispatched qualified student-athletes to national tournaments and captured several NAIA teams and individual championships.

The NSIC continues to make a major imprint nationally, winning 23 national titles since 2006. Winona State men claimed NCAA II Basketball Championships in 2006 and 2008 and narrowly missed a third crown, falling in a last second shot in 2007. In addition, the Warriors established a NCAA II record of 57 consecutive victories.

Concordia University launched an ongoing streak of seven consecutive NCAA II Volleyball Championships in 2007. In 2008 the Golden Bears won 37 straight matches after a season opening loss on their way to a second consecutive title and scripted a marvelous encore in 2009 with a perfect 37-0 finish, a third straight national crown and a winning streak of 74 straight matches. In 2010 the Golden Bear established that NCAA record win streak to 75 before dropping their second match of the season. They started 2010 with a 10-4 record before ripping off 22 straight wins on their way to their fourth straight national title. In 2011, after overcoming midseason injuries, the Golden Bears hit their stride. The Golden Bears knocked off No. 1 and undefeated Cal State San Bernardino to become the first team in the history of NCAA Division II women's volleyball, to capture a fifth consecutive NCAA Division II Championship. Then in 2012, the Golden Bears again made a late season and championship match surge as they defeated Tampa 3-2 after trailing 0-2 to win their sixth straight NCAA DII Volleyball National Championship. In 2013 Concordia-St. Paul won the NSIC regular season title, but was defeated in the NSIC Tournament Championship by Minnesota Duluth. But from there the Golden Bears ripped off six straight NCAA postseason wins, extending their streak to 42, on their way to a 3-0 sweep of BYU-Hawaii to win another NCAA National Championship. After a two year hiatus, the Golden Bears return to the top of Division II volleyball as they won the 2016 and 2017 national championships.

In a most surprising run, Minnesota Duluth completed a perfect 15-0 season by winning the 2008 NCAA Division II Football Championship. The Bulldogs, limited to only 24 scholarships by league rule, swept a field of fully-funded teams, including top ranked Grand Valley State and number three Northwest Missouri State. Two years later, in 2010, the Bulldogs repeated that feat, going 15-0 again to win the national championship. The Bulldogs became the first NCAA DII football squad to win two national championships with undefeated records.

Minnesota State added more luster to the league by finishing 32-2 and claiming the 2008-09 NCAA II Women's Basketball Championship. The Mavericks rolled to a wild 103-94 victory over Franklin Pierce to set a NCAA record for total points in the title game. In 2017 the Maverick softball team went 64-7 to win the National Championship. The Mavericks went 10-1 in NCAA play, including 5-0 in Salem Virginia as they defeated Angelo State 5-1 in the championship game.

Augustana got into the mix of national championships in 2011 when their women's cross country team turned in a true team performance in Spokane, Wash. All five Viking runners earned All-American status as Augustana won the first cross country national championship in NSIC history. The Vikings men's basketball team won the 2015-16 National Championship after going 34-2 and defeating Lincoln Memorial 90-81 in Frisco, Texas. The 2018 Augustana baseball team became the first NSIC institution to win a national championship in baseball, as the Vikings had an impressive post season, going 8-1 in NCAA play and a perfect 4-0 in Cary, North Carolina to finish the season 52-9. In 2019 it was the Augustana Softball team that made a run to the national championship as the Vikings went 61-11 and defeated Texas A&M Kingsville twice by the score of 6-4 to win the National Championship.

After multiple runner-up finishes, the St. Cloud State Huskies finally captured the national championship in wrestling in 2015. They repeated in 2016 and then took home the title again in 2018 and 2019.

The NSIC has now had 15 student-athletes awarded with the NCAA Elite 90 Award on 18 occasions. Also earning the award were Ryan Schlichte (MSU, FB, 2019), Sasha Hovind (NSU, ODTF, 2018), DJ Pollard (NSU, Men's Basketball, 2018), Grant Pulver (UMD, Cross Country, 2017), **Leisa McClintock (Wayne State, Volleyball, 2015)**, Tavia Rutherford (Sioux Falls, Golf, 2015), Claire Sames (SMSU, Volleyball, 2014), Kara Pioske (Concordia-St. Paul, Volleyball 2013), Billy Brockmueller (Sioux Falls, Cross Country 2012, 2014 & IDTF 2014), Ben Keller (Minnesota State, Baseball 2012 & 2013), Cody Lensing (Augustana, Wrestling 2012), Kendra Huettl (Minnesota State, Softball, 2011), Matt Braithwaite (Augustana, Cross Country, 2010) and Lauren Brown (Winona State, Outdoor Track & Field, 2010).

Member schools continue to emphasize the educational, entertainment and unifying value of sports while pointing with pride to the many advantages to be gained by attending these colleges and universities. The NSIC is committed to providing rewarding experiences for its student-athletes, and while the challenges that loom are sizable, indeed, the NSIC is surely well positioned for the future.

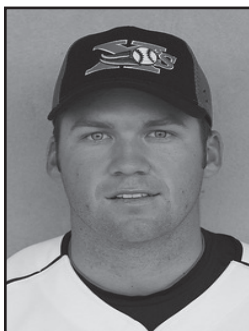
Nick Schumacher (2004-08)

Schumacher started his pro career in 2008 with the Padres' Arizona Rookie League and was later called up to the Class A Eugene (Ore.) Emeralds of the Northwest League.

In 2009, Schumacher helped the Fort Wayne TinCaps of the Class A Midwest League win the league title, going 6-0 with a 1.11 ERA in 37 appearances. In 56 2/3 innings, Schumacher allowed just 47 hits and had 55 strikeouts. In 2010, Schumacher was named a Mid-Season All-Star with Fort Wayne after recording 21 saves and was promoted to the Class A Advanced California League and pitched for the Lake Elsinore Storm.

Schumacher moved closer to home to pitch in the 2011 and '12 seasons for the Sioux City Explorers of the American Association. In two seasons he posted a 15-13 record with a 4.10 ERA.

The Nebraska City native played for the Spain National Team in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.



Brady Borner (1998-2001)

Borner had a successful six-year pro career with the Pittsburgh Pirates after being drafted in the 31st round of the 2001 draft. He recorded a stellar 35-15 record in Class A and AA with a 3.02 ERA. He was named the Pirates' Minor League Pitcher of the Year in 2005 after going 6-1 with a 2.08 ERA for Class AA Altoona in 48 relief appearances during the 2005 season.

Brady Borner was inducted into the Wayne State College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2007 and the Northern Sun Conference Athletic Hall of Fame in the summer of 2012.

Dustin Jones (2004-07)

Sioux City Heelan graduate and Wayne State All-American outfielder Dustin Jones had a consistent and successful five-year stint playing for his hometown Sioux City Explorers of the American Association before retiring after the 2011 season.

Jones still ranks in the top 10 in numerous career statistics playing for the Explorers, including fourth in career hits (397), fifth in doubles (69), triples (12) and stolen bases (89) and 10th in RBI with 148 while also ranking high all-time in the American Association in career walks (247) and runs scored (250).

Dustin Jones was inducted into the WSC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2016 and the NSIC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2019.



Travis Mortimore (2006-07)

Mortimore was drafted by the Seattle Mariners in the 21st round of the 2007 Major League Baseball Player Draft and pitched in the Mariners organization through the 2010 season.

In his first season with Mariners, Mortimore was named to the Arizona Rookie League All-Star Team and was promoted late in the season to Tacoma in AAA. In 2008, he pitched with the Class A Wisconsin affiliate and was later promoted to the Class A Advanced California League and pitched for the High Desert Mavericks for the final 2 1/2 years with the Mariners organization.

Mike Bisenius (2009-12)

Bisenius is another hometown player (Sioux City Heelan) that had a stellar career at Wayne State and signed with the Sioux City Explorers of the American Association.

Bisenius was a two-time All-NSIC selection at Wayne State as an outfielder and earned Rawlings/ABCA Third Team All-American honors at WSC in 2011 as a junior after hitting .401 with eight homers and 48 RBI's while hitting .450 with runners in scoring position.

In his one season with the Explorers (2012), Bisenius hit .215 in 48 games.

2006 - The 2006 Wildcats won the NSIC regular season title (19-1), NSIC Tournament title (3-0) hosted in Wayne and finished with a 37-15-1 record while advancing to the NCAA Central Regional.
