Conner Fiene was named Rawlings Gold Glove All-American on June 28, 2022, joining third baseman Michael Herman (2013) and first baseman CJ Nolen (2014) as Wildcat Gold Glove All-Americans. Last season, Fiene threw out an NSIC-leading 27 base stealers while making just one error behind home plate. He gunned down 27 of 63 (42.8%) would-be base stealers while helping a Wildcat defense set a new school record with a .972 fielding percentage.

Wayne State College has been a vital part of Northeast Nebraska since James M. Pile founded the college as Nebraska Normal College in 1891. From the early days as a private higher education institution with a handful of faculty and students until today, as a strong and proud member of the Nebraska State College System boasting more than 4,000 students and 450 faculty and staff, Wayne State has served as an educational, economic and cultural engine for Northeast Nebraska and beyond.

In addition, the auditorium, through the use of its stage, can accommodate 2,500 to 3,000 for commencement, theatrical performances, lectures and other similar events.



Memorial Stadium/Bob Cunningham Field: The stadium is used for seating up to 4,000 spectators for Wayne State College and Wayne High School football games. It also houses a press box and concession stand. WSC also hosts many high school track meets at this facility.

Ley Theatre, located in Brandenburg Hall, has fixed seating for 150. Additional seats may be added to accommodate up to 220. Ramsey Theatre, located in the Peterson Fine Arts Building, can accommodate 650 people on its main floor and balcony.

We are proud to offer exceptional education at an affordable cost. With low tuition rates and financial assistance given to most of our students each year, WSC is the most affordable and best quality four-year college in the region. Our value, combined with personalized attention from caring professors and staff, a friendly campus community, and opportunities to learn in and outside the classroom, makes WSC a great place for students to thrive and advance their futures.

Wayne State's four academic schools, Arts and Humanities, Business and Technology, Education and Behavioral Sciences, and Science, Health, and Criminal Justice, offer more than 130 programs of study and 55 minors in 15 academic departments, awarding bachelor's, master's and education specialist degrees in a variety of programs and fields. Two new sports were added for the 2019-20 season - women's golf and beach volleyball.

Wayne State continues to invest in upgrades to athletic facilities. The most recent additions include the completion of the Kirk Gardner Indoor Athletic Complex (formerly the Carlson Natatorium). A new state-of-the-art press box was completed in the summer of 2018 at Bob Cunningham Field. In the last two years Rice Auditorium has installed a videoboard and new branded playing surface to enhance the Wildcat fan experience.

You'll feel right at home on Wayne State's beautiful, historic campus located in the northeast Nebraska community of Wayne. The campus combines stately, historic buildings with the newly renovated Willow Bowl, Student Center, Ramsey Theatre, Studio Arts Building and Connell Hall.

Each WSC academic building contains more than one smart classroom, also known as technology enhanced classrooms, which create new opportunities in teaching and learning by integrating networking, digital and audio visual technologies.





WAYNE STATE ADMINISTRATION



Dr. Marysz Rames President

Dr. Marysz Rames was appointed the 13th president of Wayne State College by the Nebraska State College System Board of Trustees on June 18, 2015. She came to Wayne State from Dakota State University in Madison, S.D., where she had served as interim president since Aug. 15, 2014.

Rames earned her education doctorate in adult and higher education in 1997 from the University of South Dakota in Vermillion. She earned her bachelor degree in business administration and communication studies, with a minor in economics, in 1982, and her master's degree in educational administration in 1986, from University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, Colorado.

She spent one year (2014-15) as interim president at Dakota State University (DSU) in Madison, South Dakota. During this time she was instrumental in promoting a strong shared governance system, finalizing the university's five-year strategic plan, revitalizing the university's Foundation and actively raising funds to increase scholarships. Rames also worked with the legislature and others in several major new construction and renovation projects.

Prior to her interim appointment, Rames served as the vice president for student affairs from 2000 until June 2015 at South Dakota State University (SDSU) in Brookings. As the senior student affairs officer, Rames oversaw numerous university divisions and initiatives, including, but not limited to, enrollment management, student success, strategic planning, fundraising/fiscal management, diversity and inclusion, collaborative partnerships, leadership development, and increasing efficiency and effectiveness for students.

Rames served as an assistant professor of education at SDSU, teaching courses in administration and leadership in student affairs; serving on master's and doctoral students' graduate committees; and conducting research in financial trends in higher education, student retention and completion, and affordability and access to higher education. Rames also served as the interim associate vice president of student affairs (1997-1999) and the interim director for diversity enhancement (1999) at SDSU.

Prior to her arrival at SDSU, Rames worked at Aims Community College in Greeley, Colo., and the University of Wyoming in Laramie. Her scholarly presentations include topics such as student services, retention efforts, and working with today's college students.

Rames and her husband, Steve, have two children - Matthew and Jessica.



Mike Powicki Director of Athletics

Mike Powicki is in his 11th year (2022-23) as Athletic Director at Wayne State College. Powicki began his duties at Wayne State College on July 23, 2012 and has been instrumental in improvements to athletic facilities and staffing during his 10 years at the institution.

Over the past 10 years at WSC, over \$11 million has been invested in facility improvements, staffing and operations enhancements. More facility additions and renovations are planned in the near future as Wayne State announced in June a \$26.5 million athletic/recreation facility addition and renovation project that includes the addition of an air-supported indoor structure and major renovations to the Recreation Center, Rice Auditorium and the Kirk Gardner Indoor Athletic Complex. The three-phase project will begin with the new indoor facility starting in the spring of 2023 with a tentative completion date set for the fall of 2025.

The 2021-22 school year saw two more projects created to benefit Wildcat athletics. The Rice Auditorium Stage Conversion Project, totalling \$1 million, will enclose the current stage and create an open-air room to provide premium fan seating and in-game hospitality area for Wildcat volleyball and men's and women's basketball games in Rice Auditorium along with providing a multi-use area for student-athlete recruitment and team meetings. Another project scheduled for completion in late August is field turf installed on the WSC Soccer Pitch.

Powicki was instrumental in the addition of two sports to Wayne State athletics in 2019-20 with the addition of beach volleyball and the re-instatement of the women's golf program. He also orchestrated the renovation of the former natatorium into the Indoor Athletic Complex that will benefit all Wild-

cat athletic programs. Powicki also helped orchestrate the largest single scholarship gift in the history of Wayne State as the Gardner Foundation announced on October 3, 2019 a \$1.8 million gift to the school. Included in the gift was a one-time donation of \$300,000 toward the Indoor Athletic Complex along with \$150,000 toward athletic operations and \$925,000 toward athletic scholarships to WSC.

Wildcat student-athletes continued to excel in the classroom during the 2019-20 school year. 11 of the 13 sports at Wayne State posting a cumulative grade point average over 3.00. WSC had 212 Presidential Scholar Athletes and 142 NSIC All-Academic selections with 47 student-athletes posting a perfect 4.00 GPA in either the 2019 spring and/or fall semester. Wildcat athletics also produced an all-time high six Academic All-Americans in the 2019-20 school year and had one NSIC Elite 18 Award winner (Aaron Ras was a repeat selection in baseball).

In the summer of 2019, Rice Auditorium benefitted with the addition of several upgrades that included new (hanging) baskets, hallway graphics of current and past Wildcat athletes to enhance the look of Rice Auditorium and a newly designed floor/playing surface.

The Bob Cunningham Field Press Box Replacement project covering \$3.9 million was done in 2018. The project increased the amount of work space for media and staff working home events at Cunningham Field. The new facility also provides universal space on the lower level that will give WSC athletics an opportunity to host special events and create additional revenue through corporate sponsorships and donor stewardship.

In the fall of 2018 new Daktronics video scoreboards and a sound system totaling over \$200,000 were installed in Rice Auditorium to enhance the game day experience for Wildcat fans and student-athletes.

The first major athletic project that was completed under the guidance of Powicki was the Bob Cunningham Field/Memorial Stadium Renovation project. The project began in May, 2013 and was highlighted by installation of artificial turf, ornamental fencing, press box graphics and new goal posts. The \$1.6 million project also included the widening, lengthening and re-sodding of the Wildcat Soccer Pitch, along with installing new irrigation, facility fencing, scoreboard and making the facility ADA accessible. The Dr. LeRoy Simpson Track at Memorial Stadium was re-surfaced and painted in the summer of 2014 as the final phase of the project.

Powicki currently serves on the NCAA Division II Athletic Directors Association Board, NCAA Division II Central Regional Advisory Committee for baseball and is on the Northern Sun Conference Hall of Fame Committee. He also serves locally as the Wayne Kiwanis Board President, Vice President of the Wayne Area Economic Development Board of Directors and Revitalize Wayne Committee.

Powicki currently serves on the NCAA Division II Athletic Directors Association Board, NCAA Central Regional Advisory Committee for baseball and is on the Northern Sun Conference Hall of Fame Committee. He also serves locally as the Wayne Kiwanis Board President along with the Wayne Area Economic Development Board of Directors and Revitalize Wayne Committees.

Prior to arriving at Wayne State, Powicki served as Assistant Athletic Director at Minnesota State University in Mankato, Minnesota. He was the Assistant Athletic Director for Marketing and Corporate Partnerships from 2008-10 and was promoted to Assistant Director of Athletics for Development and Strategic Partnerships in 2010 where he served in that role until July 2012 when he arrived at Wayne State.

While at MSU, Powicki successfully developed and executed the athletics department revenue generation plan, responsible for generating \$1.7 million annually. Powicki managed all fundraising, development and marketing operations while overseeing the athletic department marketing/fundraising staff.

Powicki also served as Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs at Upper Iowa University from 2004-2008 where he was a part of the Peacocks transition from NCAA Division III to NCAA Division II status and into the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. While at Upper Iowa, Powicki monitored all team operations, recruiting and fundraising budgets. Powicki oversaw the UIU Recreation and Fitness Center staff, budget and overall operation.

In his time at Upper Iowa he created and sold athletic corporate sponsorship opportunities, supervised and coordinated all athletic department fundraising activities, developed and implemented the Peacock Club for donors and successfully completed the "Road to Glory" athletic facility capital improvement project. He also served as tournament director for various national and regional NCAA Division II Championship events.

During his tenure at UIU, Powicki served as an adjunct professor for the Exercise and Sports Studies within the Department of Education. Powicki obtained his bachelor degree from the University of Iowa in exercise science in and earned his masters degree in exercise and sport science/sport administration from Wisconsin-La Crosse.

Mike has two daughters - Faith and Elle (pronounced L) - and resides in Wayne.



PETE CHAPMAN BASEBALL COMPLEX



Located north of Memorial Stadium, the baseball and softball complex opened in the spring of 1996 and provides a picturesque setting for Wildcat baseball and softball games.

The baseball field received a face lift in the summer of 2004 with the additions of locker rooms, rest rooms, a concession stand and press box. A new wood fence was installed on the baseball field prior to the start of the 2005 season.

In the spring of 2006, the facility was named the Pete Chapman Baseball/Softball Complex in honor of the late Wayne State College athletic director/football coach and his contributions to the Wildcat athletic department. In the fall of 2006, a locker room/press box was constructed at the softball field, giving softball players their own locker room facilities. Prior to the start of the 2007 season, a new 10-inning electronic scoreboard was installed at the baseball field.

In the fall of 2007, a concrete pad and walkway was installed from the Recreation Center parking lot to the baseball/softball complex. The concrete walkway replaced the previous hard rock path, making it easier for fans and the handicapped to watch Wildcat softball action. A large concrete pad was also poured between the softball and baseball fields and the area between the clubhouses had new sod installed, making the Pete Chapman Complex even more fan-friendly.

In the spring/summer of 2008, batting cages and an enclosed pitching cage/bullpen area were also constructed north of the softball clubhouse giving Wildcat softball players more tools to work on their skills. The summer of 2009 saw a new wood fence installed in the outfield for softball.

The Pete Chapman Softball Complex hosted the 2010 NCAA Division II Central Regional and a new digital scoreboard was installed at the softball field in the spring of 2011, making the the Pete Chapman Complex one of the premier softball/baseball facilities in the Central Region.





WAYNE STATE FACILITIES



Rice Auditorium

Rice Auditorium serves as the home for the Wildcat men's and women's basketball teams as well as the volleyball squad. Recent upgrades to the arena include the stage conversion project in 2022, new baskets and rebranded playing surface in 2019, a new scoreboard, videoboard and sound system installed in the fall of 2018, new lights in 2011 and renovated offices and locker rooms.

The gymnasium area seats approximately 2,500 for basketball games and volleyball matches. Named for John D. Rice, Wayne State College's president from 1951-56, Rice Auditorium was the site of the 1999 NCAA Division II North Central Regional Men's Basketball Championships, the 2006 NSIC Red Baron Women's Basketball Classic, the 2012 NCAA Division II Central Regional Women's Basketball Championships and the 2022 NCAA Central Regional Volleyball Championships



Memorial Stadium / Bob Cunningham Field

Memorial Stadium has been "Home of the Wildcats" since 1931 when the college purchased 11 acres of land for athletic fields. The grandstand was constructed in 1933. The stadium was officially designated Memorial Stadium followed World War II in honor of the Wayne State students who served in the war. Bob Cunningham Field was named in 1993 for the WSC three-sport Hall of Fame standout (1936-39).

The press box underwent a complete replacement with a new structure built in 2018. The new press box is 5,220 square feet and includes an elevator along with a club level for corporate events.

The main stadium has seating for 2,500 fans while the bleachers on the east side of the field can seat an additional 750 fans. In the fall of 2010, Cunningham Field had new chairback seats installed in the middle three sections of the west stadium bleachers while the remaining bleacher seats in the west stadium were also replaced. The fall of 2011 saw the installation of a new scoreboard and videoboard and in the summer of 2013, Cunningham Field underwent a renovation with synthetic field turf replacing the grass surface.

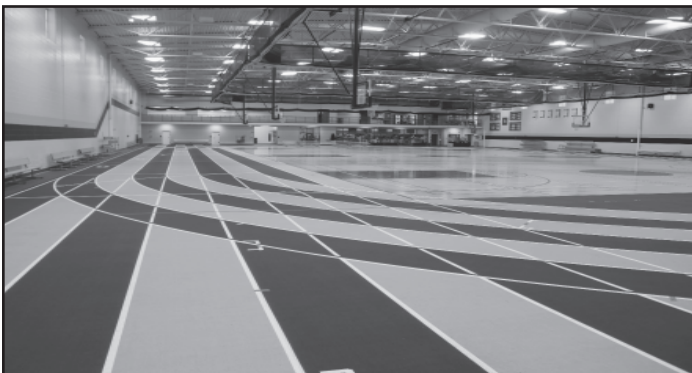


Recreation Center

The Wayne State College Recreation Center opened in 1987. It is the college's main facility for student recreation and selected activities.

The main area in the Recreation Center provides a six-lane running track that was resurfaced in 2021 and has three full-size courts for basketball, volleyball, tennis and badminton. Racquetball, weight training, aerobics, gymnastics, wrestling and sauna facilities are all available to WSC students, faculty and staff as well as residents of the Wayne community.

The Recreation Center also houses locker rooms for Wildcat athletic teams and offices for the WSC athletic department.





WAYNE STATE FACILITIES



Wildcat Strength/Conditioning Center

Recognizing the importance of first-class facilities for their student athletes, the Wayne State College athletic department completed a state-of-the-art renovation to its athletic facilities in the fall of 2008, building a new weight room at Memorial Stadium.

All Wayne State student athletes have utilized the benefits of new weight room equipment that features 18 platforms and racks, dumbbells and selectorized machines. The facility allows 72 student athletes to work out at the same time.

The project has enhanced Wayne State's ability to attract high quality student athletes and provide current team members the resources necessary to compete at the NCAA Division II level.



Kirk Gardner Indoor Athletic Complex

The Kirk Gardner Indoor Athletic Complex was completed in September, 2020 and has benefitted all athletic teams at Wayne State. The space in the former Carlson Natatorium turned the former indoor swimming pool area into an indoor turf sports facility.

The facility features three batting cages along with putting greens and volleyball net hookups along with employee offices on the balcony above that overlooks the practice area.



Wayne State Soccer Complex

Located east of Memorial Stadium and adjacent to the Pete Chapman Baseball Complex, the WSC Soccer Complex made its debut in the fall of 1997, in time for the inaugural Wildcat soccer season. In the summer of 2022 the WSC Soccer Pitch installed field turf replacing the natural grass surface.

During the spring and summer of 2013, the Wayne State Soccer Complex underwent major renovations that were part of the \$1.5 million athletic improvement project. Improvements to the soccer field included a new scoreboard, fencing and widened playing surface.



Pete Chapman Softball Complex

Located north of Memorial Stadium, the softball complex opened in the spring of 1996. In the spring of 2006, the facility was named the Pete Chapman Softball Complex in honor of the late Wayne State College athletic director/football coach and his contributions to the Wildcat athletic department.

The Pete Chapman Softball Complex has evolved into one of the nicest facilities in the Central Region. Improvements made over the years include a concrete pad/walkway to the facility from the Rec Center parking lot, enclosed pitching cage and bullpen areas for both teams, a new wood fence in the summer of 2009 and digital scoreboard for the 2011 season.

The Pete Chapman Softball Complex hosted the 2010 NCAA Central Regional Softball Tournament.



ATHLETIC TRAINING SERVICES



Muffin Morris *Head Athletic Trainer*



Dr. Muffin Morris is in her 15th year (2022-23) at Wayne State College as the Head Athletic Trainer. She oversees athletic training for all 15 sports at Wayne State College and is the head athletic trainer for football and men's basketball.

She also serves as an advisor to the WSC Student Athlete Advisory Committee and worked three years (2013-16) as senior women's administrator.

Prior to arriving at Wayne State, Morris worked four years at the University of South Dakota. She served as a graduate assistant athletic trainer and worked with football, swimming/diving, track and field/cross country and volleyball programs with the Coyotes.

Morris, a native of Chariton, Iowa, earned her bachelor's degree from Buena Vista University in athletic training in 2004. She received her master's degree from the University of South Dakota in 2006 in health, physical education and recreation and obtained her doctorate degree in adult/higher education from the University of South Dakota on July 31, 2008.

Morris resides in Wayne.

Dr. Carreau has published papers on various orthopaedic topics and is a member of the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgery, the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine and the Arthroscopy Association of North America. Dr. Carreau and his wife have four children. He is an avid fisherman and enjoys the outdoors.

Dr. Michael Nguyen joined CNOS as a Primary Care Sports Medicine Physician after completing his fellowship training in Sports Medicine at Morristown Medical Center in Morristown, N.J. He initially trained in family medicine in Waterloo, Iowa through the University of Iowa. He earned his medical degree as well as his MS in Hyperbaric Medicine from Saba University School of Medicine in Saba, Netherland-Antilles. Dr. Nguyen also earned a MS in Health Sciences Research from Texas State University at San Marcos.

WILDCAT HEAD COACH ALEX KOCH



Alex Koch Head Coach



Alex Koch is in his ninth year (2022-23) as Head Baseball Coach at Wayne State College. He was introduced as the 14th head coach in the program's 55-year history on July 3, 2014. In his eight years as leader of the Wildcat program, Koch has records of 163-175 overall (.482) and 122-110 (.526) in Northern Sun Conference play.

The Wildcats were 19-26 overall and ninth place in the NSIC (13-18) during the 2022 season. WSC set a new school record with a .972 fielding percentage that ranked tied for second

in the NSIC and tied for 19th in NCAA Division II. Seniors Andrew Hanson (First Team) and Alex Logelin (Second Team) earned All-NSIC honors while senior catcher Conner Fiene was named ABCA/Rawlings Gold Glove All-American after leading the NSIC with 27 base runners thrown out caught stealing during the 2022 season.

Under Koch in 2021, the Wildcats went 12-22 overall and 11-19 in the NSIC. Junior second baseman Alex Logelin earned All-NSIC Second Team honors for the 'Cats.

Wayne State had a 8-7 record in the 2020 season until COVID-19 canceled the remainder of the season.

The 2019 season saw the Wildcats make an 11-win improvement, finishing 32-18 overall and 23-12 (5th place) in the Northern Sun Conference. WSC improved dramatically on the mound, recording a 3 run improvement in ERA from 2018 to 2019 (7.22 to 4.17). The Cats had a 10 game win streak in late March and won 18 of 20 games from March 22nd to April 14th. WSC ended the season with six players receiving All NSIC honors and three earning All Region recognition.

In 2018 the Wildcats finished 21-26 overall and seventh place in the NSIC with an 18-16 league mark.

Koch led the Wildcats to a 29-24 overall record and a fourth place finish in the NSIC with a 23-15 league mark in 2017. The Wildcats were 14-6 in games decided by two runs or less and made a dramatic improvement in pitching from the previous season as the team's ERA went from 8.22 to 4.97 in the 2017 season.

Under Koch in 2016, Wildcats were 15-28 on the season and ninth in the NSIC with a 12-16 league record. WSC suffered numerous close losses, going 1-8 in one run games and 2-3 in two run decisions. Offensively, WSC ranked fourth in the NSIC with a .331 batting average - the team's highest batting average since the 2009 season.

In his first season as leader of the Wildcats, Koch led Wayne State to a 27-24 overall record and a 22-14 mark (fifth place) in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. It was the 18th straight winning season for Wayne State College baseball.

Koch (pronounced cook) has been associated with the Wildcat baseball program as a player and coach since 2006. He served three seasons as an assistant coach with Wayne State from 2010-12 and was a volunteer assistant with the program from 2012-14 after he accepted the position as director of the Wayne Community Activity Center in February, 2012.

A graduate of Millard South High School, Koch was a standout player for Wayne State from 2006-09, earning First Team All-NSIC honors three seasons (2007, '08 and '09) and was a two-time ABCA/Rawlings All-Central Region selection (Second Team in 2008 and First Team in 2009). Koch ranks second at Wayne State in career doubles (53), third in career RBI's (181) and tied for sixth in career hits with 217. He played on four NSIC regular season championship teams and four NCAA Tournament teams, including the 2009 team that reached the NCAA Central Regional final.

Alex is married to former Wayne State softball player Kiley Peterson and the couple resides in Wayne with their sons Kash and Knox and daughter Kollins.

Tyler Vaughn is in his third season (2022-23) as pitching coach for the Wayne State baseball team.

Vaughn is familiar with the NSIC, having played at Augustana and coached at Southwest Minnesota State prior to becoming the pitcher coach at Luther College in Iowa.

A native of Fort Dodge, Iowa, Vaughn spent 1 1/2 years as pitching coach at Luther College before coming to Wayne State.

Schroeder comes to WSC following a successful playing career at Augustana University where he was a member of the Viking baseball team for five years as a utility player. He was a member of the 2018 NCAA Division II national championship team that was 52-9 and played on two NCAA Central Region championship teams, two NSIC tournament championship teams and one NSIC regular season championship team.

Schroeder is a graduate of Minnehaha Academy in Minneapolis, Minnesota and earned a bachelor degree in sport management at Augustana in May, 2020. He is currently pursuing a master's degree at Wayne State in organizational management.

Manganaro was 506-309-1 in his 17 years as head coach at Wayne State from 1993-2009, leading the 'Cats to seven trips in a nine year span to the NCAA Tournament with six NSIC regular season titles. He was a four-time NSIC Coach of the Year and led WSC to five NSIC Tournament titles.



2023 WILDCAT SEASON PREVIEW



Ninth-year head coach Alex Koch may need to have ID cards early on as he gets to know the 2023 version of the Wayne State baseball team.

16 of the 36 players on the 2023 roster are new to the team with seven transfers and nine high school standouts signing with the Wildcats.

WSC will rely on the new players to fill holes left by graduation as the Wildcats lost five of their top seven hitters and seven of the top eight pitchers from last year's team that was 19-26 overall and finished ninth in the NSIC with a 13-18 league record.

Last year's team set a new school record with a .972 fielding percentage and will look to a young roster to improve on a .266 batting average (8th-NSIC) and a 6.34 ERA (9th-NSIC) from last year.



"We have a team that is full of first and second year guys," said Coach Koch. "They come to practice everyday with great focus and energy. Looking forward to see how their hard work translates."

Gone from last year's team are All-NSIC performers Andrew Hanson and Alex Logelin, who both hit over .300 last season

while combining for 52 stolen bases.

The team's top returning hitter from last season is this year's Wildcat Player to Watch in junior outfielder Colin Lynam, who hit .333 last season with a team-high 17 multi-hit games to go with 54 hits and 40 runs scored.

"Colin came to us last year and performed well as a transfer," remarked Koch. "He is looking forward to stepping up as a leader on a young Wayne team."

Other top returning starters are sophomore designated hitter Nick Barnett - .271 in 35 starts with three homers and



19 RBI and sophomore second baseman Chase Douglas who hit .233 in 25 starts with nine stolen bases.

The Wildcat pitching staff will be young, returning just six wins from last season. The veteran of the staff will be senior right hander Ryan Obrecht, who has a 12-9 career record

entering his fifth year in a Wildcat uniform.

Fremont junior Brody Sintek went 3-5 last season in 10 starts with two complete games and one shutout while sophomore Jackson Shelburne posted a 3-5 mark in 12 appearances and seven starts as a freshman last season working 35.2 innings.



The Wildcat Pitcher to Watch is

sophomore transfer Corbin Kirk, a left hander from Casper, Wyoming and Western Nebraska Community College. Last season he was 5-5 in 50 innings of work with 78 strikeouts and a 4.14 ERA.

"From the moment he stepped onto campus he has helped our program from a leadership standpoint," stated Koch. "We look for him to be a rock for us in our weekend rotation."

Other returning arms for the Wildcats are sophomore right hander Josh Kilzer (0-0, 5.79 ERA in seven appearances), sophomore left hander Jacob Kneifl (0-1, 7.50 ERA in 15 appearances) and sophomore right hander Nolan Belt.



Wayne State was picked to finish 10th in the Preseason NSIC Baseball Coaches Poll released January 18th. Augustana captured last year's NSIC regular season title while Minnesota State won the NSIC post-season tournament championship as both teams advanced to the NCAA National Tournament.

The Wildcats are scheduled to open the 2023 season on Friday, February 17th in a four-game series at Missouri S&T. WSC also faces William Jewell and Fort Hays State in non-conference matchups along with their annual Florida Spring Break Trip the second week of March.

WSC is scheduled to open Northern Sun Conference play at home on Saturday, March 18th hosting Minnesota Crookston at the Pete Chapman Baseball Complex.

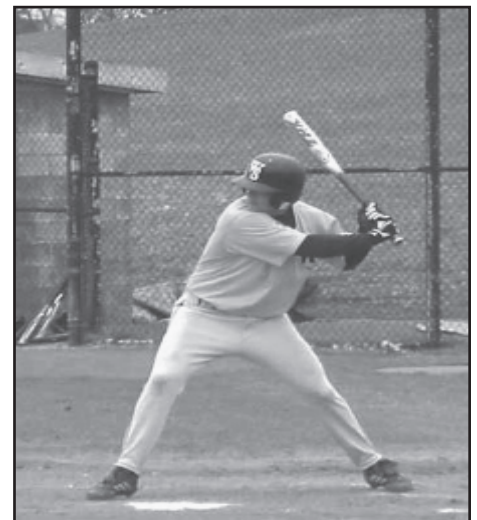

THE NORTHERN SUN INTERCOLLEGIATE CONFERENCE



From its modest origin as a six-team alliance over eight decades ago, the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference has matured into a 16-team union of upper Midwest colleges and universities to form arguably the strongest affiliation in NCAA Division II.

The NSIC can trace its roots to 1932 when six schools, including Bemidji State University, Minnesota State University, Mankato, Minnesota State University Moorhead, St. Cloud State University, University of Minnesota Duluth and Winona State University signed on as charter members. All remain active subscribers of the league today. Southwest Minnesota State University was added in 1969, followed by Northern State University in 1978, Wayne State College (NE) in 1998, Concordia University-St. Paul and the University of Minnesota Crookston in 1999, the University of Mary and Upper Iowa University in 2006, Augustana College in 2008 and Minot State University and the University of Sioux Falls in 2012. Minnesota State, St. Cloud State and Minnesota Duluth left the league to join the North Central Conference but returned to the NSIC in 2008. University of Minnesota, Morris and Michigan Tech University were once part of the NSIC family as well.

In 1992 the NSIC became a true athletic showcase for both men and women with the merger of the traditional Northern Intercollegiate Conference (NIC) and the Northern Sun Conference (NSC), the home of women's athletics since 1979. Before NSIC affiliates became certified for championship competition in the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) in 1995, its member institutions filled prominent roles in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). NIC and NSC clubs annually dispatched qualified student-athletes to national tournaments and captured several NAIA teams and individual championships.

The NSIC continues to make a major imprint nationally, winning 25 national titles since 2006. Winona State men claimed NCAA II Basketball Championships in 2006 and 2008 and narrowly missed a third crown, falling in a last second shot in 2007. In addition, the Warriors established a NCAA II record of 57 consecutive victories.

Concordia University launched an ongoing streak of seven consecutive NCAA II Volleyball Championships in 2007. In 2008 the Golden Bears won 37 straight matches after a season opening loss on their way to a second consecutive title and scripted a marvelous encore in 2009 with a perfect 37-0 finish, a third straight national crown and a winning streak of 74 straight matches. In 2010 the Golden Bear extended that NCAA record win streak to 75 before dropping their second match of the season. They started 2010 with a 10-4 record before ripping off 22 straight wins on their way to their fourth straight national title. In 2011, after overcoming midseason injuries, the Golden Bears hit their stride. The Golden Bears knocked off No. 1 and undefeated Cal State San Bernardino to become the first team in the history of NCAA Division II women's volleyball, to capture a fifth consecutive NCAA Division II Championship. Then in 2012, the Golden Bears again made a late season and championship match surge as they defeated Tampa 3-2 after trailing 0-2 to win their sixth straight NCAA DII Volleyball National Championship. In 2013 Concordia-St. Paul won the NSIC regular season title, but was defeated in the NSIC Tournament Championship by Minnesota Duluth. But from there the Golden Bears ripped off six straight NCAA post-season wins, extending their streak to 42, on their way to a 3-0 sweep of BYU-Hawaii to win another NCAA National Championship. After a two year hiatus, the Golden Bears return to the top of Division II volleyball as they won the 2016 and 2017 national championships.

In a most surprising run, Minnesota Duluth completed a perfect 15-0 season by winning the 2008 NCAA Division II Football Championship. The Bulldogs, limited to only 24 scholarships by league rule, swept a field of fully-funded teams, including top ranked Grand Valley State and number three Northwest Missouri State. Two years later, in 2010, the Bulldogs repeated that feat, going 15-0 again to win the national championship. The Bulldogs became the first NCAA DII football squad to win two national championships with undefeated records.

Minnesota State added more luster to the league by finishing 32-2 and claiming the 2008-09 NCAA II Women's Basketball Championship. The Mavericks rolled to a wild 103-94 victory over Franklin Pierce to set a NCAA record for total points in the title game.

In 2017 the Maverick softball team went 64-7 to win the National Championship. The Mavericks went 10-1 in NCAA play, including 5-0 in Salem Virginia as they defeated Angelo State 5-1 in the championship game. The Mavericks added their third team national championship in 2021-22 when they took home the women's indoor track & field championship. Makayla Jackson took home individual national championships in the long jump and the 60m dash, while Denisha Cartwright won the 60m hurdles title, helping the Mavericks score 56 team points.

Augustana got into the mix of national championships in 2011 when their women's cross country team turned in a true team performance in Spokane, Wash. All five Viking runners earned All-American status as Augustana won the first cross country national championship in NSIC history. The Vikings men's basketball team won the 2015-16 National Championship after going 34-2 and defeating Lincoln Memorial 90-81 in Frisco, Texas. The 2018 Augustana baseball team became the first NSIC institution to win a national championship in baseball, as the Vikings had an impressive post season, going 8-1 in NCAA play and a perfect 4-0 in Cary, North Carolina to finish the season 52-9.

In 2019 it was the Augustana Softball team that made a run to the national championship as the Vikings went 61-11 and defeated Texas A&M Kingsville twice by the score of 6-4 to win the National Championship.

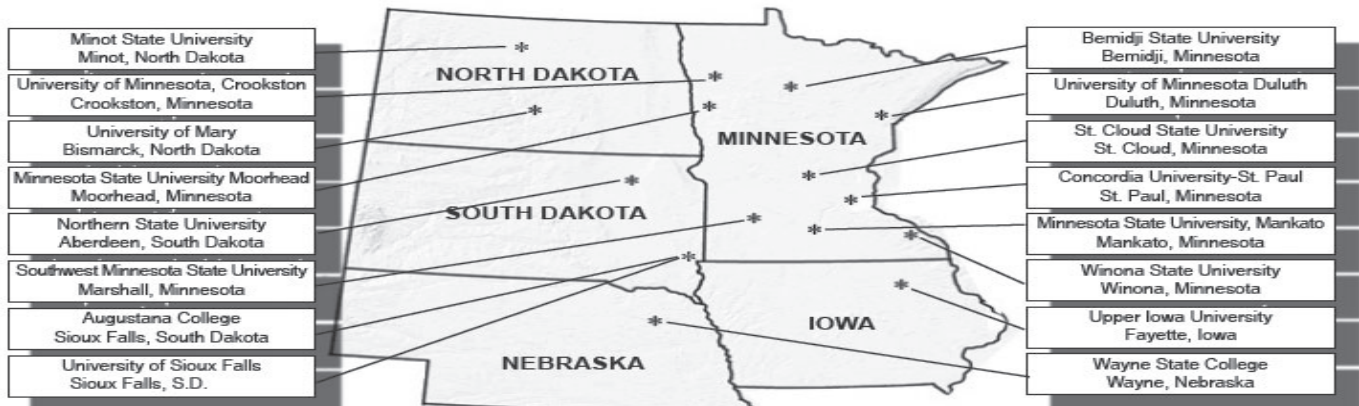
After multiple runner-up finishes, the St. Cloud State Huskies finally captured the national championship in wrestling in 2015. They repeated in 2016 and then took home the title again in 2018, 2019 and 2021.

The NSIC has now had 16 student-athletes awarded with the NCAA Elite 90 Award on 19 occasions. Earning the award were Rachel Rairdon (AUGIE, WCC, 2021), Ryan Schlichte (MSU, FB, 2019), Sasha Hovind (NSU, ODTF, 2018), DJ Pollard (NSU, Men's Basketball, 2018), Grant Pulver (UMD, Cross Country, 2017), **Leisa McClintock (Wayne State, Volleyball, 2015)**, Tavia Rutherford (Sioux Falls, Golf, 2015), Claire Sames (SMSU, Volleyball, 2014), Kara Pioske (Concordia-St. Paul, Volleyball 2013), Billy Brockmueller (Sioux Falls, Cross Country 2012, 2014 & IDTF 2014), Ben Keller (Minnesota State, Baseball 2012 & 2013), Cody Lensing (Augustana, Wrestling 2012), Kendra Huettl (Minnesota State, Softball, 2011), Matt Braithwaite (Augustana, Cross Country, 2010) and Lauren Brown (Winona State, Outdoor Track & Field, 2010).

Member schools continue to emphasize the educational, entertainment and unifying value of sports while pointing with pride to the many advantages to be gained by attending these colleges and universities. The NSIC is committed to providing rewarding experiences for its student-athletes, and while the challenges that loom are sizable, indeed, the NSIC is surely well positioned for the future.

Brady Borner (1998-2001)

Borner had a successful six-year pro career with the Pittsburgh Pirates after being drafted in the 31st round of the 2001 draft. He recorded a stellar 35-15 record in Class A and AA with a 3.02 ERA. He was named the Pirates' Minor League Pitcher of the Year in 2005 after going 6-1 with a 2.08 ERA for Class AA Altoona in 48 relief appearances during the 2005 season.

Brady Borner was inducted into the Wayne State College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2007 and the Northern Sun Conference Athletic Hall of Fame in the summer of 2012.



Dustin Jones (2004-07)

Sioux City Heelan graduate and Wayne State All-American outfielder Dustin Jones had a consistent and successful five-year stint playing for his hometown Sioux City Explorers of the American Association before retiring after the 2011 season.

Jones still ranks in the top 10 in numerous career statistics playing for the Explorers, including fourth in career hits (397), fifth in doubles (69), triples (12) and stolen bases (89) and 10th in RBI with 148 while also ranking high all-time in the American Association in career walks (247) and runs scored (250).

Dustin Jones was inducted into the WSC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2016 and the NSIC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2019.



Mike Bisenius (2009-12)

Bisenius is another hometown player (Sioux City Heelan) that had a stellar career at Wayne State and signed with the Sioux City Explorers of the American Association.

Bisenius was a two-time All-NSIC selection at Wayne State as an outfielder and earned Rawlings/ABCA Third Team All-American honors at WSC in 2011 as a junior after hitting .401 with eight homers and 48 RBI's while hitting .450 with runners in scoring position.

In his one season with the Explorers (2012), Bisenius hit .215 in 48 games.



Nick Schumacher (2004-08)

Schumacher started his pro career in 2008 with the Padres' Arizona Rookie League and was later called up to the Class A Eugene (Ore.) Emeralds of the Northwest League.

In 2009, Schumacher helped the Fort Wayne TinCaps of the Class A Midwest League win the league title, going 6-0 with a 1.11 ERA in 37 appearances. In 56 2/3 innings, Schumacher allowed just 47 hits and had 55 strikeouts. In 2010, Schumacher was named a Mid-Season All-Star with Fort Wayne after recording 21 saves and was promoted to the Class A Advanced California League and pitched for the Lake Elsinore Storm.

Schumacher moved closer to home to pitch in the 2011 and '12 seasons for the Sioux City Explorers of the American Association. In two seasons he posted a 15-13 record with a 4.10 ERA.

The Nebraska City native also played for the Spain National Team in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.



Travis Mortimore (2006-07)

Mortimore was drafted by the Seattle Mariners in the 21st round of the 2007 Major League Baseball Player Draft and pitched in the Mariners organization through the 2010 season.

In his first season with Mariners, Mortimore was named to the Arizona Rookie League All-Star Team and was promoted late in the season to Tacoma in AAA. In 2008, he pitched with the Class A Wisconsin affiliate and was later promoted to the Class A Advanced California League and pitched for the High Desert Mavericks for the final 2 1/2 years with the Mariners organization.

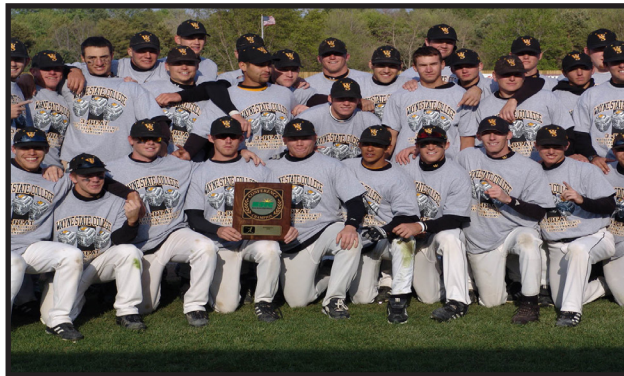
