• Exhibition Recap

The 2015-16 Gauchos made their debut this past Sunday in an exhibition with Cal State Dominguez Hills. UCSB freshmen Kali Jones and Coco Miller looked impressive in their first collegiate game, as Jones led the Gauchos with 22 points in going 11-12 from the floor while Miller added 12 points and sank two of her three shots from three-point range. Santa Barbara almost came back from 10 points down in the fourth quarter, but the Toros were able to hold on thanks to a 24-point performance from point guard Breanne Garcia. As a team, the Gauchos led in points in the paint (24-18), second chance points (16-5), and bench points (43-21).

• What's New?

Bonnie Henrickson and her coaching staff were busy during their first summer in Santa Barbara, as they brought over three transfer student-athletes to the UCSB roster. Fans will have to wait on the debuts of transfers Sarah Porter (Ole Miss) and Drea Toler (Oregon) who will be redshirting this year per NCAA transfer rules. However, center Je Zhé Newton is eligible for the 2015-16 season, and will immediately become UCSB's tallest player at 6-3. The Central Arizona transfer initially committed to Georgia Tech after finishing her high school career as a four-star prospect and as the ninth ranked post player in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz.

• Class of 2019

The Gauchos will have four freshmen on their roster this year with Lena Ethington (5-8, G), Kali Jones (6-2, F), Coco Miller (5-10, G), and Julianna Ramey (5-6, G). Jones and Miller both signed NLI's last November to join UCSB, while Ethington and Ramey announced their arrivals in the spring. Miller finished her prep career as JSerra Catholic HS's all-time leading scorer with 2,140 points and its single season scoring champ with 774 points. Jones was a first team all-league caliber player in high school and nearly averaged a double-double as junior with 16.5 points and 9.5 rebounds per game.

• The Wright Staff

Junior Mi'Chael Wright had a standout game in UCSB's exhibition, as she led all post players with three assists, was second on the team with seven rebounds, and also added a block and a steal. Her assist and rebound totals would have been career-highs for the forward. Wright has been great at drawing charges before, including one against the Toros, but on Sunday she also earned two trips to the foul line where she went 3-4.

The Henrickson File

Bonnie Henrickson was hired UCSB's Head Women's Basketball Coach on Apr. 23, 2015 after serving the last 11 years as the Head Coach at Kansas. In her 18 years as a head coach, the Willmar, Minn. native guided teams to 14 postseason appearances, including seven NCAA Tournaments. In all, Henrickson's squads have amassed a total of 344 wins, averaging more than 19 per season. Under her tutelage, the Jayhawks advanced to the Sweet 16 in back-to-back seasons (2012, 2013), while they also earned berths to five Women's National Invitation Tournaments (WNIT), reaching the championship game in 2009. Before arriving in Lawrence, Kan., Henrickson took her first head coaching position at Virginia Tech where she compiled a 158-62 record and made seven postseason appearances, reaching the NCAA Tournament five times and the WNIT twice. With her at the helm, the Hokies won 20 or more games in each of her seven seasons. She finished as the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year and was finalist for national coach of the year after her second season in Blacksburg when her team went 28-3 and made the Sweet 16. Henrickson is a 1986 graduate St. Cloud State University in Minnesota. As a player, she helped SCSU to a 97-25 record, three Northern Sun Conference championships and three NCAA Division II quarterfinals.

2014-15 Recap

Last season, UCSB finished last in the Big West with a 2-27 record. After going winless in non-conference play, the Gauchos picked up victories over UC Davis and Cal State Fullerton. Point Guard Onome Jemerigbe was named Honorable Mention All-Big West after leading the team in both points and assists per game. She was also one of the league's top distributors with 4.4 helpers per conference game.

• Fantastic Freshmen

UCSB was led by a pair of talented freshmen in their season opening exhibition, as Kali Jones netted 22 points and Coco Miller recorded 12. At 6-4, Jones was in an ideal matchup against Cal State Dominguez Hills as she was easily the tallest player whenever she was on the floor. The freshman forward showed strong hands in taking in passes and making quick finishes off the glass en route to an 11-12 shooting performance. Miller got started early in hitting corner threes to beat the Toros' zone defense. The 5-10 guard shot 4-5 overall in the game -- including a 2-3 from downtown -- and added three rebounds and an assist.

• Forward Thinking

Aside from the previously mentioned Jones, Newton, and Wright, UCSB's frontcourt will also feature sophomores Sabrina Callahan, Chaya Durr, and Taylor Farris. Though Callahan missed the first 10 games of her freshman season to injury, she had her best game as a rookie in scoring seven points (3-4 fg, 1/2 3fg) in 13 minutes of play against reigning Big West Champion CSUN. Durr opened the 2014-15 season as a starter in six of UCSB's first 15 games. During that stretch she hit a career high 15 points at CSU Bakersfield where she went 5-9 from the floor. Farris made the most starts of any underclassman last season with 11 and averaged 23.1 minutes per outing. She made most of her impact in the rebound column in being second on the team with a 4.6 rpg average.

• Good Point!

Onome Jemerigbe picked up right where she left off last season in dishing out nine assists against Cal State Dominguez Hills. The junior is returning for her second season as UCSB's starting point guard, as she earned an All-Big West Honorable Mention after running the point last year. Aside from Sunday's game, she has hit the nine-assists mark twice in her career. The Stockton, Calif. native finished fourth in the conference during league play with 4.4 assists per game, while she was also UCSB's leader in points (8.6 ppg) and assists (4.4 apg) through the entirety of the season.

• The Backcourt

Along with Jemerigbe and Ware, UCSB will return four guards from a season ago. Makala Roper was the Gauchos' leading three-point shooter with 39 three-point field goals and going 31.7 percent from beyond the arc. Dioseline Lopez will also be back for her senior season. The point guard played in all but two games and made two starts a year ago and finished on a high note by scoring a career-best 13 points at Cal Poly. In the assist category, she had her top performance versus LSU with six helpers.

• This Week

The Gauchos will officially tip-off the 2015-16 season with visits to Washington State and Idaho. Last season, the Cougars topped UCSB in the Thunderdome 81-55, but will be without their top scorers from that game in Friday's rematch. Chaya Durr reached her first ever double digit scoring performance in that game with 10 points. The Gauchos stop in Moscow will be their first since 2009. This season, the Vandals return four starters from a season ago, including their second and third leading scorers and top rebounder.

• Meet the Coaches

In addition to bringing in new players to the program this off-season, Henrickson was also hard at work in putting together her inaugural UCSB coaching staff. Her first hire was Evan Unrau who was named associate head coach. This is not Unrau's first stop at UCSB in her career, as she served as an assistant coach under Lindsey Gottlieb during her first season at the helm in 2008-09. Henrickson also brought back one of the program's all-time greats in Mia Fisher who ranks as the 12th leading scorer in Gaucho lore with 1,378 points. Finally, Henrickson rounded out her staff with Nate Fripp who spent the past 10 years as the head coach at St. Mary's High School (Berkeley, Calif.) where he compiled a 276-72 record.
