## **WSU CONTINUES ROAD TRIP AT BOISE STATE**

The Washington State women's basketball team (5-1) will look to rebound from its first loss of the season, traveling to Boise, Idaho to face the Boise State Broncos (3-2) Thursday, Dec. 3. Tipoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. MT (6 p.m. PT) from Taco Bell Arena. ## **ABOUT THE BRONCOS**

Head coach Gordy Presnell is in his 11th season at the helm of the Boise State women's basketball program. Presnell has guided the Broncos to a 3-2 record this season, most recently defeating Stetson in the San Juan Shootout (Puerto Rico). Last season, Presnell and BSU finished fourth in the Mountain West Conference with a 22-11 record, making an appearance in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

## **LAST TIME ON THE HARDWOOD**

Freshman Borislava Hristova continued her high-scoring season with 22 points at Oklahoma State Monday night, but it was not enough to lead the Cougars to victory, as they fell in Stillwater, 70-60, for their first loss of the season. Redshirt-freshman Nike McClure played a career-high 10 minutes, while pulling in a career-best five rebounds along with senior Mariah Cooks to lead WSU on the glass.

## **COMING UP**

Washington State will conclude its three-game road trip with a Sunday afternoon game in San Diego, Dec. 6. The Cougars and Toreros are scheduled to tip off at 1 p.m. at Jenny Craig Pavilion.

## **COACHING STAFF RETURNS TO BOISE**

Thursday's game marks a return to Boise State for several of WSU's coaching staff, including head coach June Daugherty, associate head coach Mike Daugherty, and assistant coach Rod Jensen. June Daugherty began her coaching career at Boise State, along with Mike, leading the Broncos from 1989-96. In their time in Boise, the Daughertys compiled a 123-74 record, a pair of Big Sky regular season titles, and BSU's first NCAA Tournament berth in school history. Jensen began his Boise State tenure in 1983 as the Broncos' top assistant coach. In 1995 he became the head coach, leading BSU to a 109-93 record in seven years. Jensen gained as a defensive coach, as the Broncos regularly ranked among the top teams in the country defensively and won a Big West East Division Championship in 1999.

## **THREE OPPONENTS – THREE TIME ZONES**

The Cougars are in the middle of a nine-day road trip spanning three time zones and three states. WSU traveled to Stillwater, Oklahoma and the Central Time Zone, falling to

the Cowgirls, 70-60, Monday. The team jumps back one hour into the Mountain Time Zone for a matchup with the Boise State Broncos this Thursday, before concluding the trip at San Diego, Sunday, in the Pacific Time Zone. WSU won't have much of a break as it hosts Gonzaga at home just two days after facing USD in southern California.

## **OFF TO A HOT START**

The Cougars (5-1) started their season 5-0 for the first time since 1998-99 when WSU also started the year 5-0. The honor for best start in school history goes to the Cougars' 1978-79 squad that started the season 10-0 before falling to Oregon.

## **BORISLAVA 'BOBI BUCKETS' HRISTOVA**

True freshman Borislava Hristova has turned heads in her first six games with the Cougars. The Varna, Bulgaria native is averaging 21.0 points per game, best in the conference by a freshman and second-best overall. Her scoring average is the third-best by a freshman in the entire country. Hristova dropped 30 points on San Jose State, becoming just the second freshman in WSU history to reach the 30-point plateau. She is a dead-eye from the field, shooting an impressive .571 (50-of-90) as a forward. Hristova was named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week, the conference released Nov. 23, and was also named the Rainbow Wahine Classic MVP after pouring on 39 points in two games.

## **RECORD WATCH**

Senior Taylor Edmondson has made 77.4 percent (65-of-84) of her free throws during her WSU career. The mark is currently fifth-best in school history, after the New Mexico native began the season tied for seventh with a .769 clip. Fellow senior Dawnyelle Awa enters Thursday's game with 277 career assists, eight shy of a place on the school's all-time top-10 list. Awa, along with senior Mariah Cooks, have each played in 103 games during their time on the Palouse. If both seniors play in the 23 remaining regular season games, they will sit in a tie for third on WSU's all-time games-played list (126 games), and just three games shy of the school record held by former teammate Sage Romberg (129).

## **COUGAR FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTING EARLY**

Washington State welcomed one of its most talented recruiting classes in June Daugherty's tenure with the signing of its three 2015-16 freshmen. Borislava Hristova currently leads the team with 21.0 points per game. The Varna, Bulgaria native dropped 30 points on San Jose State, becoming just the second freshman in WSU history to reach the 30-point plateau. Maria Kostourkova has proved an inside threat, averaging 6.2 rebounds per game and 6.6 points per game. Alexys Swedlund dropped four 3-pointers against San Jose State to aid the Cougars in victory, finishing with a career-high 16 points.

## **YOUNG WSU TEAM LED BY FOUR SENIORS**

With nine underclassmen, WSU is young this season. The Cougars entered the season with eight student-athletes that had played less than 300 minutes in their careers, but are led by a senior class that has played more than 6,000 minutes in Cougar uniform. Washington State returns two starters from last year after losing Shalie Dheensaw, Tia Presley, and Lia Galdeira (foregone senior year).

## **THE "UNITED NATIONS OF BASKETBALL"**

The 2015-16 Cougar basketball team is represented by student-athletes from seven different countries and five different states. Head coach June Daugherty regards the team as the "United Nations of Basketball." The Cougars have five student-athletes from Europe compared to six for the rest of the Pac-12 Conference combined. Of the conference's six Australian student-athletes, two of them don WSU uniforms.

## **WSU PICKED TO FINISH 10TH**

The Pac-12 Conference released the 2015-16 Preseason Coaches' Poll, Oct. 14, with the Cougars picked to finish 10th in the conference, receiving 30 points. The 2015-16 Preseason Media Poll also tabbed Washington State for 10th place, with 75 points, the conference announced Nov. 4.

## **FOUR PLAYERS TABBED TEAM CAPTAINS**

Redshirt-freshman Nike McClure, sophomore Pinelopi Pavlopoulou, and seniors Mariah Cooks and Alexas Williamson were named this year's team captains for the Cougars.

## **DAUGHERTY INKS FOUR FOR 2016-17**

Chanelle Molina, Cameron Fernandez, Katie Campbell, and Kayla Washington have each signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball at Washington State University beginning next fall, WSU Head Coach June Daugherty announced Wednesday. Molina (Kailua Kona, Hawaii) is listed as a five-star recruit by ESPN.com, and is the third WSU recruit from Konawaena High School (Dawnyelle Awa and Lia Galdeira). Fernandez (Makawao, Hawaii) led Lahainaluna High School to a 20-2 last season and the state championship game, while averaging 17 points, six assists, four steals, and five rebounds per game. Campbell (Oxnard, Calif.) is a three-time captain at Oaks Christian High School, she is a 3-point threat for the Lions, and made 77 shots from beyond the arc during her junior season. Washington (San Bernardino, Calif.) is a four-year captain at Cajon High School, Washington has led the Cowgirls to three-straight Citrus Belt League Championships.

## **COUGARS SEEK RETURN TO POSTSEASON**

Washington State has made two-straight appearances in the postseason for the first time in school history. Last year the Cougars were listed as the "First Team Out" of the NCAA Tournament and went on to compete in the WNIT, falling in the opening round to Eastern Washington. WSU also competed in the WNIT in 2014, snapping a postseason drought that dated back to 1991.

## **FRESHMEN LEAD WSU TO BEST START SINCE 1998-99**

WSU's three true freshmen poured on a combined 56 points as the Cougars defeated San Jose State, 95-80. Borislava Hristova led the way with a career-high 30 points, becoming just the second freshman in school history to score 30 points in one game. Alexys Swedlund added 16, making four shots from beyond the arc. Senior Mariah Cooks pulled in a season-best 12 rebounds, as WSU outrebounded the Spartans 63-39.

## **COUGARS DOWN HAWAII FOR TOURNAMENT TITLE**

Senior Dawnyelle Awa scored a career-high 16 points in her return to Hawaii, leading WSU to a 62-52 win over Hawaii in the 2015 Bank of Hawaii Rainbow Wahine Classic. In addition to Awa, freshman Borislava Hristova (16 points) and senior Taylor Edmondson (10) scored in double digits to carry the Cougars to the tournament title. Hristova was named the tournament's MVP, averaging 19.5 points across two games, while Awa picked up all-tournament team honors.

## **WSU OPENS WAHINE CLASSIC WITH VICTORY**

Freshman Borislava Hristova continued her hot start, leading all scorers with 23 points, as the Cougars defeated Nevada, 70-57, in the opening round of the Rainbow Wahine Classic. Washington State forced the Wolf Pack into 26 turnovers, including 18 in the first half, leading to 21 points for WSU. Senior Dawnyelle Awa scored a season-high nine points, while sophomores Caila Hailey and Bianca Blararu set career bests in rebounds (4) and points (7).

## **COUGARS FEND OFF HAMPTON**

The Cougars improved to 2-0 with a 68-61 win over visiting Hampton Monday, Nov. 16. Freshman Borislava Hristova led WSU with 20 points, becoming the first freshman to break the 20-point plateau since Lia Galdeira did so against Arizona in 2013. The Cougars shot 11-of-22 from beyond the arc, as Hristova, senior Taylor Edmondson, and freshman Alexys Swedlund each made three 3-pointers.

## **WSU OPENS SEASON WITH WIN OVER UCSB**

Washington State opened the 2015-16 season with a 61-44 victory over UC Santa Barbara Nov. 13 at Beasley Coliseum. True freshman Borislava Hristova led all scorers with 15 points, the most by a true freshman in their debut since Lia Galdeira scored 33 in 2012. The Cougars used a stifling defense to hold the Gauchos to 11-of-43 (.256) from the floor, while forcing UCSB into 23 turnovers, including 15 steals.

## **WASHINGTON STATE HEAD COACH JUNE DAUGHERTY**

Cougar Head Coach June Daugherty begins her ninth season at the helm of the Washington State women's basketball program. Daugherty has guided the Cougars to back-to-back postseason berths for the first time in school history after reaching the opening round of the WNIT in 2014 and 2015. The Cougars are 95-162 in Daugherty's time in Pullman and are coming off of a seventh place finish in the Pac-12 Conference.

## **2014-15 SEASON IN REVIEW**

Washington State earned its second-straight postseason berth after being selected to the WNIT for the second-straight season. Eighth-year head coach June Daugherty led the Cougars to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in program history, finishing with a 17-14 overall record and 7-11 in Pac-12 Conference play, good for seventh place for the second-straight season. The Cougars posted four wins over NCAA RPI top-50 teams Dayton (13), Maryland (6), at Gonzaga (39) and at Washington (33). WSU came close to knocking off three of the top-4 teams in the Pac-12 this season, falling to Stanford in Pullman in overtime, dropping a 73-70 decision to Oregon State in Corvallis, a 57-54 heartbreaker in Berkeley and a 61-56 contest to Oregon State. WSU went 9-2 in nonconference play, recording one of the biggest wins in program history with a 70-64 victory over No. 10/8 Maryland, an eventual No. 1 seed and Final Four participant, at the San Juan Shootout in Puerto Rico...WSU's win at Utah Feb. 15 gave June Daugherty career win No. 400...according to Jeff Sagarin's Rankings (RPIratings.com), WSU played the 33rd-toughest schedule in the country...WSU played nine NCAA Tournament teams last season and three WNIT teams.

## DAUGHERTY'S CAREER

## HEAD COACH JUNE DAUGHERTY



Washington State University Head Coach June Daugherty begins her ninth season with the Cougars and has led the charge toward a new era in WSU women's basketball. Just as she had done at each of her two previous stops, Daugherty, who has coached more than 700 career games, has begun turning around the WSU women's program, leading the Cougars to two-consecutive WNIT appearances in 2014 and 2015, bringing in top-ranked recruiting classes, improving attendance numbers and overseeing student-athletes who place premiums on academics and community service.

This past season, Daugherty hit a personal milestone, earning her 400th career win as the Cougars defeated Utah Feb. 15. Daugherty continued to build on the success of the previous season, as WSU earned a second-consecutive postseason berth for the first time in school history. The WSU women's basketball program earned national recognition,

recording one of the biggest wins in program history with a 70-64 victory over No. 10/8 Maryland, an eventual No. 1 seed and Final Four participant, in Puerto Rico, November 29.

Under Daugherty, Washington State has reached the Pac-12 Conference Tournament semifinals in two of the last four seasons, 23 student-athletes earned all-academic honors in the last seven years, and five players signed professional contracts to play overseas in the last four summers.

Off the court, the Cougars continued to shine in the classroom as the Cougars earned national recognition as part of the NCAA's Public Recognition Awards for the 2013-14 academic year. WSU earned the honor for the second-straight season with a multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score among the top 10 percent of all squads in the country. WSU posted a perfect four-year average score of 1,000, and was one of 43 women's basketball teams honored for its accomplishments. WSU, along with Stanford, were the only two Pac-12 Conference schools recognized.

During the 2013-14 season, Daugherty led the Cougars to one of the best campaigns in program history, earning a trip to the WNIT, the program's first postseason appearance since 1991, and posted 17 wins, the most since 1995-96. WSU also notched four wins over ranked teams, including one on the road against No. 10 Nebraska and went on to post nine conference wins for the first time since 1994-95. Guards Lia Galdeira and Tia Presley both earned spots on the All-Pac-12 Team, becoming the first pair of Cougar teammates to earn all-conference honors in the same season in program history. The Cougars received some national recognition late in the year, receiving votes in the Top-25 USA Today Coaches' Poll following their Pac-12 Tournament run, becoming the first WSU team to be mentioned in a poll since the 1990-91 season.

In 2012-13, Daugherty led a team that featured six freshmen and three sophomores to the Pac-12 Conference Tournament quarterfinals for the second straight season, beating Arizona State in the opening round before falling to top-seeded Stanford. The Cougars improved three spots in the conference standings from a season ago, finishing eighth. WSU produced some notable wins while playing one of the toughest schedules in the country, beating No. 20 Ohio State, posting a road victory over regional rival Gonzaga and sweeping the season series with Arizona State. The Cougars finished the year with a program record for blocks in a season with 114.

Also under Daugherty's guidance in 2012-13, the Cougars backcourt received recognition from the conference as Lia Galdeira, the second-leading freshman scorer in the country and three-time Pac-12 Freshman of the Week winner, earned a number of All-Pac-12 accolades as a freshman after pacing the Cougars in scoring, rebounding, steals and minutes. Sophomore point guard Tia Presley also earned all-conference honors despite being limited to seven conference games due to injury. Daugherty also saw center Carly Noyes cap off her impressive career by becoming the school's all-time leader in blocked shots, games played and career starts.

The 2011-12 campaign saw Daugherty lead the Cougars to one of the most successful seasons in program history while playing one of the toughest schedules in the country (No. 27). WSU posted the most wins since 1995-96, recording 13 overall victories and the second double-digit win season under Daugherty while improving their final RPI by 50 spots from the season prior. The Cougars saved its best for last, beating UCLA the final weekend of the regular season before posting the program's inaugural wins at the conference tournament. WSU knocked off Oregon State and USC in the first two rounds to advance to the nationally-televised semifinal against California held at the Staples Center in Los Angeles. Additionally, Daugherty led the Cougs to the program's inaugural win over a Big Ten Conference opponent (Wisconsin) and the first win over a Big East Conference opponent (Marquette) in over 20 years. Daugherty's team followed nonconference play by winning its first three games of Pac-12 play for the first time since 1977-78. The 2011-12 Cougars made their mark on the record book as well, posting the most rebounds, the sixth-most points, fourth-most threes, fifth-most assists and second-most assists in WSU single-season history.

2011-12 also saw Daugherty's first WSU recruiting class cap their impressive careers as a pair of 1,000-point scorers exited along with a three-time academic all-conference selection in addition to the three players who received invites to the WNBA combine. Headlining the group was guard Jazmine Perkins who finished her career as a three-time all-conference selection and WSU's all-time leader in games played and the first player in school-history, male or female, with 1,200+ points, 700+ rebounds and 250+ steals.

2010-11 saw the Cougars take another step forward under Daugherty's guidance while playing the No. 27 toughest schedule in the country. WSU posted the most conference wins, the highest scoring average and highest shooting percentage since 2000-01. The Cougars posted their highest finish since the 1997-98, tying for seventh after posting season sweeps over California and Oregon State and beating Oregon and Oregon State on the same weekend to record their first weekend sweep in conference play since 2001.

WSU finished the year with a school-record 208 made three-point field goals and the second-most assists in program single-season history. The past two Cougar teams have produced two of the top block totals in program history, recording 98 in 2009-10 and 100 last year, the second-best mark in the Cougar single-season record book.

In 2009-10, the Cougars started to make their move. Despite having the sixth-youngest team in the country, WSU started earning wins and accolades that hadn't been seen in Pullman for years. The Cougars defeated Arizona State in Tempe, Ariz., in front of a national television audience, their first road win over the Sun Devils in more than 13 years. WSU also defeated USC at Galen Center, the team's first road win over the Trojans in more than 11 years.

Individually, following a 33-point scoring barrage against ASU, guard April Cook garnered WSU's first Pac-10 Player of the Week honor in four years, and just the second by a Cougar in the last 13 years. Then-freshman Carly Noyes broke WSU's single-season blocks record, a mark that had stood for 25 years, and became the first player in school history to lead the Pac-10 in the statistical category. Daugherty also signed her third-straight nationally-ranked recruiting class, and if recent history is any

indication, greatness should be expected from the get-go. Multiple players from each of her first three signing classes garnered postseason recognition by Pac-10 coaches and media members following their debut seasons.

Following 2008-09, the Cougars ranked among the nation's top 30 teams in both increasing their win total and increasing their RPI ranking. During the regular season the Cougars won six more games than the previous season, ranking 26th nationally and second in the Pac-10 amongst teams making the greatest turnarounds. WSU also moved up 83 spots in the RPI from the previous season, the second-highest increase amongst Pac-10 teams, and tied for the 28th-highest jump nationally.

In year one, Daugherty instilled excitement around Cougar women's basketball, signing the nation's 16th-ranked recruiting class (Blue Star Basketball). The class also received a top-25 nod from HoopGurlz (No. 24), ranked second in the Pacific-10 Conference and was unquestionably the greatest signing class in school history. Fans' excitement translated into a packed Beasley Coliseum, as WSU more than tripled its attendance from the previous season. In year two, Daugherty guided the Cougars to an eighth-place finish in the Pac-10, WSU's highest ranking in the conference since also finishing eighth in 1998-99, and the team posted double-digit wins for the first time since the 2000-01 season. Daugherty also followed the most heralded recruiting class in school history with another highly-ranked class in 2008-09.

Daugherty's players have received quite a bit of postseason attention since her arrival on the Palouse. In her first season guard Katie Appleton garnered her first-career all-conference honor after being named All-Pac-10 honorable mention. Guard Kezia Kelly was named Freshman All-Pac-10 honorable mention. April Cook and Jazmine Perkins took home a slew of honors following the 2008-09 season, earning mention on the All-Pac-10 Team and the Pac-10 All-Freshman Team. Perkins was also named to the Pac-10 All-Defensive Team. In 2009-10, Cook garnered her second-straight honorable mention all-conference honor, and freshmen Carly Noyes and Kiki Moore combined for a number of accolades. Daugherty continued to produce all-conference selections last season as Perkins and Sage Romberg garnered All-Pac-10 honorable mention honors while Romberg was placed on the Pac-10 All-Freshman team and Ireti Amojor received All-Pac-10 All-Freshman honorable mention. It marked the third consecutive season that Daugherty had at least one freshman garner all-conference recognition.

Dating back to her years at Washington, Daugherty has placed at least one individual on the All-Pac-10/12 team each year since 1997. A pair of Cougs received All-Pac-12 accolades in 2011-12 as Perkins received all-Pac-12 honorable mention while both Perkins and Carly Noyes earned all-defensive team honorable mention. In 2012-13, Galdeira and Presley received all-conference honorable mention with Galdeira also earning a spot on the all-defensive and all-freshmen teams. This past season, Galdeira and Presley both earned spots on the All-Pac-12 Team, becoming the first pair of Cougar teammates to earn all-conference honors in the same season in program history.

Daugherty, whose career record stands at 387-360 (.518), has more than 20 years of experience working with WNBA-caliber talent. She began her head coaching career at Boise State, where she coached for seven years (1989-96) and compiled a record of 123-74 (73-31 Big Sky Conference). Under her watch, the Broncos not only made the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history, but achieved their first national ranking and won their first regular season conference title.

In 1992, the Broncos won the Big Sky regular season championship, and in 1994 they shared the conference crown with Montana and earned an at-large bid to the NCAA tournament. At the conclusion of the 1993-94 season, Daugherty was named Big Sky Co-Coach of the Year.

After turning things around at Boise State, Daugherty continued her success at Washington, where she coached for 11 seasons. After finishing ninth in the Pac-10 in 2000, Daugherty led the Huskies to their first conference title since 1990, the greatest turnaround in conference history. She led Washington to nine postseason appearances in 11 seasons - six NCAA Tournament appearances and three WNIT appearances - and led the Huskies all the way to the NCAA Women's Basketball Championship Elite Eight in 2001.

Daugherty helped a number of players earn individual honors at Washington, with Giuliana Mendiola becoming the school's first Pac-10 Player of the Year, and four players earning District VIII All-America honors. 16 players have combined for 49 selections to the Pac-10 All-Academic Team at Washington, and 30 student-athletes on the Big Sky Conference All-Academic Team at Boise State. In her seven seasons at WSU, 11 players have combined for 23 All-Academic selections.

A major advocate for healthy heart awareness, Daugherty was named the Sudden Cardiac Arrest Association's National Coach of the Year in 2008. Since becoming a survivor of sudden cardiac arrest Daugherty has become one of the nation's most visible spokesmen, filming a nationally-aired commercial, speaking at fund-raisers for the Hope Heart Institute and the American Red Cross and helping WSU sponsor the inaugural "Cougs Have Heart" basketball game to raise awareness for heart disease.

Daugherty is a member of the Women's Basketball Coaches' Association and is a former member of its Board of Directors. She is also a member of both the State Farm Coaches' All-America Team and the Russell Athletic/WBCA Coach of the Year selection committees and is currently serving on the WBCA Ethics Board, the WBCA All-America selection committee for Region 8 and is the captain of the Pac-12 coaches committee. Daugherty often serves as a clinician for the NCAA YES Clinic at the Final Four, and she has been active in USA Basketball and was an assistant coach for the West Team at the 1995 Olympic Sports Festival.

Daugherty served as an assistant coach at Stanford under head coach Tara Vanderveer prior to taking over the Boise State program. Daugherty also had a two-year stint on the Kent State staff as an assistant coach from 1983-85.

Daugherty played collegiate basketball at Ohio State from 1974-78, where she led the Buckeyes to the Big Ten Championship in 1977 and 1978. She is still ranked amongst the school's top 25 in career scoring with 1,137 points. She also ranks fifth in career rebounds (829), is tied for 17th in career field goals made (500) and shares the single-game school record for blocked shots (12 against Michigan State in 1976). At the conclusion of her senior season, she earned first-team All-America honors and was a Wade Trophy finalist the first year the award was presented.

Just prior to the start of the 2001 season, The Ohio State University honored Daugherty with an induction into the OSU Athletic Hall of Fame. Daugherty was inducted into the Westerville High School in December, 2011.

Following graduation in 1978, Daugherty contributed as both a player and coach on several international teams, including a period as a player and coach for the Union Sportive Vierzon Club based in France.

Daugherty, a native of Columbus, Ohio, is the daughter of Naomi and Jim Brewer and has two brothers, Mark and Neil Brewer, and one sister, Ruth Williams. She and her husband Mike are the parents of twins Doc and Breanne.
