WASHINGTON STATE COMPETES IN PAC-12 CHAMPIONSHIP

>> The Washington State men's cross country team, and the women's cross country team will compete in their sixth meet of the year, as the Cougars depart to compete at the Pac-12 Championships in Stanford, California.

>> The Stanford Golf Course is the site for the Pac-12 Championship this season, as this marks the 26th time the course has hosted the Pac-12 Championship for the men and 14th time for the women.

COUGARS IN THE RANKINGS:

>>The Cougars men's cross country program came in at No. 29 overall in the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) week five poll, while placing in the number eight spot in the west regional rankings. The Cougs are looking to rebuild momentum after dropping 12 spots after their races at the Inland Empire Championships and Pre-National Meet.

>> The Cougar women's cross country program came in 15th place overall in the latest west region ranking in the week five USTFCCCA poll, dropping down one spot from the previous week, as they look to climb the rankings by scoring points in the upcoming meet at Pac-12 Championship.

- Led Cougar men to three-straight NCAA Championships at-large invitations.
- WSU men's XC team finished 14th at 2016 NCAAs highest NCAA finish in 32 years.
- Michael Williams earned All-America honors with 30th-place; first Cougar since 1998.
- Vallery Korir finished 33rd at 2017 NCAAs, becoming the fourth woman in WSU history to earn All-America honors.
- WSU men's XC 26th at 2015 NCAAs and 24th at the 2017 NCAAs.

>> Washington State's men and women ran at the Pre-National Meet on Saturday, Oct. 13...The WSU women placed 26th overall, as freshman Emma Jenkins was the top runner with a time of 21:33.2 to finish 26th overall...For the men, the Cougs claimed 10th as a team, with senior Chandler Teigen leading the way finishing at 24:16 to place 26th overall.

>> The Cougars men and women also ran in the Inland Empire Championships on Saturday, Oct. 13...The WSU women placed 6th overall as sophomore Samantha King-Shaw claimed the top finish by a Coug with a time of 18:06 to place 14th overall...For the men, the Cougs finished second as a team, with sophomore Andrew Cooper placing seventh overall with a time of 24:35.
