## BAILEY-BRAYTON FIELD HISTORY

**CAPACITY:** 3,500

The home of Cougar baseball is one of the classiest collegiate facilities in the country. The picturesque Bailey-Brayton Field, which seats 3,500 fans, sits on the edge of campus, just southeast of the Beasley Performing Arts Coliseum.

The field opened at its current location in 1980, relocating after the Martin Stadium renovation which moved Mooberry Track to the site then occupied by the baseball field. In 1981, the already superb facility received an upgrade with the addition of an electronic scoreboard, which sits atop the left field fence. A \$250,000 lighting project was completed in 1984, making Bailey Field one of the few NCAA college-owned facilities in the nation with lights. WSU defeated Washington 3-2 in the first night game.

The "Walk of Fame" was added in 1988, which gave fans entering Bailey Field an historical look at WSU's baseball tradition. From 1980 to 2000, the facility was known as Bailey Field. During a special rededication ceremony prior to the 2000 season, the field added the name of WSU's all-time wins leader, skipper Chuck "Bobo" Brayton.

In 2004, FieldTurf was implemented and in 2007, home plate was made all FieldTurf.

In 2006, the addition of an indoor hitting / pitching facility was complete along with a new press box to house television and radio broadcasts.

In 2010, a three-million dollar videoboard was added.

In the fall of 2013, the Bailey-Brayton infield underwent a remodeling that included new logos and a FieldTurf mound. Washington State was believed to be the first school on the West Coast to have an artificial surface mound.

In the summer of 2017, Bailey-Brayton Field received AstroTurf's state-of-the-art Diamond Series playing surface, replacing the FieldTurf that was installed in 2004.





**Marty LEES**  
Head Coach

Marty Lees enters his third season at the helm of Washington State Baseball after being named the 15th head coach in program history in 2015. Prior to WSU, Lees spent the previous three seasons as the assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Oklahoma State and the previous 11 at Oregon State. In those 14 years he coached 10 teams that reached the NCAA Tournament, including two national champions with Oregon State (2006-07).

Last season saw the Cougars up their win total from a season ago highlighted by a stretch that saw Washington State claim four straight Pac-12 Conference series en route to a 24-29 campaign, including a 10-20 mark in league play. In year two under Lees, WSU featured a lineup with six first-year players, recorded its highest batting average, scored the most runs and hit the most home runs since 2013 while posting the fourth-most doubles (105) in the Pac-12, the most by a Cougar team since 2012. Washington State won four straight conference series for the first time since 1995, claiming series against No. 30 Washington, at Utah, Oregon and No. 28 UCLA, WSU's first series win over the Bruins since 2009. The Cougars played well at Bailey-Brayton Field in 2017, posting a 20-10 mark for the best home record since the 2010 team went 20-5. Following the season, three players earn All-Pac-12 accolades led by third baseman Shane Matheny's selection to the All-Pac-12 team while shortstop Andres Alvarez and outfielder Justin Harrer each garnered honorable mention. In the classroom, six Cougars received Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention, the most since 2012. In June's MLB Draft, three Cougars and a pair of WSU signees were selected in the MLB Draft.

In 2016, his first season at WSU, Lees led the Cougars to series wins over No. 10 Oregon State and No. 14 University of Washington, giving WSU its first series win in Seattle since 2004. Washington State finished the 2016 campaign 19-35 including an 11-19 mark in Pac-12 Conference play while improving in batting average, runs scored and home runs from the season prior with a roster that featured just one senior. The Cougars recorded the second-most stolen bases in the Pac-12, led the league in stolen bases during conference play and tied for the most double plays turned against Pac-12 opponents. Lees saw three players earn All-Pac-12 Conference accolades led by second baseman Trek Stemp's selection to the All-Pac-12 team and four players earned Pac-12 All-Academic honors. In the Major League Baseball Draft, Lees saw three Cougars drafted and four Cougar signees also picked by MLB clubs. Known as one of the best recruiters in college baseball, Lees and his staff put together a 2016 recruiting class that was ranked No. 28 by D1Baseball.com.

In his final season with the Cowboys posted a 38-20 record, falling in the 2015 NCAA Stillwater Regional, the first time in his three seasons Oklahoma State did not advance to the Regional Championship game. Along with helping lead the Cowboys to the NCAA Louisville Regional final in 2013 and a Big 12 Conference championship and NCAA Super Regional appearance in 2014, Lees thrived as Oklahoma State's recruiting coordinator. The Cowboys' first class with Lees on board was ranked No. 4 nationally by Baseball America and No. 5 by Collegiate Baseball, and followed that with a 2014 class that was ranked No. 5 by Collegiate Baseball for the second-consecutive year.

In January 2013, Lees came in at No. 6 on Baseball America's list of the nation's top 10 college assistant coaches; a list compiled from votes of 70 Division I head coaches across the country, as well as the input of more than a dozen scouts. As the primary coach for OSU's infielders, Lees coached 13 Cowboy infielders who have earned All-Big 12 honors over the last three seasons, and in 2015, Oklahoma State recorded a .975 fielding percentage.

Lees arrived at Oklahoma State after spending the previous 11 years on the coaching staff at Oregon State, including the final three (2010-12) as the Beavers' associate head coach. Lees joined the Oregon State staff as a volunteer assistant in 2002 and moved to a full-time assistant coach in 2004. He helped coach the Beavers to three-straight College World Series berths from 2005-07, including back-to-back national championships in 2006-07.

He worked primarily as the defensive coach for infielders and catchers and also spent his last six years as the team's recruiting coordinator. While in Corvallis, he

coached 30 All-Pac-10/12 Conference performers and 10 All-Americans. Under his guidance, Darwin Barney was the 2005 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year, while Chris Kunda was named the conference's defensive player of the year in 2006.

Lees also established himself as a top recruiter as each of his classes as recruiting coordinator ranked in the top 25 nationally. In 2008, the Beavers' signed a class ranked No. 3, and Oregon State's 2011 recruiting class ranked in the top 10 and included Michael Conforto, who earned All-America honors as a freshman in 2012.

A native of Lakeview, Ore., Lees earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Western Oregon in 1994. He and his wife, Kristy, have three sons, Brandon, Brady and Jake.



**Dan SPENCER**

Dan Spencer enters his third season as the Cougars Associate Head Coach / Pitching Coach after spending the previous three seasons at New Mexico and the prior four years as the head coach of Texas Tech, compiling a 115-112 record. Before joining Texas Tech for the 2008 season, Spencer spent 11 seasons with Washington State Head Coach Marty Lees at Oregon State as the Beavers hitting coach (1997-2003) and pitching coach (2004-2007).

Last season saw WSU up their win total from a season ago highlighted by a stretch that saw Washington State claim four straight Pac-12 Conference series, a first since 1995. The Cougar pitching staff tallied more strikeouts and wins from a season ago while Scotty Sunitich finished third in the Pac-12 with eight saves. WSU also tallied the second most pickoffs in the conference led by Damon Jones who lead the league with six pickoffs. Spencer also guided junior college transfer Cody Anderson to share the team-lead with five wins and also produce the tenth-lowest batting average against among all Pac-12 pitchers. Spencer closed the season with a pair of Cougar pitchers selected in the MLB Draft, Jones went to the Phillies in the 18th round and reliever Colby Nealy to the Dodgers in the 35th round.

In 2016, his first season with Washington State, Spencer saw a pair of Cougars earn All-Pac-12 honorable mention honors and two hurlers taken in the 2016 Major League Baseball Draft. Spencer guided Ian Hamilton, WSU's all-time saves leader who converted to a starting pitcher, lead the team in innings and strikeouts before being selected in the 11th round by the Chicago White Sox. Reliever Ryan Walker joined Hamilton earning all-conference honors after leading a young WSU staff in wins, ERA, saves and opponent batting average. His 2.40 ERA was the fourth-lowest in the Pac-12 while his five saves tied for tenth. The Cougar pitching staff featured nine arms who made their WSU debut in 2016 including seven true freshmen.

Spencer helped the Lobos reach the title game of the 2015 Mountain West Tournament, posting a 32-27 overall record, 17-13 in conference play. He coached All-MWC First-Team pitcher Toller Boardman and Tyler Stevens, who became the first Lobo pitcher to be named a freshman All-American. In 2014 Lobo pitchers recorded their lowest collective ERA (4.23) since 1977. It was also the seventh lowest staff ERA in the program's 115-year history. The bullpen also saved a school-record 16 games.

Prior to New Mexico, Spencer spent five seasons at Texas Tech, one year (2008) as associate head coach and four more as head coach, where his Red Raider set several records during his years as head coach. He was the first head coach to win at least 25 games each of his first four seasons, and his teams defeated 32 nationally-ranked opponents. His players excelled in the classroom as well as the Red Raiders produced 31 Academic All-Big 12 players in his four years, almost as many as the school had (34) in the 12 years prior to his arrival.

In addition to winning back-to-back national titles while at Oregon State (2006-07), he was part of the staff that led the Beavers to three straight College World Series appearances (2005-2007) and back-to-back Pac-10 titles in 2005-2006. His pitching staffs led the Pac-10 in ERA in both 2005 and 2006 and in saves in 2006 and 2007. He also served as the program's recruiting coordinator and brought in three nationally-ranked recruiting classes. Collegiate Baseball Magazine named Spencer the National Pitching Coach of the Year in 2007.

In his career at Oregon State, Texas Tech and New Mexico, Spencer coached 12 players to 26 All-American awards, and had 35 players selected in the first 10 rounds of the Major League Baseball draft, including 14 in the top five rounds and three first-round picks.

He began his head coaching career at Green River Community College in Auburn, Wash., where he was the head coach from 1992-1996. In 1992 and 1994 he was named the Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges Coach of the Year.

Spencer played one season at Mira Costa Junior College in San Diego in 1984 and went on to play three seasons at Texas Tech University (1984-87).

A native of Vancouver, Wash., Spencer received his bachelor's degree in history from Portland State University in 1990. He and his wife, Susie, have three children: Wade, Logan, and Elizabeth.

Former Washington State catcher and minor league manager Jim Horner enters his third season as the Cougars assistant coach, working the outfielders, catchers and hitters. Horner, a first-team All-Pacific-10 catcher for the Cougars in 1996, returned to the Palouse after managing the Seattle Mariners Double-A affiliate Jackson Generals (Tenn.) for the 2014 season and the first half of the 2015 campaign.

This past season saw WSU up their win total from a season ago highlighted by a stretch that saw Washington State claim four straight Pac-12 Conference series, a first since 1995. The Cougars, with a lineup featuring six first-year players most of the season, recorded their highest batting average, scored the most runs and hit the most home runs since 2013 while posting the fourth-most doubles (105) in the Pac-12, the most by a Cougar team since 2012. Three position players earned All-Pac-12 Conference honors led by third baseman Shane Matheny's selection to the All-Pac-12 team who was later among the three Cougars selected in the MLB Draft.

In 2016, his first season back in the dugout with the Cougars, Horner helped the WSU offense improve from the season prior in batting average, runs scored and home runs while finishing second in the Pac-12 Conference in stolen bases. Horner also saw second baseman Trek Stemp earn All-Pac-12 honors after posting the fourth-best batting average in the conference at .355 and was selected in the Major League Baseball Draft by the Tampa Bay Rays.

Horner owns seven-plus years of managerial experience, serving as the skipper of the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers (Seattle - Low-A) from 2006-07 before managing the High Desert Mavericks (Seattle - High-A) from 2008-10 and 2013. In 2009, he was named California League Manager of the Year and Seattle Mariners Staff Member of the Year after guiding the Mavericks to South Division first and second half titles and earning a spot in the championship series.

From 2011-12, Horner coached two seasons at Texas Tech University serving as the Red Raiders' hitting coach under then head coach Dan Spencer who was also hired by Lees as the Cougars' associate head coach. In 2012, Horner helped Texas Tech finish second in the Big 12 in batting average (.292), second in slugging percentage (.418), second in doubles (117) and ranked 12th in the nation with a conference-best 24 triples. That season, the Red Raiders were the only team in the league to have three of the top 10 hitters in the Big 12 led by second baseman Jamodrick McGruder (.358) who went on to earn All-America honors and was named a semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy. In his two seasons at Texas Tech, seven position players were taken in the Major League Baseball Draft highlighted by first-round pick Barret Barnes who was taken No. 45 by the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2012.

Horner began his managerial career with the Class-A Wisconsin Timber Rattlers for two seasons before moving to High Desert. He began coaching in 2005 as the hitting coach with the short-season Everett AquaSox.

Horner joined the coaching ranks immediately after completing a nine-year professional playing career, all with the Mariners' organization. He was a catcher in the Seattle farm system from 1996 to 2004. In 2000, Horner reached the Triple-A level with the Tacoma Rainiers. He was a Double-A All-Star with the San Antonio Missions in 2003 and collected the John Ellis Award for community service in 2000 as a member of the New Haven Ravens in the Eastern League. He batted .259 with 116 doubles, six triples, 59 home runs and 298 RBI during his nine year minor-league career.

Horner played at Washington State for coaches Bobo Brayton (1993-94) and Steve Farrington (1995-96). The Twin Falls, Idaho native earned first-team All-Pac-10 Conference honors as a senior after leading the Cougars with a .332 batting average. Horner was also named the Pacific-10 Conference Medal Winner for Washington State as WSU's top male student-athlete and received all-academic honors while earning a bachelor's degree in criminal justice.

Jim and his wife, Katie, have four children: daughters, Madison and Reagan, and sons, Jackson and Tyler.

Shirer appeared in 74 games and made 61 starts in the outfield for the Cougars in 2016-17, recording 28 runs scored, 44 hits, five doubles and stole 17 bases including 12 as a redshirt-sophomore in 2016, tied for second-most in the Pac-12

Conference that season. Prior to WSU, Shirer spent two seasons at the College of Southern Idaho where he earned All-Scenic West Conference honorable mention in 2015 after leading the team with 10 stolen bases and posting a .409 on-base percentage.

Shirer is a native of Chehalis, Wash. and attended W.F. West High School.

Trek Stemp joined the Washington State coaching staff as an undergraduate assistant for the 2018 season. Stemp played three seasons for the Cougars before he was drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in 2016.

Stemp played the 2013-14 seasons before redshirting and playing the 2016 season, head coach Marty Lees' first year at WSU. Stemp appeared in 130 games, 115 as a starter and posted a .312 career batting average, recording 149 hits, 19 doubles, 79 runs scored, 19 stolen bases and 43 career multiple-hit games. The Kennewick, Wash. native earned All-Pac-12 Conference honors as a redshirt-junior after hitting .355 with 65 hits, six doubles, 32 runs scored, 12 stolen bases,

17 multiple-hit games and recorded three different hitting streaks of 10+ games throughout the season.

Stemp, who hit .280 with seven doubles and seven stolen bases with Rays' rookie league team in 2016, attended Kennewick High School where he was a two-time All-State selection.

Adam Thackery begins his second season as the Cougars' baseball strength and conditioning coach.

Thackery, who also works with the Washington State track and field and women's soccer programs, joined WSU after spending four years at Miami (Ohio) University as the first assistant strength and conditioning coach for football. Thackery also worked with the baseball, women's soccer, volleyball, softball and men's swimming programs. Prior to Miami, Thackery previously worked at the University of Indianapolis (2011-12) as an assistant strength and conditioning coach and adjunct professor in kinesiology. Thackery, who has worked with 34 All-Americans and nine draft picks (NFL, NBA, MLB), also worked as a graduate

intern for the Indiana University men's basketball strength and conditioning staff for the 2010-11 season.

Thackery was three-year letterwinner in track and field at Indianapolis, throwing the hammer, discus and javelin. He earned his bachelor's degree in kinesiology and exercise science at Indianapolis and master's degree in kinesiology and applied sport science at Indiana. Listed below are the 25 former baseball players/coaches who have been inducted into the Washington State Athletics Hall of Fame.

#### RICK AUSTIN (2012)

Rick Gerald Austin was born Oct. 27, 1946 in Seattle. He attended Lakes High School in Tacoma, Wash., where he competed in baseball, football and track. In 1968, he led the nation with 12 wins and tied a then-Washington State single-season record. His 1.10 ERA in 1968 is third all-time at WSU and his 1.33 mark in 1967 ranks fifth. He was a Pac-8 All-Star, a NCAA District First Team selection and a Second Team All-American in 1968. He was a first round pick of the Cleveland Indians in the June Secondary Phase of the MLB Draft in 1968. Austin spent part of four seasons in MLB, two with the Indians and two with the Milwaukee Brewers. He appeared in 89 games, including eight starts, winning four and saving six.

#### BUCK BAILEY (1978)

A WSU sports institution for 35 years, Buck came to the university as assistant football coach and became a legend as its colorful - and winning - head baseball coach. Played football and baseball at Texas A & M and Bethany College in West Virginia and was Captain of West team in the first East-West Shrine game in 1925. At WSU, Bailey's baseball teams won 11 Northern Division pennants and were second 10 times. The 1950 team was runnerup for the NCAA title and Bailey's Cougars were seventh nationally in 1956. Athlete-Coach of "Bailey's Angels," barnstorming basketball team made up of WSU sports greats which toured the Northwest and entertained thousands. Died in 1964.

#### CHUCK "BOBO" BRAYTON (1982)

Chuck "Bobo" Brayton, one of the winningest collegiate baseball coaches in NCAA history, and one of the most innovative and imaginative leaders in the college game. A three-sport letterman at WSU and an All-American at shortstop for the Cougars in 1947, Brayton played on two Championship baseball teams at WSU and, beginning in 1965, coached the Cougars to an unprecedented 13 straight Northern Division pennants...retired after the 1994 season the winningest coach in WSU history and the fourth winningest NCAA Div. I baseball coach at the time of retirement...final record 1,162-523-8 (68.9%)...WSU baseball field, Bailey-Brayton Stadium, named after Brayton and his mentor Buck Bailey...baseball uniform number retired May, 2003.

#### GORDON BRUNSWICK (2012)

A three-sport athlete at Washington State, Gordon Brunswick earned a total of six letters with the Cougars, one in basketball under head coach Jack Friel (1949-50), two in football for coach Phil Sarboe (1947-48), and three in the sport he's most known for, baseball, under coach Buck Bailey (1948-50). A native of Tacoma, Wash., Brunswick was an all-conference first baseman in 1948 and an all-conference outfielder in 1950. In his three seasons he hit .329 in 41 conference games, having his best season as a sophomore when he hit .462 in 11 league games. As a senior in 1950 the Cougars finished first in the PCC Northern Division with a 12-2 league mark and swept Stanford to advance to the first College World Series held at Omaha, Neb. The Cougars fell to Texas in the championship game, finishing as national runner-up with a 32-6 overall mark. Following the 1950 season Brunswick turned pro, spending five seasons in the minor leagues, including a short stint with AAA Seattle. In his final season, 1954, he signed with the New York Yankees and played for Modesto, San Francisco and the Tri-Cities.

#### RON CEY (1982)

Ron Cey, the famous "Penguin" of the Los Angeles Dodgers, began his climb to the Major Leagues as a third baseman for Washington State in 1967-68. Cey has played more games at third base for the Dodgers than any other Athlete in the club's history and has set Major League records for runs batted in and home runs. He also tied a National League record for fewest errors by a third baseman and was named to the NL All-Star team six times in his first eight years with the Dodgers.

**MARV CHAMBERLAIN (2016)**

Marv Chamberlain grew up dreaming of playing baseball at Washington State and fulfilled his dream, producing a record-setting career for the Cougars. The Longview, Wash. native remembers following WSU's 1965 College World Series run where they finished third, but Chamberlain, a high school catcher at the time, made up his mind he was going to play for head coach Bobo Brayton and the Cougs. As a sophomore in 1972, Chamberlain led the Pac-8 Conference in hitting at a .415 clip followed with a junior campaign that saw him hit .345 in conference play and finish the year with a team-best 45 RBI. He capped his career in record-setting fashion, setting or tying 10 school records as a senior in 1974 while leading Washington State to a share of the Pac-8 Northern Division title. The utility man turned first baseman earned ABCA First-Team All-America, All-District and First-Team All-Pac-8 Conference honors after hitting .383 with 16 home runs along with school records for RBI (73) and total bases (127). He also became the first Cougar in program history to reach double-digits in both home runs and stolen bases (15) in the same season. Chamberlain left Washington State the all-time leader in games played (159), at-bats (494), hits (166), runs-batted-in (156), grand slams (3) and tied the record in doubles with 27. He was later selected in the eighth round of the 1974 Major League Baseball Draft by the Montreal Expos before receiving his bachelor's degree in pharmacy.

**CLIFF CHAMBERS (1984)**

The highlight of an outstanding professional baseball career for Cliff Chambers was a 3-0 no-hit May 9, 1951, as Pittsburgh beat Boston in the second game of a double-header. His pro career included stops in Chicago, Pittsburgh and St. Louis, compiling a 48-53 record, 4.29 ERA in six seasons. His best seasons were 13-7 with Pittsburgh in '49, and a combined 14-12 in 1951 with Pittsburgh and St. Louis (11-6 that year after being traded to St. Louis). He posted an 11-5 career mark at WSU in 1941-42, completing 12 of 18 starts, including nine of 10 in 1942. He posted three shutouts. At the plate, Chambers hit .354 overall and .444 in league play in 1944. He also spent two outstanding years in the minor leagues, including a 28-8 record for Los Angeles in 1947 when he won the strikeout title and was a two-time Pacific Coast League All-Star pick.

**GENE CONLEY (1979)**

Gene Conley is one of a few persons in sports history to play on two world championship teams - in different sports. Conley spent two years on the Washington State University campus and played on championship basketball and baseball teams. He later played on the Boston Celtics' world championship teams of 1959, 1960 and 1961, and was a pitcher on the Milwaukee Braves team that won the World Series in 1957. At WSU, Conley played center on Coach Jack Friel's championship basketball team of 1950, and he pitched for Coach Buck Bailey's 1950 Cougar team that won the Northern Division and District Eight and finished second in the College World Series.

**PETE DUNCAN (2012)**

Born Sept. 7, 1948 in Victoria, British Columbia, Peter James Duncan became the first Canadian named to the NCAA All-American team when he was selected as a third baseman in 1970. That season, he led the Pac-8 with a .423 batting average in conference games and a .379 mark overall while tying a then-WSU record for hits with 58. Duncan was named Pac-8 and NCAA District 8 First Team in 1970. The Cougars won the Pac-8 in 1970, and Duncan was honored as the team's Most Inspirational Player. He made seven relief appearances in his Cougar career and, after spending one season at third base in the Kansas City Royals' organization, he was converted to a full-time pitcher. He spent four seasons in the minor leagues as a hurler where he was 28-18 with a 2.54 ERA in 407 innings.

**WILLIAM FALLER (2012)**

William "Butch" Don Faller was born April 14, 1925 in Mount Vernon, Wash. He played second base for Washington State in 1947 and batted .262 in 13 conference games. In 1948, he moved to shortstop, appeared in 11 conference games and batted .211 (other Cougar statistics are unavailable). Faller played two years (1948-49) in the Philadelphia Phillies' organization where he batted .288 and .287, respectively for Klamath Falls (Ore.). He spent several years teaching and coaching high school in Washington. He was hired in 1961 as the Yakima Valley College (now Yakima Valley Community College) as the head football and baseball coach. In baseball, he replaced Bobo Brayton. His baseball teams won 664 games, 11 conference titles and 18 league and regional championships. The NWAACC championship trophy is named in his honor.

**DALE FORD (1983)**

Known as "The Whale", Ford is one of WSU's greatest all-around athletes, but baseball was where he excelled. He played in the early and mid-1960's, graduating in 1966. Ford won eight varsity letters in three sports during an era when freshmen couldn't play varsity sports. Dale was a quarterback for two years, won three basketball letters, and was an NCAA record-setting home run hitter in baseball for three years. In 1966 he set an NCAA mark with 17 home runs and at one time held WSU records for home runs in a season, career batting average (.365) and season slugging percentage (.857). He played with the Cub and Angel organizations before knee injuries ended his career. Ford is now a business executive in the Seattle area.

**DAN FRISELLA (2012)**

Born March 4, 1946 in San Francisco, Daniel Vincent Frisella was a 1963 graduate of Serra High School in San Mateo, Calif. After attending the College of San Mateo, Frisella transferred to Washington State where he was a key member of the Cougar pitching staff in 1965 and 1966. His 0.743 WHIP in 1965 is second-best in school history and his 108 strikeouts in 1966 are a Washington State record for the wood bat era. Frisella recorded five shutouts in his Cougar career, one shy of the Washington State record. He was part of the 1965 team that won the Pac-8 Northern Division and NCAA District 8 titles on its way to the College World Series. He was 17-1 in his Cougar career and helped Washington State win the 1966 Pac-8 Northern Division crown. A third round selection by the New York Mets in the June Secondary Phase of the 1966 MLB Draft, Frisella was with the Mets by 1967. He played for the Mets from 1967-72, then spent the next four seasons pitching for four-different big league clubs. He made 351 appearances in MLB, won 34 games and registered 57 saves.

**SCOTT HATTEBERG (2015)**

Scott Hatteberg spent three seasons (1989-91) in a Cougar uniform before embarking on an 18-year professional career. An All-State baseball player out of Yakima, Wash., it didn't take long for Hatteberg to make an impact for the Cougars. As a sophomore in 1990 he led the team in hitting (.381), along with hits (88), total bases (145), slugging (.628) and tied a conference record with 29 doubles. He earned first-team All-Pac-10 North honors and was the Region VII Selection Hitter award recipient as Washington State's everyday catcher, where he formed the battery with another WSU Hall of Famer, Aaron Sele. The summer before his junior season he was selected for Team USA and toured Europe with a Pac-10 All-Star team, where he hit a team-best .467. His junior season he hit .365 with 21 doubles, tied for fifth on WSU's single-season list and captured Pac-10 North MVP honors, first-team All-Pac-10 accolades for the second-straight season, and was named to the ABCA All-District second team. He was selected No. 43 overall by the Boston Red Sox in the 1992 MLB Draft. He spent 14 seasons in the major leagues, seven with Boston, four with Oakland and three with Cincinnati, retiring in 2008 with career totals of 1,153 hits, 249 runs, 249 doubles, 106 home runs and 527 RBI. He was one of the featured players in the hit movie, Moneyball.

**MARK HENDRICKSON (2016)**

One of Washington State's most versatile athletes coming out of Mount Vernon, Wash., Mark Hendrickson played both basketball and baseball for the Cougars in his four-year athletics career (1992-96). On the basketball court, the 6-foot-9 forward made an immediate impact as a freshman during the 1992-93 season, averaging 12.6 points and 8.0 rebounds as he was named to the five-member Pac-10 All-Freshmen Team. Despite his strong start, Hendrickson saved his best for last, as he was a Pac-10 All-Conference First Team pick his junior and senior years. He finished his career as the Pac-10 active leader in double-doubles with 43 in 108 games and became the first Cougar to lead his team in rebounding all four seasons. Hendrickson concluded his basketball career in 1996, holding the school record in career field goal percentage (.567), while ranking second for career rebounds (927) and third for points (1,496). Hendrickson made eight appearances on the mound for the Cougar baseball team during his junior year (1995). Following graduation Hendrickson was the 31st overall pick in the 1996 Draft by the Philadelphia 76ers. After four years in the NBA with four different teams (Philadelphia, Sacramento, New Jersey and Cleveland), he moved on to baseball, where he had been a four-time MLB Draft pick. He spent 10 years in the major leagues, playing with Toronto, Tampa Bay, Los Angeles (Dodgers), Florida and Baltimore, collecting 58 wins and 666 strikeouts before retiring in 2015. Hendrickson is one of 12 athletes all-time to play both in the NBA and MLB, and the only one to play at least four seasons in each league.

**MIKE KINKADE (2017)**

One of the finest baseball players ever to pass through Washington State, Mike Kinkade left an indelible mark on the history of Cougar baseball during his time. Recruited by and playing his first three seasons under the legendary Bobo Brayton, Kinkade set WSU records for career hits (304), runs (230) and doubles (75) during his career. Starting 224 of 228 games, he also finished second on WSU's all-time lists for games played (228), RBI (197) and at-bats (844), third in triples (12) and walks (125), fifth in batting average (.360) and eighth in home runs (25). For the three-time team captain, his junior season was arguably his finest as he earned All-America second-team honors by National Collegiate Baseball Writers and third-team honors by both Collegiate Baseball and Baseball America after hitting a career-best .388, with 90 hits, a school and Pac-10 North-record 31 doubles, nine home runs and 61 RBI. He was a three-time All-Pac-10 Northern Division First-Team selection, twice as a DH (1993, 1994) and as a catcher (1995), before being drafted in the ninth round of the 1995 MLB June Amateur Draft. Kinkade played six major league seasons, parts of three with the New York Mets, two with the Los Angeles Dodgers and two with the Baltimore Orioles, finishing with a career batting average of .256 with 100 hits, 20 doubles and 10 home runs. He also earned a Gold Medal as a member of the U.S. Olympic Team at the 2000 Sydney Games. Kinkade owns and manages a fitness business in Pullman.

**ROBERT McGUIRE (2012)**

Robert Charles McGuire was born Dec. 2, 1927. He attended Lincoln High School in Tacoma, Wash. McGuire was a three-time all-conference selection as an outfielder. He was selected to the 1950 NCAA All-District team while leading Washington State to a national runner-up finish. While overall statistics are not available for McGuire's time at Washington State, he batted .304, .377 and .364 for a career average of .353 in conference play. McGuire played four seasons in Minor League Baseball where he batted .265. He also played halfback for the Cougar football team (1947-49) and was inducted into the Tacoma-Pierce Sports Hall of Fame in 1971.

**JOE McINTOSH (1987)**

Few pitchers ever achieve the success Joe McIntosh enjoyed during a brilliant Cougar career, either on the field, or in the classroom. The Billings, Montana native came out of Billings High in 1969 known as an infielder, but Cougar coach Bobo Brayton saw the makings of a great pitcher his first year on campus and quickly sent him to the mound. In the next three years McIntosh established nine career records and six Pacific-8 Conference marks, plus a host of other records. In addition, the pre-med major was picked to the CoSIDA Academic All-America first team three straight years. He received his Master of Law (L.L.M.) degree in tax from New York University in 1981 and is now a lawyer in Seattle. The 6-2 right hander won all 10 games as a sophomore in 1971, winning the first of three straight Buck Bailey Awards as WSU's top pitcher. He posted a 10-5 mark in 1972, then finished off his career with a 13-3 mark in 1973. He tossed back to back no-hitters that season six days apart, beating Whitworth 8-0 and then Puget Sound 6-0. McIntosh was a member of the USA team that competed in the World Amateur Tournament in the fall of 1972, striking out 21 in 21.1 innings. He shut out Germany, Brazil and El Salvador for a 3-0 mark. Drafted in the 13th round by San Diego, McIntosh's pro career was cut short by an arm injury after being traded to Houston in 1975.

**ART McLARNEY (1982)**

Art McLarney starred in basketball and baseball for the Cougars in the 1930-32 era, was WSU's first All-American in baseball (1932) and signed a professional baseball contract with the New York Giants after his senior season at WSU. Three-year Northern Division selection and All-Pacific Coast choice in 1930 in basketball. McLarney was a student leader as well as an outstanding athlete and served as Student Body President in 1932. Later was a successful high school and collegiate basketball and baseball coach.

**JAY MILLER (2015)**

Jay Miller was a four-year letterwinner for the Cougar baseball team from 2002-06, ending his career as Washington State's all-time hits leader. Miller, from Bellevue, Wash., made an immediate impact, leading WSU in batting average (.341), hits (72) and doubles (21) en route to All-Pacific-10 Conference honorable mention honors. Miller continued his assault on the Cougar record book, leading the team in batting average and hits three of his four seasons. He saved his best for last, earning third-team All-America and third-team Pac-10 honors as a senior. That season he batted .361, sixth in the Pac-10, and led the conference in hits (88) and doubles (28), the latter total second in the NCAA. He finished his career as WSU's career hits leader with 307. That total placed him ninth all-time in the Pac-10, while his 74 career doubles were second all-time at WSU and the fifth-most in Pac-10 history. Miller was also tied for third all-time in games played (227), fifth in walks (107), sixth in runs scored (161) and tied for ninth in RBIs (147). Taken in the 17th round by the Philadelphia Phillies, Miller played three seasons in the organization, totaling 197 hits and 29 doubles.

**WILLIAM "BILL" NOLLAN (1982)**

William "Bill" Nollan won fame in Northwest athletics as both Athlete and coach. Lettered in basketball, baseball and tennis at WSU and pitched on two Championship baseball teams for the Cougars. Coached at Pasco, Hoquiam and Lincoln (Seattle) High Schools. Nollan's teams at Lincoln, his alma mater, won 22 city titles in football, basketball, track and baseball in 27 years. He was "Mr. Cougar" in Seattle and western Washington for many years.

**JOHN G. OLERUD (2001)**

The only Cougar baseball Athlete ever to be named College Athlete of the Year. The outstanding first baseman and pitcher spent three seasons with the Cougars before turning professional with the Toronto Blue Jays, then the New York Mets and now a star for the Seattle Mariners. Olerud is the only pitcher in NCAA history to win 15 games - he was 15-0 in 1988, and also hit 20 or more home runs - he hit 23 that year. John Olerud still holds numerous WSU records, including career batting average at .434 and single season batting average at .464. Olerud was 26-4 and posted a 3.17 ERA while throwing 241.1 innings over three seasons. His sophomore season was truly magical - he set or equaled 12 school records while being named Athlete of the year by Baseball America. Included was a 22-game hitting streak and a slugging percentage of .876. During his career he set two Pac-10 records and 10 Pac-10 North marks. In January prior to his junior year at WSU, Olerud suffered a subarachnoid hemorrhage, a type of brain seizure. He missed the first 28 games of the spring season, but returned to hit .359 for WSU over the final 27 games. Weeks prior to the start of his senior season, Olerud signed a contract with Toronto and went directly to the Major Leagues. In 1993, Olerud became the first Blue Jay to win a batting title, hitting .363. That year he became just the ninth MLB Athlete since 1900 to collect 200 hits and walk 100 times. Olerud played for the New York Mets two seasons, 1997-98, then signed with Seattle. John joined his father John Sr. in the WSU Athletic Hall of Fame.

**JOHN OLERUD (1986)**

Paced WSU to third in the 1965 College World Series while returning first-team All-America status as a catcher...led WSU in hitting that year with a .341 average...he won the Coaches Cup (MVP) in 1964 and 1965 and the "Top Hitter" award in 1965...he tied a school career record with 12 home runs and completed his career ranked in the top ten in times at bat, triples, home runs and runs-batted-in...earned Phi Beta Kappa honors in Zoology and pre-med...spent seven years in the California Angels organization following 1965 draft...Washington medical school graduate...currently associate professor of medicine (dermatology) and orthopedics (sports medicine) at University of Washington hospital...born 11-26-43 at Fargo, North Dakota...attended Federal Way (Wash.) High.

**TED ROHWER (1989)**

Ted Rohwer ranks as one of Washington State's greatest all-around athletes, excelling in football, basketball and baseball. A graduate of Spokane's North Central High, he played for three of the greatest coaches in Cougar history, Babe Hollingbery's first three gridiron teams, Jack Friel's first basketball team in 1929, and as a shortstop and first baseman on Buck Bailey's first three baseball teams. During his football career, the Cougars went 17-7-2, including a 6-1 season in 1926 and a 7-3 finish in 1928. The former sophomore class president at WSU started his basketball career in 1927 for Karl Schlademan. Rohwer was among the top scorers for the Cougars each of three seasons. On the diamond, Rohwer started his career playing for Hack Applequist. A year later, in 1927, Bailey took over the program. During his four varsity seasons as one of WSU's top home run hitters, the Cougars were 60-27. He later turned down pro offers from the Buffalo Bisons (football) and the St. Louis Cardinals (baseball). After coaching stints at Longview High and Portland's Grant and Lincoln Highs and working in private business, Rohwer entered Pacific University's optometry school, graduating in 1955. He then practiced optometry in Seattle (1955-65) and Spokane until his retirement in 1976. He died at age 71 in 1978.

**AARON SELE (2013)**

Aaron Sele put together one of the most distinguished careers in Cougar baseball history during his three years (1989-91) on the Palouse. In 1990 he received numerous national honors, including All-America honors from the American Baseball Coaches Association (first team) and Baseball America (third team) after posting a 12-3 record, 2.22 ERA with 121 strikeouts in 121 2/3 innings pitched. The following summer he was a member of Team USA, where he led the team in starts, innings pitched and strikeouts, going 5-2. That included a three-hit shutout win over Cuba, the first time Cuba had been shut out in international competition. A two-time all-conference and all-district selection in his career, Sele left school as the career record holder for strikeouts and owned the top-two marks on the WSU single-season list. His name appeared on a Cougar top 10 list for single season or career in more than a dozen places when the Boston Red Sox made him a first round pick, No. 23 overall, in the 1991 MLB Draft. Sele recorded 148 wins over 15 big league seasons, playing for six teams.

**RICHARD STILES (2015)**

Richard Stiles' impact on Cougar baseball is the stuff movies are made of. Arriving from Yakima, Stiles played for legendary coach Buck Bailey from 1947-49, leading Washington State College to within one game of the College World Series in 1949. That season Stiles posted a 12-1 record, including 10 complete games, as the Cougars won a school-record 33 games. He was named to the AABC All-District 8 and All-Northern Division first teams. Over his final two seasons he set a conference record by winning nine consecutive conference games and finished his career with a 17-2 record. The only person from Washington or Oregon in 1949 accepted to the Northwestern Medical School in Chicago, he deferred his final season at WSC. After one season playing for the St. Louis Browns farm system in 1950, where he had an 11-5 record, Stiles obtained his medical degree and became a family doctor, returning to his hometown to enjoy a lengthy practice. During that time, a young coach at Yakima Valley College, Bobo Brayton, was struck on the head while pitching batting practice. Stiles was one of the physicians who operated on Bobo, saving the Cougar icon's life. Just like in the movies, Stiles found his field of dreams in both Pullman and Yakima.

**BOB WAITS (2015)**

Bob Waits was a two-sport athlete for the Cougars from 1969-71, playing both baseball and basketball and produced one of the most decorated baseball careers in Washington State history. Waits, known for a letter he wrote to Bobo Brayton in high school stating how he would play two sports in college and steal 50 bases, lettered three times in both baseball and basketball during his record-setting career. Waits played his first two seasons in the outfield before moving to second base for his final season, where he enjoyed a breakout season as a senior, earning first-team All-America honors after setting an NCAA record with 59 stolen bases while also posting a .358 batting average. He finished his career with a .304 batting average and a school-record 94 stolen bases. On the basketball court Waits played for coach Marv Harshman. Following his graduation, Waits coached baseball at Olympia High School before he returned to WSU to coach the Cougar JV team and earn his master's degree in 1975. He later served as an assistant coach under legendary head coach Bobo Brayton in 1977 before entering private business. After a successful stint as a high school baseball coach in the Tri-Cities area, Waits passed away at the age of 35 after a battle with cancer.



# 1950

The Cougars roared to a 14-2 start and cruised to a 27-4 mark in the regular season, including a 12-2 record and first-place finish in the Pacific Coast Conference Northern Division. WSC swept a pair of games in Pullman against Stanford to capture the PCC crown and traveled to Omaha, Neb., for the first College World Series at the site. After defeating Tufts in the opener, future Major League pitcher Gene Conley and Rod Keough pitched back-to-back complete game victories over Alabama and Rutgers, respectively. WSC was routed by Texas and the Longhorns defeated Rutgers to set up a winner-take-all game with the Cougars. Despite three hits by shortstop Eddie Coleman, the Cougars were blanked 3-0 and finished national runner-up with a 32-6 record.



# 1956

After a 6-3 start, Washington State ripped off 15-straight wins and went on to post a 26-6 regular season record. Included in the winning streak were five wins by Jerry Bartow, including four of his school single-season record 10 complete games. The Cougars won the Pacific Coast Conference Northern Division with an 11-3 mark and hosted USC with the PCC title and NCAA District 8 spot in the College World Series on the line. Bartow bested the Trojans on a six-hitter in the opener and Bill Rich, who batted .422 in 90 at bats during the season, drove in all five runs in game two and the Cougars swept the series. In Omaha, Neb., Bradley defeated WSC 4-3 in the opener and New Hampshire handed Ron Aiken his only loss of the season to eliminate the Cougars.



# 1965

Washington State won 16 of its first 17 outings, including 12-straight to open the season, and rolled to a 29-6 regular season record. The Cougars won the Pacific Coast Northern Division at 14-4 and hosted Stanford in the NCAA District 8 Play-off. In the opener against the Indians, Harold Brunstad plated two runs with a double in the eighth to lift WSU to a 2-1 victory and the Cougars routed Stanford 13-3 in game two to give head coach Bobo Brayton his first trip to the College World Series. In Omaha, Neb., WSU split its first two games, defeating Texas and losing to Ohio State. The Cougars edged Connecticut by a run to set up a rematch with the Buckeyes that turned out to be a classic. Steve Arlin struck out 20 Cougars and Ohio State pushed across an unearned run in the 15th inning for a 1-0 win that ended WSU's season. The Cougars finished fourth in the nation according to Collegiate Baseball.



# 1976

The Cougars won their final 10 regular season games to finish 39-12 and win the Pacific-8 Conference with a 16-2 record. Washington State hosted the NCAA West Regional where the Cougars blasted four home runs, including three off future big-league hurler Mike Scott, to defeat Pepperdine in the opener. WSU took two of three games from Cal State Fullerton behind a pair of wins from tournament MVP Bob Sherwood and advanced to the College World Series in Omaha, Neb. At the CWS, Washington State scored in five of the first six innings and defeated Oklahoma in the first round before losing to Arizona State and Maine to end the season 43-15. Future big-league pitcher Eric Wilkins led the Cougars with 10 victories and WSU averaged over seven runs a game on offense.

President

A nationally respected university leader, Kirk H. Schulz became the 11th president of Washington State University and a tenured professor in the Gene and Linda Voiland School of Chemical Engineering and Bio-engineering on June 13, 2016.

President Schulz is guiding WSU's transformation into one of the nation's top 25 public research universities, one that offers exceptional research and innovation. He has also pledged a university-wide focus on providing a transformative educational experience to undergraduate and graduate students to ensure their success in the classroom and after graduating from WSU.

Prior to arriving at Washington State, Shultz served as president of Kansas State University for seven years, guiding the university to a number of significant achievements, including:

- Enrollment reached a record 24,766 students in fall 2014.
- Private giving increased from \$84.9 million to \$211 million in a four-year period.
- With more than 40,00 members, Kansas State has ranked No. 1 in the Big 12 for 18 consecutive years for the percentage of graduates who are members of the alumni association.
- Campus facilities were expanded significantly, including construction of a welcome center, theater, academic facilities and a football complex.
- The University won three Big 12 Athletic Conference championships in two years: football (2012), men's basketball (2013), and baseball (2013).
- KSU was selected as home for the \$1.2 billion Department of Homeland Security National BioAgro Defense Facility (NBAF).

In addition, he is the chair of the NCAA board of governors, the association's highest-ranking committees. As chair, he helps oversee issues across the association. His term runs to January 2017.

Under Schulz's leadership, Kansas State University was selected a Friend of the Flint Hills by the Flint Hills Discovery Center Foundation in spring 2014. The award recognizes the university's contributions to the Konza Prairie, one of the last remaining tallgrass prairies in North America.

Before his appointment at KSU, Schulz served as vice president for research and economic development at Mississippi State University. He has also served on the faculty at Michigan Technological University and the University of North Dakota.

The president is one of the most active college presidents nationally to use Twit-

Schulz is active in several professional societies including the American Institute for Chemical Engineers and the American Society for Engineering Education. In recognition of achievements in the field of Chemical Engineering, he was selected as a fellow in both the American Society of Engineering Education and the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

He is active in the Boy Scouts of America and served as president of the Coronado Council. In 2013, he was recognized with the Distinguished Eagle Scout Award from the National Eagle Scout Association. Schulz also served various roles on the boards of Cereal Food Processors, the Greater Manhattan Community Foundation, the Kansas Bioscience Authority, and the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology.

He is married to Dr. Noel Nunnally Schulz, who serves as a professor in the Voiland College of Engineering and Architecture, Washington State University. Prior to her arrival at WSU, Dr. Schulz served as the associate dean for research and graduate programs in the College of Engineering and the Paslay Professor of Electrical Engineering at Kansas State University.

They have two sons, Tim and Andrew.

Director of Athletics

Patrick Chun was officially named Washington State's Director of Athletics on Jan. 21. He became the 14th individual to lead Cougar athletics in school history and the first Asian-American athletic director to lead a Power 5 school. He has spent the past five and a half years leading Florida Atlantic University athletics and the previous 15 years at Ohio State University in a multitude of roles from 1997 through 2012, culminating as the executive associate athletics director.

During his time at Florida Atlantic University athletics, Chun guided the Owls to unprecedented successes across academics, athletics, student-athlete development and fundraising. His top priority upon arriving at FAU was academics, which saw tremendous growth. Entering the 2017-18 academic year, FAU student-athletes have posted a combined GPA above 3.0 for each of the past four semesters, a first in school history. School records were also posted for Graduate Success Rate (GSR) and Academic Progress Rate (APR) in 2016-17.

Chun's focus on the complete student-athlete is highlighted by the 2016 National Association of Academic Advisors (N4A) Model Practices Award, awarded to FAU for displaying best practices in their programming for student-athletes. FAU was honored for its work with the football program. Along with the academic improvement, the FAU athletics department developed a comprehensive life skills program, featuring career services and a speakers program, as well as a concerted effort to provide community service to the South Florida area.

Under Chun's leadership, FAU athletics rose to some of its greatest heights, winning multiple championships, individual and team, and numerous national and conference awards. Owls' football won its final 10 games of 2017 to finish 11-3 with a bowl victory over Akron while receiving votes in the final national poll. Entering the 2017-18 academic year, FAU athletics posted an overall winning record the previous three years while women's volleyball, women's soccer, beach volleyball, men's tennis, women's tennis, baseball and softball have either won conference championships, been ranked highest in school history or finished with winning seasons. The men's and women's diving teams, women's track and field and cross country programs produced conference champions along with all-conference honorees.

Chun has earned a reputation as an outstanding fundraiser with record successes at two institutions. At FAU, December 2, 2015, the university announced the largest single gift in its history, \$16 million from the Schmidt Family Foundation. The lead gift is directed to the design and construction of a new athletics facility to be named the Schmidt Family Complex for Academic and Athletic Excellence. In addition to the naming rights gift, two separate \$5 million naming gifts were included in the project for a sports medicine center and academic center. Construction began in the fall of 2017.

Additional facility improvements at FAU during Chun's time included the opening of the \$800,000 FAU Tennis Complex, the addition of sand volleyball courts for the beach volleyball program and last fall the FAU Varsity Soccer Field opened following renovations and enhancements.

Revenue generation has been at the forefront of initiatives for Chun. In August of 2013, FAU agreed to a 10-year agreement with Learfield Sports as its exclusive corporate sponsorship sales unit. The partnership

is expected to generate \$25 million in revenues over the life of the agreement. In 2015, FAU extended its agreement with Adidas for \$1.2 million.

On a national level, Chun currently serves on the NCAA Baseball Rules Committee. He also was named to the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) executive committee in 2016. Chun completed a three-year term on the NCAA Division I Baseball Committee from 2013-16. He also serves as a mentor in the NCAA Pathways program. Chun had previously served on the executive committee for the National Association for Athletics Development Directors (NAADD) and was a longtime board member for the Columbus, Ohio chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. In 2011, Chun was selected for the inaugural class of the Division 1A Athletics Directors Association Fellowship Program.

Prior to FAU, Chun spent 15 years at Ohio State University working at his alma mater. During his tenure, he was promoted six times in the Department of Athletics, ultimately elevating to Executive Associate Athletics Director for External Relations. In his last role at Ohio State, Chun provided leadership and oversight for all facets of the external relations division from 2009-12. In the four years of overseeing the external relations division, Chun oversaw record fundraising years of \$42 million in 2012, \$41 million in 2011, and \$39 million in 2010. Chun also was a lead member of the athletics department senior team that authored the then-largest multimedia rights deal in intercollegiate athletics history: a 10-year, \$128 million partnership with IMG College in 2009. Chun also served as the daily administrative liaison with the football program.

A native of Strongsville, Ohio, Chun earned a bachelor's degree from Ohio State University and a master's degree from Duquesne University. He and his wife, Natalie, also an OSU alumna, have three daughters (Vanna, Kennedy and Gretta) who enjoy their dog (Little Brother).



## Anne McCoy

### Deputy Director of Athletics / SWA

Veteran intercollegiate athletics administrator Anne McCoy has served Washington State University since 2001 and was promoted from associate director to senior associate director of athletics in 2004. Her appointment to senior woman administrator came in the summer of 2007 and in 2013 she was named deputy director of athletics.

In her current capacity she is charged with supervising all aspects of WSU's day-to-day operations along with several areas within the department, including human resources, equipment and computer operations. She also oversees 13 of WSU's 17 athletic programs.

McCoy currently serves as the liaison to the Pac-12 Women's Soccer Coaches and is on the Legislative Committee for the Pac-12. She recently completed positions on several conference committees, including Vice President of the Executive Committee, Women's Basketball Tournament and the Diversity Leadership Initiative. She is the past chair of the NCAA Women's Rowing Committee and is a past vice president of the Pac-10 Conference.

A Wisconsin native, McCoy earned a bachelor's degree in sports management in 1989 from the University of Massachusetts. While an undergraduate, she worked for the Pittsburgh Penguins professional hockey organization, expanding the club's season ticket base. McCoy also served an internship as the assistant athletic business manager at the University of Connecticut, and was instrumental in designing and implementing a comprehensive computerized budget-tracking system.

McCoy served in several capacities at the University of Maine from 1989-1995, lastly as associate director of athletics and senior woman administrator. At Maine, she supervised men's basketball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's swimming and softball in addition to the athletic business office, ticket office, retail store and cheerleading staff and operations. She took a similar administrative position at St. Louis University from 1995-96.

In 1996, McCoy joined the staff at Portland State University as associate director of athletics and senior woman administrator, and was promoted to senior associate director of athletics in 1998. ## John JOHNSON

### Senior Associate Director of Athletics

John Johnson recently served as the Cougars' Interim Director of Athletics following the departure of Bill Moos, assuming the interim role October 18, 2017 before Patrick Chun was hired in late January of 2018.

No stranger to the Pacific-Northwest, Johnson has been a long-time administrator at Washington State, beginning in 2004 when he arrived as the senior associate athletic director. From 2004-10 Johnson worked alongside athletic director Jim Sterk, Johnson had oversight for WSU's athletic foundation, now known as the Cougar Athletic Fund, as well as external operations, including sponsorships, marketing, ticket sales, radio and television revenues and communications. He played a major role in fundraising and management of multiple facility projects, including the

Phase I renovation of Martin Stadium, the baseball indoor hitting and pitching facility, the Simmelink Indoor Tennis Courts renovation and the Tom and Barbara Wilson Indoor Rowing facility. He managed the design and construction of the Martin Stadium Renovation, the \$120 million project included the construction of a new press box, club seating and suite areas. The renovation also included the construction of the Cougar Football Complex operations building. Additional facility projects he has oversight on in the past seven years include the renovation of the Lower Soccer Field, the Moobery Track and Field Complex just prior to the 2013 Pac-12 Championships, the indoor hitting facility for men's and women's golf, the video board at Beasley Coliseum, and renovating the men's and women's basketball lockerrooms.

Johnson arrived at WSU after serving as the director of athletics at Weber State from 1997-2004. While at Weber State, Johnson oversaw all aspects of the intercollegiate athletics program. He was responsible for the upgrading of the university's facilities, including the construction of the Stewart Stadium Sky-Suites/ Press Box facility, which was completed in September of 2001. Johnson drew substantial financial support for the Weber State athletic programs through a 70 percent increase in corporate sponsorships and a 50 percent increase in annual giving. He also secured the first \$1 million-plus gift in department history.

Johnson arrived at Weber State after serving as the director of athletics at Eastern Washington University from 1993-97. While at Eastern, Johnson was responsible for the general administration and management of 15 sport programs, staff and support personnel. Johnson served as President of the NCAA Division I-AA Athletic Director's Association for the 2000-01 year. At the 2001 NACDA Convention held in Salt Lake City, Johnson was honored as the Division I-AA West Region Athletic Director of the Year. He also served on the NCAA Championship and Competition Cabinet, and served on the NCAA Division I Football Executive Committee, the National Football Foundation Executive Committee, and the NCAA Division I-AA Football Championship Committee.

A 1982 graduate of EWU with a bachelor's degree in business, and later earning a master's in business from EWU in 1984. A graduate of East Valley High School in Spokane Valley, he later was a football student-athlete at Montana State and Eastern Washington. Johnson and his wife, Lisa, have two children: daughter, Ellie, and son, Cooper.
