>> The 13th-ranked Washington State men's cross country team, and women's cross country team will compete for the second time this season, at their home course at the Colfax Golf Club in Colfax in the Cougar Classic Friday, Sept. 14.

>> The men's 8,000m race will begin at 5:15 p.m., followed by the women's 6,000m race at 6 p.m. The meet marks the first time the Cougars will face outside competition in 2018 teams as they host; Eastern Washington, Gonzaga, Idaho, Lewis-Clark State, Pepperdine, Portland State and Walla Walla >> The Colfax Golf Club will also be the site of the 2019 NCAA West Region Cross Country Championships, and the 2015 Pac-12 Cross Country Championships.

COUGARS IN THE RANKINGS:

>> The Washington State men's cross country team came in at No. 13 ranking in the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) week one poll, while holding down a number four spot in the most recent west regional rankings.
