

WASHINGTON STATE VOLLEYBALL

THREE CONSECUTIVE NCAA TOURNAMENT SECOND ROUND APPEARANCES

2018 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- >> Washington State is one of only 17 programs (15 from Power 5 schools) in the nation to advance to at least the NCAA Second Round in 3 consecutive seasons (2016, 2017, 2018) along with: Nebraska, Penn State, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Purdue, Stanford, Washington, Oregon, Texas, Baylor, Florida, Kentucky, Missouri, Pittsburgh, BYU and Creighton.
- >> WSU's 23 wins is most in a season since 2002, and is 4th-most in WSU history. Head Coach Jen Greeny was part of three of the four seasons with more wins than 2018: as a player in 1996 (27 wins) and 1997 (26 wins), and as an assistant coach in 2002 (24 wins).
- >> WSU broke the 16-year old school record for single-season points (2,236.5), the most points recorded in a single season since 2002 (2,232.5)...The 2018 squad totaled less kills, but more service aces, solo blocks, and block assists in setting a new top mark.
- >> This was the third consecutive appearance for WSU at the NCAA Championship Tournament under eighth year WSU Head Coach Jen Greeny. It is also the third time the Cougars advanced to the Second Round, and for the second consecutive year falling to the eventual National Champion.
- >> This was the 13th overall trip to the NCAA Tournament for the WSU volleyball program. Coach Jen Greeny has now been a part of nine total tournament appearances for WSU: playing for the Cougars in the NCAA Tournament (1995, '96, '97), was an assistant coach for WSU's appearances in 2000, '01 and '02, and as a head coach in 2016, '17, and '18.
- >> WSU had not swept a weekend series over USC, and UCLA since 1997, defeating the then No. 7 Trojans 3-2, and beating the No. 18 Bruins 3-1. The last time the Cougars had swept UCLA 3-0, was in 1996 on the road in Los Angeles, and was the first time sweeping the Bruins inside of Bohler Gym.
- >> WSU finished 2018 ranked No. 16 in the nation, the highest final ranking for the Cougars since 2002, in the history of the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll. WSU has 10 Top 25 finishes which is tied for 28th-best in NCAA DI history alongside Arizona State, Michigan State, and Cal Poly.
