MATCH PREVIEW

- >> Washington State will begin the 2019 season facing James Madison in the first match-up ever between the two programs.
- >> The Cougars currently hold a 2-0 all-time advantage over the Iowa Hawkeyes, last meeting in 1996, where WSU defeated Iowa 3-0 in the Iowa State Tournament.
- >> WSU will see a familiar face in Stony Brook in the final match of this season opening tournament, having swept the Seawolves 3-0 last season in the Cougar Challenge.

QUICK NOTES

NATIONAL PRESEASON RANKINGS

The Cougars will begin the year ranked No. 22 overall by the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) in the annual preseason rankings, looking to make a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance after hosting a year ago. The RichKern Poll sees WSU in the Top 25 as well, ranked No. 24, and the Pablo Rankings posted the Cougars at No. 14 overall in the country to begin 2019 as well.

BIG THREE

WSU will welcome back a handful of letter winners, five total, and those will are looking to make the biggest impact are the three seniors in Jocelyn Urias, Alexis Dirige, and Ashley Brown. All were starters a season ago during the Cougars' Sweet Sixteen run, Urias anchoring down the middle blocker position, Dirige commanding the defense at libero, and Brown directing the offense at setter. Jocelyn is coming off a steller 2018 season, being named to the AVCA All-American Honorable Mention team, along with earning All-Pac-12 honorable mention honors as well. Ashley was also named to the All-Pac-12 honorable mention team last year, and Alexis continues to climb the all-time WSU Volleyball career leaderboard in total digs, sitting at third all-time.

WSU PICKED EIGHTH IN PRESEASON PAC-12 POLL

The Washington State volleyball team has been selected to finish eighth in the preseason Pac-12 coaches poll as announced by the conference office. The Cougars will see four key returners in seniors Jocelyn Urias, Alexis Dirige, and Ashley Brown, along with junior Penny Tusa, all who helped see WSU advance to the Sweet Sixteen a season ago. Washington State Volleyball will welcome seven new student-athletes to the squad in 2019 as well.



WOODFORD TO SWEDEN TO BEGIN PRO CAREER

Washington State Volleyball All-American McKenna Woodford signed her first professional volleyball contract with Engelholms Volleyball (EVS) of Ängelholm, Sweden. The former WSU standout from Chandler, Arizona made an immediate impact for the Cougars during her debut season as a freshman, earning Pac-12 All-Freshman First Team honors, along with two Pac-12 Freshman of the Week selections. Woodford continued to ride that momentum throughout the rest of her WSU career, making contributions both on and off the court. McKenna finished her illustrious four-year career at WSU, finishing eighth overall in all-time kills with 1,257, eighth in kills per set at 2.95, and fourth overall in total points at 1,445.5. During her senior season, where she helped lead the Cougars to a NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance, Woodford earned AVCA All-American Honorable Mention honors, along with an AVCA Pacific North All-Region selection as well.

WSU TO BE BROADCAST LIVE ON PAC-12 NETWORKS FOR 12 MATCHES

The Washington State University volleyball program finalized the 2019 schedule and the Cougars will have 12 matches televised this fall, the Pac-12 Networks announced Monday. WSU's non-conference schedule includes one team that played in the 2018 NCAA Championship in Stony Brook. Before the Pac-12 Conference action begins, the Cougars meet three teams with RPIs in the top 75 nationally from a season ago. Five total non-conference opponents finished 2018 with RPIs in the top 100 as well.

Greeny led Washington State to their third consecutive NCAA Championship Tournament appearance, where the Cougars advanced to the Sweet Sixteen for the first time since 2002. WSU earned the No. 16 overall seed in the tournament as well, which saw the Cougars host the opening two rounds of play inside Bohler Gym. Washington State defeated defending Big Sky Champions Northern Arizona, and the University of Tennessee, each in four sets to continue on into the regional round. The Cougars ultimately fell to No. 1 overall seed and the 2018 NCAA National Champions, Stanford Cardinal inside Maples Pavilion in the Sweet Sixteen.

The 2018 season saw Washington State Volleyball receive numerous awards upon the conclusion of the regular season, as three student-athletes, Taylor Mims, McKenna Woodford, and Jocelyn Urias were all selected as AVCA All-Americans. Associate Head Coach Burdette Greeny was named the Division I AVCA Assistant Coach of the Year to continue the recognition of WSU. Finally the Cougars earned four All-Pac-12 selections, three AVCA All-Region picks, six Pac-12 All-Academic selections, along with Woodford being named to the 2018 Google Cloud Academic All-District® 8 team.

Jennifer Stinson was a stellar multi-sport athlete at Davenport (Wash.) High. At WSU she became the seventh player in WSU history with 1,000 career kills. A three-time All-Pacific-10 Conference selection, Greeny's statistics are prominent in WSU's all-time career lists ranking fourth in block assists (360), fourth in total blocks (419), and sixth in solo blocks (59). She trained with the 1997 U.S. National volleyball team.

Greeny also excelled in the classroom where she was WSU's Athlete of the Year in 1998-99. She was a CoSIDA District VIII Academic All-America first-team and second-team selection her final two years and was a Pac-10 Volleyball All-Academic selection three times. She received her bachelor's degree in education from WSU in 1999.

Greeny spent four and one-half years on WSU Head Coach Cindy Fredrick's volleyball coaching staff. At the time of her departure, Greeny had been involved in seven of the 11 seasons Cougar volleyball qualified for postseason action, three as a player, three as an assistant coach and once as head coach. During her playing career, WSU was ranked as high as fifth in the country and made the Elite Eight of the NCAA Championship Tournament. Greeny was instrumental in WSU's second and only other appearance in the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament, in 2002, this time as an assistant coach.

Greeny has coached or played in nine of WSU's 13 NCAA Championship tournament appearances.

Junior Taylor Mims embraced the position move from middle blocker to outside hitter and had the sixth-best offensive output (4.17 kills per set and 4.75 points per set) in the Pac-12, and her 599 points was 12th-best in the NCAA. Mims was accorded All-Pac-12 First Team honors as well as named to the All-America honorable mention teams for PrepVolleyball.com and VolleyballMag.com.

Great blocking was another key to the Cougars' success in 2017 as WSU was sixth-best nationally with 364.5 total blocks and 11th in team blocks per set at 2.89. Redshirt sophomore Jocelyn Urias and juniors Ella Lajos and Claire Martin provided the most stops at the net while sophomore libero Alexis Dirige became the 11th player in school history to reach 1,000 digs and did it in the fewest number of sets.

The Fall of 2016 was the most successful season for the WSU volleyball program since 2002. The Cougars tallied a 22-12 overall record and an 11-9 record for fifth place in the highly-competitive Pac-12 Conference after a preseason coaches' poll predicted a ninth-place finish. Seeing her success

throughout the season, Greeny's fellow conference coaches voted her the 2016 Pac-12 Coach of the Year. WSU made history in 2016 with a trio of consecutive wins over AVCA Top 10 nationally-ranked teams in 10 days: at No. 4 Washington Sept. 21, at No. 9 UCLA Sept. 23 and versus No. 9 Stanford Sept. 30.



The Cougars earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Championship

tournament for the first time in seven years and won a First Round match for the first time in 14 seasons. This season's 22 wins is tied for fifth-most in WSU volleyball program history and under Greeny's leadership, WSU has produced the best three season win-totals in the last 14 years with 18 wins in 2013, 16 wins in 2015 and 22 wins in 2016. Greeny's WSU teams have posted a 62-11 non-conference record during her six years as head coach. The Cougars compete in the country's strongest volleyball conference, the Pac-12, where for the last 17 consecutive seasons the conference has had six or more teams advance to the NCAA Championship tournament including the record of 10 teams in 2014.

The Cougars led the country in total blocks in 2016 and was third-best nationally for blocks per set (3.23 bps) with sophomore middle blockers Taylor Mims and Claire Martin producing outstanding statistics. Mims was third-best nationally in total blocks (191) and eighth-best in blocks per set (1.49 bps) while Martin was 24th-best in total blocks (156) and 16th-best in blocks per set (1.41bps). Mims and WSU junior outside hitter Casey Schoenlein were named to the 2016 All-Pac-12 honorable mention team.

Greeny and her staff have tirelessly worked to return the Cougars volleyball program back to the national prominence it received when Greeny was a player and an assistant coach. To that end, the Cougars ranked No. 17 in recruiting class rankings from 2013-15 according to PrepVolleyball.com, which includes two classes ranked among the Top 21: No. 14 in 2013, and No. 21 in 2015, with the 2014 class garnering honorable mention accolades. Among the WSU recruits are six PrepVolleyball.com Top 100 players and two Gatorade State Players of the Year. Greeny credits her husband and lead recruiter, assistant coach Burdette Greeny, with achieving these fine recruiting classes.

Greeny has also changed the academic culture of the program with 12 semesters of a team grade point average of 3.0 or better.

WSU Associate Head Coach Burdette Greeny brings a driven competitive nature and a dynamic intensity as both a coach and the lead recruiter to the Cougars volleyball program.

Greeny just completed his eighth season with the Cougars and was instrumental in WSU's back-to-back-to-back NCAA Championships tournament Second Round appearances, with the most recent trip seeing the Cougars into the Sweet Sixteen. He joined the Cougar volleyball program in March 2011 as an assistant coach and was promoted to Associate Head Coach in February 2017. Greeny was named the 2018 AVCA National Assistant Coach of the Year as well after the tremendous year by the Cougars.

Greeny's recruiting prowess is evident in the PrepVolleyball.com's national rankings. WSU is one of only 15 programs in the nation to have two Top 25 and one Honorable Mention recruiting class between 2013 and 2015. The 2013 and 2015 recruiting classes are two of the highest-ranked recruiting classes ever in any sport at WSU. Among Greeny's WSU recruits are six PrepVolleyball.com Top 100 players and two Gatorade State Players of the Year.

Burdette Greeny assisted his wife Jen at Lewis-Clark State College from 2007-10. He was an assistant coach for three seasons and one of 20 assistant coaches nominated for the 2009 NAIA National Assistant Coach of the Year Award. He was promoted to Associate Head Coach at LCSC in 2010. Greeny's recruiting resume at LCSC included three Junior College First Team All-Americans, one Junior College Second Team All-American, one Gatorade State Player of the Year, two state players of the year, and 12 first team all-state selections. In four years, 37 LCSC players were named to the conference all-academic teams and seven players were selected as NAIA Volleyball National Scholar-Athletes.

Greeny was an all-league selection in both basketball and baseball at Port Angeles (Wash.) High School. He was named one of the top ten pitchers in the state by Tacoma News Tribune (1993), drafted by the New York Mets but instead played basketball and baseball at Tacoma Community College (1993-95). He earned second-team All-West Region honors both years as a third baseman and set a school record for striking out 17 batters in a game. He pitched for WSU in 1997, winning the team's award for strength and conditioning. He signed as a free agent with the Milwaukee Brewers before the 1998 draft and was with the organization for two seasons.

Burdette and Jen Greeny were honored in 2015 with a City of Pullman Chamber of Commerce Walk of Fame plaque. They have two daughters, Lauren and Leah.

Shannon Wyckoff Hunt has made significant contributions to the success of the WSU volleyball program through her ability to hone the skills and techniques of the Cougars defense as well as her keen analysis of the nationally-ranked opponents.

Hunt was an outstanding student and athlete at WSU from 1994 through 1997, and a teammate of Greeny. During Hunt's collegiate career the Cougars volleyball team played all four years in the NCAA Championship Tournament and advanced to the Elite Eight once and to the Sweet Sixteen once.

She was the first Washington State player to reach 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs in a career. Her 1,254 career digs was the WSU all-time list leader from 1997 until 2008 and is currently second-best all-time. Hunt tallied 1,051 career kills which was fifth-best at the time and now ranks ninth-highest in school history. In addition, her career 83 service aces total is ranked 11th-best at WSU.

Hunt competed at Prairie High near Vancouver, Wash., and was the state volleyball Player of the Year three consecutive years - twice in AA and once in AAA. She was the first four-time all-league selection in the history of the Greater St. Helens League. The Falcons' volleyball team finished fourth three times in the state championships. Her senior year Prairie also won the state AAA Academic title. Hunt was a starter on the Nike Northwest Juniors Club team all five years she played.

At Washington State, Hunt started on the left side as a freshman and missed only six matches in the starting lineup, due to injury, during her four-year career. As a sophomore Hunt's 376 digs led team and 3.72 digs per game was third-best in conference. She set a school record with 32 digs in a match at South Florida in 1995. She was named to two all-tournament teams as a junior and was an important cog in the Cougars' advancing to the NCAA Championships Elite Eight. As a senior, Hunt continued amassing kills and digs as an outside hitter, earned two more all-tournament honors, and helped lead the Cougars to the Sweet Sixteen at the NCAA Championships.

Hunt moved to the newly constructed Hockinson High School, also in Brush Prairie, Wash., where she was the head volleyball coach from 2004 through 2010. At Hockinson, Hunt led two Hawks' volleyball teams to state championship tournaments and had five players play collegiately after their prep volleyball careers.

Hunt lives in Pullman with her husband Joe, and their sons Grayson and Austin.


