OPENING XI

- > Washington State enters the day 3-0-0 on the year after posting wins over Montana (6-0) and JMU (6-3) last weekend at Lower Soccer Field.
- > With the win over JMU the Cougs are 14-0-1 since their last non-conference loss on Aug. 27, 2017.
- > WSU will face renew its regional rivalry with Gonzaga Thursday after a two-year hiatus. WSU has dominated all-time 23-1-1, however the last match went to the Zags, 1-0, in Spokane.
- > All-time WSU has posted 299 (299-228-59) victories with #300 on the horizon.
- > The 12 goals over the weekend were the most scored in back-to-back contests since a 13-goal weekend, Sept. 22-24, 2000 when WSU defeated Gonzaga (4-1) and Portland State (9-0) at Lower Soccer Field.
- > The Cougars enter the week ranked #17 United Soccer Coaches Poll. In the two other major polls WSU sits at #10 by TopDrawerSoccer.com and #20 by SoccerAmerica.
- > WSU enters the week the #1 ranked scoring offense in the country at 5.33 goals per game. The 16 goals in three games is the second most all-time to start a season (WSU scored 17 in three games to start the 1991 season, they would score 18 in four games)
- > Nine different Cougars have scored on the year with Morgan Weaver and Averie Collins leading the way with three each.
- > Morgan Weaver, named to the MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List to start the year, is fourth alltime in program history in scoring with 31 goals and fifth in points with 70.
- > Brianna Alger is 3rd in the nation in assists per game at 1.33 (4 total). WSU is #1 overall in assists per contest at 5.67 (17 total).
- > Ella Dederick earned her 40th career victory Friday, four shy of tying the all-time record of 44 held by Gurveen Clair (2011-14)

COUGAR NOTES

LAST TIME OUT

In their first two home games of the new season the Cougars dominated the pitch outscoring Montana and JMU a combined 12-3 to improve to 3-0-0 on the year. The six goals against Montana were the most scored in a game since 2012 a feat they would repeat two days later against JMU. Even more impressive, the Cougs scored their six against the Dukes in the first half, the most in a single half since scoring seven against Montana in 2002. Seven different Cougs got into the action over the weekend while Morgan Weaver, MacKenzie Frimpong-Ellertson, and Averie Collins each netted a pair of strikes.

NON-CONFERENCE DOMINANCE

In their evolution into one of the elite teams in the country, the Cougars have proven to be nearly unbeatable outside of the Pac-12. In 2018, WSU went a perfect 7-0 in non-conference play en route to a 10-0 start. In all, the Cougars have not dropped a non-conference match since Aug. 27, 2017 at Santa Clara. WSU has not dropped a home non-conference contest since Aug. 19, 2016 to BYU.

With the win vs Montana the Cougs are 14-0-1 since their last non-conference loss.

THE GREATEST SHOW ON "TURF"

In just three games the 2019 Cougars have proven to have one of the most potent offenses in the country as WSU enters the week #1 in scoring offense at 5.33 goals per game. Using a wide ranging attack, the Cougars have had nine different players hit the back of the net to score their 16 goals (one own goal). The Cougs have scored in myriad of ways scoring five off of corners, four in open play, three on crosses, and three from the spot. With all the goals being scored it's no surprise the Cougs are #1 in assists per game at 5.66 (17 total) led by Brianna Algers' four, all of which have come off of corners.

COUGARS BACK AND BETTER THAN EVER

Despite the loss of a few key players from last season, the 2019 Cougars are back and better than ever as eight of 11 starters returned headlined by all-region honoree Morgan Weaver up top and goalkeeper Ella Dederick between the posts. The two captains lead a stacked team of veteran players who have advanced to the second-round of the NCAA Tournament in each of the last two seasons. In addition, the Cougars returned 29 goals (70% of their scoring) from 2018.

The vets have contributed 9 goals and 12 assists in three games so far.

FRESH FACES READY TO CONTRIBUTE

While the Cougs enter the year with established veterans at every position WSU also welcomes in 10 new faces that have already made an immediate impact. The most experienced newcomer to the Cougars is graduate-transfer Averie Collins who came to the Palouse after graduating from Stanford. Collins won a national title with the Cardinal and finished her Stanford career with 10 goals, five assists, and 25 points. In addition to Collins, freshman MacKenzie Frimpong-Ellertson earned a spot among the starters while eight of the nine freshmen have seen solid time on the pitch.

Collins enters the week tied for the team lead with 3 goals while Frimpong-Ellertson has netted two. Each have added an assist. Freshman Skye McMillon got on the scoreboard in her first appearance in the season opener against Seattle U.

WEAVER ONE TO WATCH

Coming off of a career year, senior Morgan Weaver put her name among the best in the nation as the Washington State star was named to the watch list for the Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy. Weaver became the first Cougar in program history to be named to the preseason watch list. The MAC Hermann Trophy is the most prestigious award in collegiate soccer and is awarded to United Soccer Coaches National Player of the Year in NCAA Division I soccer.

Weaver has scored 3 goals and posted 1 assist in 3 games.

OFFENSIVE DEPTH TAKES CENTER STAGE

Three-deep at every position it is no surprise that the overall depth has shown through as the Cougars' have 9 different goal scorers accounting for 16 goals. The Cougs also have three different game-winners on the year in three games.

In addition, five of the nine scorers have been first time scorers (including grad-transfer Averie Collins scoring her first goal at WSU).

SCORING EARLY AND OFTEN

Sporting the nation's #1 offense the Cougars have pounced on their opponents early to put the game away. Entering the game WSU has scored 11 of its 16 goals in the first 45' of the contest including posting a six spot in the first half against JMU.

Even more impressively, the Cougars have scored 7 goals in the first 20' and 3 inside the first 10' of action. The blitzkrieg offense was optimized against JMU when Makamae Gomera-Stevens scored the fastest goal in program history as the junior netted the opening strike just :21 seconds into the contest.

WSU RANKED #17/#10/#20

Entering the week the Cougars are among the elite as WSU comes in ranked #17 in the country as per the United Soccer Coaches (USC) poll. In the other two major polls the Cougs look even better as they come in #10 in the nation in the TopDrawerSoccer.com poll and #20 by SoccerAmerica.

Last season the Cougs climbed as high as #7 in the USC poll and #5 in TDS and SA polls after beginning the year a perfect 10-0-0. The top-10 rankings marked the highest rankings in program history for WSU.

ALGER'S ASSISTS

Taking over the role of starting left back and primary distributor for the Cougars, junior Brianna Alger wasted no time jumping in with both feet as she picked up a pair of assists on the first two goals of the season. She added an assist in each game at home to run her streak to three-straight games, tying the longest streak in program history.

Her 4 total assists is second in the Pac-12 while her 1.33 per game ranks first and third nationally. She earned Pac-12 DPOW honors for her play.

Alger, playing in the back for the first time in her career, is looking to replicate the play of all-region honoree Maddy Haro, who finished 2018 second in the nation with a program record 15 assists. For comparison sake, Haro also earned the first Pac-12 DPOW of the season and assisted on four goals in the first three contests.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

Taking care of business at home all season long, the Cougs came up with a program record 10 wins at Lower Soccer Field in 2018. The previous record for WSU was eight, done three times prior. Overall, the Cougs went 10-1-1 at home for an .875 win percentage, tied for the third-best percentage in WSU history. The only teams to get past the Cougars at home last year were #2 USC (3-2) and #1 Stanford (1-1 Draw, 20T).

In addition to the wins, the Cougs outscored their opponents 33-12 at home scoring 80% of their goals at Lower Soccer

In 2019 the Cougars are 2-0-0 and hold a 12-3 scoring advantage.

All-time, WSU is 153-77-24 at home.

WEAVER LEADS THE WAY, CLIMBING THE RECORD BOOKS

Star senior forward Morgan Weaver proved once again to be one of the best players in the country in 2018 after posting a career-best 13 goals, tying for the lead in the Pac-12 in the regular season. Her 13 goals ranked tied for fourth all-time in WSU single season history and finished No. 20 in the country overall.

Weaver ended her junior year on a tear, scoring six goals in the final five games including goals against #1 Stanford and a hat-trick against rival Washington to end the regular season.

With 3 goals, Weaver now has 31 career goals and ranks fourth all-time in program history. The all-time record for goals sits at 83, held by hall-of-famer Kim Lynass (1990-93). Deka DeWitt's (1997-2000) second place mark of 40 is well within reach of Weaver in her final season on the Palouse.

DEDERICK, BACK WITH HER SIGHTS SET ON THE RECORD BOOK

After missing most of the 2018 season due to injury, star keeper Ella Dederick is back and ready to take her place as the best goalkeeper to ever don the Crimson and Gray. The sixth-year senior was granted an extra year of eligibility for 2019. She was 5-0 with 2.5 shutouts before injury.

Three games into the season Dederick is 3-0 with 1.5 shutouts and a 0.47 GAA.

Career Ranking - Wins (2nd, 40), Win percentage (T4th, 0.623), saves (5th, 237), goals against average (2nd, 0.86), minutes in goal (3rd, 6266:25), shutouts (T2nd, 21).

ALGER NAMED PAC-12'S BEST IN WEEK 1

For the first time in her career, junior Brianna Alger was named the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week as announced by the conference office. The award for Alger was the first of the season for the Cougars and picked up where WSU left off a season ago after the team captured a conference-best nine weekly awards, including four on the defensive side, throughout the year. The junior not only led WSU to the shutout of Seattle U but assisted on the opening two goals of the 4-0 route to open the 2019 season.

SOCCER SELECTED FOURTH BY PAC-12 COACHES

Coming off one of their most successful seasons in program history, the Washington State soccer team caught the attention of the coaches in the Pac-12 Conference as the Cougars were picked to finish fourth in the preseason coaches poll as announced by the conference office. The fourth place pick marks the highest preseason ranking for the Cougars in the preseason poll. Stanford, the four-time defending conference champions, were picked to take the title for a record fifth-consecutive season after receiving seven first-place votes. UCLA came in just behind the Cardinal in the poll after picking up the remaining five first-place votes.

WAZZU IN 2018

The Cougs finished the regular season 12-5-1 and eventually finished 13-6-1 overall including a big win over then #8 UCLA, 1-0, and a draw against #1 Stanford, 1-1. The record for WSU was bolstered by a program record start that saw the Cougs go 10-0, rocketing up the rankings to an all-time high of #7 before injuries and bad luck caused the team to stumble. After getting back on track the Cougs earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament where they would rout Montana, 5-1, at home in the first round. The season would come to an end at #2 Georgetown a week later as the Hoyas took a 1-0 win in the second round to knock the Cougs out of the postseason. The 13 wins on the year for the Cougs marked the third-most wins in a single season for WSU. The second round appearance marked the first time in program history WSU won its first round game in back-to-back seasons.

Overall, four Cougs earned all-conference honors led by first teamer Morgan Weaver who also earned first team allregion honors. Senior Maddy Haro ended her career with second team all-conference and all-region honors while senior Maegan O'Neill saw her injury shortened season finish with a third team award. Freshman Mykiaa Minniss earned all-freshman honors.

COUGS POSTSEASON RUN

The Cougs made a postseason push to the second round for the second-straight season (in 2017 WSU made the third round) as an at-large bid out of the Pac-12. The success in the regular season earned the Cougars a home game in the first round, dismantling Montana 5-1 at Lower Soccer Field on Nov. 9 to earn a trip to the Nation's Capital for a game against one-seed Georgetown. While the Hoyas would prevail in a close 1-0 contest the Cougs run in the postseason was historic as it marked just the first time in program history WSU won first round games in back-to-back seasons. The win in the first round was the fifth-time the Cougars moved on to round two in 12 NCAA appearances. WSU sports a 4-10-4 record in the NCAA tournament.

WASHINGTON STATE HEAD COACH TODD SHULENBERGER

In just four seasons, coach Shulenberger has reshaped the Cougar program in his image, taking the Cougars among the elite programs in NCAA soccer. In four seasons, the Cougars have won 45 games including a program-record 14 victories in Shulenberger's first season. Shulenberger became the second coach in program history to lead his team out of the first round of the NCAA Tournament in back-to-back season following in the footsteps of Matt Potter who took the Cougs to the second round in 2009 and 2010. In 2017, he became the first coach in WSU history to guide his team to the round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament. In 2018, the Cougars broke a number of program records including beginning the season a perfect 10-0, the best start and longest win-streak in program history. The wins to start the year propelled WSU to a No. 7 ranking in the coaches poll, the highest ranking in the history of Cougar soccer.

By the end of the year, and despite injuries wreaking havoc on the WSU's squad, the Cougars earned a home game in round one of the NCAA Tournament. After posting a 9-1-1 record at home in the regular season, the Cougs would tack on a record 10th home win in the tournament, dismantling Montana, 5-1, to advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second-straight year. In all, WSU finished the 2018 season with 13 wins, one-shy of the program record. On the field, the Cougs play was recognized repeatedly over the year by the Pac-12 with a conference best nine weekly awards, the most of any team in the conference on the season. Junior Morgan Weaver and senior Maddy Haro would earn all-region honors for their play with Weaver taking home first team honors.
