The awards, sponsored by Meijer, Incorporated, are presented after the Fall, Winter and Spring athletic seasons to six male and six female student-athletes that excel both in the classroom and on the fields of play.

The six male student-athletes to receive the Fall 2011 Meijer Commissioner's Awards are: **Josh Renel of Wayne State University**; Tom Schneider of Ferris State; Anthony Witt of Grand Valley State; David Bakker of Hillsdale; Jacob Clark of Michigan Technological University; and Mike Noffsinger of Ohio Dominican University.

The six female student-athletes to receive the Fall 2011 Meijer Commissioner's Awards are: Ashley Huntey and Tina Muir of Ferris State University; Ashley Botts of Grand Valley State University; Clara Leutheuser and Amanda Putt of Hillsdale College; and Michelle Rogers of Tiffin University.

"I admire the dedication and hard work on the field and in the classroom that has been exemplified by the 12 student-athletes who were awarded the Commissioner's Award," stated GLIAC Commissioner Dell Robinson. "This group will serve to be our future leaders of tomorrow. The conference office truly appreciates the continued support that has been provided by Meijer allowing our student-athletes to be recognized regionally and nationally for academic excellence."

Josh Renel (Rochester Hills, Mich./Rochester Adams), a senior on the Wayne State football team, was voted to the All-GLIAC First Team at running back, and to the CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team. He was selected to the Hansen's Football Gazette All-America Third Team as an all-purpose back and earned D2Football.com Honorable Mention All-America honors as an all-purpose back. Renel finished 28th nationally in all-purpose yards per game (146.00), 33rd in kickoff return average (25.61), and 55th in rushing yards per game (84.56). He had at least 120 all-purpose yards in 14 contests. Renel majored in business administration with an emphasis on marketing earning a 3.52 cumulative grade-point average.

Running back Joique Bell became the first former Wayne State University player to participate in the Senior Bowl. In January 2010, he rushed for 17 yards on eight carries, but recorded a first down on three of his rushing attempts.

Four of his carries came on the North's initial drive of the game setting up a field goal.

Last January offensive tackle Joe Long played in the 87th East-West Shrine Game®. The Game was held at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Fla.

Long played both offensive tackle and served as a long snapper in the contest.

In January of 2011, cornerback Stan Thornton played in the Cactus Bowl. He tallied two tackles and a pass break-up as his Red Storm squad recorded a 28-6 triumph over the Blue Devils in the Division II Cactus Bowl.

Thornton had a pass break-up of Hillsdale quarterback Troy Weatherhead's attempt on a third-and-two play on the game's opening drive.

In the Blue Devils' first drive of the second quarter, Thornton tackled a wide receiver for a five-yard gain on a third-and-six play. He also recorded a solo tackle in the fourth quarter.

The Red Storm defense limited the Blue Devils to 4-of-15 on third and fourth down plays during the contest.

Thornton's participation marked the 13th by a Wayne State player in the Division II All-Star game.

The Warriors had two seniors from the 2008 campaign participate in post-season bowl games. Both safety Dante Dunn and linebacker Tristan Black played in the East Coast Bowl, while Dunn also saw action in the 2009 Cactus Bowl.

Dunn was in on three tackles for the North, while Black made two tackles at the East Coast Bowl.

In the Cactus Bowl, Dunn led the East defense with a forced fumble and a fumble recovery and eight tackles, including one for loss.

Running back Craig Duppong participated in the 2003 Whataburger Cactus Bowl held in Kingsville, Texas, on the campus of Texas A&M University-Kingsville.

Duppong led the East squad in rushing with 33 yards on 12 carries. On his first carry of the game, on a fourth-and-one, Duppong gained three yards. His 11-yard run on the first drive of the second half set up the East's squad first points. On a third-and-two rush in the fourth quarter,

Duppong gained three yards and another first down. In overtime, he had a five-yard carry on a second-and-10 that led to an East field goal and a 27-24 lead. The West squad threw a 35-yard touchdown pass on its first play in the extra session for a 30-27 win.

The year before, WSU senior wide receiver Pierre Brown participated in the 2002 Whataburger Cactus Bowl. Brown had four receptions for 42 yards for the East squad.

Formerly known as the Snow Bowl, the Cactus Bowl used an East/West format until the 2011 game with teams comprised of Division II Players.

Huston Julian played in the 2001 Cactus Bowl following the completion of the 2000 season. "This was just an amazing experience," said Julian. "It was nice to put on the pads once again and play the game that I love. There was great support from the community for the game and it was an unbelievable atmosphere to be around. It was nice to be a celebrity for a week."

After the end of the 1997 campaign, Tony Hawk and Derek Lindsay both participated in the 1998 contest. The previous year Ken Johnson was selected, while Gary Ruttan played in the 1996 game. Matt Carey and Joe Gough each participated in the 1995 Snow Bowl.

The inaugural NCAA Division II All-Star game was held on January 6, 1994, at the Fargo Dome in Fargo, North Dakota.

Wayne State linebacker Tom Beer was one of six players selected from the MIFC to participate in the inaugural Snow Bowl.

~~The East Coast Bowl is an annual college All-Star football game played the Saturday following Thanksgiving at Historic Cameron Field in Petersburg, Va.~~

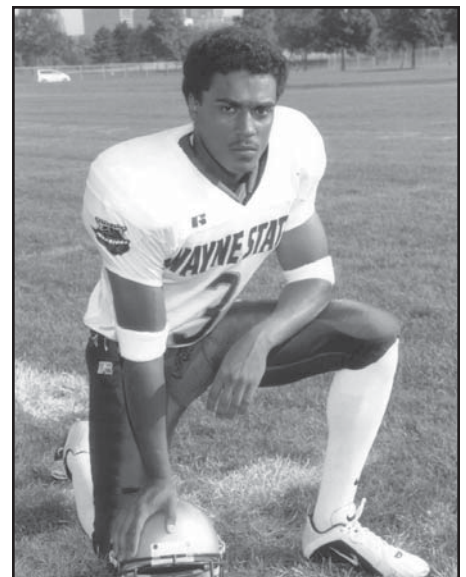

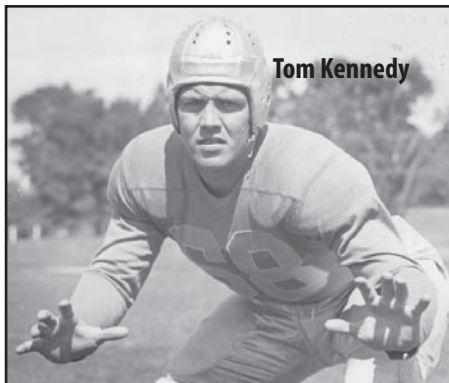


Jeremy Jones during one of his three first half interception returns at Nebraska-Kearney in the second round of the 2011 NCAA playoffs.

The first Tartar ever drafted was George Gembis, who was selected in the 13th round (115th overall) by the Brooklyn Dodgers in 1939.

Valentino "Tino" Sabuco, a 1946 Tartar letterwinner from Detroit MacKenzie H.S., played 10 games in 1949 with San Francisco of the All-American Football Conference as a 6-1, 206-pound center.

Bob Langas, a 6-4, 230-pound defensive end from Detroit Cooley H.S., and a three-year Wayne letterwinner (1949-50-51), played eight games in 1954 with Baltimore and had one kickoff return for 18 yards.

Jack Crittendon, a 6-1, 190-pound offensive end from Ferndale, lettered from 1950-53 at Wayne. He played 10 games with the Chicago Cardinals in 1954 and had five receptions for 48 yards.

Elbert Richmond, a 1950-51-52 Wayne letterwinner, signed with the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1953 and played two exhibition games for the Green Bay Packers.

Walt Jenkins, a 6-1, 223-pound defensive lineman from Detroit Miller H.S., lettered in 1953 and 1954 at Wayne. He was drafted in the ninth round of the 1955 draft by the Detroit Lions (108th overall) and played two games with Detroit in 1955. He then played in the Canadian Football League with the Hamilton Tiger-Cats from 1956 to 1959, playing at both defensive end and offensive guard.

Vic Zucco, a 1953-54 letterwinner at Wayne, was a 6-0, 187-pound defensive back from Pittsburgh. He was drafted in the fifth round in 1957 by the Chicago Bears (60th overall). Zucco played 38 games with the Bears from 1957-60, playing all 12 games in 1957-58-60, and two contests in 1959. He recorded 12 kickoff returns for 384 yards, eight interception returns for 85 yards, 37 punt returns for 176 yards and returned one fumble for a touchdown.

Ben Paolucci, a three-year (1955-56-57) letterwinner at WSU, was a 6-2, 240-pound defensive tackle from Detroit Cass Tech. He was drafted by the Detroit Lions in the ninth round of the 1958 draft (109th overall). Paolucci played four games with Detroit in 1959.

A.J. Vaughn, a 1965-66-67 letterwinner at WSU, was selected in the 12th round by the Atlanta Falcons (302nd overall) in the 1968.

Richard "Dick" Byas, a 5-9, 180-pound defensive back from Detroit MacKenzie H.S., was a three-year letterwinner at WSU (1971-72-73). He played 103 games with the Atlanta Falcons from 1974-80 returning six interceptions for 193 yards, four punts for 30 yards and 23 kickoffs for 519 yards. He scored three touchdowns.

John Sokolosky was a 6-2, 240-pound center from Detroit De La Salle H.S. A four-year letterwinner (1974-75-76-77) at WSU, he played 11 games in 1978 with the Detroit Lions.

Paul Butcher, a 6-0, 230-pound linebacker from Dearborn St. Alphonsus H.S., earned four letters as a Tartar (1982-83-84-85). He played 134 games with the Detroit Lions, Los Angeles Rams, Indianapolis Colts, Carolina Panthers and Oakland Raiders from 1986-96. He was selected as the special teams player for the 1986 All-Madden Team.

Derric Coakley, a 1989 WSU football letterwinner, returned to professional football following a minor league baseball career. He was selected as the 1998 Professional Indoor Football League Defensive Player of the Year while competing for the Green Bay Bombers. He also played with the Peoria Pirates, Pensacola Barracudas (AF2), Winnipeg Blue Bombers (CFL) and the Tennessee Valley Raptors while earning All-League honors five times.

Tom Beer, a 6-1, 237-pound linebacker from Bay Port H.S., was a four-year (1990-93) letterwinner at WSU. He was drafted in the seventh round of the 1994 draft by the Detroit Lions (215th overall). He played in 41 games with the Lions from 1994-96.

Michael Gluski, who lettered four years at WSU (1994-98), played in AF2 for the Cape Fear Wildcats. Gluski's teammate both at WSU (1995-98) and with Cape Fear was Daishawn Franklin.

Pierre Brown, a 1998-2001 WSU letterwinner, signed as a free agent with Detroit in 2002. The 6-1, 180-pound wide receiver from West Bloomfield, had 22 catches for 286 yards and a touchdown in 2003 with the Berlin Thunder of NFL Europe.

Leo Wells, a four-year WSU letterwinner (2002-05), played in 2006 with the Peoria Roughriders of the United Indoor Football League recording eight tackles. He spent the 2007 season with the Kalamazoo Xplosion of the Continental Indoor Football League.

Bobby Boyer, who lettered twice at WSU (2004-05), played in 2006 with the Green Bay Blizzard of AF2 catching 14 passes for 239 yards and two touchdowns. He played in 2007 with the Port Huron Pirates of the CIFL and with the Flint Phantoms in 2008. He had 38 catches for 517 yards and seven touchdowns for the Phantoms.

Lee Butler, a 2004-05 WSU letterwinner, also played with the Peoria Roughriders in 2006 where he had six catches including one for a touchdown. Wes Brown, a 2005-06 WSU letterwinner, played in 2007 with the Kalamazoo Xplosion of the CIFL.

Numerous former WSU players played in the CFL in 2008. Nick Body (2002-06 WSU letterwinner) was selected MVP of the championship game after recording 12 receptions for 156 yards and three touchdowns. During the regular season, Body had 66 catches for a league-leading 849 yards and a CFL best 28 touchdowns. Body's teammate with the Saginaw Sting was Nate Collins, a 2001-02 WSU letterwinner. One of the owners of the squad was Mike Johnson, a WSU tight end from 2000-03.

Other former WSU players competing in the third season of the CFL were Brandon Dinkins (Milwaukee Bonecrushers) and Randy Hutchison (Kalamazoo Xplosion). Dinkins lettered in 2002 for WSU, while Hutchison was a 2001-03 WSU letterwinner.

In 2009, Dante Dunn had a rookie tryout with the Buffalo Bills.

In the summer of 2009, Randy Hutchison and Nick Body played for the Fort Wayne Freedom of the CIFL. Body also played for the Saginaw Sting of the Indoor Football League along with Nate Collins.

Former kicker (2003-04) Greg Gundersen played with the Alabama Vipers and Tulsa Talons of the Arena Football League in 2010 and the Utah Blaze and the Tampa Bay Storm in 2011 connecting on 47-of-59 extra points.

In the spring of 2009, Tristan Black was drafted in the second round

by the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League. Black blocked a punt and had four tackles in his first professional game.

Despite being injured most of 2009, Black recorded eight tackles for the Stampeders. In 2010, he was traded to his hometown Toronto Argonauts and recorded seven tackles and a fumble recovery for the Argos. In 2011, he was awarded the game ball following Toronto's season-opening 23-21 victory at Calgary. Black had 13 tackles and an interception in 2011.

Joique Bell was originally signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills and spent all of the 2010 pre-season with the Bills. He rushed for 152 yards on 27 attempts and two touchdowns in four exhibition games that year for Buffalo. He also had four receptions for 15 yards and two kickoff returns for 34 yards.

After spending the first two weeks of the NFL regular-season on Buffalo's practice squad, Bell was signed by the Eagles on Sept. 21 and made his NFL regular-season debut in Philadelphia's 28-3 win at Jacksonville. He played eight NFL regular-season games in 2010 (five with Indianapolis and three with Philadelphia), while also spending three weeks on Philadelphia's practice squad. Bell was signed to the active roster by the New Orleans Saints prior to their playoff game but was inactive for the loss at Seattle.

In the 2011 pre-season with the Saints, Bell had the fifth-most rushing yards of any player with 182 on 31 carries with two runs for more than 20 yards. He also lead New Orleans with nine receptions for 139 yards with a long of 60 yards. He spent the entire regular-season except the first two weeks on the Saints practice squad before being signed by the Detroit Lions prior to the regular-season finale.

In the 2012 pre-season, Bell led the Lions with 158 yards on 38 attempts with eight receptions for 97 yards to earn a spot on the opening day 53-man roster.

Daunte Akra, who played in both 2008 and 2010 at WSU, was on the CFL's Montreal Alouettes practice squad in 2011 before joining the Detroit Lions for training camp. He re-joined Montreal's practice squad for the remainder of the 2011 campaign.

The Chicago Bears, led by former Tartar Phil Emery (who became general manager early in 2012), signed safety Jeremy Jones to a free agent contract following the draft. Jones had an interception at Cleveland in the final pre-season game to earn a spot on the 53-man roster.

Joe Long inked a free agent contract with the St. Louis Rams following the 2012 NFL Draft. Long appeared in all four St. Louis pre-season games, but was cut on the day after the pre-season ended.

Troy Burrell spent a month with the Detroit Lions during the summer of 2012.

The Wayne State University Department of Athletics is committed to the academic foundation of the Warrior student-athletes, their professional development and community involvement. Programs have been implemented to improve academic performance and retention in order to deliver success in the classroom. During the 2011-2012 academic calendar year 60% of the Wayne State student-athlete body received a 3.0+ Grade Point Average at full time enrollment status.

The Wayne State football program had 30 student-athletes receive GLIAC All-Academic team recognition during the 2011 season. Under the direction of head football coach Paul Winters, football student-athletes participate in a daily study table that emphasizes time management, classroom readiness, test taking strategies, tutorial assistance and study group sessions. Dr. Maria Sepulveda of the athletic department supervises the football study table sessions.

Beyond the classroom the athletic department provides professional development resources for the student-athlete body. Each year employment recruiters, local businesses, and corporate sponsors attend a professional development seminar within the athletic department providing an opportunity for student-athletes to learn about future employment endeavors. Dynamic workshops are presented such as resume writing and preparing for a career search. A graduate school panel night is also comprised of the student-athletes providing an avenue for student-athletes to learn more educational opportunities exceeding their undergraduate work.

Football is prevalent in the community through involvement associated with the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. Two members from each of the 15 Wayne State sports serve on the committee in efforts to build leadership and a strong relationship with the surrounding community. Joining the entire student-athlete body, the football team assists with fundraising for the Make-A-Wish Foundation, generating resources through canned food and clothing drives, volunteering at local soup kitchens, and mentoring programs.

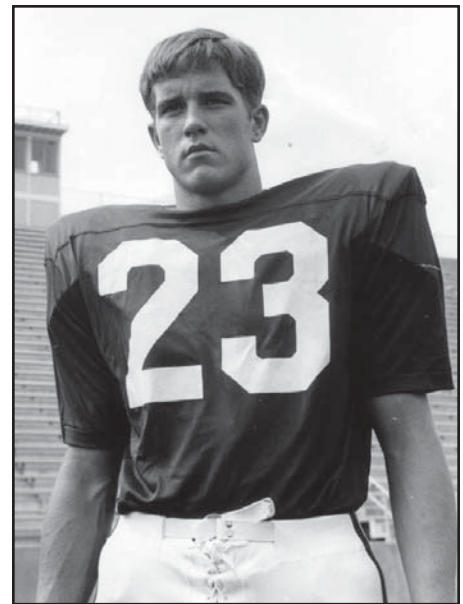
Four members of the 2007 Wayne State University football team were selected for the 2008 NFF Hampshire Honor Society, which is comprised of college football players from all divisions of play who each maintained a 3.2 GPA or better. The announcement was made by the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame.

Selected from WSU were seniors Guye Goodlow (Detroit, Mich./Renaissance), Frank Lietke (Walled Lake, Mich./Walled Lake Central), Dale Knuth (Canton, Mich./Dearborn Divine Child) and Kenny Schmidt (Waterford, Mich./Waterford Mott). The four honorees were the most for any GLIAC school.

For the 2008 football season, Wayne State's Andrew Bates was one of two GLIAC players inducted into the Hampshire Honor Society. The following year both Joe Claiborne and Bruno Shkreli were inducted, while Matt Faulkner received this recognition for the 2010 football campaign. In 2011-12, WSU had the most inductees of any GLIAC school and any college in the State of Michigan with six.

Qualifications for membership in the NFF Hampshire Honor Society include:

- * Being a starter or a significant substitute in one's last year of eligibility at an accredited NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision, Football Championship Subdivision, Division II, Division III, or an NAIA college or university;

* Achieving a 3.2 cumulative grade point average throughout entire course of undergraduate study; and

* Meeting all NCAA-mandated progress towards degree requirements.

A total of 721 players from 232 schools qualified for membership in the society's sixth year, making this year's class the largest since the program's creation in 2007.

The NFF Hampshire Honor Society capitalizes on the NFF's current National Scholar-Athlete program, greatly expanding the number of scholar-athletes the NFF can recognize each year and further strengthening the organization's leadership role in encouraging academic performance by the student-athletes who play football at the more than 700 college and universities nationwide. Jon F. Hanson, the chairman and founder of The Hampshire Companies, provided an endowment to launch the NFF Hampshire Honor Society in 2007. He made the contribution as part of his legacy to the organization after serving as NFF chairman from 1994-2006. Each of the 721 players awarded with membership in this year's Honor Society will receive a certificate commemorating the achievement.

GUY NAMED TO AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

The two 11-man teams, a Division I-A team and a combined team from NCAA Football Championship Subdivision, Divisions II, III and the NAIA, honor players for their dedication and commitment to community service. The AFCA has been selecting the Good Works Team since 1997. From 1992-1996, the Good Works Team was chosen by the College Football Association. When the CFA disbanded in 1997, the AFCA began selecting the teams.

Alan Guy's selection in 2007 marked the first time a WSU football player has earned Good Works honors.



Ron Solack

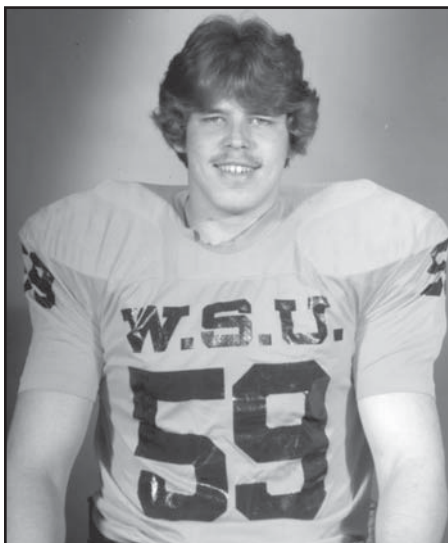
The first football number ever retired at Wayne State University is the number 35 jersey last worn by Ron Solack. Ron died of post-surgery complications in 1968, on the eve of the opening of the new Wayne State University Stadium. Ron wore his Wayne State uniform with unmatched pride and played the game with enthusiasm. He would have been a senior member of the 1969 team. An award was instituted in his name in 1969.

In 2002, Wayne State instituted the Randy Guzowski Award. The criteria includes: an upperclassman, who has shown true dedication to the University community, has demonstrated outstanding team leadership, and has shown exemplary school and community citizenship.

The award is named after former WSU student-athlete Randy Guzowski. During his playing days (1977-80), the three-year letterwinner consistently contributed to the program both on and off the field.

Following his playing career, Randy continued to serve the University. He joined the WSU police force in 1987 and served 15 years before passing away on December 23, 2001, from complications following a kidney and liver transplant.

The inaugural winner, in 2002, of the Randy Guzowski Award was senior offensive lineman Joel Grambau. Senior defensive back Ryan Rutley was the 2003 recipient, while junior defensive back Ryan Oshnock was given the award three times from 2004-06.

The 2007 recipient was senior linebacker Alan Guy, with junior Bruno Shkreli earning the award in 2008. Fifth-year senior fullback Brian Rilley was the 2009 recipient, while junior running back Josh Renel received the award following both the 2010 and 2011 campaigns.
