BUFFS HOST LIONS IN REGULAR-SEASON FINALE - The West Texas A&M Buffaloes (6-3, 5-2 LSC) return home to the friendly confines of Kimbrough Memorial Stadium to host the A&M-Commerce Lions (1-8, 1-6 LSC) in Lone Star Conference action for the regular-season finale. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. in Canyon, Texas.

SENIOR DAY - The West Texas A&M Athletics department and the Buffs football program will honor 18 seniors for their dedication and efforts to the WTAMU football team over their respective careers. Starting seniors that will be honored include: WR Brittan Golden, C Hector Rodriguez, RB Tommy Hampton, NT Dishon Robertson, DE Simi Kuli, LB Anthony Scott, LB Zane Farris, CB Caleb Randolph, CB Maurice Caldwell, and SS Curtis Jefferson.

THE SERIES - The Lions lead the all-time series 14-12, but the Buffs have won the previous three meetings between the two teams. WT head coach Don Carthel is 3-0 when playing the Lions under the helm of the Buffs football program, but it will be the first meeting for A&M-Commerce head coach Guy Morriss to face the Buffs.

THE COACHES - WTAMU head coach Don Carthel is in his seventh season at the helm of the Buffalo football program. His record of 65-19 ranks second-best all-time amongst former WT head coaches. He entered the 2011 campaign nine wins shy of tying Joe E. Kerbal's mark of 68 wins. In 15 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Carthel is 111-65-1 overall. Since arriving at WT, Carthel is 3-0 all-time against the Lions.

Guy Morriss is in his third season with the Lions and brings in a combined 9-21 record into Saturday's contest since taking over at A&M-Commerce. Overall, Morriss is 39-75 in 10 head coaching seasons. Before taking over at A&M-Commerce, Morriss was the head coach at Baylor.

THE RANKINGS - The Buffs fell out of this week's American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division II Coaches Poll following it's loss to then No. five-ranked Midwestern State. WT fell from No.

LAST MEETING WITH TAMUC - The Buffs and Lions have not met since 2007, when WT downed the Lions 45-14 on Sept. 15 at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium. The Buffs jumped out to a 24-0 lead before TAMUC put up its first points of the game, and WT followed with 21 unanswered points to go up 45-14. The Lions scored once more in the final 30 seconds of the ball game. WT tallied over 500 yards of total offense and limited the Lions to just 183 total yards.

GOLDEN MOVES UP TO NO. 2 ALL-TIME - Senior wide receiver Brittan Golden moved into second-place all-time in receiving yards with his nine-catch, 170 yard performance over Central Washington last Saturday. The Denver City, Texas, native leapfrogged Keith Miller with his third reception of the night - a 15 yard pass and catch from quarterback Dustin Vaughan in the second quarter - to give him 2,551 career receiving yards.

Late in the fourth quarter, Golden caught his ninth pass of the evening and took it 70 yards to the house and surpassing Brad Bailey's mark of 2,677 career receiving yards in the process. The 70-yard catch-and-run gave Golden 2,696 career yards.

Golden moved up from ninth-place all-time in career receptions all the way to No. 6 with 151. Following his four catch performance at Midwestern State on Saturday, he is now just 11 receptions shy from tying Tyson Williams' career total of 166 receptions for fifth-place all-time.

STREAKS - Head coach Don Carthel has had seven straight winning seasons at the helm of the Buffalo football program. He surpasses former WTAMU head coach Joe Kerball for the most consecutive winning seasons while at head coach for the Buffs. Kerball had six-straight winning seasons at the helm of the team from 1965-70.

McCULLER'S A FORCE - Sophomore linebacker Taylor McCuller tallied a team-high 18 tackles on Saturday against Midwestern State. Seven of his tackles were unassisted as well. He recorded 10 total tackles before going into the locker room at halftime. McCuller had a hand in both of WT's fumble recoveries, forcing both MSU fumbles. His first forced fumble came on the first play from scrimmage after MSU got the ball back on a punt that hit a WT player in the back. WT went on to score a touchdown on the turnover.

VANVORIS KEEPS RETURNERS AWAY - Punter/placekicker Kevin VanVoriss recorded six kickoffs on Saturday for a net average of 61.8 yards. Four of his kickoffs went for touchbacks on the afternoon. For the season, VanVoriss has 19 touchbacks from 60 kickoffs. Opponents are averaging just 19.1 yards per return and the opposing team's average starting field position is the 24-yard line.

PLAYOFF PICTURE - With Saturday's loss to Midwestern State, the Buffs' playoff picture got a little more fuzzy. WT needed help on Saturday with a loss, but unfortunately did not get that help as all the teams that needed to lose - won. A win over the Lions and help from MIAA schools could help secure a playoff spot for the Buffs. WT went into Saturday's game ranked sixth in the Super Region 4 rankings. The next set of rankings will be released Monday afternoon.

A LOOK AHEAD - WT will await its outcome for the NCAA Division II playoffs following Saturday's game against A&M-Commerce. Playoff teams will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 13.

DON CARHEL
HEAD COACH
SEVENTH SEASON
EASTERN NEW MEXICO '74

To say that Don Carthel has elevated the West Texas A&M football to that of national prominence would be an understatement. What Carthel has accomplished over the past five seasons at WTAMU is simply amazing, having taken a program that had won just seven games over the previous four years combined and guide it to five winning seasons, four successive NCAA Division-II playoff appearances, four LSC South Division titles, three-consecutive Lone Star Conference Championships - and 51 victories.

In 2009, playing a schedule that featured six nationally-ranked opponents, and playing the nation's then-top-ranked team twice, Carthel rallied an injury-riddled squad from a 1-5 start to six consecutive wins - posting a 7-5 mark and the

school's first bowl appearance since the 1967 season.

During his first season in Canyon, Carthel and the Buffs surprised everyone, having been picked to finish last in the LSC preseason poll, as they registered a 10-1 regular season record and captured the school's first Lone Star Conference Championship in 19 years. Excitement surrounding Carthel's program was evident as attendance soared, with a regular-season average of over 14,000 fans per game at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium. In addition to garnering local praise from alumni and area media outlets, Carthel was honored by his peers as the 2005 Lone Star Conference Coach of the Year.

Following that breakout campaign there was still work to be done as Carthel set out in 2006 to let the LSC and the rest of NCAA Division II know that WT's 2005's success was no fluke. The Buffs left little doubt, as they posted an 11-2 season and became the first squad in school history to claim back-to-back outright conference championships. In addition, WT notched another 'first' in the school record book as it claimed the program's first-ever NCAA Division II playoff victory with a 30-27 overtime win over Abilene Christian. After leading the country in Division II average attendance the previous year, Buff fans again came out in droves, helping WT rank first, nationally, in total attendance.

That only set the stage for what was to come during the 2007 campaign, as the Buffs confidently went about amassing the school's first-ever undefeated regular season, going 11-0 to claiming a third-straight Lone Star Conference championship and advance two rounds into the NCAA post-season playoffs.

Another 11-win, record shattering campaign followed in 2008, as the Buffs again were among the biggest draws in NCAA Division II. That season saw Carthel's squad set no fewer than 15 team, 21 individual, 26 LSC and eight NCAA playoff records.

Carthel graduated from ENMU with a bachelor's degree in physical education and a minor in mathematics in 1974, then went on to get his master's in physical education in 1975. He played center for the Greyhounds from 1970-73, helping ENMU to a No. 17 NAIA ranking his senior season.

In 1981, at the age of 28, Carthel became the youngest head coach in the country when he took over at Lubbock Christian College (now Lubbock Christian University), a position he held from 1981-82.

Following a stint at the University of Texas-El Paso (UTEP), Carthel returned to his alma mater to serve as head coach from 1985-91.

The elder Carthel coached at ACU from 2001 until 2004, when he was named the head coach and general manager of the Amarillo Dusters in their inaugural season in the Intense Football League. In April, 2005, Carthel resigned to take the reins at West Texas A&M.

Carthel and his wife, the former Cindy Phillips, of Farwell, Texas, have been married for 37 years, and have two adult children, Colby (the Buffs' defensive coordinator) and Courtney.
