## BUFFS AND RAMS BATTLE SATURDAY NIGHT FOR BERTH IN NCAA DIVISION II CHAMPIONSHIP

**THIS WEEK'S MATCHUP** - The 16th-ranked West Texas A&M football team continues its magical season with a date in the NCAA Division II National Championship on the line as it travels to No. 2 Winston-Salem State in the NCAA Division II Semifinals Saturday evening at 5:30 p.m. at Bowman Gray Stadium in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. The Buffs a 12-2 on the year, while the Rams are 13-0.

**WATCH AND LISTEN TO THE BUFFS** - The game will be broadcast on the internet on ESPN3 as John Sadak and Rene Ingoglia will have the call and Angela Mallen will be on the sideline. The game will be broadcast on the radio throughout the Texas Panhandle on KGNC-AM NewsTalk 710 with Neil Horn and Brice Edwards. There are no live stats.

**THE COACHES** - WTAMU head coach **Don Carthel**, the winningest coach in terms of winning percentage and wins in WT football history, brings a record of 79-21 (.787) in his eighth season at the helm of the Buffalo football program. In his 17th season, Carthel is 125-67-1 (.648). He surpassed Joe E. Kerbel in wins Sept. 15 with his 69th win at the helm of the Buffaloes for the most in school history in a 40-10 win over Texas A&M-Kingsville at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

Winston-Salem head coach **Connell Maynor** is in his third season at the helm of the Rams. He is 34-3 going 13-1 and losing in the NCAA Semifinals last season. Maynor was named American Football Coaches Association Super Region One Coach of the Year this week as he has led his team to another undefeated season to this point. Maynor played at Winston-Salem State and North Carolina A&T and has more than two decades of football experience including 10 years at Fayetteville State as the quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator, as well as working in the Arena Football League where he was the offensive coordinator for the Philadelphia Soul (2006-2008) and an Arena Bowl XXII championship in 2008. He is a four-time Arena Bowl champion with two at Tampa Bay (1993-1994) and two in Orlando at quarterback (1998 and 2000).

**CARTHEL NAMED AFCA REGION FOUR COACH OF THE YEAR** - West Texas A&M head coach Don Carthel was announced as American Football Coaches Association Division II Region Four Coach of the Year Monday. Carthel earned Co-Lone Star Conference Coach of the Year honors this season, too.

**GAME 15** - Saturday's game is the 15th of the season for the Buffaloes and will be the most games played in a season in school history as the previous most was 13 games in 2006-2008. The most games played in a season in Division II is 16 set by Wayne State (Mich.) last season as the NCAA runner-up to Pittsburg State (Kan.)

**THE SIX-SEED** - This is the second year in a row that a six-seed has made it to the NCAA Semifinals. Last season, Wayne State (Mich.) upset Winston-Salem State in the semifinals 21-14 earning a berth in the NCAA championship.

**RECAPING CSU-PUEBLO** - The Buffs' season came full circle last week as WT and Colorado State-Pueblo hooked up once again this season. The Buffs opened the 2012 season with a 44-34 loss at CSU-Pueblo on Aug. 30, but that sour taste changed quickly on Saturday as WT dominated the game from the get go. The Buffs silenced the 10,217 crowd as WT was led by junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan who passed for 324 yards and three scores on 24 of 38 passes with one interception. Senior running back Khiry Robinson tallied 181 yards on the ground and had two catches for 14 yards with a score. Junior wide receiver Nathan Slaughter came up with catch after catch after catch as he tallied 170 yards receiving and two touchdowns on seven receptions. Defensively the Buffs dominated the CSU-Pueblo this time as it held the high-powered Thunderwolves' rushing offense to just 32 yards on the ground as CSUP had 265 yards on the ground in the first meeting in August. CSUP quarterback Ross Dausin didn't have a lot of time in the pocket as the relentless WT defense sacked him seven times for 46 yards led by junior defensive lineman Ethan Westbrook who had 3.0 sacks for 24 yards and a forced fumble. He now has a school-record 19.5 sacks on the season. Junior linebacker Taylor McCuller had 15 tackles in the game including eight solo stops as he broke the school-record for tackles in a season with 156 as Joe Calhoun had 151 in 1995. WT amassed 517 yards of offense as they had 193 yards on the ground and 324 through the air and held CSUP to just 225 yards of total offense. For the second straight week, the Buffs have knocked off an undefeated and top five ranked team as WT won at No. 4 Ashland Nov. 24, 33-28.

**WHERE NO BUFFALO HAS GONE BEFORE** - Last Saturday's game at CSU-Pueblo was the first time WT has ever played in the NCAA Quarterfinals. The 33-28 win over Ashland last week was the first time the Buffaloes had advanced past the second round in school history. With the win at CSU-Pueblo, WT moved over .500 in postseason play for the first time at 6-5 all-time in the NCAA Tournament in six appearances in eight seasons all under Carthel. WT has made the postseason each of Carthel's seven previous years including two wins in the Kanza Bowl (2009, 2011). The Buffs' first NCAA Tournament win came in 2006 with a 30-27 home, overtime win over Abilene Christian, followed by a 43-17 loss at Chadron State in the second round after a home defeat in 2005 to Pittsburg State (Kan.) in Carthel's first season. WT defeated Washburn (Kan.) at home 49-39, in 2007 and followed with a 56-28 loss at Northwest Missouri State. In 2008, the Buffs downed Central Washington in a 49-42 thriller at Kimbrough, followed by the record-shattering 93-68 loss at Abilene Christian. WT then lost 55-35 at Central Missouri in the NCAA Tournament in 2010. The Buffs are 3-1 at home in the NCAA Tournament and, with the wins at Chadron State, Ashland and CSU-Pueblo this season, improved to 3-4 on the road in the NCAA Tournament.

**A WIN OVER WINSTON-SALEM STATE WOULD...**

- Give the Buffs a 13-2 record which would be the most wins in a season in school history
- Earn a berth in WT's first NCAA Championship in football against either Valdosta State or Minnesota State
- Give WT a 7-5 record in the NCAA Tournament all-time in six appearances
- Be the fourth consecutive road win in NCAA Tournament play
- Be the fifth win over a ranked team this season (4-2)
- Mark the fourth time a Lone Star Conference Team has made the championship and first since 1994 (2-1)
- Be the fourth win in the NCAA Semifinals for a LSC and first win since 1994 (3-8)
- Tie for the most games played in a season at 16 with Wayne State (Mich.) in 2011
- Give the Buffs their 480th win in school history and a 480-482-21 record
- Become the first team to defeat an undefeated team in its final game of the season three times in the same season since Northwest Missouri State in 2007 and just the second time in NCAA history

**ABOUT WINSTON-SALEM STATE** - The Rams enter with a 13-0 mark after a hard-fought 21-17 win over Indiana (Pa.) Saturday in the NCAA Quarterfinals. WSSU's standout quarterback Kameron Smith passed to Ricky Rozier with 3:51 remaining putting WSSU on top. However, Indiana (Pa.) had one last chance and a pass deflection on the final play of the game inside the WSSU 10 by Casey Davenport sent the Rams to the semifinals for the second consecutive season. The Rams are led by Smith who is 183 of 299 for 2,810 yards and 40 touchdowns on the season with just nine interceptions. He ranks second nationally in passing efficiency at 177.68 and 40th nationally in total offense at 258.00. The ground attack is led by Maurice Lewis as he has 851 yards on 164 carries and 11 touchdowns. Jameze Massey is one of two receivers who have over 1,000 yards on the year as he has a team-high 54 catches for 1,099 yards and 13 touchdowns. Jahuann Butler leads the team with 1,114 yards and has 12 scores on 53 receptions. Massey ranks 29th nationally in yards per game at 91.6 per contest. Massey ranks 43rd nationally in all-purpose yards at 134.3. Defensively, the Rams are led by Carlos Fields who leads the team with 97 total tackles, including 55 solo stops. He is second on the team with seven tackles for loss. Daniel Mungin leads the team with 5.5 sacks and 10.0 tackles for loss, while Larry Hearne has a team-high four interceptions on the year.

**IN THE NCAA'S** - The Buffs have continued their outstanding play each week in the playoffs as they are averaging 35.0 points per game and allowing 23.7 in the three games. WT has rushed for 557 yards (185.7) and thrown for 991 (330.3), while holding the opposition to 304 yards on the ground (101.3) and 742 (247.3) through the air. WT is averaging 516 yards per game in total offense, while allowing just 348.7 yards per game. Senior running back Khiry Robinson leads the team with 469 yards on the ground and three scores, while junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan has throws for 991 yards with nine touchdowns and four interceptions on 78 of 119 for a 153.73 passing efficiency. Juniors Torrence Allen and Nathan Slaughter have had huge games thus far at wide out as Allen leads the team in the playoffs with 390 yards and three scores for a 130.0 average, while Slaughter has 272 yards and two touchdowns for a 90.7 average. Defensively, the Buffs are led by junior linebacker Taylor McCuller who has a team-high 38 tackles with 20 solo stops. Junior defensive lineman Ethan Westbrook has been a beast with six sacks to lead the team and eight tackles along with four quarterback hurries and two forced fumbles.

**MULLANE A NFF NATIONAL SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AND WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL FINALIST** - Senior offensive lineman Aaron Mullane was named one of 15 National Football Foundation National Scholar-Athletes and he is a finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy which goes to the absolute best student-athlete in the nation. Mullane, a native of Amarillo, Texas, has a 3.84 overall grade-point average and a 3.95 overall in the science discipline as he is a biology and chemistry double major. He graduates in December and has applied to six medical schools already. The \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship he will receive will certainly help fulfill his dreams of being a physician. He, along with the other 14 scholar-athletes, will be honored at the 55th NFF Annual Awards Dinner at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City, Dec. 4, 2012. There, one of the 15 honorees will be awarded the 23rd William V. Campbell Trophy as it is the Academic Heisman of college football.

**VAUGHAN NAMED CAPITAL ONE/CoSIDA ACADEMIC PLAYER OF THE YEAR** - Junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan was named Capital One/CoSIDA Academic Player of the Year Wednesday as he not only has excelled on the field, but also in the classroom with a 3.9 grade-point average in biology/pre-med. He was named the Lone Star Conference Academic Player of the Year and becomes the first CoSIDA First Team Academic All-American for WT since Emily Brister earned first team honors in 2008 and 2009 in women's basketball. No WT student-athlete has ever been named Academic Player of the Year until Vaughan. In addition to Vaughan, junior wide receiver Nathan Slaughter earned first team honors, along with senior offensive lineman Aaron Mullane. Junior defensive back John McSheffery was a second team honoree. It is the first time WT has ever had a first team All-American in football and Vaughan, Slaughter and Mullane are the second, third and fourth first team selections in school history as Emily Brister of women's basketball was the only other first team selection in 2009 and 2009.

**FOKETI TABBED FINALIST FOR GENE UPSHAW AWARD** - Senior offensive lineman Manase Foketi is a finalist for the 2012 Gene Upshaw Lineman of the Year Award. Foketi has played and started all 13 games for the Buffs who are playing in the NCAA Quarterfinals this weekend for the first time in school history. He transferred to WT after three years at Kansas State. Foketi protects the blind side for a Harlon Hill Finalist in junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan. He graded out above 95% in each of the 14 games thus far.

**SEVEN BUFFALOES NAMED DAKTRONICS ALL-REGION** - Led by junior defensive lineman Ethan Westbrook who was named Daktronics Super Region Four Defensive Player of the Year, the Buffs had seven players named to the Daktronics All-Region teams as three were named to the first team and four garnered second team honors for the most of any team in the region. Along with Westbrook, junior kicker Sergio Castillo, Jr., and senior offensive lineman Manase Foketi earned first team honors, while junior wide receiver Torrence Allen, junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan, junior linebacker Taylor McCuller and senior offensive lineman Aaron Mullane were named second team.

**NATIONAL BUFFALOES** - For the season, the Buffs rank highly in a number of areas on both sides of the ball, including seventh nationally in passing offense at 343.64 yards per game. They are seventh in total offense at 487.29 yards, 14th in scoring offense averaging 40.07 points per game, 38th in rushing defense allowing 126.50 yards on the ground, 32nd in total defense at 338.13, eighth in passing efficiency at 162.01, lead the nation in sacks at 4.14 and are sixth in tackles for loss at 9.14 per game.

**ROAD WARRIORS** - The Buffs have been road warriors this season as the Winston-Salem State game will be their then game away from home this season (9-1). The Buffs are 8-1 in true road games and 1-0 in neutral site games. WT has won eight-straight road games and eight away from Kimbrough dating back to the 44-34 loss against CSU-Pueblo Aug. 30 in the season-opener. WT, under Carthel, is 41-11 away from Kimbrough in his eight seasons, including a 4-0 record in neutral site games. Carthel won 11 of his first 12 games away from home in 2005 and 2006, while winning 20 of his first 23 (2005-2008). The eight road wins and nine total wins away from home are the most in school history.

**GEOGRAPHY LESSON** - The trip to Winston-Salem, North Carolina, this weekend will be the seventh different state the Buffs have played a football game this season. WT has played games in Colorado (twice), Texas, New Mexico, Georgia, Nebraska, Ohio and North Carolina. They also flew into Rapid City, S.D., and chartered a bus down to Chadron, Nebraska, for the game.

**RACKING UP THE FREQUENT FLYER MILES** - Since the playoffs have started, WT logged almost 4,500 miles in its first two road games to Chadron State and Ashland University. The trip to CSU-Pueblo was another 680 miles there and back and the trip to Winston-Salem, N.C., is 2,288 miles there and back. For the four playoff games, the Buffs have traveled 8,024.04 miles.

**RUSHMORE BUFFS** - The West Texas A&M football team had a great opportunity to visit one of the nation's greatest historical landmarks prior to the Chadron State game as it visited Mount Rushmore in South Dakota following the team's charter flight into Rapid City, S.D.

**COMING FROM BEHIND** - The Buffaloes battled back from a 14-0 first quarter deficit Nov. 17 at Chadron State and battled back from a 28-19 deficit in the third quarter Nov. 24 at Ashland to go along with a 21-19 deficit at halftime. It was the fifth time this season that the Buffs trailed and battled back for the win. Nov. 24 marked the second week in a row that the Buffs have trailed in the third quarter to come back for the win. Last week, WT never trailed in its 34-13 win at Colorado State-Pueblo.

**SLAUGHTERING** - Junior wide receiver Nathan Slaughter had an outstanding game against CSU-Pueblo Saturday as he tallied a career-high 174 yards on seven catches and two touchdowns in the 34-13 win. He had a 74-yard catch, which was a career-high, as he took the flea-flicker from junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan and ran sideline-to-sideline for the score. It was his first 100 yard receiving game since tallied 133 at Eastern New Mexico (Oct. 20) and the third of the season.

**STOPPING THE RUN** - The Buffs' rushing defense has been solid all season and Saturday was no exception as WT held the high-powered rushing attack of CSU-Pueblo to just 32 yards on 33 carries. CSU-Pueblo had 265 yards rushing against WT in the first meeting in August. Since then, have held seven teams under 100 yards rushing, including just three yards against Abilene Christian (W, 36-0, Oct. 13), 15 yards at Incarnate Word (W, 24-0, Sept. 22), 49 yards at Angelo State (W, 35-9, Oct. 6). In all, WT is 7-0 when holding teams under 100 yards rushing. The Buffs rank 38th nationally in rushing defense at 126.5 yards per game which is second in the Lone Star Conference.

**SACKS FOR WESTBROOKS** - Junior defensive lineman Ethan Westbrook has a school-record 19.5 sacks on the year which ranks him first nationally. He needs just one sack to tie the NCAA Division II record for sacks in a season set by Charlie Cook of LIU Post in 2001. Westbrook currently in tied with Damien Gilyard of LIU post as he had 19.5 in 2004. Westbrook has recorded three sacks in back-to-back games and has four games of tallying three sacks. In the first six games of the season he had just four sacks and has followed with 15.5 in the last eight games.

**ROBINSON RETURNS TO FORM** - After Ashland put on a concentrated effort to stop the run and held senior running back Khiry Robinson to just 58 yards rushing Nov. 24, he came back with another stellar performance in the playoffs as CSU-Pueblo had no answer for him Saturday. Robinson racked up 176 yards rushing on 26 carries and caught two passes for 14 yards and a touchdown. Through the three playoff games, Robinson has 469 yards rushing on 77 carries for a 156.3 average and three scores. He has caught five balls for 74 yards and a touchdown. He set a career-high with 235 yards rushing on 30 carries and three scores in a 38-30 win at Chadron State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament Nov. 17.

**SOLID SERGIO** - Junior place kicker Sergio Castillo, Jr., tallied his second kick from 50 or more yards Saturday in the Buffs' 34-13 win at CSU-Pueblo. He went 2 for 2 in field goals with a 45-yarder and the 50-yarder. For the season Castillo is 19-21 in field goals and 68-69 in extra-points for a team-high 125 points. Castillo is 37 of 44 all-time in field goals and 173-176 in extra points. He is third all-time in scoring in school history with 284 points. Castillo had a 56-yard field goal earlier this year which is the second-longest field goal in school history (58) and the longest in the Lone Star Conference this season. Castillo ranks ninth nationally this season in field goals averaging 1.36 per game and he is 24th nationally in scoring at 8.93 points per game.

**GETTING IN THE BACKFIELD** - The Buffs have been strong all season in tackles for loss as they rank sixth nationally averaging 9.14 tackles for loss per game and lead the conference. Saturday, WT had 12 tackles for loss for 61 yards as it is the sixth game this season it has tallied double-digit tackles for loss. For the season, the Buffs have 128 tackles for loss for an astonishing 549 yards.

**1,000-YARD RUSHER/RECEIVER COMBO** - Along with Robinson who has 1,516 yards rushing, junior wide receiver Torrence Allen had seven receptions for 142 yards at Chadron State Nov. 17 pushing him over the 1,000-yard mark as he has 1,356 yards this season on 81 receptions to lead the team. Allen ranks 11th nationally in receiving yards per game at 104.31 and 33rd nationally in receptions per game (6.23) which are both tops in the conference. The last time WT had a 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver in the same season was 1994 with Norman White running for 1,122 and Brad Bailey having 1,552 receiving yards. Robinson is 14th nationally in rushing at 123.67 to lead the conference and is tied for 21st in scoring at 9.00 points per game.

**A FOR ALLEN** - Junior wide receiver Torrence Allen had a career day Nov. 24 as he made catch-after-catch to help lead the Buffs to a historic second round win in the NCAA Tournament. Allen caught a career-high 13 balls for a career-high 185 yards and a career-high three touchdowns. It was the first three touchdown performance for a WT player since Britton Golden had three touchdowns in a game twice in 2011. The 185 yards receiving are the most for a Buffalo

player this season.

**STRONG VAUGHAN** - Junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan completed a career-high 35 passes and a career-high 50 attempts in the Buffs' 33-28 win at No. 4 Ashland. Vaughan tallied 398 yards for his eighth game this season of throwing over 300 yards and tallied four touchdowns for his fourth game of four touchdowns or more this season.

**STOUT ON "D"** - Buffalo defense held the high-powered Ashland offense in check for the most part Nov. 24 as Harlon Hill finalist senior quarterback Taylor Housewright struggled throwing a career-high three interceptions and a fumble on the second to last play of the game. Housewright threw two touchdowns and 166 yards, but was 20 of 34 passing and was sacked four times by the top-ranked team in the country in sacks.

**STRONG SECONDARY** - The West Texas A&M secondary came up with a season-high three interceptions at Ashland. Junior Curtis Slater tallied the first interception in the game and the fourth of the season, while senior Jordan Smith and sophomore Torian Oakley each added a pick later. Oakley and Chris Ceazer were tied for first and third, respectively, in tackles Nov. 17 at Chadron State. Oakley had a game-high nine solo stops with two assisted tackles for a team-high 11 total stops and a pass breakup, while Ceazer had eight solo stops and 10 total tackles. The three interceptions at AU were the most in a game for the Buffs since four pick versus Central Missouri Nov. 27, 2011, in the Kanza Bowl.

**VAUGHAN FINALIST FOR HARLON HILL** - Junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan was one of eight finalists for the 2012 Harlon Hill Trophy. The list was comprised of four quarterbacks, three running backs and one receiver. Six of the finalist, including Vaughan, helped lead their teams into the NCAA Division II playoffs. Despite not being invited as one of the final three to the 27th Annual Harlon Hill Trophy Presentation Banquet, Friday, December 14 at the Marriott Shoals Conference Center in Shoals, Ala., Vaughan is the only player among the final eight still playing.

**VAUGHAN USES HIS FEET** - Dustin Vaughan showed against Chadron State how he not only can use his arm, but also his feet as he had a career-high 69 yards rushing on 10 carries with a career-long 20-yard scamper at Chadron State. Vaughan has a career-high 145 yards rushing on the season for a 10.4 average per game on 63 carries.

**BUFFS PLACE 10 ON FIRST TEAM ALL-LSC** - Five Buffaloes earned specialty awards as the Lone Star All-Conference Team was announced last week. Junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan was named Offensive Player of the Year, while senior running back Khiry Robinson was named Offensive Back of the Year. Junior wide receiver Torrence Allen shared Receiver of the Year honors, while junior defensive lineman Ethan Westbrook was named Defensive Player of the Year and head coach Don Carthel was named co-coach of the Year. All four players were first team selections along with senior offensive linemen Aaron Mullane and Manase Foketi, junior place kicker Sergio Castillo, Jr., senior defensive lineman Tyrell Higgins and junior safety Curtis Slater all were on the first team. The Buffs had seven second team selections and nine honorable mention honorees for a total of 26 players named to the all-conference squads.

**DEFENSE STANDS TALL** - After a 14-0 deficit at the end of the first quarter by Chadron State, the Buffalo defense clamped down and the offense picked it up holding as the Buffs outscored the Eagles 38-16 the rest of the way and outgained them 454-316 in total offense the rest of the way, including 234-49 on the ground. The defense had three key sacks for 32 yards and five tackles for loss for 39 yards in the final three quarters, while holding the Eagles to just 2 of 11 on third down for the game and 0 of 2 on fourth down. Last week, the Buffs were down 28-19 in the third quarter, but outscored the Eagles 14-0 the rest of the way. WT held AU to 166 yards passing, four turnovers, a crucial missed field goal and four sacks.

**STRONG ON THE GROUND** - WT amassed a season-high 311 yards rushing at Chadron State on 43 attempts for a 7.2 average. It was the most rushing yards in a game by the Buffs since 300 at New Mexico Highlands on Aug. 25, 2005.

**GOOD ON 3RD DOWN** - The Buffs were 9 of 14 against Chadron State with a number of key pickups to keep drives alive and pull out the come-from-behind win. In the playoffs, WT is 23 of 44 for 52 percent on third down and leads the league this season in third down conversions at 83 of 177 for a 46.9 average. Conversely, the Buffs are third in the conference in opponent third downs, holding teams to a 34.3 average on the pivotal down on 72 of 210. In addition, they are holding teams to 16 of 44 on third down in the playoffs for just 36 percent.

**FIRST AND TEN BUFFS** - The Buffs lead the conference in first downs with 323 for a 23.1 average per game.

**STRONG LEGGED VAN VORIS** - Junior punter Kevin Van Voris had three punts at Chadron State for 153 yards and a 51.0 average, including a career-long 74-yarder. Van Voris is 28th nationally in punting at 40.71 yards. He has 51 punts on the year for 2,076 yards with five touchbacks, 10 fair catches, 18 inside the 20 and eight of over 50 yards along with two over 70 yards.

**IN THE "RED" ZONE** - WT is second in the conference in red zone scoring on 56 of 64 chances for an 87.5 average with 42 touchdowns and 14 of 14 in field goals. The touchdowns have been pretty balanced at 18 rushing scores inside the 20 and 24 passing. Conversely, the defense is third in the conference on 32 of 40 for an 80 percent average. The opposition has scored 26 touchdowns with six field goals. The Buffs have two red zone interceptions and one fourth down stop, along with five missed field goals by the opponents.

**GETTING THE STOP ON 4TH** - The Buffs lead the conference in fourth down defense holding opponents to just 7 of 20 for a 35.0 average.

**BLOCK PARTY** - The Buffs tallied their sixth blocked kick of the season at Texas A&M-Commerce (Nov. 10) as junior defensive back Curtis Slater got his hand on the punt on the opening possession of the game. Junior linebacker Eric Finefueiaki returned the punt for a touchdown. It was the second blocked punt returned for a touchdown by the Buffs this season.

**MCCULLER TACKLES** - Junior linebacker Taylor McCuller continued his impressive season as he has a school-record 156 tackles on the year with a team-high 67 solo stops. McCuller ranks fourth on the team in tackles for loss with 11.5 for 31 yards and he has 3.5 sacks for 11 yards. He has five quarterback hurries, one fumble recovery and one forced fumble. McCuller had a career-high 20 tackles earlier this season at West Georgia and leads the team with nine games of double-digit tackles, including seven in the last eight games. He ranks ninth nationally in tackles at 11.14 per game which is second in the conference.

**FIRST IN THE NATION IN SACKS** - The Buffs are first in the Nation in sacks averaging 4.14 per contest. For the season WT has 58 sacks for 370 yards.

**ALL-PURPOSE ROBINSON** - Khiry Robinson had a season-high 260 all-purpose yards with 235 yards rushing and 25 receiving at Chadron State Nov. 17. He leads the conference and is 10th nationally in all-purpose yards at a 175.33 clip with a total of 1,897 with 1308 rushing, 405 receiving, 158 in punt returns and 26 in kick returns. The 26 yards returning kicks Nov. 3 was the first time in his career. Robinson ranks 9th nationally in all-purpose runners.

**WORD UP** - With injuries to a number of wide receivers this year, the younger receivers really have stepped up and picked up the slack as redshirt freshman Jarrian Rhone has been very impressive so far, while true freshman Word Hudson had a career-high five receptions for 90 yards and his first collegiate touchdown, which

tied the game at seven in the first quarter at West Georgia (Oct. 27). It was Hudson's second collegiate game and Hudson earned his first career start versus Midwestern State. For the season, he has 11 receptions for 149 yards and a touchdown. Rhone has played in all 14 games with seven starts. He has 48 catches for 534 yards and three touchdowns, while Hudson has played in eight games with one start.

**2012 TEAM CAPTAINS** - Team captains for 2012 include senior offensive lineman **Aaron Mullane** (Amarillo, Texas/Tascona HS), senior defensive back **Jordan Smith** (Killeen, Texas/Killeen HS), senior defensive lineman **Aaron Wampler** (Lubbock, Texas/Frenship HS), junior linebacker **Taylor McCuller** (Red Oak, Texas/Red Oak HS), junior defensive back **Curtis Slater** (Houston, Texas/Cy-Ridge HS), junior QB **Dustin Vaughan** (Corpus Christi, Texas/Catallen HS), junior linebacker **Kyle Voss** (Belton, Texas/Belton HS) and junior offensive lineman **Craig Watts** (Killeen, Texas/Killeen HS)

**FEAR THE BEARD** - A number of players decided after spring practice to not shave until the end of the 2012 season this year and to look as Casey O'Conner put it "A Braveheart look." O'Conner, along with Marc Waller, Aaron Wampler, Lawrence Lehaul and Jacob Laguna all have full beards.

**VAUGHAN RANKS HIGHLY** - Junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan has had an impressive campaign as he ranks sixth nationally in passing efficiency at 162.08 and seventh in total offense at 334.86 yards per game. Both are tops in the conference.

**VAUGHAN THIRD IN CAREER PASSING** - In just over two full seasons at quarterback, junior Dustin Vaughan has thrown for 7,955 career yards as he is third all-time in school history. Taylor Harris (2007-2010) leads the school annals with 9,799 yards. Vaughan has 4,543 passing yards this season which is third-most in a season in school history as he already has a career-high touchdowns for a season with 44 touchdown passes and just 11 interceptions.

**2010:** Vaughan saw time in four games during his redshirt freshman campaign for the Buffs in 2010 as the third string quarterback. He went 7-for-12 for 96 yards for a efficiency of 125.53 while also rushing for nine yards on four attempts. Against Southwestern Oklahoma, Vaughn went 5-of-10 for 63 yards including his longest pass of the season, a 29 yard completion to Sidney Parker.

## DON CARTHEL

**HEAD COACH  
EIGHTH SEASON  
EASTERN NEW MEXICO '74**

To say that Don Carthel has elevated the West Texas A&M football to that of national prominence would be an understatement. What Carthel, who earned his 100th career collegiate victory Sept 28, 2010, in a 37-27 win at Angelo State, has accomplished over the past seven seasons at WTAMU is simply amazing. He took a program that had won just seven games combined over the previous four years and guided it to seven winning seasons, five NCAA Division-II playoff appearances, four LSC South Division titles, three-consecutive Lone Star Conference Championships, two bowl appearances - and 67 victories.

During his first season in Canyon, Carthel and the Buffs surprised everyone, having been picked to finish last in the LSC preseason poll, as they registered a 10-1 regular season record and captured the school's first Lone Star Conference Championship in 19 years. Excitement surrounding Carthel's program was evident as attendance soared, with a regular-season average of over 14,000 fans per game at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium. Carthel was honored by his peers as the 2005 LSC Coach of the Year.

Following that breakout campaign, Carthel set out in 2006 to let the LSC and the rest of NCAA Division II know that WT's 2005's success was no fluke. The Buffs left little doubt, as they posted an 11-2 season and became the first squad in school history to claim back-to-back outright conference championships. After leading the country in Division II average attendance the previous year, Buff fans again came out in droves, helping WT to again rank first, nationally, in total attendance.

That only set the stage for what was to come during the 2007 campaign, as the Buffs confidently went about amassing the school's first-ever undefeated regular season, going 11-0 to claiming a third-straight Lone Star Conference championship and advance two rounds into the NCAA post-season playoffs.

Another 11-win, record shattering campaign followed in 2008, as the Buffs again were among the biggest draws in NCAA Division II. That season saw Carthel's squad set no fewer than 15 team, 21 individual, 26 LSC and eight NCAA playoff records.

In 2009, playing a schedule that featured six nationally-ranked opponents, and playing the nation's then-top-ranked team twice, Carthel rallied an injury-riddled squad from a 1-5 start to six consecutive wins - posting a 7-5 mark and the school's first bowl appearance since the 1967 season.

He then guided his 2010 squad to a sixth-consecutive winning season and a fifth NCAA playoff appearance. 2011 saw the Buffs take a 7-3 record into their second Kanza Bowl before topping #23 Central Missouri, 26-7, to improve WT's bowl record to a perfect 6-0 all-time.

Carthel graduated from ENMU with a bachelor's degree in physical education and a minor in mathematics in 1974, then went on to get his master's in physical education in 1975. He played center for the Greyhounds from 1970-73, helping ENMU to a No. 17 NAIA ranking his senior season.

In 1981, at the age of 28, Carthel became the youngest head coach in the country when he took over at Lubbock Christian College (now Lubbock Christian University), a position he held from 1981-82.

Following a stint at the University of Texas-EI Paso (UTEP), Carthel returned to his alma mater to serve as head coach from 1985-91.

The elder Carthel coached at ACU from 2001 until 2004, when he was named the head coach and general manager of the Amarillo Dusters in their inaugural season in the Intense Football League. In April, 2005, Carthel resigned to take the reins at West Texas A&M.

Carthel and his wife, the former Cindy Phillips, of Farwell, Texas, have been married for 37 years, and have two adult children, Colby (the Buffs' defensive coordinator) and Courtney.

### NO. 6 THUNDERWOLVES OUT-DISTANCE NO. 24 BUFFALOES

**PUEBLO, Colo.** – The 24th-ranked West Texas A&M football team opened the 2012 season with a 44-34 loss at sixth-ranked Colorado State-Pueblo, Thursday evening. The Buffs were led by junior wide receivers Torrence Allen and Lance Ratliff as the duo went a combined 17 catches for 317 yards and three scores.

In a game that saw the teams' combine for 1,042 yards of offense, the Buffs led 546 to 516 in total yardage, but two trips to the red zone coming away with no points either time proved costly. The Buffs held a 25-23 lead in first downs, while CSUP had 304 yards on the ground and the Buffs had 380 through the air.

"Their offensive line has 125 starts between them, they are very experienced and well coached as they outplayed us in the trenches especially in the first half," Buffalo head coach Don Carthel said.

WT junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan went 28 of 45 with an interception and three touchdowns for 380 yards. Allen had nine catches for 164 yards and a score, while Ratliff had seven receptions for 153 yards and two scores. Junior Nathan Slaughter had 192 yards in kick returns and 208 all-purpose yards.

Defensively, the Buffs were led by senior defensive back Jordan Smith who led the team with 10 tackles and a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.

After the Buffs won the coin toss and deferred, CSUP, on the first play from scrimmage, Trent Thompson on a short pass reception was stripped by Smith as the Buffs recovered at the Thunderwolves' 31. Moments later, the Buffs had a second and goal at the one and fumbled right back to CSUP.

"Offensively Coach Lee (Stephen) did a really good job of mixing the running and the passing throughout the game," Carthel added. "We stayed in our game plan and if we could have scored off the turnover and if Jordan (Smith) could've scooped and scored instead they recovered it and scored. Those were two critical plays in the ballgame as we were off to a good start. They played well enough to win and we didn't."

The Thunderwolves then went on a 94-yard drive as Chris Ashe ran eight yards for the score with 6:49 remaining in the opening quarter using just over six minutes on the clock to open the scoring.

The Buffs didn't fret one minute as they came right back as Vaughan fired a 57-yard touchdown pass to Ratliff to even the game at 7-7. On the ensuing CSUP drive, a roughing the passer call helped keep the Thunderwolves' drive alive as CSUP quarterback Ross Dausin hooked up with J.B. Mathews for a 39-yard touchdown pass for a 14-7 CSUP lead with less than four minutes remaining in the first quarter.

Just as before, the Buffs came right back with another quick drive as Vaughan used a steady passing and good runs as junior running back Aaron Harris scampered in from seven yards out to tie the game at 14-14 seconds remaining in an action-filled first quarter.

CSUP came right back again and used a sustaining drive as Dausin threw a long 23-yard catch and a dive by Marcial Williamson at the eight yard-line. From there, Mathews ran in for the score and a 21-14 lead with nine minutes remaining in the half.

On the next WT possession, a couple of false starts proved costly as the Buffs had to punt for the first time in the game. Junior Kevin VanVoris booted a 52-yard punt for a touchback as CSUP led 21-14 with 5:30 remaining in the half. It was the first punt by either team in the game.

WT senior linebacker Kevin McCluskey came up with a big sack putting CSUP in a big hole on its next possession. The Thunderwolves punted with 1:22 remaining in the half.

The Thunderwolves had a back-breaking final drive of the half as a long pass to Paul

Browning after an intentional grounding call on Dausin set the Thunderwolves up for a 47-yard field goal by Greg O'Donnell for a 24-14 CSU-Pueblo lead at intermission.

Slaughter took the second half kick 62 yards to the CSUP 38. The Buffs then tried a 56-yard field goal by junior Sergio Castillo, Jr., which was wide left with 13:34 remaining in the third quarter.

O'Donnell kicked his second field goal, a 45-yarder, on the ensuing CSUP possession for a 27-14 lead with 10:03 remaining in the third quarter. The Buffs made quick work again as Vaughan hooked up with Ratliff one more time for a 62-yard touchdown pass bringing the Buffs within 27-20 as WT tried for a 2-point conversion and failed.

After back-to-back punts by both teams, O'Donnell kicked his third field goal of the game for a 30-20 lead on a 36-yarder with 3:02 remaining in the third.

On a big 3rd and 8 from the CSUP 40, Vaughan fired a laser to junior Trevor Hammargren to keep the drive alive and a first down as the third quarter came to a close.

Vaughan's pass on the first play of the 4th quarter, was tipped at the line, intercepted and returned for a 75-yard touchdown by Kevin Cuff for a 37-20 Thunderwolves lead. Vaughan came right back with a 75-yard touchdown pass to Allen cutting the deficit to 37-27 with 13:27 remaining in the game. The pass was on 3rd and 10 and it was an inside screen for five yards as Allen darted down the sideline outrunning the CSUP defense.

After an onside kick by the Buffs, which was touched early, CSUP used two long runs by Mathews, followed by a fade pass by Dausin to Roger Pfannenschmid for a 9-yard score and a 44-27 lead.

Freshman running back Calvin Burns had a number of nice receptions and runs on the ensuing possession as the Buffs got down to the five. On a fourth and goal, Vaughan's pass was wide of Hammargren in the end zone as the Buffs were turned away for the second time tonight in the red zone.

The Buffs kept fighting and junior quarterback Luke Halpin came in for the final drive as the Buffs marched down the field for a nine play, 80-yard drive capped by a redshirt freshman Jeremy Alridge touchdown from a yard out for a 44-34 final score. Halpin went 6 of 7 for 68 yards in the game.

The Buffaloes will look to rebound next Saturday in the 2012 home opener versus Western State Colorado University at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium with kickoff scheduled for 6 p.m.

### BUFFS ROLL PAST WESTERN STATE IN HOME-OPENER, 57-20

CANYON, Texas – West Texas A&M senior quarterback Dustin Vaughan tied his career-high with five touchdown passes as the Buffaloes opened the 2012 home slate with a 57-20 win over visiting Western State Colorado University at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium Saturday evening. With the win, the Buffs improved to 1-1 on the year, while the Mountaineers fell to 0-2.

“We had a lot of big plays in the first quarter that got us off to a great start,” head coach Don Carthel said. “The defense really came out with a mission today. The starters played really well for three quarters and then we pulled them. Overall it was a great performance by the Buffaloes tonight.”

With the win, Carthel tied former Buffalo head coach Joe Kerbel for the most wins in school history with 68. Kerbel coached the Buffs from 1960-1970 with a record of 68-42-1. Carthel now is 68-20 since he began in 2005.

The Buffaloes jumped all over Western State in the first quarter to the tune of a 21-0 lead as Vaughan went 9 of 10 for 156 yards in the opening quarter and three touchdowns passes. Reigning Lone Star Conference Offensive Player of the Week, junior wide receiver Torrence Allen, had four catches for 104 yards and two touchdowns in the quarter, including a 77-yard bomb from Vaughan on a two play, 79-yard driving using just 49 seconds for a 14-0 lead. Less than four minutes into the contest Allen caught his first touchdown pass on an 8-yard pass from Vaughan. Redshirt freshman running back Jeremy Alridge tallied 60 yards on the ground in the opening quarter.

In the second quarter, Vaughan hooked up with reigning Special Teams Player of the Week junior wide receiver/return specialist, Nathan Slaughter for a 67-yard score with 7:10 remaining in the half on a two play, 72-yard drive using just 47 seconds.

At the half, the Buffs led 34-0 as Vaughan was 16 of 21 for 343 and four scores, while Alridge 79 yards on the ground and the team rushed for 115 through the first half. The Buffalo defense stood strong in the opening half with an interception which led to the first score by Allen and held WSCU to just 129 total yards.

The Mountaineers got on the board with 56 seconds left in the third quarter on a 30-yard touchdown pass from Brian Duboski to Lukas Adams as the extra point was blocked by junior defensive back Dwight Morrison. It was the first blocked extra point since Shane Baichtal versus Midwestern State on Oct. 23, 2010.

With the game well out of hand, a number of players saw action in the fourth quarter as junior running back Aaron Harris caught a 16-yard touchdown pass from junior quarterback Luke Halpin with 11:27 remaining for a 55-6 score. Adams then caught his second touchdown of the night for WSCU from Duboski for a 55-13 score with 8:45 remaining.

The Buffs scored their first safety since D.J. Ross at Tarleton State Oct. 1, 2011, as Duboski mishandled the snap at his own seven yard-line as he

wisely kicked the ball through the back of the end zone for a 57-13 deficit.

With 46 seconds remaining, Adams blocked a WT punt and returned it for 33 yards for a score and a 57-20 final.

For the game, the Buffs amassed 677 yards of offense on 34 of 44 from the air for 507 and had 30 rushes for 170 yards on the ground. Vaughan went 22 of 32 for 409 yards and five scores tying his career-high for touchdowns set last season versus Incarnate Word (Sept. 24, 2011). Halpin went a perfect 11 for 11 for 94 yards and a touchdown, while sophomore David Lehocky was 1 for 1 for four yards.

Alridge had a career-high 102 yards on 11 carries, while, for the second game in a row, the Buffs had two receivers over 100 yards as Slaughter led the way with 132 yards on six receptions and a score, while Allen had five receptions for 122 yards and two scores. Junior Trevor Hammargren also had a touchdown as he had four receptions for 34 yards, while Harris and junior wide receiver Jace Jackson each had 16-yard touchdown receptions. Last week Hammargren and Allen each had over 100 yards receiving.

Defensively, the Buffs were led by sophomore linebacker Shane Sobnosky who had six tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss for nine yards, a forced fumble and a pass breakup. Junior linebacker Taylor McCuller also had six tackles as did junior linebacker Kyle Voss. Junior defensive lineman Shane Pennix had a fumble recovery in the end zone for a touchdown. It was the first defensive touchdown since Kevin McCluskey scored on a fumble return last season in the Lone Star Football festival versus Texas A&M-Kingsville (Sept. 17, 2011).

The Buffaloes begin conference play next Saturday at the Lone Star Football Festival in Dallas at Cowboys Stadium where they will face Texas A&M-Kingsville (2-0) who upset No. 9 Abilene Christian tonight 16-13 in Abilene. Game time is scheduled for 8 p.m.

### WEST TEXAS A&M TOPPLES #14 TEXAS A&M-KINGSVILLE, 40-10

ARLINGTON – West Texas A&M quarterback Dustin Vaughan threw for 250 yards and three scores Saturday night as the unranked Buffaloes topped 14th-ranked Texas A&M-Kingsville, 40-10, in the final game of the Lone Star Football Festival at Cowboys Stadium.

Vaughan completed 19 of 29 passes and threw scoring passes of 13 yards to Trevor Hammargren and 32 yards and four yards to Lance Ratliff. The win pushes the Buffs to 2-1 overall and 1-0 in the Lone Star Conference, while the Javelinas failed to follow up on a big 16-13 road win at Abilene Christian last week, falling to 2-1 and 1-1.

WTAMU head coach Don Carthel won his 69th game at the helm of the Buffaloes as he surpassed Joe Kerbel (1960-1970) for the all-time wins in school history. Carthel now stands at 69-20 in his eighth-year and is 115-66-1 all-time in his 17th season. Kerbel was 68-41-1 during his tenure at WT.

West Texas A&M never trailed, taking a 7-0 lead on the Vaughan-to-Hammargren pass, and then eventually pushed the lead to 24-3 late in the third quarter. Ratliff had a pair of acrobatic catches in the quarter as he finished the game with three catches for 76 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Kingsville appeared to have gotten back into the game momentarily early in the fourth quarter when Sherman Batiste capped a 15-play, 75-yard drive with a 6-yard scoring catch from Nate Poppell to cut the WT lead to 24-10.

But the Buffs answered with a six-play, 83-yard drive that was capped by Khriy Robinson's 7-yard scoring run, pushing the WT lead to 31-10 with 6:36 to play. Less

than 45 seconds later, Chris Metcalf picked up a fumble and returned it 25 yards for a score to push the lead to 38-10, and Shane Sobnosky dropped Kingsville backup quarterback Bryan Ehrlich in the end zone for a safety with 1:24 to play to put an end to the scoring.

Poppell finished the game 19 for 32 with one interception, 188 yards and touchdown. Batiste caught six passes for 86 yards and one score, while Randall Toney carried the ball 10 times for 42 yards.

### NO. 25 BUFFALOES BLANK INCARNATE WORD, 24-0

SAN ANTONIO, Texas – The 25th-ranked West Texas A&M football team used a strong defensive performance Saturday night en route to a 24-0 win at University of the Incarnate Word. With the win, the Buffs improve to 3-1 on the year and 2-0 in the Lone Star Conference, while UIW falls to 1-3 and 0-2 in conference play.

The defense held UIW to just 146 yards of offense and a total of 15 yards rushing, along with recording a season-high eight sacks. WT junior linebacker Kyle Voss had a game-high 14 tackles with two sacks and three tackles for loss for 15 yards. In all, the defense had 13 tackles for loss for 81 yards, as well as forcing a fumble and an interception.

Offensively, the Buffaloes were led by junior wide receiver Lance Ratliff who had two catches for 68 yards and both were touchdowns. Junior Torrence Allen had another strong outing with nine receptions for 86 yards. Junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan was 19 of 32 with one interception for 243 yards and two scores. Senior Khiry Robinson, in his second game of the season, had 13 carries for 58 yards and four receptions for 51 yards.

Through a scoreless first quarter, the Buffs changed that quickly in the second as senior quarterback Dustin Vaughan hooked up over the middle for a 45-yard touchdown pass Ratliff 30 seconds into the quarter for a 7-0 lead.

On third and long very long for the Cardinals after a great jump and sack from Voss on second down from their own 17, Taylor Woods threw a short screen pass to Trent Rios who broke coverage for 54 yards, but the Buffalo defense came up big again pushing the Cardinals out of field goal position. On the ensuing punt, Emmanuel Nunez couldn't handle the snap and fell on the ball at the 50 where WT took over.

On a fourth and one from the 42 of UIW, the Buffs went for it as senior running back Khiry Robinson ran up the middle for two yards and a first down with 3:45 remaining in the half. The Buffs went for it again on fourth down, but didn't get to the first down marker giving the ball back to UIW with two minutes remaining in the half.

Moments later, Woods was intercepted by senior defensive back Jordan Smith with 1:24 remaining in the half at the WT 44.

A nice pass Allen gave the Buffs a first and 10 at the UIW 33 with

1:15 remaining in the half. The Buffs then had a second and seven at the 15 with 40 seconds remaining in the half. After a WT timeout, Vaughan escaped a sack and scampered to the six yard line with 25 seconds left. WT settled for a field goal from junior Sergio Castillo, Jr., for a 10-0 lead at intermission.

Just as in last week's game, it took the offense a half to get things going, but in the third quarter it got going with two touchdowns courtesy of the second Vaughan to Ratliff on a 23-yard pass, followed by some good special teams as the Buffs blocked a UIW punt as junior defensive lineman David Christmas picked up the ball and ran in for a score for a 24-0 lead.

It was the first shutout for the Buffaloes since a 49-0 win over Texas A&M-Commerce on Nov. 12, 2011. It also was the first road shutout since a 27-0 win at Angelo State on Oct. 25, 2008.

UIW was led by Rios who had 66 yards on the ground on 14 carries and had six receptions for 67 yards. Woods played instead of starter Zach Rhodes who had a concussion last week and was held out. Woods went 14 of 26 with an interception for 123 yards.

The Buffs return home to host Tarleton State next Saturday at 6 p.m. at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium.

### #23 BUFFALOES STOMP TEXANS, 41-21

CANYON, Texas – No. 23 West Texas A&M broke open a 7-7 game in the second quarter for a 41-21 victory Saturday night at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium over visiting Tarleton State. With the win, the Lone Star Conference leading Buffaloes improved to 4-1 on the year and 3-0 in conference play. Tarleton State fell to 2-2 on the year and 2-2 in league play.

“I saw two tough teams out there tonight, it was a very physical game and two really good teams squaring off against each other and the Buffaloes came through,” head coach Don Carthel said. “They answered the bell in the third quarter as Tarleton came after us and we came back and putting points on and kept our composure and the lead.”

Buffalo quarterback junior Dustin Vaughan threw 23 of 37 for 331 yards and four touchdowns, while senior running back Khiry Robinson had a season-high 125 yards on the ground on 18 carries and had a 90 receiving yards and a touchdown. Junior wide receiver Torrence Allen had a game-high 104 yards receiving with two touchdowns.

Defensively, junior linebacker Kyle Voss had a game-high 12 tackles with five solo stops and seven assisted and one tackle for loss. Junior linebacker Taylor McCuller had 11 tackles, while junior defensive lineman Ethan Westbrook had a team-high three tackles for loss with a sack.

Tarleton State was led by running back Vaughan Smith with a game-high 134 yards on the ground on 24 carries and a score. Quarterback Aaron Doyle was 15 of 27 for 196 yards and a score. Arthur Buckingham had a team-high four receptions for 69 yards and a touchdown. Three Texans had eight total tackles each to lead the team, while Rufus Johnson had three tackles for loss and six total stops.

The Texans scored first on a six play, 52-yard drive using 2:12 on the first quarter clock as Smith scampered in from 15 out for a 7-0 lead.

Redshirt freshman Jarrian Rhone returned the kick 79 yards for the Buffaloes to the TSU 15 as Vaughan hooked up with junior Trevor Hammargren for a 15-yard strike and a 7-7 score.

After a costly Doyle fumble at the WT 44 early in the second quarter, Vaughan threw a 56-yard touchdown pass to Allen for a 14-7 lead which the Buffs would never relinquish. The first two scoring drives for the Buffs were 2 plays, two touchdowns and 15 seconds of time.

Junior kicker Sergio Castillo, Jr., kicked the first of his two field goals from 22-yards out on the next WT possession.

WT came up with its third blocked kick and second blocked punt of the

season as junior linebacker Eric Finefeuiaki came untouched on the Isaac Arellano punt setting the Buffs up at the TSU 14. Vaughan and company went two plays for 14 yards and 11 seconds as Robinson caught a 14-yard pass for a 24-7 lead with 2:28 remaining in the half.

Tarleton State came out in the third quarter and put together the first of two scoring drives to get back into the contest. On 3rd and 5 from the WT 45, Doyle threw a 45-yard touchdown to Buckingham for a 24-14 score.

WT added a field goal from Castillo, Jr., on its next drive for a 27-14 lead, but TSU had the answer once again, cutting the deficit to 27-21 with 4:45 remaining in the third.

A back-breaking, unsportsmanlike conduct penalty on TSU kept the ensuing WT drive alive as the Buffs went 77 yards in 4:42 on nine plays for a redshirt freshman running back Jeremy Alridge touchdown and a 34-31 lead to answer the Texans right back.

WT added its final score of the game as it drove a season-high 93 yards in 2:22 on five plays as Vaughan capped the win with a 35-yard strike to Allen for his second score of the game and a 41-21 lead.

“I thought we ran the ball pretty well both halves and I thought we had a really good mixture of run-pass and play action pass on offense,” Carthel added. “Defensively we played a great first half and the third quarter they had some momentum and made some plays, but they are a good team and great athletes and they are going to make some plays. I was glad we took the game under control in the fourth quarter and came away with a win.”

The Buffaloes return to the road next Saturday at 6 p.m. at Angelo State, before returning home Oct. 13 for Homecoming versus rival Abilene Christian.

### NO. 21 BUFFALOES STOMP RAMS FOR FIFTH-STRAIGHT WIN, 35-9

**SAN ANGELO, Texas** – Two interceptions and one returned for a touchdown by junior defensive back Curtis Slater helped lead visiting West Texas A&M to a 35-9 win at Angelo State Saturday evening. With the win, the 21st-ranked Buffaloes improved to 5-1 overall with their fifth-straight win and a league-best 4-0 in Lone Star Conference play. Angelo fell to 3-3 on the year and 2-1 in conference play.

Junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan threw for 236 yards and three scores on 16 of 32 with one interception. Senior running back Khiry Robinson followed up his Lone Star Conference Offensive Player of the Week honor with a career-high 145 yards on the ground on 18 carries for an impressive 8.1 average.

As a team, the Buffs had 398 yards of total offense, while ASU had 332. The Buff defense was all over the field tonight as it held ASU's high-powered rushing attack to a season-low 49 yards on 25 carries (2.0 avg.). Junior linebacker Kyle Voss had a game-high 11 tackles with 2.5 tackles for loss. Slater had four tackles with three solo stops, the two interceptions, one tackle for loss, a pass breakup and two quarterback hurries.

After the Buffs had to punt on their opening possession, the Rams went seven plays for 40 yards in 2:46 for a 40-yard field goal by Jarred Martin for a 3-0 lead with just over nine minutes remaining in the first quarter.

On the Buffs next possession, Vaughan hooked up with senior Alphonse Coleman, who started for the injured Lance Ratliff, for 42 yards followed by a 32-yard run from senior Khiry Robinson setting the Buffs up with a first and goal at the four. Vaughan then threw his 18th touchdown pass of the season from 10 yards out to junior Torrence Allen for a 6-3 lead. WT went for two for an 8-3 lead with 6:53 remaining in the first quarter.

The Buffs had to punt on their next possession as junior Kevin VanVorvis pinned the Rams inside the 20. The Buff defense came up with a three-and-out and on 4th down the snap went over the punter's head and junior defensive back Dwight Morrison recovered the fumble at the ASU three. WT kicked a 24-yard field goal from junior Sergio Castillo, Jr., for an 11-3 lead early in the second quarter.

After a couple of punts by both teams, Angelo State had a great scoring opportunity as it started at the WT 28 and got to the Buff nine, but Martin missed the 26-yarder wide right as the WT defense came up with a red zone stop.

WT found itself with a 3rd and 10 from its own 20 on its next possession when Robinson broke free for a 46-yard run down to the ASU 34. From there, Vaughan hooked up with junior Nathan Slaughter over the middle for a 23-yard touchdown pass and an 18-3 lead with 4:06 remaining in the half.

Angelo held the ball for the majority of the rest of the half and got inside the 20 as Martin attempted a 39-yard field goal with 26 seconds remaining in the half and pushed it wide left as the Rams came up empty in the red zone once again.

For the half, WT had 101 yards on the ground on 17 carries and Vaughan went 11 of

20 in the air for 164 yards and two scores. The defense came up huge in the run game as it held ASU to just 22 yards rushing on 14 carries. Robinson had 84 yards rushing, while Coleman led the team with 75 yards receiving in the half on three receptions.

Angelo State began with the ball in the second half as WT forced a fourth down, but on the punt a personal foul was called on WT for roughing the kicker giving the Rams new life on the drive. Despite the foul, the WT defense came up with the stop forcing a punt.

The Ram defense got a piece of the VanVorvis punt setting ASU up again in Buffalo territory, but junior defensive back Curtis Slater stepped in front of the Blake Hamblin pass at the WT 15-line and returned it 85-yards for a touchdown and a 25-3 lead. It was the first interception return for a touchdown since Caleb Randolph returned an interception 97 yards versus Incarnate Word last season (Sept. 24).

On the ensuing Rams' possession, Slater again was on the receiving end of a Hamblin pass. This time, he returned it 39 yards setting up a field goal by Castillo, Jr., as he moved into fifth all-time in scoring with eight points thus far as he has 209 career points surpassing Norman White (1993-1996). Castillo, Jr., is 26-36 all-time in field goals and 131 of 133 in extra points.

Hamblin hooked up with Dakarai Pecikonis for a 20-yard touchdown early in the fourth quarter. On the extra-point the Buffs brought the house as ASU couldn't get the kick off for a 28-9 score.

After a stop on a fake punt by the Buff defense, the offense took over at the ASU 40. WT converted a fourth in inches on the drive and then Vaughan hooked up with Allen once again for a 23-yard touchdown strike for a 35-9 lead with 7:33 remaining.

WT returns home next week for a huge game on Homecoming against rival Abilene Christian next Saturday at 6 p.m. at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium.

### #20 BUFFALOES TROUNCE ABILENE CHRISTIAN FOR HOMECOMING, 36-0

CANYON, Texas – A dominating performance by the No. 20 West Texas A&M football team as it treated the largest crowd of the season to a 36-0 shutout of visiting Abilene Christian on Homecoming Saturday evening at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium. With the win, the Buffaloes improved to 6-1 on the year and a perfect 5-0 in the Lone Star Conference. ACU fell to 4-3 on the year and 2-3 in conference play.

The game was a dominating performance on all fronts as a season-high crowd of 13,019 saw WT outgain ACU 475-207 in total offense, including 92-3 in rushing and 383-207 in passing yards. Buffalo junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan threw for 359 yards and three scores on 32 of 45, while redshirt freshman Jarrian Rhone, who earned his first collegiate start tonight, had a career-high nine receptions for 106 yards and a score. Junior Nathan Slaughter had eight catches for 83 yards and score and junior Trevor Hammargren with three receptions for 31 yards and a score.

Senior running back Khiry Robinson had his third game of over 100 yards on the ground as he had 15 carries for 102 yards and a score as he averaged 6.8 yards per carry.

It was the eighth-consecutive win in a row on Homecoming for the Buffaloes as they improved to 42-26-2 all-time on Homecoming. WT had its second shutout of the season marking the first time accomplishing that feat since 2008 in a 27-0 win at Angelo State and a 51-0 win at home over Tarleton State. WT won 24-0 at Incarnate Word on Sept. 22 this season.

Abilene Christian suffered its first shutout since a 31-0 loss at Angelo State exactly 11 years ago to the day on Oct. 13, 2001. The Buffs snapped a string of 121-straight games with a score by the Wildcats. In addition, it was the fourth shutout in the series between ACU and WT as the Buffaloes blanked Abilene Christian 35-0 in 1921, 12-0 in 1932, 20-0 in 1997 and tonight. All four shutouts were in Canyon.

Once again, the Buffalo defense came up big as junior linebacker Taylor McCuller had 13 total tackles with seven solo stops and six assisted. He had one sack for five yards and 2.5 tackles for loss for eight yards. In all, WT had 13 tackles for loss (61 yards) tying its season-high set at Incarnate Word and eight sacks Saturday also tying the season-high set at Incarnate Word. The eight sacks totaled 50 yards against the Wildcats.

WT came up with two interceptions as reigning Lone Star Conference Defensive Player of the Week junior defensive back Curtis Slater had his third pick in his last two games and junior defensive back Chris Metcalf had his first interception on the year returning it 15 yards.

After ACU was forced to punt on its initial drive helped out by a huge junior Bryan Johnson sack, WT took the ball at its 20 and went 11 plays on 80 yards in 4:16 as Vaughan hooked up with Hammargren for a 14-yard strike and a 7-0 game. On the drive, WT converted two third downs to keep the drive alive in a very methodical drive down the field.

The Wildcats and Buffs punted on their next two possessions, but the WT special teams came up huge as junior punter Kevin VanVoris pinned ACU at its own two. Junior deep snapper Ramon Lopez ran down field and downed the ball at the two. VanVoris had five punts for 203 yards and 40.6 average for the night with a season-high four inside the 20 and a touchback. He also had six kickoffs for 390 yards for a 65.0 average and five touchbacks.

Just as the special teams made the great play to down the ball, the defense came up

with the interception on the ACU drive as junior defensive back Chris Metcalf picked off the Mitchell Gale offering returning it 15 yards. WT settled for a 35-yard field goal from junior Sergio Castillo, Jr.

The teams then traded punts and WT got the ball back with 1:19 remaining in the half. Vaughan completed a pass to redshirt freshman Jarrian Rhone on third down and had a 17-yard completion to junior Torrence Allen on 3rd and 15 from the WT 44. Castillo made a career and Lone Star Conference season-long 56-yard field goal as time expired for a 13-0 lead. The school-record field goal was a 58-yarder by Bruce Wyre against Louisville on Nov. 24, 1973.

The Buffs took the opening kick of the third quarter and went eight-play for 75 yards in 3:46 as Robinson scored from one yard out for a 20-0 lead. It was Robinson's second rushing touchdown of the season. After a three-and-out by ACU, Vaughan hooked up with Slaughter to Rhone for a 75-yard strike and a touchdown on two plays for 82 yards and a 27-0 lead with 8:37 remaining in the third. It was Rhone's first collegiate touchdown.

After punts by both teams, ACU took over at its 12. Gale was sacked by Johnson and senior Tyrell Higgins for a loss of nine yards. After an incomplete pass, Higgins and junior Shane Pennix sacked Gale in the end zone for a safety and a 29-0 lead. It was the third safety of the season for the Buffaloes.

Vaughan and Slaughter hooked up for a 31-yard score early in the fourth quarter for a 36-0 lead.

Gale was 17 of 29 with two interceptions and 207 yards and was sacked eight times. Charcandrick West had six carries for 16 yards on the ground, while he led the team in receiving yards with six receptions for 56 yards. Darrell Cantu-Harkless also had six receptions for 55 yards. Angel Lopez led the team with 13 tackles and one tackle for loss. Reigning conference sack leader, Nick Richardson had just two tackles and no sacks.

The Buffaloes return to the road for two games beginning next Saturday at 7 p.m. CT at Eastern New Mexico in the annual Wagon Wheel game and then to West Georgia for an Oct. 27 matchup with kick scheduled for 7 p.m. CT. WT then returns home to host rival Midwestern State Nov. 3 at 6 p.m. in the final regular season home game.

### STRONG SECOND HALF PROPELS NO. 17 BUFFS TO 44-21 WIN

PORTALES, N.M. – A career-high four rushing touchdowns by senior running back and three in the second half helped propel the No. 17 West Texas A&M football team to a 44-21 win over Eastern New Mexico in the annual Wagon Wheel Game at Blackwater Draw. With the win, the Buffs have won seven-straight in the Wagon Wheel series and improved to 7-1 overall this season and a league-best 6-0 in the Lone Star Conference. ENMU fell to 2-5 overall and 1-4 in conference play. WT improved to 14-11 in the Wagon Wheel Game and 15-11 overall against ENMU.

WT amassed 454 yards of offense, including 132 on the ground and 322 through the air. Robinson led the game with 137 yards rushing on 16 carries for an 8.6 average. Junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan went 19 of 32 with two interceptions and two touchdowns to go along with 312 yards. Junior wide receiver Nathan Slaughter had 127 yards and one touchdown on seven carries, while redshirt freshman Jarrion Rhone had four receptions for 89 yards and a score.

ENMU was just over its average in rushing at 205 yards for the game on 46 attempts. The Greyhounds had 391 total yards and 186 through the air. Muleshoe, Texas, native, senior quarterback Wesley Wood led the team in rushing with 92 yards and one touchdown on 15 carries. He was 15 of 31 for 188 yards and two scores through the air. Chase Kyser led the way in receiving with 92 yard and two scores on seven receptions.

Defensively, the Buffs were led by 13 tackles from junior linebacker Taylor McCuller as he had five solo stops, eight assisted tackles and a game-high three quarterback hurries. Junior defensive back Curtis Slater had 12 tackles with a game-high nine solo stops and a fumble return. Junior defensive lineman and reigning Lone Star Conference Defensive Player of the Week Ethan Westbrooks had five tackles, but tied his career-high with three sacks for 11 yards. He also had three sacks against Abilene Christian last week.

WT didn't take any time at all getting on the board as Vaughan found Slaughter for 11 yards on a third and 10 from the 39. Robinson broke about six tackles as he ran 48-yards to the one yard line setting up Robinson on a 1-yard run for a 7-0 WT lead with 13:27 left in the first half. It was Robinson's third rushing touchdown of the season.

After an ENMU punt, the Buffs went three-and-out, but junior punter Kevin VanVorhis nailed a career-long 70-yard punt which was downed at the ENMU five. A nice pass from Wood to Jacob Johnson got the Greyhounds out of their own territory. ENMU went for it on 4th-and-eight from the WT 37, but Wood tried the quick kick which went into the back of one of the ENMU players as WT junior linebacker Taylor McCuller recovered it and ran to the ENMU 44 where WT took over.

Following a holding penalty on WT, on 3rd-and-15, Vaughan threw a screen pass to Rhone who picked up the first down and then Vaughan threw a 27-yard touchdown pass to Slaughter for a 14-0 lead with 4:30 remaining in the first quarter.

Wood, on third and seven, threw a 19-yard touchdown pass to Kyser for a 14-7 score with 9:38 remaining in the first half. It was the first points the WT defense has allowed in over five quarters.

Vaughan answered as again on a third down, he threw a 58-yard touchdown pass to Rhone on a slant over the middle as Vaughn threaded the needle between two defenders for the pass and score for a 21-7 lead with just over eight minutes remaining in the second quarter.

Wood then ran in from 33-yards out to pull ENMU within 21-14 with seven seconds remaining in the half. ENMU gets the ball to start the second quarter as it averted a potential 28-7 hole.

For the half, WT had 56 yards rushing on four carries, 185 yards passing from Vaughan as he was 11 of 19 with two touchdowns and two interceptions. Robinson had 56 yards on the ground and a score, while Rhone had 89 yards and a score on four receptions. Junior linebacker Taylor McCuller had 10 total tackles in the first half, with five solo stops, while junior defensive back John McSheffery had nine total stops.

After punts by both teams, ENMU's Derek Kendall-Campbell couldn't handle the handoff from

Wood as junior defensive lineman Shane Pennix got his paw in there and forced the fumble with junior defensive back Curtis Slater recovering.

Vaughan went up top on the ensuing play as he hooked up with Slaughter for a 42-yard pass, followed by a two-yard run by Robinson for his second rushing touchdown of the game and a 28-14 lead with 9:15 remaining in the third quarter.

Robinson scored third touchdown of the game giving WT a 35-14 lead late in the third quarter as WT regained possession off a punt by the Greyhounds. Vaughan methodically moved the Buffs down the field from their 40 for the score as Robinson had two very nice runs breaking a number of tackles in the process. It was the first three rushing touchdown game for the Buffs since Kevin Thompson had three at Northeastern State on Oct. 2, 2010. It also marked Robinson's fourth consecutive game of over 100 yards rushing as he finished the third quarter with 114 yards on 12 carries.

After ENMU had just five rushing yards and 22 total yards in the third quarter, Wood hooked up with Johnson for a 31-yard pass setting the Greyhounds up at the WT 33. Wood then threw a 33-yard touchdown pass to Kyser for his second touchdown of the evening keeping ENMU in the game with 14:09 remaining at 35-21 on a four play, 65-yard drive.

Down two touchdowns and third and two from ENMU's 15, the Greyhounds were stopped for no gain and then hurried to the line and looked as if they were going to go for it, but let the play clock run down and then used their second timeout. Out of the timeout, they decided to punt and it was blocked back out of the end zone by junior linebacker Eric Finefeuiaki for a safety and a 37-21 Buff lead. It was the second blocked punt of the season for the Buffs which resulted in a safety. It also was the fourth safety of the season for the Buffs and second in as many games as Pennix recorded one last week against Abilene Christian.

Vaughan and the Buffs drove down the field on the ensuing free kick from ENMU as Slaughter had a diving catch for 26 yards at the goal line. Robinson then took it in from one yard out for his fourth rushing touchdown of the season. The last time the Buffs had a four game Keithon Fleming ran four for four versus Central Washington on Nov. 15, 2008.

The Buffs came up with a red zone stop on the next ENMU possession as Kyser couldn't come up with the catch at the goal line on fourth and two.

WT continues on the road next week as it travels to the Peach State to take on West Georgia next Saturday night at 7 p.m. CT.

UWG was led by running back David Bailey who had 70 yards and a score on the ground. Freshman quarterback Dallas Dickey had 56 yards rushing and a score, as well as going 7 for 10 for 112 yards and two touchdowns through the air.

Defensively, the Buffs were led by junior linebacker Taylor McCuller who had a career-high 20 tackles with eight solo stops. The Buffalo defense held West Georgia to just 151 yards rushing – well below its 223.14 yards per game average coming in as it was ranked 23rd nationally. The Buffs tallied five sacks for 34 yards and nine tackles for loss for 49 yards. The Buffs entered the game ranked first nationally in sacks at over four a contest and third nationally in tackles for loss at just over 10 per game.

After a three-and-out by the Buffs, West Georgia took the ball at its own 36 and drove down field with a couple of nice passes and nifty running by quarterback Dallas Dickey. Dickey then threw a 2-yard touchdown pass to David Bailey out came out of the backfield for a 7-0 lead with 8:38 remaining in the first quarter.

On the next Buffalo possession, Vaughan went over the top for a 62-yard touchdown pass on a 3rd and three, to freshman Word Hudson down the right side of the field for a touchdown and his first career score.

Just like the drive before for UWG, Bailey scored this time from three yards out for a 14-7 lead on a 10-play, 64-yard drive. Dickey also did it with his feet through the first two drives by the Wolves as he has six carries for 55 yards.

Two big catches by junior wide receiver Trevor Hammargren, followed by an 11-yard pass to Rhone set the Buffs up with a first and goal at the UWG five. After a rush and an incomplete pass, Vaughan threw a three-yard touchdown pass over the middle to senior Aarrhon Flores for a 14-14 score. It was Flores' first touchdown of the season.

A big sack by junior defensive lineman Ethan Westbrooks, his league-leading 11th of the season, forced the first three-and-out for the Wolves as the Buffs took over at their own 46 six following the 39-yard punt into the wind by Davis Brackett. Westbrooks had two sacks for the game for 12 yards.

Robinson scampered 39 yards, followed by five-yard touchdown pass from Vaughan to Rhone for the Buffs' first lead of the game at 21-14.

On the ensuing Wolves' possession, they had a fourth and four and got a first down by virtue of a WT penalty and moved it to the 50, but on fourth and nine, the punt went over Brackett's head as WT recovered deep in UWG territory.

On a fourth and one on the UWG two, WT lined up for a field goal, but junior defensive back and holder John McSheffery threw a

two-yard touchdown pass to Robinson for a 28-14 lead as WT rattled off 21-straight points in the second quarter. It was McSheffery's first career throw.

Brackett, struggled on his next punt as he shanked hit off his foot for six yards giving the Buffs good field possession with one minute remaining in the half. A nice run by Robinson and a pass from Vaughan to Rhone set WT up in the red zone once again. Vaughan connected with junior wide receiver Torrence Allen for his first catch since the Abilene Christian game for a 2nd and two from the 12 with 30 seconds remaining in the half.

Junior kicker Sergio Castillo, Jr. kicked a 29-yard field goal to give WT a 31-14 lead with 12 seconds remaining in the half. The field goal marked the fifth consecutive drive the Buffs had scored. It was his 11th made field goal of the season and the first since the Abilene Christian game.

For the half, WT led with 200 yards passing on 17 of 24 with three touchdowns from Vaughan. Robinson had 74 yards on eight carries on the ground, while Rhone led the way receiving with 66 yards and a score. Defensively, the Buffs held UWG to 45 yards passing and 91 yards rushing. WT linebacker Taylor McCuller had 12 total tackles.

West Georgia methodically moved down the field all on the ground, except one pass, on its opening possession of the second half as Dickey ran in from three yards out for a 31-21 score on 16-play, 8:03-minute drive.

Vaughan's first pass after the score was tipped at the line of scrimmage and intercepted by Tyrell Adams, but a personal foul was called on the Wolves after the pick as UWG started the drive at the WT 34.

Following the interception, Westbrooks dropped Dickey for a loss on first down, followed by a big sack from junior linebacker Kyle Voss and then on third down, Dickey was sacked by junior linebacker Bryan Johnson as Dickey fumbled and Johnson recovered.

On the first play, Vaughan threw a 46-yard touchdown pass to Allen as it completely changed the momentum UWG had gained following its first drive of the half for a 38-21 WT lead with 5:17 remaining in the third quarter.

On 3rd and 25 from the UWG 39, the Wolves picked up 23 on a screen pass and then on fourth and two UWG picked up the first down on offside WT. Dickey then went up top as he threw a 33-yard touchdown to Joey Eliezer who out-jumped sophomore Torian Oakley for the score bringing UWG to within 38-28. The touchdown marked the most points WT had given up in a game this season since allowing 44 in the season opener at Colorado State-Pueblo.

The Buffs once again answered UWG as Allen and Slaughter had key catches on the drive as Vaughan, on 3rd and goal, went play action to junior wide receiver Sidney Parker caught the pass for Vaughan's fifth touchdown pass of the game tying his season and career-high in a game.

Redshirt freshman Jeremy Alridge scampered in from just outside the goal line for a 52-28 score late in the fourth. It was Alridge's third rushing touchdown of the season.

## #10 MUSTANGS SPOIL BUFFS' SENIOR NIGHT IN HEARTBREAKING FASHION

CANYON, Texas – A punt on a 4th-and-16 ricocheted away from No. 12 West Texas A&M junior punter Kevin VanVoris as No. 10 Midwestern State's Marqui Christian recovered and ran in for the game winning touchdown giving the visiting Mustangs a 52-48 win on Senior Night at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium.

The Buffaloes (8-2, 6-1 LSC) had a 48-38 lead with 2:55 to play as they went for it on 4th and four from the six as senior quarterback Dustin Vaughan threw a touchdown pass – his third of the game to senior running back Khiry Robinson. Vaughan was 30 of 47 for 391 yards and three scores in the game, while Robinson had a career-high 147 yards on the ground on a season-high 23 carries, while catching four passes for 54 yards and a touchdown. He had a game-high 233 all-purpose yards.

From there, Midwestern State (8-1, 7-1 LSC) quarterback Brandon Kelsey threw a 16-yard pass to open its drive, followed by a 56-yard strike to Jared Freeman to the WT three. Kelsey rank in for his third rushing touchdown of the night for a 48-45 deficit.

WT recovered the onside kick and looked as if it would be able to run out the clock, but went three-and-out setting up the mishandled punt.

Following the touchdown by the Mustangs, Vaughan had 55 seconds to work and fired a 39-yard strike to Lance Ratliff getting the Buffs to the MSU 29. A big sack from Matt Ellerbrock, followed by an incomplete pass and an interception by Kendall Wrenn just outside the goal line sealed the game.

Ratliff had a career-high 180 yards and a touchdown in his first game since Sept. 29. He had a game-high 11 receptions. Redshirt freshman Jarrian Rhone had six receptions for 61 yards, while junior Torrence Allen had five receptions for 82 yards.

Defensively the Buffs were led by junior linebacker Taylor McCuller who had a game-high 12 total tackles with a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Junior linebacker Kyle Voss had eight tackles. MSU was led by Gadrion Muse who had 10 total tackles with one of two sacks and two tackles for loss.

The game was a back-and-forth affair from the start as the teams combined for 54 first downs, 1,106 total yards and 100 points. The Mustangs had 333 yards rushing on 43 attempts for a 7.7 average, while WT had 134 yards on the ground on 31 carries. MSU's Keidrick Jackson, the conference's leading rusher, had 149 yards on the ground on 20 carries and two scores.

The Buffaloes took the opening kick and drove 58 yards on 12 plays for 5:08 as junior Sergio Castillo, Jr., kicked a 34-yard field goal as the Buffs converted two third and long's on the drive, including two rushes Robinson for a combined 27 yards setting up the field goal.

Midwestern State, known for a good rushing attack, didn't disappoint in its first two drives accounting for 87 yards rushing and 47 yards passing as Kelsey and Jackson each scored touchdowns for a 14-3 lead midway through

the first quarter.

From there, the teams basically traded scores as MSU scored touchdowns on its first four drives. WT pulled within 28-24 with 3:21 remaining in the first half as Robinson has a nice rush for 26 yards, followed by a Robinson score from seven yards out.

Following a MSU punt, which was the first stop by the Buff defense in the game, Vaughan hooked up with Robinson for a 47-yard pass setting the Buffs up. Robinson then ran in from 20 out for a 31-28 lead.

MSU had a chance to tie at the end of the first half, but kicker Greg Saladino pushed a 26-yard field goal wide right. The Mustangs tied the game at 31 on their opening drive of the second half, but WT responded with the first of two miscues by MSU in the third quarter. A 37-yard punt by VanVoris was muffed by Dominique Williams as WT long-snapper junior Ramon Lopez recovered at the MSU 14.

The drive was interesting as seven of the first eight snaps resulted in penalties as Vaughan threw a 7-yard touchdown pass to junior Trevor Hammargren for a 38-31 lead. MSU running back Chauncey Harris then fumbled on the ensuing MSU possession as McCuller forced and recovered the fumble at the MSU 29.

The Buffs had first and 10 at the 11, but two incomplete passes forced Castillo to kick for a 41-31 lead with 2:28 left in the third.

A fumble by Robinson proved costly early in the fourth setting up the comeback for MSU. Ellerbrock recovered the Robinson miscue as Muse forced the fumble at the WT 20. Kelsey threw a 20-yard pass to Mark Strange for a 41-38 score with 14:02 remaining.

The Buffaloes will look to rebound next Saturday in the regular season finale at Texas A&M-Commerce. WT can still earn a share of the Lone Star Conference Championship with a win over the Lions. Game time is scheduled for 2 p.m.

### BUFFS EARN SHARE OF LSC TITLE; AWAIT POSTSEASON FATE

**COMMERCE, Texas** – For the first time since 2007, the No. 17-ranked West Texas A&M football team can call itself Lone Star Conference Champions after a 45-14 win over Texas A&M-Commerce Saturday afternoon in the regular season finale for both teams. With the win, the Buffs improved to 9-2 on the year and finished conference play with a 7-1 record tying with Midwestern State for the conference title, while TAMUC fell to 1-9 and 1-7 in league play.

The Buffs were led on the ground by senior running back Khiry Robinson as he became the first running back since Keithon Flemming in 2007. Robinson led the way with 110 yards on the ground and two scores. He has 1,015 yards and 11 rushing touchdowns for the season. Junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan, who didn't play in the fourth quarter due to the lopsided score, went 20 of 29 for 278 yards and two touchdowns. Junior wide receiver Torrence Allen had four catches for 103 yards and a score.

Defensively, the Buffs were led by juniors Shane Pennix and Taylor McCuller who each had seven tackles and each had a sack. TAMUC and the conference-leading tackler, Danny Mason, had 15 tackles on the day.

West Texas A&M will now return home and await its NCAA Tournament fate as the NCAA Division II Football Selection Show will be announced live tomorrow at 4 p.m. CT on [www.ncaa.com](http://www.ncaa.com).

The Buffs forced a three-and-out on the opening possession by the Lions on a windy day at Memorial Field as the Lions lined up for a punt at their 25. West Texas brought the heat and junior defensive back Curtis Slater blocked the punt with junior linebacker Eric Finefeuiaki scooped and scored for a 7-0 lead with just over 12 minutes remaining in the first half. It was the first punt block returned for a touchdown since junior linebacker David Christmas returned one at Incarnate Word Sept. 22, 2012, and the sixth block of the season for the Buffs.

On the second WT possession, the Buffs marched down the field following a TAMUC punt from the 50 as Robinson ran in from five yards out for a 14-0 lead midway through the first quarter. It was the tenth rushing touchdown of the season for Robinson.

A fumble forced by redshirt freshman defensive back Anthony Hayes and recovery by junior linebacker Chris Olson set the Buffs up once again near midfield as Vaughan threw a nice pass to junior wide receiver Lance Ratliff, but the Buffs were stopped on fourth and short at the 15.

Following a fumble by the Buffaloes, the Lions marched down field and Jamar Mosley ran in from 11-yards out for a 14-7 score with 2:11

remaining in the first half. It was the second rushing touchdown by a running back this season for the Lions.

WT took the ensuing kick and drove down field for a score in the final minute on a nine-play, 73-yard drive for 1:30 on the clock as it was capped on a 15-yard run from Robinson for a 21-7 lead with 35 seconds left in the half.

For the half Robinson led the way with 71 yards on the ground and two scores. Vaughan went 13 of 20 for 138 yards. TAMUC had 186 total yards, while the Buffs had 232. WT held the Lions to just 35 yards on the ground.

After Cameron Frosch punted to the WT 2-yard line on the Lions first drive of the second half, the Buffs drove 98-yards on 10 plays in 4:23 for a touchdown and a 28-7 lead. Robinson had a 20-yard run which pushed him over 1,000 yards for the season early in the drive. Vaughan, then on 3rd and 8, threw a nice 18-yard pass to junior wide receiver Torrence Allen for a first down at the TAMUC 15. Vaughan then hooked up with junior Jace Jackson for the score from 13-yards out.

The 98-yard drive was the longest of the season for the Buffs.

The Lions came right back with a nice drive as they cut the deficit back to 14 with a 5-play, 75-yard drive consuming 2:47 as Wayne Chapman scored from five-yards out for the second rushing touchdown of the game.

On the ensuing drive, Vaughan hooked up with Allen on the flea-flicker for 75-yards and a 35-14 score. They then scored, once again, early in the fourth as redshirt freshman Jeremy Alridge lead the ground attack and ran in from 12-yards out for a 42-14 score.

The Buffs added a late field goal from junior Sergio Castillo, Jr., for the final margin of 45-14.

**CHADRON, Neb.** – A career-high 235 yards rushing by West Texas A&M senior running back Khiry Robinson helped bring the No. 16/sixth-seed Buffaloes back from a 14-0 first quarter deficit for a thrilling 38-30 win over No. 20/three-seed Chadron State in the first round of the NCAA Division II Championship Saturday afternoon at Elliott Field at Don Beebe Stadium on the campus of Chadron State University. With the win, the Buffaloes advance to play at No. 2-seed Ashland University of Ohio next Saturday in the second round.

“It was a great football game with two really good teams out there,” head coach Don Carthel said. “It was a very physical game with a lot of big hits and big plays. Both offenses played very well and both defenses made some good stops to give their teams the chance to win. It’s what you would expect out of a playoff football game.”

With the win, the Buffs improved to 10-2 on the year and the 10 wins are the most in a season since 11 in 2008. It was the fourth NCAA Tournament win for WT and the first in school history on the road as the Buffs improved to 4-5 all-time in the tournament. It also was the second win against a ranked team for WT this season.

The Buffs were led by Robinson’s career-high 235 yards, but the entire team contributed time and time again Saturday. It was the most rushing yards in a game since Tyson Williams had 203 yards versus East Central on Nov. 13, 2010. Robinson had a career-high 30 carries in the game for a 7.8 average. Junior wide receiver Torrence Allen had 142 yards on seven receptions as he made big plays over and over.

Junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan struggled early as he was just 3 of 8 with two interceptions for 49 yards in the first quarter, but settled down and finished the game 19 of 31 with 269 yards and two scores. Vaughan was quite impressive with his feet as he had a season-high 10 rushes for 69 yards.

Defensively, the Buffs made big plays for the final three quarters as sophomore defensive back Torian Oakley and junior Taylor McCuller each had 11 tackles, while sophomore defensive back Chris Ceazer had 10 stops. Junior linebacker Kyle Voss had four tackles, but a huge 14-yard sack and two tackles for loss for 20 yards. WT had three sacks as CSC entered as the No. 14 team nationally in sack allowed at just .82 per game.

WT amassed 580 yards of total offense on 269 yards passing and a season-high 311 yards on the ground as the Buffs are known for its passing. The defense held the Eagles, who average 185.27 yards on the ground to just 72 yards rushing on 26 attempts.

“The heart of this football team in unexplainable,” Vaughan said. “We say all the time we are a family and we’d do anything for each other and I think we showed that today. Especially in the beginning of the game I threw those two picks and I was hoping we get something going and these guys never once questioned our ability to get going and we feed off of each other and got the offense going. I give a lot of credit to our offensive line as they have done a great job all year. That is a whole lot of the reason why we do what we do on offense.

Give credit to those guys as I love having all of that time in the pocket.”

With the Buffs up 38-23 late in the fourth, Chadron State moved right down the field as Nathan Ross caught a four-yard touchdown pass with 1:39 remaining for a 38-30 Buff lead. Off a high bounce on the onside kick, the Eagles regained possession as Kyle Vinich jumped high and got the ball at the CSC 47.

Three incomplete passes including a pass breakup by junior linebacker Brian Johnson forced CSU into a 4th and 10 from the WT 38. On a busted play, WT junior defensive lineman Ethan Westbrooks had Eagle quarterback Jonn McLain dead to rights, but McLain threw it up and somehow Allan Schmaltz caught it, but came up just inches short of a first down as WT took over on downs. Robinson ran for 45 yards to the CSC 28 clinching the win.

“When we came off the field after we scored our final touchdown, the first thing I said was this is not over,” Vaughan added. “We know very well these games are not over no matter how far ahead you are. I think the experience against MSU, although I wish we could take it back, ended up helping us at the end of the game as our defense did a great job of holding them.”

### #16 BUFFS UPSET UNDEFEATED #4 ASHLAND, 33-28

**ASHLAND, Ohio** – On a cold and breezy, November day in Ohio with light snow flurries, the No. 16 West Texas A&M football team fought through the cold and wind and pulled out a 33-28 win at No. 4 Ashland University in the second round of the NCAA Division II Super Region Four. With the win, WT improved to 11-2 on the year advanced to the Super Region Final for the first time in school history, while previously undefeated Ashland ends its season with an 11-1 record.

In a game that saw temperatures in the 20s, the Buffs fought through the coldest weather they had played in all season as the defense stepped up with two huge sacks and a bend, but don't break mentality in the final minutes for the win.

On 3rd and five from AU's 41 with just over three minutes remaining and WT clinging to a 33-28 lead, junior defensive lineman Ethan Westbrook came up with his biggest sack of the year dropping Housewright for a 10-yard loss forcing the Eagles to punt with 2:43 remaining. It was Westbrook's team and Lone Star Conference-leading 15.5 sack of the year which tied the school record for sacks in a season with Franco Glaze in 1997.

WT drained as much of the clock as it could and then punted with 48 seconds left to the 12. From there, Housewright threw three nice passes to Brian Gamble, who plays both ways, getting to the WT 26 with 12 seconds remaining. Westbrook tallied his third and school-record 16.5 sack of the season as senior defensive lineman Tyrell Higgins came up with the ball with eight seconds remaining. Vaughan and the offense took a knee for the win.

WT evened its NCAA Tournament record at 5-5 as it will play a third playoff game for the first time in school history in six appearances. The Buffs will travel to Pueblo, Colorado next Saturday to face off with the #1 ThunderWolves of Colorado State-Pueblo who topped the University of Indianapolis, 28-7 earlier in the day. A game time has not yet been set for next weekend. The ThunderWolves handed the Buffs their first loss of the season back on September 30 at the Neta and Eddie DeRose ThunderBowl, 44-34.

The Buffs were led by a stellar throwing day from Harlon Hill Finalist Dustin Vaughan as he was 35 of 50 with four touchdowns and one interception for 398 yards. Junior wide receiver Torrence Allen continued to have an impressive postseason as he tallied a career-high

13 receptions for 185 yards and three key scores, while junior wide receiver Nathan Slaughter had 10 receptions for 98 yards.

Defensively, the Buffs had players step up all over the field as junior linebacker Taylor McCuller led the team with 12 total tackles, while junior linebacker Kyle Voss was second with nine stops. Just like in the Chadron State game last week, the defensive backs continued to make big plays as junior defensive back Curtis Slater, sophomore Torian Oakley and senior Jordan Smith all came up with interceptions on fellow Harlon Hill Finalist Taylor Housewright who had just one interception all season coming in for Ashland. The defensive line forced four sacks for 24 yards and 10 tackles for loss for 39 yards, while recovering a punt to win the turnover battle 4-2.

The Eagles were led by Anthony Taylor on the ground as he had a game-high 156 yards and a score on 22 carries. Housewright was 20 of 34 with three interceptions and 166 yards to go along with two touchdowns. Gamble led the team with 66 yards receiving, while Taylor and Anthony Capasso caught the Housewright scores.

Gamble led all defensive players with 14 tackles as he was all over the field and had nine solo stops. Cody Bloom was second with 12 tackles, while Mike Millan added nine stops.

### #16 BUFFS GET REVENGE WITH 34-13 UPSET WIN AT #1 CSU-PUEBLO

**PUEBLO, Colo.** – The West Texas A&M football team exacted some revenge Saturday with a dominating performance on both sides of the ball as it upset top-ranked Colorado State-Pueblo at the Netta and Eddie DeRose ThunderBowl with a 34-13 win in the NCAA Quarterfinal. With the win the Buffs improved to 12-2 on the year, while CSU-Pueblo ended its season a 12-1.

The Buffs, who avenged a season-opening 44-34 loss to these same Thunderwolves Aug. 30, silenced the announced crowd of 10,217 midway through the first half. However, the Buffs had a nice contingent of fans of approximately 800 who made the five-hour trip from Canyon.

West Texas A&M should find out where and when it will play top-seeded out of Super Region One and second-ranked Winston-Salem State Sunday.

WT was led by junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan who passed for 324 yards and three scores on 24 of 38 passes with one interception. Senior running back Khiry Robinson tallied 181 yards on the ground and had two catches for 14 yards with a score. Junior wide receiver Nathan Slaughter came up with catch after catch after catch as he tallied 170 yards receiving and two touchdowns on seven receptions.

Defensively the Buffs dominated the CSU-Pueblo this time as it held the high-powered Thunderwolves' rushing offense to just 32 yards on the ground as CSUP had 265 yards on the ground in the first meeting in August. CSUP quarterback Ross Dausin didn't have a lot of time in the pocket as the relentless WT defense sacked him seven times for 46 yards led by junior defensive lineman Ethan Westbrooks who had 2.5 sacks for 21 yards and a forced fumble. He now has a school-record 19 sacks on the season. Junior linebacker Taylor McCuller had 14 tackles in the game including eight solo stops as he broke the school-record for tackles in a season with 155 as Joe Calhoun had 151 in 1995.

WT amassed 517 yards of offense as they had 193 yards on the ground and 324 through the air and held CSUP to just 225 yards of total offense. For the second straight week, the Buffs have knocked off an undefeated and top five ranked team as WT won at No. 4 Ashland last week 33-28.

There was an energy and a confidence from the opening kick on the Buffalo sideline as the teams traded punts for the first three possessions and the Buffs turned the ball over on downs on a 4th and 1 from the CSU-Pueblo 45 midway through the first quarter.

The WT defense came up big with a stop as junior linebacker Bryan Johnson came up with the first sack of the game forcing a punt.

That's when the WT offense started clicking as the Buffs marched a season-high 94 yards on three plays in just 1:19 of time as Vaughan completed two passes to Nathan Slaughter for 91 yards, including a 74-yard strike on a flea-flicker as Slaughter caught it on the near side and reversed field for a 7-0

lead.

The Thunderwolves went 18 plays in 8:03, but the bend, but don't break WT defense came up huge once again as senior defensive lineman came up with a huge nine-yard sack on Dausin on a 3rd and six from the WT eight yard line forcing a field goal.

The Buffaloes came right back with an 8-play, 71-yard drive as Vaughan and Slaughter hooked up once again on a 40-yard pass down the CSUP 31. Another 10-yard pass to Slaughter put the Buffs on the 17. On 3rd and goal from the goal line, Vaughan threw a pass to Robinson in the end zone for a 21-3 lead.

WT took over late in the second quarter after senior defensive back Jordan Smith picked off Dausin for Smith's third interception of the season. The Buffs marched from their own 21 to the CSUP 28 as junior kicker Sergio Castillo, Jr., kicked a 45-yard field goal with seven seconds remaining in the half for a 24-3 lead.

WT put the game out of reach on the defensive side as Westbrooks sacked and forced a Dausin fumble as junior linebacker LeBrandon Mosley picked up the loose ball and ran in from 26-yards out on the ensuing CSUP possession for a 34-6 lead late in the third quarter. It was first fumble returned for a touchdown by the Buffs since Chris Metcalf returned one 25 yards versus Texas A&M-Kingsville in Cowboys Stadium earlier this season.

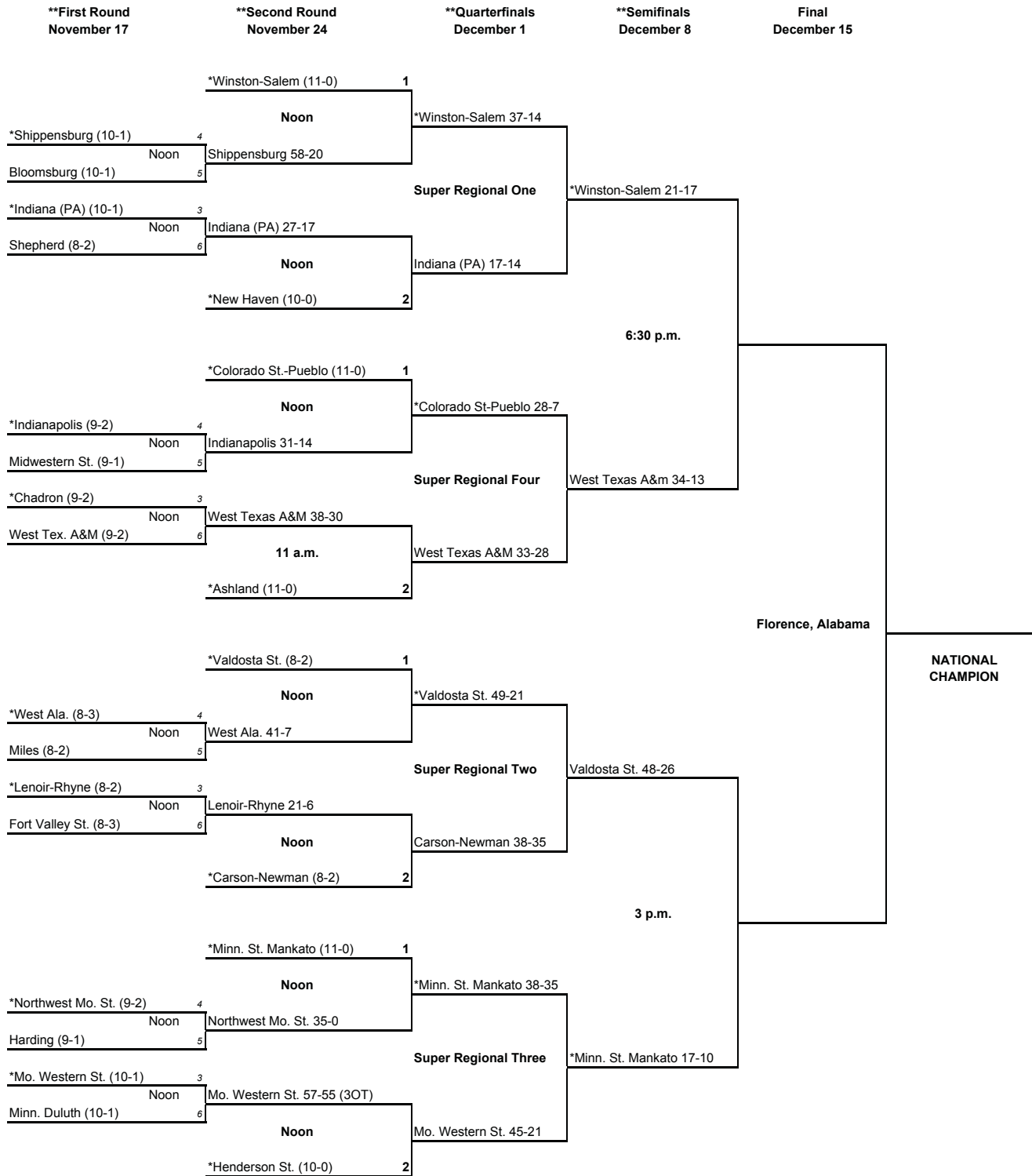
