ABOUT THE SERIES

Colorado School of Mines and Washburn have met on the gridiron 15 times, with the Ichabods holding an 11-4 advantage in the all-time series dating back to 1953. The two teams played every year from 1953-1959 and again from 1961-1964 before resuming the series in 2004 when the Orediggers defeated Washburn, 34-27, in the season opener for both teams in Topeka, KS. Last year, WU captured its third straight victory over CSM with a 27-7 win at Brooks Field in Golden. Below is a complete list of the all-time CSM vs. Washburn series.

THE HEAD COACHES

Bob Stitt is in his ninth season as the head coach at CSM and claims a 51-39 (.567) overall record. Stitt's .567 winning percentage is the highest by a CSM football coach who has coached in at least 20 games and the highest for a modern day coach at CSM. In addition, Stitt's 51 wins are the third most in CSM history and trail only Marv Kay (84 wins from 1969-1995) and Fritz Brennecke (78 wins from 1947-1969). Stitt is 1-3 all-time vs. Washburn.

Washburn is led by seventh-year Head Coach **Craig Schurig**, who played his collegiate football at Colorado School of Mines. The 2005 MIAA Coach of the Year, Schurig was a four-year letterman as a defensive back for the Orediggers and was selected team captain as a senior when he garnered Second Team All-Conference accolades. Schurig earned a bachelor's degree in Petroleum Engineering from CSM in 1987. Schurig claims an overall mark of 40-29 at Washburn. Schurig is 3-1 all-time against his alma mater.

ALL-TIME RECORD

CSM claims a 375-517-30 (.420) all-time record in what is now its 121st season of collegiate football. The Orediggers' first-ever football game, a 6-4 win over Denver University, was played in 1888.

CSM vs. THE "W's"

CSM is 68-89-3 all-time against the eight schools it has played that begin with the letter "W". After falling to Washburn University to open the 2007 season, the Orediggers defeated Western N.M. Univ. (38-21) and Western State (21-7) during the RMAC portion of their schedule. CSM fell to Western Oregon, 26-12, in the Dixie Rotary Bowl last December.

Bob Stitt returns for his ninth season as the head football coach at Colorado School of Mines in 2008.

During his first eight years, Stitt has guided the Orediggers to a 51-39 overall record, including a 36-29 mark in the RMAC. Stitt's .567 winning % is the highest by a Mines football coach who has coached in at least 20 games and the highest for a modern day coach at CSM.

Mines compiled a 6-2 mark in the RMAC (7-5 overall) and earned a berth in one of just two sanctioned NCAA Division II bowl games - the Dixie Rotary Bowl - in 2007. With their 7-5 overall record in 2007, the Orediggers secured their sixth winning season in the past seven years. The 2007 Dixie Rotary Bowl marked the second time in four years that the CSM football team had advanced into the post-season, and the third time in program history that the Orediggers had played in a post-season bowl game. CSM landed 14 All-RMAC selections and two All-Region picks in 2007 while six players earned recognition on the NFF's All-Colorado Teams. Furthermore, Derek Dykstra was selected to participate in the Valero Cactus Bowl (NCAA Division II football all-star game).

In 2006, the Orediggers (4-7 overall, 2-6 RMAC) had 12 All-RMAC, five All-Region and seven NFF All-Colorado selections. Michael Curl earned Honorable Mention All-American honors and Bryan Florendo, who became the first Oredigger to rush for 1,000 yards (1,018) since 1939, was selected as the Offensive Player of the Year on the NFF's All-Colorado Team.

The Orediggers' 6-5 overall record in 2005 gave CSM its fifth consecutive winning season, marking the first time that had happened in the 118-year history of the program. Mines placed 13 players on the All-RMAC teams while three earned All-Region recognition.

In 2004, Stitt led the Orediggers to the best season in school history as the team went undefeated (8-0) in conference play and captured its first RMAC title since 1958. In addition, the 2004 squad posted a perfect 11-0 mark in the regular season and advanced to the NCAA Division II playoffs for the first time in program history. In the opening round, Stitt led CSM to a 52-33 home victory over Midwestern State. Mines was defeated in the second round of the playoffs at top-ranked Pittsburg State - the eventual national runner-up - to end its season and also snap a school-record 14-game winning streak, which was the second longest in Division II at the time. The record-setting 2004 season helped earn Stitt RMAC Coach of the Year, Division II AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year and d2football.com Southwest Regional Coach of the Year accolades.

Furthermore, Stitt was instrumental in helping senior QB Chad Frieauf win the 19th Annual Harlon Hill Trophy in 2004 as the top player in NCAA Division II. Frieauf, who established an NCAA Division II single-season record for passing yards (4,646) in 2004, became the first player from CSM and the RMAC to win the Harlon Hill Trophy. A total of 18 Orediggers earned both All-RMAC and NFF All-Colorado honors in 2004, while six players brought home All-Region laurels. Three players also went on to garner All-American recognition, including Frieauf, Daniel Leger and Justin Gallas.

During his second and third seasons at Mines (2001 and 2002), Stitt guided the Orediggers to back-to-back 7-4 finishes. The seven wins in 2001, which marked the first winning season for Mines since 1991 (6-4), were the most by the Orediggers since 1958. The 2001 and 2002 seasons also marked the first time since 1975 and 1976 that the CSM football team had produced consecutive winning years.

During his tenure at CSM, Stitt has coached a grand total of 93 All-RMAC performers, 19 All-Region selections and four All-Americans.

Before coming to Mines, Stitt most recently served as an offensive coordinator at Harvard University, helping the Crimson set school records in total offense in a game (640 yards), passing yards in a game (405), first downs in a game (34) and points scored in an Ivy League game (63). Stitt's 1999 offense ranked first among Ivy League teams in rushing, third in scoring and fourth in total offense.

A graduate of Doane College (Nebraska), Stitt received various

accolades as a running back and a return specialist - including All-State College Offensive Player of the Year in 1985 - when he played for the Tigers in the mid-80's. Stitt also played left field for the Doane baseball squad and competed in the 4x100m relay on the track & field team. Stitt returned to coach at his alma mater after receiving his master's degree in Physical Education from the University of Northern Colorado in 1989. The offensive coordinator and offensive line coach for four years at Doane, Stitt produced three NIAA Division II All-Americans and 19 All-NIAC offensive players during his tenure. Stitt went on to coach at Austin College (Texas) from 1994 to 1999, serving as the assistant head coach and the coordinator of offense and special teams, before he moved on to Harvard.

A native of Tecumseh, Nebraska, Stitt lettered in football, basketball, track & field and baseball at Tecumseh High School. Stitt and his wife, the former Joan Scherrer, reside in Arvada with their sons, Joe (9) and Sam (4).

ALL ABOUT WASHBURN UNIVERSITY

Washburn University is an NCAA Division II school in Topeka, Kansas. Washburn, which has an enrollment of 7,000, is a member of the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. In 2007, the Ichabods went 8-4 overall and finished second in the MIAA with a 7-2 mark in conference play. WU made its second appearance in the NCAA Division II playoffs in three years last fall and dropped a 40-39 decision to West Texas A&M University in the first round. The Ichabods, who return 43 letterwinners in 2008, play their home games at Yager Stadium at Moore Bowl. Washburn has a 483-537-44 (.467) all-time record entering what is now its 117th season of football. For more information about Washburn football, visit <http://www.wusports.com>.

WHEN THE ICHABODS HAVE THE BALL...

Sophomore QB Jake Iverson appeared in four games as a redshirt freshman in 2007 and attempted only six passes. Senior RB Brandon Walker, WU's Offensive Player of the Year last fall, rushed for 760 yards and earned Second Team All-MIAA honors in 2007. Washburn has produced a 1,000-yard rusher in five of the past six seasons.

...AND WHEN THEY DON'T

In 2007, Washburn led the MIAA in turnover margin and collected a league-best 39 turnovers. Junior LB Zach Watkins, who earned 2008 Pre-Season All-America Honors from *Lindy's Magazine*, led the MIAA with 143 total tackles (64 solo) last fall and senior DL Eric Lawrence recorded a team-most 14.5 tackles for a loss in 2007. Junior LB Michael Wilhoite had 58 tackles and three interceptions a season ago.

COLORADO CONNECTION

The Ichabods have six players on their roster from the state of Colorado. The Orediggers have 61 players on their 2008 roster who hail from Colorado.

UP NEXT FOR CSM...FORT HAYS STATE UNIVERSITY (Sept. 6th in Golden)

in a series that dates back to 1946. FHSU defeated Colorado School of Mines by the score of 34-10 on September 8th, 2007, at Lewis Field Stadium in Hays, Kansas. The Orediggers' last victory over the Tigers came in 2006 (31-24) in Golden.

DID YOU KNOW?

Since he took over as the head coach at CSM in 2000 (90 games), **Bob Stitt's** record at home (26-19) is nearly identical to his record on the road (25-19). Stitt is 0-1 in neutral-site contests (2007 Dixie Rotary Bowl).

WIN-WIN SITUATION

The Orediggers went 7-5 overall (6-2 RMAC) in 2007 to secure their sixth winning season in the past seven years.

2008 PRE-SEASON RMAC FOOTBALL COACHES POLL

CSM was picked to finish fourth in the 2008 RMAC Pre-Season Coaches Poll. Chadron State, which brought home seven of the 10 first-place votes, was tabbed first. The Eagles were followed by Mesa State (three first-place votes) and Nebraska - Kearney. Western N.M. University and Adams State were selected fifth and sixth, respectively, while N.M. Highlands University and Western State tied for seventh. Fort Lewis and first-year program CSU - Pueblo rounded out the poll at ninth and tenth.

OREDIGGERS GO BOWLING

CSM's trip to the 2007 Dixie Rotary Bowl marked the third time in program history that Mines had competed in a bowl game. In the first-ever meeting between the two teams, Western Oregon defeated CSM by the score of 26-12 in the 2007 Dixie Rotary Bowl on 12/01/07 in St. George, Utah. Senior LB **A.J. Montalvo**, who will wear #33 instead of #48 this season, was selected as CSM's MVP of the 2007 Dixie Rotary Bowl. Mines played in the Aztec Bowl in 1979 (vs. Guadalajara Univ.; W, 30-14) and again in 1989 (vs. Univ. of Mexico All-Stars; L, 29-49). The 2007 Dixie Rotary Bowl also marked the second time in four years that Mines had qualified for post-season play. CSM qualified for the NCAA II playoffs for the first time in program history in 2004.

PRE-SEASON ALL-RMAC SELECTIONS

Five Orediggers were named to the 2008 Pre-Season All-RMAC squad, including sophomore RB **J.T. Baum**, senior DB **Drew Ferren**, junior LB **Nick Haniszewski**, sophomore KR **Tom Kastens** and sophomore DL **Marc Schiechl**.

SCHIECHL NAMED 2008 PRE-SEASON ALL-NCAA II BY Lindy's Magazine

Sophomore DL **Marc Schiechl** has earned Pre-Season Second Team All-NCAA Division II honors from *Lindy's Magazine* for the 2008 season. Schiechl established new individual single-season school records for tackles-for-a-loss (17.5) and sacks (13.5) as a redshirt freshman in 2007. The owner of 47 total tackles (18 solo) in 2007, Schiechl also finished third in the nation (NCAA Division II) and second in the RMAC in sacks per game (1.13) last fall. An NFF First Team All-Colorado, Second Team All-RMAC and Second Team All-Southwest Region selection last year, Schiechl was selected as the 2007 RMAC Defensive Freshman of the Year. Schiechl established a new individual single-game school record with 4.0 sacks on 10/06/07 at NMHU, as well.

IN THE POLLS

The Orediggers and the Ichabods are both listed in the "receiving votes" section of the American Football Coaches Association's (AFCA) 2008 pre-season national poll. CSM received two votes and Washburn received 64 votes. CSM did not finish in the top 25 of any of the final 2007 national polls. Washburn finished the 2007 season ranked 24th in the final AFCA national poll and 21st in the d2football.com national poll.

MINES LANDS 14 ON 2007 ALL-RMAC TEAMS

A grand total of 14 Orediggers earned post-season honors from the RMAC in 2007. Earning First Team All-RMAC laurels were WR **Derek Dykstra**, OL **Stephen Immel**, DB **Drew Ferren** and DL **Marin Richardson**. DB **Kevin Folly-Kossi**, LB **Hunter Wardlaw** and DL **Marc Schiechl** were Second Team All-RMAC selections while QB **David Pesek**, WR **Adam Saur**, OL **James Tyree**, OL **James Reeves**, PK **Aaron Abel**, LB **Nick Haniszewski** and DL **Blaine Sumner** were Honorable Mention All-RMAC picks.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES - 2007 NATIONAL LEADER IN QB SACKS

The CSM defense led the nation (NCAA II) in sacks per game (4.67) and established a new single-season school record for sacks (56) in 2007. CSM also established a new single-game school record for sacks with 14 during a 41-13 win at OPSU on 09/29/07.

BLOCK PARTY

CSM recorded 11 blocked kicks in 2007 (inclusive of punts, field goal attempts and extra point attempts). **Kevin Folly-Kossi** had three blocked kicks and **Nick Haniszewski** blocked two. From 2000-06 (seven seasons), CSM blocked a total of 10 kicks.

CSM REPRESENTED IN 2008 VALERO CACTUS BOWL

Former Oredigger **Derek Dykstra** competed for the West All Stars in the 2008 Valero Cactus Bowl - the annual NCAA II post-season all-star football game - on 01/11/08 in Kingsville, Texas. Dykstra finished the contest with two receptions for 22 yards.

BENSON TO LEAD CSM DEFENSE IN 2008

Bob Benson begins his first season as the Orediggers' Associate Head Coach, Defensive Coordinator and DB Coach in 2008. During the 2006 and 2007 seasons, Benson was the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Towson University. During his first year with the Tigers, Benson's defense reduced its margin of points per game allowed by 13 from the previous season. In 2007, Towson's defense finished the regular season ranked second in the CAA in scoring defense, third in pass defense and fifth in overall defense. Prior to his arrival at Towson, Benson spent 13 years (1993-05) as the head football coach at Georgetown University. Benson compiled a 72-64-0 overall record during his time at Georgetown and led the Hoyas to six consecutive winning seasons from 1994-99. During that six-year stretch, the Hoyas went 44-17 overall and won or shared three MAAC titles. Benson's 2005 defense finished fourth in the country in passing defense. Following the 1997 and 1998 seasons, Benson was selected as the MAAC Coach of the Year. Benson's 1997 squad also earned a berth in the ECAC-IFC Bowl game, marking Georgetown's first post-season appearance since the 1950 Sun Bowl. Benson subsequently received Georgetown's Outstanding Coaching Achievement Award. Benson's 1998 and 1999 teams posted back-to-back 9-2 seasons, tying the school record for single-season victories. In their final four seasons in the MAAC, the Hoyas went 29-3 in league play. In 1995 and 1996, Georgetown led NCAA Division I-AA in total defense. After leading the nation in passing efficiency defense in 1993, Georgetown's 1995 squad led the country in rushing defense (53.2 ypg). Benson departed the Georgetown football team with the second-highest number of coaching victories (72) in program history. From 1990-92, Benson was the defensive coordinator at Johns Hopkins University. Before his arrival at Johns Hopkins, Benson was the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Worcester Polytechnic Institute from 1988-89. Benson began his collegiate coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Albany in 1986.

MAKING THE GRADE

A grand total of 12 Orediggers qualified for Academic All-RMAC recognition in 2007, including **Keegan Moyer**, **Robbin Vinnola**, **Zach Meints**, **Drew Ferren**, **Kevin Folly-Kossi** and **Dillon Davisson**.

ARRIVING IN THE NICK OF TIME

Junior LB **Nick Haniszewski** led CSM in solo tackles (41), assisted tackles (tied - 57) and total tackles (98) during the 2007 regular season. Haniszewski concluded the 2007 season with 10.0 tackles for a loss, six passes defended, 4.0 sacks and two blocked kicks while starting all 12 games. Even more, Haniszewski finished seventh in the RMAC in tackles per game (8.2) this fall. Led by Haniszewski, the CSM defense finished second in the RMAC in rushing defense (90.3 ypg) and total defense (292.9 ypg) in 2007.

THEY'VE GOT A LITTLE CAPTAIN IN THEM

Senior defensive back **Drew Ferren** and junior quarterback QB **David Pesek** will serve as the Orediggers' team captains in 2008.

ON THE HUNT

Junior LB **Hunter Wardlaw**, who started all 12 games in 2007, led the Orediggers in assisted tackles (tied - 57) and finished second on the team in total tackles (81) last season. Wardlaw concluded the 2007 campaign with 6.0 tackles for a loss, 3.5 sacks, one interception, three passes defended, one forced fumble, a pair of fumble recoveries and one QB hurry. A Pre-Season All-RMAC selection last fall, Wardlaw guided the 2007 CSM defense that finished third in the RMAC in scoring defense (19.2 points allowed per

PESEK MAKING HEADLINES ON AND OFF THE FIELD

Junior QB **David Pesek**, who led the RMAC in total offense (247.0 ypg) and passing (243.9 ypg) while starting all 12 contests last season, earned Honorable Mention All-RMAC recognition in 2007. Pesek amassed a 122.63 QB rating while completing 274-of-436 passes (62.8%) for 2,927 yards and 16 TD during his sophomore year. In June of 2008, Pesek traveled to Afghanistan with eight other men from his church to embark upon a seven-day goodwill trip in the refugee camp of Berek Aub. Pesek's group traveled 36 hours across 17 countries and 10 time zones in an effort to support Berek Aub's need for construction, health care and education. Pesek's trip to Afghanistan was covered in *The Golden Transcript* and on the NCAA football webpage at <http://www.ncaa.com>.

DREW'S CREW

Senior DB **Drew Ferren**, who was named to the 2008 Pre-Season All-RMAC team, finished third on the team in solo tackles (35) and fourth in both total tackles (64) and assisted tackles (tied - 29) while starting all 12 games as a junior in 2007. Ferren led the Orediggers and tied for second in the RMAC with five interceptions (one touchdown) last fall. Ferren garnered NFF First Team All-Colorado and First Team All-RMAC recognition in 2007 while finishing second on the team in passes defended (eight).

BREAKING UP IS HARD TO DO

Senior DB **Kevin Folly-Kossi** led CSM with nine passes defended during his junior season in 2007. Folly-Kossi, who finished with 34 total tackles (10 solo), one fumble recovery and a team-most three blocked kicks last year, earned Second Team All-RMAC and NFF Second Team All-Colorado accolades in 2007.

A SAUR TASTE FOR OPPONENTS

Junior WR **Adam Saur** finished second on the team in receptions (48), receiving yards (695) and TD receptions (four) while starting all 12 games in 2007. Saur, who averaged 14.5 yards per catch a season ago, earned Honorable Mention All-RMAC honors last fall.

ON THE RUN

Sophomore RB **J.T. Baum** led CSM with 433 yards rushing in 2007. Baum, who was named to the 2008 Pre-Season All-RMAC team, averaged 3.8 yards per carry last fall and caught 22 passes for 95 yards. Junior RB **Keegan Moyer** had 50 carries for a team-second-best 147 yards during his sophomore season in 2007 (2.9 yards per carry). Moyer also hauled in 39 passes for 222 yards (5.7 yards per catch) while leading CSM in kickoff returns (11) and kickoff return yards (232).

BIG BEN

Junior DB **Ben Tiller** finished second on the team in solo tackles (39) and third in total tackles (66) while starting all 12 games in 2007. Tiller, who recorded five passes defended last fall, was second on team with three INT (one touchdown) in 2007.
