UCO ON THE ROAD: Central Oklahoma's rugged early-season schedule continues Saturday when the Bronchos travel to Topeka, Kan. to take on Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association rival and No. 18-ranked Washburn.

Kickoff at 7,200-seat Yager Stadium is 2:37 p.m. in the MIAA TV Game of the Week.

UCO is 0-3 on the season and in the league, while the Ichabods are 3-0 overall and in the conference.

The game will be carried in Oklahoma by Cox Communications (channel 3/703 HD).

The Bronchos were picked 10th by the coaches and 11th by the media in the pre-season MIAA poll, while WU was tabbed fourth by the media and sixth by the coaches.

ABOUT THE SERIES: UCO and Washburn are tied 1-1 in a short series that started in 2011.

The Ichabods won the initial game, 48-3 in Topeka, with the Bronchos pulling off a 38-20 upset of ninth-rated Washburn last year in Edmond.

ROAD WOES: The Bronchos have lost 16 of their last 17 road games. UCO ended a 15-game road losing streak that dated back to 2009 in its final away contest last season, routing Lincoln 56-25.

The Bronchos dropped their first road game this season at Missouri Southern 52-38.

LAST YEAR: A cross-country touchdown pass and short interception return sparked UCO in last year's 35-20 upset of No. 9-ranked Washburn in Edmond. **Adrian Nelson's** 92-yard touchdown pass to **Marquis Walters** and a 25-yard interception return by **Colton Byford** turned a 14-6 deficit into a 20-14 lead and the Bronchos went on to earn their first-ever MIAA win.

Nelson ended up 14-of-29 passing for 218 yards, while **Joshua Birmingham** added 22 carries for 137 yards rushing.

LAST WEEK: UCO rolled up 566 total yards against Emporia State last Saturday at Wantland Stadium, but the Hornets finished with 699 yards and threw seven touchdown passes in a 54-38 win. **Marquez Clark** had a single-game school record 13 receptions and **Joshua Birmingham** scored three touchdowns in becoming the school's all-time leading scorer.

NEXT WEEK: UCO returns home to host MIAA foe Central Missouri.

THE COACH: In his second year as head coach at Central Oklahoma is **Nick Bobeck**, who returned to his alma mater in January 2012 after a phenomenal four-year stint at Navarro (Texas) College.

A four-year standout at fullback for UCO from 1999-02, **Bobek** went 42-5 at Navarro and led the Bulldogs to the 2010 junior college national title. **Bobek** is 2-11 with the Bronchos.

ON THE AIR: All UCO games will be broadcast live on the True Oldies Channel, KZLS-99.7FM and KOAG-1640AM.

Veteran broadcaster **David Garrett** calls the action, with former UCO All-American **John Fitzgerald** adding color commentary.

BRONCHO NICKNAME

Bronchos was the nickname selected for Central Oklahoma in 1922 by Mrs. C.W. Wantland, wife of long-time football coach C.W. Wantland.

The name was chosen from a number of suggestions for the name of UCO's football team and became the nickname for all athletic teams at the school.

UCO FOOTBALL TIDBITS

⇒ The Bronchos have won 31 conference/division championships.

⇒ UCO has won more games than any other Oklahoma college team besides the University of Oklahoma.

⇒ The Bronchos have won seven or more games in a season 38 times.

⇒ UCO has had seven Harlon Hill Trophy candidates: RB Tyrone Jones (1993), RB Joe Aska ('94), RB Reggie Donner ('98), WR Dee Dee Carter ('01), RB Jarrod Manoy ('03), QB Justin Allgood ('04) and RB Joshua Birmingham ('10).

⇒ The Bronchos have had 18 players drafted into the NFL and former star Keith Traylor won three Super Bowl rings during a 17-year career.

DYNAMIC DUO

JOSHUA BIRMINGHAM

Running back **Joshua Birmingham** continued his stellar season against Emporia State last Saturday en route to become UCO's all-time leading scorer.

The senior star had 15 carries for 93 yards with touchdown runs of one, three and seven yards in addition to catching seven passes for 44 yards and returning three kickoffs for 55 yards in finishing with 192 all-purpose yards.

Birmingham took over as the school's career leading scorer with 318 points (53 TDs), breaking the record of 300 set by **James Hooks** from 1969-72.

He continues to lead the MIAA in rushing (138.0 yards/game) and scoring (18.0 points/game) and is second in all-purpose yardage (232.0 yards/game).

In NCAA Division II national statistics, **Birmingham** ranks first in scoring, sixth in all-purpose and 12th in rushing.

He's had 11 runs of 10-plus yards this season, including runs of 43 and 73 yards.

Birmingham already owns the school career mark for all-purpose yards (5,325) and he's now second in career rushing yards (3,619) and receptions (141).

He needs 742 yards to break the rushing record of 4,360 and 33 catches to surpass the receptions mark of 173.

MARQUEZ CLARK

Wide receiver **Marquez Clark** has quickly turned into one of the most dangerous offensive weapons in NCAA Division II.

The junior standout had 12 receptions in the first two games before breaking loose with a school-record 13-catch game last week against Emporia State. He piled up 236 receiving yards -- the third-best total in UCO history -- and had three catches of 34-plus yards, including a 48-yard touchdown.

Clark added a 21-yard punt return, four kickoff returns for 67 yards and a 14-yard run in finishing with 338 all-purpose yards, the second-best single-game total at UCO.

In three games, **Clark** has already accumulated 757 all-purpose yards, a 253.3 per-game average that leads the MIAA and ranks second nationally.

He's also second in the league and nation in both receiving yards (472) and receiving yards per game (157.3) while ranking second in the conference and 15th in Division II in receptions per game (8.3).

Clark is averaging 24.9 yards a play for the Bronchos -- 26.1 on kickoff returns (9-235), 18.9 on receptions (25-472), 16.0 on punt returns (2-32) and 6.0 on rushes (3-18).

BRONCHOS ARE YOUNG: UCO has an extremely young team in 2013, featuring 70 underclassmen on the 96-player roster with 34 freshmen, 21 sophomores and 15 redshirt freshmen.

Twenty-three of the 43 players who saw action against Emporia State were underclassmen -- 12 sophomores, nine redshirt freshmen and two true freshmen.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE: UCO had one of the most productive offensive outings in its long history last week as the Bronchos finished with 566 total yards, the ninth-best game in school history.

Central passed for 362 yards -- the eighth-highest single-game total -- and added 204 rushing, with 370 of the total yards coming in the second half. The Bronchos ran 77 plays in the game and averaged 7.4 yards a snap.

UCO had four touchdown drives of 60-plus yards last week (63, 65, 70 and 82).

The Bronchos are third in the MIAA in total offense with a 502.7-yard per-game average, ranking eighth in rushing (208.0 yards/game) and fourth in passing (294.7 yards/game).

NELSON THROWS IT: Senior QB **Adrian Nelson** had the biggest game of his two-year, 12-game UCO career against Emporia State, completing 26-of-42 passes for 362 yards and a touchdown while also rushing seven times for 56 yards and one TD.

The 418 total yards ranks fourth on UCO's single-game list and the 362 passing yards was the seventh-best game in school history.

Nelson ranks fourth in the MIAA in passing yards per-game (294.7) and already has 884 yards on the season with 61 completions in 108 attempts (56.5 percent). He has 2,661 career passing yards, needing 297 to move into 10th place on UCO's all-time list.

GOOD PROTECTION: UCO's offensive line did its job against Emporia State, not allowing a sack despite 42 passing attempts and a new starter in the lineup.

Senior C **Cameron Pound**, sophomore RG **Landon Chappell**, redshirt freshman LG **Mason McLaughlin** and freshman LT **Brandon Waggoner** all started for the third consecutive game, while redshirt freshman RT **Micah Goodman** made his first career start in place of injured sophomore **Denton Simek**.

The o-line has given up just three sacks in three games and 111 pass attempts.

HOOD MOVES UP: Junior WR **Christian Hood** caught two passes for 22 yards last week to move up the ladder on UCO's career receptions list.

He's now eighth with 104 career catches, needing two more for seventh and nine more for sixth.

ABOUT THE DEFENSE: UCO didn't have much luck slowing down high-powered Emporia State last week as the Hornets set Wantland Stadium records for passing yards (522), total yards (699) and passing touchdowns (seven).

The Bronchos are last in the 14-team MIAA in total defense, allowing 590.3 yards a game -- 330.7 passing (14th) and 259.7 rushing (12th).

SHOECRAFT SMASHES 'EM: Senior LB **Adrian Shoecraft** tied a UCO career high with 11 tackles against Emporia State, making five solo stops and six assisted ones.

Shoecraft tops the Bronchos with 28 tackles (12 solo) for the season to go with two pass break-ups.

HILL RETURNS: Junior DB **Thomas Hill** returned to action against Emporia State after sitting out the previous game with injury and was in on nine tackles (six solo).

HIDDINK ALMOST GETS RECORD: Redshirt freshman PK **Seth Hiddink** had the second-longest field goal in school history against Emporia State, knocking through a 50-yarder -- one yard off **Ronnie Gulikers'** 1996 record -- in addition to making all five extra point attempts.

Hiddink is perfect so far this season, having gone 13-for-13 on PATs and 3-for-3 on field goals in scoring 22 points.

ABOUT WU: The Ichabods returned 19 starters from last year's 7-4 team and WU has yet to be tested this season, having outscored its first three opponents 160-33.

Washburn leads the MIAA in scoring defense (11.0 points/game) and rank second in scoring offense (56.3 points/game).

The Ichabods are seventh in the league in total offense with a 470.3-yard per-game average, ranking sixth in passing (279.0) and ninth in rushing (191.0).

Mitch Buhler has hit 45-of-86 passes for 713 yards and nine touchdowns to lead the offense, with 16 players having caught at least one pass.

WU is second in the MIAA in total defense, giving up 293.0 yards a game -- 110.0 rushing (first) and 183.0 passing (third).

LBs **Bryce Atagi** (24 tackles, two interceptions) and **Shay Wooten** (14 tackles) lead the defense.



THE SCHEDULE: Here's a game-by-game look at UCO's 2013 schedule:

⇒ **Missouri Southern 52, UCO 38 (Sept. 5 • Joplin, Mo.)** - Missouri Southern racked up 308 first-half yards in taking a 35-14 lead en route to season-opening win. Bronchos finished with 511 total yards, getting 328 passing from **Adrian Nelson** along with 169 and four TDs rushing from **Joshua Birmingham**.

⇒ **Pittsburg State 65, UCO 24 (Sept. 14 • Edmond)** - The Gorillas jumped out to a 20-0 lead en route to gaining 599 total yards and making a Wantland Stadium-record 35 first downs. The Bronchos finished with 431 yards, including a 152-yard, two-TD rushing outing by **Joshua Birmingham**.

⇒ **Emporia State 54, UCO 38 (Sept. 21 • Edmond)** - Emporia State set four MIAA and five Wantland Stadium records in claiming a 54-38 victory. The Hornets rolled up 699 total yards and had seven touchdown passes, while UCO finished with 566 yards. **Marquez Clark** had a single-game school record 13 receptions and **Joshua Birmingham** scored three touchdowns in becoming the school's all-time leading scorer.

⇒ **UCO at Washburn 20 (Sept. 28 • Topeka, Kan.)** - Series tied 1-1. The Bronchos picked up their first-ever MIAA win over the Ichabods last year with a 35-20 home victory.

⇒ **UCO vs. Missouri Western (Oct. 5 • Edmond)** - The Griffons lead the series 3-0. MWSU is the defending MIAA champion.

⇒ **UCO at Northwest Missouri (Oct. 12 • Maryville, Mo.)** - The Bearcats lead the series 3-2. NWMSU scored a Wantland Stadium-record 70 points in routing the Bronchos 70-7 last year.

⇒ **UCO vs. Central Missouri (Oct. 19 • Edmond)** - The Mules lead the series 1-0. UCM won last year in a game that was delayed overnight by lightning midway through the second quarter.

⇒ **UCO vs. Lincoln (Nov. 2 • Edmond)** - The Bronchos lead the series 1-0. UCO returns from an open week to play its final home game of the season.

⇒ **UCO at Southwest Baptist (Nov. 9 • Bolivar, Mo.)** - Series tied 2-2. The Bronchos begin a season-ending two-game road swing.

⇒ **UCO at Northeastern State (Nov. 16 • Tahlequah, Okla.)** - UCO leads the series 45-26-2. The two old rivals joined the MIAA league together and continue a series that first started in 1912.
