NSU vs. WASHBURN • Saturday • Nov. 7, 2015
1 p.m. (CT) • Doc Wadley Stadium (8,300) • Tahlequah, Okla.

THE GAME . . . The *Northeastern State RiverHawks* (2-7, 2-7 MIAA) are set for their final home game of the season when they welcome the *Washburn Ichabods* (4-5, 4-5 MIAA) to town . . . kickoff is set for 1 p.m. Nov. 7 at Doc Wadley Stadium (8,300) in Tahlequah, Oklahoma . . . the contest will be Senior Day for the NSU football program and RiverHawks Rally for the university . . . Washburn enters the contest having lost four of their last five games, while NSU has split its last four matchups . . . the game can be heard live on KEOK 102.1 FM in Tahlequah with Bill Huddleston (play-by-play) and Sean Rowley (color) providing commentary . . . a free audio broadcast can be found at goriverhawksgo.com . . . the game will be streamed live on Stretch Internet (<http://portal.stretchinternet.com/nsu/>, subscription based) . . . a football-only season pass is available for \$69.95, and a day pass can be purchased for \$9.95.

THE MATCHUP . . . Northeastern State and Washburn have met just five times in the history of the two programs . . . the two squads played a home-and-home series in 1987-88, and both teams picked up home triumphs . . . Washburn earned a 23-21 win in 1987, but the Redmen were victorious in the return matchup 35-30 . . . the only other three meetings between NSU and WU came over the last three years, when the Ichabods handed the RiverHawks three-straight losses.

THE HEAD COACHES . . . NSU's **ROB ROBINSON** (William Jewell, '00) is in his second season as the RiverHawks head coach . . . he was named the 19th head football coach in school history on Dec. 19, 2013 . . . he owns a 2-18 all-time record . . . Robinson spent the previous 12 years under Craig Schurig as a member of the Washburn Ichabod coaching staff, serving as the offensive coordinator for the last four seasons . . . he also directed the running backs from 2007-13 and coached the wide receivers from 2002-06 . . . he served as the recruiting coordinator from 2002-10 and was the academic coordinator from 2010-13 . . . Robinson was an integral member of a Washburn staff that completely turned around the Ichabod program . . . Washburn averaged 3.3 wins from 1989-03 and had just one winning season, but the Ichabods averaged 7.9 wins from 2004-13 and posted 10 straight winning campaigns . . . Robinson is the second former coordinator under Schurig's tutelage to become the head coach of another program, joining Fort Hays State's Chris Brown . . . Robinson spent the 2001 season at Pittsburg State as a graduate assistant, coaching the defensive backs with Ichabod head coach Craig Schurig . . . the Gorillas won the MIAA Championship that year. WU'S **CRAIG SCHURIG** (Colorado Mines, '87) is in his 14th season with the Ichabods . . . he has compiled a 95-63 record during his tenure . . . in 13 seasons as the Ichabods' head coach, Craig Schurig has built one of the most respected programs in the MIAA with three NCAA playoff appearances as well as the 2005 MIAA title coming on the heel's of a 2007, 2009 and 2011 runner-up finish in the conference race . . . through his first 11 seasons, in addition to three NCAA playoffs and a conference title, Schurig has led the Washburn football program to the 2004 Mineral Water Bowl Championship and the 2010 Kanza Bowl Championship . . . as quarterbacks coach, he helped NSU QB coach Dane Simoneau throw for more than 4,000 yards setting a school record and a national finalist award for the Harlon Hill Trophy as the best player in NCAA Division II, the first national finalist in Washburn history . . . Simoneau would go on to be a five-time consensus All-American at quarterback as well as the MIAA's Offensive Player of the Year, the

first Ichabod to win the award . . . in his eleven seasons at Washburn, the Ichabods have had 18 different players earn 51 different All-American accolades, two MIAA Most Valuable Defensive Players, an MIAA Offensive Player of the Year, four MIAA Freshman of the Year awards and 145 players receive all-MIAA honors . . . he has been equally on task with players in the classroom with 225 Ichabods named to the MIAA Academic Honor Roll, including three Academic All-Americans.

POWELL WINS WEEKLY ACCOLADE . . . Garrett Powell was named the MIAA/AstroTurf Special Teams Athlete of the Week, the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association announced Oct. 19 . . . the senior wide receiver/punter from Bartlesville, Oklahoma, was a big weapon in flipping field position in NSU's 31-21 victory over Missouri Southern State on Oct. 17 . . . he punted eight times for 353 yards (44.1 yards per punt), which included a 71-yard boot in the first quarter that was downed at the one-yard line . . . the punt was the longest by any MIAA player this season and was also the longest of Powell's career . . . he finished the game with a career-high four punts downed inside the 20-yard line, and he also had a career-high three downed inside the 10. Powell leads the MIAA of 50+ yard punts (8) this season and is second in total punting (41.0) . . . he also had four catches for 79 yards and a touchdown in the game . . . this is the first weekly honor of Powell's career and the first weekly special teams honor by an NSU football player since the RiverHawks joined the league in 2012 . . . the only other time an NSU player has won a weekly accolade was when former linebacker Langston Jones was named defensive athlete of the week on Sept. 16, 2013.

HAVE A DAY, DARIAN . . . NSU picked up a second-straight win by defeating Missouri Southern State 31-21 on Oct. 17 . . . the RiverHawks were led by a monster defensive effort from Darian Morris . . . the junior linebacker finished with nine tackles, four pass breakups, two fumble recoveries, one interception, one forced fumble, one tackle for loss, one half sack, and one school-record 97-yard fumble recovery return for touchdown . . . the last time an NSU player had a fumble recovery for a touchdown was on Oct. 20, 2012 . . . the last time an NSU player had two fumble recoveries in the same game was on Sept. 13, 2008 . . . the last time an NSU player had at least one fumble recovery and one interception in the same game was on Oct. 21, 2006.

STREAKING NO MORE . . . Northeastern State defeated Nebraska-Kearney 31-14 on Oct. 10 to snap what was the nation's fourth-longest active losing streak . . . the RiverHawks had failed to win a game since the end of the 2013 season, but they picked up a decisive triumph over the Lopers to break into the win column for the first time in the Rob Robinson era . . . NSU scored first, last and plenty of times in between to secure the 17-point victory . . . senior running back Joel Rockmore rushed the ball 18 times for a career-high 210 yards, while also scoring touchdowns on runs of 76 and 85 yards . . . junior wideout Matthew Butler also recorded a 74-yard TD reception in the third quarter . . . those were the three longest plays of the season . . . Northeastern State held the Lopers scoreless over the final two quarters and kept them below 200 yards of total offense (199) . . . the last time Northeastern State held an opponent to fewer than 200 yards of total offense was August 27, 2011.

YEA, HE'S STILL GOT IT . . . Joel Rockmore was an all-region performer in 2012 and a preseason All-American in 2013 . . . the senior tailback exploded out of the gates in 2013 but suffered a season-ending injury in the second game of the year . . . he returned in 2014 but struggled to regain his elite form, finishing with just 272 yards rushing on 86 carries (3.2 yards

per carry) in nine games (30.2 yards per game) . . . he started off well this season - 252 yards through the first three games - but he then erupted for a career-high 210 yards and two touchdowns on just 18 carries in a win over Nebraska-Kearney on Oct. 10 . . . he busted runs of 85 and 76 yards, which were the two longest rushes of his career . . . he also tallied 101 yards rushing on 25 carries in a win over Missouri Southern State on Oct. 17 . . . the 25 carries were the most for him in a single game since he had 33 against Central Oklahoma on Nov. 10, 2012.

SACK PARTY . . . Northeastern State has recorded 23 quarterback sacks through nine games this season, which is the most in a single season since the 2009 squad finished with 24 . . . the RiverHawks had four sacks each against Pittsburg State, Missouri Western State and Nebraska-Kearney, while registering three against Central Missouri and two each against Fort Hays State, Northwest Missouri State and Missouri Southern State. . . the last time NSU posted multiple four-sack games in a single season was in 2010 . . . senior linebacker Irving Steele and junior defensive back Steffon Herd lead the team with 4.0 sacks each . . . if either one registers at least one more half sack this season, it will be the most in a single campaign since Travis Boswell finished with 7.0 in 2011 . . . T'Nheous Smith and Quincy Dotson are all tied for third on the team with 3.0 sacks each.

VIDEOBOARD UPGRADE UNVEILED OCT. 3 . . . Northeastern State University Director of Athletics Tony Duckworth announced that a new videoboard would be installed at Doc Wadley Stadium . . . funded completely through private dollars, the new project is estimated to cost \$100,000 . . . the 16' x 9' videoboard with 32' branded top banner and 8' x 9' backlit advertising panels debuted at NSU's Oct. 3 home football game against Northwest Missouri State . . . Duckworth said the project cost was greatly reduced because there is already a current structure in place . . . one of the major difference fans will notice right away will be a larger videoboard that goes from standard definition to high definition . . . with the recent turf installation project completed this past summer, NSU has now invested approximately \$500,000 in upgrades to Doc Wadley Stadium this year.

RIVERHAWKS DEBUT NEW TURF UPGRADE . . . Northeastern State Director of Athletics Tony Duckworth selected Hellas Construction to provide and install new Matrix® Turf at Doc Wadley Stadium for the 2015 season . . . the new playing surface replaced the first iteration of field turf that was installed at Gable Field in 2005 . . . the newest edition to the stadium features top-of-the-line turf which is currently utilized most notably by the Dallas Cowboys, Baylor University and the University of California . . . the design features the same NSU logo that currently dons center court inside the NSU Event Center, and the end zones have a black background with "NORTHEASTERN STATE" and "RIVERHAWKS" in large, white lettering outlined in NSU green . . . Hellas defines Matrix® Turf as the finest synthetic turf system available . . . from the advanced fibers, down through the patented REALFILL™ and reinforced backing - each component is part of an authentic, artificial turf system . . . Matrix® Turf has undergone decades of in-depth research and intense testing, resulting in countless innovations that make each Matrix synthetic turf field stronger and more reliable than ever before . . . Matrix® Turf is also held to a higher standard when it comes to testing for strength, safety and overall performance . . . each Matrix® Turf field is designed to provide a superior athletic experience at all levels of competition.

THE TALE OF TWO SCHEDULES . . . Northeastern State competed against the seventh most difficult schedule in all of Division II during the first five weeks of the season in terms of opponent win percentage . . . all five opponents the RiverHawks faced have been nationally-ranked or received votes in the AFCA poll at some point this season . . . the record of those five teams through the first five weeks of the season stood at 21-4 (.840), and the only losses suffered were against each other . . . the back half of the schedule for NSU is considerably less treacherous, as the final six opponents were a combined 9-21 (.300) through five games . . . the RiverHawks have already taken

advantage of the softer schedule, as they defeated Nebraska-Kearney 31-14 on Oct. 10 and Missouri Southern State 31-21 on Oct. 17.

MISSED OPPORTUNITIES . . . NSU has struggled in the kicking game since joining the MIAA, and more specifically over the past two seasons . . . the RiverHawks have converted just 23 of 42 (54.8 percent) field goals since the beginning of the 2012 season, and they are just 5-for-15 (33 percent) since 2014 . . . Northeastern State has been solid in the extra-point department, however, as the team has converted 74 of 83 (89 percent) extra-point attempts over the last four years.

THE QB/WR DUO RETURNS . . . NSU is in Year 2 of the Kevin Pantastico era . . . the junior quarterback returned after an inaugural campaign that saw him finish fourth in the MIAA in passing yards per game (196.9) and sixth in total offense (193.4) . . . he finished 193-for-375 for 2,166 yards . . . he also had eight touchdowns to go with 14 interceptions, while starting all 11 games . . . Pantastico has the luxury of throwing to one of the top receivers in the league in Garrett Powell . . . the senior wideout ranked second in the MIAA last season in receptions per game (5.7) and fourth in receiving yards per game (72.8) . . . he appeared in 10 games and finished the campaign with 57 receptions for 728 yards and five touchdowns.

RECONSTRUCTING THE O-LINE . . . Northeastern State struggled up front in 2014 with an offensive line that started seven different combinations in the first seven games of the season . . . NSU entered 2015 with a starting offensive line that featured three players who were not on the roster last season . . . the RiverHawks have beefed up the interior with the addition of Jordan Baldwin (LT), Brian Hobbs (C) and Lance Cox (RG) . . . Tyler Easter returned to start at right tackle and Brian West returned to start at left guard . . . the new-look offensive line features five juniors that average 302 pounds and are an average height of 6-foot-2 . . . redshirt freshman Dakota Ritchie (6-4, 275) was the team's starting left tackle last season before suffering a season-ending injury in the first game . . . West, Hobbs, Cox and Easter have started all nine games this season . . . Baldwin has made seven starts at left tackle, and Ritchie has started the other two.

SOLVING THE KICKING WOES . . . Northeastern State was one of just two teams in the entire country (Malone University) to not attempt a field goal in the first five games of the 2014 season . . . the RiverHawks were also one of five teams across the nation (Lincoln, Clarion, Southern Nazarene, Cheyney) to not make a field goal through the first eight weeks of the season . . . the RiverHawks were 1-for-7 on field-goal attempts last year, with the lone conversion coming in Week 9 against Central Oklahoma . . . both players who attempted field goals in 2014 are no longer with the program, and Eddie Garcia has been added to the mix to help the special teams . . . Garcia is a junior college transfer from El Camino College who earned All-National Central Conference Second Team honors a season ago . . . he went 13-for-15 on field-goal attempts with a long of 45 last season, and he also was 24 of 26 on point-after attempts.

QUITE THE TURNOVER . . . The RiverHawks completely overhauled their roster for the 2015 campaign and feature only 23 players who have ever played in a game for NSU prior to this season . . . there are 64 newcomers to the roster and just 32 players who were on the team a year ago

. . . the roster breakdown includes nine seniors, 28 juniors, seven sophomores and 52 freshmen . . . of the 64 newcomers, 24 are transfers.

7 RIVERHAWKS EARN POSTSEASON ACCOLADES IN 2014 . . . Northeastern State had seven players named all-conference last year . . . headlining the list of RiverHawks was defensive back Chandler Barr, who was named to the All-MIAA Third Team . . . those named All-MIAA Honorable Mention were defensive tackle Kenley Choute, offensive lineman Jonathan Brown, wide receiver Garrett Powell, tight end Kyle Matheson, linebacker Kenneth Davis, and defensive back Steffon Herd . . . the postseason honors were the first for all seven RiverHawks . . . Barr finished the season with 36 tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss . . . he also broke up eight passes and returned five kickoffs for 90 yards . . . Choute finished with 27 tackles and 6.5 TFL's . . . Davis and Herd both registered 77 tackles, and Herd was second in the MIAA with 56 solo stops . . . Davis finished with 10.5 TFL's and 1.5 sacks . . . Herd had 1.5 TFL's and one interception . . . Powell finished second in the MIAA with 5.7 receptions per game . . . he led NSU with 57 catches for 728 yards and five touchdowns . . . Matheson tallied three receptions for 23 yards.

2014 MIAA ACADEMIC AWARD WINNERS . . . Northeastern State placed 16 members of the squad on the MIAA Academic Honor Roll . . . those included eight offensive players, six defensive players and two specialists . . . sophomore tight end Kyle Matheson was named an MIAA Scholar-Athlete . . . overall, there were 271 MIAA Students-Athletes in football named to the MIAA Academic Honor Roll . . . to achieve honor roll status, a student-athlete must have a cumulative grade-point average of 3.00 and have at least two terms of attendance at the certifying member institution, excluding summer terms . . . of those 271 student-athletes, 24 earned the MIAA Scholar Athlete Award, which is given to those who have a cumulative grade-point average of 3.50, have at least two terms of attendance at the certifying member institution, excluding summer terms, and, if competing in a championship sport of the MIAA, earn All-MIAA honors.

DVORAK COLLECTS ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN NOD . . . Ross Dvorak was named to the 2014 Capital One Academic All-America® NCAA Division II Football Second Team, which was the second-straight year he earned academic All-American status . . . the former RiverHawk carried a 3.97 grade-point average in business administration, while serving as one of the starting offensive linemen . . . in 2013, Dvorak became the second NSU student-athlete in school history to be named an Academic All-America . . . he joined former RiverHawk women's golfer Whitney McAteer, who was named to the 2013 Capital One Academic All-America® Women's At-Large First Team.

ON THE WRONG SIDE OF HISTORY . . . The RiverHawks posted a 0-11 record in 2014, marking the first time in school history the team lost 11 games in a single campaign . . . only two other teams in school history have finished with double-digit losses (2004, 2008) . . . only one NSU team in school history (2004) has ever finished an entire season without a win or a tie (minimum four games played) . . . Northeastern State is now in its 102nd year of football.

MIAA, NSU PARTNER WITH STRETCH INTERNET FOR 2015 . . . The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association is set to continue its partnership with Stretch Internet® to provide streaming of conference events . . . Stretch partners with the league and members institutions to broadcast all conference football and men's and women's basketball games, as well as selected other conference events . . . fans can view all conference football and basketball games live through almost any internet connected device, including Smart TV's, Apple TV and Google Chromecast . . . the GameCentral 2.0 platform will also allow fans to access live stats in the video stream . . . the new platform also features archived games and other video content.

The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association announced distribution partners and price points for the MIAA Television Network . . . fans can access the web streams through either from the league portal or from goriverhawksgo.com . . . beginning Sept. 3, fans will be able to purchase a day pass for \$9.95, and they also have the option of purchasing a football season pass for \$69.95 . . . fans may purchase a season pass for volleyball for \$44.95 with men's and women's basketball season passes being available for \$89.95 each . . . fans wishing to have access to all MIAA web streaming content can purchase an All-Access pass for \$149.95 . . . the MIAA also announced several returning distribution partners as well as two new distribution partners who have joined the network for the 2014 season.

- KSMO-TV which serves 100 percent of the Kansas City market and is available over-the-air on through a cable or satellite provider.
- Cox Communications KS serving communities across the state of Kansas including Topeka, Pittsburg, and Wichita.
- Cox Communications Oklahoma serving communities across the state of Oklahoma including the Tulsa and Oklahoma City markets.

Mendez as the new offensive line coach, which was under the guidance of Lane . . . Mendez joined the NSU staff after a two-year stint at Ellsworth Community College where he also served as O-line coach . . . prior to his time at ECC, he spent three years in various roles at Ottawa University . . . he was a volunteer in 2010, an assistant in 2011 and a graduate assistant in 2012 . . . Marvin Bohannon served as a graduate assistant in 2014 but was promoted to assistant coach following the departure of Bradley Thomas, who is now the offensive coordinator at Oklahoma Baptist University . . . Bohannon coaches the wide receivers . . . Will Skeans has returned to NSU and serves as the strength and conditioning coordinator/linebackers coach . . . he was a graduate assistant with the program from 2012-13.

NSU SELECTED LAST IN PRESEASON POLLS . . . Northeastern State was picked to finish 12th in both the 2015 MIAA Preseason Coaches' and Media Polls, the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association announced at the MIAA Football Media Day on August 3. The RiverHawks collected 16 points in the coaches' poll and 47 points in the media poll. They were also selected to finish 12th in both polls last season. Northwest Missouri State and Pittsburg State locked down the top two spots in both rankings. The Bearcats brought in eight of 12 first-place votes (118 total) in the coaches' poll and raked in 28 of 41 first-place votes (478 total) in the media poll. Pittsburg State earned four first-place votes in the coaches' poll and 13 in the media poll to earn 114 and 455 points, respectively. NSU finished 0-11 overall a year ago and finished 12th in the conference.

SEASON TICKETS ON SALE . . . Season ticket packages are now on sale for the six-game home portion of the football schedule . . . prices begin as low as \$45 per person for an adult general admission ticket . . . season chair back seats begin at \$75 each for adults and \$25 each for children ages 4-14 . . . season ticket holders receive the benefit of sitting in comfortable chair back seats for NSU's six home MIAA contests where they can watch future NFL players competing in the finest NCAA Division II conference in the nation . . . they also receive excellent view of the halftime show featuring the NSU Band . . . the 2015 campaign marks the third year of the \$25 single-game Family 4-Pack, which includes two general admission adult tickets and two general admission student tickets (ages 4 through high school) . . . the Family 4-Pack may be purchased at any time and used at any regular season home game . . . all Northeastern State home football games are played at Doc Wadley Stadium and will be contested on the new Matrix® Turf installed this summer . . . also for convenience, the Athletics Department will continue utilizing online ticketing for football and basketball . . . online ticketing allows for advanced ticket sales . . . all fans are required to show a ticket prior to entering an NSU football or basketball contest . . . NSU fans have another avenue for acquiring Northeastern State apparel and accessories . . . the store is loaded with options for fans of all ages, ranging from T-shirts, polos and sweat-shirts, to home office supplies, drinkware and kitchen essentials . . . every item is branded with official Northeastern State athletics and university logos, and select RiverHawks gear and accessories are customizable . . . the online store can be accessed by simply visiting www.goriverhawksgear.com . . . the shop can also be viewed by clicking on the shopping cart at the top right of www.goriverhawksgo.com, the static graphic underneath the main picture or the rotating horizontal carousel just above the video player.

NOTES FROM THE EMPORIA STATE GAME . . . After NSU posted just 13 points total through the first three games of the season in 2014, the RiverHawks exploded for 35 points and 504 yards of total offense against Emporia State . . . the RiverHawks fell in double overtime to the Hornets by a 42-35 scoreline, which was the first double OT game for NSU since Nov. 11, 2006 . . . quarterback Kevin Pantastico broke school records for completions (34) and attempts (56) . . . he also threw for a career-high 369 yards - which was the most by an NSU QB since 2011 - and a pair of touchdowns . . . he had 26 yards rushing and a TD run in overtime . . . he led NSU on three TD drives of 52, 75 and 79 yards in the fourth quarter to send the game to OT . . . NSU trailed by 14 points twice in the final quarter before scoring the third TD with less than a minute to play in regulation . . . Terrance Dixon's first rushing touchdown early in the fourth quarter was the first TD on the ground for NSU this year . . . the RiverHawks were also penalized 201 yards, which broke both the school's all-time record and the MIAA's all-time record for penalty yards in a single game . . . NSU was flagged for 19 penalties, which broke the school's all-time record for most penalties called against a team in a single game . . . the mark also tied the MIAA's all-time record, which was matched most recently by Central Missouri in 1999 . . . NSU ran a school-record 90 plays, which broke a mark that hasn't been equaled since Sept. 27, 1980 . . . Garrett Powell had a career-high 14 receptions for 179 yards . . . the 21 points NSU scored in the fourth quarter was the most points in a quarter since the RiverHawks had 24 in the second frame against Lincoln on Nov. 3, 2012 . . . the last time NSU scored 21 points in a fourth quarter was against East Central on Sept. 27, 2008.

THE 2014 SEASON OPENER . . . Northeastern State opened the 2014 season against Pittsburg State University for the third year in a row . . . the Rob Robinson debut was seen by the fourth-largest crowd in Carnie Smith Stadium history (10,814) . . . Steffon Herd made his first start on the defensive side of the ball and finished the game with a team-high eight tackles . . . the contest also marked the first time NSU was shutout since Sept. 5, 2009 . . . the NSU defense held Jeff Seybold to a career-low 14 yards rushing . . . Seybold was an All-MIAA First Team member the year ago . . . the RiverHawks also had more fourth-down conversions (3-for-5) than third-down conversions (2-for-16).

HOW THEY'VE FARED IN THE NEW LEAGUE . . . The RiverHawks are in their fourth year as members of the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association . . . since joining the NCAA in 1996, NSU has been a member of the Lone Star Conference (1996-2011), an independent (2011-12), and now the MIAA (2012-P) . . . the MIAA is one of the strongest football conferences in the country, as it boasts multiple national champions and squads

that routinely make deep runs in the NCAA Championship playoffs . . . the MIAA is home to two of the last four national champions, including Northwest Missouri State (2013) and Pittsburg State (2011) . . . since joining the MIAA, the RiverHawks are 8-34 overall with a 8-33 record against league opposition.

FORMER RIVERHAWK WINS SUPER BOWL . . . Former Northeastern State offensive lineman Michael Bowie became the 15th player in school history and the first in 21 years to be selected in the NFL draft when he was chosen by the Seattle Seahawks with the 36th pick in the seventh round in the 2013 draft . . . he was the 242nd overall pick and is attempting to become the first NSU football player since 1992 to play for an NFL team . . . he started nine games along the offensive line during the season and helped lead Seattle to a victory in Super Bowl XLVIII . . . Bowie has since been claimed off waivers by the Cleveland Browns and is expected to miss his second-straight season due to injury.

GOING BOWLING IN 2011 . . . Northeastern State made its first appearance in a bowl game since making the transition to Division II last season . . . the RiverHawks posted a 7-4 mark in the regular season and was awarded a bid to the Mineral Water Bowl, one of only two Division II bowl games . . . Northeastern State fell 28-14 to Minnesota State University in Excelsior Springs, Mo.

NSU HELPS WELCOME UTSA TO COLLEGIATE FOOTBALL . . . Northeastern State traveled to San Antonio, Texas, on Sept. 3, 2011, for a meeting with the UTSA Roadrunners . . . the special occasion marked the first football contest in UTSA history, which was won by the Roadrunners, 31-3 . . . the game attracted 56,743 fans, which was the largest crowd to ever watch an NSU football game and the largest crowd in NCAA to ever watch a program's first collegiate football game.
