Washburn University is located in Topeka, the capital of Kansas, at 17th and College Streets. Metropolitan Topeka, with a population of approximately 140,000, is served by four railroads - Santa Fe, Union Pacific, Rock Island and Missouri Pacific; one airline - Central; numerous bus lines; and major highways, including the Kansas Turnpike.

The University encompasses 160 acres located in the heart of Topeka. The campus holds seventeen buildings including 2 fraternity and 4 soror-

ity houses, and men's and women's residence halls. Four fraternities are located near the campus.

The campus also includes an athletic stadium, a nine-hole golf course, tennis courts, practice football fields, baseball diamond and housing for married students.

Schools in the college program are Liberal Arts, Fine Arts, Law, Education, Business, USAF Reserve Officer Training Corps, Evening College and Summer School.

WILLIAM JENNINGS

Director of Athletics

Opening his first season this year as Washburn's athletic director is Bill Jennings, who for the past two years served on the Jack Mitchell football staff at the University of Kansas.

The 46-year-old football veteran was head mentor at the University of Nebraska from 1957-1961.

A native of Norman, Okla., Jennings holds two degrees from the University of Oklahoma: a bachelor of science and a master of education. His major field of study was physical education.

As a wing back and end for the "Big Red" during the 1938-39-40 years, he established pass receiving records of 26 in one season; most passes caught in career, 70; and most career receiving yards, 753 -- all of which still stand.

The year prior to WW II service in the Marines, Jennings coached at Cushing, Okla. From 1942-46, he served as a captain overseas with the Marine Corps.

In 1946, he joined the late Jim Tatum staff at Okla. Univ., remaining there until 1953 when he entered the oil business.

Jennings returned to coaching in 1956 at the Univ. of Nebraska. One year later he was elevated to the head job of the "Cornhuskers."

He is married to the former Mary Yetman of Tulsa, and has two daughters - Mrs. Vicki Martin, wife of former Nebr. fullback, Noel Martin, who now coaches at Rosedale High in Kansas City; and Jan, a high school senior.

Coach Ellis D. Rainsberger begins his seventh year of coaching and third year as head football coach at Washburn University.

Before coming to WU, Rainsberger assisted Tom O'Connell and Bus Mertes at Drake University in 1960-61-62. Also, he was head coach at La Salle Peru Illinois high school, posting a 9-1 record and a third place state rating.

The head mentor started college at Missouri University in 1951 taking a two year break to serve in the U. S. Army Paratroopers. After the Army he completed his education at K State, receiving his B.S. in physical education in 1957.

Rainsberger was a three-year letterman in football and a two-year letterman in wrestling at K-State. His sophomore year he was named Missouri Valley heavyweight wrestling champion. He obtained numerous football ratings - team captain, 1956 and 1957; Big Eight All-Star in 1956 and 1957; honorable mention All-American in 1957; and Scholastic All-American in 1956.

The young coach will probably use a multiple formation offense and a hard-nosed Rainsberger defense.

Rainsberger is 31 years old and married to the former Shirley Meegan. They have five children ranging in age from 2 to 10 years.

ASSISTANT COACHES

~~ED LINTA~~ - Line Coach. A new member of the WU coaching staff replacing Norman Short. Short will continue as head basketball coach. Ed coached at Eastern Arizona Junior College last year, posting a 5-4 record. He was an assistant at University of Arizona from 1959-1961 and University of Wyoming for the 1962 season. Ed received his master's degree in education and guidance from University of Arizona in 1961.

FRED THOMPSON - Assistant backfield coach. Thompson, a law student from North Adams, Mass., was a four-year letterman at halfback for Ottawa University. He will work with Ron Heck and Gary Kershner in the backfield.

RON HECK - Assistant backfield coach. Ron is a graduate assistant who lettered four years and served as a co-captain for WU last year. He is a physical education major from Junction City.

LEON SHELINBARGER - Assistant line coach. Leon, stepping in to fill the vacancy left by by Ralph Smith, was a three-year letterman at WU. He is from Topeka and played guard for the Ichabods.

GARY KERSHNER - Assistant backfield coach. A letterman from K-State, Kershner will be helping in the backfield. He is a law student from Manhattan and played under Bus Mertes at K-State.

SEASON FORECAST

Washburn University's 1964 football squad should potentially be stronger but lacking in experience. This is the summary of the upcoming campaign in a nut shell. "With a few breaks WU could turn in its best season in recent years," commented Coach Rainsberger. "Right now it is too early to give a true opinion on the season. There are so many things that can come up before the season gets under way that could change the outlook."

The defensive line will be the strong point of the team. All-CIC players Jack Clanton and Lonny Morrison are the only two men missing from the line-up. Returning will be Bob Noblitt, All-CIC guard and 1964 team captain.

Returning in the defensive backfield will be Pat Scherzer who along with graduates Curt Miller and Ron O'Rear ranked in the top ten of the nation on pass defense last year. Washburn has several capable men that can fill in the positions vacated by Miller and O'Rear.

The most questionable spot will be the offensive line. Washburn lost three of the first four guards and tackles and the top center candidate. The Ichabods are planning on starting one freshman and three sophomores in the line. End is the only position with all players returning.

"One other question mark will be the quarterback position. A replacement for All-CIC quarterback Bill Harper must be found," said Rainsberger. "Transfer Bob Wallace and squadsman Tom Huber will battle for that position." Fullbacks Bob Jones and Charles Franklin return with more experience. Almost all of the halfbacks from 1963 will be on hand when practice begins. Ron Heck is the only halfback lost from last year and he will be coaching. The backfield shapes up much better than the line and is bigger and stronger this year.

As for the 1964 schedule, it will be one of the toughest programs WU has ever faced. Non-conference foes Kearney State and Warrensburg State along with the two Colorado schools and the CIC teams will provide fans with plenty of action. Kearney State returns 24 lettermen from the squad that won fourth place rating in the NAIA in 1963.

Regarding the CIC race, Coach Rainsberger thinks Pittsburg State and Omaha University will be the teams to beat. Fort Hays State and Emporia State are improved and capable of beating the leaders.

"The chances of Washburn winning the conference are fairly slim," declared the head mentor. "We definitely should be considered the dark horse of the conference."
