## WASHBURN FACILITIES

Washburn University's 160 acre campus is located in southwest residential Topeka, the capital of Kansas. Four years ago on June 8, 1966, a tornado destroyed nine campus building and damaged 14 others, but the end of reconstruction is finally in sight.

A \$2.5 million Learning Resources Center, built to house the psychology, American civilization, sociology, business administration, and economics departments and the Air Force ROTC, will be completed some time after the first of the year.

In the fall of 1968 the \$3.3 million Fine Arts Center was dedicated and a new Heating Plant was completed this summer. Workmen have also been busy this summer removing the Quonset huts and barracks that were used for part of the married student housing. As part of the campus face lifting, there have been more than 800 trees planted on campus to replace the 650 lost in the tornado.

In addition to Moore Bowl, other athletic facilities include Whiting Field-house, seven sand-green golf holes, tennis courts, a swimming pool, a practice football field and a baseball diamond.

Two fraternity houses and two sorority houses are on campus, as is married student housing. Three fraternity houses are located near the campus as are three sorority homes.

The university also owns KTWU, Channel 11, the first educational television station in the state.

Work should begin sometime this year on the Fred C. and Julia Kuehne Belltower, which will house those bells which pealed the time from atop Thomas Gymnasium before it was destroyed in the tornado.

## -FORECAST-

Although 24 returning lettermen should provide the nucleus for a sound team, Bud Elliott is counting on some standout transfers to fill in the gaps and add depth, to enable the Ichabods to improve on last year's 5-5 mark.

Biggest losses were in the defensive line where all four starters graduated, including All-RMAC defensive tackle Don Prince. Elliott feels that juco transfer Bob Roepke (220) and letterman Mike Gallant (235) should provide better balance at the tackles. Defensive end is a question mark with only one returnee, sophomore letterman Marvin Bailey, who will be joined by Mike Westgate, a fullback last year.

The Ichabods will be well off at linebacker as veterans Don Makalous, Ray Smith, Steve Green, Jimmy Honn, Dave Bowen and Jim Orton will be joined by transfer Dale Sample, giving the Ichabods depth and quality at every position. The defensive secondary will be headed by co-captain Gene McBride who should be one of the best in the RMAC. John Bakalar, a K-State transfer, was moved to defensive safety in spring drills and Monte Rose, an offensive quarterback, could start at the defensive right half position.

Dale Bennett is back at quarterback and after a year's experience should have an outstanding year, although Monte Rose and newcomer Gene Pettey will push him for the starting assignment. Two running backs of a year ago--Chat Carruthers and Kevin McCormick--return, as does starting fullback Rick Harrison. At flankerback Al Dressman has established himself as one of the best in the conference and 1968 All-RMAC split end Irv McCoy is back out after a year's absence.

Aside from strong-side tackle, the offensive line will be experienced with co-captain Bill Bibens and Andy Marquart at the guards, Mike Snedegar at the quickside tackle and Lee Van Riper at center. Elliott looks for Dennis Davis,

a juco transfer, to fill the strong-side tackle position.

Considering the upcoming season, Elliott says, "We will lose some incentive in that we are not eligible for the RMAC title and I think that even though we could be a better football team, the competition has also improved and to improve on last year's record will be quite a task."

## GAME PRESS SERVICES

Those covering Washburn University football games will receive both half-time and final statistics along with a scoring summary each half.

The University Relations staff will phone beeper reports to radio and TV stations desiring them, following all home games and most road contests. The staff will also file game stories on request to newspapers.

With advance notice, halftime interviews with WU officials can be arranged.

## PRESS FACILITIES

Washburn's press box, first in use last year, provides space for two field phone booths, two scouting booths, one clock booth, and three broadcasting areas. There are also large areas for news writers and photographers. The box has two rest-rooms, heating, and air conditioning.

-FORECAST-

With 25 returning lettermen including nine defensive starters, Coach Don Dempsey's fourth year as head coach will be a good one if he can come up with the offensive to score after his defense holds.

The greatest losses from last year's team are All-AIC tackle "Slick" Wilson, All-AIC guard Gary Branch, and three other starting offensive linemen. Back for his final year, however, is 235-pound pro tackle prospect Joe Hoing.

One of the main problem areas of a year ago should be more stable as sophomore quarterback John Pirpich is back brimming with confidence and armed with additional speed gained from track to give the "Wonder Boys" the sprint-out option.

The tailback position should be sound with All-AIC tailback Larry Brown and sophomore Doug Brice returning. Brown last year averaged 4.1 yards per carry en route to gaining 1,118 yards for the season and scoring 10 touchdowns.

-FORECAST-

Prospects look good for the "Cavaliers" who last year scored 297 points while holding the opposition to 147, and who return twenty lettermen. Coach Matt May's charges were 5-0 for league play in their first year in the Kansas Conference but were not eligible for the title. This year they are eligible for the crown and their incentive should be twice as strong.

Record-setting quarterback Dan Ruden is gone and his replacement, sophomore Randy Jakious, is inexperienced. Jakious will have a good target, though, in Jim McNeive who is a four-year veteran at flanker and may also start at defensive safety. Newcomer Leon Kremer is expected to take over at running back as last year's standout Oscar Brown has graduated. Whatever the combination, the backs should find some running room as the entire offensive line returns.

The defense will also be strong with veterans Jerry Marks and John Mulvihill at linebacker, Steve Klemencic at safety, and John Turner at defensive guard.

-FORECAST-

Several factors make second year head coach Del Stoltenberg optimistic: all of last year's starting offensive backfield, and most of the starting defensive backfield return, among 30 lettermen. Loaded with freshmen and sophomores last year, the squad has the advantage of experience.

Stoltenberg expects the defense to be strong again after ranking fifth in the NAIA in rushing defense last year.

Back in the offensive backfield is tailback Sam Singleton, who gained 836 yards rushing and scored 48 points to lead the team in scoring although playing on offense in only 6 games; he was also a full time starter on defense.

Quarterback Marty Going, who passed for 778 yards and six touchdowns, and fullback Jerry Luedtke, who was the No. 2 rusher at 626 yards, also return. Back to catch the passes from Going is No. 1 receiver, split-end Greg Walker.

If the "Cardinals" can find a defense to match the offense this year's team could be bowl-bound again. With Danny Brown, an All-American candidate back at quarterback, and Bill Cantrell, an All-American candidate back at fullback, the offense should be potent. Last year Brown passed for 23 touchdowns and Cantrell finished the season as the number 3 scorer in the nation, while the Cardinals scored 357 points to their opponents 130.

The offense is further bolstered by the return of wingback Tracy Woods and All-District tackle DeWitt Phillips and All-District wide receiver Alvin Lowery.

On defense Coach Nelson points to returning linebackers Tom Crosset and L.J. Simmon, and defensive back Ron Sealock, as the bright spots, but feels that a lot will depend on the development of sophomore linemen Mark Wallace, Dave Ringenberg, and John Schoonover.

-FORECAST-

Second-year Coach Rube Berry hopes to improve on last year's 2-8 mark with 34 transfers and 16 returning lettermen headed by All-American candidate Jim Hoots.

The 6'4", 245 pound Hoots anchors a formidable defensive line that averages 6'3" and 249 pounds. During spring practice the defense allowed only two touchdowns. Veterans Carl Basler and Ron Van Dine and transfers Gary Autry and Marty Galbraith will combine forces in the defensive secondary.

Offensively the "Lions" have a number of question marks. Bill Wood has been moved from his quarterback spot to wide receiver. Mike Sexton could take over the quarterbacking duties but he will be pressed by juco transfer Ray Harding. Either of them should have a good target in record-setting tight end Dave Evans who caught 27 aerials for 250 yards last year.

The Vikings position is similar to Washburn's as twenty of twenty-six returning lettermen are sophomores and juniors, so the accent is on youth. However after compiling a 5-5 record--identical to that of the Ichabods--last year with a difficult schedule, Coach Kenneth Gibler feels his team will be competitive.

The only losses from last year's starting offensive unit were standout guard Greg Wallace and fullback James Kelly. With seven 210-pound-plus lettermen tackles returning, the backs should be given some running room. Coach Gibler hopes to again average 20.8 points per game and plans to put more emphasis on running this year to insure a balanced offensive attack.

Tom Taylor, a defensive safety, and Keith Maxey, a defensive end, both graduated, but six returning defensive starters should provide a strong nucleus. Position changes are planned to fill the other slots.

With an improved defense and an offensive unit which was impressive in spring drills, Coach Lester hopes to turn what were one and two point losses last year into victories this year and get above .500.

The defense will be anchored by 6-6, 255 pound All-American candidate Mike Potchard at tackle. An All-RMAC and All-District performer last year, Mike runs the 40 yard dash in 4.9 seconds and may play both ways. Six other returning starters will join him on defense.

Janesko led the RMAC in total offense last year with 1,855 yards for a .232.0 per game average. Coach Lance feels the running game will be stronger with a veteran line and the power running of Charlie Divitto who last year gained 632 yards in 25 carries for a 5.1 average and 6 touchdowns.

There will be a lack of depth on defense but All-RMAC safety Ervin Bott is back to shut off the opposition's passing game. Lance put a premium on defenders in recruiting last spring and his top six newcomers are all defensive backs or line-men.

The "Indians" should have little trouble moving the ball again this year with Rocco Gonnella at quarterback. Gonnella set new UN-O marks in passing with 147 completions for 1,933 yards. Gone is his primary receiver, Tom McKernan, but lettermen Dan Crnkovich and Mark Poole will provide good targets. Back at running back is All-RMAC Phil Wise, who last year became the first runner in UN-O history to go over 1,000 yards with 1,146 for 5.1 per game average.

The defense seems strong up front with ends Rich Luger (240) and John Brennan (230) back, along with tackles Mel Washington and Gary Kipfmiller. The defensive secondary is the one question mark with only one starter returning, three year letterman Don Franklin. ## HEAD COACH - BUD ELLIOTT

Harold "Bud" Elliott, who built three Kansas Conference championship teams at Southwestern College, begins his second season at the helm of the Washburn Ichabods.

Elliott, 38, becomes the 29th grid coach at Washburn and last year promptly led the Ichabods to a 5-5 record, the best in the last five years.

In five seasons at Southwestern, his teams compiled a 37-7-3 record and the '67 team went undefeated. His other conference titles came in 1964 and 1968.

Elliott became coach at the Winfield school in 1964 and proceeded to build a co-championship team after the '63 Mound-builders had finished last in the standings. For this rebuilding effort he was voted NAIA District 10 Coach of the Year. He received the honor again in 1967 and 1968. Also in 1967 he was named KCAC Coach of the Year and NAIA Area III Coach of the Year.

Elliott's 1968 Southwestern team ranked sixth in the nation for total defense, while the 1967 club set a NAIA pass interception record with 34. His 1967-team was ranked 15th in the final NAIA ratings and the 1966 squad was ranked as high as 16th during the season.

He went to Southwestern following four seasons as head football coach at Turner High School in Kansas City. He began his coaching career at Turon, Kansas, in 1953. He moved to Geneseo High School in 1955 and to Mulvane in 1958 for two successful seasons.

He served as Chairman for the NAIA Games Committee of the 1969 National Outdoor Track Meet.

He and his wife Nancy are the parents of five children. Elliott is a graduate of Baker University.

## LINE COACH - BOB NOBLITT

Noblitt will begin his second year as Washburn's line coach. Noblitt came to Washburn from Yankton, South Dakota, where he served as wrestling coach and line coach in charge of defense at Yankton College.

He graduated from Washburn in 1965 after receiving All-CIC and All-American honors as a guard in the 1964 season.

Upon graduation he coached at Claflin High School, Claflin, Kansas. He then received his master's degree while coaching at Southern Illinois University before moving to Yankton for two years.

Noblitt and his wife Janet have two sons.

He is the second leading passer the University has produced with 1,934 yards. He also holds the record for best completion average for one game with eight of nine for 111 yards.

Elliott coached all sports at Silver Lake from 1959 to 1966. He coached two baseball teams to the state tournament and his football teams won the Mideast League title in 1959-61-63 and 1966. He also serves as head baseball coach at WU and coached the 1967 Ichabods to a 21-8 mark and the CIC championship.

### ABOUT THE RMAC

The second oldest active collegiate organization of its kind in the United States, the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference (founded in 1909) entered a new era on April 30, 1968, as a result of its merging with the Central Intercollegiate Conference of Kansas and Nebraska and adding six independent colleges and universities.

On that date, the RMAC expanded to fifteen members, which were assigned to two geographical divisions over a five-state area including Kansas, Nebraska, Colorado, Utah, and New Mexico.

Conference competition is held in nine sports: football, cross-country, basketball, wrestling, swimming, baseball, track and field, tennis, and golf. Championship playoffs are held annually between the division champions in football and basketball, and Conference-wide tournaments or meets are held in the other seven sports.
