1988 Washburn University Football Season Outlook

In Washburn University's final season in the Central States Intercollegiate Conference, head coach Larry Elliott and his Ichabods would like nothing more than to ride into the post season sunset as conference champions. With 20 lettermen returning, including 14 starters, (8 offense, 6 defense) the Ichabods appear to have the personnel to accomplish that goal.

Washburn's backfield promises to be solid in 1988 with the return of fleet footed tailbacks Dashiell Wandix (Jr.) and Les Williams (Jr.). Wandix averaged 5.9 yards a carry last season, while Williams was second on the team in rushing with 320 yards. Bruising fullbacks Phillip Brooks (Jr.) and Waldorf Junior College (Ia.) transfer Mike Carrier (Jr.) give Washburn a talented arsenal of ball carriers. The top quarterback heading into 1988 is Scott Crimmins (Jr.). Crimmins started part time a year ago, throwing for 519 yards and two touchdowns. Pushing him for playing time are Barry Griffiths (Sr.) and Mark Johnson (Fr.). Crimmins and company will have plenty of talented targets to throw to, headlined by returning starters Dwayne Haley (Sr.), Dave Murphy (Sr.) and Troy Slusser (Sr.). Slusser enjoyed a banner 1987 campaign, catching 28 passes for 724 yards and eight touchdowns, an average of 25.9 yards a catch. He proved to be doubly dangerous as a return specialist, leading the CSIC in kickoff returns with a 24.4 yard average while finishing fifth in the conference in punt returns (9.2 yard average) to earn All-Conference honors. If the Bods have a question mark on offense, it's at tight end, where several players are battling for the starting job left vacant by the graduated Chris Bleue, a second round selection by the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League. The leading candidates to replace Bleue are Bruce Mellen (Sr.) and Doug Deines (So.), both of whom played defense for the Bods last season. Up front Washburn is solid with the return of starters Gene Cullinane (Sr.), Cecil Hicks (Sr.), Eric Otting (Sr.) and Steve Sheehan (Sr.). The four veterans will be joined by Tom Bruno (Jr.), Shawn Rigby (Jr.) and Bruce Stindt (Sr.) to give Washburn a formidable front line.

Defensively, Washburn's biggest task will be replacing Second-Team NAIA All-American linebacker Troy Stedman, a seventh round selection of the Kansas City Chiefs. Spearheading Washburn's hopes will be bookend defensive ends Charlie Bennett (Sr.), an All-District 10 selection a year ago, and Stewart Ensign (Sr.). Bennett led the Bods in tackles last season with 108, while Ensign wreaked havoc in opposing backfields, collecting eight quarterback sacks. Defensive tackle Vince Paszek (Sr.) returns after missing last season with a knee injury and will join mammoth tackle Troy Drenth (Jr.) and Bruce Lane (Jr.) to anchor the Ichabod defensive line. At linebacker, Washburn will rely heavily on Mike Cardoza (Sr.) and Luke Lovejoy (So.) to fill the void left by Stedman's departure. Lovejoy enjoyed a fine rookie campaign, finishing third on the team in tackles with 80. Redshirt junior Wade Dennis, Coffeyville Junior College (Ks.) transfer Howard Holbrook (Jr.) and Frank Lemus (Jr.) will battle for the other starting linebacking jobs. Washburn's secondary welcomes the return of starters Anthony Bryan (Sr.) and Clay Phillips (Sr.). Bryan tied for the team lead in pass break-ups with five last season, while Phillips was second on the team in tackles with 85. David Coker (Sr.) and Foothill Jr. College (Ca.) transfer Blake Gudmundson (Jr.) will vie with several talented freshman for playing time in the secondary.

Perhaps Washburn's biggest chore will be replacing All-District 10 punter Tim Beasley and place kicker Dan Barber. Beasley, a four year starter for the Ichabod's, was second in the conference a year ago with a 38.6 yard average, and holds Washburn career records for most punts (239) and yards (9,983) in a career. A host of players, led by freshman Al Kaniper are on hand to battle for the punting job.

The loss of Barber, who was forced to quit after a series of nagging back injuries, leaves a big hole in the Bods place kicking department. Freshman Dave Ruder and wide receiver Dave Murphy are the leading candidates to fill Barber's shoes.

Once again a tough schedule awaits the 1988 Ichabods. Washburn will open its season at home with future conference foe Northwest Missouri State University in Moore Bowl and then hit the road for games with defending MIAA co-champion Central Missouri State and 1987 NAIA playoff entry Northeastern State Oklahoma. The Bods rugged CSIC slate is highlighted by home contests with three-time defending conference champion Pittsburg State and cross state rival Emporia State University.



Larry Elliott - Head Coach

Larry Elliott enters his ninth full season as head coach of the Washburn University Ichabods. Elliott was head coach for the Ichabods from 1974-1978, and took the helm once again at the midway point of the 1984 season, following the resignation of head coach George Tardiff. In eight and a half seasons at the Ichabod post, Elliott has compiled a 44-45-1 record, which ranks him third on Washburn's All-Time Winningest Coaches' list behind Ernie Bearg (47-30-5), and all-time leader Dick Godlove (68-42-4).

Larry Elliott's name is very familiar to the Washburn "family" and the entire greater Topeka community. Elliott, a 1959 Washburn University graduate, was an All-CIC selection in both football and basketball. Elliott still ranks sixth on the Ichabod's career passing list, with 1,934 yards through the air. Elliott is going on his 21st year of service to Washburn University. He is ranked as the Ichabod's second winningest baseball coach, having led them to a 188-174 record (51.6%) from 1967-79. Before coming to Washburn in 1966, Elliott was head football, basketball and baseball coach at Silver Lake High School in Silver Lake, Kansas. Elliott, a LaJunta, Colorado native who attended high school in Ulysses, Kansas, currently lives in Topeka with his wife Arlene.



Bill Danenhauer - Offensive Coordinator and Strength and Conditioning Coordinator

Bill enters his fourth year on the Washburn staff, his third as offensive coordinator after serving one year as the Bod's defensive line coach. Under Danenhauer's leadership the Washburn offense flourished last season, setting a school record with 3,847 yards of total offense. Before coming to Washburn, Danenhauer served as offensive coordinator at St. Cloud State

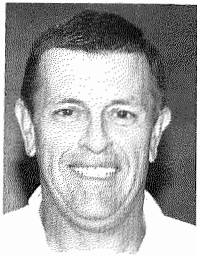
University (Minnesota) in 1984. At St. Cloud, Danenhauer's squad finished second in the North Central Conference in total offense, setting a school record with 4,092 total offensive yards. Bill played collegiate football and also wrestled at the University of Nebraska in Omaha, where he graduated in 1981. The 30 year old Danenhauer played a brief stint in the NFL for the Pittsburg Steelers in 1981 and then for the Baltimore Colts during the 1982 and 1983 seasons. Bill and his wife Brenda have a son, Aaron, age three, and a three month old daughter, Melissa.



Charlie Dieker - Offensive Line

Charlie begins sixth season as offensive line coach for the Ichabods. Dieker definitely has his coaching expertise in the offensive line, as the former collegiate offensive lineman has coached the offensive line in each of his 12 years of college coaching. He came to Washburn in 1983 after a one year stint at Panhandle State University in Oklahoma. Prior to that, Dieker coached three years at St. Mary of the Plains College in Dodge City, Kansas. He began his coaching career at Pleasant Hill High School in Pleasant Hill, Missouri, coaching football, wrestling and track.

The 34 year old Dieker, a 1977 graduate of Northwest Missouri State University in Maryville, Missouri, was a co-captain of the Bearcats and an All-Conference selection in the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association. He served as a graduate assistant at his Alma Mater in 1978 while working on his Masters. Charlie, a native of Shelbina, Missouri, and his wife Susan have a three year old daughter, Annie, and a one year old son, Christopher.

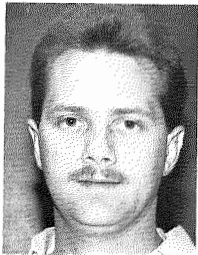


Dennis Caryl - Defensive Coordinator

Dennis has compiled 24 years of coaching experience, half of that at the collegiate level. The 45 year old Caryl, in his fourth year with the Ichabods, came to Washburn from Lincoln University (Mo.), where he was the offensive coordinator. Coach Caryl has gathered a vast variety of coaching experience from practically every level of football. As a high school head coach, he was twice named "Coach of the Year" in the state of Iowa. Dennis was the offensive coordinator for three years at Northwestern College

(Iowa), including 1974 when the Red Raiders won the NAIA Division II National Championship. He was head coach at Upper Iowa University from 1976-78, which at the time, was a member of the NAIA Division I. Caryl also has two years of coaching experience at the NCAA Division I-AA level, when he served as offensive line coach at Tennessee Tech University in 1980 and 1981.

Dennis is a 1964 graduate of Northwestern College in Orange City, Iowa, and has a master's degree from Northwest Missouri State University in Maryville, Missouri. Coach Caryl, a Sioux Rapids, Iowa native, and his wife Betty have three children, Arrow, age 16, Beau, age 14, and Misty, age 12.



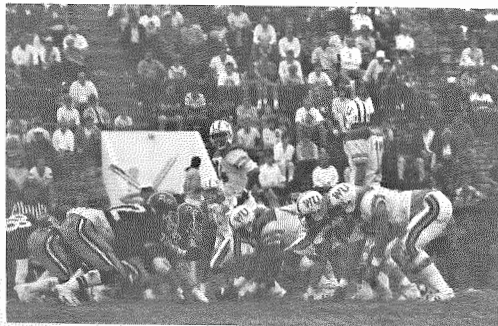
Steve Walter - Defensive Backs, Special Teams & Recruiting Coordinator

Steve enters his fourth season as Washburn's defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator. Along with his coaching duties, Steve also serves as the football recruiting coordinator.

Coach Walter joined the Washburn staff after two years at Friends University in Wichita, Kansas, where he served as defensive coordinator and was responsible for coaching the defensive secondary. While at Friends, the defense ranked fourth

in the nation in pass defense during both the 1983 and 1984 seasons, and ranked in the top ten nationally in total defense in 1984. Prior to his stint at Friends, Steve served as graduate assistant for three years at the University of Kansas, highlighted by their 1981 appearance in the Hall of Fame Bowl. He also was on the staff at his alma mater, Bethany College (Ks.), when they posted back-to-back conference championships and NAIA Division II playoff berths in 1978 and 1979.

The 30 year old Walter, a Hoisington, Kansas native, received his bachelor's degree from Bethany and his master's degree from the University of Kansas. Steve and his wife Millie live in Topeka.

Jerry Robertson - Athletic Director

The driving force behind Washburn University athletics is Director of Athletics, Jerry Robertson. The former Winchester, Kansas resident graduated from Washburn in 1965 with a Bachelor's of Education Degree after concluding a much-heralded baseball career for the Ichabods. Robertson pitched the Ichabods to the conference baseball championship (CIC) and a national ranking in 1964. Upon graduation, Robertson was drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals and spent the next four years in the Cardinal's system. The following two seasons, Jerry played for the Montreal Expos, Detroit Tigers, and New York Mets. In 1972, Robertson

returned to Topeka to assume the position of Executive Director of the Topeka YMCA. For 12 years Jerry was instrumental in raising 90% of the "Y's" operating budget of \$900,000, while expanding facilities to two new locations.

Jerry, a 1982 inductee into Washburn's Athletic Hall of Fame, and his wife Carol, have two sons, Jeff age 22 and Jason age 19.



Janet Degginger - Assistant Athletic Director

Janet begins her second year as Assistant Athletic Director at Washburn. Before coming to Washburn, Janet worked as an administrator in Washington, D.C. and Lawrence, Kansas. At Washburn, Degginger's responsibilities include financial management, administration of team travel, supervision of office personnel and facilities use coordination.

Janet, a Topeka, Kansas native, is a 1967 Washburn University graduate. She lives in Lawrence with her son Preston, age 15.



Kip Helt - Sports Information Director

A familiar face to Washburn athletics, Kip begins his first full year as Sports Information Director. The 23 year old Helt was a three year starter for the Ichabod baseball team from 1985-87. His .465 batting average in 1985 ranks second on the all-time Ichabod hitting charts. As a student at Washburn, Helt served as an assistant in the Sports Information Department as well as Sports Editor of the campus newspaper. He also compiled experience locally in both radio and television.

Kip, an Olathe, Kansas native, is a 1988 summa cum laude graduate of Washburn University with a degree in Communication Arts. He is single and lives in Topeka.

What's An Ichabod?

The name Ichabod was derived from the first name of Ichabod Washburn, and early benefactor of the University. Until 1938 there was not a graphic representation or any particular characteristics associated with Mr. Ichabod. During the 1937-38 school year, the editors of KAW, the university yearbook, decided that such items were important to the university and began to accept suggestions for a design of Mr. Ichabod. The adopted design was drawn by Bradbury Thompson (BA '34).



The following explanatory material accompanied Ichabod's first representation in the Washburn Kaw: "He has courage and enthusiasm as shown by his brisk walk. He is democratic and courteous, for he tips his hat as he passes. Sincere in his search for truth and knowledge, he studiously carries a book under his arm. His friendly smile makes you like him. He is neatly dressed and he fits well into his generation...but he adopts himself with equal ease to any change of any age."

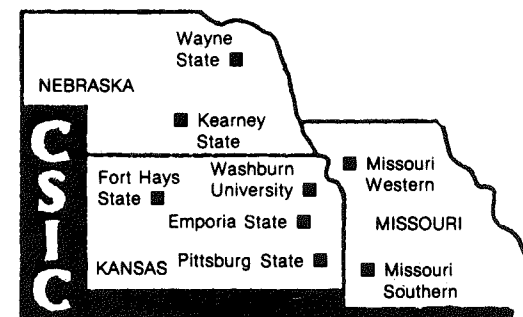
