A NEW ERA

WVU Director of Athletics and Associate Vice President Shane Lyons named coach Tim Flynn the school's ninth wrestling coach in April 2018. Flynn came to West Virginia from Edinboro, where he spent the past 21 years building the Fighting Scots into a wrestling powerhouse. He compiled a 223-95-5 career record at Edinboro to become the school's all-time winningest coach and a member of its Hall of Fame. His accomplishments at Edinboro totaled 150 national qualifiers, 38 All-Americans, 64 Eastern Wrestling League (EWL) champions and 97 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) champions. He led the Fighting Scots to five top-10 finishes at the NCAA Wrestling Championships, 14 top-20 finishes and 18 top-25 finishes.

LAST TIMEOUT

Wednesday's match vs. the Hokies marks back-to-back rivalry matches for the Mountaineers, as West Virginia most recently suffered a 37-3 loss at the hands of No. 24 Pitt on Saturday, at the Fitzgerald Field House, in Pittsburgh. Redshirt senior Christian Monserrat was the only Mountaineer who added to the team's point total, as he recorded a 4-0 decision over Robert Lee at 149 pounds. With the win, the Methuen, Massachusetts, native remains undefeated in dual action.

SCOUTING THE HOKIES

Virginia Tech last competed on Dec. 7 and picked up a 24-16 victory over Princeton in its home opener at the Cassell Coliseum. The victory marked the Hokies' first win of the year, as the squad fell to a pair of ranked foes on the road earlier this season (No. 7 Missouri and No. 25 Northwestern). Six Hokies check-in to this week's national rankings, with two-time All-American David McFadden ranking the highest at No. 5 via Interim. McFadden made his first appearance of the season against Princeton with a 5-0 decision at 174 pounds. Coach Tony Robie, who is currently in his second season at the helm, led his team to an eighth-place finish at last year's NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships.

FAMILIAR FACES

Flynn will see some familiar faces on the mat this week, as Edinboro transfers Korbin Myers (133) and Billy Miller (HWT) are both listed as probable starters for Wednesday night's match. Miller, who is ranked at No. 7 via Interim, transferred to Virginia Tech in June with one year of eligibility remaining. While at Edinboro under Flynn, Miller was a three-time NCAA qualifier and two-time EWL champion. Myers, who is ranked as high as No. 13 by FloWrestling, joined the Hokies with two years of eligibility. Myers won his second EWL Championship last season and qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the second time in his career. Additionally, Robie was a two-time All-American and a 1997 NCAA finalist at 158 pounds with Flynn on staff. Before taking over the head coaching duties at Edinboro, Flynn served as an assistant under legendary coach and Olympian Bruce Baumgartner from 1992-97.

SERIES VS. VIRGINIA TECH

The Mountaineers and the Hokies will square off for the 22nd time on Wednesday. West Virginia boasts a 12-9 lead in the all-time series, which dates back to 1951. However, it has been Virginia Tech that has claimed the last three meetings (2016-18), after a 30-6 win in Blacksburg, Virginia, last season. Prior to the 2016 meeting, the two teams had not met since 2004, when the Mountaineers captured a 39-13 victory in Blacksburg.

LOOKING AHEAD

Following a holiday break, the Mountaineers head south for several matches, taking on Virginia, Michigan State, North Dakota State and Purdue, as part of the South Beach Duals, in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, from Dec. 29-30. West Virginia holds a 12-2 all-time series advantage over Virginia. Michigan State holds a 5-1 lead in the all-time series, though WVU claimed a 23-12 win in the squads' most recent meeting in 2012. The Mountaineers went head-to-head with the Bison for the first time in program history last season, notching a 19-12 victory over NDSU in Morgantown. Purdue holds a 1-0 all-time series advantage, though the squads have not faced each other head-to-head since 1954.

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TOUGH SLATE

Flynn's inaugural season is highlighted with 18 dual matches, including six in front of the Mountaineer faithful at the WVU Coliseum. West Virginia has faced three teams ranked inside the USA Today/NWCA Coaches' Poll this year, with No. 14 Virginia Tech becoming the Mountaineers' fourth top-25 opponent of the 2018-19 season. WVU will wrestle nine Big 12 duals and will face seven opponents that finished in the top 25 at the 2018 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships.

LEADING THE PACK

Redshirt sophomore Matthew Schmitt, redshirt freshman Noah Adams and Monserrat were appointed as this year's captains, with each wrestler bringing a different leadership trait to the team room this season. Monserrat is one of two seniors on the 2018-19 roster, donning the most experience over Schmitt and Adams in a Mountaineer singlet. However, Schmitt is the only Mountaineer to return to the mat this season as an NCAA Qualifier. Adams, a native of Coal City, West Virginia, gained valuable experience wrestling unattached in several tournaments last season.

FRESH FACES

Redshirt freshman Joey Thomas and sophomore Hunter DeLong are both listed as probable starters for the first time this season. Thomas wrestled unattached in 10 tournaments last season, finishing with a 16-20 record at 125 pounds. The Mount Airy, Maryland, native earned a trio of major decisions and a pair of pins, landing on the podium at six tournaments. DeLong is listed to make a break in the lineup at 184 pounds. The Parkersburg, West Virginia, native wrestled in a pair of dual matches at 197 pounds last season, but closed the year competing at several different tournaments. He compiled a 12-17 overall mark, notching two major decisions, two technical falls and two wins by fall.

MOVING UP

Redshirt freshman KJ Fenstermacher started the season at 125 pounds, notching a 5-5 overall record and a 1-2 dual mark. However, Fenstermacher did not make weight at the Pitt match on Saturday, causing him to move up one weight class to 133 with Schmitt out of the lineup due to injury. The Northampton, Pennsylvania, native transferred to West Virginia from Pitt, redshirting as a true freshman last season. Fenstermacher capped his high school career with an overall record of 160-17 at 120 pounds, earning back-to-back third-place finishes at the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA) Class A Wrestling Championships his junior and senior year. Additionally, Fenstermacher was crowned a two-time National High School Coaches Association (NHSCA) All-American and a two-time FloNational All-American.

MARTIN SETTLES IN

Redshirt senior Joe Wheeling suffered a season ending injury in early November, which caused true freshman Luke Martin to slide into his weight class at 141. The Parkersburg, West Virginia, native currently holds a 6-5 record, posting two major decisions and one tech. fall on the season. Martin was a four-time West Virginia state finalist for Parkersburg South High, claiming three state titles. He also was named an NHSCA All-American.

MONSERRAT MAKING MOVES

Monserrat moved up one weight class from last season, competing at 149 pounds for an 8-3 overall record on the year. He remains undefeated in dual action, leading the squad with 13 match points and nine takedowns. A native of Methuen, Massachusetts, Monserrat competed at 141 pounds as a redshirt junior, recording an 18-16 overall mark, with five major decisions, two tech. falls and one pin.

NGATI RETURNS TO THE LINEUP

Junior Brandon Ngati returned to the starting lineup on Saturday, dropping a 6-4 decision to No. 13 Demetrius Thomas of Pitt in the heavyweight bout. Ngati, a native of Gaithersburg, Maryland, earned the starting role for WVU the past two seasons, though

redshirt junior David Smith went 2-0 at wrestle-offs in late October to win the starting spot over Ngati. Most notably, Ngati pinned Iowa State's Jon Scanlon in 4:28 to lead WVU to its first-ever Big 12 win on Feb. 12, 2017, in Morgantown.

JOURNEYMEN COLLEGIATE CLASSIC

Five Mountaineers took first place in their respective pools, as West Virginia collected 217 points for a seventh-place finish at the 2018 Journeymen MyHouse Collegiate Classic on Nov. 11, in Schenectady, New York. The tournament field featured competition from 17 universities, including six teams ranked inside the College NWCA/USA Today Top-25 Poll. Thomas (125), Monserrat (149), sophomore Nick Kiussis (165), Adams (197) and Smith (HWT) each earned a first-place finish in their respective pools.

HOKIE OPEN

West Virginia sent 16 wrestlers to compete in the 2018 Hokie Open, at Berglund Arena, in Roanoke, Virginia, on Nov. 4. Ten Mountaineers finished in the top five of their respective weight classes, with Schmitt (133) and Adams (197) winning division titles. Schmitt went 5-0 in the 133-pound open division to claim his first tournament win of his career. Adams also recorded a perfect 4-0 mark to capture the 197-pound freshman/sophomore division title. Additionally, redshirt junior Zachary Moore (157) and Kiussis (165) each earned third-place finishes in the open division, while Smith placed fifth in the heavyweight open division. Five Mountaineers also joined Adams on the podium in the freshman/sophomore division. Freshman Josh Ramirez (174) and Fenstermacher (125) each collected third-place finishes, while DeLong placed fourth at 184 pounds. Additionally, redshirt freshman Sean Mullican and Thomas each claimed a fifth-place finish in the 285-pound and 125-pound pool, respectively.

SEASON-OPENING VICTORY

West Virginia topped Big 12 foe Northern Colorado, 22-14, in its 2018-19 season opener on Nov. 1, at the WVU Coliseum, in Morgantown. WVU won six of 10 bouts against UNC, including a win by fall at 285 pounds. Down 14-9 with four bouts remaining, Schmitt collected a huge 13-5 major decision over Christopher Sandoval at 133 pounds, cutting WVU's deficit to one at 14-13. Wheeling then pushed the Mountaineers in front with a 7-1 decision over Owen Lamb at 141 pounds. Monserrat helped WVU seal the deal with an 8-2 decision over Mason Hulse at 149 pounds, increasing the Mountaineers lead to five at 19-14. Moore capped the night for the Mountaineers, as he used a trio of takedowns, a reversal and four near fall points for a 12-8 decision over Jordan Robison at 157 pounds.

BIG 12 ADDS AFFILIATE MEMBERS

The Big 12 Conference added Fresno State and Northern Iowa in July of 2017 as affiliate members to give the league a 12-team field. The new additions joined Air Force, Iowa State, Northern Colorado, North Dakota State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, South Dakota State, Utah Valley, West Virginia and Wyoming.

BIG 12 WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIP ANNOUNCED

The 2019 Big 12 Wrestling Championship will be held at the BOK Center in Tulsa, Oklahoma, from March 9-10, for the third year in a row. Tickets are on sale now. Conference institutions hosted the wrestling championships on campus from 1997-2015. The 2016 event was held in Kansas City's Sprint Center.

KENNY RITCHIE NAMED BIG 12 COORDINATOR OF OFFICIALS

Kenny Ritchie was named the Big 12 Conference Coordinator of Wrestling Officials during the offseason. Ritchie is a 28-year member of the National Wrestling Officials Association and was inducted into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2015. He has officiated 17 NCAA Division I National Championships, including 14 championship final matches. Ritchie's role with the Big 12 will include
