COWBOY QUICK HITS

► Seven All-Americans and five seniors return to the Cowboy lineup and redshirt-freshman, and 2017 Junior World Champion Daton Fix is another key addition at 133 pounds.

► In 2017-18 the Cowboys went 13-2 in dual meets and wrapped up conference competition at the Big 12 Championships in Tulsa, Okla., claiming their sixth consecutive conference title with four individual champions.

► This week the Cowboys have 10 wrestlers ranked at their respective weights in various polls.

► The Pokes held steady in the USA Today/Intermat rankings this week at No. 3, and look to build on a 7-0, (4-0 Big 12) record.

► Oklahoma State head coach John Smith assumed the title of winningest active head coach in NCAA Division I wrestling more than a year ago. He holds 418 wins in his 28th year coaching the Cowboys. Last season, Smith became the eighth coach to notch 400 wins in division I wrestling.

MEDIA INFORMATION AND POLICIES

The Oklahoma State athletic communications office welcomes you to another season of Cowboy wrestling. The communications staff is here to assist members of the media in their coverage of Oklahoma State athletics. Please take a moment to become familiar with the following media policies.

CREDENTIALS

Members of the media should contact Emily Lingenfelter in the Oklahoma State media relations office to request credentials to OSU wrestling duals (emily.lingenfelter@okstate.edu or 405-744-4316). Credentials can be picked up at the Southwest pass gate to Gallagher-Iba Arena on match days.

INTERVIEWS

Media interview requests for Oklahoma State head coach John Smith should be directed to Sean Maguire in the OSU media relations office. Any requests for assistant coaches and wrestlers should be directed to Emily Lingenfelter in the OSU media relations office. Coaches and wrestlers are typically available for interview before practice starts (usually around 3 p.m. CT), but arrangements can be made to accommodate most schedules.

MEDIA PARKING

Members of the media attending matches at Gallagher-Iba Arena should park in the lot just south of the arena and Boone Pickens Stadium. The entrance to the lot is located off Knoblock Street. No parking pass is necessary for entry into the lot.

VISITING RADIO, PHONE LINES

Phone lines will be provided to the primary radio broadcast crews for both the Cowboys and the visiting team. Additional lines are available to the media on a first-come, first-served basis in the Gallagher-Iba Arena media room.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photographers may shoot from the east and west sides of the mat, but are prohibited from shooting in front of either team's bench on the north and south sides of the mat.

COWBOYS ON THE AIR

Rex Holt and Roger Moore are in their 14th year together as the radio broadcast team of Oklahoma State Cowboy Wrestling. OSU wrestling can be heard on its primary home of 93.7 KSPI-FM radio in Stillwater. Occasionally, events are aired on Pete 94.3 FM or 780 AM radio Stillwater should programming conflicts arise. JOHN SMITH

Head Coach | 28th Year | Oklahoma State, 1988

Now in his 28th year, Smith accepted the head coaching position at Oklahoma State in 1992 and the numbers and accomplishments since that time speak for themselves. He has led his alma mater to five NCAA team titles in 1994, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006, and he has coached 32 NCAA individual champions and five Olympians. Under his watch, the Cowboys have brought 18 team conference tournament championships, two Big 12 regular season titles and 114 individual conference titles back to Stillwater. He has seen his student-athletes earn All-America recognition 129 times, an average of 4.8 All-America honorees per year.

STILLWATER – The Oklahoma State wrestling team tallied its fourth Big 12 win of the season on Friday night, defeating West Virginia, 29-6, at Gallagher-Iba Arena.

The Cowboys (7-1, 4-0 Big 12) won nine of 10 matches on Friday, including a couple of ranked wins by Nick Piccininni and Preston Weigel, as well as a pair of major decisions from Boo Lewallen and Jonce Blaylock.

"I want to see more out of this team," head coach John Smith said. "I'm just not seeing the level that I think we're capable of seeing. And we have got to start putting it together and pushing ourselves a little bit harder in these matches. To score points, if somebody's coming out and trying to keep us from scoring, have the will to go in and not let that kind of match take place, I thought we saw that a little bit in a couple matches ... I'm looking for a lot more aggression."

Matched up with No. 14 Zeke Moisey, Piccininni came away with the 4-0 decision to give the Pokes an early, 3-0 edge. Tied with no score after one period, Moisey took down to open the second. The Cowboy redshirt sophomore would ride out the entirety of the period, however, and chose down to start the third. Piccininni escaped just a couple of seconds into the final frame and scored on a takedown with 25 seconds to go.

Kaid Brock followed Piccininni's win up with a 6-1 decision at 133 pounds, defeating West Virginia's Matthew Schmitt. Brock was in control for most of the match, scoring takedowns in the first and second periods and allowing no offensive scores from Schmitt to earn his 16th win on the year.

Dean Heil scored another decision for the Pokes at 141 with an 11-5 victory against Christian Monserrat. Heil used four takedowns and a reversal, as well as riding time, to rack up 11 points; however, Monserrat's reversal with just seconds to go in the match wiped away a would-be major decision from the two-time defending champ.

The Cowboys got their bonus points at 149 and 157, as Lewallen and Blaylock controlled their opponents for major decisions.

Lewallen overwhelmed West Virginia's Tyler Rea from the opening whistle, scoring three takedowns in the opening period to take a 6-2 lead into the second. The Cowboy redshirt sophomore finished off the match with takedowns in both of the second and third frames to secure the 12-4 win.

Blaylock overcame an early takedown from Zach Moore to open the match, and rebounded with a takedown of his own before the end of the period to head to the second tied at three. From there, it was all Blaylock, who got in on three more scores over the final two periods and pull away for the 13-5 major.

The Mountaineers got on the board with their only win of the night at 165 pounds. In his first career start, Cowboy Dalton Moran traded takedowns in the first period with Nick Kiussis. With a 3-2 lead, Moran was reversed and eventually pinned in 2:04.

Jacobe Smith got the Cowboys back on track at 174 with a 9-4 decision over Parker VonEgdy. Smith used flurries in the first and third periods to rack up three takedowns and a reversal on his way to his fifth-straight win.

At 184 pounds, tied at one apiece after regulation, Cowboy Keegan Moore and Brenden McRill headed to sudden victory to decide their match. It was Moore that would come up with the win, tallying a takedown with 11 seconds to go to lock up the 3-1 decision.

In a rematch of last year's 197-pound Big 12 title bout, Preston Weigel went head-to-head with West Virginia's 13th-ranked Jacob Smith. Smith struck first, scoring a takedown on the edge of the mat early in the first period to lead, 2-1, after one. Choosing down, Weigel escaped quickly to open the second frame before scoring on a takedown of his own to take a 4-2 lead. Smith chose the down position to open the third, but couldn't get off bottom, as Weigel rode the Mountaineer for the remainder of the final period on his way to a 5-2 decision.

"(It was about) being tough," Weigel said. "I needed it there. You don't want to give him a chance. He was sitting there stalling, and you just have to go get it when you need it."

Finally, Derek White finished off the dual with a 10-4 win over West Virginia's Brandon Ngati. White had little trouble with the Mountaineer sophomore, scoring four takedowns en route to his 13th win of the season.

THE BASICS

Oklahoma State wrestling rounds out a grueling month-long road schedule at West Virginia and No. 14 Pittsburgh on Friday and Saturday, respectively.

It marks OSU's 14th meeting with the Mountaineers and sixth all-time dual with Pittsburgh, the most recent taking place in 2016 at Gallagher-Iba Arena.

West Virginia's lineup features three top-20 wrestlers at 133, 149 and 165 pounds. Gfeller's bout with Monserrat marks his third ranked match in a week.

This week's NWCA/USA Today DI Coaches poll positions the Cowboys at No. 3 after Penn State and Ohio State, respectively. The Cowboys have a ranked wrestler at each weight, with seven of those landing in the top 10 and four of those among the top five.

Friday's contest in Morgantown is at 8 p.m. EST and the dual at Pitt starts at 1 p.m. EST.

WATCH THE COWBOYS

Fans can watch the dual at West Virginia on MountaineerTV, and the Pitt dual is set to air on ACC Network Extra.

LISTEN LIVE

The Princeton dual will air live on Pete 94.3 FM on Saturday with Rex Holt and Roger Moore on the call beginning at noon central.

The Cowboys' second bout of the weekend is on 97.3 KSPI FM.

ABOUT THE COWBOYS

Coming off a rebuilding year that saw a number of Cowboys utilize redshirts, OSU returns seven All-Americans, adds a pair of transfers and 2017 Junior World Champion Daton Fix to its lineup. A number of familiar faces are back on the mat, including seniors Chandler Rogers, Jacobe Smith, Preston Weigel and Derek White.

Rogers led all Cowboys in falls with 11 and knocked off six ranked opponents in the previous season. In his first year competing in the orange singlet, Jacobe Smith took home an All-America nod, finishing eighth after being slotted at No. 13 for the NCAA Tournament. Weigel returns from a season fraught with injuries and looks to make a run at the podium again to wrap up his Cowboy career. One of the Pokes' pleasant surprises in 2017-18 was heavyweight Derek White. Although White fell short of an All-America finish at nationals, he collected a Big 12 title, 51 points in duals and a team-leading 55 dual takedowns for the Cowboys.

Following up an impressive 13-2 dual record, the Cowboys also claimed the program's 52nd conference title, with Nick Piccininni, Boo Lewallen, Chandler Rogers and Derek White bringing home first-place finishes.

Piccininni looks to secure his third conference title and make his way back to the podium at the NCAA Championships in March. All-American Kaid Brock led the Cowboys in dual points scored with 54 last season. The Cowboy notched eight major decisions and was three takedowns shy of team leader Derek White.

A pair of less familiar faces takes the mat for the Cowboys this season at 157 and 184 pounds. Andrew Shomers and Dakota Geer put on the orange singlet for the first time at South Dakota State following their transfer from Edinboro. Shomers made the NCAA tournament for the first time last year and finished in the round of 32. Geer comes into the season after a redshirt year at Edinboro having made the NCAA Tournament in his true freshman campaign for the Scots.

IN THE POLLS

This week, the No. 3 Cowboys have seven wrestlers inside the top 10, four falling in the top five and a ranked wrestler at each weight class.

Heavyweight Derek White and freshman Daton Fix hold the highest marks for the Cowboys, both landing at No. 2 this week. Fix knocked off No. 3 Nick Suriano at the RAC in a wild double-overtime match. No offensive points were scored in the bout. White picked up his fifth fall of the year at Princeton. These highest ranked Cowboys lead the team in dual takedowns with Fix at 23 and White next in line at 21.

Nick Piccininni comes in at No. 4 again this week after collecting a top-10 win over Princeton's Pat Glory and notching a technical fall at Rutgers. All but three of his matches this season have come with bonus points attached.

After wrestling the No. 1 and 2 wrestlers at 149 pounds last weekend, Kaden Gfeller moved up one spot to No. 5 at the weight. Gfeller wrestled close bouts with Matthew Kolodzick and Anthony Ashnault, losing by a combined eight points. Also landing at No. 5 this week is Joe Smith at 174 pounds. Smith made his way into the polls following the Southern Scuffle. He picked up two decisions in New Jersey this past weekend.

Jacobe Smith garners a No. 11 ranking after collecting a first-period fall over Princeton's Kevin Parker and a major decision against Willie Scott (Rutgers). Kaid Brock dropped to No. 13 at 141 pounds after notching a major decision at Princeton and defeating Rutgers Pete Lipan. Chandler Rogers remains at No. 10 spot at 165 pounds after bowing out at the Scuffle due to injury and being sidelined for the latest duals.

Andrew Shomers (157) wrestled for the first time since the Reno Tournament of Champions at 165 pounds for both New Jersey duals. Shomers went 1-1 on the weekend and hangs on to the 19th spot at 157 pounds.

At 197 pounds, Dakota Geer comes in at No. 10. Geer lost a tough bout at Princeton to No. 3 Patrick Brucki but bounced back on Sunday to pick up a decision at Rutgers.





MATCH NOTES

LAST TIME OUT

PISCATAWAY, N.J. – Cowboy Daton Fix defeated No. 3 Nick Suriano in a packed Rutgers Athletic Center, helping the Cowboys to a 26-5 defeat of the Scarlett Knights on Sunday afternoon. Oklahoma State won eight of 10 bouts to secure the win.

Fix's 3-2 double-tiebreaker lasted more than 30 minutes. After a scoreless first period, the pair scored only escapes in regulation, sending the bout to overtime. Rutgers coaches challenged for a locked hands call on Fix but were unsuccessful. A locked hands call on Suriano was then overturned. In SV2, Fix won the 3-2 decision after a hands to the face call on Suriano. The win pushed Fix to 20-0 on the season.

OSU capped off the dual with back-to-back wins at 197 and heavyweight. Dakota Geer won a hard-fought 4-2 decision over Matt Correnti, and Derek White took his bout with Christian Colucci, 4-2, also. Each team was deducted a team point for unsportsmanlike conduct following the match at 149 pounds.

- Nick Piccininni leads the Cowboys in dual nearfalls this season (9) and is tied with Fix for number of ranked wins (5).
- Jacobe Smith has wrestled for OSU at 174 and 184 pounds in duals. He remains undefeated and has won six of the seven by fall or major decision, adding one of each to his resume last weekend.
- Joe Smith entered the rankings two weeks ago at No. 5 following an impressive Southern Scuffle outing where he lost a 5-1 decision in the finals to No. 1 Mark Hall.

BIG MEN FALL HARD

Heavyweight Derek White garnered his first career pin against Oklahoma's Jake Boyd on Dec. 9, and has been on a roll ever since.

White went on to defeat Northern Colorado's Robert Winters in a second-period, 17-2 technical fall in the Cowboys' latest dual meet. Four days later in Reno, the No. 3 ranked wrestler collected first and second round falls against Menlo's Jeremiah Holbrook and Bryan Barnes (unat.). The first tournament pin came in a career-best 29 seconds.

At the Southern Scuffle, White earned two technical falls in his first two matches before pinning Lock Haven's Thomas Haines in the quarterfinals. The Cowboy went on to claim the heavyweight title defeating Nick Nevills and Anthony Cassar (PSU) via decisions.

He added his fifth career fall to the win column last weekend against Princeton.

ROGERS' RACE TO 100

Cowboy senior Chandler Rogers is only nine wins shy of reaching the 100-win milestone in the OSU orange singlet. Rogers sits at 14-2 on the season, his only losses coming to Wyoming's Branson Ashworth and No. 3 Chance Marsteller (Lock Haven).

All of Rogers' wins this season have boasted bonus points, including 11 falls, two technical falls and a major decision. The 11 pins are only two shy of his season-best 13.

With the second half of the Cowboys' schedule getting underway, Rogers has plenty of opportunities to join the 100-win club and position himself among the ranks of more than 40 OSU wrestlers who reached the milestone in their careers.

400 AND COUNTING

Last season, Oklahoma State head coach John Smith assumed the title of winningest active head coach in NCAA Division I wrestling.

After the Cowboys' win over Minnesota in November, Smith reached dual win No. 400 for his career, becoming the seventh

head coach in DI history to reach that benchmark. He is also only the fifth coach to win all of his duals at the same school. Currently sitting at 416 career wins, Smith is 5 wins away from tying Jack Childs and T.J. Kerr for fifth on the list. Impressively, of his 417 wins, 142 have come over top-10 teams.

GET YOUR FIX

Oklahoma State redshirt freshman Daton Fix took gold at the 2017 Junior World Championships in August 2017, outscoring five opponents by a combined score of 53-1 and leading the United States to its first team title since 1984. With the win, Fix became the first Cowboy wrestler to take gold at the event since Alan Fried in 1991.

After blazing through the 2018 Senior World Team Trials, the Sand Springs native fell to world bronze medalist Thomas Gilman at Final X, then participated in a special wrestle-off with Brandon Courtney of Arizona State. The Cowboy outscored Courtney 21-0 in the two matches, sealing a spot on his third-straight World Team.

He stormed through the first round in Trnava, Slovakia, before falling to Asia Junior Championships runner-up Naveen Naveen, 5-4, in the semifinals. He returned to the mat to collect his third technical fall of the tournament over Kyrgyzstan's Bekbolot Myrzanzazar Uulu and bring home a third-place finish.

The Cowboy made his debut for OSU at South Dakota State and picked up his third technical fall of the season with a 16-1 win over Spencer Huber. Fix turned around Sunday to defeat Minnesota's No. 6 Ethan Lizak, 6-1. The redshirt freshman defeated a second returning All-American on Nov. 25, in his Gallagher-Iba Arena debut when he notched a decision over Wyoming's No. 11 Montorie Bridges. In his first Bedlam match, Fix won by technical fall, 20-5, over OU's Anthony Madrigal.

Fix has five ranked wins on the season and since the season's first rankings has climbed from No. 10 to No. 2 at 133 pounds.

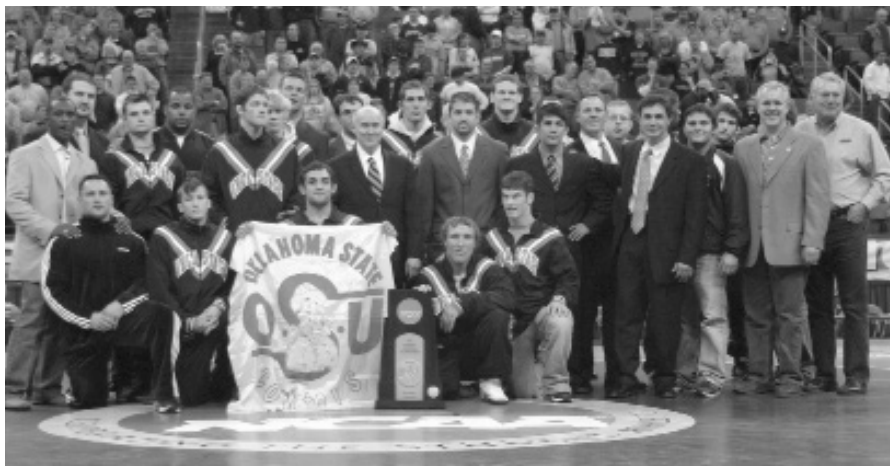

COWBOY WRESTLING TRADITION

Oklahoma State wrestling celebrated 100 years of history three seasons ago. The Cowboys, then known as the Oklahoma A&M Tigers and led by A.M. Colville, wrestled their first match in 1915 against the University of Texas. It was a rough start for OSU as it fell to the Longhorns in its lone dual of the season. But the Cowboys pulled through and went on to win 34 NCAA team championships (the most by any school in any sport), 142 individual champions and 462 All-Americans. Overall, the Cowboys hold an incredibly impressive 1,106-129-23 overall record.

NO OFF-SEASON

The 2018-19 college wrestling season might have ended in March, but several Cowboys competed as late as June with others wrestling through the summer and into the beginning of the fall semester.

On June 1, Nick Piccininni, Jacob Fontanez, Kaden Gfeller, Kaid Brock, Boo Lewallen, Chander Rogers, Joe Smith and Cornelius Putnam traveled to Akron, Ohio, to contend for spots on the United States U23 Freestyle World Team.

Redshirt freshman Bear Hughes clinched a spot on the Junior Greco-Roman World Team. The Cowboy advanced to the finals following winning a U.S. Open title in Las Vegas. He went on to sweep the finals in Indianapolis this summer.

Austin Harris also made a run at the Open, claiming a 97 kg Junior Greco title at the UWW freestyle tournament in April. He finished eighth at the 2017 Junior Nationals to earn All-America Status. The Roseburg, Ore., native went to Fortaleza Brazil, in August, where he spent just over two minutes on the mat on his way to a Junior Pan-American Greco title. Harris also won his weight class in the freestyle bracket.

Daton Fix spent his summer on the mat contending for a position on the USA Wrestling Senior freestyle team and ultimately training and competing at 57kg on the Junior World team.

Fix swept the U.S. Open with five wins over opponents among the ranks of former Cowboy Eddie Klimara, Zane Richards and four-time NCAA All-American Zach Sanders. The wins set the stage for a best-of-three series with two-time world team member Tony Ramos. Fix only needed two matches to get the job done.

He fell at Final X to world bronze medalist Thomas Gilman but moved on to defeat Arizona State's Brandon Courtney in a best-of-three series to earn a spot on the Junior World Team.

The redshirt freshman traveled to Trnava, Slovakia, to compete for his second-consecutive World title, but was upset in the semifinals. The Cowboy fought back and collected a third-place finish, marking his third bronze finish at world competition.

COAST-TO-COAST COWBOYS

The 2018-19 Cowboys roster features 19 native Oklahomans, but the remaining 17 wrestlers come to Oklahoma State from 13 other states, including: California, Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Kansas, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Texas, Utah and Virginia.

OKLAHOMA STATE IS "WRESTLING U"

In 2016, Dan Lobdell and Andrew Spey of *FloWrestling* highlighted the best schools at each weight class over the past 15 years. The 10-part series breaks down each weight class using an algorithm that factors in a school's NCAA qualifiers, All-Americans and national champions over that time span to name one school the best at each class.

Oklahoma State took top honors in four weight classes (133, 149, 165 and 174), while finishing second at heavyweight. Not only were the Cowboys one of two schools to take multiple weight classes, but OSU was the only program to take more than two.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Like most years, this season's squad features a number of family ties within Cowboy wrestling.

Coach John Smith promoted his nephew Chris Perry from the volunteer assistant position more than a year ago to a member of the full-time coaching staff. Smith's son and two-time All-American Joe, returns to the mat in 2018-19 after a redshirt year.

Redshirt sophomore Andrew Marsden's brother Austin wrestled for OSU through 2016. Chandler Rogers' older brother Jordan was a Cowboy wrestler from 2012-2017. Redshirt sophomore Wyatt Sheets' father, Mike, was a four-time All-American and two-time NCAA Champion during his time as a Cowboy, and Daton Fix, Wes Ahlberg and Zalin Edwards' fathers all competed for the Cowboys.

CHAMPS IN THE CLASSROOM

Seven members of the Oklahoma State wrestling team earned spots on the Academic All-Big 12 team, and two earned NWCA All-Academic status.

Senior Dean Heil earned first team honors, as Jonce Blaylock, Gary Wayne Harding and Andrew Marsden. Geo Martinez, Donald Cannon and Hestin Lamons received second team honors. Blaylock was honored for his second consecutive season.

Heil and Blaylock were also named to the NWCA All-Academic team, with Heil receiving recognition for the fourth time in his Cowboy career.



MATCH NOTES

SMITH SIGNS SEVEN TO NLI

Oklahoma State wrestling head coach John Smith announced the signing of seven student-athletes to National Letters of Intent on Nov. 15. Brevin Balmededa, Cade Lindsey, Daniel Manibog, Chance McLane, Colt Newton, Triston Wills and Reece Witcraft will join the Cowboys in the fall of 2018.

Balmededa is Flo's No. 6 ranked high school wrestler in the country at 152 pounds and Intermat's No. 3. He boasts two Florida state titles to date. The Cowboy commit won the 2017 Super 32 and is a three-time NHSCA National Tournament champion. He notched a fourth-place finish at Super 32 this year. Balmededa comes to Oklahoma from South Dade High School where he wrestles for his father.

The 2019 Cowboy class also includes Katy, Texas', Daniel Manibog who comes in at No. 9 in Flo's 145-pound rankings. He's a two-time Texas state champion and knocked off multiple top-ranked wrestlers at Fargo this summer to finish fourth. Flo's No. 19 wrestler at 132, Reece Witcraft will also join the Cowboys in 2019.

McLane comes to OSU from Bozeman Montana with two state titles under his belt and a second-place finish at the USA World Greco-Roman Team Trials at 65 kg. McLane competed alongside fellow Cowboy signee Balmededa at Super 32 this fall.

Derby High School teammates Triston Wills and Cade Lindsey are set to join the Cowboys following their senior seasons. Lindsey is a three-time, top-three finisher in Kansas, and Wills took home top honors last season when he knocked off current Cowboy Jalin Harper in the 160-pound Kansas state finals. Oklahoma native Colt Newton also signed this week. He is a three-time state finalist and dropped a finals bout to Witcraft in 2018 after defeating him in the regular season.

COACHED BY THE BEST

When wrestlers come to compete at Oklahoma State, they are coached by the best. John Smith holds six world championships and two Olympic gold medals. Smith, Zack Esposito, Chris Perry and Tyler Caldwell also combine for five NCAA championships and 13 All-America honors. Smith brings in a plethora of international coaching experience. Most recently, he coached the 2017 USA Women's Cadet World Team, for which he was named USA Wrestling Women's Co-Coach of the Year alongside Campbell's Kary Kolat.

Esposito has had a hand in coaching World teams for the past four years, including two Cadet World Teams, a first-place Junior World Team and title-winning World Cup Team.

WRESTLING'S HOUSE OF HORRORS

No venue in America has a richer wrestling tradition than Gallagher-Iba Arena, home of Oklahoma State wrestling since 1939. In its beginning as Gallagher Hall, the gymnasium was named for Edward Clark Gallagher, the Oklahoma A&M wrestling mentor who never wrestled competitively but became the greatest coach of his time.

Since wrestling began in Gallagher-Iba Arena, the Cowboys have won 25 NCAA titles and have had 40 unbeaten and untied campaigns at home. One of their longest winning streaks ran with the arena's opening in 1939 and lasted until Feb. 16, 1951. During that period, Oklahoma State won 37 straight home duals, with no ties.

Gallagher-Iba Arena has proved to be one of the most difficult venues for opponents to win in across all of college sports, as the Cowboy wrestling program boasts an impressive 482-40-6 overall record in the arena.

From the final dual of 1959 through the first five home duals of the 1967 season, Oklahoma State wrestled 67 duals without a loss, finishing with an impressive 60-0-1 record before the streak was broken by Oklahoma, 19-13.

OSU's latest home winning streak of 50 consecutive duals was the second-longest such streak without a loss or tie, as it began near the end of the 1986 season and lasted until Jan. 30, 1993.

BROOKINGS, S.D. – The No. 4 Oklahoma State wrestling team racked up four falls and four more bonus-point wins Friday night on its way to a 45-6 drubbing of Big 12 opponent South Dakota State in the Cowboys' first dual of the 2018-19 season. OSU's lone loss came via injury default at 149 pounds.

"Overall, it was a really good effort by our squad," coach John Smith said. "One-hour weigh-in, first dual meet ... that all creates a scenario where it's hard to come out and look as good as you want to look, but I'm pleased and looking forward to tomorrow."

OSU's first of three consecutive pins came from 157-pounder Andrew Shomers over Colten Carlson in 3:52. No. 20 Shomers scored a four-point nearfall in the bout and had more than three minutes of riding time when the fall came. In the next match, Chandler Rogers pinned Logan Peterson in 5:36, and at 174 pounds, Jacobe Smith looked up Jackrabbit Brett Bye to get a pin in 4:19.

In his OSU debut, No. 9 Daton Fix collected a 19-1 technical fall over SDSU's Spencer Huber at 133 pounds. Huber made his first start for the Jackrabbits in place of returning national champion Seth Gross, and after three takedowns and three nearfalls, Fix was finished in 4:43.

Redshirt junior Kaid Brock wrestled for the Cowboys at 141 against Rylee Molitor. Brock was the third-straight Cowboy to earn a bonus-point win, coming away with a 17-4 major decision. MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. – The No. 4 Oklahoma State wrestling team (2-0) won its second dual of the weekend Sunday, as the Cowboys won seven individual bouts with three wins over ranked opponents and three more bonus-point wins to take down No. 11 Minnesota, 23-9, at Maturi Pavillion.

Nick Piccininni, Daton Fix, Kaden Gfeller and each claimed wins over ranked opponents at 125, 133 and 149 pounds, respectively, while Chandler Rogers (165 pounds), Jacobe Smith (174 pounds) and Dakota Geer (184 pounds) won three-straight major decisions to separate the Cowboys from the Gophers for a comfortable dual win.

"I thought we did a good job as far as winning the second and third periods in some of those closer bouts," coach John Smith said. "Looking at the positives, we had Kaden Gfeller with a good win. It was a nice match to watch from a guy who had to bump up a weight with short notice."

At 149 pounds, Gfeller stepped in for injured Boo Lewallen to upset No. 18 Tommy Thorn, 9-3. The Cowboy's offense started early with a takedown and finished strong with a takedown and two-point nearfall to close out the final period.

Fix matched up with No. 6 Ethan Lizak at 133 pounds and defeated the 2017 NCAA finalist, 6-1. The ninth-ranked Cowboy scored two takedowns and a reversal and held Lizak to only one escape in the bout.

"I was really excited for this trip," Fix said. "It was my college debut, really, and I was looking forward to wrestling Seth Gross and Ethan Lizak. I only got the opportunity to wrestle one, and I took advantage of it. I've been looking forward to this year for as long as I can remember."

Piccininni was tested at 125 pounds in a matchup with the Minnesota's Sean Russell but held on to defeat the fifth-ranked Gopher, 3-0. The Poke moves to 3-2 in the series against Russell and handed Russell his first loss of the season.

The string of three consecutive major decisions began with a Rogers win over Minnesota's Carson Broisma, 10-2. Rogers picked up four takedowns in the bout and also earned a riding time point. Smith notched an 11-2 major over Devin Skatzka in the 174 bout, and Geer shut out Owen Webster in his 10-0 major at 184 pounds.

Andrew Marsden picked up OSU's seventh win of the dual at 197 pounds, beating Brandon Krone, 2-0.

Redshirt junior Kaid Brock and Andrew Shomers lost decisions at 141 and 157, respectively. No. 8 Mitch McKee upset Brock, 6-3, to mark the 141-pounder's first loss in the series. Shomers dropped a close bout to No. 11 Steve Bleise, 8-5, when the Gopher picked up a late takedown and nearfall. Third-ranked Derek White fell to No. 5 Gable Steveson at heavyweight, 8-2.

It marked OSU's fourth-straight win over Minnesota, and its second-straight in Minneapolis. OSU would have won the match 24-9, but was docked a team point during Fix's match.

The Cowboys open the home portion of their schedule next week, facing the Wyoming Cowboys on Nov. 25 in Gallagher-Iba Arena.

Kaden Gfeller and Dakota Geer came away with bonus-point wins, and Andrew Shomers and Daton Fix both collected wins by decision over ranked opponents.

"That is kind of what you live for," coach John Smith said. "I thought Dakota and Andrew did a good job, just have to focus at the end of the third period, and I thought (Daton) worked through the match with common sense. He did pretty good defending when his opponent got to his legs."

The dual started with a shootout at 141 pounds with No. 6 Kaid Brock defeating Wyoming's Sam Turner, 14-10. The redshirt junior scored five takedowns in the first period and added another in the third. At 149 pounds, Kaden Gfeller remained undefeated with a major decision over Jaron Jensen.

"It was a big cultural change," Shomers said. "I wrestled at a small school, and there was about 100 people at each match, so being here on Thanksgiving weekend and have a crowd like that was really exciting."

Redshirt sophomore Dakota Geer won his third major decision of the season, defeating Carless Looney, 14-4, in his first OSU home dual. Looney got an early first-period takedown, but No. 14 Geer responded with a reversal and went on to score three more takedowns and two back points in the closing periods.

"There's definitely a different atmosphere here than at Edinboro," Geer said. "There were a lot more people, which makes it more exciting. I like it ... I like it here."

In the afternoon's finale, No. 6 Daton Fix won a much-anticipated bout with 11th-ranked Montorie Bridges, 3-0. Fix was awarded a point after two stalling calls in the first and rode the returning All-American through the second period. Fix was able to escape in the third and notched a point for riding time.

At 165 pounds, No. 6 Chandler Rogers lost his match to ninth-ranked Branson Ashworth, 4-1, in the pair's third meeting. In the next bout No. 8 Jacobe Smith squeaked out a 6-5 decision over Hayden Hastings following a last-second, third-period reversal. Andrew Marsden fell to Cale Davidson, 8-5, in the 197-pound matchup.

No. 3 Derek White scored three takedowns to win his bout with Brian Andrews, 8-2, before Nick Piccininni collected the Cowboys' third bonus-point win of the day, in a 12-4 major decision over Cole Verner.

OSU returns to GIA on Dec. 9, for Bedlam. The Cowboys take the mat at 12:30 p.m., and the match will air live on ESPN.

STILLWATER – The Oklahoma State wrestling team recorded its largest Bedlam margin of victory in 26 years Sunday in a 41-2 drubbing of Oklahoma, headlined with three pins from Nick Piccininni (125), Chandler Rogers (165) and Derek White (HWT).

"Being from the East Coast, I didn't get to experience Bedlam, but it's a whole different ballgame when you get to experience it," Piccininni said. "I love it. I learned to love it. This is something that as we get older we'll always look back and remember and reflect on, the Bedlam matches. And to go out and dominate, it makes it even sweeter."

The dual pushed the all-time series record to 141-27-10.

"You appreciate the wins," Smith said. "It is a dual meet we take seriously. I have had teams that have gone in where we thought we would win 6, 7 or 8 matches, and it didn't end up that way. We take it seriously, and our guys love it. They respect the fact that it is a meet they expect to win."

The Cowboys' first fall of the afternoon came at 125 pounds when No. 4 Piccininni pinned OU's Zach Atencio in 56 seconds. Rogers collected his in 1:53 over the Sooners' Jeremy Thomas, following two first-period takedowns. The afternoon heavyweight finale marked White's first career fall in his final Bedlam dual. He nearly went the distance, but pinned Jake Boyd in 6:18.

"It was big, it's the way you want to start. Nick had a nice single-leg shot, and he fed right into a cradle," Smith said. "Nick did a nice job of taking it slow. He has a heck of a grip for a 125 pounder; his grip is phenomenal. He kept that grip and ran him right to his back. I am excited for Nick."

Also notching bonus-point victories for the Cowboys were Daton Fix at 133 pounds, Jacobe Smith (174), and, in his dual-season debut, Preston Weigel at 197 pounds. Fix scored six takedowns in his match against Anthony Madrigal along with a four-point nearfall to win a 20-5 technical fall. Smith won a major decision over OU's Anthony Mantanona, 19-6, in which he also collected more than three minutes of riding time. Weigel took the mat for the first time since wrestling in the OU open, winning a first-period technical fall, 16-1, over Ruston Duke. The Cowboy scored two takedowns and four nearfalls in 2:21.

At 141 pounds, redshirt freshman Kaden Gfeller won his third-consecutive dual bout in an 11-6 decision over OU senior Davion Jeffries. Andrew Shomers defeated Justin Thomas, 5-3, and Dakota Geer won a 5-3 major decision over Kayne MacCallum to remain undefeated on the year.

The Cowboys return to the mat Dec. 16, to take on the Bears of Northern Colo., in Greeley just before traveling to Nevada for the Reno Tournament of Champions.
