A NEW ERA

WVU Director of Athletics and Associate Vice President Shane Lyons named coach Tim Flynn the school's ninth wrestling coach in April 2018. Flynn came to West Virginia from Edinboro, where he spent the past 21 years building the Fighting Scots into a wrestling powerhouse. He compiled a 223-95-5 career record at Edinboro to become the school's all-time winningest coach and a member of its Hall of Fame. His accomplishments at Edinboro totaled 150 national qualifiers, 38 All-Americans, 64 Eastern Wrestling League (EWL) champions and 97 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) champions. He led the Fighting Scots to five top-10 finishes at the NCAA Wrestling Championships, 14 top-20 finishes and 18 top-25 finishes.

SERIES VS. OKLAHOMA

West Virginia and Oklahoma will square off for the 10th time on Friday, as the Sooners boast a 7-2 lead in the all-time series. However, it was West Virginia who claimed the last meeting, as the Mountaineers picked up a 24-12 win in Morgantown on Jan. 4, 2018. The Sooners have won seven straight matches prior to the 2018 meeting.

SCOUTING THE SOONERS

The Sooners have not competed since mid-December, winning a 20-12 match at Appalachian State on Dec. 16. Dom Demas is the only Sooner to appear in the most recent Intercollegiate rankings, checking in at No. 8 in the 141-pound weight class. He rose eight spots from his previous mark of No. 16 after upsetting No. 6 Kaid Brock of Oklahoma State in a 7-6 decision on Dec. 9. He also is tabbed at No. 8 by FloWrestling and No. 9 by The Open Mat.

EDINBORO TIES

Oklahoma's head coach Lou Rosselli was a two-time All-American (1991 and 1993) at Edinboro with Flynn on staff as an assistant (1992-97). Rosselli earned Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference and Eastern Wrestling League Wrestler of the Year honors his senior year (1993) after winning titles in both conferences at 118 pounds. Flynn took over Edinboro's head coaching duties in 1997, with Rosselli serving as

the volunteer assistant for three years before being promoted to assistant coach for eight seasons.

LAST TIMEOUT

The Mountaineers went 1-3 at the South Beach Duals last weekend, including a win over No. 20 North Dakota State on Sunday. West Virginia opened the two-day event with matches against Virginia and Michigan State, suffering a 26-13 setback to the Cavaliers and dropping a 23-16 match to the Spartans. The following day, West Virginia picked up a 19-17 victory over No. 20 North Dakota State before dropping a 23-20 match to No. 13 Purdue. Redshirt senior Christian Monserrat, redshirt sophomore Matthew Schmitt and sophomore Nick Kiussis each posted a perfect 4-0 record on the weekend. Junior Brandon Ngati also wrestled in a trio of matches at the South Beach Duals, going 3-0 on the weekend.

LOOKING AHEAD

Following its match in Oklahoma, West Virginia will head to Raleigh, North Carolina, for a 1 p.m. dual against the Wolfpack on Sunday, Jan. 13. NC State, which finished fifth at the 2018 NCAA Tournament, holds a slim 3-2 advantage in the all-time series.

TOUGH SLATE

Flynn's inaugural season is highlighted with 18 dual matches, including six in front of the Mountaineer faithful at the WVU Coliseum. West Virginia has faced six teams ranked inside the USA Today/NWCA Coaches' Top-25 Poll thus far, with the Mountaineers upsetting the No. 20-ranked Bison for their first win over a top-25 program. WVU will wrestle nine Big 12 duals and will face seven opponents that finished in the top 25 at the 2018 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships.

LEADING THE PACK

Redshirt freshman Noah Adams, Schmitt and Monserrat were appointed as this year's captains, with each wrestler bringing a different leadership trait to the team room this season. Monserrat is one of two seniors on the 2018-19 roster, donning the most experience over Schmitt and Adams in a Mountaineer singlet. However, Schmitt is the only Mountaineer

FRESH FACES

True freshman James Wujek is listed as a probable starter for the first time this season. The Prosper, Texas, native finished with a 137-39 record at Prosper High and was a three-time state qualifier, finishing as the runner-up his senior year. He also placed fourth at the 2017 state tournament.

SCHMITT COMES BACK

Schmitt returned to the lineup for the first time since Nov. 4, going 4-0 at the South Beach Duals last weekend. The Platte City, Missouri, native is now 10-0 on the year with a 5-0 dual record. Schmitt opened the season with a win over Big 12 foe Northern Colorado on Nov. 1, followed by a 5-0 mark in the 133-pound open division at the Hokie Open (Nov. 4) to claim his first tournament win of his career.

MARTIN SETTLES IN

Redshirt senior Joe Wheeling suffered a season ending injury in early November, which caused true freshman Luke Martin to slide into his weight class at 141. The Parkersburg, West Virginia, native currently holds an 8-8 record on the season, posting two major decisions and one tech. fall. He picked up his first dual victory vs. Virginia Tech on Dec. 19, claiming an 8-7 decision over Dominic Latona at 141 pounds. Martin was a four-time West Virginia state finalist for Parkersburg South High, claiming three state titles. He also was named an NHSCA All-American.

MONSERRAT MAKING MOVES

Monserat moved up one weight class from last season, competing at 149 pounds for a 13-3 record on the year. He remains undefeated in dual action, leading the squad with 29 match points

and 17 takedowns. A native of Methuen, Massachusetts, Monserat competed at 141 pounds as a redshirt junior, recording an 18-16 overall mark, with five major decisions, two tech. falls and one pin.

NGATI RETURNS TO THE LINEUP

Ngati returned to the lineup on Dec. 15 vs. Pitt, dropping a 6-4 decision to No. 13 Demetrius Thomas in the heavyweight bout. He then dropped a 4-0 decision to No. 7 Billy Miller of Virginia Tech four days later for an 0-2 record in dual action. Ngati bounced back at the South Beach Duals though, earning a 3-0 mark at the two-day event with wins over Virginia's Tyler Love, North Dakota State's Brandon Metz and Purdue's Jacob Aven. The Gaithersburg, Maryland, native earned the starting role for WVU the past two seasons, though redshirt junior David Smith went 2-0 at wrestle-offs in late October to win the starting spot over Ngati. Most notably, Ngati pinned Iowa State's Jon Scanlon in 4:28 to lead WVU to its first-ever Big 12 win on Feb. 12, 2017, in Morgantown.

DOWN GOES NO. 20

West Virginia won six of 10 bouts over No. 20 North Dakota State on Dec. 30, notching its first victory over a ranked opponent this season. The Mountaineers started their day against the Bison, winning three of the first four matches for a 9-2 advantage. Schmitt picked up an 8-4 decision over No. 19 Cam Sykora to knot the team score at 3-3. NDSU was then called for unsportsmanlike conduct during the 141-pound match, costing the Bison a team point to put the score at 3-2 in favor of WVU. Martin collected a 5-4 decision over Taylor Nein, while Monserat increased the Mountaineers' lead to seven with a 5-3 decision over Jaden VanMaanen at 149 pounds. Redshirt junior Zachary Moore dropped a 6-1 decision at 157 pounds, but Kiussis struck back with an 11-3 major decision over No. 17 Andrew Fogarty to push the Mountaineers' advantage back to eight at 13-5. However, West Virginia forfeited its matches at 174 and 184 pounds, respectively, as the Bison took a 17-13 lead in the match with two bouts remaining. Adams

brought the Mountaineers within one after a 5-2 decision over Cordell Eaton at 197 pounds. Trailing 17-16 in the match, Ngati answered the call for the Mountaineers, grinding out a hard-fought 8-7 decision in the heavyweight bout to hand West Virginia the 19-17 team victory. With the win, WVU has defeated NDSU for the second consecutive year, as the Mountaineers hold a 2-0 lead in the all-time series.

JOURNEYMEN COLLEGIATE CLASSIC

Five Mountaineers took first place in their respective pools, as West Virginia collected 217 points for a seventh-place finish at the 2018 Journeymen MyHouse Collegiate Classic on Nov. 11, in Schenectady, New York. The tournament field featured competition from 17 universities, including six teams ranked inside the College NWCA/USA Today Top-25 Poll. Redshirt freshman Joey Thomas (125), Monserat (149), Kiussis (165), Adams (197) and Smith (HWT) each earned a first-place finish in their respective pools.

HOKIE OPEN

West Virginia sent 16 wrestlers to compete in the 2018 Hokie Open, at Berglund Arena, in Roanoke, Virginia, on Nov. 4. Ten Mountaineers finished in the top five of their respective weight classes, with Schmitt (133) and Adams (197) winning division titles. Schmitt went 5-0 in the 133-pound open division to claim his first tournament win of his career. Adams also recorded a perfect 4-0 mark to capture the 197-pound freshman/sophomore division title. Additionally, Moore (157) and Kiussis (165) each earned third-place finishes in the open division, while Smith placed fifth in the heavyweight open division. Five Mountaineers also joined Adams on the podium in the freshman/sophomore division. Freshman Josh Ramirez (174) and redshirt freshman KJ Fenstermacher (125) each collected third-place finishes, while sophomore Hunter DeLong placed fourth at 184 pounds. Additionally, redshirt freshman Sean Mullican and Thomas each claimed a fifth-place finish in the 285-pound and 125-pound pool, respectively.

SEASON-OPENING VICTORY

West Virginia topped Big 12 foe Northern Colorado, 22-14, in its 2018-19 season opener on Nov. 1, at the WVU Coliseum, in Morgantown. WVU won six of 10 bouts against UNC, including a win by fall at 285 pounds. Down 14-9 with four bouts remaining, Schmitt collected a huge 13-5 major decision over Christopher Sandoval at 133 pounds, cutting WVU's deficit to one at 14-13. Wheeling then pushed the Mountaineers in front with a 7-1 decision over Owen Lamb at 141 pounds. Monserrat helped WVU seal the deal with an 8-2 decision over Mason Hulse at 149 pounds, increasing the Mountaineers lead to five at 19-14. Moore capped the night for the Mountaineers, as he used a trio of takedowns, a reversal and four near fall points for a 12-8 decision over Jordan Robison at 157 pounds.

BIG 12 ADDS AFFILIATE MEMBERS

The Big 12 Conference added Fresno State and Northern Iowa in July of 2017 as affiliate members to give the league a 12-team field. The new additions joined Air Force, Iowa State, Northern Colorado, North Dakota State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, South Dakota State, Utah Valley, West Virginia and Wyoming.

BIG 12 WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIP ANNOUNCED

The 2019 Big 12 Wrestling Championship will be held at the BOK Center in Tulsa, Oklahoma, from March 9-10, for the third year in a row. Tickets are on sale now. Conference institutions hosted the wrestling championships on campus from 1997-2015. The 2016 event was held in Kansas City's Sprint Center.

KENNY RITCHIE NAMED BIG 12 COORDINATOR OF OFFICIALS

Kenny Ritchie was named the Big 12 Conference Coordinator of Wrestling Officials during the offseason. Ritchie is a 28-year member of the National Wrestling Officials Association and was inducted into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2015. He has officiated 17 NCAA Division I National Championships, including 14 championship final matches. Ritchie's
