West Virginia Mountaineers (7-1)

West Virginia and Austin Peay Meet for the First Time in Series History

- Thursday's game will be televised by Nexstar in West Virginia on WVNS (Beckley), WOWK (Charleston), WBOY ABC (Clarksburg) and WTRF My Ohio Valley (Wheeling). It will be livestreamed for free on WVUsports.com.
- Austin Peav is the 182nd different team to play a game vs. West Virginia in the WVU Coliseum (non-exhibition).
- West Virginia is 144-37 against teams making their first appearance in the Coliseum.
- WVU leads the Big 12 in FG% defense (36.4), 3-point FG% defense (26.7) and offensive rebounds per game (14.0).
- Derek Culver (9.4) and Oscar Tshiebwe (9.3) rank first and second, respectively, in Big 12 Conference rebounding.
- WVU won the 2019 Cancun Challenge last month. Oscar Tshiebwe was named MVP, while Miles McBride was named to the All-Tournament Team. WVU defeated Northern Colorado, Boston U., Northern Iowa and Wichita State.
- With a win at Oklahoma State on Dec. 29, 2017, Bob Huggins moved past Jim Phelan on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. Huggins' record now stands at 867-363 in his 37th season as a head coach. He needs nine more victories to tie Adolph Rupp for seventh place all-time.
- Huggins is the fourth-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim and Roy Williams.
- West Virginia is 148-42 at the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including a 73-35 mark in league games.
- WVU is 557-162 (.778) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 198-48 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 16 seasons.
- West Virginia is 109-8 at home against non-conference teams in the last 18 years, and has won 90 of its last 96.
- West Virginia has won 69 of its last 73 games at home in the month of December.
- West Virginia is 127-61 since the start of the 2014-15 season.

Austin Peav

Governors (4-4)

- WVU is 200-56 in its last 256 games against unranked teams, including winners of 106 of its last 124 at home.
- West Virginia is 128-34 in non-conference regular season games under Bob Huggins, including a 74-6 mark at home.
- West Virginia is 159-40 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 17 seasons.
- Bob Huggins has wins over 46 AP-ranked teams at WVU, including 18 wins over Top 10 teams and three over No. 1.
- Sophomore forward Derek Culver was named to the All-Big 12 Preseason Honorable Mention Team, while freshman forward Oscar Tshiebwe was named the Big 12 Preseason Freshman of the Year.
- Tshiebwe is the second McDonald's All-American to enroll as a freshman at WVU (Chris Brooks, 1986). He is the third McDonald's All-American to play at WVU, joining Brooks and Ohio State transfer Greg Simpson in 1996.
- Tshiebwe had 20 points, 17 rebounds at Pitt becoming just the fourth WVU freshman to post those numbers in a game.
- Tshiebwe was named the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on Nov. 18 and Dec. 2.
- Culver was named to the 20-man preseason Kareem Abdul Jabbar Award Watch List.
- Last year, Culver was named to the All-Big 12 Second Team and the All-Big 12 Freshman Team (unanimous selection).
- Culver led the Big 12 in rebounding in conference games only (10.9) and had the highest scoring average (12.5) among freshmen in Big 12 Conference games only.
- Culver had eight double-doubles in Big 12 action, which ranked second in the league to Kansas' Dedric Lawson (II).
- West Virginia led the country in offensive rebounds with 525, averaging 14.6 per game.
- WVU is 51-39 in the Big 12 regular season in the last five seasons, including a 40-32 mark in the last four seasons.
- West Virginia is 120-96 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games (Big 12 and Big East).
- Bob Huggins is 76-66 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 66-60 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- The Mountaineers have won 88 of their last 95 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU has won 98 of its last 106 and 154 of its last 172 games when holding opponents to less than 69 points.
- WVU is 209-36 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better 77 times under Bob Huggins (429 games).
- West Virginia is 70-5 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 220-43 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 223-27 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 188-16 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 677 consecutive games.
- The Mountaineers are 207-50 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 205-59 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 99 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 37 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- The Mountaineers have won 87 of their last 126 conference games at the WVU Coliseum.
- WVU is 11-6 all-time on Dec. 12. In the month of December, the Mountaineers are 398-162.

Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 867 games in his 38th season as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks fourth in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks eighth among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 33 of 37 seasons, including 24 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but eight of his 37 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.7 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 13 All-Americans and 69 allconference selections.
- Huggins has coached 19 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins has led West Virginia to nine NCAA Tournament

Scouting Austin Peav

- Austin Peay is 4-4 this season following a 90-83 home victory over North Florida on Saturday.
- The Governors have won three of their last four games. They are led by Terry Taylor, who averages 22.5 ppg.
- Austin Peay is 4-0 at home and 0-4 on the road this season.
- Matt Figger is in his third season as head coach at Austin Peay. His career record stands at 45-30.

Series Record

- West Virginia and Austin Peay will be meeting for the first time on the basketball court.
- West Virginia is 8-1 all-time against current members of the Ohio Valley Conference: 2-1 vs. Eastern Kentucky, 1-0 vs. Jacksonville State, 3-0 vs. Morehead State, 1-0 against Murray State and 1-0 vs. Tennessee Tech.
- This will be the 11th time Bob Huggins has faced Austin Peay. He holds an 8-2 record against the Governors.
- When he was the head coach at Akron, Huggins posted a 4-2 record against Austin Peay. At Cincinnati, he held a 4-0 record against the Governors.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 111th season and 117th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,778-1,101 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 22nd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 29 NCAA berths, 16 NIT trips and one CBI bid since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 21 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 16 years, WVU played in the CBI in 2019, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2018, 2017 & 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2016 and 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 12 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Under Bob Huggins, Jevon Carter was named to the John Wooden, Lute Olson and Senior CLASS All-America teams in 2018. Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and Basketball Times and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in 2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations and NBA Hall of Famer Rod Thorn and former Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), Stansbury Hall (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was closed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

- West Virginia is assured of a winning non-conference mark for the 28th consecutive season.
- West Virginia is 159-40 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 17 seasons.
- The last time WVU did not post a winning non-league record was 1990-91, when WVU went 4-4 outside of conference.
- WVU is 130-34 in non-conference games under Bob Huggins.
- WVU has finished with one loss during non-conference play in eight different seasons. They were: 1981-82 when West Virginia went 11-1 out of the Atlantic 10, 1957-58 when WVU lost only to Duke in going 11-1, 1996-97 when the Mountaineers were 7-1, losing the season opener at Minnesota, 2004-05 when WVU went 10-1 outside the Big East, 2006-07 when the Mountaineers went 12-1 with their only loss to Arkansas, 2009-10 when WVU was 11-1 with its only loss at Purdue, 2014-15 when the Mountaineers had a one point home loss to LSU, finishing 12-1 and in 2016-17 when WVU finished 12-1 with a four-point loss to Temple in Brooklyn, New York.
- WVU has had one perfect non-conference regular season, 10-0, in 1997-98.

Preseason Awards

- Sophomore forward Derek Culver was named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Honorable Mention Team.
- Freshman forward Oscar Tshiebwe was named the Big 12 Conference Freshman of the Year, the first WVU player to
 receive a preseason rookie or freshman of the year award in any conference.
- The Mountaineers were predicted to finish fifth by the league's head coaches in the Big 12 preseason poll.

NCAA Statistical Leaders

- Last season, WVU led the country in offensive rebounds with 525 and led also in 2017-18 with 521 offensive boards.
- In 2016-17, WVU led the country in turnover margin (7.7), turnovers forced (20.0), total steals (371) and steals (10.0). WVU
 ranked third in scoring margin (14.8), fifth in offensive rebounds (14.3), 21st in assists (16.4) & 23rd in scoring offense (81.5).
- In 2014-15, the Mountaineers led the country in forced turnovers, steals and offensive rebounds. In 2015-16, West Virginia led the country in forced turnovers.

Academic Success

- Forty-five of the last 46 seniors on the WVU men's basketball team have graduated on time or early since 2004.
- In 2017-18, Jevon Carter was named CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year for men's basketball and first team Academic All-American.
- Carter was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District II First Team in 2017-18 and 2016-17.
- In 2019, Chase Harler was named to the Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball First Team, while Logan Routt was named
 to the second team.
- Last year, WVU had 13 players on the Garrett Ford Academic Honor Roll with a 3.0 GPA or better.
- In 2010, 2011, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019, WVU men's basketball also was recognized nationally for ranking in the top 10
 percent nationally among men's basketball programs for the Academic Progress Rate (APR).
- In 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019, WVU men's basketball was recognized by the NCAA for a perfect four-year APR score of 1000

Huggins Receives Contract Extension

- On Nov. 6, 2017, Director of Athletics Shane Lyons announced a four-year contract extension to 2021-22 for Bob Huggins.
- It extended his relationship with the University until 2027.
- Under the agreement, following the 2021-22 season, Huggins will assume a five-year Emeritus status within the WVU
 Department of Intercollegiate Athletics, which concludes June 30, 2027.
- Huggins will be paid \$3,950,000 in 2019-20, \$4,050,000 in 2020-21 and \$4,150,000 in 2021-22.











More Team Assists

- Bob Huggins has posted 47 conference road victories in 12 seasons at WVU, including four in 2017-18, five Big 12 road wins in 2016-17, six Big 12 road wins in 2015-16 and four Big 12 road wins in 2014-15.
- In 2017-18, it was WVU's ninth NCAA appearance in 11 years and 11th appearance in the last 14 seasons.
- WVU has reached the Sweet 16 in eight of its last 12 NCAA appearances (2018, 2017, 2015, 2010, 2008, 2006, 2005, 1998).
- WVU has made 16 postseason appearances in the last 17 years, including the NCAA Final Four in 2010.

- The Kansas game marked the 320th time in school history WVU played a team ranked in the AP Top 25.

- WVU has played 158 ranked teams since the start of the 2004-05 season, winning 60 of those games.
- Bob Huggins has faced 103 ranked teams during the regular season in 12 years, the most in school history. Gale Catlett faced 66 ranked teams during the regular season in 25 years, while John Beilein faced 34 ranked teams during regular season play in five years.

In The Rankings

- In 2017-18, West Virginia finished ranked No. 15 in the Associated Press poll and No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- WVU's No. 2 AP ranking on Jan. 8, 2018, was its highest since a No. 2 ranking on Dec. 29, 1959.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 99 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 37 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- WVU was ranked for 76 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll until Nov. 19, 2018.
- WVU's streak of 55 weeks from 2015-18 in the AP poll was one week shy of the school record of 56 weeks from March 1956 to March 1960.

- Coach Bob Huggins annnouned the signing of three recruits during the November signing period.
- Isaiah Cottrell, a 6-foot-10, 220-pound forward from Las Vegas, Nevada, currently attends Huntington Prep in Huntington, West Virginia. Previously, he attended Bishop Gorman High School in Las Vegas, where he averaged 15.2 points, 9.3 rebounds and 4.3 blocks per game as a junior in 2018-19.
- Kedrian Johnson, a 6-foot-3, 180-pound guard from Dallas, Texas, currently attends Temple College in Temple, Texas.
 Last year, he led the country in steals (3.7) and was fifth in the country in scoring at 25.6 points per game as a
 freshman. He attended high school at South Oak Cliff High.



Recap

West Virginia made its free throws down the stretch to hold off pesky Akron 94-84 in front of 12,513 at the WVU Coliseum.

The Zips used an 11-O run to trim West Virginia's lead to six with 10:25 remaining, and stayed in range with 1:57 remaining when Channel Banks' third 3 made it a seven-point game. Following an exchange of possessions the Mountaineers' Derek Culver was fouled with 1:26 to go.

Last year, that would have been a big concern for West Virginia with Culver making just half of his free throw attempts, but tonight he hit both and sophomore guard Sean McNeil added two more 26 seconds later to build WVU's lead to nine.

Freshman guard Miles McBride got two more charities to go down with 28 seconds left, and two more from McNeil put the game on ice.

West Virginia hit 10-of-11 from the charity stripe over the final 3:15 to

Overall, West Virginia successfully converted 31-of-40 free throws with Culver hitting all eight of his attempts to finish with a team-best 16 points.

Jermaine Haley matched Culver's 16, sophomore Emmitt Matthews Jr. scored 13 and McBride added 11 points to go with six rebounds, four assists, four steals and a key block with 4:36 remaining when Banks appeared to have an easy layup.

The Cincinnati resident ended up playing 29 minutes off the bench 19 of those coming in the second half.

West Virginia's bench was really the difference as the Mountaineers outscored the Zips' bench 42-9.

Seven different WVU players tallied 8 points or more, and it was the bench that got double-digit leads in both halves. West Virginia had a 16-point lead right before the end of the first half and then got it to 17 with 12:53 left on two Taz Sherman free throws.

Touted freshman Oscar Tshiebwe got into early foul trouble and played just 12 minutes, the forward scoring 5 points and grabbing five rebounds. The Mountaineers began the game with Culver and Tshiebwe both on the floor, but quickly downsized when the Zips used the 3-ball to take an early 11-5 lead.

West Virginia (I-O) took its first lead on a Matthews Jr. 3 and never trailed afterward.

One disappointing stat was West Virginia's 37-36 rebounding margin, an area Huggins has said his team should be exceptional in 2019-20.

Akron got a game high 20 points from forward Xeyrius Williams.

Recap

West Virginia was simply too big, too strong and too deep for Pitt at the Petersen Events Center in Pittsburgh.

Freshman Oscar Tshiebwe's 20 points and 17 rebounds was complemented by Emmitt Matthews Jr.'s 17 points and eight boards to power the Mountaineers to a 68-53 victory over the Panthers.

Tshiebwe had a double-double by the eight-minute mark in the first half of the game, and Sean McNeil, whose three first-half triples really ignited West Virginia.

Pitt (2-2) shot a horrid 3-of-25 from the floor in the second half and finished the game converting just 30.2 percent. Consequently, Pitt's only recourse was to continue driving the ball to the rim (unsuccessfully) where it was met by 6-foot-9 Tshiebwe, 6-foot-10 Derek Culver, 6-foot-11 Logan Routt and 6-foot-8 Matthews Jr.

West Virginia had a staggering 51-36 advantage on the glass to offset a poor shooting night from the floor. Other than Tshiebwe and Matthews Jr., who combined to hit half of their 28 field goal attempts, the rest of the Mountaineers managed to convert just 9-of-32.

Tshiebwe's stat line included eight offensive rebounds, three blocks and a steal coming off a foul-plagued, five-point, five-rebound performance during the season opener.

McNeil came off the bench to add 11 for the victorious Mountaineers. Pitt led just twice in a first half in which the officials called nearly as many fouls as there were points scored. The Panthers' final lead came with 1:24 remaining in the half on McGowen's step-back 3. But West Virginia's Brandon Knapper responded 25 seconds later with a driving layup for the final points of the half.

Notebook

- The victory over Pitt was West Virginia's fourth straight against the Panthers for the first time since the mid-1970s when Bob Huggins was a Mountaineer player.
- The win also stopped WVU's 10 game road losing streak that spanned the entire 2019 season. West Virginia's last true road win was at Baylor on Feb. 20, 2018.
- Oscar Tshiebwe's 20-point, 17-rebound performance was just the fourth time in school history at WVU freshman posted those numbers in a game. The others: Derek Culver vs. TCU in 2019, Maurice Robinson against Saint Francis in 1975 and Warren Baker vs. Virginia Tech in
- Pitt's 12 percent shooting (3-of-25) from the field was the second worst shooting performance in a half in school history.
- The two teams met for the first time in the month of November in the Backyard Brawl.

Recap

Jermaine Haley had an 18-point, 12-rebound, double-double, and Derek Culver came off the bench to score 13 second-half points to lead West Virginia to a 69-61 victory over Northern Colorado at the WVU Coliseum in the first game of the Cancun Challenge.

West Virginia (3-0) had a 17-point first half lead and led by 10 at the break before going cold in the second half.

"We got some points off our defense," Huggins said of his young team's offense success in the first half. "I thought we ran some pretty good stuff and we made some shots. We come out in the second half ... and there are going to be spots in the game when you don't make shots and we had pretty good shots in the second half and didn't make them."

The dry spell came at the 10-minute mark when the Mountaineers went scoreless for nearly five minutes, which allowed the Bears to tie the game at 54 with 6:18 remaining.

Culver ended the drought with a short jumper and Haley followed with a layup off of Jonah Radebaugh turnovers. Another Northern Colorado turnover led to two Culver free throws, and Haley scored again to expand the margin to eight.

Two Culver free throws with 3:26 to go made it a 10-point margin.

Freshman Oscar Thsiebwe, who scored 20 points and grabbed 17
rebounds three nights earlier against Pitt in Pittsburgh and was named
Big 12 Newcomer of the Week, struggled with just 4 points and grabbed
seven rebounds in 19 minutes of action.

Emmitt Matthews Jr. scored 6 points and grabbed three rebounds after going for 17 and eight at Pitt.

West Virginia shot 48.1 percent from the floor, mostly close to the basket as the Mountaineers tried just nine 3-point field goals, making four.

Northern Colorado (2-3) doubled up West Virginia from behind the arc, but it took the Bears 30 attempts to do so.

Forward Bodie Hume led Northern Colorado with 18 points on 7-of-16 shooting. The Bears shot just 37.7 percent from the floor and was out-rebounded 42-24.

The attendance was 9,470.

Recap

West Virginia used 21 points and 10 rebounds from fabulous freshman Oscar Tshiebwe to roll over Boston University $69\cdot44$ in a Cancun Challenge game played at the WVU Coliseum.

The Democratic Republic of the Congo native made his first seven shots and finished the game hitting 10-of-13 field goals.

Derek Culver contributed 10 points and four rebounds as West Virginia outscored BU 48-22 in the paint. WVU scored 25 points off 22 Terrier turnovers and grabbed 25 offensive rebounds.

Six-seven guard Jermaine Haley added 13 points on 5-of-6 shooting. West Virginia scored the first 11 points of the game and had a 17-point lead at the 10-minute mark of the first half before Huggins began substituting players. A couple of scoring droughts allowed Boston to cut WVU's lead to nine, 23-14, on a Jonas Harper 3.

Freshman Miles McBride answered with a 3 at the other end, one of just two made 3s on 18 attempts for the game. Huggins said after the game all of the players who struggled shooting the ball have also struggled shooting it in practice.

The Mountaineers led 36-23 at halftime and an 8-0 run to begin the second half turned the game into a rout.

WVU's biggest lead was 28 points.

West Virginia (4-0) shot 44.3 percent (27 of 61) and 61.9 percent from the free throw line (13 of 21).

"It could be scary if we can make any shots," Huggins said.

Boston University, which defeated South Carolina 78-70 three days earlier, shot just 32.7 percent overall for the game with six of its 17 field goals coming from 3-point distance.

Sophomore forward Walter Whyte led the Terriers with 13 points on 5-of-13 shooting.

Recap

Freshman guard Miles McBride came off the bench to score a gamehigh 18 points to power West Virginia to a 60-55 victory over Northern lowa in the Cancun Challenge at the Hard Rock Hotel in Riviera Maya, Mexico.

The Mountaineers rallied from 15 points down with 10:51 remaining in the second half to win their fifth game of the season. McBride was the catalyst, the freshman hitting 6-of-12 field goals, assisting on five more baskets, blocking two shots and grabbing a couple of defensive rehounds.

WVU used a 33-13 run over the remaining 10:32 of the game to overcome a miserable first half offensive performance that saw the Mountaineers score only 20 points.

UNI primarily uses just six players and a key moment in the game came with 1:58 remaining when 6-9 forward Austin Phyfe picked up his fifth foul, and was soon joined by 7-foot backup center Justin Dahl when he was disqualified 53 seconds later.

That left Northern lowa with no size to protect the rim and allowed Emmitt Matthews Jr. to crash the glass and tip in McBride's missed jumper with 17 seconds left to give WVU a 56-55 lead.

Matthews Jr. was undercut by Spencer Haldeman on the play and after reviewing the replay monitor ruled it was a flagrant 1 foul and awarded WVU to free throws and possession of the basketball.

Sean McNeil was brought in to attempt the free throws on behalf of Matthews, who hit his head hard on the floor when he fell to the ground and was taken out of the game.

McNeil made one of two at the line and on the ensuing possession, McBride was fouled after catching Jermaine Haley's inbound pass and converted another free throw to give the Mountaineers a 58·55 lead.

On the other end, Northern Iowa's A.J. Green missed a short jumper, McBride grabbed the rebound and was fouled by Isaiah Brown. The freshman walked to the other end to score the game's final two points.

West Virginia shot just 37 percent but it was far worse in the first half when it was shooting in the low 20s.

UNI (6-1) wasn't shooting much better until the early portion of the second half when it used a 16-4 run to take a 15-point lead.

Overall, Northern lowa was 3-of-20 from behind the arc.

West Virginia, which expected to have an advantage on the glass, was outrebounded 38-34.

Recap

Oscar Tshiebwe scored 19 points and grabbed 18 rebounds to lead the Mountaineers to a 75-63 victory over Wichita State to claim the Cancun Challenge in Riviera Maya, Mexico.

In Tshiebwe's three good games so far in 2019-20, he scored 20 points and grabbed 17 rebounds in a road win at Pitt, tallied a season-high 21 points with 10 rebounds in a home win against Boston University and then this 19-point, 18-rebound double-double.

Jordan McCabe was the player Huggins went with at the end of tonight's game and he responded with seven critical free throws when his teammates were struggling there to finish with 9 points.

Derek Culver scored 7 points and was a rebound away from pulling down double-digit boards as the Mountaineers controlled a really good rebounding Wichita State team on the glass 48-31.

Guard Sean McNeil came off the bench to hit two big 3s in the first half and finished with 8 points as nine different players got into the scoring column.

West Virginia's powerful front line outscored Wichita State in the paint 30-16 and was a major factor in holding the Shockers to just 30.6 percent on their 62 field goal attempts.

The 6-0 Mountaineers were so dominating that Wichita State only held the lead for 15 seconds of the game.

The only area where West Virginia wasn't exceptional was at the free throw line where it missed nine of its first 15 attempts, but even there it was much better down the stretch.

The Mountaineers shot 14-of-19 in the second half to finish the game 18-of-30 overall.

Recap

Derek Culver didn't get the start, but he was on the floor when it counted to help West Virginia hold off pesky Rhode Island 86-81 in an entertaining college basketball game at the WVU Coliseum.

Culver came off the bench to score a career-high 25 points and grab 11 rebounds to offset Fats Russell's game-high 32 points for the Rams.

Russell, a 5-10, 165-pound sophomore guard, almost singlehandedly erased West Virginia's I1-point halftime lead. The Philadelphia resident made 14-of-25 field goal attempts and his jumper with 10 minutes to go pulled the Rams to within a basket, 60-58.

Jermaine Haley missed at the other end and guard Jeff Dowtin tied the game on a driving layup.

Forward Oscar Tshiebwe quickly unknotted things by scoring two of his 11 points, all of them coming late in the second half. Tshiebwe was also one rebound shy of registering another double-double.

Haley scored the first eight points for the Mountaineers and then added 10 more in the second half, including a huge 3 with 5:38 left with the shot clock down to one and West Virginia only leading 67-64.

Haley was also the guy coach Bob Huggins went to with 34 seconds left and the Mountaineers dinging to an 82-81 lead.

Haley was able to use his size to get into scoring position close to the basket to score with 12 seconds left.

Rhode Island's Tyrese Martin made a bad pass trying to get the ball to Russell for a potential game-tying 3 and WVU regained possession of the basketball with three seconds left.

Huggins subbed in two of his better free throw shooters, Sean McNeil and Jordan McCabe, who was fouled by Russell when play resumed.

McCabe made both free throws as West Virginia finished the game 24·of-31 from the line for 73.9 percent. That offset a 44.6-percent shooting effort from the floor, despite the Mountaineers having a distinct size advantage in the paint.

Culver hit 9-of-17 from the floor and forward Emmitt Matthews Jr. also converted half of his field goal attempts (5-of-10) – all of them coming in the first half when he scored 14.

Rhode Island shot 60 percent in the second half and finished the game at 48.5 percent.

Two of the five players on the floor for West Virginia late in the game were freshmen Tshiebwe and Miles McBride, who finished with 8 points and hit 4-of-6 from the foul line.

An announced crowd of 10,973 watched the game.

Notebook

It was Rhode Island's first appearance at the Coliseum since a 2004 NIT game. The Rams and Mountaineers were once regular foes from 1981 to 1995 when West Virginia was a member of the Atlantic 10 Conference.

Recap

Rasheem Dunn's two free throws with five seconds left lifted St. John's to a 70·68 victory over West Virginia in a Big East-Big 12 Battle game at Madison Square Garden.

WVU's quest to go $8\cdot0$ also ended in the Garden primarily because of turnovers, point-blank misses and another poor performance at the free throw line.

West Virginia turned the ball over a season-high 22 times, shot just 41.8 percent from inside the arc and missed seven of its 12 free throw attempts, yet still had an opportunity to win the game at the end.

The Mountaineers (7-I) erased a nine-point St. John's lead by holding the Red Storm without a field goal over the remaining 4:28 of the game. Their final field goal was made by Josh Roberts on a stick-back basket to give them a 68-59 advantage.

Derek Culver cut into the lead with a follow-up basket, and a Taz Sherman 3 got it down to four with 2:05 to go. Then a Miles McBride steal led to a Culver opportunity near the basket to make it a two-point game.

The sophomore forward was fouled by Roberts but could only get one of two attempts to fall through the cylinder \cdot one of four misses on the day from the 82-percent free throw shooter.

Another steal by McBride led to Sean McNeil's 3 in transition to tie the game at 68 with 1:13 remaining.

West Virginia had an opportunity to take the lead on its next offensive possession when Nick Rutherford missed a layup, but Sherman's open baseline 16-footer didn't drop and Culver momentarily grabbed the ball before having it knocked out of his hands by Dunn.

With St. John's in possession of the ball, coach Mike Anderson called timeout with 16 seconds to go and when play resumed, Dunn made a stumbling drive to the basket where he ran into Culver holding his spot with one arm in the air.

The baseline official whistled Culver for the foul, his fifth, putting Dunn at the line for two free throws. He made both, leaving West Virginia with five seconds to either tie it with a basket or win it with a 3.

Following WVU's last timeout, what the Mountaineers ended up getting was a 3-point try from McBride on the move but he wasn't able to get it to go down. Huggins thought there was more than enough time to get something at the basket and perhaps draw a foul as Dunn did.

McNeil came off the bench to lead West Virginia with 13 points while Culver finished with 12 points and a game-high 18 rebounds.

The Red Storm shot just 32.9 percent from the floor but they did make all but five of their 27 free throw attempts.

The 22 turnovers they forced resulted in 22 points.
