#### West Virginia Begins Play in Roman College Basketball Invitational

- This will be West Virginia's 46th appearance in a postseason tournament. WVU is 52-45 all-time in the postseason.
- Grand Canyon is the 178th different team to play a game against West Virginia in the WVU Coliseum (non-exhibition).
- West Virginia is 141-36 against teams making their first appearance in the Coliseum.
- West Virginia has played the fifth-toughest schedule in the country according to the latest NCAA NET rankings.
- WVU is 44-30 in March under Bob Huggins, and WVU is 59-37 in its last 96 games in March.
- WVU is 192-54 in its last 246 games against unranked teams, including winners of 101 of its last 118 at home.
- West Virginia is 143-41 at the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including a 73-35 mark in league games.
- WVU is 552-161 (.780) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 193-47 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 15 seasons.
- Bob Huggins has wins over 46 AP-ranked teams at WVU, including 18 wins over Top 10 teams and three over No. 1.
- Derek Culver was named to the All-Big 12 Second Team and to the All-Big 12 Freshman Team (unanimous selection).
- Culver led the Big 12 in rebounding in conference games only (10.9) and had the highest scoring average (12.5) among freshmen in Big 12 Conference games only.
- In Big 12 Conference games only, Derek Culver finished first in the league in offensive rebounds (3.8), first in rebounding (10.9), second in defensive rebounds (7.1) and 12th in scoring (12.5).
- Culver had eight double-doubles in Big 12 action, which ranked second in the league to Kansas' Dedric Lawson (II).
- Culver had 22 points and 21 rebounds vs. TCU, the first WVU player to have a 20-20 game since Mo Robinson in 1977.
- On March 9, Culver had 16 points and 21 rebounds at Oklahoma State.
- Culver is the first WVU player since Rod Thorn (1961) to have two 20-plus rebounding games in the same season.
- The last WVU player to average more than 10 rebounds a game for the season was Kevin Jones in 2012 (10.9).
- Culver is 21st in the country in fouls drawn per 40 minutes at 6.8 per contest.
- Culver went to the line 129 times in Big 12 play, ranking first in free throw attempts.
- Jermaine Haley is averaging 15.9 points per game in the last eight games, including a career-high 28 points vs. ISU.
- Haley posted his first career double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds in the Big 12 Championship vs. Oklahoma.
- Jordan McCabe had 25 points, 11 assists, six steals and five boards vs. TCU, the only college player this season to have 25 points, 11 assists, six steals and five boards in a game, and the first college player since 2010 (D.J. Cooper, Ohio U.).
- Emmitt Matthews had 28 points vs. Texas Tech (3/14), the second-most points by a Big 12 freshman this season.
- West Virginia ranks second in the country in offensive rebounds with 489, averaging 14.4 per game.
- The Mountaineers have attempted 808 free throws, the ninth-most attempts in the country.
- With a win at Oklahoma State on Dec. 29, 2017, Bob Huggins moved past Jim Phelan on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. Huggins' record now stands at 859-361 in his 37th season as a head coach. He needs 17 more victories to tie Adolph Rupp for seventh place all-time.
- Huggins is the fourth-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim and Roy Williams.
- West Virginia has used 17 different starting lineup combinations this season with 14 different players starting a game.
- West Virginia is 119-59 since the start of the 2014-15 season.
- WVU is 51-39 in the Big 12 regular season in the last five seasons, including a 40-32 mark in the last four seasons.
- West Virginia is 120-96 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games (Big 12 and Big East).
- Bob Huggins is 76-66 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 66-60 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- Sagaba Konate set the WVU school record for career blocks against Pitt on Dec. 8, 2018, when he blocked seven shots to break the previous record of 190 set by D'or Fischer. Konate now shows 191 blocks for his career.
- The Mountaineers have won 82 of their last 89 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU has won 92 of its last 100 and 148 of its last 166 games when holding opponents to less than 69 points.
- WVU is 203-36 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better 76 times under Bob Huggins (419 games).
- West Virginia is 70-5 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 213-43 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 216-27 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 182-15 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 667 consecutive games.
- The Mountaineers are 203-49 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 198-58 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- West Virginia is 6-1 all-time on March 20.

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 859 games in his 37th season as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks fourth in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks eighth among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 33 of 37 seasons, including 24 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but eight of his 36 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.7 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 13 All-Americans and 69 allconference selections.
- Huggins has coached 19 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.

#### Scouting Grand Canyon

- Grand Canyon is 20-13 after falling in the championship game of the WAC Tournament to New Mexico State, 89-57.
- The Antelopes have won six of their last eight contests. They finished with a 10-6 conference record in the WAC.
- Grand Canyon is 5-7 on the road and 3-4 on neutral courts this season.
- Dan Majerle, a former NBA All-Star and Olympian, is 123-71 in his sixth season as head coach at Grand Canyon.

#### Series Record

- This will be the first meeting between West Virginia and Grand Canyon.
- West Virginia has a 2-0 record against current members of the Western Athletic Conference (WAC).
- WVU defeated UMKC, 112-67, on Dec. 17, 2016, at the Coliseum for Bob Huggins' 800th career victory.
- Also under Huggins, WVU defeated New Mexico State, 75-61, in the consolation game of the Legends Classic in Newark, New Jersey, on Nov. 24, 2007.

#### WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 110th season and 116th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,770-1,099 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 22nd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 29 NCAA berths, 16 NIT trips and one CBI bid since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 21 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 15 years, WVU played in the CBI in 2019, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2018, 2017 & 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2016 and 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 12 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Under Bob Huggins, Jevon Carter was named to the John Wooden, Lute Olson and Senior CLASS All-America teams in 2018. Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and Basketball Times and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in 2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations and NBA Hall of Famer Rod Thorn and former Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), Stansbury Hall (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was closed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

# Winning Non-Conference Mark

- West Virginia finished with a winning non-conference mark for the 27th consecutive season.
- West Virginia is 152-39 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 16 seasons.
- The last time WVU did not post a winning non-league record was 1990-91, when WVU went 4-4 outside of conference.
- WVU is 121-33 in non-conference games under Bob Huggins.
- WVU has finished with one loss during non-conference play in eight different seasons. They were: 1981-82 when West Virginia went 11-1 out of the Atlantic 10, 1957-58 when WVU lost only to Duke in going 11-1, 1996-97 when the Mountaineers were 7-1, losing the season opener at Minnesota, 2004-05 when WVU went 10-1 outside the Big East, 2006-07 when the Mountaineers went 12-1 with their only loss to Arkansas, 2009-10 when WVU was 11-1 with its only loss at Purdue, 2014-15 when the Mountaineers had a one point home loss to LSU, finishing 12-1 and in 2016-17 when WVU finished 12-1 with a four-point loss to Temple in Brooklyn, New York.
- WVU has had one perfect non-conference regular season, 10-0, in 1997-98.

# In The Rankings

- Last season, West Virginia finished ranked No. 15 in the Associated Press poll and No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- WVU's No. 2 AP ranking on Jan. 8, 2018, was its highest since a No. 2 ranking on Dec. 29, 1959.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 99 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 37 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- WVU was ranked for 76 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll until Nov. 19, 2018.
- WVU's streak of 55 weeks from 2015-18 in the AP poll was one week shy of the school record of 56 weeks from March 1956 to March 1960.
- West Virginia has been ranked 119 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005, in the AP poll, and 233 weeks total in school history.
- WVU was No. 6 in the final AP poll in 2010, its highest final ranking since a No. 5 ranking in 1959-60.
- In 2010, WVU was ranked in the Top 10 for nine straight weeks the most consecutive weeks in the Top 10 since 1960.

#### Academic Success

- Forty-one of the last 42 seniors on the WVU men's basketball team have graduated on time or early since 2004.
- Last season, Jevon Carter was named CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year for men's basketball and first team Δcademic ΔII-Δmerican
- Carter was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District II First Team in 2017-18 and 2016-17.
- In 2019, Chase Harler and Lamont West were named to the Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball First Team, while Logan Routt was named to the second team.
- Last year, WVU had 13 players on the Garrett Ford Academic Honor Roll with a 3.0 GPA or better.
- In 2010, 2011, 2016, 2017 and 2018, WVU men's basketball also was recognized nationally for ranking in the top 10 percent nationally among men's basketball programs for the Academic Progress Rate (APR).
- In 2016, 2017 and 2018, WVU men's basketball was recognized by the NCAA for a perfect four-year APR score of 1,000.

# Huggins Receives Contract Extension

- On Nov. 6, 2017, Director of Athletics Shane Lyons announced a four-year contract extension to 2021-22 for Bob Huggins.
- It will extend his relationship with the University until 2027.
- Under the agreement, following the 2021-22 season, Huggins will assume a five-year Emeritus status within the WVU Department of Intercollegiate Athletics, which concludes June 30, 2027.
- Huggins will be paid \$3,850,000 in 2018-19, \$3,950,000 in 2019-20, \$4,050,000 in 2020-21 and \$4,150,000 in 2021-22.

#### Recap

C.J. Massinburg poured in a career-high 43 points to lead Buffalo to a 99-94 overtime win over 13th-ranked West Virginia at the WVU Coliseum.

Massinburg hit 12 of his 22 shot attempts, including 9 of 15 from 3, made all 10 of his second-half free throw attempts to finish 10 of 12 from the line, grabbed 14 rebounds and handed out three assists.

Buffalo's other 10 players were just 2 of 22 from 3.

WVU, playing for the first time in four years without All-American guard Jevon Carter, came out on fire to build an early eight-point lead. The Bulls (2-0) battled back to take a pair of four-point leads before the Mountaineers used back-to-back 3s from Chase Harler and Beetle Bolden, and then another 3 from Bolden to go ahead by seven, 31-24.

Bolden also dropped in a driving layup ahead of the horn to give the Mountaineers an eight-point halftime advantage.

In the second half, West Virginia (0-1) built its lead to 13 on Lamont West's 3 from the corner, making it 49-36, and once again at 71-58 on Logan Routt's bucket just ahead of the eight-minute timeout.

WVU maintained its double-digit margin on three Bolden free throws with 4:43 remaining, but Bolden soon had to leave the game with severe leg cramping and did not return.

Consequently, West Virginia's only field goal for the remainder of regulation was Andrew Gordon's loose-ball basket with 3:58 left, which made the score 81-73.

And that's when Massinburg took over.

His 3s on consecutive possessions pulled Buffalo to within two, 81-79, and then another deep triple with 16 seconds left tied the game at 84.

Following two Mountaineer timeouts, the second one used when Esa Ahmad couldn't inbound the basketball underneath Buffalo's basket. West Virginia had an opportunity to win it in regulation. As time was winding down, however, freshman point guard Brandon Knapper struggled to get WVU into its offensive set deep in the backcourt. He eventually got the ball to West standing well beyond the 3-point line for a desperation shot that failed to draw iron. Sagaba Konate grabbed the offensive rebound but was unable to get off another attempt ahead of the buzzer.

The Mountaineers' next field goal didn't come until 41 seconds were remaining in overtime, that coming on Ahmad's layup

An announced crowd of 12,657 attended the game.

#### Notebook

Massinburg's 43 points were four shy of the WVU Coliseum record of 47 established by Notre Dame All-America guard Austin Carr 47 years ago on Feb. 20, 1971, and were the most points scored against the Mountaineers since Duquesne's Mark Stevenson dropped in 43 at the A.J. Palumbo Center on Jan. 30, 1990.

#### Recap

Esa Ahmad scored 16 points and Sagaba Konate added 14 points. eight rebounds and four blocks to lead West Virginia to a 71-53 victory over Monmouth at Coastal Carolina's HTC Center in Conway, South Carolina, in the Myrtle Beach Invitational,

WVU (1-1) held Monmouth without a field goal during an eightminute stretch in the second half to turn a nine-point lead with six and a half minutes remaining into a 17-point advantage with 5:04 left.

Konate's 3 at the top of the key with the shot clock winding down began the spurt, and freshman Jordan McCabe quickly hit another 3 in transition to make it a 15-point game. Chase Harler's layup 35 seconds later following Deion Hammond's missed layup forced Monmouth coach King Rice to call a 30-second timeout.

West Virginia's biggest lead of the game was 22 points with 1:39 remaining.

"We didn't shoot the ball so quick (in the second half)," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said about his team's second half turnaround. "We shoot it so quick and when we miss we've got guys running to the goal, the ball goes bouncing over their head and that gives them transition (opportunities) and makes us get too spread. It's not a good formula for us to win."

In the first half, Monmouth had a four-point lead, 27-23, before West Virginia used an 8-4 spurt to tie it at 31. West Virginia scored the final five points of the first half to take a 36-31 halftime lead.

Guard James "Beetle" Bolden scored nine on three-of-eight shooting while forward Lamont West failed to score after pouring in a team-high 22 against the Bulls.

West Virginia shot 45.7 percent from the floor and just 26.1 percent from 3, the Mountaineers taking half of their 46 shot attempts from

Monmouth (0-4) shot 35.3 percent, turned the basketball over 18 times and had 11 more fouls than field goal attempts. The Mountaineers did a much better job containing the Hawks in the second half.

Hammond was the only Monmouth player to reach double digits with 10.

"We were giving up too much penetration so I told them to gap it more," Huggins explained. "If we gave up something it was going to be a contested 3 - it wasn't going to be a straight-line drive to the basket."

This is the second time these two schools met. West Virginia also winning the first meeting in Morgantown back on Nov. 14, 2014,

#### Recap

Western Kentucky made just enough plays down the stretch to outlast West Virginia 63-57 in the semifinal game of the Myrtle Beach Invitational played at Coastal Carolina's HTC Center in Conway, South Carolina.

Neither team shot the ball well, Western Kentucky making 32 percent of its field goal attempts and West Virginia just 33, but the Hilltoppers feasted on Mountaineer turnovers and fouls.

West Virginia mishandled the basketball 22 times and sent WKU to the free throw line 34 times where it converted 27 - 12 more than West Virginia's 15 free throws made.

The Mountaineers (1-2) struggled all night getting good looks on the offensive end of the floor and when they did pass the ball enough to get an open shot it was usually a 3. WVU missed 19 of the 25 it attempted which led to numerous runout opportunities for Western Kentucky.

Starting forwards Sagaba Konate and Esa Ahmad were a combined O-for-6 from behind the arc, while backup forward Wesley Harris also missed both triples he tried.

Lamont West was 1-for-6 and guard Beetle Bolden was the only player to make more than one, hitting two of the five he tried. But Bolden turned the ball over five times and every player who got into the game turned the ball over at least once, with the exception of West.

Despite this, West Virginia battled back from six points down to tie the game at 57 on Konate's free throw with 1:26 remaining.

But Desean Murray answered with a dunk and another empty possession from West Virginia resulted in two more Western Kentucky free throws. Jared Savage made both, putting the Hilltoppers ahead 61-57 with 31 seconds to go.

Two missed 3s by Bolden and Ahmad led to more Western Kentucky free throws and its third victory of the season.

Charles Bassey and Taveion Hollingsworth led four double-figure scorers with 13 each, while Josh Anderson scored 12 and Savage added

Ahmad led West Virginia with 12 and Bolden finished with 10. West Virginia began the game with an early 8-2 advantage and led 35-33 at halftime. However, WVU began the second half with turnovers on back to back possessions and turned it over 10 more times during the second 20 minutes.

#### Notebook

The two times met for the first time since the 1987 NCAA Tournament First Round in Syracuse, N.Y.

#### Recap

Lamont West's career-high 27 points helped West Virginia defeat Saint Joseph's 97-90 to earn the Mountaineers a third place finish at the Myrtle Beach Invitational at Coastal Carolina's HTC Center in Conway, South Carolina.

West made 8 of 12 from the floor, including 7 of 11 from 3, and hit all four of his free throw attempts to give West Virginia a big boost off the hearth

The Mountaineers (2-2) benefitted from St. Joseph's fouls, the Hawks losing their leading scorer Charlie Brown to fouls 8:07 remaining and West Virginia leading 79-71.

Soon after, Wesley Harris hit a 3 to put the Mountaineers ahead by 11, and their lead swelled to a game-high 14 with 6:01 remaining on Brandon Knapper's 3 from the wing.

Knapper, on the floor in place of injured starter Beetle Bolden, out with an elbow injury suffered during Friday night's loss to Western Kentucky, logged 24 minutes and scored 9 points, grabbed five rebounds and handed out five assists. More importantly, Knapper turned the ball over just one time and the Mountaineers as a team were credited with just 12 miscues – 10 fewer than they committed in the earlier loss to Western Kentucky.

"We moved the ball," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. "We got open guys the shots they can make."

Sagaba Konate scored 15 and grabbed nine rebounds, Harris contributed 13 points off the bench and Esa Ahmad finished with 12.

Konate, who missed all three of his 3-point attempts in the game against the Hilltoppers, didn't try a 3 this afternoon, taking all 12 of his shot attempts from inside the arc.

Sixty seven of West Virginia's 97 points came from forwards West, Kontate, Harris and Ahmad.

"Those are the guys who we thought were going to be our strength this year,"  $\operatorname{Huggins}$  said.

WVU had a 39-29 advantage on the glass and was able to withstand a 52-percent shooting performance from behind the arc from St. Joseph's, which finished 13 of 25 from there. The Hawks struggled at the free throw line, however, missing 11 to shoot just 60.7 percent.

There were 20 ties and 14 lead changes in the game, which West Virginia led at halftime, 51-49.

St. Joe's largest lead was six points midway through the first half and its final lead was  $64\cdot62$  on Lamarr Kimble's layup with 13:25 remaining in the game. WVU tied it on Knapper's two free throws and gradually got it to five on more free throws from West and Ahmad.

#### Recap

Esa Ahmad's career-high 30 points and Sagaba Konate's careerbest 26 powered West Virginia to an 88-76 victory over Valparaiso here at the WVU Coliseum.

"They're both capable, we just need them to be more consistent until we can get these freshmen a little more knowledge of what college basketball is all about." West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said.

Twenty four of Konate's 26 came in the second half, at one point the forward pouring in 13 points during a four-minute stretch to help West Virginia extend its three-point halftime lead to five on his straight-away 3, and then to seven on his driving layup the next time down the floor.

Freshman Emmitt Matthews Jr.'s second try from dose to the basket gave the Mountaineers their first double-digit advantage at 11 with 6:42 remaining.

WVU's biggest lead was 14 on Ahmad's jumper with 1:02 left. Derrik Smits, the son of former NBA standout Rik Smits, led Valpo with 20 points on 9-of-12 shooting. The Crusaders (3-3) hit 9-of-20 from behind the 3-point arc and were shooting better than 70 percent from the floor midway through the second half before cooling off down the streith

Huggins started freshman Brandon Knapper in place of injured starter James "Beetle" Bolden and he played a good portion of the game at point guard. Knapper and freshman Jordan McCabe did a solid job holding on to the basketball as the Mountaineers committed a season-low seven turnovers, 11 fewer than the 18 they were averaging heading into the game.

Ahmad did most of the damage in the first half as West Virginia built an early nine-point advantage, 14-5.

But then Valpo, trailing 18:10, went on an 11-2 run to take a 21-20 lead on Ryan Fazekas' jumper, and led by two, 26-24, on Deion Lavender's 3

Ahmad answered with two free throws to tie the game, and more free throws from Emmitt Matthews Jr., Konate and West built the lead back to five with 2:57 remaining.

Konate grabbed 10 rebounds to finish with a double-double, his first of the season.

Ahmad hit 12-of-15 from the floor and was also 5-of-6 from the free throw line.

WVU outscored Valpo 17-7 at the line and had a 35-28 edge on the glass to move past .500 for the first time this season at 3-2.

Lamont West came off the bench to score 20 and Esa Ahmad followed up his career-best 30 points with 16 in West Virginia's 92-78 victory over Rider at the WVU Coliseum.

West made four-of-five from 3-point distance, hit four-of-five from the free throw line and added seven rebounds.

"We looked pretty good for a while, passed the ball, and looked like a team that liked each other," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said.

The Mountaineers, playing without injured starting forward Sagaba Konate, got 12 points from guard Beetle Bolden, all in the first half, 11 from Chase Harler and a season-high 11 from freshman forward Emmitt Matthews Jr. coming off the bench.

Another freshman, Jordan McCabe, entered the game with 7:02 left in the first half and West Virginia trailing 28-21. In the next five minutes the Mountaineers got a wing 3 from Ahmad, assisted by McCabe, a wing 3 from West, assisted by McCabe, and another deep 3 from West, also assisted by McCabe.

A seven-point deficit turned into a 32-28 lead in a matter of three minutes.

WVU finished the half with a Wesley Harris dunk off of Harler's feed and West's deep 3 before the horn sounded to give the Mountaineers a 43-36 halftime advantage.

After Rider's Jordan Allen began the second half with a 3, West Virginia used a 13-point run to build its lead to 17, 56-39, on a pair of Logan Routt free throws. Routt started in place of Konate and finished with 7 points and a team-high eight rebounds.

West Virginia's largest lead was 19, 75-56, with 9:20 remaining. Rider (2-2) made a little run to reduce the Mountaineers' lead to 10, 82-72, on Stevie Jordan's basket with 3:35 left, but West Virginia answered with Matthews transition dunk, once again assisted by

McCabe handed out a season-high eight assists in 17 minutes of action, 12 of those coming in the second half when Huggins opted to sit Bolden and not risk another injury in a chippy game that saw three technicals and a flagrant 1 foul called on the Broncs.

After shooting just 21 percent to begin the game, West Virginia finished 30-of-70 for 42.9 percent. The Mountaineers had a 46-36 advantage on the glass and outscored Rider's bench 37-29.

Esa Ahmad and Beetle Bolden scored 15 points each to lead six West Virginia double-figure scorers in the Mountaineers' 106-72 victory over Youngstown State at the WVU Coliseum.

No regular played more than starting guard Chase Harler's 24 minutes.

"Those freshmen have just got to play and keep getting better and better," Huggins said. "The more we can get them into the game the better they are going to be."

Sagaba Konate scored the game's first basket and WVU never trailed, the Mountaineers building their lead to double digits on Bolden's steal and layup before the under-16 timeout.

An 11-0 run over the remaining 3:44 gave West Virginia a commanding 55-37 halftime lead.

West Virginia's largest lead was 34 points, 99-65, with 4:11 remaining. Thirteen different players got into the game and 12 scored for West Virginia. Konate contributed 14 points and a team-high nine rebounds. The junior was also credited with three blocks.

Wesley Harris, Brandon Knapper and Lamont West scored 10 each for West Virginia.

The Mountaineers shot a season-high 54.1 percent from the floor, hitting 40 of its 74 shot attempts. WVU was also credited with 20 assists on its 40 field goals.

WVU had a 47-39 edge on the glass, but the Penguins pulled down an alarming 17 offensive rebounds. Both teams took a lot of 3s -Youngstown State attempted 36 and West Virginia 32.

The Penguins got a game-high 20 points off the bench from Garrett Covington

Youngstown State shot 37.7 percent from the floor and finished with 15 turnovers, but Huggins was still not satisfied with his team's half-court defense.

"We don't gang-guard the way we need to gang-guard," he pointed out. "We're not in help position and we watch the ball too much. We've got to get better at helping and supporting each other."

An announced crowd of 10.849 watched the game

KeVaughn Allen's 19 points led Florida to a 66-56 victory over coldshooting West Virginia in the nightcap of the Jimmy V Classic at Madison Square Garden in New York City.

The nightcap was a matter of which team could come up with enough offense to outlast the other. Florida turned out to be that team, the Gators hitting 33.3 percent of their field goal attempts compared to West Virginia's 29.7 percent to give the Gators a double-digit victory, their sixth in nine meetings against the Mountaineers.

West Virginia's top four scorers Esa Ahmad, Sagaba Konate, Lamont West and Beetle Bolden shot a combined 6-for-35 from the floor, scoring 14 points between them.

Chase Harler was the only Mountaineer who could find his shooting touch, the junior guard hitting four of his five field goal attempts to finish with a team-high 11 points.

"We won't pass the ball," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. "Our biggest problem is, one, we don't pass it well and, two, we don't have any idea where we're supposed to go. It blows my mind how can a guy can be standing wide open and we can't see him."

Florida (5-3) was not much better, the Gators making 16 of their 48 field goal tries while committing 15 turnovers. Florida did most of its damage from the free throw line where it converted 28-of-46, compared to West Virginia's 11-of-20.

In addition to being whistled for 30 personal fouls, West Virginia once again had difficulty handling the basketball as it committed 21 turnovers against Florida's quarter court trapping defense.

The Mountaineers' only lead came with 16:36 remaining in the second half when Bolden's steal led to an Ahmad dunk to give the Mountaineers a 31-30 advantage.

But Florida responded with an 18-2 flurry to put the game out of reach with nine minutes to go.

"We couldn't score," Huggins said. "We went six minutes and didn't

"There were 22 points off of 21 turnovers and many of those were guys just doing things they are not capable of doing," Huggins said.

#### Notebook

The game was West Virginia's third appearance in the Jimmy V Classic and its third loss in the event. The Mountaineers fell 68-65 to Davidson in 2008 and 70-54 to Virginia in 2015.

Sagaba Konate's 16 points, nine rebounds and seven blocks powered West Virginia to a 69-59 victory over Pitt in a turnover-plagued, foul-marred basketball game at the WVU Coliseum.

There were combined 50 turnovers, 49 fouls and a near secondhalf Mountaineer meltdown

Konate was certainly one answer, the junior setting the WVU career block-shot record once established by D'or Fischer with his 191st career rejection on Trey McGowens' dunk attempt with 3:54 remaining in the game.

Konate continually turned back Pitt's straight-line drives at the rim, scored close to the basket and in transition on some thunderous dunks when his teammates were able to get him the ball, and he played like a preseason All-Big 12 player.

Huggins said a day earlier that he wasn't sure if Konate was going to play because he didn't practice on Thursday. But he was well enough to come off the bench and give the Mountaineers 27 effective minutes.

Junior guard Beetle Bolden scored a team-high 18 points - a lot of those coming off the ball when Jermaine Haley was in the game at point guard - while Esa Ahmad added 13 points to go with a seasonhigh seven turnovers.

West Virginia (6-3) used an 11-0 run during a five-minute stretch late in the first half to take control of the game. A Konate dunk and three Bolden free throws with 12.9 seconds left gave the Mountaineers a 39-27 halftime advantage.

WVU built its margin to 17 on Ahmad's layup with 15:10 remaining, and led by 14 points when Haley had to come out of the game with his

The 6-foot-7-inch Haley was the Mountaineers' most effective ball handler against Pitt's pressure because he is tall enough to pass the ball over top of defenders.

But as soon as he went to the bench, West Virginia's comfortable lead soon dwindled from 14 to eight in a matter of four minutes.

Two Ahmad free throws with 3:43 remaining seemed to put the Mountaineers back in control with a 15-point advantage.

Panther freshman guard Xavier Johnson scored a game-high 21 points and McGowens added 18 while the other eight Pitt players who got into the game scored 20 points on a combined 7-of-24 shooting. Overall, Pitt shot 31.5 percent from the field and just 26.1 percent from 3-point distance

#### Recap

Rhode Island took advantage of West Virginia's poor shooting to run away with an 83-70 victory over the Mountaineers in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic at Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Connecticut.

The Mountaineers, with starting forward Sagaba Konate who was unavailable for the game with an injured right knee, struggled without him to find any offensive rhythm against the Rams.

WVU trailed the entire first half and if not for the free throw line the Rams' two-point halftime lead would have been much larger.

West Virginia briefly took a three-point lead on Brandon Knapper's 3 early in the second half, but another field goal drought saw the Rams rebuild their lead to four when Omar Silverio's jumper made it 63-59.

It was still a one-point game with 8:21 remaining when WVU came unglued.

A missed Ahmad 3 turned into a Cyril Langevine dunk. Then, back-toback misses by Chase Harler and Ahmad resulted in another run-out dunk by Jeff Dowtin. The next time down the floor, a Jermaine Haley turnover led to Langevine's jumper to give Rhode Island a seven-point cushion.

WVU temporarily trimmed the deficit to four on Wesley Harris' 3, but five straight empty possessions enabled Rhode Island to expand its margin to 75-65 and take control of the game with 2:39 remaining.

URI's biggest lead was 14 points achieved twice at 81-67 and 82-68. Guards Fatts Russell and Jeff Dowtin led five Rhode Island double figure scorers with 18 points each. Langeville added 15 points and six rebounds after sitting a good portion of the first half in early foul trouble.

West Virginia, much like it did in its 10-point loss to Florida earlier in the season in Madison Square Garden, struggled all game long on the offensive end of the floor. The Mountaineers were 18-of-56 shooting, including 5-of-25 from 3-point distance while turning the ball over 15 times.

WVU's only effective offensive player was forward Wesley Harris, who made five of his six shot attempts to finish with a career-high 18 points to go with nine rebounds.

Ahmad added 12 but got off just six shot attempts, making two, while starting guards Beetle Bolden and Chase Harler were a combined 1-of-14 shooting with two assists and four turnovers.

The point differential between the two starting backcourts favored Rhode Island 36-6.

Huggins was also unhappy with his team's non-existent pressure that resulted in just one steal. The Rams had a 44-24 scoring edge in the paint and got 20 points off of those 15 WVU turnovers.

#### Recap

Wesley Harris followed up a career high with another career high. The junior forward was two points better than the 18 he scored against Rhode Island to help West Virginia defeat Jacksonville State 74-72 in front of 8,231 at the WVU Coliseum.

Harris made eight of his 11 field goal attempts and it was his dutch 3 point shooting late in the game that helped the Mountaineers hold off the Gamecocks.

West Virginia (7-4), playing without starting center Sagaba Konate, also played all but four minutes without its top scorer Esa Ahmad.

Ahmad scored two points before being taken out of the game and he didn't return. Lamont West stepped in and scored 18 points off the bench on seven-of-12 shooting, including four-of-six from 3.

At one point in the first half, Huggins had three freshmen on the floor at the same time - Brandon Knapper, Emmitt Matthews Jr. and Derek Culver - and he later used a three-forward lineup for a good portion of the WVU up four, and then he fed Bolden for a short jumper to make it second half when WVU built its lead to nine, 49-40, on West's 3.

But Jacksonville State (7-5) battled back to take a 58-57 lead on Jason Burnell's layup, forcing Huggins to call timeout with 8:35 remaining. The Mountaineers got points following the stoppage when Harris followed up Jermaine Haley's miss, and then Haley stole the inbounds pass and scored to make it 61-58. WVU.

A Knapper 3 gave West Virginia a 64-62 lead with 6:29 remaining, and another West 3 with 4:20 left put the Mountaineers back in front, 68-

Following the under-four timeout and Christian Cunningham making just one of two at the free throw line, Harris responded with another big 3 from the corner to give the Mountaineers a 71-67 advantage.

A fourth Harris 3 pushed the lead to five, 74-69, with 1:46 to go. But two Burnell free throws and a couple of close misses by West and Haley gave Jacksonville State an opportunity to try and tie the game, trailing

Tv Hudson was fouled by Beetle Bolden away from the ball with 26 seconds left and Hudson could only convert one of his two free throw attempts, making the score 74-72.

Haley grabbed Hudson's miss and was fouled by Cunningham with 23 seconds left. He was unable to convert the front end of a one-and-one, giving Jacksonville State an opportunity to tie the game with a field goal or take the lead with a 3. Burnell got a good look at a 3 from the top of the key with eight seconds remaining, missed, and Chase Harler grabbed the rebound and was fouled with four seconds still showing on the clock.

He also missed, but Bolden was able to deflect a length-of-the-floor pass out of bounds as time expired.

#### Recap

Beetle Bolden came off the bench to score a career-high 22 points and Esa Ahmad added 21 to lift West Virginia to a 78-68 victory over Lehigh at the WVU Coliseum.

Bolden hit four 3s, grabbed eight rebounds, handed out five assists and spent the early portion of the game at the off-guard position with freshman point guard Jordan McCabe earning his first start of the season.

McCabe hit a couple of shots and finished with 5 points in 12 minutes of action before Huggins switched to Bolden and junior Chase Harler in the backcourt for most of the second half.

West Virginia got a big lift from freshman forward Derek Culver, who took over the game with 11:18 remaining when the Mountaineers were leading by just two, 52-50.

Culver hit a couple of free throws on back-to-back possessions to a six-point game.

Four minutes later, following a Lance Tejada 3, Culver made a pretty baseline move to score and was fouled by Nic Lynch on the play. After converting a traditional three point play, Culver grabbed Kyle Leufroy's miss and then followed up Ahmad's miss to give the Mountaineers an eight-point lead.

At the other end of the floor, Culver blocked Jeameril Wilson's driving layup attempt, Jermaine Haley grabbed the rebound and that stop eventually led to two Ahmad free throws, giving the Mountaineers their first double-digit lead of the game, 69-59.

Culver played a total of 19 minutes and finished with 11 points and 11 rebounds.

Wesley Harris, coming off consecutive career-high scoring performances against Rhode Island and Jacksonville State, contributed 10 points and hit a couple of big second-half 3s, his second from the corner with 1:51 remaining to give West Virginia a 13-point advantage, its biggest of the game.

There were 11 lead changes and seven ties before West Virginia finally took control of things halfway through the second half.

WVU used its big size advantage to out-rebound the Mountain Hawks, 52-25. Ahmad grabbed nine boards while Harris and Logan Routt added five rebounds each. The Mountaineers had a staggering 30-2 margin in second-chance points and they also outscored the Mountain Hawks 37-10 from their bench.

Texas Tech overcame some frigid shooting to outlast West Virginia 62-59 in a foul-plagued, turnover-marred Big 12 opener at the WVU

The two teams combined to commit 50 fouls and mishandle the basketball 35 times, but the Mountaineers were far more generous by committing 22 turnovers. Those 22 miscues led to 27 of the Red Raiders'

Tech made 21 of their 55 field goal attempts for 38.2 percent and only 3-of-18 from 3, but the Red Raiders got a big triple from Davide Moretti with 2:09 remaining to give them a 55-54 lead after Esa Ahmad's two free throws put the Mountaineers ahead 54-52.

After Moretti's 3, West Virginia came up empty on three straight possessions, two of those resulting in turnovers and the other being a Chase Harler miss from the corner.

Jarrett Culver, Tech's 19.6 points-per-game scorer who went scoreless in the first half after picking up three fouls, got a short jumper to go down with 40 seconds remaining to give the Red Raiders a 57-54 lead.

Two more points from Culver at the free throw line pushed Tech's lead to five, but Lamont West answered with a 3 at the other end with 21 seconds left

Culver and West then traded free throws, making it 61-59 with five seconds to go.

Chris Beard used his final timeout underneath West Virginia's basket to get his team organized for the inbound play.

Culver ran over West Virginia's James Bolden before the ball was put into play, no foul was called, and the scrambling Mountaineers were forced and made 13-of-19 from the free throw line while West Virginia shot 40 to foul Moretti with three seconds to go.

Moretti made the first free throw and missed the second, but Brandon Knapper's mid-court shot attempt to tie the game as time expired Mountaineers had possession of the ball with an opportunity to take the was off line and bounced off the backboard.

West Virginia (8-5, 0-1) had a nine-point first half lead before hitting a long field goal drought that spanned more than 10 minutes and extended into the second half.

During that stretch, Bolden's short jumper with 4:53 to go in the first half was the only Mountaineer field goal until Derek Culver finally ended the drought nearly six minutes into the second half

That turned a 21-12 West Virginia lead into a 33-24 deficit.

WVU also didn't help itself at the free throw line by missing eight in the first half and 14 for the game. A couple of those misses came on the front end of one-and-ones, which could have resulted in additional scoring opportunities.

Matt Coleman III's 17 points, including a dutch 3 with 1:03 remaining, lifted Texas to a 61-54 victory over West Virginia at the Erwin Center in Austin, Texas.

The Longhorns also got 14 points from Dylan Osetkowski and 10 from Elijah Mitrou-Long. West Virginia fought back from an eight-point deficit to make it a

two-point game with 2:25 remaining when Derek Culver put back Esa Ahmad's 3-point miss.

Jaxson Hayes and Ahmad traded baskets to make the score 56-54, Longhorns, with 1:38 remaining. The Mountaineers defended Texas for almost the entire shot clock until Coleman, with three seconds remaining, hit a step-back 3 over Wesley Harris to give Texas a 59-54 lead.

Jordan McCabe's 3-point attempt at the other end was off the mark, and Osetkowski grabbed the rebound, and got the ball to Coleman who was fouled by Harris.

Coleman made both free throws.

Another trip down the floor for the Mountaineers resulted in a Beetle Bolden turnover, and the Longhorns dribbled off the remaining 24 seconds of the clock

Nearly all of West Virginia's second-half scoring came from Bolden and freshman forward Derek Culver, who just missed another double double with 17 points and nine rebounds. Culver made 8 of his 12 field goa attempts while grabbing five offensive rebounds.

Bolden finished with 13 while Ahmad ended with 10.

Texas finished the game shooting 50 percent from the floor, 21-of-42, percent from the floor, 20-of-50, and made 9-of-14 from the line

There were at least 12 different instances during the game when the lead but could never get over the hump.

Kansas State overcame a 21-point second half deficit to stun West Virginia 71-69 at Bramlage Coliseum in Manhattan, Kansas.

Barry Brown's game-high 29 points, 20 of those coming in the second half, were enough to give the Wildcats their first Big 12 victory of the season.

For a good portion of the game, it looked like West Virginia was going to be the team getting its first conference victory of the year.

West Virginia (8-7, 0-3) jumped out to an early 20-3 lead and had a 36-21 advantage at halftime. Then, a quick start to the second half got the Mountaineers' lead to 21, 42-21, with 18:49 remaining on Derek Culver's short jumper.

Then WVU went cold and Kansas State got hot.

The Wildcats scored the next 15 points over a six-minute span before Culver ended West Virginia's drought with a tip-in basket. WVU eventually got its margin back to 10 with 8:51 remaining on Culver's traditional three-point play. In the process of Culver scoring, K-State's Makol Mawien fouled out of the game

But that's when Brown and Xavier Sneed took over the game. Those two helped Kansas State make eight-straight field goals, the last one a Sneed 3 from the corner with 2:30 left to give the Wildcats their first lead of the game at 67-66. He was also fouled by Lamont West and Sneed's free throw made it 68-66.

West tied the game at 68 when he followed up his miss along the baseline. Then after a Sneed missed 3 with 1:33 remaining, West was fouled by Mike McGuirl while both were going for the rebound. West could only get one of two to go down - one of nine missed free throws for the Mountaineers - and Brown was able to score a layup at the other end to give the Wildcats a 70-69 lead with 29 seconds remaining.

Huggins used his final timeout. On West Virginia's prior possession following another Huggins timeout, Esa Ahmad fumbled away the basketball while trying to score in the lane.

This time, Jermaine Haley dribbled down the clock and got the ball to Culver in the lane in front of the foul line. His short jumper with five seconds remaining was strong and Sneed grabbed the rebound. West fouled Sneed, who made the first one and missed the second, but West Virginia was unable to get off a shot attempt to win it.

Kansas State (11-4, 1-2) led for only 56 seconds, but it got the lead at the most important time in the game.

#### Notebook

West came off the bench to lead West Virginia with 21 points, 15 of those coming from 3-point distance. Culver had another strong performance with 17 points and a game-high 12 rebounds.

#### Recap

West Virginia simply didn't have an answer for Isaac Likekele.

Oklahoma State's unlikely hero scored a career-high 23 points and
Cameron McGriff added 16 points and 10 rebounds to lead the Cowboys to
an 85-77 victory at the WVU Coliseum.

Likekele, who came into the game averaging 7.1 points, 16 above his average by shooting seven-of-10 from the floor, mostly on straight-line drives to the rim. He also made nine-of-11 from the free throw line and overall the Cowboys converted 23-of-31 from there.

It was the third straight victory for the Cowboys at the WVU Coliseum.

Oklahoma State's 5-2 record in Morgantown is the best of any Big 12 team since West Virginia joined the conference in 2012.

For the struggling Mountaineers, it was their fourth straight conference defeat and their overall record drops to 8-8.

Huggins, who used a starting lineup consisting of Beetle Bolden, Jermaine Haley, Chase Harler, Lamont West and Logan Routt and did not play regulars Esa Ahmad and Wesley Harris, also used true freshman guard Trey Doomes for the first time this year seeking a spark.

At one point in the first half he had four freshmen on the floor at the same time with Doomes, Derek Culver, Jordan McCabe and Emmitt Matthews Jr. out there.

WVU missed its first seven shots but was able to hang around until the Cowboys began to take control late in the first half. Five straight McGriff points gave Oklahoma State a 28-22 lead, and consecutive 3s from Maurice Calloo and Curtis Jones built the margin to 10.

A Jones 3 and some free throws gave the Cowboys an 11-point halftime advantage.

West scored the first eight points of the second half for West Virginia. and then Bolden added five more to make it a two-point game with 11:39 remaining.

But Oklahoma State answered with a 15-7 run to build its lead back to 10 - eight of those coming from Likekele.

The Cowboys' biggest lead was 12, 75-63, with 3:48 remaining. But WVU couldn't stop Likekele's drives to the basket and failed to cover Oklahoma State's 3-point shooters, the Cowboys finishing 8-of-17 from behind the arc for 47.1 percent.

West Virginia also struggled with its outside shot by missing 23 of its 29 triple attempts and finishing shooting just 38.8 percent.

The Mountaineers had a 43-36 advantage on the glass but 18 of those rebounds came off of missed shots.

#### Recap

Desmond Bane's 26 points led TCU to a 98-67 victory over West Virginia at Schollmaier Arena in Fort Worth, Texas.

The Horned Frogs, which missed six of their first seven shots, warmed up pretty quickly. TCU ended up hitting 12 triples and scoring 28 more at the free throw line on 37 attempts to come two points shy of eclipsing the 100-point barrier for the first time against a Bob Huggins-coached Mountaineer fram

The 31-point loss was West Virginia's worst since suffering a 39-point defeat against No. 1-ranked Kentucky in the Sweet 16 round of the 2015 NCAA Tournament.

All eight players TCU coach Jamie Dixon put in the game got in the scoring column with six reaching double figures.

In addition to Bane's 26, Alex Robinson scored 14, JD Miller 13, Kouat Noi and Lat Mayen 12 each, and Keyin Samuel finishing with 10.

TCU (13·3, 2·2) shot 47.5 percent (29 of 61) from the floor, including 12 of 28 from 3.

TCU's largest lead was 35 with 2:21 remaining in the game.
West Virginia got a team-high 15 points from Beetle Bolden.
Bolden only played 25 minutes after getting into early foul trouble.
Wesley Harris was the only other Mountaineer to reach double figures with 13.

Freshman Derek Culver, coming off a 15-point, 15-rebound doubledouble in a loss to Oklahoma State, scored eight points and grabbed four rebounds in 22 minutes.

Starting guard Jermaine Haley left the game with a left hand injury and returned to the bench with it wrapped.

Turnovers once again were an issue for West Virginia as the Mountaineers committed 17 miscues, two more than their season average. As was the case against Oklahoma State, there were times when Huggins had as many as four freshman out on the floor at the same time.

"They have kind of a breakout and our guy comes down and blocks his shot and their guy ran right by our next guy, caught it and dunked it in," Huggins said. "Now, you just make a great effort play and you turn around and there is your teammate jogging down the floor. That's not teamwork at all. And that's something we've never had.

"We've had teams that weren't very talented in the past but they tried. West Virginians appreciate hard work. It's a state of hard-working people and I'm embarrassed."

#### Notebook

 It was TCU's second-ever victory against West Virginia, both coming at TCU during the last two years.

Recap

There is some fight left in these WVU Mountaineers after all. Coming off perhaps the worst performance in coach Bob Huggins' 12-year tenure at his alma mater at TCU, West Virginia scored the game's final seven points to stun seventh-ranked Kansas 65-64 at the WVU Coliseum

Jermaine Haley's driving basket with 8.5 seconds left put West Virginia ahead 65-64. At the other end of the floor, Kansas got two shot attempts to win it - one from Lagerald Vick from the corner with a second remaining and the other a follow-up try by Dedric Lawson that glanced off the front of the rim before the horn sounded.

The Jayhawks (15-3, 4-2) missed five straight shots down the stretch to blow a six-point lead with 2:23 remaining.

After Marcus Garrett's layup made it 64-58, a Wesley Harris 3 from the wing sliced Kansas' lead in half. Then, a Garrett missed jumper at the other end led to Derek Culver's basket with 1:26 left.

Two 30-second timeouts called by Bill Self, the first coming with 1:16 remaining after the Culver score and the other occurring with 44 seconds to go, both resulted in empty possessions.

Following the first timeout, Garrett couldn't get his driving layup over Culver to go down but he stole the ball back when Culver tried to pass the ball backwards to a teammate.

Self called a second timeout to draw up something better.

But what Kansas ended up getting was a wild 3-point try by Vick from the corner that ended up in Haley's hands along the baseline.

Haley got the ball back on the wing, maneuvered to his right and drove past Quentin Grimes to put in the winning shot off the glass.

The Jayhawks, which have lost five of seven at the Coliseum, stumbled through a first half that saw them shoot just 37 percent from the floor and commit 13 turnovers, resulting in a 23-23 tie at halftime.

West Virginia (9-9, 1-5) won the game because it held on to the basketball and didn't stand around on the perimeter and jack up contested 3s that have frequently led to fast break opportunities for the opposition during the five-game losing streak.

The Mountaineers tried just three triples in the first half, choosing instead to pass the basketball and look for shots closer to the rim.

In the second half, when the game began to open up a little bit, West Virginia was able to convert five-of-11 from 3-point range, mostly on step-in shots.

Haley scored 13 points on five of five shooting to lead the Mountaineers. Bolden, suffering from the flu, came off the bench to contribute 12 while Culver added 11.

#### Notebook

 West Virginia won for the second time in a row while being unranked and facing a Top 10 team. The last was a 92-86 win over No. 8-ranked Kansas on March 8, 2014, also at the Coliseum.

The Yale graduate transfer made 10-of-16 field goals and handed out four assists to help the streaking Bears to their third straight conference

West Virginia, hoping to capitalize on its first Big 12 win two days ago against Kansas, couldn't match the same effort and intensity it put forth against the Javhawks

Baylor (12-6, 4-2) out-rebounded West Virginia 45-35 and at one point in the game had nearly as many offensive rebounds (eight) as the Mountaineers had total rebounds (nine).

The Bears took control of the game midway through the first half by going on an 11-3 run to build a 12-point lead. They eventually got it to 17 on a couple of Devonte Bandoo 3s.

Baylor's biggest lead was 21 with 15:54 remaining in the game.

West Virginia (9-10, 1-6) used full-court pressure to force 16 second half turnovers and get its deficit down to eight on a Bolden 3 from the top of the key with 3:33 remaining.

But Baylor immediately answered Bolden's 3 with Mario Kegler's

Bolden, who finished with a team-high 22 points, fouled out with 2:44 left leaving the Mountaineers without their most reliable scorer to cut deeper into Baylor's lead.

Freshman Brandon Knapper came off the bench to add a season-high 15 on six-of-12 shooting. He was the only other WVU player to reach double figures.

In addition to Mason's 29, Kegler contributed a season-high 18 and

Baylor shot 50 percent from the floor for the game and made 15-of-17 at the free throw line in the second half after missing 10 of its first 14.

Freshman Derek Culver got into early foul trouble and endured his toughest game as a Mountaineer, finishing with 3 points on one-of-eight shooting.

West Virginia also struggled at the line by missing 13 of its 34 free throw tries while also missing a staggering 16 layups.

"I don't understand how we can continually miss the shots that we miss," Huggins said. "We were 10-for-26 in layups - shots around the rim. Ten-for-26

The minus-14 degree temperatures outside in Ames didn't deter 14,252 from showing up to watch the Cyclones roll to their 16th victory of

West Virginia, without its top Big 12 scorer Beetle Bolden, who didn't make the trip after injuring his ankle in the loss at Tennessee, turned the basketball over 19 times and committed 26 fouls leading to 29 lowa State free throws.

The Cyclones shot a sizzling 54.5 percent from the floor - most of that coming on driving layups, dunks or shots close to the rim.

"They out-athlete us," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. "We gave up so many straight-line drives, which is a no-no. We've got guys who have been here four years turning people loose to the middle of the floor."

Marial Shayok scored 18 points and Nick Weiler-Babb added 14 to help lowa State.

The Mountaineers (9-12, 1-7) led just once, 18-17, on Brandon Knapper's bank-shot 3 with 10:29 to go in the first half before lowa State used an 8-0 run to take a 25-18 advantage. The Cyclones made another 9-0 run later in the half to build their margin to 16 on the way to a 45-28 lead at intermission.

An Emmitt Matthews Jr. basket with 9:10 remaining in the game got West Virginia's deficit down to 10, 61-51 - the closest West Virginia could get before the Cyclones responded with back-to-back baskets by Weiler-Babb and Wiggington.

lowa State's biggest lead was 27 points with 42 seconds to go. Lamont West scored 24 points before fouling out to lead West Virginia.

Matthews Jr. matched his season high with 11 points, all of those

Huggins was ejected from the game with 3:28 remaining after drawing a pair of technical fouls arguing a no-call on a missed Wesley Harris shot attempt.

Freshman Brandon Knapper picked the right time to have the best game of his young college basketball career.

With Beetle Bolden out for the second straight game with an injured ankle and West Virginia coming off three straight double-digit losses, the South Charleston product scored a career-high 25 points to lift the Mountaineers to a 79-71 victory over Oklahoma at the WVU Coliseum

Knapper, who came into the game averaging 4.5 points per game and had seven more turnovers than assists, performed like a completely

Aside from Knapper's scoring, the Mountaineers won the game because they dominated the backboard by out-rebounding the Sooners 46-30. Frequently, West Virginia's best offense was missing its initial shot and then Esa Ahmad, Derek Culver and Wesley Harris crashing in the glass.

The trio grabbed 16 of West Virginia's 18 offensive rebounds to give it a 27-9 advantage in second-chance points.

Culver finished with 13 points and 14 rebounds, Ahmad scored 12 and grabbed 13 rebounds and Harris contributed 13 points and seven boards.

Oklahoma (15-7, 3-6) had things going its way with an early 15-10 lead and the Sooners led 26-25 with 3:27 remaining before West Virginia finished the half scoring the final eight points.

Knapper got a drive into the lane to go down off the glass, Chase Harler made a pair of free throws, Ahmad followed Logan Routt's miss and then freshman guard Trey Doomes completed the first-half scoring with two more at the line.

In the second half, West Virginia (10-12, 2-7) built its lead to nine, 47-38, when Ahmad grabbed Harris' miss and found Jordan McCabe open beyond the top of the key for a 3.

The Sooners eventually got their deficit down to one, 59-58, by driving to the basket and going to the free throw line nearly every time down the floor. During one four-minute stretch Oklahoma scored nine points despite taking just one shot attempt (an Aaron Calixte missed

OU made 18-of-19 from the line in the second half, including two from Kristian Doolittle with 4:52 remaining to make it a 63-60 game. Huggins chose to switch to a 3-2 zone to try and slow down OU dribble penetration.

Huggins called timeout with 1:59 remaining to get his team organized and out of that came a step in 3 by Knapper from the wing to make it 68-63.

#### Recap

West Virginia looked like a basketball team playing its third road game in 10 days.

Just two days after getting its second Big 12 victory of the year against Oklahoma, the Mountaineers looked like they had nothing left in the tank in losing 81-50 to 18th-ranked Texas Tech at United Supermarkets Arena in Lubbock, Texas,

West Virginia (10-13, 2-8) made just nine field goals - its fewest in a game in 77 years - and committed 26 turnovers in falling by 31 points on the road for the second time this season.

WVU made nine field goals in a 30-22 loss at Duquesne on Jan. 7, 1942. The fewest field goals made by a Mountaineer team during the shot-clock era was 10 against Cincinnati on Jan. 30, 2008, a 62-39 defeat against the Bearcats at the Coliseum.

"We've never gotten beat like this before," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. "Even the team that won (13 in 2013) they played. They tried. At least you could go to the bench and somebody would come in and play harder than the guy that you took out. We're putting guys in who aren't playing as hard as the guys we take out - and the guys we're taking out is because they're not playing hard."

West Virginia scored the game's first five points and actually led 14-12 before going ice cold. The Mountaineers made just one field goal for the remainder of the half, that coming from Derek Culver, as the Red Raiders built a 15-point halftime lead.

In the second half, West Virginia came completely unglued as Tech consumed its ballhandlers and forced turnover after turnover.

Brandone Francis led Texas Tech with 16 points. Jarrett Culver added 12 and Davide Moretti contributed 11 before coach Chris Beard emptied his

For a good portion of the second half. Culver was the only Mountaineer player capable of scoring, his points mostly coming from the free throw line. He went to the line 24 times, making 15, to finish with a career-high 23 points.

Culver, who also made four-of-10 from the floor, grabbed 12 rebounds for his fifth double-double of the season.

Besides Culver, the rest of the team was just five-of-29 from the floor. Texas Tech shot 52.6 percent to improve to 18-5, 6-4 on the season.

#### Notebook

Culver's 24 free throw attempts were four shy of a school record held by Bill Morrison against Pitt in 1920, and the most by any WVU player since 1922 when college basketball was still using a designated free throw shooter. All-American guard Rod Thorn once attempted 23 free throws in a game against George Washington on Jan. 12, 1963.

#### Recap

Courtney Ramey's 19 points helped Texas to a 75-53 victory over West Virginia at the WVU Coliseum.

An announced crowd of 12,815 was looking for a bounce-back performance from the Mountaineers after they lost by 31 earlier in the week at Texas Tech

But West Virginia was unable to deliver.

WVU had no answer for Texas' zone defense, especially in the second half when the Mountaineers made just nine-of-23 field goals to finish the game shooting 35.3 percent.

"I'm totally embarrassed that this is happening," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. "I don't know what to say."

Texas (14-10, 6-5) never trailed but did see its early eight-point lead whittled to one, 29-28, with 2:13 remaining in the first half. A Jermaine Haley 3 from the top of the key, a Chase Harler layup off a feed from Derek Culver and five straight points from Esa Ahmad forced Longhorn coach Shaka Smart to call timeout.

When play resumed, Ramey knocked down a triple, one of five he made for the night, and Matt Coleman III finished the first half scoring when he converted a driving layup off of a Lamont West miss.

A 10-1 Texas run to begin the second half got the Longhorn lead to 15, 44-29, and soon it grew to 23, then to 27 and eventually to 29 points before Smart emptied his bench.

Roach II added 14 points on six-of-10 shooting.

Texas made 29-of-64 for 45.3 percent (including eight second half dunks) and was nine-of-23 from 3-point distance for 39.1 percent.

The Longhorns had a 42-34 rebounding advantage and a 40-22 edge in paint scoring.

West Virginia (10-14, 2-9) got a team-best 14 points from forward Esa Ahmad.

Culver added seven points and grabbed a team-best 11 rebounds. It was the sixth time the freshman has grabbed 10 or more boards in a game during the season.

It was West Virginia's fourth straight game without injured guard Beetle Bolden and the 15th without injured forward Sagaba Konate.

"We're all accountable and I'm accountable and it's my fault," Huggins said. "I recruited them, or at least I approved of their recruitment, so it's my fault and I'll fix it."

The 22-point loss was West Virginia's largest at home during the 2018-19 season.

David McCormack and Ochai Agbaji scored 10 each as Kansas shot 52.8 percent from the floor for the game.

KU (20-6, 9-4) held West Virginia to just 16 first half points in building a commanding 27-point halftime lead.
"Our effort was good until we got down late in the first half and we

started to feel sorry for ourselves." West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said.

The Mountaineers were playing with just nine scholarship players

following the dismissals of Esa Ahmad and Wesley Harris earlier in the week. Meanwhile, juniors Beetle Bolden and Sagaba Konate continue to sit out with injuries.

There were some small victories for West Virginia. The Mountaineers outscored the Jayhawks 37-35 in the second half and also had a 36-31 edge on the glass.

"I thought in the second half we came out with some intensity and made some good plays - and made them turn it over some as well," Huggins said.

Freshman Derek Culver was one point shy of recording his sixth double-double of the season with nine points and 12 rebounds. It's the seventh time the Youngstown, Ohio, resident has grabbed 10 or more rebounds in a game.

He also matched Jermaine Haley for the team lead in assists with four.

WVU got a team-high 11 points from Lamont West and Chase Harler, who came off the bench to make five of his nine field goal attempts.

The starting lineup Huggins used included three freshmen – Culver,
Brandon Knapper and Emmitt Matthews Jr., making his first career start. He fouled.
finished with seven points and five rebounds, but also had four turnovers.

"We haven't competed and I want them to compete," Huggins said. "If we compete we are going to win our share. Competing means we've got two guys rebounding the ball every single time – not once in five, not once in three – every single time because we don't make shots."

#### Recap

Kansas State used a 19-2 run over a seven-minute stretch in the second half to pull away from West Virginia 65-51 at the WVU Coliseum.

Yet with 11:55 remaining it was anyone's game with the score tied at 42. West Virginia had scored seven straight to force a Wildcat timeout, but when play resumed that's when K-State stepped on the gas.

A Makol Mawien dunk (he missed three others) began a 19-point Wildcat flurry to put this one away and give them their 20th victory of the season and 10th in conference play.

"We had some breakdowns," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said.
"We were going to down ball screens on the side and we did a decent job downing them on the side. Then they started setting them in the middle of the floor and we were supposed to soft-hedge and we didn't. That's how Mawien got the wide-open dunk under the basket and I thought that one broke our back."

The Mountaineers (10-16, 2-11) shot just 34.6 percent from the floor - the fourth straight sub-40-percent shooting night and their seventh in Big 12 play. West Virginia was five-of-23 from behind the arc.

It was also the fourth straight game in which West Virginia scored 53 or fewer points.

"We just didn't make shots," Huggins said. "They made open shots and we didn't make open shots. That's the name of the game. That's basketball."

K-State's three centers Mawien, James Love III and Levi Stockard III combined to commit 11 fouls, sending Culver to the free throw line eight times where he made five.

The Youngstown, Ohio, resident scored 11 points and grabbed 13 rebounds for his sixth double-double of the season and his fifth straight double-digit rebounding performance. But the freshman was just three-of-nine from the floor and was unable to score through contact when he was fouled

Junior Lamont West led the Mountaineers with 16 points while grabbing seven rebounds.

Brandon Knapper scored 10 while Emmitt Matthews Jr. added nine. "We need to be more consistent," Huggins said. "It's just hard for us getting anything dose to the basket other than Derek."

Kansas State got 21 points on seven-of-14 shooting from senior guard Barry Brown. In the two wins against West Virginia in 2019 Brown scored 50 points.

#### Notebook

#### Recap

Baylor scored 16 of the game's final 21 points to outlast West Virginia 82-75 at the Ferrell Center in Waco, Texas.

The Mountaineers had a 70-66 lead with 3:07 remaining when Andrew Gordon converted a pair of free throws, two of his season-high 13 points, before going cold.

Two Baylor scores, a Devonte Bandoo jumper and a big Mario Kegler triple 22 seconds later gave the Bears a 71-70 lead.

Bandoo was able to make one of two free throws, and following a Lamont West miss, Jared Butler beat Chase Harler off the dribble for a basket to put the Bears up three. Harler fouled Butler on the play and his free throw gave the Bears a two-possession lead at 76-70.

Freshman guard Trey Doomes finally ended Baylor's 10-0 run with a layup with 50 seconds to go.

Baylor's biggest lead was 10, 82-72, before Jermaine Haley banked in a 3 with 11 seconds remaining.

West Virginia (10-17, 2-12) led for a good portion of the game, three times the youthful Mountaineers extending their lead to seven points, the latest coming on Jordan McCabe's right wing 3 with 12 minutes to go.

McCabe, seeing most of the action at point guard with Brandon Knapper out after suffering a neck sprain in practice, scored a seasonhigh 14 points.

Haley matched his season high for the third time with 13, while Gordon gave WVU a big boost off the bench in place of struggling Derek Culver with 13 points and four rebounds. Gordon made seven-of-nine from the free throw line after coming into the game shooting just 40 percent from the charity stripe.

Other than Gordon going four-for-four from the line late, West Virginia missed six free throws in the second half that helped Baylor get the lead.

Lamont West led West Virginia with 16, but struggled in the second half after scoring 10 before intermission. West was just four-of-14 from the field and two-of-nine from 3.

The Mountaineers once again struggled from behind the arc, hitting just six-of-22 for 27.3 percent.

Culver had another tough day with teams focusing on him whenever he catches the ball in the paint. He was just two-of-nine from the floor and five-of-10 from the free throw line for nine points before fouling out with 1:08 remaining.

Baylor (18-9, 9-5) was led by Mario Kegler's 23 points.

#### Recap

Bob Huggins' young West Virginia team grew up a little bit vs. TCU. The undermanned Mountaineers outlasted the undermanned Horned Frogs 104-96 in triple overtime in front of 8,798 WVU fans at the WVU Coliseum

West Virginia, with four freshmen playing, was the team making the clutch plays at the end after missing four different opportunities to hit game-winning shots in regulation and the first two overtimes.

In the final overtime, junior forward Lamont West's 3 from the wing with 2:59 remaining began a 10-0 West Virginia run over the next two minutes to give the Mountaineers 100-91 lead.

Following an Alex Robinson miss, a hustling Jermaine Haley scored to put West Virginia up four. Another TCU miss preceded a second Mountaineer 3, this one coming from Chase Harler in the corner, to put them up seven.

Two Haley free throws pushed the margin to nine.

West Virginia had numerous chances to put TCU away, beginning in regulation when the Mountaineers led by six with 1:59 remaining.

But freshman guard Jordan McCabe missed the front end of a one and-one so instead of leading by as many as eight if McCabe makes both, the lead was sliced to three when J.D. Miller banged in a 3 at the other end.

On its next possession, TCU tied the game at 68 on Desmond Bane's 3.

WVU missed an opportunity to retake the lead with 24 seconds left when Kevin Samuel appeared to pin Haley's layup attempt on the glass, but no goal tending was called.

West Virginia also had a chance to win the game in regulation when Bane's turnover at midcourt ended up in the hands of McCabe, but his running 3-point try from the top of the key at the buzzer glanced off the front of the rim.

At the end of the first overtime, McCabe had two more cracks to win it at the buzzer. He rebounded his miss with three seconds left to take another 3 at the horn but once more it was off target.

At the end of the second overtime, Chase Harler's running jumper from the baseline with three second left glanced off the rim into the hands of Derek Culver, who was unable to get his stick-back attempt to go down just as time expired.

Aaron Calixte and Jamai Bieniemy scored 22 points each to lead Oklahoma to a 92-80 victory over West Virginia at the Lloyd Noble Center in Norman, Oklahoma.

Oklahoma shot a sizzling 59.2 percent from the floor by hitting 29 of its 49 field goal attempts. OU also hit 10-of-21 from 3-point distance for

Kristian Doolittle contributed 15 points and Brady Manek added 14 for Oklahoma.

"I didn't think we competed," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. "I thought this group, although not the most talented, was going to compete like our old guys but they didn't compete today.

"And it wasn't everybody, some guys gave us great effort but a few just didn't give us any effort," Huggins added.

West Virginia (11-18, 3-13) got a season-high 23 points from Jermaine Haley, who was coming off an 18-point performance earlier in the week in the triple-overtime win against TCU.

Freshman point guard Jordan McCabe added 18 points to go with his season-high 25 scored against the Horned Frogs.

Freshman Derek Culver went for nine points and nine rebounds while freshman Emmitt Matthews Jr. grabbed a game-best 10 rebounds. He added eight points.

"I thought Emmitt was good in the first half and then he got tired," Huggins said. "He was out of gas."

Culver was just two-of-eight from the floor as Oklahoma chose to do what other teams have done by playing Culver physically whenever he gets the ball in the paint.

After leading by eight early in the game, a five-minute field goal drought to end the first half doomed the Mountaineers.

Oklahoma used as 17-3 run to finish the first half with a 42-28 advantage

West Virginia began the game hitting six of its first eight field goal attempts before ending the half going just four-of-21.

The Mountaineers recovered to shoot 48.5 percent in the second half to bring their shooting percentage up to 41.9 percent for the game. OU had a 30-19 advantage in bench scoring and a 16-6 edge in fast

break points off of 17 Mountaineer turnovers.

Christian James, Oklahoma's leading scorer with an average of 15.4 points per game, scored just seven today while Lamont West, one of two double figure scorers for WVU, made just one 3-point field goal before fouling out with 7:52 remaining in the game.

West Virginia got a career-high 28 points from junior Jermaine Haley and another outstanding 18-point, five-assist effort from emerging freshman point guard Jordan McCabe to knock off 25thranked Iowa State 90-75 at the WVU Coliseum.

Haley made 13-of-20 from the floor, mostly on drives to the basket. He also converted two-of-four from 3-point range while grabbing seven rebounds and handing out three assists.

McCabe had 18 points (15 from 3) with his final 3 coming with 9:02 remaining in the game right after the Cyclones had reduced their 21-point halftime deficit to 10 on Zoran Talley Jr.'s transition basket. McCabe's big 3, from well beyond the arc, stopped lowa State's 10-3 run

Soon, West Virginia pushed its lead back to 17 after Lamont West's five-point flurry. West scored 12 points and grabbing a season-high 12 rebounds - his first double-double since last year's NCAA Tournament victory over Marshall when he got 18 points and 10 boards.

Freshman forward Derek Culver produced his eighth double-double of the season with 15 points and 11 boards.

West Virginia outrebounded Iowa State 44-34, had a 15 to 11 edge in assists and the turnovers were negated at 14 each.

The Mountaineers (12-18, 4-13) shot a sizzling 57.5 percent in the first half (23-of-40) and finished the game at 47.8 percent, well above the 41 percent they are shooting for the season.

WVU used a 12-0 run at the midway point in the first half to turn a 20-18 deficit into a 30-20 lead, forcing Iowa State coach Steve Prohm to use one of two timeouts he called during a six-minute span.

His first one came after the Mountaineers took an early 14-10 lead. The Mountaineers looked like a completely different team, which Huggins noted afterward.

"We're playing guys now that we didn't play before," he said. "We're a totally different team. We play a bunch of young guys that like each other and play well together and want to win."

West Virginia's 55 first half points were more than it scored for an entire 40 minutes during a four-game stretch in early February when it absorbed blowout losses to Texas Tech, Texas, Kansas and Kansas State.

Since then, the Mountaineers have scored 104, 80 and 90 points in their last three games while going 2-1 over that stretch.

At the final timeout of the first half, longtime athletic equipment manager Bubba Schmidt was recognized for his 42 years of dedicated service to Mountaineer basketball.

Schmidt will be retiring in June.

#### Recap

Lindy Waters scored 19 points and Yor Anei added 16 points and five blocks to help Oklahoma State to an 85-77 victory over West Virginia at Gallagher-Iba Arena in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

The Cowboys (12-19, 5-13) shot a sizzling 56.7 percent in the first half and led by as many as 12 points before the Mountaineers battled back to tie the game at 66 with 8:59 remaining on Jermaine Haley's floater close to the basket.

Then, a Chase Harler air ball led to Thomas Dziagwa's runout basket and Anei scored a close one to make it 70-66. But a couple of baskets by Haley and Derek Culver turned it into a two-point game with five minutes to go

Two missed free throws by Lindy Waters, a 93.1 percent free throw shooter, opened the door for West Virginia, but the Mountaineers were unable to capitalize.

McCabe couldn't get his shot attempt to go down leading to another Anei basket. Huggins, upset a foul wasn't called on McCabe's miss, was assessed a technical foul leading to Dziagwa's two free throws and a sixpoint Oklahoma State advantage with 4:14 to go.

Two Isaac Likekele free throws with 1:27 remaining pushed the margin to nine.

Haley answered with a 3 and following a Cameron McGriff missed free throw West Virginia could have made it a four-point game, but Culver missed a wide open layup attempt with 57 seconds to go, likely a result of Anei's five blocks.

Likekele was fouled by Lamont West and his two free throws put the game on ice for OSU.

Oklahoma State outscored West Virginia 9-3 over the remaining 2:59. Dziagwa scored 15, McGriff had 14 and Curtis Jones added 13 for the Cowboys.

Culver, Haley and West had 16 each for West Virginia. Culver also matched his season high with 21 rebounds. Freshman forward Emmitt Matthews Jr. added a season-high 13 points.

"The difference in the game for me was their shot blocker," Huggins said. "We had probably 12 points that (Anei) took away from us."

Oklahoma State shot 50 percent for the game (30 of 60) and also made 11-of-24 from 3-point range for 45.8 percent.

West Virginia (12-19, 4-14) shot 44.6 percent overall and was 13-of-28 from 3-point distance for 46.4 percent.

WVU had a 40-32 edge on the glass but turned the ball over 12 times to Oklahoma State's five, four of those coming in rapid-fire succession to begin the second half. The Mountaineers had nine turnovers after intermission.

In 2016. Buddy Hield's half-court shot that would have defeated West Virginia in the Big 12 Tournament semifinals was waved off following an official's review, and this time. Christian James' 3-pointer at the buzzer that would have sent the game into overtime was ruled a 2 when instant replay clearly showed his left foot touching the line.

So instead of overtime, 10th-seeded West Virginia pulled out a 72-71 victory over the seventh-seeded Sooners in the Phillips 66 Championship at the Sprint Center in Kansas City

West Virginia (13-19) led by as many as eight points in the first half before the Sooners used a 10-3 run to take 28-27 lead on Brady Manek's basket with 4:11 remaining.

A couple of Lamont West baskets put WVU back ahead 31-28, but Oklahoma used a 7-2 run to dose out the first half with a 35-33 lead.

It was James again who hit the big shot with eight seconds left to give the Sooners the halftime lead.

Oklahoma expanded its lead to six on Rashard Odomes threepoint play early in the second half, but WVU used an 8-0 run over a three-minute stretch to take a 50-47 lead on Jordan McCabe's 3 with 11:39

Another McCabe 3 put West Virginia ahead 53-49 and a Jermaine Haley baseline drive kept the margin at four with 9:23 remaining. WVU's lead got to six when Maney was called for goal tending on Logan Routt's baseline shot attempt.

But a Kristian Doolittle three-point play with 4:29 left pulled the Sooners to within one, 64-63, where it remained with 2:10 to go when Doolittle made two more free throws.

After Lamont West missed a deep 3-point attempt with the shot clock winding down, freshman guard Brandon Knapper came up with the biggest defensive play of the game when knocked the ball away from Jamal Bienemy. That led to Derek Culver's stick-back basket with 1:02 left to put WVU ahead 72-69.

Twice, Oklahoma had good looks to score and both times its shot attempts didn't go down. Doolittle came up short on an open jumper behind the foul line with 46 seconds to go and Bienemy missed a difficult 3-point try from the wing with 12 seconds remaining.

Haley grabbed Bienemy's miss and was fouled with seven seconds to go. He missed the front end of the one-and-one, opening the door for James to tie it with a 3 at the end.

West led the Mountaineers with 15 points while Haley added 14 and McCabe, after going scoreless in the first half, finished with 12.

#### Notebook

Logan Routt and Andrew Gordon gave West Virginia a big lift off the bench in place of Culver, the duo combining to score 12 points and grab eight rebounds.

The meaningful basketball games will continue for West Virginia. The 10th-seeded Mountaineers pulled off a stunning 79-74 upset victory over regular-season co-champion Texas Tech at the Sprint Center in the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship quarterfinals.

West Virginia beat Texas Tech by playing Bob Huggins style basketball, which means out toughing the guys in the other jerseys.

It was freshman forward Emmitt Matthews Jr., whose 3.9-points-pergame scoring average probably registered just a passing mention on the Texas Tech scouting report. He roasted the Red Raiders to the tune of 28 points, none more emphatic than the two he scored on a thunderous breakaway dunk right in Tarig Owens' face with 35 seconds left in the first

That put an immediate end to Texas Tech's 11-0 run that got it back into the game.

The Red Raiders were playing catchup the entire night after getting down by 17 points with 9:28 to go in the first half. Red Raider coach Chis Beard burned all but one of his timeouts in the first half seeking ways to try and get his team going.

Moments before Matthews' Sports Center-quality dunk, Tech had reduced West Virginia's lead to four, 33-29, on two Owens free throws.

After taking a 38-29 lead into the locker room at halftime, WVU rebuilt its lead to 14, 50-36, on McCabe's foul line jumper with 14:48 to go. It remained at 14 on five straight points from Chase Harler and got to 15 on Matthews' corner 3 with 8:36 to go before Texas Tech began chipping

A Matt Mooney 3 got it to nine with 7:34 remaining, and then Big 12 Player of the Year Jarrett Culver took over. A Culver steal led to a Brandone Francis basket to reduce Tech's deficit to seven with 4:40 to go.

A Culver dunk with 3:06 left made it a one-possession game and his layup a minute later gave the Red Raiders a 69-68 lead.

Derek Culver put West Virginia back in the lead with two free throws with 1:37 remaining and then he was able to retrieve Culver's missed jumper. Culver couldn't get his shot to go down at the other end, but Lamont West grabbed the offensive rebound and was fouled by Francis with 1:04 left

West's offensive rebound was one of 19 offensive rebounds WVU secured against the No. 7 rated college basketball team in the country. He hit both free throws to put West Virginia ahead 72-69.

In addition to Matthews' 28 points, he also grabbed eight rebounds and made a couple of steals. McCabe finished with 13, including a pair of 3s, while Haley added 11 and West finished with 10.

Derek Culver pulled down a team-high 13 rebounds.

#### Notebook

#### Recap

West Virginia's surprising run in the Big 12 Championship ended in the semifinals when third-seeded Kansas ousted the 10th-seeded Mountaineers, 88-74, at the Sprint Center in Kansas City.

Dedric Lawson scored 24 points on 9-of-13 shooting and grabbed eight rebounds to get the Jayhawks back into the championship game.

West Virginia (14-20) was leading 32-25 until Kansas freshman guard Quentin Grimes caught fire from 3-point distance. The Woodlands, Texas, resident went 5-for-5 from behind the arc to key a 23-8 Jayhawk run over the remaining 5:34 to give them a 48-40 halftime lead.

"Grimes got hot at the end of the half," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. "We had our hands down and he just jumped up and shot them in. He was the biggest reason and maybe the only reason for their run. He was very good."

Another 14-2 Kansas spurt early in the second half extended the margin to 18 before it swelled to 23 on Charlie Moore's layup with 8:14 to go. A 10-point WVU flurry made it a 13-point game with 6:05 left, but Kansas answered with six straight points to push the lead back to 19.

In addition to Lawson's 24, Grimes scored 18 before leaving the game with a leg cramps, according to Self.

Devon Dotson added 13 and Marcus Garrett contributed 11 as Kansas shot a sizzling 52.4 percent from the floor, including 40 percent on 8-of-20 from 3-point range.

The Mountaineers got 16 points from junior forward Lamont West and a 14-point, 11-rebound, double-double from freshman forward Derek Culver, his 10th double-double of the season.

Freshman guard Brandon Knapper came off the bench to score 10. Emmitt Matthews Jr., who scored a career-high 28 points in the win over seventh-ranked Texas Tech, was held to just 5 on 2-of-10 shooting. Guards Jordan McCabe and Jermaine Haley also saw their seven game double-digit scoring streaks end.

McCabe finished with 7 on 3-of-7 shooting while Haley had 4 on 2-of-5 shooting.

The Mountaineers, who dominated the glass in their first two tournament wins over Oklahoma and Texas Tech, were out-rebounded by the much fresher Jayhawks 43-33.

WVU was the first No. 10 seed to reach the Big 12 Tournament semifinals since the conference was reduced to 10 teams.

#### Notebook

Kansas has defeated West Virginia all three times the two teams have met in the Big 12 Tournament, the prior two times coming in the championship game. The Jayhawks are now 12-5 against WVU.
