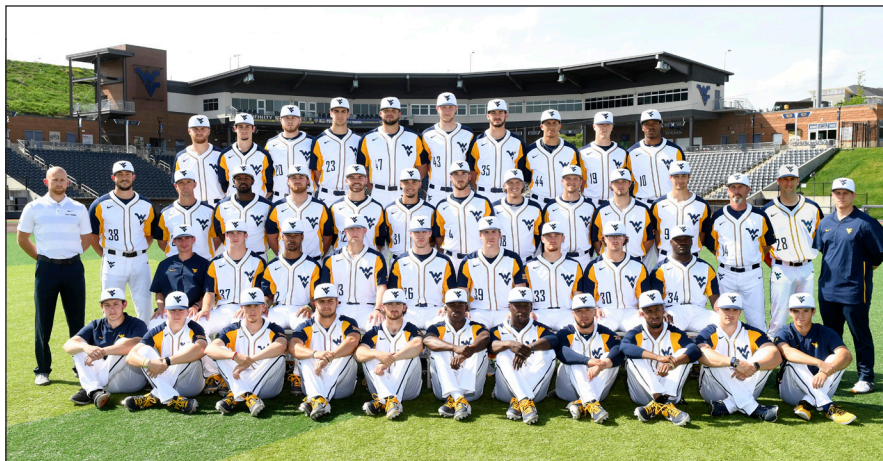

### BY THE NUMBERS

**38** WVU won 38 games in 2019, the second-most in program history and two shy of the record of 40, set in 1994. West Virginia's 13 Big 12 wins also tied a program record, along with its 13-11 league mark.

West Virginia is ranked in the final national polls for the first time since 1982. The Mountaineers, who have been ranked for a program-record **19** eight consecutive weeks, finish the season as high as No. 19 in the NCBWA poll.

A program-record 4,355 fans saw WVU beat Fordham in the NCAA Regional at Monongalia County Ballpark. It marked the third time this season that Mountaineer Nation set a home attendance record. **4,355** In total, 49,299 fans cheered on the Mountaineers at home in 2019, for an average of 1,972, both the highest totals in team history.

The first consensus All-American in team history, junior Alek Manoah is the first player to be named to more than five All-America teams in a single season and the only Mountaineer with more than two first team honors. **1**

## Quick Hits: Key Team Notes

- The 2019 season marked the **127th year of baseball** at West Virginia. Founded in 1892, WVU owns an all-time record of 2,198-1,577-19 and is the second-oldest program in the Big 12.
- West Virginia made its **13th NCAA Championship appearance** in program history and hosted its first regional since 1955. Prior to WVU's NCAA trip in 2017, it last made an NCAA Regional in 1996.
- **Coach Randy Mazey** concludes his seventh season at the helm and owns a 227-176 record in Morgantown. He is the fourth-winningest coach in team history and the fifth to eclipse the 200-win mark. He won his 205th game on March 31, 2019, passing Ira Errett Rodgers (204-209-4 from 1921-42, 1946) for fourth place on the all-time list. Mazey is 414-336-2 in his career, while his 200th Mountaineer win came on March 16, 2019.
- Mazey was named the **Big 12 Coach of the Year and the ABCA East Regional Coach of the Year**. He is the first coach in program history selected as the Big 12 Coach of the Year and the ABCA accolade is his second in three seasons and the fourth ever for a WVU coach.
- The Mountaineers play at **Monongalia County Ballpark, one of the finest facilities in the country** and the newest Big 12 ballpark. WVU is 75-43 (.636) in the venue since it opened in 2015 and holds a .714 winning percentage (60-24) since April 2016. Additionally, 21 of the top 25 home crowds in WVU history have come at Monongalia County Ballpark, which seats 3,500.
- The program **attendance record was broken three times** in 2019, highlighted by a record crowd of 4,355 for the NCAA Regional opener on May 31. That easily beat the previous record of 3,494, set on April 13.
- West Virginia was **38-22 on the season**, 18-7 at home, 17-13 on the road, 10-1 in midweek contests and 9-8 against top-25 teams. West Virginia has won 30 or more games in four of Mazey's seven seasons.
- WVU's **38 wins were its second-most in program history** and two shy of the record of 40, set in 1994.
- West Virginia is ranked in the final national polls, finishing the season as high as No. 19 in the NCBWA poll. **WVU appears in the final rankings for the first time since 1982** and has been ranked in the top-25 a program-record eight consecutive weeks in 2019.
- The Mountaineers were **one of two teams to win six Big 12 series**, their most conference series wins in a single season since winning six Big East series in 2003. WVU's 13 Big 12 wins and 13-11 record was tied for its best Big 12 mark, matching a 13-11 slate in 2013. West Virginia also won five consecutive conference series for the first time since winning six in a row in 2003.
- WVU made the **Big 12 Championship Game** for the second time in four years and is one of two teams to make four consecutive Big 12 semifinals.
- Eight players were selected in the 2019 MLB Draft, led by junior Alek Manoah, the 11th overall pick by the Toronto Blue Jays, **tied for the highest draft pick in program history**. He was joined by senior Ivan Gonzalez (eighth round, Chicago White Sox), junior Nick Snyder (11th round, Arizona Diamondbacks), junior Kade Strowd (12th round, Baltimore Orioles), junior Brandon White (17th round, Los Angeles Angels), senior Darius Hill (20th round, Chicago Cubs), junior Chase Illig (29th round, New York Yankees) and junior Sam Kessler (34th round, Detroit Tigers).
- The **eight draft picks are the most in program history**, eclipsing the six Mountaineers selected in the 2001 and 2014 drafts. There have been 98 draft selection in WVU history since the first draft was held in 1965, and 28 have come in Mazey's seven seasons
- Manoah is the first player in program history to be named to more than five All-America teams in a single season, as he was named to **five All-America first teams** and two second teams. He is the only player in program history with more than two first team honors and has five of WVU's nine total first-team awards. He is the 21st player in team history to be named an All-American, and has seven of WVU's 54 total accolades.
- Manoah was named the **unanimous Big 12 Pitcher of the Year**. Also on the All-Big 12 First Team, he is joined by five Mountaineers on the second team and three honorable mention selections. WVU's 11 total Big 12 accolades are its second-most since joining the league, and the five second team honors are its most.

- Three players were named to the **ABCA/Rawlings East All-Region Team**, as Manoah was named to the first team and Hill and Snyder were recognized on the second team. WVU's three all-region accolades are its most since tallying three in 2014.
- Snyder was named the **Perfect Game National Pitcher of the Week** after he came a strike away from a no hitter in a dominating 16-strikeout, one-hit, no-walk complete game shutout performance on April 30.
- The Mountaineers beat No. 3 Oregon State, 2-0, on March 3, a win that is **tied for WVU's highest-ranked win in program history**. In Corvallis, Oregon, the Mountaineers handed the Beavers, the defending NCAA champions, their first loss of the season.
- With the win at No. 3 OSU, **WVU improved to 3-2 all-time against defending national champions**, with all five games coming on the road.
- Nearly half of the Mountaineers' 52-game regular-season schedule, **24 games, was against teams that made the 2018 NCAA Tournament**. That included nine games against teams that advanced to the 2018 College World Series, with a three-game series at Oregon State, the 2018 national champions, along with a home series against Texas Tech and a road set at Texas. NCAA Tournament teams also included Oklahoma, Canisius and Kent State at home and Baylor, Oklahoma State and Morehead State on the road.
- The Mountaineers played **18 of their first 24 games away from home**, with two of the six home games, Canisius on Feb. 19 and Towson on Feb. 27, added to the schedule the day before and three days before, respectively.
- The added games against Canisius and Towson marked the **earliest home games in program history** and the first-ever February home games.
- WVU's **36-man roster** features five seniors, 11 juniors, five sophomores and 15 freshmen. With several two-way players, four are catchers, 12 are infielders, nine are outfielders and 20 are pitchers. That includes 16 right-handers and four lefties.
- This year's freshman class is the **highest-ranked recruiting class in program history**. The signing class of 15 student-athletes was ranked No. 26 in the nation by Perfect Game, the best in WVU history and the first in the top 30.
- WVU was **picked to finish sixth in the Big 12 Preseason Coaches' Poll**. West Virginia has advanced to three consecutive Big 12 Championship semifinals and has finished fourth in the final standings in three of its first six years in the league.
- A pair of former Mountaineer left-handers **made their Major League debuts last season**, as Harrison Musgrave and John Means were called up by the Colorado Rockies and Baltimore Orioles, respectively.
- With Musgrave and Means' debuts, **24 Mountaineers in program history have played in the big leagues**, and Means and Musgrave are the first players coached by Randy Mazey at WVU to earn an MLB call-up.
- Three Mountaineers are **currently playing on MLB Teams**. Musgrave, with the Rockies, and Means, with the Orioles, are joined by West Virginia native Jedd Gyorko of the St. Louis Cardinals. Gyorko will begin his seventh MLB season in 2019.
- A total of **17 former Mountaineers played professional baseball** last season.

## Plenty of Highlights in Historic 2019 Season

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. (June 27, 2019) – It was a record-breaking season to remember for the West Virginia University baseball team, which finished the 2019 season ranked in the top-25 in each major poll after making its 13th NCAA Championship appearance in program history and hosting an NCAA Regional for the first time since 1955.

In its 127th season, WVU went 38-22 on the season and 13-11 in Big 12 play. West Virginia's 38 regular-season wins were its second-most in program history and two shy of the record of 40, set in 1994. The Mountaineers' Big 12 mark was tied for its best ever, and they made the Big 12 Championship Game for the second time in four seasons.

A record eight players were selected in the MLB Draft, coach Randy Mazey was named the Big 12 Coach of the Year and junior right-hander Alek Manoah, the unanimous Big 12 Pitcher of the Year, was WVU's first consensus first team All-American in program history and the only player to be named to more than five All-America teams in a single season.

West Virginia went 18-7 at Monongalia County Ballpark, as the program attendance record was broken three times in 2019. A crowd of 4,355 watched WVU's NCAA Regional opener on May 31, which easily beat the previous record of 3,494, set on April 13. In total, 49,299 fans cheered on the Mountaineers at home this season, for an average of 1,972, both the highest totals in team history.

## Mountaineers Ranked In Final Polls

West Virginia is in the final national rankings in each major top-25 poll.

- The Mountaineers finish the season as high as No. 19 in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) poll. WVU is No. 20 in the Baseball America top-25, No. 21 in the final D1 Baseball rankings, No. 25 by Perfect Game and No. 27 in the Collegiate Baseball poll.
- The final rankings mark the eighth consecutive week WVU has appeared in the national polls, a program record. West Virginia has been ranked in at least one top-25 poll every week since April 15, and came in as high as No. 13 in the final regular-season rankings.
- West Virginia's No. 13 ranking was its highest since at least 1982, when the Mountaineers finished the season No. 16 in the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper poll. The 1982 season also was the last time WVU appeared in the final season rankings.
- WVU was ranked for more than two weeks in a season for the first time in seventh-year coach Randy Mazey's tenure.
- The Mountaineers' appearance in this week's polls is the 11th time they have been ranked since 1982, with all 11 appearances, eight times in 2019, twice in 2017 and once in 2018, coming under Mazey.
- WVU is one of four Big 12 Conference teams ranked in at least one final national poll.

## Mountaineers in the NCAA Rankings

In the final national statistical rankings, the Mountaineer pitching staff ranked among the best in the country. WVU was No. 4 in the NCAA in hits allowed per nine innings (7.19), No. 8 in strikeouts per nine innings (10.1), No. 11 in shutouts (6), No. 18 in WHIP (1.27) and No. 24 in ERA (3.70), while West Virginia was second in the Big 12 in strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.40). Offensively, the Mountaineers were No. 25 nationally in stolen bases (98) and No. 27 in doubles (119) and third in the Big 12 in sacrifice flies (30).

Individually, junior right-hander Alek Manoah's 144 strikeouts, a school record, ranked No. 6 in the country. He was No. 12 in WHIP (0.90), No. 22 in hits allowed per nine innings (5.90), No. 27 in starts (16), No. 28 in ERA (2.08), No. 29 in strikeouts per nine innings (11.96), No. 33 in wins (9), No. 34 in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.33) and No. 37 in complete games (2).

Junior left-hander Nick Snyder was No. 6 in the NCAA in strikeouts per nine innings (13.63), No. 12 in hits allowed per nine innings (5.56) and No. 33 in wins (9), while he was third in the Big 12 in ERA (2.65).

Senior right fielder Darius Hill ranked No. 4 in the country with 25 doubles, and sophomore second baseman Tyler Doanes was No. 31 with 21. Junior center fielder Brandon White finished No. 37 nationally in stolen bases (26) and third in the conference in sacrifice bunts per game (0.16). Doanes also finished third in the Big 12 in stolen bases (20) and sacrifice flies (6), while junior righty Sam Kessler was No. 3 in saves (8).

## Breaking the Record Books

West Virginia's 38 wins were its second-most in program history and two shy of the record, while its 60 games played are third-most. The Mountaineer pitching staff broke the school record for saves (15) and strikeouts (595) and was second in innings pitched (528.1) and fourth in strikeouts per nine innings (10.10). Offensively, WVU tied the program record for walks (257) and was third in stolen bases (98) and sacrifice flies (30). The defense had 1,585 putouts, second-most all-time.

Individually, Manoah broke the single-season record for strikeouts, with 144, tied the record for starts (16), was No. 3 in innings pitched (108.1) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.33), No. 6 in shutouts (2) and wins (9) and No. 9 in strikeouts per nine innings (11.96). Snyder was No. 5 in strikeouts per nine innings (13.63), No. 6 in wins (9), No. 7 in winning percentage (.900) and No. 10 in strikeouts (103). Kessler was tied for No. 2 in saves (8) and tied for No. 6 in both appearances and relief appearances (24).

Offensively, Hill finished tied for No. 4 in doubles (25) and was No. 8 in extra-base hits (34) and at-bats (238). Doanes tied for No. 4 in sacrifice flies (6), freshman shortstop Tevin Tucker was No. 5 in walks (39) and White was No. 6 in stolen bases (26). Additionally, Hill, Tucker and senior catcher Ivan Gonzalez tied for No. 6 in both games played and starts, with 60, while Doanes was No. 9 in starts and No. 10 in games played, with 59.

Hill's 1,000 fielding percentage tied a program record, and Gonzalez broke the school record for chances (566) and putouts (511) in a season.

## Mazey Honored as He Climbs Up the Wins Chart

The 2019 Big 12 Coach of the Year and ABCA Regional Coach of the Year, Randy Mazey concludes his seventh season at WVU with a 227-176 record.

- Mazey is the fourth-winningest coach in program history and passed Ira Errett Rodgers (204-209-4 from 1921-42, 1946) for fourth place on the all-time wins list on March 31, 2019, with a 5-1 win over No. 19 Oklahoma. Steve Harrick is third on the all-time wins list, with a 333-162-1 mark, from 1948-67.
- Mazey is the first coach in program history to be named the Big 12 Coach of the Year, when he collected the accolade in 2019. It is his third conference Coach of the Year honor.
- The ABCA Regional Coach of the Year award is the second in three seasons for Mazey, who also earned the honor in 2017. It is the fourth time a Mountaineer coach has been recognized as regional coach of the year, while Mazey is the first to collect it more than once.
- Mazey is one of three coaches in program history to lead WVU to multiple NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Mazey became the fifth coach in program history to eclipse the 200-win total on March 16, 2019, with a 9-1 victory at William & Mary.
- After guiding WVU to the NCAA Tournament in 2017, Mazey was named the ABCA East Regional Coach of the Year and the Chuck Tanner College Coach of the Year Award by the Rotary Club of Pittsburgh.
- Mazey joins Errett Rodgers, Harrick, Dale Ramsburgh (1968-94) and Greg Van Zant (1995-2012) with at least 100 wins at WVU. All five also have 200 wins at West Virginia.
- In his career, Mazey is 414-336-2 and earned his 400th win on April 20, 2019.

## Record-Setting Draft Success

West Virginia has experienced unprecedented success in the Major League Baseball Draft in Randy Mazey's tenure, which peaked with a record-breaking eight draft picks in 2019.

- The eight WVU draft picks are the most in program history, eclipsing the six Mountaineers selected in the 2001 and 2014 drafts.
- Junior right-hander Alek Manoah led the way as the 11th overall pick by the Toronto Blue Jays. He is the second Mountaineer to ever be picked in the first round and ties right-hander Chris Enochs for the highest draft pick in program history. Enochs was the 11th overall pick in 1997 by the Oakland Athletics.
- Senior catcher Ivan Gonzalez joined Manoah in the top 10 rounds, as he was picked in the eighth round by the Chicago White Sox. He is the 13th Mountaineer ever picked in the top 10 rounds.
- This year's selections were Manoah, Gonzalez, junior Nick Snyder (11th round, Arizona Diamondbacks), junior Kade Strowd (12th round, Baltimore Orioles), junior Brandon White (17th round, Los Angeles Angels), senior Darius Hill (20th round, Chicago Cubs), junior Chase Illig (29th round, New York Yankees) and junior Sam Kessler (34th round, Detroit Tigers).
- There have been 98 draft selection in WVU history since the first draft was held in 1965, and 28 have come in Mazey's seven seasons.
- At least two players have been drafted in each of Mazey's seven seasons.

### Home Sweet Home

West Virginia plays in one of the premier collegiate baseball venues in the country, Monongalia County Ballpark. With a capacity of 3,500, the ballpark opened in 2015.

- West Virginia owns a 75-43 (.636) record in the venue, which included a 18-7 mark in 2019 and a 60-24 (.714) record since April 17, 2016.
- The WVU attendance record was broken three times in 2019, highlighted by 4,355 fans for the NCAA Regional-opener on May 31. The top five home crowds in program history all came in 2019.
- WVU has experienced record-setting attendance numbers each year, as nearly 200,000 fans have watched the Mountaineers in their new home. That includes more than 30,000 every season.
- The Mountaineers opened Monongalia County Ballpark with a 6-5, 13-inning victory against Butler on April 10, 2015.
- Just beyond the right field fence serves as the everyday home for the Mountaineers, with clubhouse amenities rivaling those in Major League Baseball. The building features a player's locker room, coaches' locker room and offices, player's lounge, team theater, indoor and outdoor batting cages, a fully-equipped athletic training room and equipment room.
- Monongalia County Ballpark was named the BaseballParks.com Ballpark of the Year for 2015. The annual award recognizes a new or remodeled stadium with the best combination of site selection, exterior appearance, architectural design and fan amenities.

### Hill Honored, Rises in WVU Record Books

One of the most consistent players in program history, senior right fielder Darius Hill's career concludes with his name found throughout the Mountaineer record books.

- Hill owns the WVU record for games played and starts (235), at-bats (941) and doubles (79), while he is second in hits (304) and extra-base hits (106), third in total bases (454) and sacrifice flies (15), fourth in runs (176), fifth in triples (10), sixth in RBIs (163) and seventh in fielding percentage (.991).
- Hill's 79 doubles ties the Big 12 record, set by Baylor's Chris Durbin from 2000-03.
- This season, Hill was No. 4 nationally and first in the Big 12 with 25 doubles. He finished tied for No. 4 in program history in doubles (25), tied for No. 6 in games played and starts (60), No. 8 in extra-base hits (34) and tied for No. 8 in at-bats (238). Hill led the team in hits (75), RBIs (41), runs (47) and slugging percentage (.521) and was second in batting average (.315).
- A Dallas native, Hill was recognized on the All-Big 12 Second Team, the Academic All-Big 12 First Team and the Preseason All-Big 12 Team as a senior.
- Hill was named a candidate for the 2019 Senior CLASS Award, which recognizes student-athletes who have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. He is one of 30 baseball players honored and one of three from the Big 12 Conference, the most of any conference.
- Hill was named to the ABCA East All-Region First Team, the All-Big 12 Second Team and the Big 12 All-Tournament Team as a junior in 2018. In 2017, he collected All-Big 12 Honorable Mention accolades and Big 12 All-Tournament Team honors. As a freshman in 2016, Hill was named to five freshman All-America teams, the ABCA East All-Region Second Team, the All-Big 12 Second Team and the Big 12 All-Freshman Team.
- Majoring in management, Hill was named to the Academic All-Big 12 First Team in 2018 and the Academic All-Big 12 Second Team in 2017. He has been recognized on the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll and the Garrett Ford Academic Honor Roll throughout his career. Hill was named to the WVU President's List in the fall of 2018 after he earned a 4.0 GPA.

### Record-Breaking Big 12 Series Wins

West Virginia won six Big 12 series, and five consecutive, over No. 19 Oklahoma (March 29-31), at No. 23 Oklahoma State (April 5-7), vs. No. 11 Texas Tech (April 12-14), against Kansas (April 20-21), at Texas (April 26-28) and at Kansas State (May 10-12).

- The Mountaineers are the only Big 12 team to win six conference series in 2019.
- WVU won six Big 12 series in a season for the first time since it joined the league prior to the 2013 season. Previously, West Virginia won four Big 12 series in 2013, 2014, 2016 and 2017.
- The five consecutive conference series wins were the Mountaineers' most since they won six Big East series in a row in 2003.
- The last time WVU won six conference series in a single season was 2009, when the Mountaineers claimed six Big East series.
- Additionally, WVU's 13 Big 12 wins and 13-11 record is tied for its best Big 12 mark, matching a 13-11 slate in 2013.

### Snyder's Midweek Magic, Near No-No

Junior left-handed starter Nick Snyder turned in one of the most dominating performances in program history in a one-hit, 16-strikeout contest on April 30. He was rewarded with Perfect Game National Pitcher of the Week and WVU Student-Athlete of the Week accolades following the performance.

- In the 2-0 win over Marshall, Snyder took a no hitter into the ninth inning and threw his first career complete game to go along with the one hit allowed, one walk and career-best 16 strikeouts. He allowed just two baserunners, a walk in the third inning and a two-out single in the ninth.
- The one-hitter was the first by a Mountaineer since Zac Cline held Virginia Tech to one hit on May 23, 2003 and the 10th nine-inning one-hitter in team history. Snyder's 16 strikeouts are the most by a WVU hurler since Wes Shaw had 16 on April 8, 1989, against Fairmont State. The 16 strikeouts are tied for eighth-most in program history, and is one of seven 16-strikeout performances in WVU history.
- In the regular season, Snyder had a team-high eight wins, while the Mountaineers were 10-0 in his starts. In those starts, he recorded a 1.20 ERA with 27 hits and eight earned runs allowed in 52.2 innings pitched. He has 83 strikeouts and 23 walks.
- On the season, in 16 total appearances and 13 starts, Snyder ranked No. 6 in the NCAA in strikeouts per nine innings (13.63), No. 12 in hits allowed per nine innings (5.56) and No. 33 in wins (9), while he was third in the Big 12 in ERA (2.65).

The 2019 NCAA Morgantown Regional marked West Virginia's 13th NCAA appearance in team history and second since 2017. The Mountaineers are 11-26 all-time in NCAA play, and advanced to the regional finals three times, in 1961, 1982 and 2017.

WVU is 2-4 at home, and hosted the 1955 District III Championship, a best-of-three series against Wake Forest, in addition to the 2019 NCAA Regional. The 1955 event marked the first NCAA appearance in program history.

The Mountaineers are 1-0 against the Atlantic 10, 2-7 vs. the SEC and 1-12 against the ACC.

West Virginia went 1-2 in 2019 at Monongalia County Ballpark. Hosting a Regional for the second time in program history, the Mountaineers opened play with a 6-2 victory over Fordham in front of a program-record 4,355 fans. WVU lost its next two games, 4-0 to Duke, the eventual regional champion, and 11-10 to Texas A&M.

WVU made its first NCAA appearance in 1955, when it hosted Wake Forest in the District III Playoffs. West Virginia lost the best-of-three series, 2-1, as the Demon Deacons advanced to the College World Series and won the national title. The Mountaineers' first NCAA win came on May 30, 9-7.

West Virginia reached the NCAA Tournament five times in the 1960s, and played in the District 3 Playoffs in Gastonia, North Carolina, each time. WVU made the postseason in four consecutive seasons beginning in 1961. The Mountaineers' wins in the stretch came in 1961, 4-3 against Florida State, and 1963, a 2-1 win against Auburn.

After a postseason appearance in 1967, WVU would not return until 1982. West Virginia traveled to the East Regional in Columbia, South Carolina, where it went 2-2. The Mountaineers won back-to-back games, 7-6 in 10 innings against Old Dominion, before a 4-1 win against East Carolina. WVU also made the Tournament in 1985 and 1987, going 0-2 both years.

The Mountaineers went 1-2 in 1994, with a 19-7 win against Rider in Miami.

In 1996, West Virginia opened play in Clemson, South Carolina, with an 8-2 upset win over second-seeded Tennessee. A 9-4 win over Georgia Southern followed to send WVU to the regional semifinals, but the Mountaineers lost their next two games.

In 2017, WVU reached the regional final thanks to a pair of victories over third-seeded Maryland, 9-1 in the opener and 8-5 in an elimination contest. However, Wake Forest edged WVU twice, 4-3 and 12-8.

Prior to regional play, West Virginia played Lafayette in a play-in game in 1948, though the game is not recognized in the NCAA's postseason record book. Lafayette won, 8-0, and advanced to the NCAA Finals.

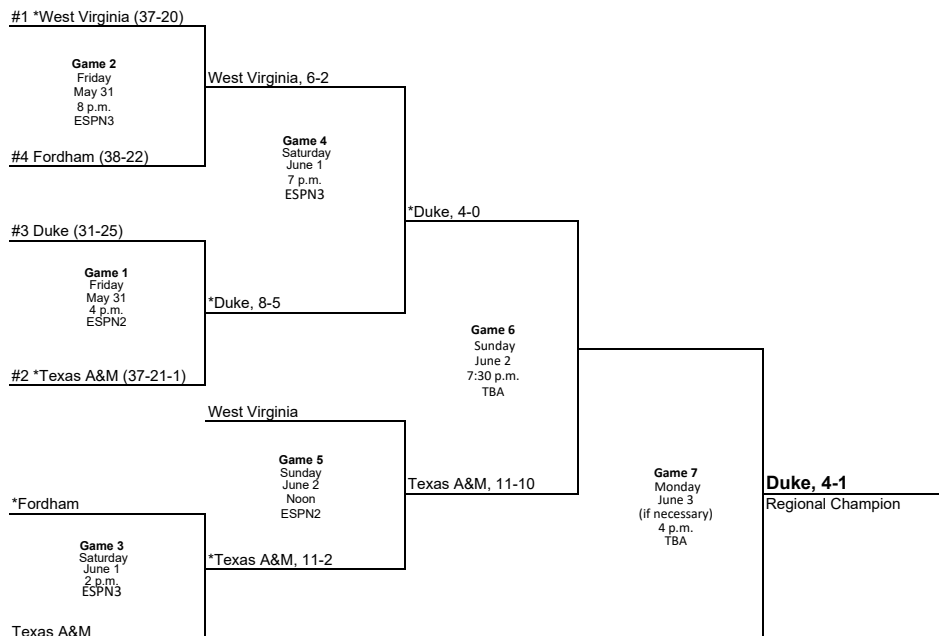

## Alek Manoah's Game-by-Game Breakdown

### at Kennesaw State - February 15 (No Decision)

On Opening Day, Manoah struck out a then-career-best 13 batters, which nearly doubled his previous career high of seven. He threw 78 pitches, 58 for strikes. Manoah struck out three batters in an inning twice and had two strikeouts in a frame three times. He also escaped a bases-loaded, no-out jam in the third inning.

### at Georgia Southern - February 22 (Win)

Manoah allowed one unearned run on two hits with eight strikeouts, second-most in his career at the time and two walks in 6.1 innings. He held GSU hitless through 4.2 innings and did not allow a runner to reach second base while on the mound.

### at No. 3 Oregon State - March 1 (Loss)

Manoah suffered his first loss of the season at No. 3 Oregon State. Against the defending national champions, he allowed seven runs, four earned, on four hits with three strikeouts and three walks in 2.0 innings. All seven runs and four hits came in the second inning, with one error.

### Kent State - March 9 (Win)

In 7.2 innings, Manoah struck out 12 batters and allowed two runs on five hits. He struck out the side in the sixth and seventh innings and added two strikeouts in the third and fifth. From the fourth through seventh innings, Manoah struck out nine of the 10 batters he faced.

### at William & Mary - March 16 (Win)

Manoah allowed one unearned run on four hits with nine strikeouts and three walks in 7.0 innings, and William & Mary's first hit did not come until the fifth inning. He struck out the side in the first inning, struck out two more in the fourth and got a key strikeout to end the fifth inning with two runners in scoring position.

### at Baylor - March 22 (No Decision)

In WVU's Big 12 opener, Manoah allowed five runs on eight hits with six strikeouts and two walks in 7.1 innings pitched. He faced the minimum three batters in the third, fourth and fifth innings.

### No. 19 Oklahoma - March 29 (Loss)

Manoah had another quality start but suffered his second loss of the season after he allowed two runs, both in the second inning, on three hits with three strikeouts and four walks in 7.1 innings. He escaped a jam in the fourth, after an error and a double put two on with one out.

### at No. 23 Oklahoma State - April 5 (Win)

Manoah struck out 11 and did not walk a batter in 8.0 shutout innings to help the Mountaineers beat No. 23 Oklahoma State. He held the Cowboys to three hits in a then-career-long outing. Manoah retired the side in order five times and limited OSU to just three baserunners, only one of which advance to second base, in the eighth.

### No. 11 Texas Tech - April 12 (Win)

In his first career complete game, Manoah struck out a career-best 15 batters in a shutout performance against No. 11 Texas Tech. He held the Red Raiders to four hits with no walks. Manoah did not allow a baserunner until the fourth inning and allowed a runner to reach second base just once. Manoah had three strikeouts in the third and eighth innings, had two punchouts in an inning three times and retired the side in order five times.

### Kansas - April 19 (Win)

Manoah became the first player in program history to strike out 15 batters in a complete game shutout in back-to-back games, and it was his third consecutive scoreless outing. Manoah gave up just three hits and again did not walk a batter. He struck out two batters in an inning four times, struck out three in the first and had at least one strikeout in every inning. Manoah retired 12 in a row beginning in the second and notched four perfect 1-2-3 innings. In a 0-0 game in the ninth, he worked his way out of a two-on, no-out jam to keep his shutout streak intact and allow WVU to walk off in the bottom half.

### at Texas - April 26 (No Decision)

Manoah earned his ninth quality start and held Texas to one run on seven hits with eight strikeouts and two walks in 7.0 innings. With the one run allowed, in the third inning, Manoah's shutout streak was snapped at 34.1 consecutive innings, and he walked his first batter in 28.1 consecutive innings. While he was not as dominant as he was in his last three shutout outings, Manoah battled on the road to escape several key jams to allow the Mountaineer offense to rally late. His first strikeout did not come until the third, and he proceeded to add eight more on the night.

### TCU - May 3 (Loss)

Manoah suffered his third loss of the season and just his third non-quality start in 12 starts. In 6.0 innings, he allowed five runs, four earned, on eight hits with five strikeouts and four walks. He gave up runs in the fourth and fifth, two in the sixth and one in the seventh.

### at Kansas State - May 10 (Win)

Manoah had another dominant start and collected his 11th quality start in 14 starts. In 8.0 shutout innings, he allowed three hits with one walk and 13 strikeouts on 102 pitches. He struck out two batters in an inning five times and had five 1-2-3 innings. Manoah allowed a baserunner to reach second base just once in the win.

### George Washington - May 16 (Win)

Manoah broke the single-season strikeout record, with 125, with four strikeouts in 3.2 innings. On a pitch count that saw him exit the game to a standing ovation after 56 pitches, he allowed a run on four hits with no walks.

### vs. No. 7 Texas Tech - May 23, Big 12 Championship (Win)

Manoah turned in another fantastic start against the Big 12's best offense and held No. 7 Texas Tech to one run on four hits with 10 strikeouts and a walk in 8.0 innings. The outing was his seventh double-digit strikeout performance and 11th quality start in 15 starts. While the leadoff batter reached in five of the first six innings, TTU was hitless in eight at-bats with runners in scoring position.

### vs. Duke - June 1, NCAA Regional (Loss)

In a winner's bracket contest against the eventual regional champion, Manoah allowed four runs, two in the first and two in the third, in 6.0 innings. He gave up four hits with nine strikeouts and four walks. In his final appearance of the season, Manoah did not allow a hit after the third inning and struck out three consecutive batters to end the sixth after the first two runners reached base.

A then-WVU-record 3,487 fans watched West Virginia score the go-ahead run in the eighth inning to beat Pitt, 5-4, in the Backyard Brawl on April 3, at Monongalia County Ballpark.

- In front of the largest crowd to ever watch a WVU home game at the time, the Mountaineers regained a 5-4 lead in the eighth inning on a sacrifice fly by junior first baseman Kevin Brophy after the Panthers tied the game with a three-run sixth inning. WVU scored four runs in the bottom of the second inning to take a 4-1 lead, which included a two-run home run by Brophy.
- In the oldest and most-played rivalry in program history, West Virginia has won five in a row against Pitt and 10 of the last 13 meetings. With the win, WVU increased its lead in the all-time series to 107-88.

### Three Consecutive Top-25 Series Wins

WVU won three consecutive Big 12 series against top-25 opponents, vs. No. 19 Oklahoma from March 29-31, at No. 23 Oklahoma State from April 5-7 and against No. 11 Texas Tech from April 12-14.

- West Virginia lost the opener to the Sooners, 2-1 on March 29, as both teams had five hits. OU scored two in the second and WVU one in the sixth. Junior right-hander Alek Manoah allowed two runs on three hits in 7.1 innings.
- WVU evened the series the next day with a 12-4 win, as the Mountaineers scored the go-ahead run in the seventh and added an eight-run eighth. West Virginia took a 1-0 lead in the first inning, and led 3-0 after four, but OU rallied to tie the game in the sixth.
- WVU jumped out to an early lead and never trailed for the second consecutive day to win the series, 5-1 on March 31. Junior right-handed starter Kade Strowd earned the win and allowed a run on three hits in 5.0 innings, while junior first baseman Marques Inman hit a two-run home run.
- West Virginia opened the series at No. 23 OSU with an 11-1 win on April 5, as Manoah struck out 11 with no walks and three hits allowed in 8.0 shutout innings. WVU scored at least one run in each of the first five innings and totaled 17 hits, led by Inman's four hits and four RBIs.
- OSU evened the series on April 6 with a 9-5 win. WVU led 5-0 after four innings, but OSU rallied with one in the fifth, three in the sixth and five in the eighth. Sophomore lefty Jackson Wolf allowed four runs, one earned, in 7.0 innings.
- West Virginia won the series with a 4-2, comeback win on April 7. WVU erased an early 2-1 deficit with two runs in the eighth inning and added an insurance run in the ninth. Strowd earned the win and had a season-high 10 strikeouts in a career-best 7.1 innings. He held OSU to two runs on four hits.
- Manoah tossed a four-hit, complete-game shutout with a career-high 15 strikeouts and no walks to lead WVU to a series-opening, 2-0 victory on April 12 against No. 11 TTU. Both runs came with two outs, on RBI singles by Inman in the first inning and sophomore designated hitter Paul McIntosh in the third.
- A walk-off walk lifted West Virginia to the series win the next day, with a 4-3 victory in front of 3,494 fans, then the largest home crowd in program history. Inman drew a four-pitch walk in the bottom of the ninth inning to bring in the winning run. WVU took a 2-0 lead in the first, but TTU rallied to take a 3-2 lead in the fifth before West Virginia answered in the bottom of the fifth to tie it at 3-3. Inman and senior third baseman Ivan Gonzalez each had two hits and two RBIs in the win, while four pitchers held Tech to three runs on nine hits.
- West Virginia was shut out in the series, finale on April 14, 3-0. WVU was held to two hits as the Red Raiders scored two in the fifth and one in the eighth.

## WVU Upsets No. 3 Oregon State

West Virginia traveled to No. 3 Oregon State, the defending NCAA champions, from March 1-3, and won the finale on March 3, 2-0.

- The 2-0 upset win is tied for the highest-ranked win in program history. The Mountaineers also beat No. 3 TCU twice at home on April 14-16, 2017.
- West Virginia faced the defending national champions for the second time in program history and is 3-2 all-time against teams the year after they won the NCAA title. In 2017, WVU went 2-0 at Coastal Carolina, the reigning champions.
- A strong start by right-hander Kade Strowd and a pair of second-inning home runs by first baseman Kevin Brophy and left fielder Paul McIntosh fueled WVU in the win. Strowd took a no hitter into the seventh inning and held Oregon State to one hit with five strikeouts. In 6.1 innings, he struck out five with nine walks, but five double plays, including four inning-enders, helped him shut out OSU. Strowd earned the win and righty Sam Kessler collected the save with 2.0 shutout innings. On March 4, Strowd was named the Big 12 Pitcher of the Week.
- West Virginia opened the series with a 9-2 loss on March 1, and the Beavers won Saturday's contest, 4-2.

- The class features Ryan Bergert, Drew Britt, Alec Burns, Austin Davis, Phillip Dull, Brock Helverson, Madison Jeffrey, Gabe Kurtzhals, Jeremy Lapp-Barger, Beau Lowery, Paul McIntosh, Zach Ottinger, Daniel Ouderkirk, JJ Sousa and Tevin Tucker.
- McIntosh comes to West Virginia from Motlow State CC, and he was drafted by the Los Angeles Angels in the 34th round of the 2018 MLB Draft.
- Additionally, WVU's 2019 signing class is ranked No. 38 by Perfect Game, the second-best in WVU history and the second ever ranked in the top 40.

## WVU Sixth in Big 12 Preseason Poll

WVU was voted to finish sixth in the 2019 Big 12 preseason coaches' poll.

- West Virginia is one of two teams to make three consecutive Big 12 Championship semifinal appearances.
- The Mountaineers have finished in the top four in the final Big 12 standings in three of their first six seasons in the league.
- Despite its early success since joining the conference, West Virginia has never been voted better than fifth in the preseason poll.
