No. 24 West Virginia Begins Big 12 Conference Play at Kansas State

- WVU is 6-4 in Big 12 openers. This will be the eighth time in 11 years WVU has opened league play on the road.
- WVU has not played a game on New Year's Eve since defeating James Madison in Charleston in 1999.
- The Mountaineers broke into the rankings this season on Dec. 26 with a No. 24 ranking.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 130 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 43 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- In the latest NET rankings, the Mountaineers are ranked 11th.
- WVU ranks No. 21 in the latest Kenpom rankings -- 42nd in defensive efficiency and 21st in offensive efficiency.
- West Virginia has shot 50 percent or higher in three of its last four games and in six of the first 12 this year, matching the total of all of last season in 33 games.
- WVU is averaging 81.3 points per game, the second highest of any Bob Huggins team at WVU. His top team at West Virginia was the 2017 squad that averaged 81.5 points per game and won 28 games.
- In the latest NCAA stats, WVU ranks 29th in scoring offense, 27th in FG%, 35th in 3FG%, 30th in free throws made per game and 37th in turnovers forced per game.
- Bob Huggins was enshrined into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in September 2022.
- With a win against Portland State on Nov. 25, Bob Huggins moved past Jim Calhoun (920) into third place all-time in Division I victories. Bob Huggins' record now stands at 926-401 in his 41st season as a head coach.
- Huggins is the second-winningest active coach behind Jim Boeheim.
- Huggins has coached 1,327 career games, the fifth-most games coached all-time by a Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim, Jim Phelan and Cliff Ellis.
- On Jan. 4, 2021 at Oklahoma State, Bob Huggins recorded his 300th career victory at his alma mater. Only Gale Catlett (1979-2002) has won more games at WVU with 439. Huggins now has 336 victories at West Virginia.
- Huggins became just the second coach to win at least 300 games at two different Division I schools (WVU - 336 and Cincinnati - 399), joining Roy Williams (Kansas - 418 and North Carolina - 485).
- In his 41st season as a head coach, Huggins became the 17th Division I head coach all-time to coach 41 or more years.
- Huggins is one of 49 Division I coaches who are coaching at their alma maters this season.
- WVU is 250-74 in its last 324 games against unranked teams, including winners of 136 of its last 159 at home.
- WVU is 75-68 in the Big 12 regular season in the last eight seasons.
- West Virginia is 144-125 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games (Big 12 and Big East).
- Bob Huggins is 100-95 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 90-89 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- Huggins has posted 55 conference road victories at WVU, including six in 2020-21, two in 2019-20, four in 2017-18, five Big 12 road wins in 2016-17, six Big 12 road wins in 2015-16 and four Big 12 road wins in 2014-15.
- West Virginia returned five players from last year's team. Those five combined to play in 95 games last season with a total average of 9.1 points per game. However, the Mountaineers added six players with previous Division I experience. Entering the 2022-23 season, those six players have played in 479 career games with 319 starts, scoring 3,805 points and grabbing 1,716 rebounds.
- Emmitt Matthews Jr. returned to WVU after playing last season at Washington. He is believed to be just the second Mountaineer player to start his career at WVU, transfer to another school, then finish his career in Morgantown. Levi Phillips played at WVU in 1971-72, transferred to Oklahoma State in 1973 and finished at WVU in 1974.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better 98 times under Bob Huggins (526 games).
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 774 consecutive games.
- The Mountaineers have won 132 of their last 145 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU has won 143 of its last 157 and 199 of its last 223 games when holding opponents to less than 69 points.
- WVU is 254-42 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- West Virginia is 88-7 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 266-57 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 271-35 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 234-18 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 251-65 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 248-71 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- West Virginia is 186-99 (.645) since the start of the 2014-15 season.
- West Virginia is 6-2 all-time in games played on Dec. 31.
- West Virginia is 416-165 in games played in the month of December.

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Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins was enshrined into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2022.
- Huggins has won 926 games in his 41st season as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks second in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks third among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 34 of 40 seasons, including 25 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but nine of his 40 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.7 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- He has been named national coach of the year six times.
- Huggins has coached 14 All-Americans and 77 all-conference selections.
- Huggins has coached 20 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins has led WVU to 10 NCAA Tournaments.

Scouting Kansas State

- Kansas State is 11-1 overall following a 73-65 win over Radford on Dec. 21.
- The Wildcats have won five in a row since a 76-64 loss at Butler on Nov. 30.
- Jerome Tang, a former assistant at Baylor, is in his first season as head coach at Kansas State.

Series Record

- West Virginia and Kansas State will be meeting for the 25th time in series play that began in 1949. WVU leads 15-9.
- The first meeting took place in Morgantown on Dec. 12, 1949, with the Wildcats coming away with a 49-44 victory.
- WVU has won five of the last six in the series, including two of three last season. WVU won 71-68 in Morgantown and 73-67 in the opening round of the Big 12 Championship. K-State won in Manhattan, 78-73, on Feb. 14.
- The Mountaineers have won 14 of the last 19 meetings in the series.
- West Virginia is 14-8 against the Wildcats since the Mountaineers joined the Big 12 in 2012.
- The Mountaineers are 4-6 against K-State in Bramlage Coliseum, winning in four of its last eight visits.
- Bob Huggins is 15-9 against his former team (15-8 at WVU). His Akron team fell to the Wildcats, 70-68, on Dec. 10, 1988.
- Bob Huggins led K-State to a 21-12 record in 2006-07, the Wildcats' most wins in 19 years. K-State broke an eight-season postseason drought when Huggins led the Wildcats to the NIT Second Round. The Wildcats also collected 10 Big 12 wins for the first time since the league's inception in 1997.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 114th season and 120th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,837-1,139 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 20th in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 30 NCAA berths, 16 NIT trips and one CBI bid since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 24 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 13 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Under Huggins, Derek Culver was named to the Lute Olson All-American team in 2021, Jevon Carter was named to the John Wooden, Lute Olson and Senior CLASS All-America teams in 2018. Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, DaSean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden & *Basketball Times* and Kevin Jones earned All-America honors in 2012 by John Wooden.

Winning Nonconference Mark

- West Virginia has posted a winning nonconference mark for the 31st consecutive season.
- West Virginia is 192-46 against nonconference teams in regular season games in the last 19 seasons.
- The last time WVU did not post a winning non-league record was 1990-91, when WVU went 4-4 outside of conference.
- WVU is 161-40 in nonconference games under Bob Huggins.
- WVU has finished with one loss during nonconference play in nine different seasons. They were: 1981-82 when West Virginia went 11-1 out of the Atlantic 10, 1957-58 when WVU lost only to Duke in going 11-1, 1996-97 when the Mountaineers were 7-1, losing the season opener at Minnesota, 2004-05 when WVU went 10-1 outside the Big East, 2006-07 when the Mountaineers went 12-1 with their only loss to Arkansas, 2009-10 when WVU was 11-1 with its only loss at Purdue, 2014-15 when the Mountaineers had a one point home loss to LSU, finishing 12-1, in 2016-17 when WVU finished 12-1 with a four-point loss to Temple in Brooklyn and in 2019-20 (12-1) with a two-point loss at St. John's.
- WVU has had one perfect nonconference regular season, 10-0, in 1997-98.

- Huggins was the only collegiate coach to be enshrined in the 2022 class.

Academic Success

- Fifty-three of the last 54 seniors on the WVU men's basketball team have graduated on time or early since 2004.
- Of the returning players, Kobe Johnson and James Okonkwo were named to the Academic All-Big 12 Rookie Team in 2021-22.
- In 2017-18, Jevon Carter was named CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year for men's basketball and first team Academic All-American.
- In 2010, 2011, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020, WVU men's basketball also was recognized nationally for ranking in the top 10 percent nationally among men's basketball programs for the Academic Progress Rate (APR).

Recap

Emmitt Matthews Jr.'s 15 points and seven rebounds helped West Virginia to a 76-58 victory over pesky Mount St. Mary's at the WVU Coliseum in the 2022-23 season opener.

Matthews, who spent one year at Washington after three seasons at WVU, made six of his 10 field goal attempts, including a couple of pretty fastbreak dunks.

Texas transfer Tre Mitchell came off the bench to contribute 13 points in just 14 minutes of action, while South Carolina transfer Erik Stevenson chipped in with 10. Stevenson got eight of of those in the second half after spending most of the first half on the bench in foul trouble.

Mohamed Wague just missed a double-double with nine points and nine rebounds. He also blocked two shot and made a couple of steals.

"I'm not happy with the way we guarded and not very happy with the way we rebounded, and we've got to stop turning the ball over," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins, who collected his 917th career victory to move him to within three of tying Jim Calhoun for third on the NCAA's all-time wins list.

The Mount's Jalen Benjamin led all scorers with 18, but he had to work for all of them making four of 13 from the floor. The 3-ball kept Mount St. Mary's hanging around, particularly in the second half when it connected on six of nine from behind the arc.

West Virginia had a 45 to 28 edge on the glass and connected on 14 of its 19 free throw attempts, compared to just 12 of 22 for the Mount.

The Mountaineers led 30-18 at halftime.

WVU, which struggled mightily scoring dose to the basket, had a 32 to 10 advantage in points in the paint tonight. Other specialty stats in West Virginia's favor: bench scoring (40-10), fast break points (15-3), second chance points (17-9) and points off turnovers (19-9).

West Virginia led for 35:30 with two lead changes and two ties. Ten of the 11 players who saw action got into the scoring column.

The Mountaineers committed 18 turnovers and only took two more shot attempts than Mount St. Mary's.

Dakota Leffew joined Benjamin in double figures for The Mount with 12.

This was the sixth time Mount St. Mary's has played in Morgantown and it has lost all six of those decisions. It is the fourth time the two teams have opened the season, also doing so in 2006, 2013 and 2016.

The attendance was 9,960.

November 7 was the earliest date in school history that West Virginia tipped off a men's basketball season.

West Virginia improved to 98-16 all-time in season openers, including a 104-10 record in home openers.

Recap

Joe Toussaint's 18 points led four double-digit scorers in West Virginia's 81-56 victory over Pitt at the Petersen Events Center in Pittsburgh.

The victory was the Mountaineers' sixth straight since the series was resumed in 2017 and represents the longest winning streak since claiming nine in a row from 1964 to 1968.

Toussaint, an Iowa transfer, had a big-boy line score for the victorious Mountaineers with five assists, four rebounds and two steals to go with his game-high 18 points. He was 5 of 11 from the floor and 7 of 9 from the free throw line.

South Carolina transfer Erik Stevenson contributed 16 points on 7-of-12 shooting, emerging sophomore forward Mohamed Wague tallied 11 on 5-of-5 shooting and Emmitt Matthews Jr. chipped in with 10.

The Mountaineers made a sizzling nine of their first 10 shots and finished shooting 52.6% from the floor, converting 30 of 57, including 8 of 21 from 3-point distance. WVU hit 4-of-12 from behind the arc in the second half when Pitt played primarily zone defense.

The Panthers had an early 15-10 lead before West Virginia took control of the game late in the first half when the Mountaineers outscored the Panthers 16-6 over the remaining 4:54 to lead 47-36 at the break.

Pitt (1-1) dosed its deficit to nine points on the opening possession of the second half, but WVU immediately answered with Kedrian Johnson's 3. WVU's margin got to 15 on Seth Wilson's 3 with 6:41 left and then quickly to 21 on Matthews' triple two minutes later. After Nelly Cummings' basket with 9:03 to go, Pitt converted only one more field goal for the remainder of the game.

West Virginia's 25-point victory was its largest against the Panthers since Jan. 17, 1968, when Huggins was a high school freshman.

Ten WVU players logged eight or more minutes and all 10 got into the scoring column. The Mountaineers had a 42-10 advantage in bench scoring and outscored Pitt 36-22 in the paint.

Jamarius Burton led Pitt with 16 and Greg Elliot added 12. Forward John Hugley, who scored 17 in last year's loss in Morgantown, sat on Pitt's bench in street clothes after missing his second straight game because of a preseason knee injury.

West Virginia boosted its overall series record to 101-88 and is improves to 38-56 in Pittsburgh and 5-7 in games played at the Petersen Events Center.

A crowd of 10,827 attended the game but dwindled to mostly West Virginia fans at its conclusion.

Recap

Hall of Fame coach Bob Huggins tied Jim Calhoun for third place on the NCAA Division I men's basketball wins list with his 920th victory following the 92-58 triumph over Penn at the WVU Coliseum.

The Ivy League preseason favorite was making its first WVU Coliseum appearance since the 1981 National Invitation Tournament.

West Virginia used some torrid outside shooting to build a 52-31 halftime lead. Guard Erik Stevenson made his first eight shots and finished the game 8-of-9 from the floor to tally a game-best 21 points. The senior hit all four of his 3-point tries.

"Erik had a really good day shooting the ball," Huggins said. "He got the kind of shots he's really good at making."

Tre Mitchell scored all 11 of his points in the first half while Kedrian Johnson and Joe Toussaint also chipped in with 11 each.

West Virginia (4-0) was 30-of-54 from the floor for 55.6% and 12-of-23 from 3-point distance for 52.2%.

"We had the right guys shooting it and that helps," Huggins said. "We didn't shoot it as well when James (Okonkwo) was shooting it from the corner as when Tre was shooting them from the corner. That's the key thing getting the right guys shooting the ball."

WVU forced Penn into committing 18 turnovers resulting in 21 points. West Virginia's bench outscored the Quakers' 36 to 13.

The Mountaineers' largest lead was 34 points with 14 seconds remaining. Every player who dressed got into the game and everyone got into the scoring column. During one play midway through the second half, a hustling Mohamed Wague dove on the floor for a loose basketball with West Virginia leading by 24 points and showed its appreciation with a loud ovation.

West Virginia's two point guards Kedrian Johnson and Joe Toussaint combined for eight assists and no turnovers.

"I think they're starting to realize how important it is and starting to realize how important they can be in what we do," Huggins said. "It's going to be a continual climb and it's going to get harder and harder, and we've got to get better and better."

The only negative stat for West Virginia was Penn's 38 to 29 advantage on the glass.

Guard Clark Slajchert led Penn with 20 points on 7-of-17 shooting. Forward Max Martz chipped in with 10. The Quakers shot only 35% from the floor including 29.2% from 3.

The announced attendance was 9,875.

Recap

West Virginia used some smothering defense to overwhelm Florida 84-55 in its final game of the Phil Knight Legacy Tournament played at the Chiles Center in Portland, Oregon.

The Gators led briefly 8-7 before the Mountaineers put on a blitz that saw them make runs of 10-0 in the first half and then 16-0 early in the second half to take complete control of the game.

“Obviously, I thought we played really well,” West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. “In the first half we got a little loose, but I think by and large we played pretty well.”

WVU’s 16-0 run spanned nearly four minutes early in the second half and turned a 10-point game into a blowout. The Mountaineers’ largest lead was 31 points, 79-48, with 2:38 left. All 14 players who dressed got into the game and 11 got into the scoring column.

Forward Tre Mitchell led a balanced Mountaineer attack with 17 points, followed by Erik Stevenson’s 15 and Emmitt Matthews Jr.’s 13.

WVU shot 50% in the second half to outscore the Gators 43-22 after intermission.

Florida’s leading scorer, Colin Castleton, who came into the contest averaging 20.7 points per game, got into early foul trouble and finished the night scoring just 3 points on 1-of-6 shooting. The Gators’ other big scorer, guard Will Richard, tallied 8, which was six below his season average.

Florida (4-3) shot just 34.5% from the floor and 11.8% from 3-point range, the Gators missing 15 of their 17 tries from behind the arc.

West Virginia (6-1) also had its best performance of the season on the glass by outrebounding Florida 49 to 28. Forward Mohamed Wague was one rebound and two points shy of a double-double, the sophomore matching his season high with nine boards to go with 8 points. Mitchell grabbed eight rebounds and Stevenson hauled in seven.

“Rebounding has got to continue to get better and we’ve got to take better care of the ball,” Huggins said.

West Virginia scored 20 points off Florida’s 14 turnovers and converted 7 of its 17 attempts from behind the arc.

Overall, the Mountaineers shot 43.3% from the floor for the game. It was West Virginia’s first win over the Gators since 2002 in Charleston when John Beilein was in his first season coaching the Mountaineers. The game was played in the Capital City as a homecoming for Florida guard Brett Nelson.

The victory was for fifth-place bragging rights in this loaded tournament, won by 24th-ranked Purdue over eighth-ranked Duke, 75-56. The Boilermakers, which knocked off West Virginia, 80-68, also defeated sixth-ranked Gonzaga by 18 points.

Recap

Xavier shot 62.5% in the second half to outgun West Virginia 84-74 in a Big 12-Big East Battle at the Cintas Center in Cincinnati, Ohio.

West Virginia led for a good portion of the game, including an 11-point advantage with 2:42 left in the first half.

But it was a tale of two halves for the Mountaineers, now 6-2. WVU shot 53.6% in the first half, including 7-of-9 from 3-point distance with two of those triples by Emmitt Matthews Jr. and Seth Wilson going in off the glass.

The good fortune West Virginia enjoyed in the first half evaporated during the game’s final six minutes when it made just one of its final 12 field goal attempts, that coming on Joe Toussaint’s layup with 4:26 to go to reduce Xavier’s lead to 73-72.

“I thought we were a totally different team in the second half, for whatever reason,” West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. “We had guys in foul trouble and you’ve got to take them out when they get three fouls that early in the game and they didn’t respond the way that you would hope that they would when they got back in.”

Jimmy Bell Jr., Toussaint and Tre Mitchell finished the game with four fouls each while Matthews Jr. and Erik Stevenson had three fouls.

The Musketeers made 28 of their 52 field goal attempts for 53.8% and doubled up the Mountaineers at the free throw line taking 30 free throws to West Virginia’s 15.

Xavier converted 23 of theirs while West Virginia cashed in on 11 with a couple of critical misses in the second half on the front end of one-and-ones.

Souley Boum led the way for the Musketeers with 23 points on 5-of-8 shooting from the floor and 11-of-14 from the line.

Seven-foot center Jack Nunge contributed 17 points and a game-high 14 rebounds, while Colby Jones tallied 14 points and Adam Kunkel chipped in with 11.

“They made some 3s and drove it at the rim and got fouled,” Huggins said. “They’re making three-point plays while we’re giving away two-point plays.”

Xavier beat West Virginia 34-28 on the glass and actually outscored the Mountaineers 17-9 on turnovers despite committing three more miscues than WVU.

Xavier had the edge in second-half points, 14-6, as well as points in the paint, 42-32.

Stevenson led WVU with 16 points, but only two of those came after intermission. Bell Jr. tallied a season-high 12 points, making all five of his field goal attempts, while Matthews Jr. tossed in 12.

Recap

West Virginia shot 50% from the floor and doubled up UAB at the free throw line to pull out an 81-70 victory before 12,182 at the WVU Coliseum.

In a tough, physical, entertaining game that more closely resembled a January conference affair, the two teams combined for 44 fouls leading to 43 free throws.
West Virginia cashed in on 22 of its 25 attempts while UAB was just 11 of 18.

The Mountaineers built a 40-31 halftime lead and led 42-31 after their opening possession of the second half before going ice cold. WVU went more than six minutes without a field goal and that allowed the Blazers to take a 47-45 lead on Ladarius Brewer's layup.

West Virginia's next eight points came from the free throw line before Erik Stevenson snapped the field goal drought with a baseline drive with 11:24 remaining to put the Mountaineers ahead 55-49.

The lead got to 10 on Emmitt Matthews Jr.'s 3, and then to 13 on Kedrian Johnson's runner from the left side of the lane with the shot clock winding down.

The Mountaineers' biggest lead of the night was 15 when Mohamed Wague scored a layup with 3:04 remaining.

West Virginia had 15 fouls to give from its three bigs, Jimmy Bell Jr., James Okonkwo and Wague, and it nearly used them all. Wague fouled out with 2:50 left after Bell picked up his fourth foul with 4:15 to go. Bell almost had another foul called on him when Ty Brewer was fouled driving to the basket, but the officials went to the replay monitor and changed it to Matthews Jr.

Jordan "Jelly" Walker, who came into the game leading the country in scoring with an average of 25.7 points per game, was good as advertised, the senior scoring 19 points and handing out seven assists. But Kedrian Johnson, as he did last year in Birmingham, stuck to Walker like glue and forced him to miss 11 of his 17 field goal attempts and turn the ball over seven times.

Johnson came up one point shy of his career high with 17 points. He made 5-of-10 from the floor and knocked down all seven of his free throw attempts to go with a pair of rebounds, an assist and a steal.

Joe Toussaint also gave WVU terrific minutes off the bench with 14 points, three steals, a rebound, an assist and a block in 25 minutes.

Matthews Jr., who landed awkwardly on his knee in the opening minute of the game and left the floor, returned a few minutes later and finished the game with 16 points and nine rebounds. The Mitchell rounded out WVU's double-figure scorers with 13 points while grabbing seven rebounds.

West Virginia connected on 27 of its 54 field goal attempts offensively and forced UAB into committing 19 turnovers. Those 19 turnovers led to 25 points.

West Virginia got a season-high 22 points from Erik Stevenson and an 18 point, 10-rebound double-double from Jimmy Bell Jr. to out-gun Buffalo 96-78 at the WVU Coliseum.

On Bob Huggins Hall of Fame Day, his players treated their coach to his 925th career victory by outscoring the Bulls 35-18 over the remaining 11:40, turning the game into another blowout triumph for the Mountaineers.

Buffalo trimmed West Virginia's lead to one, 61-60, on Yazid Powell's jumper, but Jonnivius Smith fouled Tre Mitchell in the act of shooting and also drew a technical foul complaining about the call.

That sent Mitchell to the foul line for four free throws, all of which he made, and then Mitchell tacked on a pair of baskets to boost WVU's lead to nine.

The margin got to 15 on Bell Jr.'s three-point play before Bell added a baseline dunk, a layup, a pair of free throws and another three-point play to grow WVU's lead to 21.

The Saginaw, Michigan, resident's career-high 18 points came on 5-of-6 from the floor and 8-of-13 from the free throw line. Four of his game-high 10 rebounds came on the offensive glass.

Stevenson got 16 of his game-high 22 in the first half, and West Virginia needed all of it as the Mountaineers struggled to slow down Buffalo's dribble drives to the basket. The Bulls outscored West Virginia 24 to 12 in the paint and shot 55% in the first half.

Reserve forward Isaac Jack got all of his season-high 13 points while Isaiah Adams contributed 11 in the first half. Adams added 9

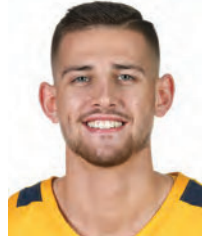

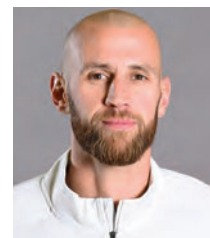
