West Virginia Opens 2024-25 Season vs. Robert Morris

- November 4 is the earliest date in school history that West Virginia has tipped off a men's basketball season.
- West Virginia is the only team in the country that has two players on the same team who averaged more than 20 points per game from last season -- Tucker DeVries (21.6 ppg) and Jayden Stone (20.8 ppg).
- West Virginia owns a 99-16 all-time record in season openers, including a 105-10 record in home openers.
- West Virginia is 136-13 at home against nonconference teams in the last 22 years, and has won 117 of its last 128
- West Virginia is 198-54 against nonconference teams in regular season games in the last 20 seasons.
- The Mountaineers have posted a winning nonconference record in 31 of the last 32 seasons.
- WVU is 609-187 (.778) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 250-73 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 20 seasons.
- WVU is 262-97 in its last 359 games against unranked teams, including winners of 145 of its last 177 at the WVU
- This is the 116th season and 122nd year overall for WVU basketball, which began in 1903.
- Darian DeVries, who led Drake to six consecutive 20-win seasons and has a career .732 winning percentage as a
 head coach, was named the 23rd head men's basketball coach at West Virginia University on March 24, 2024.
- DeVries has a record of 150-55 (.732) in six seasons as a head coach, including a 55-15 (.786) mark in the last two
- To fill his coaching staff, DeVries hired Chester Frazier (Associate Head Coach), Tom Ostrom (Assistant Coach), Kory Barnett (Assistant Coach), Nick Norton (Assistant Coach/Director of Player Development) and Cavel Witter (Assistant Coach).
- WVU's support staff this season will be Nelson Hernandez as director of player personnel/recruiting, Garrett Sturtz as director of operations, Jalen Cannady as video coordinator and Ryan Horn as strength and conditioning coach.
- This past August, the men's basketball team went to Italy for a 10-day tour and won all three of its games against international competition.
- Darian DeVries is 6-0 all-time in season opening games.

Robert Morris

Colonials (0-0)

- West Virginia returns just 2.8 percent of its scoring from last season's team (Ofri Naveh).
- The Mountaineers will be led by a pair of transfers in Tucker DeVries (Drake) and Javon Small (Oklahoma State). Last season, DeVries was named an Associated Press All-American Honorable Mention selection, while Small earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention honors.
- In addition, Eduardo Andre (Fresno State), Joseph Yesufu (Washington State), Sencire Harris (Illinois), Amani Hansberry (Illinois) and Jayden Stone (Detroit Mercy) will all see considerable action this season.
- WVU has a wealth of experience on its roster who have college basketball experience. They have combined to play 806 games, made 442 starts, scored 7,606 points, grabbed 3,304 rebounds and dished out 1,248 assists.
- Tucker DeVries was named to the 20-member Julius Erving Preseason Watch List, giving annually to the nation's top small forward.
- Tucker DeVries was named to the preseason Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year Watch List.
- Tucker DeVries has scored the most points (1,867) of any senior (four-year players only) entering this season. He
 ranks eighth overall for career scoring by returning players (including fifth-year) and third in the Big 12 Conference.
- Tucker DeVries has scored the fifth-most points in college basketball since 2021-22. He's one of 12 players who
 have scored 1,800 or more points since 2021-22.
- Eduardo Andre will play in his 100th career game against Robert Morris.
- Joseph Yesufu needs two more points to reach 700 for his career.
- Toby Okani needs 73 more points to reach 1,000 for his career.
- Tucker DeVries is 133 points shy of reaching 2,000 for his career.
- Darian DeVries is 68-2 when scoring 80 or more points in a game.
 West Virginia was predicted 13th in the Preseason Big 12 Poll by the league's head coaches.
- The Mountaineers played one exhibition game during the preseason. WVU defeated the University of Charleston,
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 864 consecutive games.
- The Mountaineers have won 144 of their last 162 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU has won 155 of its last 174 and 211 of its last 240 games when holding opponents to less than 69 points.
- West Virginia is 0-0 all-time in games played on November 4.

Series Record

- West Virginia is 19-2 all-time against Robert Morris.
- The series began on Feb. 12, 1979 with WVU winning in Morgantown, 85-79.
- Twenty of the 21 games have been played in Morgantown. The 1999 game was played in Fairmont when the WVU Coliseum was closed for asbestos abatement.
- Robert Morris' last win in the series came on Nov. 25, 1989, a 67-64 victory at the WVU Coliseum.
- The Colonials also won in Morgantown on Nov. 26, 1988, a 75-67 win at the Coliseum.
- Robert Morris last visited Morgantown on Dec. 7, 2010, an 82-49 WVU victory in Andrew Toole's first season as head coach of the Colonials.
- West Virginia is 42-4 all-time against current members of the Horizon League.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 115th season and 121st year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,855-1,175 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 21st in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 31 NCAA berths, 16 NIT trips and one CBI bid since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 24 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 13 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Since 2010, Derek Culver was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2021, Jevon Carter was named to the John Wooden, Lute Olson and Senior CLASS All-America teams in 2018, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden & Basketball Times and Kevin Jones earned All-America honors in 2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations and Naismith Hall of Famer Rod Thorn, former Utah Jazz broadcaster and Curt Gowdy Media Award winner "Hot Rod" Hundley and most recently Naismith Hall of Famer Bob Huggins. Head coach Joe Mazzulla led the Boston Celtics to the 2024 NBA World Championship, Mike Gansey serves as General Manager of the Cleveland Cavaliers and Jonnie West is the Senior Director of Pro Personnel for the Golden State Warriors.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), Stansbury Hall (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was closed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

Darian DeVries

- Darian DeVries, who led Drake to six consecutive 20-win seasons and has a career .732 winning percentage as a head coach, was named the 23rd head men's basketball coach at West Virginia University on March 24, 2024.
- DeVries has a record of 150-55 (.732) in six seasons as a head coach, including a 55-15 (.786) mark in the last two
- Spent the last six seasons at Drake, leading the Bulldogs to three Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) titles (two tournament and one regular season) and three NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Posted a 78-33 (703) record in the MVC
- Was hired at Drake prior to the 2018-19 season and led the Bulldogs to six of the 11 20-win seasons in program
- Last season, DeVries led Drake to a 28-7 record, capping the season with a MVC Tournament title and the Bulldogs' third NCAA Tournament appearance in four years.
- Was a two-time MVC Coach of the Year (2019 and 2021).
- Finalist for the 2023-24 Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award, giving annually to the top mid-major head coach in college basketball.
- Prior to Drake, Devries was an assistant coach at Creighton for 17 years under Greg McDermott and Dana Altman.
- Joined Creighton as a graduate manager and spent 20 years at Creighton.
- During his time at Creighton, he was part of 19 postseason appearances and 12 NCAA Tournament bids.
- Is a 1998 graduate of Northern Iowa, where he played for coach Eldon Miller.
- Led UNI in 3-point shooting for three seasons and converted on 44 percent of his attempts.
- A native of Aplington, Iowa, who was inducted into the Iowa High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame.
- Oldest of five siblings three brothers played football and sister played volleyball.
- DeVries and his wife, Ashley, have a son Tucker and a daughter, Tatum.

- Haris Elezovic: Attended Laval University in Quebec ... averaged 12.2 points and 10.3 rebounds per game .. career-high 26 rebounds against UQAM ... previously attended McGill University in Montreal ... signed with West Virginia in August.
- Amani Hansberry: Played last season at Illinois ... career-high eight points against No. 1 UConn in the NCAA Elite Eight ... 2023 Gatorade Maryland Player of the Year.
- Sencire Harris: Sat out last season as a redshirt at Illinois ... played in all 33 games as a freshman, starting seven ... attended St. Vincent-St. Mary's High School and won Ohio Co-Player of the Year honors.
- Dylan Jay: Invited walk-on from Phhoenix (Ariz.) PHH Prep ... previously attended Chelan High in Washington ... averaged 23 points per game.
- Ofri Naveh: Only player returning from last year's WVU team ... competed with Israel in the summer of 2023 in FIBA U18 European Championship play ... made his first collegiate start vs. Jacksonville State on Nov. 14, 2023 ... Academic All-Big 12 Rookie Team ... played in 24 games with seven starts.
- Toby Okani: Fifth-year senior after two seasons at UIC and two seasons at Duquesne ... was named to the MVC All-Defensive Team after leading the league in blocks (2.0) last season ... was one of two MVC players to rank in the top 10 of the conference in three primary defensive categories (rebounding, steals and blocks).
- Abraham Oyeadier: Originally from Ghana ... graduated from Academy of Sports Science in California ... averaged 10.7 points, 11.3 rebounds and 1.6 blocks per game.
- Jonathan Powell: Named Division I Ohio High School Basketball Coaches Player of the Year last year at Centerville High ... averaged 19.7 points, 4.2 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game ... scored 17 points against Cleveland St. Ignatius in the Division I state championship game.

- WVU owns 117 wins against AP-ranked teams.
- Since 1995, the Mountaineers have played 255 nationally ranked teams. WVU has played 369 total games against
 nationally ranked competition. That means more than 69 percent of the games against the best teams in the
 country have come during the last 30 seasons.
- WVU has played 206 ranked teams since the start of the 2004-05 season, winning 75 of those games.

- In 2022-23, WVU made its 31st appearance all-time in the NCAA Tournament, dating back to 1955.

- UMass last appeared in the Coliseum on March 15, 2007, in the second round of the NIT with the Mountaineers winning 90-77. WVU would then go on to win the NIT in New York City.
