West Virginia Mountaineers (1-0)

West Virginia and Campbell Meet For First Time

- Campbell is the 198th different team to play a game vs. West Virginia in Hope Coliseum (non-exhibition).
- West Virginia is 156-41 against teams making their first appearance in Hope Coliseum.
- WVU is 144-13 at home against nonconference teams in the last 24 years, and has won 125 of its last 136 games.
- West Virginia is 208-56 against nonconference teams in regular season games in the last 22 seasons.
- The Mountaineers have posted a winning nonconference record in 32 of the last 33 seasons.
- WVU is 623-191 (.767) all-time at Hope Coliseum and 264-77 at Hope Coliseum in the last 22 seasons.
- WVU is 278-106 in its last 384 games vs. unranked teams, including winners of 158 of its last 193 at Hope Coliseum.
- This is the 117th season and 123rd year overall for WVU basketball, which began in 1903.
- Ross Hodge, who has won 80% of his games as a head coach and is considered one of the nation's top defensive masterminds, was named the 24th head men's basketball coach at West Virginia University, Vice President and Director of Athletics Wren Baker announced on March 26, 2025.
- Hodge spent the last eight seasons at North Texas, including the last two as head coach, posting a 46-24 (.657) record.
- In 2024-25, Hodge's North Texas team won 27 games and advanced to the semifinals of the NIT in Indianapolis.
- Hodge has compiled a record of 193-48 (.801) in eight seasons as a head coach.
- Hodge's record as a Division I head coach in three seasons is 47-24 (.662).
- Hodge's 46 wins were the most by a UNT head coach in his first two seasons.
- In 2024-25, North Texas ranked third in the country in scoring defense at 59.9 points per game, 1.5 points behind first place Houston.
- To fill his basketball staff, Hodge hired Yusuf Ali (Assistant Coach), Johnny Estelle (Assistant Coach), Phil Forte (Assistant Coach), Jase Herl (Assistant Coach) and Andre Shaw (Assistant Coach).
- WVU's support staff this season will consist of Mike Randle (Director of Recruiting), Sean McClurg (Director of Video, Scouting & Analytics), Alex Mergner (Director of Men's Basketball Operations), Jason Martinez (Strength & Conditioning Coach) and Mathew Donello (Athletic Training).
- Ross Hodge is 39-10 as a Division I head coach when leading at halftime.
- Dating back to last season, Ross Hodge has held opponents to under 70 points or more in 24 consecutive games.
- Ross Hodge is 29-5 in home games as a Division I head coach.
- Ross Hodge is 43-14 when scoring 60 or more points, 29-4 when scoring 70 or more points and 10-0 when scoring 80 more points as a Division I head coach.
- Ross Hodge is 24-3 when holding opponents to less than 60 points as a Division I head coach.
- West Virginia returns zero percent of its scoring and minutes played from the 2024-25 season.
- The Mountaineers have nine Division I transfers on their roster: Brenen Lorient (North Texas & Florida Atlantic), Jasper Floyd (North Texas & Fairfield), Honor Huff (Chattanooga & VMI), Chance Moore (St. Bonaventure & Missouri State), Jackson Fields (Troy), Niyol Hauet (Weber State), Morris Ugusuk (South Carolina), Treysen Eaglestaff (North Dakota) and Harlan Obioha (UNC Wilmington and Niagara).
- WVU has a wealth of experience on its roster who have college basketball experience. Entering this season, they have combined to play 713 games, made 409 starts, scored 6,654 points, grabbed 2,490 rebounds, made 809 3-point field goals, had 587 steals and dished out 1,027 assists.
- Four Mountaineers are approaching 100 games played in their careers: Chance Moore (99 games), Treysen Eaglestaff (99 games), Jackson Fields (95 games) and Harlan Obioha (96 games).
- Honor Huff needs 12 more points to reach 1,500 for his career and five 3-point field goals to reach 300 for his career.
- The Mountaineers have won 161 of their last 183 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU has won 172 of its last 197 and 228 of its last 260 games when holding opponents to less than 69 points.
- West Virginia was predicted 11th in the Preseason Big 12 Poll by the league's head coaches.
- The Mountaineers played one exhibition game during the preseason. WVU defeated Wheeling University, 80-54, on Oct. 26.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 897 consecutive games.
- West Virginia is 1-0 all-time in games played on November 6.

Scouting Campbell

- Campbell is 0-1 on the season, falling at No. 24 Wisconsin on Monday, 96-64.
- Last year, Campbell was 15-17 overall and 10-8 in the CAA.
- Campbell assistant coach Joseph Yesufu played for the Mountaineers last season.

Series Record

- West Virginia and Campbell will meet for the first time in school history.
- West Virginia is 48-12 all-time against current members of the Colonial Athletic Association.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 117th season and 123rd year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,875-1,188 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 20th in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 31 NCAA berths, 16 NIT trips and one CBI bid since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 24 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 13 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Since 2010, Derek Culver was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2021, Jevon Carter was named to the John Wooden, Lute Olson and Senior CLASS All-America teams in 2018, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden & Basketball Times and Kevin Jones earned All-America honors in 2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations and Naismith Hall of Famer Rod Thorn, former Utah Jazz broadcaster and Curt Gowdy Media Award winner "Hot Rod" Hundley and most recently Naismith Hall of Famer Bob Huggins. Head coach Joe Mazzulla led the Boston Celtics to the 2024 NBA World Championship, Mike Gansey serves as General Manager of the Cleveland Cavaliers and Jonnie West is the Senior Director of Pro Personnel for the Golden State Warriors.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), WVU Field House (1928-69) and Hope Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was closed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

Ross Hodge

- Ross Hodge, who has won 80% of his games as a head coach and is considered one of the nation's top defensive masterminds, was named the 24th head men's basketball coach at West Virginia University, Vice President and Director of Athletics Wren Baker announced on March 26, 2025.
- Hodge spent the last eight seasons at North Texas, including the last two as head coach, posting a 46-24 (.657) record.
- In 2024-25, Hodge's North Texas team won 27 games and advanced to the semifinals of the NIT in Indianapolis.
- Hodge has compiled a record of 193-48 (.801) in eight seasons as a head coach, including 47-24 in Division I.
- In 2024-25, Hodge has led a revamped North Texas team to an eight-win overall improvement and second-place finish in the American Athletic Conference, five spots higher than its preseason projection.
- UNT's 27 wins were the second-most single season wins in school history and the 14 league victories were tied for the third-most league wins in school history and most in its AAC tenure.
- Hodge's 46 wins were the most by a UNT head coach in his first two seasons.
- In 2024-25, North Texas ranked third in the country in scoring defense at 59.9 points per game, 1.5 points behind first place Houston.
- That season, UNT had the AAC's second-most efficient offense and second-most efficient defense. On offense, UNT averaged 1.13 points per possession against AAC opponents and on defense held AAC opponents to 1.01 points per possession.
- In 2023-24, in UNT's first season in the American, Hodge led North Texas to a 19-win season and the second round of the NIT.
- Hodge was named a finalist for the 2024 Joe B. Hall National Coach of the Year Award, which is given to the nation's top rookie head coach. He was the only rookie head coach to lead his respective team to either the NCAA Tournament or NIT.
- North Texas was without two starters due to injuries for half of its league games and finished with 10 conference wins, the most by a first-year UNT head coach.
- Also, North Texas' scoring defense held opponents to 63.8 points per game, which was the 12th-best in the nation and best in the AAC. North Texas made 284 3-point field goals and shot 37.7% from 3. It was tied for the second-most single season 3-point field goals in program history and the 3-point field goal percentage was 14th best in the nation.
- Hodge was the architect of North Texas' defense. The Mean Green have featured one of the nation's top defenses over the last five seasons. Since 2020, North Texas is giving up an average of just 59.2 points per game. Only Houston is allowing fewer points per game over the last five seasons combined (58.0). In 2021-22 and 2022-23, UNT had the nation's No. 1 scoring defense, limiting opponents to 55.7 and 55.8 points per game, respectively, and is Conference USA's top single-season scoring defenses in league history.
- In his six seasons at UNT prior to being named head coach, Hodge served as the associate head coach under current Texas Tech head coach Grant McCasland. Hodge helped lead the Mean Green to a 135-65 overall record and 71-35 record in conference games. North Texas won the 2020 Conference USA regular season championship, 2021 Conference USA Tournament championship and 2022 Conference USA regular season title. In 2021, UNT earned an automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament, where they received a program-best No. 13 seeding. In the first round the Mean Green upset Purdue, 78-69, for the program's first-ever NCAA win. In 2023, Hodge helped lead North Texas to the 2023 NIT championship, the program's first NIT title. In his first season at North Texas in 2017-18, Hodge helped guide UNT to the 2018 CBI championship.
- UNT was just one of six schools in the country to have won a national postseason game in each of the last five years, joining Baylor, Creighton, Gonzaga, Houston and Oregon.
- In 2022-23, North Texas won a single-season program record 31 overall games. It was the second straight season UNT set the program record for single season wins. Additionally, UNT won 16 league games in 2022 and 2023, which is a program record.
- Prior to his arrival at North Texas, Hodge served as the associate head coach under McCasland at Arkansas State for the 2016-17 season. The Red Wolves made a 10-win improvement that season, which was the second-best turn around in Division I basketball that year.
- Prior to Arkansas State, Hodge spent four seasons with Larry Eustachy at Colorado State. Hodge served as the lead recruiter there and helped the Rams to an 87-48 record over his four-year stint. During his time there, the Rams advanced to postseason play twice, including the NCAA Tournament in 2013, where they reached the NCAA Second Round after defeating Missouri, 84-72. CSU lost to eventual national champion Louisville. Hodge joined the Division I coaching ranks when he was hired by Eustachy as an assistant coach at Southern Miss prior to the 2011-12 season. The Golden Eagles posted a 25-9 record and finished second in Conference USA with an 11-5 mark. Southern Miss received an at-large berth in the NCAA Tournament as an eight seed.
- From 2006-11, Hodge was one of the nation's top junior college head coaches, compiling a 146-24 (.858) overall record with stops at Paris Junior College and Midland College.
- Hodge guided Midland to a 63-7 (.900) overall record in his two seasons (2009-11) after taking over the Midland head coaching job after McCasland left to be the head coach at Midwestern State. Hodge saw his 2010-11 team post a 33-4 record, winning the Western Junior College Athletics Conference title, the Region V Tournament championship and advancing to the NJCAA Championship game. In 2009, Hodge led Midland to its best start in program history (26-0) and an appearance in the Region V Tournament title game.
- Between 2003 and 2005, Hodge served as the assistant men's basketball coach at Texas A&M University-Commerce, where he helped the Lions to the 2004-05 Lone Star Conference Championship, and a spot in the NCAA Division II Sweet 16.
- Hodge was a two-year starter at Paris Junior College, where he won the Bobby Walters Leadership Award in 2001. He finished his playing career at Texas A&M-Commerce, where he was honored with the Terry Allen Award for leadership and positive representation on and off the court in 2003.
- Hodge is a native of Dallas. He and his wife, Shelly, have two children, Emery and Reed.

- **Honor Huff:** Came to West Virginia from Chattanooga, where he played the last two seasons ... this past season at Chattanooga, Huff led the country with 131 3-point field goals made while shooting 41.6% from 3, earning All-Southern Conference First Team honors ... led Chattanooga to the NIT title, averaging 15.2 points per game in 36.5 minutes per game ... shot 42.4% from the field and 82.0% from the free throw line ... matched his career high with 31 points against VMI, including shooting 9-of-10 from 3-point range ... in 2023-24, he earned All-Southern Conference Second Team honors and to the NABC Division I All-District Team.

- The BYU game on March 1 marked the 377th time in school history WVU played a team in the AP Top 25.
- In 2024-25, the Mountaineers were 4-4 against ranked teams with wins over No. 2 Iowa State, No. 3 Gonzaga, at No. 7 Kansas and No. 24 Arizona, with losses at No. 10 Houston, home vs. No. 6 Houston, at No. 9 Texas Tech and at No. 25 BYU.
- WVU owns 121 wins against AP-ranked teams.
- Since 1995, the Mountaineers have played 263 nationally ranked teams. WVU has played 377 total games against nationally ranked competition. That means more than 69 percent of the games against the best teams in the country have come during the last 31 seasons.
- WVU has played 214 ranked teams since the start of the 2004-05 season, winning 79 of those games.

In the Rankings

- WVU broke into the AP poll on Jan. 6, 2025, with a No. 21 ranking. WVU appeared at No. 21 on Jan. 6 and No. 23 on Jan. 20.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked in at least one AP poll in 16 of the last 20 seasons.
- Prior to last season, WVU last appeared in the poll on Dec. 26, 2022 with a No. 24 ranking.
- West Virginia has been ranked 152 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005, in the AP poll, and 266 weeks total in school history.
- WVU's 266 appearances in the AP poll ranks 38th all-time in NCAA history for most AP poll appearances.

More Assists

- In 2022-23, WVU made its 31st appearance all-time in the NCAA Tournament, dating back to 1955.
- WVU has made 11 NCAA appearances in the last 17 seasons, including the Final Four in 2010. The Mountaineers have made 13 NCAA appearances since 2005.
- The Mountaineers have won 118 of their last 181 conference games at Hope Coliseum.
- WVU is 111-124 in Big 12 regular season games since joining the league in 2012-13.

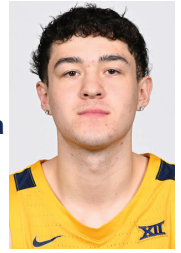

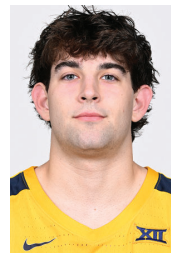

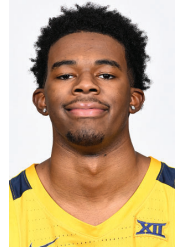

Recap

West Virginia used a career-high-tying 25 points from Jasper Floyd to defeat Mount St. Mary's 70-54 in Ross Hodge's coaching debut at Hope Coliseum.

Floyd, who once tallied 25 points against Yale when he played at Fairfield, made 9 of 13 from the floor, 6 of 9 from the free throw line and handed out four assists.

Honor Huff contributed 16 points, seven of those coming from the free throw line and all three field goals coming from behind the 3-point arc, while Brenen Lorient chipped in with 11 points and 13 rebounds.

Lorient's work on the glass was significant because the Mountaineers were getting doubled up on the backboards for most of the game.

The Mount's final rebounding advantage was nine, 38 to 29, although Hodge thought some of that margin is a little bit misleading.

West Virginia's real advantage came at the free throw line where the Mount's 25 fouls resulted in 35 free throw attempts, the Mountaineers converting 23.

WVU produced 13 steals leading to those 20 Mount St. Mary's turnovers and 19 fastbreak points.

"I thought our defensive activity was probably the difference in the game," Hodge said. "We turned them over 20 times, and we only turned it over nine."

West Virginia finished 21 of 48 from the floor for 43.8% and 5 of 18 from beyond the arc for 27.8%.

"We were trying to settle in offensively and it was the first time out for a lot of these guys, and you can tell there was a little bit of squeeze and I've got to do a better job of alleviating some of that with them and try and get them some easy baskets," Hodge said.

The Mount, which connected on just 39.1% of their 46 field goal attempts, got a team-high 15 points from Trey Deveaux. No other player reached double figures.

West Virginia led 35-29 at halftime and its largest lead came at the end of the game.

"We had not been great in the closed scrimmage or the exhibition coming out at halftime, and I thought we had that little push just enough to keep them at arm's bay for the most part," Hodge said.

The Mountaineers were without senior guard Chance Moore, sitting out the first five games to satisfy NCAA transfer requirements, and senior forward Jackson Fields, who is still recovering from a preseason hand injury.

The game was the Mount's seventh appearance at the Coliseum, all losses.
