A student by the name of L.A. Kibbe urged the formation of a football team in 1903. He formed a committee and met with then Bellingham State Normal School President Dr. Edward T. Mathes. Mathes approved having a team as long as it paid its own way. R.W. Greene was the first coach and Kibbe was the general manager. At that time there were 37 men enrolled in school and 370 women. The first game was played with New Whatcom High School and BSNS lost 6-5 (touchdown only counted five points). The first win was recorded over Everett High School 12-0.
