





# HOF CLASS OF 2022: JODIE KACZOR BERRY, MICHAEL KOENEN, TERRI MCMAHAN, ART PHINNEY, BILL ROE, DR. JOHN UTENDALE

Following a two-year hiatus caused by COVID-19, six former Vikings will be inducted into the Western Washington University Athletics Hall of Fame this afternoon on Whatcom Educational Credit Union Court at Sam Carver Gymnasium.

The 2022 class is the largest since the inaugural WWU hall of fame ceremony, which had seven inductees, was held in 1968.

Three are former Viking athletes. They include Jodie Kaczor Berry, a standout point guard in women's basketball at Western who has gone on to become a top NCAA Division I assistant coach; Michael Koenen, who played professionally for 10 years in the National Football League after a record-breaking career as a punter and placekicker for the Vikings, and Terri McMahan, who was a Western volleyball team captain in the early 1970s and went on to earn state high school hall of fame honors as a coach and administrator.

Rounding out the honorees are Art Phinney, who in 1998 coached Western softball to the school's first national team title in any sport, Bill Roe, a Viking assistant track & field and cross country coach for 35 years while serving on national and international organizations for those sports, and Dr. John Utendale, the school's Faculty Athletic Representative for

11 of his 28 years at Woodring College of Education, known for his achievements as an elite player and ice hockey activist during a groundbreaking career in that sport and higher education.

Phinney, Roe and Utendale are being inducted posthumously.


"This is an outstanding group we are inducting into the Western Athletics Hall of Fame," said WWU Director of Athletics Steve Card. "Three student athletes who all had wonderful careers at Western and followed that up with outstanding accomplishments in their chosen fields, two legendary coaches and a trailblazing professor and ice hockey player. They are all very deserving of our most prestigious honor."

The class of 2022 brings the hall's membership to 155 over the 120-year history of athletics at Western.

The induction ceremony is the 45th for WWU. Its hall of fame is the second oldest among Pacific Northwest colleges and universities.

Rower Audrey Coon Schwind was slated to be inducted with Kaczor Berry, Koenen and Phinney in 2020 before the pandemic hit. Scheduling issues prevented her from being here today, but she will be inducted in 2023.





### **JODIE KACZOR BERRY**

Women's Basketball (Point Guard/Coach)

Current Associate Head Coach at Oregon (8 years) after being top assistant at Gonzaga (6 years, 11 overall).

Overall record of 506-210 (.701) at Oregon and Gonzaga following 2021-22 season.

At UO, helped Ducks to three NCAA I Elite Eight appearances (2017-19), Final Four (2019), three straight Pacific-12 Conference regular season titles (2018-20), and two Pac-12 tournament titles (2018, 2020).

Helped Gonzaga to 10 West Coast Conference regular season titles and seven NCAA I Tournament appearances.


Finished WWU career as program leader in 3-point makes (210) and free throw percentage (81.9).

First-team all-conference in 2001 and 2002.

During career, helped WWU to 95-24 record, going to NCAA II tourney each season and reaching national semifinals in 2000.

Received Little All-Northwest honorable mention as junior, ranking seventh nationally in 3-point percentage (42.7, 79-185) and ninth in 3-point makes per game (2.7).

Four-year WWU letter winner.



## **MICHAEL KOENEN**

Football (Punter/Placekicker)

Had 10-year NFL career as punter and kickoff specialist, playing for Atlanta Falcons (2005-10) and Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2011-14).

Kicked 58-yard field goal, then tied for ninth longest in NFL history, for Atlanta on 10/9/2005 against New England.

WWU co-Male Athlete of the Decade (2000 to 2009).

2004-05 WWU Male Athlete of the Year.

Named to seven All-America teams, including three first team picks.

Finished as Northwest small college, Great Northwest Athletic Conference and WWU record holder in kick scoring with 272 points.

Established WWU career standard for made PATs (143), kickoffs for touchbacks (73), punting average (43.1) and yards punted (8,228); second in PAT attempts (150) and third in field goals made (43) and attempted (74).

Set school and GNAC season records for PAT (40-41, .976) and field goal (12-17, .706) percentage.

Set WWU records with 54-yard field goal (2001) and 73-yard punt (2002).

Twice Northwest Region Special Teams Player of the Year.

Four-year WWU letter winner.



#### TERRI McMAHAN

#### Volleyball (Setter/Coach), Administrator

Named to Washington Interscholastic Athletic Association Hall of Fame as volleyball coach (2009) and director of athletics (2016).

Coached volleyball at Ferndale High School from 1978 to 1992, winning Class 2A state title in 1986 with perfect 27-0 record.

Her Golden Eagles won five Northwest District One titles, nine Northwest League championships and had 85-match league winning streak.

In 1987, named Washington State Volleyball Coach of the Year and Whatcom County Sports Awards Coach of the Year. Six times named NWL Coach of the Year.

Athletic administrator for 22 years, four at FHS, 11 at Edmonds School District and seven at Highline Public Schools.

Washington State Athletic Director of the Year in 2008.

National Association of Sport and Physical Education Northwest Region AD of the Year in 2009.

Seven times named WIAA District or league/conference AD of the Year.

2002 Washington State Athletic Administrators Outstanding Service Award recipient.

2001 WIAA District One Elmer Clarkson Award winner.

Two-time WWU volleyball team captain.

Three-year WWU letter winner in volleyball and tennis.



#### **ART PHINNEY**

Softball (Coach)

In 1998, directed WWU to first national team championship in school history after receiving seventh and final at-large berth to NAIA tournament.

Received 1998 NAIA National Coach of the Year honors.

Coached Vikings for seven seasons (1995 to 2001), posting record of 186-110-1. Western won 30 or more games in each of last four years at helm.

Pacific Northwest Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 1996 as Western won PNWAC title.

Pacific West Conference Coach of the Year in 2001 when Vikings took league's West Division crown.

Head coach at Skagit Valley College for three years (1985-88), directing Cardinals to 74-40 record and three runner-up finishes at Northwest Athletic Conference Tournament.

Sports Ministry Director at Living Hope Church in Vancouver, Wash., for eight years.

Directed numerous coaching, hitting and pitching clinics for club, high school and college teams.



#### **BILL ROE**

# Track & Field and Cross Country (Coach/Official/Administrator)

Long-time USATF official, serving as national officer from 1988 to 2008.

President of USATF for two terms (2000-08).

Founder in 1972 of Seattle's Club Northwest and in 1973 of Pacific Northwest Association of USATF.


Elected to International Amateur Athletic Federation (now World Athletics) Cross Country Committee in 2015. Four-time U.S. delegate to IAAF World Congress.

Served in nearly all capacities of track and cross country, including coach, meet director, clinician, official, administrator and executive.

WWU assistant track & field and cross country coach for 35 years.

Named MarathonFoto/Road Race Management Lifetime Achievement Award winner in 2017 for contributions to sport of long-distance road running.

Founder of Northwest Runner magazine.



## **DR. JOHN UTENDALE**

#### Faculty Athletic Representative/Ice Hockey

Served as WWU FAR from 1985 to 1996.

Served two-year term as chair of National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics Council of FARs.

In 1955, became first Black hockey player to sign NHL contract.

Elite player and hockey activist. Playing career lasted 20 years.

In 1972, became first Black faculty member in Western's School of Education (now Woodring College of Education)


Led WWU's Student Personnel Administration graduate program for more than 25 years. Nationally recognized for academic work.

Assistant training coach for 1980 U.S. Olympic team, "Miracle on Ice" squad that won Gold medal at Lake Placid, NY.


Coached WWU club hockey team for nine years, winning four straight Western United States Collegiate Club championships from 1982-85.


Helped found Bellingham Area Minor Hockey Association and city's junior A team (Bellingham Blazers).

Served as Western Regional Director for Amateur Hockey Association of the U.S.


