Mark Branch 12th Season - Head Coach



In his 11 seasons, UW head man Mark Branch has raised the expectations of Cowboy Wrestling to new heights. He's upped the profile of Wyoming Wrestling and brought the program notoriety and name recognition with levels of success rarely seen in the program's history. With 116 dual wins and a 76-percent win rate within the conference ranks, Branch has established the Cowboys as the team to beat year in and year out. Branch has compiled a 55-16 mark against conference record foes with four regular-season dual titles.

Branch guided the Cowboys to another successful season in 2019 as the team qualified seven wrestlers for the NCAA Championships for the first time since 2013, tying the most qualifiers in a season in the Mark Branch era. During the dual season, the Cowboys racked up 16 dual wins for the first time in the Branch era, despite fielding a lineup consisting of three returning starters from a season ago. The Pokes' 16 dual wins this season were also the most since winning a school-record 17 during the 1966-67 season. During the dual campaign the Cowboys reached as high as No. 8 in the national dual rankings, and took down fourth-ranked NC State—the highest-ranked dual win on record in program history. Branch also coached Montorie Bridges to his first Big 12 finals appearance at the conference championships.

Branch was named Big 12 Wrestling Coach of the Year in 2018, following a season in which the Cowboys went 13-3 overall with a 7-2 mark against Big 12 opponents. The Pokes' 13 dual wins went down as the fourth-most in a season in program history and their winning percentage of 81 percent is the sixth-best in one season. Wyoming finished fourth at the Big 12 Championships as seniors Archie Colgan and Bryce Meredith were awarded the program's first two Big 12 individual titles. At the 2018 NCAA Championships, Meredith was able to claim national runner-up at 141 pounds for the second time in his career while redshirt freshman Montorie Bridges earned All-America honors for the first time in his career. As a team, Wyoming tallied its best finish under Branch as the Cowboys placed 17th. It was the 20th top-25 finish and third in a row for the Brown and Gold.

In its second season as a member of the Big 12 conference, Wyoming finished fifth at the Big 12 Championships in 2017 after Branch led the team to a 7-8 overall dual record mark and 4-4 record in conference action. He led five Pokes to Nationals after the conference tournament. Bryce Meredith became UW's second finalist at Big 12s, while Drew Templeman, Branson Ashworth, Cole Mendenhall and Archie Colgan joined Meredith in earning a spot for the NCAA Championships. It was the first trip to Nationals for Mendenhall, Colgan and Ashworth. UW brought home its 19th top-25 finish as it tied for 21st at the NCAA Championships. Led by Meredith, the junior earned his second consecutive All-American status. Meredith finished fourth at 141-pounds for the Brown and Gold. His fourth-place finish was the 16th top-four finish for a Cowboy wrestler all-time at NAAs. The Cowboys placed seven team members on the 2017 Academic All-Big 12 Wrestling team. Meredith, Tanner Miller, Luke Paine, Kyle Pope and Brandon Tribble earned first team honors, while Templeman and Nate Shaw earned second team recognition for the Brown and Gold.

Branch led the Pokes to a 6-6 overall dual record in its first season as a member of the Big 12 conference. He guided three competitors to the 2016 NCAA Championship inside the iconic Madison Square Garden, as two of the Cowboys received seeds to this season's championship with one Poke being unseeded. Tanner Harms earned his second trip to NAAs, while Bryce Meredith and Drew Templeman made their first trips for UW. Meredith fell in the 141-pound final's match, but became the first Cowboy to wrestle in the finals since Reese Andy in 1996.

In 2014-15, he led the Pokes to a 11-4 overall dual record including a seven-dual winning streak. He led six Cowboys to the NCAA tournament and ad nine wrestlers earn All-WWC honors. He also guided Shane Woods to his third NCAA West Regional/WWC Championship. Currently, 54 Cowboys have been named All-Conference under Branch and he has sent 37 qualifiers to the NCAA Championship. Branch is currently fourth all-time in dual wins at Wyoming. His 11 dual wins was the fifth time he has had double-digit dual wins in his career at UW.

In 2013-14, he helped bring the Pokes back from a 1-6 start in dual action to finish 6-6 overall, but more importantly, 4-1 in WWC duals to win the regular-season title. The Cowboys knocked off 19th-ranked North Dakota State in the season finale to win the crown. In tournament action, UW brought home two Reno Tournament of Champions titles and placed two at the Las Vegas Invitational. Beginning the postseason in the West Regional, UW claimed three more weight-class crowns to up Branch's total to 23 in six seasons. The Pokes were second in the event, as the squad has placed first or second in each of the previous six years. Currently, 45 Cowboys have been named to the All-WWC squad.

Four Pokes earned bids to the 2013 NCAA Championships, bringing the head man's total to 31 over six years. UW failed to earn an All-America honor for the first time in Branch's tenure. Under Branch, UW has had eight All-America finishers.

With Branch's help, senior Joe LeBlanc capped off a stellar career in 2012, earning four All-America nods, the first wrestler in UW history to do so. That same season, UW finished 19th in the team standings in 2012, the first top-20 finish for the Pokes since 1996. The dual season was a successful one, as the Cowboys were 10-3 and a 6-0 in WWC action. Wyoming won its third-straight West Regional tournament team title as four Wyoming wrestlers won titles.

In 2010-11, Branch had a stellar campaign. After spending the season ranked in the top 20 in the nation, Wyoming won its second consecutive West Regional title with five individual titles. Branch was named Western Wrestling Conference Coach of the Year at the event for a second time in his career. Branch also helped six Cowboys earn berths to the NCAA Championships. Shane Onufer (165) and LeBlanc (184) earned All-America honors by placing fifth and sixth, respectively, to lead Wyoming to a 28th-place team finish. The Cowboys compiled an 11-7 overall dual mark and 5-1 in the WWC. UW's lone dual loss in WWC action came against Northern Iowa.

In 2009-10, Branch directed the Cowboy wrestlers to the West Regional team title over 24-time defending champion Northern Iowa. The come-from-behind championship was Wyoming's first-ever West Regional team title and UW's first tournament conference championship team since 1992. Four UW wrestlers went to the NCAA Championships, as LeBlanc went on to finish fourth at the event to earn his second All-America accolade and was named the WWC Wrestler of the Year. The Cowboys finished 33rd and Branch was named the 2010 West Region Coach of the Year by Wyoming also had a successful dual season in 2009-10, winning the WWC regular-season dual title for the second-straight year with an overall season record to 12-3 and a WWC record of 6-0. The Pokes ended the regular season 25th in the nation in the National Wrestling Coaches' Association/USA Today Coaches Poll. UW had seven wrestlers earn All-WWC honors.

On July 14, 2008, Branch was selected as the 14th head coach in the history of the University of Wyoming Wrestling program. Branch's first season guiding the Cowboys (2008-09) signaled an immediate turnaround for the program. UW earned a share of the WWC regular-season dual title with a 5-0 record. At the West Regional tournament, Wyoming finished second with four champions and sent four Cowboys to the NCAA Championships, where LeBlanc finished fifth to become the first freshman in UW wrestling history to earn All-America honors. Following his first season at UW, Branch was named WWC Coach of the Year, the West Region Coach of the Year by D1CW and the Top Rookie Coach in the nation by Amateur Wrestling News. Branch also oversaw a squad which earned nine All-WWC honors in 2008-09, the most of any WWC member institution. He was nominated by his peers to be a part of the 2009 National Wrestling Coaches Association Leadership Academy Class.

Branch came to Wyoming from Oklahoma State University where he was the associate head wrestling coach for six years, as well as a four-time NCAA finalist as a student-athlete. He was a part of five NCAA team championships as a coach and student-athlete at OSU. As a college wrestler, Branch was a member of OSU's 1994 NCAA Championship team, and served on the coaching staff for OSU's 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2005 NCAA titles. While competing for OSU, Branch was a four-time NCAA All-American (1994-97), four-time NCAA national finalist (1994-97), two-time NCAA national champion at 167 pounds (1994 and '97) and a two-time national freestyle All-American (1998 and '99). In 1997, he was named the Big XII Athlete of the Year, OSU Student-Athlete of the Year and the top graduating senior for OSU wrestling. He was a four-time NWCA Academic All-American, received an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship and a Big XII Post-Graduate Scholarship.

As a member of the OSU coaching staff, Branch was named the NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2004. He helped coach OSU to seven Big XII Championships, four NCAA Championships and three Dual Team Championships. He was named the Associate Head Coach at OSU in 2002 and served as an assistant coach for five years prior. He coached 57 All-Americans and 16 NCAA champions. He was instrumental in the recruiting of student-athletes to Stillwater, as well as organizing fundraising projects, promotional strategies and assisting in public relations functions with student-athletes.

Branch has been a freestyle wrestling coach for the Gator Club in New Orleans, La., since 1997 where he provides personal instruction and training in freestyle wrestling. His teams have participated at various World Team training camps. He has coached at the U.S. Nationals and World/Olympic Team Trials. Branch earned his bachelor of science degree in secondary education from Oklahoma State in 1997 and earned his master of science degree in athletic administration from OSU in 2000. A native of Newkirk, Okla., Mark has a daughter, Maggie Belle, and a son, Mason Layne.

Ethan Kyle

11th Season - Associate Head Coach



Ethan Kyle completed his 10th year as an assistant coach with the wrestling program at the University of Wyoming in 2018-19. Kyle is the recruiting coordinator and coaches the lower and middle weights in UW's program.

In 2019, Kyle was instrumental in coaching seven Cowboys to qualification for the NCAA Championships. He also helped guide Montorie Bridges to his first Big 12 finals appearance at the conference championships. Kyle was key to helping oversee Wyoming achieve 16 dual wins during the season, the most since the 1966-67 season, and reaching as high as No. 8 in the national dual rankings.

In 2018, Kyle helped guide Cowboy seniors Bryce Meredith and Archie Colgan claim the program's first individual Big 12 titles on the way to a fourth-place team finish, while Meredith—as a national runner-up—and redshirt freshman Montorie Bridges earned All-America honors at the NCAA Championships. Overall, six Pokes qualified for the NCAA Championships and the team placed 17th, marking the third-straight top-25 finish for Wyoming.

Kyle helped five Pokes reach Nationals during the 2016-17 season. Branson Ashworth, Archie Colgan and Cole Mendenhall each earned their first trip to the NCAA Championships, while Drew Templeman and Bryce Meredith each made their second consecutive trip. Additionally, Montorie Bridges, Ben Hornick and Sam Turner each qualified for the Junior World Team Trials in the summer of 2017.

He guided Drew Templeman and Bryce Meredith to the NCAA Championships in 2015-16 and led three Cowboys to All-WWC honors in 2014-15. He also helped mentor senior Tyler Cox to his third NCAA Championship. He guided two Pokes to all-conference finishes at the NCAA West Regional in 2013-14. Under Kyle's tutelage, junior Tyler Cox won his first conference crown at 125 pounds, while redshirt freshman Cole Mendenhall was second at 141 pounds. Cox won 29 matches during the year, including a trip to the NCAA Championships, while Mendenhall led all starters with 11 falls.

Kyle had a great season in 2012-13 with the success of Cox, who was an All-America finisher at 125 pounds. Kyle was instrumental in the success of Cox, who spent much of the season ranked in the top 20 of his weight class and won 35 matches, tied for the best mark on the team. Kyle also coached senior McCade Ford to a Western Wrestling Conference title at 141 pounds, helping UW win its fourth-straight conference title.

During the 2011-12 campaign, Kyle was an huge part of UW's place among the nation's best programs. During the 2011-12 campaign, Kyle was an huge part of UW's place among the nation's best programs. Wyoming captured a third-straight West Regional team title with four Cowboys standing atop the podium, and continued that success at the NCAA Championships. UW finished 19th overall.

Kyle gained valuable leadership experience by completing the 2014 National Wrestling Coaches Association Leadership Academy, in conjunction with the NWCA National Convention. He also serves as the freestyle and Greco-Roman coach for the Wyoming Wrestling Regional Training Center and has coached more than 10 FILA Junior freestyle and Greco-Roman All-America honorees since 2010. He has trained six athletes to participate in the 2008 and 2012 Olympic Trials and has helped coach and train athletes who made the Senior U.S. National team from 2008-13.

Kyle wrestled collegiately at 133/141 for the Oklahoma State Cowboys from 2003-07 for then-OSU assistant coach and UW head coach, Mark Branch. He was a member of OSU's four national championship teams from 2003-06 and was a team captain in 2007 as a senior. Kyle took fourth place at the Big XII tournament as a junior and was an Olympic Team training partner in 2004 at the Olympic Games in Athens. Excelling in the classroom, he was a four-time member of the Big XII Honor Roll and was the Most Outstanding Wrestling Academics Senior in 2007. He earned his bachelor's of science degree in physical education from Oklahoma State in 2007 and is currently taking classes at UW towards a master's degree in kinesiology and health.

As a prep student-athlete in St. Charles, Mo., at Francis Howell High School he was a three-time Missouri state champion, a high school All-American (Wrestling USA), a Junior National All-American in Greco and a Cadet National All-American, both freestyle and Greco. Kyle was born in St. Louis, Mo., to Ed and Tina Kyle. He has two siblings, an older brother Alex and an older sister Amanda. He married former UW runner Erin Heffron in July 2012.

Teyon Ware will be in his fifth season as an assistant coach for University of Wyoming in 2019-20.

Ware helped coach the Cowboys to a 16-4 overall record and a 6-2 mark against Big 12 opponents in 2019. The Cowboys' 16 dual wins were the most during the Mark Branch era and marked the highest dual win total by a Wyoming team since 1967. Ware also helped oversee seven Cowboys qualifying for the NCAA Championships, also tying the most in the Mark Branch era.

In 2018, Ware helped guide Cowboy seniors Bryce Meredith and Archie Colgan to the program's first Big 12 individual titles on the way to a fourth-place team finish. Six Cowboys qualified for the NCAA Championships, with Meredith claiming national runner-up at 141 pounds and redshirt freshman earning his first career All-America honors.

In just his second season, he helped guide the Pokes to a fifth-place finish at the 2017 Big 12 Championships. Five Cowboys went on to earn a trip to the NCAA Championships under the guidance of Ware of the Cowboy wrestling staff.

Ware joined the Pokes just before the 2015-16 season after serving as an assistant coach at Binghamton University for three seasons. During his time with the Bearcats he helped send eight wrestlers to the NCAA Championship. Prior to his time at Binghamton he was a club coach for the Nittany Lion Wrestling Club in State College, Penn. He also made stops as a club coach with the Prodigy Wrestling Club in Dayton, Ohio and the Oklahoma Underdog Wrestling Club in Norman, Okla.

A native of Edmond, Okla., Ware wrestled at the University of Oklahoma winning two NCAA Individual championships at 141 pounds and earned a spot in the final three times. He won NCAA Championships during his freshman and junior seasons. In 2003, he was a Big XII conference champion and also earned Big XII Outstanding Wrestler award. In 2006, he was named to the Big XII 10th Anniversary Team.

He is a 2007 graduate of the University of Oklahoma majoring in mass communications.

McCade Ford - 6th Season

Ford enters his sixth season as the assistant director of player development on the Wyoming wrestling staff in 2019-20.

Ford was key to helping the Cowboys to a 16-4 dual record and a 7-2 record against Big 12 opponents in 2019. The Cowboys' 16 dual wins were the most during the Mark Branch era and marked the highest dual win total by a Wyoming team since 1967. Ford helped oversee seven Cowboys qualifying for the NCAA Championships, also tying the most in the Mark Branch era.

In 2018, Ford helped guide Wyoming to a 13-3 dual mark with a 7-2 record against the Big 12. The Pokes' 13 dual wins go down as the fourth-most in a season in program history and their winning percentage of 81 percent is the sixth-best in one season. At the Big 12 Tournament, seniors Archie Colgan and Bryce Meredith were awarded the program's first two Big 12 individual titles, on the way to a fifth-place team finish. At the 2018 NCAA Championships, Meredith was able to claim national runner-up at 141 pounds for the second time in his career while redshirt freshman Montorie Bridges earned All-America honors for the first time in his career. As a team, Wyoming tallied its best finish under branch as the Cowboys placed 17th.

Ford was a key member of the Cowboy staff during UW's second season as a member of the Big 12. Before then, he helped the Pokes to an 11-4 overall dual record in 2014-15 and also sent six wrestlers to the NCAA Championships.

Ford wears many hats for the UW wrestling program. He works with the Cowboys academics and works with the Pokes strength and conditioning. Ford also plays a role with donor cultivation and student-athlete recruiting. He is also a key member of the Cowboys travel planning and budget. Ford serves as the tournament director for the highly successful Cowboy Open.

A former UW wrestler, Ford was 24-27 for his career and qualified for the NCAA Championships in 2012-13. He helped the Pokes win the Western Wrestling Conference team title with his 141-pound crown at the event as a senior. In his only trip to Nationals, he went 1-2.

He was a very accomplished wrestler in junior college becoming a two-time NJCAA All-American at Northwest College. He is married to former UW soccer player Ellen McCormick. He is a 2013 graduate of Wyoming majoring in sociology.

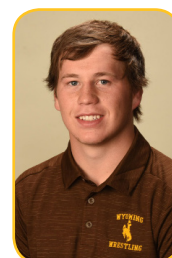

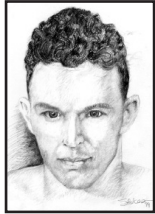

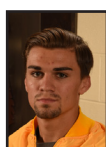

The High Plains Advantage

Training and competing at 7,220 feet has its advantages. The Cowboys use their offseason to improve their conditioning, training in various outdoor locations. During the season, the Pokes train in the team wrestling room with high intensity. That has led to a lot of success on the home mats.

Since 1931-32, the Cowboys are 271-161-6 at home, a winning percentage of 62 percent.

University of Wyoming Athletics Hall of Fame Wrestling Inductees

The University of Wyoming Athletics Hall of Fame was established in 1993, in order to honor individuals and teams who have brought honor and distinction to the Intercollegiate Athletics Department of UW over its long and storied history.

The inductees must fit into one of five categories: student-athlete, coach, team, athletics staff members or special achievement. Special achievement includes individuals who have contributed to the ideal of sports at the University. Each nominee must receive at least 75 percent of the committee's vote to be eligible for induction.

Dick Ballinger (1958-60) - Class of 1993

Dick Ballinger is the only wrestler in University of Wyoming history to win an NCAA championship. A native of Cody, Wyo., Ballinger won the 1960 NCAA Wrestling championship at 167 pounds. During his outstanding career he was named an All-American three times. He placed second in the 1958 NCAA Championships and fourth in the 1959 NCAA Championships. Ballinger guided Wyoming to a sixth-place national team finish in 1959 and a Wyoming all-time best third-place team finish in the 1960 NCAA Championships.

Dr. Everett D. Lantz (1937-65) - Class of 1994

Everett Lantz served Wyoming wrestling for 25 years as head coach, the longest tenure of any coach in the UW history. Over that period, Lantz compiled a 141-75-9 dual record, 11 Skyline Conference championships and two WAC titles. His teams won eight titles in a row from 1955 to 1962. He notched seven top-15 NCAA finishes, including a third-place national showing in 1960, the best in team history. Lantz was named the NCAA Wrestling Coach of the Year in 1960. He coached six NCAA place-winners, 10 three-time conference champions and 30 other conference winners.

1959-60 team - Class of 2003

The 1959-60 Wyoming Cowboys became the first and only wrestling team in school history to finish in the top five at the NCAA Wrestling Championships. The Pokes won the Skyline Conference and finished the season with an 11-1 dual record. The team boasted five conference champions and seven Cowboys competed at the 1960 NCAA Wrestling Championships where UW came only 13 points away from the title, finishing third. Dick Ballinger won the national championship at 167 pounds, Jerry Frude finished second at 147 pounds and Dave Hansen placed third at 123 pounds, all earning All-American honors. Wyoming head coach Everett Lantz earned 1960 NCAA Coach of the Year honors from the National American Wrestlers Association.

Reese Andy (1993-96) - Class of 2004

Reese Andy was a three-time NCAA All-American. Wrestling at 177 pounds, he placed second nationally in 1994, sixth in 1995 and second in 1996. He was a three-time Western Athletic Conference champion and was named Outstanding Wrestler in the conference three straight years (1994-96). Andy's overall record at Wyoming was 110-29, and he compiled a record of 38-4 in his senior season.

Joe Dowler (1973-87) - Class of 2005

In his 14 seasons as head wrestling coach at Wyoming, Joe Dowler led the Pokes to a 104-64-1 dual record while capturing four straight Mountain Intercollegiate Wrestling Association (MIWA) Championships, and three Western Athletic Conference titles. Dowler coached 35 conference champions, two NCAA placewinners, and two All-Americans at Wyoming. Named WAC Coach of the Year three times (1983, 1985 and 1986), he was a finalist for 1986 NCAA Wrestling Coach of the Year. Dowler was an Associate Athletics Director at UW from 1987-2001. Following his retirement, he initiated and coordinated the "W" Club for all UW athletic letterwinners.

Dave Myers (1989-92) - Class of 2008

One of Wyoming's only four-time conference champions, Myers won Western Athletic Conference titles at three different weights and represented Wyoming at the NCAA Championships four times. He was named Outstanding Wrestler of the WAC Tournament in both 1991 and 1992. He led the Wyoming wrestling team to conference championships in 1990 and 1992. In his senior year (1992) he earned All-America honors by finishing eighth at the NCAA Championships. He won 121 matches as a Cowboy, tied for sixth on Wyoming's all-time victory list.



University of Wyoming Athletics Hall of Fame Wrestling Inductees

Jerry Frude (1959-60, 1962) - Class of 2010

Jerry Frude was a two-time All-America, earning the honors in 1959 and 1960. In 1959 as a sophomore, he won the Mountain States/Skyline Conference title at 147 pounds and then went on to a second-place finish in the NCAA Championships, helping the Cowboys to a sixth-place team finish. He again finished second in the nation in the 147-pound weight class in 1960, while Wyoming finished third as a team. After sitting out a year in 1961, Frude rejoined the team in 1962 and was named co-captain. He won his second Skyline Conference championship at 147 pounds and won his first two matches at the NCAA Championships before falling to eventual national runner-up Kirk Pendleton of Lehigh. A native of Laramie, Frude was never pinned by an opponent during his college career. Wyoming's wrestling teams finished sixth (1959), third (1960), and 11th (1962) in the nation during Frude's time at UW and won the Mountain States/Skyline Conference team championship each year (1959, 1960 and 1962).

Dr. Robert Mason (1949-51) - Class of 2011

A high school football and basketball star, Bob Mason had never seen a wrestling match before he came to the University of Wyoming. After watching the sport and talking to wrestling coach Everett Lantz, he decided to join Wyoming's wrestling team. A native of Burns, Wyo., he won the conference championship in his first year of competition. Wyoming's first wrestling All-America, Mason placed fourth in the nation at 155 pounds in 1950. He repeated that feat in 1951 to gain his second All-America honor. In the Mountain States Conference, Mason won championships at 165 pounds in both 1949 and 1950 and, as team captain both years and led his team to conference titles in 1950 and 1951. At NAAs, the Cowboy wrestling team finished 12th in 1950 and 13th in 1951. Mason was a three-time letterwinner for the 'Pokes and earned his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Wyoming. He went on to a distinguished career as a high school and college wrestling coach and official and earned a doctorate in education from the University of Washington. He was inducted into the National Junior College Athletic Association Hall of Fame in 1980 and inducted posthumously into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2008. Mason died on March 18, 2000, at the age of 70.

Ray Sanchez (1967-68) - Class of 2012

One of the greatest Wyoming high school wrestlers in state history, Ray Sanchez came to the University of Wyoming after compiling an amazing record of 98-0 and winning four state championships at Cheyenne Central High School. He was a two-time senior men's National AAU champion in 1965 and 1966 and a two-time Great Plains National Champion representing Wyoming in 1966 and 1967. Sanchez was undefeated competing for the Cowboys' Freshman Team in 1966. As a Cowboy sophomore on the varsity in 1967, despite battling an elbow injury, Sanchez finished fourth in the nation at 115 pounds and earned All-America honors. Unfortunately, he suffered a back injury the following year and was forced to give up wrestling. He went on to a successful career as a teacher, coach and high school administrator.

Mike Hamel (1983-86) - Class of 2017

Wyoming's all-time leader in pins, Mike Hamel was a two-time Western Athletic Conference champion and a three-time Mountain Intercollegiate Wrestling Association champion. As a freshman, he was named to the Amateur Wrestling News Freshman All-American team and earned "Rookie of the Year" honors in the WAC. A two-time NCAA qualifier, Hamel won 12 tournaments during his time at Wyoming. He was the co-captain of the 1986 undefeated Cowboy wrestling team. He led the 'Pokes to WAC team titles in 1983, 1985 and 1986. Hamel was honored with the Admiral Land Award as UW's top student-athlete in 1986.

Steven Suder (1975-77, 1979 -- Wrestling coach, 1989-2008) - Class of 2018

Suder completed an outstanding career as a UW wrestler by earning All-America honors during his senior year of 1979. Wrestling at 150 pounds, Suder had an overall record of 62-37-2 as a Cowboy. He placed in the top four each year in the conference and was a team captain his senior year while placing at every major tournament in the Rocky Mountain Region. He returned to his alma mater as the head coach in 1989 and served in that capacity for nineteen years. He led Wyoming to two Western Athletic Conference team titles while being named Coach of the Year four times. He also earned NCAA West Regional Coach of the Year honors twice.

Academic Support/Awards

Office of Academic Support

The Office of Academic Support provides assistance to UW student-athletes in a variety of areas, including academic development, career development, and personal growth and development.

Cowboy wrestlers meet with Academic Coordinator Steven Cox weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly to discuss their current classes and to cover academic success and career preparation topics. Cox pre-advises the wrestlers for their semester class schedules, ensuring that their classes apply directly to their degree program, in order to meet NCAA eligibility benchmarks and to guarantee that the student-athletes graduate from UW within five years. Student-athletes must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours each semester, and they must take into consideration their practice and travel schedules when registering for classes. The Office of Academic Support helps student-athletes in this process.

A staff of nearly 80 tutors is also available to assist student-athletes. The tutors work with student-athletes to clarify problems the students may have with class material and, in some cases, to help

the students develop study skills, note-taking strategies, and time management techniques. Freshmen student-athletes also meet weekly with an assigned mentor, who assists them with organization and with transitioning to the academic demands of college. Tutors and mentors are upperclassmen or graduate students with at least a 3.0 GPA, or individuals from the community who have already earned at least a Bachelor's Degree.

The NCAA Student-Athlete Affairs and UW S.A.D.D.L.E. Cup program offers programming centered on career development and personal growth and development. Presentation and workshops include topics such as Drug/Alcohol Abuse, Sexual Responsibility, Money Management, Job Searching, and Cultural Diversity.

The Office of Academic Support provides UW student-athletes with resources to be successful in the classroom, to prepare for a career after athletics, and to make informed decisions about their personal behavior.
