MARK BRANCH

HEAD COACH - 11TH YEAR

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- In his 10 seasons, UW head man Mark Branch has raised the expectations of Cowboy Wrestling to new heights. He's upped the profile of Wyoming Wrestling and brought the program notoriety and name recognition with levels of success rarely seen in the program's history.
- Branch has compiled a 51-15 mark against conference foes with four regular-season dual titles.
- Under his watch, Wyoming has sent 51 wrestlers to the NCAA Championships with 12 returning as All-Americans.
- Winning his 100th career dual as a coach in 2018, Branch became the fourth head coach in school history to reach that mark.
- Branch was named Big 12 Wrestling Coach of the Year in 2018, following a season in which the Cowboys went 13-3 overall with a 7-2 mark against Big 12 opponents.
- The Pokes' 13 dual wins went down as the fourth-most in a season in program history and their winning percentage of 81 percent is the sixth-best in one season.
- Wyoming finished fourth at the Big 12 Championships as seniors Archie Colgan and Bryce Meredith were awarded the program's first two Big 12 individual titles.
- At the 2018 NCAA Championships, Meredith was able to claim national runner-up at 141 pounds for the second time in his career while redshirt freshman Montorie Bridges earned All-America honors for the first time in his career.
- As a team, Wyoming tallied its best finish under branch as the Cowboys placed 17th. It was the 20th top-25 finish and third in a row for the Brown and Gold.
- He guided three competitors to the 2016 NCAA Championship inside the iconic Madison Square Garden, as two of the Cowboys received seeds to this season's championship with one Poke being unseeded. Meredith fell in the 141-pound final's match, but became the first Cowboy to wrestle in the finals since Reese Andy in 1996.
- Prior to the program joining the Big 12, Branch was named Western Wrestling Conference Coach of the Year for guiding the team to stellar seasons in 2010, 2011 and 2012.
- From Branch's arrival in Laramie in 2009 to the program's departure to the Big 12 in 2015, he oversaw six WWC team championships and 24 Cowboys taking individual conference titles.
- With Branch's help, Cowboy standout Joe LeBlanc capped off a stellar career in 2012, earning four All-America nods, the first wrestler in UW history to do so.
- Before coming to Wyoming, Branch was the associate head wrestling coach at Oklahoma State where as a student-athlete he was a four-time NCAA finalist and a two-time NCAA Champion.
- As a member of the OSU coaching staff, Branch was named the NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2004. He helped coach OSU to seven Big 12 Championships, four NCAA Championships and three Dual Team Championships.

The Basics

The No. 13 Wyoming wrestling team hits the home stretch of the 2019 dual season this weekend.

The Cowboys are set to travel to Utah Valley for a Big 12 dual on Friday at 7 p.m., before hosting South Dakota State on Sunday at 2 p.m. to wrap up the team's home schedule.

Dual Coverage

Fans can stream Friday's dual live on the WAC Digital Network. All Wyoming home duals are streamed live on FloWrestling. Live scoring for both duals will be available on Trackwrestling as well. Fans can also follow live updates on Twitter at @WyoWrestle.

About the Cowboys

The Wyoming wrestling team is ranked No. 13 nationally by the NWCA heading into the weekend, as head coach Mark Branch returns three NCAA qualifiers from a season ago including All-American Montorie Bridges.

Last season, the Cowboys finished in fourth at the Big 12 Championships with two individual conference champions in Bryce Meredith and Archie Colgan. The finish was the highest for a Wyoming team since joining the Big 12 in 2015, and was enough to earn Branch a Coach of the Year nod from the league's coaches.

At the NCAA Championships, Bridges became the program's second freshman All-American, finishing eighth at 133 pounds. As a team, Wyoming tallied its best finish under branch as the Cowboys placed 17th. It was the 20th top-25 finish and third in a row for the Brown and Gold.

The Cowboy lineup is a young one, with seven of the team's 10 starters being either redshirt freshmen or sophomores.

Last Time Out

The Wyoming wrestling team split duals on Sunday in California, dropping its first loss of the New Year in a tough battle against Fresno State, followed by a convincing win over CSU Bakersfield.

The Cowboys' eight-match winning streak was snapped in a grinder of a dual against the Bulldogs, as Fresno State defeated the Cowboys in a 21-12 battle. The Cowboys bounced back from a tough loss in the second dual of the day on Sunday night, handling CSU Bakersfield, 25-6. Wyoming won eight of 10 bouts on the way to its 13th win of the season.

In the Rankings

The Cowboys come into this week's contests ranked No. 13 in the NWCA Coaches Poll and No. 8 in the Interim Dual Rankings, both released on Tuesday.

Heading into the 2018-19 season, only two Cowboys received rankings at their respective weights. Individually, eight Cowboys are ranked by at least one ranking service this week, with two Pokes ranked in the top 10. Montorie Bridges is ranked as high as No. 7 at 133 pounds by *WIN Magazine* while Branson Ashworth is ranked seventh at 165. At 125 pounds, *FloWrestling* slots junior Cole Verner 16th, while *FloWrestling* also ranks redshirt sophomore Sam Turner No. 12 at 141 pounds. *Trackwrestling* slots Hayden Hastings at No. 24 at 174, as freshman Tate Samuelson slides into *The Open Mat* 184-pound poll at No. 19. At 197 pounds, Cale Davidson is ranked No. 15 by *Amateur Wrestling News*. Finally, heavyweight Brian Andrews comes in at No. 20 according to *WIN Magazine*.

Eyeballing Utah Valley

Utah Valley heads into Friday's bout with the Cowboys at 9-11 overall and 0-5 in Big 12 duals. The Wolverines got off to a hot start to open the season, tallying ranked wins over Rutgers and Purdue, along with narrow losses to blue blood programs such as Nebraska and Wisconsin, but have been bit by the injury bug of late. Utah Valley is coming off lopsided losses to No. 25 North Dakota State and No. 14 Iowa State last weekend, in which they were without nine of their 10 starters. The Wolverines return four NCAA qualifiers from a season ago, including Demetrius Romero, Kimal Bastian and Tanner Orndorff, who could figure into Utah Valley's lineup this Friday.

Head coach Greg Williams is in his 13th season in Orem, racking up a 78-87 overall record.

About the Jackrabbits

South Dakota State enters the weekend at 2-7 overall with a 1-4 Big 12 record. The Jackrabbits are coming off a weekend in which they split matches against Utah Valley and Iowa State, defeating the Wolverines, 26-16 and falling to Iowa State, 47-0. With 2018 national champion Seth Gross sidelined for the season, South Dakota State is led by 2018 qualifier Henry Pohlmeier, who comes into the weekend ranked No. 18 at 149 pounds.

Head coach Damion Hahn is in his first season leading the Jackrabbits after spending 12 years as an assistant at Cornell.

MATCH NOTES

The Series: Utah Valley

- The Cowboys and Wolverines will be meeting for the 15th time in the series between the two schools, which dates back to 2005.
- The Cowboys have dominated the series, currently holding a 13-1 record in previous duals against Utah Valley.
- Wyoming is 7-0 against the Wolverines in Orem.
- Wyoming took the last meeting, 38-4, in Laramie last season.
- Head coach Mark Branch is 10-0 against the Wolverines since taking over the reins of the Cowboy program.

The Series: South Dakota State

- Wyoming and South Dakota State will be meeting for the 20th time since 1954 on Sunday afternoon.
- The Cowboys have won 15 of the previous 19 meetings.
- Wyoming holds an 8-1 advantage in matches competed in Laramie.
- The Jackrabbits won the last matchup between the two teams, 20-18, in Brookings last season.
- Head coach Mark Branch is 6-4 against the Jackrabbits.

Senior Day

Sunday's matchup with the Jackrabbits will serve as the final home dual for three Cowboys: Branson Ashworth, Brock George and Anthony Lombardo. All three will be honored for their contributions to Wyoming wrestling prior to the dual.

Ashworth owns the 10th-most career wins in school history with 115, and two seasons that rank 14th on the program single-season wins list. He's on his way to another stellar season with a 27-3 overall record.

George has been an important member of the team during his five years in Laramie. He has recorded a career high in wins this season, while making two dual starts for the Pokes.

A graduate transfer to Wyoming this season, Lombardo has been outstanding during his final collegiate season. The Bethlehem, Pa., native is 10-4 overall on the season with nine of his wins coming with bonus points. He has gone 3-1 for the Cowboys in duals.

Climbing Cowboys

Coming in at No. 13 in the *Intermat* dual meet rankings and the NWCA Coaches Poll this week, the Cowboys continue to ascend up the college wrestling polls. The Pokes' No. 11 spot in the NWCA poll last week marked the program's highest ranking in the poll since 2011-12. Wyoming reached as high as No. 10 that season and finished the campaign ranked 11th.

Senior Stays Hot

Senior 165-pounder Branson Ashworth has turned in a stellar final season as a Cowboy at the halfway point of the campaign. Ashworth is 27-3 with a 17-0 dual record for 68 dual points.

Now 8-3 against ranked opponents, 15 of Ashworth's 27 wins have come with bonus points. He has won 11-straight matches for the Pokes, which includes seven of his last eight coming with bonus points. With six tech falls against DI opponents this season, Ashworth ranks seventh in that country nationally.

20-Win Pokes

Just past the halfway point of the season, seven Cowboy starters have reached the 20-win mark for the year. Branson Ashworth leads all wrestlers with 27 on the season in 30 total matches, followed closely by Brian Andrews with 26. 2018 All-American Montorie Bridges boasts 24, while Sam Turner (22), Cale Davidson (22), Cole Verner (20) and Hayden Hastings (20) all have 20 as well.

Historic Streak Snapped

The Cowboys ran off the fourth-longest win streak in school history earlier this season. Wyoming went from Dec. 30 to Feb. 3 without a loss. The eight-match win streak was only two off from the longest in school history:

Ashworth Snags No. 100

At the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational last month, Cowboy senior Branson Ashworth tallied his 100th career win to become the 20th Poke to accomplish the feat.

With 115 wins to his credit heading into the week-end, Ashworth is currently 10th on the program all-time wins list. He is one win behind Michael Martinez (2008-12) for ninth on the list.

The Cowboy senior has recorded two consecutive 36-win seasons his last two campaigns. Those totals tie for 14th on the program single-season wins list.

Building Bridges

Wyoming's lone returning All-American Montorie Bridges caught the eyes of the wrestling world as a redshirt freshman when—then ranked No. 20 at 133 pounds—he knocked off No. 3 Kaid Brock of Oklahoma State in the dual against OSU in Cheyenne last December. That win set the stage for a stellar rookie season for Bridges who went on to finish eighth at the NCAA Championships, becoming the program's second freshman All-American.

Bridges joined Joe LeBlanc as the only freshman to earn All-American honors in their first season. LeBlanc (184 pounds) did so in 2009 when he finished in fifth place. Bridges completed his season with a 35-7 overall record. His 35 wins are tied 16th all-time in a single season for UW.

Young Guns

After losing a handful of starters from last season, this year's Cowboy lineup features a handful of new faces. That includes a wave of young talent, as the Pokes' 10-man projected lineup for Sunday features eight wrestlers that are either redshirt freshmen or sophomores. While that list includes proven grapplers like redshirt sophomores Montorie Bridges and Sam Turner, six of the 10 weights (125, 149, 174, 184, 197, HWT) this weekend feature Cowboys who have made their first career dual start at Wyoming this season.

The 7,220 Advantage

Training and competing at 7,220 feet has its advantages. The Cowboys use their offseason to improve their conditioning, training in various outdoor locations. During the season, the Pokes train in the team wrestling room with high intensity. That has led to a lot of success on the home mats.

Since 1931-32, the Cowboys are 269-161-6 at home, a winning percentage of 62 percent.

At neutral sites, Wyoming is 93-58-1 (.612), and 218-199-8 (.522) at away locations.

Big 12's Best in 2018

Wyoming's Mark Branch was honored in March as

the Big 12 Wrestling Coach of the Year after leading the Cowboys to another successful season.

During the recently the 2017-18 regular season, the Pokes compiled a 13-3 dual record, including a 7-2 mark against Big 12 foes. Wyoming's 13 dual victories tied for fourth most in a single season in Cowboy history. Additionally, Wyoming's winning percentage of 81 percent is the sixth-best in one season.

In its third year as a Big 12 member, UW finished fourth at the Big 12 Championship during the first weekend in March. Archie Colgan (157 pounds) and Bryce Meredith (141 pounds) became the first Cowboys to earn Big 12 titles. In the previous two seasons as a Big 12 member, Wyoming finished fifth at the Big 12 Championship.

Stickin' Around

Wyoming wrestling coach Mark Branch has signed a contract extension that will keep him in the Brown and Gold through the 2022-23 season.

"I'm excited to have the opportunity to continue what we started here," Branch said. "The commitment that the University of Wyoming has made towards the wrestling program has given us the tools to be successful, and I'm excited about what the future holds."

Branch Hits the Century Win Mark

In a 37-3 rout at Air Force last season, head coach Mark Branch picked up his 100th career coaching victory. With the win, he became the fourth coach in the history of Wyoming wrestling to win at least 100 duals with the program.

Unprecedented Success

Now in his 11th season at the helm of the Cowboy wrestling program, Branch has amassed a 102-49 overall record and a 49-14 mark in conference action. Under his watch, Wyoming has sent 51 wrestlers to the NCAA Championships with 12 returning as All-Americans.

First Big 12 Champs

Seniors Archie Colgan and Bryce Meredith led the University of Wyoming wrestling team on the final day of the Big 12 Championships in March of 2018, as both became the first Cowboys to earn individual Big 12 titles.

It also became the first time since 2014 that UW had two individual conference champions when Ben Stroh (184 pounds) and Shane Woods (197 pounds) were both crowned while Wyoming was a member of the Western Wrestling Conference.

Wyoming took fourth-place as a team with 82.5 points. It was the highest finish for the Brown and Gold since joining the Big 12. The Pokes had finished fifth in the previous two tournaments.

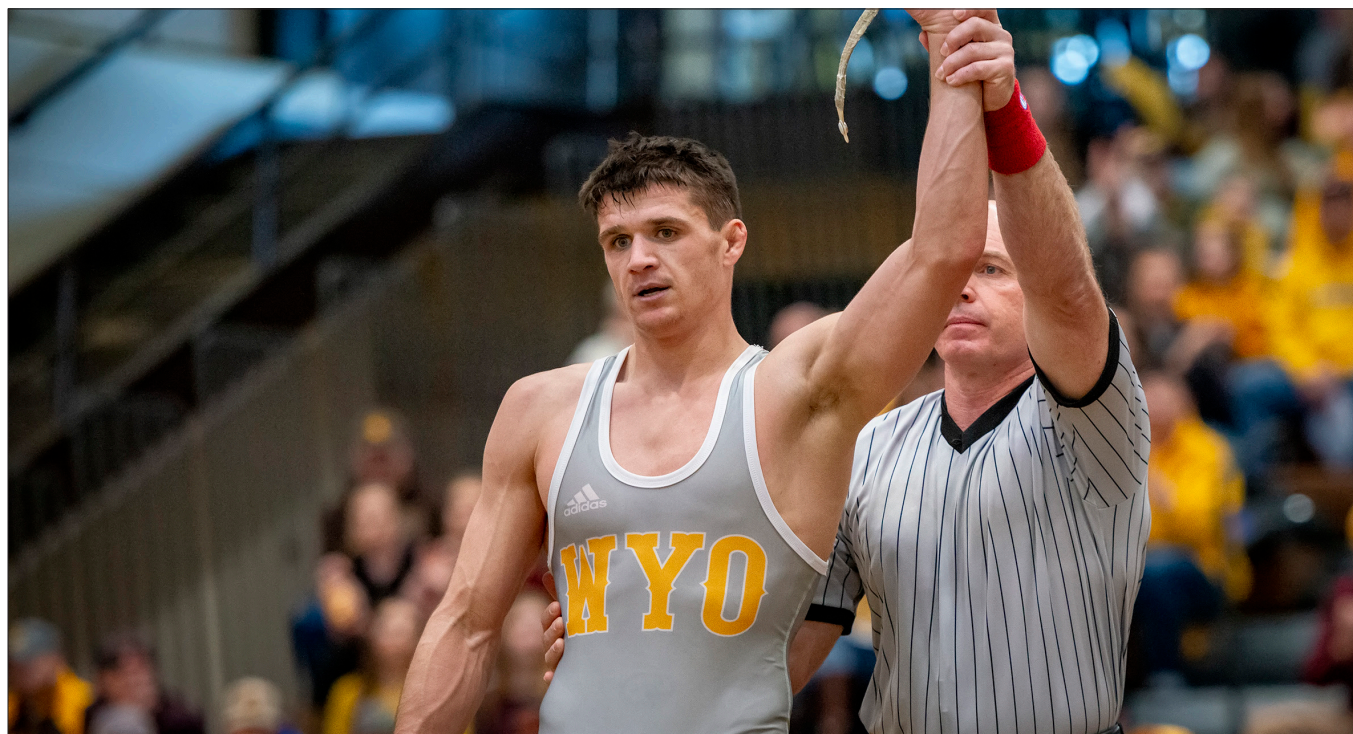

TROY, N.Y. - Against Virginia, four Cowboys got key wins in their first dual starts, while veterans Montorie Bridges, Branson Ashworth and Dewey Krueger held serve in their matches to claim the Pokes' first dual victory of the season.

After Virginia opened up with a 9-2 decision by No. 7 Louie Hayes over Cowboy Cole Verner, Wyoming tied it back up at 3-all with a Bridges 7-5 decision over Brian Courtney. Bridges recorded a pair of takedowns in the first to get to the first break with a 4-1 lead, but a stalling point and takedown awarded to Courtney over the following two periods were enough to get the Cavalier back in the match; however, Bridges was able to outlast Courtney's final efforts for the win.

The Cavaliers would respond with a Sam Krivus 5-3 decision over Wyoming's Sam Turner to retake a 6-3 lead, but from there the Cowboys were able to string together four consecutive victories to take control of the dual.

Jaron Jensen tallied his first dual win in a 6-4 edge over Virginia's Michael Murphy at 149 pounds. After a scoreless first period, Murphy opened the second with an escape from the down position and a takedown just five seconds later to take an early, 3-0 lead. Jensen was able to escape before the end of the second, and headed into the third trailing 3-1, but the redshirt sophomore came up big in the third with a pair of takedowns to lock up the first dual win of his career.

At 157, Dewey Krueger started hot with a takedown and pair of nearfalls to get to the second period of his match against Jake Keating with an 8-0 advantage. Krueger was able to record another takedown to open the second and stretch his lead to 10, but Keating wouldn't go away quietly as the Cavalier recorded a couple of takedowns and a nearfall in the final frame to tighten the score; however, it was too late as Krueger came out with the 13-7 decision.

In the only ranked matchup of the day, No. 11 Ashworth dominated No. 19 Cam Coy in a 6-1 decision. Ashworth scored a pair of takedowns while preventing Coy from scoring anything but a third-period escape.

A 3-0 win by Hayden Hastings at 174 pounds stretched the Wyoming lead to 15-6. Heavyweight Brian Andrews closed out the dual for the Brown and Gold with a 6-4 decision over Quinn Miller.

LARAMIE, Wyo. - The Wyoming team got a handful of strong performances in its dual against No. 7 Nebraska, but came up short, 22-12, to the Huskers.

The Cowboys (2-1) saw big wins from Brian Andrews, Cole Verner and Branson Ashworth in the match. Andrews scored the lone bonus point win for the Pokes with a big fall at heavyweight, while Ashworth and Verner both earned top-10 wins at their weights.

"Going into the dual, we were only favored in one match and we ended up losing it, so you know it could go pretty badly, but then you have guys that step up and wrestle well early," head coach Mark Branch said. "That's what I was afraid of too, because if you could've chose a weight to start at, that wouldn't have been where we started. We knew coming out of the gate we were probably underdogs in the first four matches, and if you drop the first four it's going to be tough to turn things around.

"Then we won two of the first four with a pin, so I wouldn't say that things went great in the first four, but at the same time we had momentum. We had excitement and we had engagement, then we just lost it."

The dual started at 184 pounds, as Nebraska picked up wins at 184 and 197 to open the day with a 6-0 lead. Nebraska's third-ranked Taylor Venz earned a 7-1 decision over Cowboy Carless Looney in the first bout of the match before No. 14 Eric Schultz edged out Wyoming's Cale Davidson, 7-3.

The Huskers wouldn't hold the advantage for long, however, as Andrews decked Christian Lance to tie up the team score at six. After a scoreless first period, Andrews chose down and escaped to take a 1-0 lead. With 12 seconds to go in the second, the Cowboy sophomore scored a takedown before taking Lance to his back for the pin with seven seconds to go in the frame. The win moved Andrews to 3-0 in dual matches and 9-1 overall. It was his second pin of the season.

Verner faced a tough test at 125 pounds, matched up with two-time All-American and 2015 NCAA finalist Zeke Moisey; however, the Cowboy junior was up for the challenge, taking the bout, 5-2 over the fifth-ranked Husker. Moisey scored the first takedown of the match, before an escape from Verner less than 20 seconds later to get to the end of the first period with a 2-1 Moisey lead. Moisey chose down to open the second and Verner took advantage by riding out the full two minutes. In the third, Verner got the quick escape to tie up the match, and recorded a last-second escape as the clock wound down to lock up the first ranked win of his career.

Nebraska would get wins in the next four bouts to stretch its lead to 10 at 19-9. At 165, Ashworth answered with a big win over No. 9 Isaiah White. Ashworth was able to escape from the down position quickly to open the second period and take a 1-0 lead following a scoreless first. White chose down to open the final frame, but couldn't get out as the Cowboy senior rode out the match while picking up a couple of stall warnings on White on the way to the 3-0 decision.

The win was Ashworth's third ranked win of the season and moved him to 9-1 overall.

At 174 pounds, redshirt freshman Hayden Hastings was up against No. 10 Mike Labriola to close out the dual. Labriola came out hot, stretching his lead to 10-4 early on against the Cowboy freshman. Hastings found his footing early in the third, however, and despite not getting the win, scored a couple of takedowns in the final two minutes to narrow Labriola's advantage to 14-11 before the final buzzer.

STILLWATER, Okla. - The Wyoming wrestling team dropped a 27-6 dual at No. 2 Oklahoma State on Sunday afternoon at Gallagher-Iba Arena.

The Cowboys (2-2, 0-1 Big 12) got impressive wins from Branson Ashworth and Cale Davidson in the dual, with Ashworth knocking off No. 5 Chandler Rogers and Davidson defeating Andrew Marsden. The rest of the team hung tough, despite going toe to toe with a team that fielded a lineup that featured top-12 grapplers in all but two weights.

Oklahoma State struck first, as sixth-ranked Kaid Brock edged Sam Turner for a 14-10 decision, followed by a 9-1 Kaden Gfeller major decision over Wyoming's Jaron Jensen to take a 7-0 lead early. At 157, Wyoming's Dewey Krueger came up short in a 3-1 decision to No. 17 Andrew Shomers.

Ashworth got the Cowboys on the board with a big, 4-1, decision over fifth-ranked Chandler Rogers. After a scoreless first period, Rogers elected to open the second on bottom. Ashworth was able to ride out the entirety of the second, followed by a quick escape to open the third. With under a minute to go in the match, Ashworth all but sealed the victory with a takedown to quiet the Stillwater crowd. It pushed Ashworth's record in the series against Rogers to 2-1.

Redshirt freshman Hayden Hastings faced a tough test at 174 pounds, matching up against eighth-ranked All-American Jacobe Smith. Smith got on the board first with a quick takedown to go up, 2-1, after the Hastings escape, and his lead was stretched to 4-1 as he was able to reverse Hastings from the down position in the second period. Heading into the final frame, Hastings picked up a point on the escape before scoring a takedown to knot up the score at four late. The Cowboy freshman rode hard on top, nearly completing the ride-out; however, Smith added another reversal with six seconds on the clock to hold on to the 6-5 decision.

OSU stretched its lead to 17-3 at 184 pounds as No. 12 Dakota Geer defeated Wyoming's Carless Looney by way of 14-4 major decision.

Wyoming snagged another win at 197 pounds as redshirt freshman Cale Davidson knocked off Andrew Marsden in an 8-5 decision. It was a bout filled with scrambles, as the two wrestlers combined for three takedowns and a couple of reversals. Davidson was able to come out on top of most of the madness, opening with a takedown early, followed by a reversal after Marsden was able to escape and score what would be the OSU Cowboy's only offensive score of the match. Davidson added another takedown in the second and a reversal from the down position in the third to lock up the second dual win of his career.

At heavyweight, Wyoming sophomore held his own with OSU's third-ranked Derek White, but ultimately came up short in an 8-2 loss. OSU added another four points to its lead with a 12-4 major decision over Cole Verner by third-ranked Nick Piccininni at 125 pounds.

LARAMIE, Wyo. - The 21st-ranked Wyoming wrestling team picked up its first Big 12 win of the season on Saturday afternoon in the Arena-Auditorium, overwhelming No. 19 North Dakota State, 29-6.

The Cowboys (3-2, 1-1 Big 12) took eight of the 10 bouts from the Bison, including bonus point wins from Montorie Bridges, Dewey Krueger and Carless Looney. The Pokes dominated on top as well, earning four full-period rideouts in the dual.

The night started at 197 pounds, where redshirt freshman Cale Davidson picked up a 6-3 decision over No. 20 Cordell Eaton. Eaton struck first in the bout, scoring a takedown with 18 seconds left to go in the first period. Davidson was able to get on the board with a second left on the escape, followed by a full second period rideout from the top starting position to keep the score at 2-1 heading into the final frame. From the down position, Davidson picked up a reversal 30 seconds into the third and sealed the match with 33 seconds to go in the bout with a takedown and rideout.

Heavyweight Brian Andrews followed up the win by Davidson with a 3-1 sudden victory decision over Brandon Metz to stretch the team score to 6-0.

At 125 pounds, Cole Verner came up just short of an upset over No. 8 Brent Fleetwood.

Bridges recorded five takedowns en route to a 12-3 major decision over North Dakota State's Paul Bianchi at 133 pounds to lock up the first bonus point win of the dual for Wyoming and put the Pokes up, 10-3, in the match. It marked Bridges' third major of the season.

At 141, Sam Turner ran off six unanswered points following an early takedown for NDSU's Gavin Sutton in the first period. Turner was able to escape quickly and later notch a takedown with five seconds to go to take a 3-2 lead into the second. After riding out the entirety of the second period, Turner scored a reversal from the down starting position in the third and finished off the match with the riding time point for the 6-2 win over Sutton.

The Bison got back on the board for what would be the final time at 149 pounds, as Jaden Van Maanen defeated Cowboy Jaron Jensen, 7-5, in sudden victory.

Junior Dewey Krueger saw the mat for a full 1:44 on Saturday as he decked Bison Nick Knutson for a first-period fall to stretch Wyoming's lead to 19-6.


Senior Branson Ashworth pushed his record against NDSU's Andrew Fogarty to 4-2 on Saturday with a convincing 6-0 win over the 13th-ranked Bison junior. Ashworth dominated the match, taking down Fogarty with 1:20 to go in the first, then rode out the remainder of the first and entirety of the second to lead 2-0 heading into the final frame. Ashworth escaped from bottom to open the third, before scoring one last takedown with 44 seconds to go to all but lock up the win.

At 174 pounds, redshirt freshman Hayden Hastings dominated the third period to drop Lorenzo De La Riva, 7-3. With the score tied at two heading into the frame, Hastings scored the reversal just 17 seconds in. The victory marked the highest-ranked win for the Pokes on record in the program's history, as well as the first top 10 win since 2012, when the Cowboys dropped No. 10 Oklahoma. It was also the third top-10 win of the Branch era.

The Cowboys started the first dual of the day on a high note as Cowboy junior Cole Verner pinned No. 7 Sean Fausz of NC State in the first period to take a 6-0 lead. Verner got the takedown over Fausz just 40 seconds into the bout, before getting the pin in 2:20.

LARAMIE, Wyo. - The 11th-ranked Wyoming wrestling team earned its sixth-straight win on Sunday afternoon, fighting off Oregon State in a thrilling, 22-16 win inside the UniWyo Sports Complex. The win marks the Pokes' third-straight win in the series with the Beavers.

The Cowboys (10-3) won six of the ten bouts, including a fall from senior Branson Ashworth at 165 pounds and a major decision from Montorie Bridges at 133. Wyoming was able to win the dual outright and avoid the result being decided by criteria thanks to a win by Cowboy redshirt sophomore Jaron Jensen in the final bout of the night.

"It was a nail-biter and a hard-earned win," head coach Mark Branch said. "We had some guys that got a chance to be the hero. That was good for Jaron. It's difficult being in that situation, having to carry the balance of everything that had happened previous to that."

The two teams traded blows for the opening four matches. Oregon State took an early, 4-0 lead in the dual after No. 18 Hunter Willits defeated Cowboy Dewey Krueger by 10-0 major decision. The Pokes took their first lead of the dual at 6-4 as Ashworth recorded a quick, first-period fall over Colton Beisley in 2:10. Ashworth has now recorded nine-straight wins with six-straight coming with bonus points.

The Beavers took a 7-6 lead at 174 pounds with a Colt Doyle 4-2 decision over redshirt freshman Hayden Hastings; however, Wyoming answered right back as freshman Tate Samuelson recorded an 8-2 decision over Bob Coleman to move to 3-0 in duals for his season. The Castle Rock, Colo., native recorded a takedown in all three periods and took the riding time point to put Coleman away and allow Wyoming to take a 9-7 lead.

The Cowboys led, 12-7, at the halfway point after redshirt freshman Cale Davidson took a 6-2 victory over Jamarcus Grant. Grant tallied the first takedown of the bout, but following a quick Davidson escape after the takedown and another to open the second period, the Cowboy got to the third frame tied up at two apiece with a stall warning already on Grant. Davidson put together a full-period ride in the final period to lock up riding time, paired with three more stalling calls on Grant before the final buzzer.

Oregon State wouldn't roll over, getting wins from No. 4 heavyweight Amar Dhesi and No. 3 Ronnie Bresser at 125 pounds to regain a 16-12 lead with only three bouts to go in the dual.

The Cowboys tied the match in the next bout, with All-American Montorie Bridges picking up a crucial major decision over Kegan Calkins. Bridges was in command of the match from wire to wire, racking up five takedowns and a minute and a half of riding time on the way to the 13-5 major. It marked the fifth major of the season for Bridges, which leads all starters.

Sam Turner came up big in the 141-pound match, compiling a trio of takedowns and nearly three minutes of riding time to notch a 9-3 win over Grant Willits and give the Pokes the 19-16 advantage heading into the final bout.


With one match remaining, Wyoming needed a win from 149-pounder Jaron Jensen over the Beavers' Josh Reyes to secure the outright dual victory.

Reyes struck first with a takedown in the opening minute of the match. Jensen was able to escape within 40 seconds, and tie the match in the following period with a quick escape from the bottom position to begin the frame.

Following a Reyes escape to open the third, the Cowboy needed to put a score and rideout together in order to clinch the match. After over a minute of trading shots on their feet, Jensen was able to get in on a shot and convert on a takedown on the edge of the mat with 31 seconds to go. When Reyes couldn't get out from bottom before the final buzzer, Jensen was crowned the winner in a 4-3 decision.

The teams got off to a late start, with weather delaying Air Force's arrival and pushing the dual back over an hour before the originally scheduled start time; however, the Cowboys showed toughness in jumping on the Falcons from the start and not letting up. The Pokes won nine out of 10 bouts, with four of their victories coming with bonus points.

"It was a dominant performance," head coach Mark Branch said. "And you start to wonder because our guys were pretty irritable waiting on Air Force to get here being down to wait by 5:30 when we didn't end up weighing in until 7:10. You get irritated pretty quick when you thought you were going to be able to eat an hour ago. We just wanted to keep them calm and keep them focused. Everything was kind of thrown out of wack, so I was happy that they responded well."

The dual opened at 157 pounds, where Dewey Krueger matched up with Air Force's Alex Mossing. Krueger rebounded from an early Mossing takedown in the first 30 seconds of the match and a 2-1 deficit heading into the second period. Krueger outscored Mossing, 3-0, in the second, escaping from bottom within a few seconds before notching the go-ahead takedown with 35 seconds to go in the frame. With Mossing electing to start the final period in neutral, the Cowboy was able to fend off a handful of attacks for the 4-2 win.

Senior Branson Ashworth stayed hot at 165 pounds, winning his 10th bout in a row and recording his seventh-straight bonus point match. Ashworth closed out Falcon Marcus Amico before the end of the second period, racking up three takedowns and three nearfalls on the way to an 18-2 tech. In his seven-match bonus point streak, the Cowboy has compiled three pins, two technical falls and two major decisions.

At 174, redshirt freshman Hayden Hastings rebounded from a Cody Suratt takedown in the first five seconds of the bout to score a takedown of his own and lead, 3-2, heading to the second. Along with taking the 125-pound match by forfeit, the Cowboys (12-3, 3-1 Big 12) racked up three falls in the win, putting the Mountaineers away quickly with under hour between the dual's first and last whistles. Wyoming picked up wins in the only two ranked-versus-ranked bouts, and won six of the nine contested bouts on the day.

"They were important wins, especially with Big 12 seeding around the corner," head coach Mark Branch said. "Those are going to help put us in the right place in the bracket...I still want to see our guys be more aggressive. There was some frustration there with our guys not opening up as much as they're capable of, but they got important wins. It was frustrating to see a couple of our guys on the wrong side of a couple of pins, but we needed them on the other side and we got them from Tony (Lombardo), Tate (Samuelson) and Sam (Turner), so that was gratifying to see."

With their eighth-straight win, the Pokes tie the fourth-longest win streak in program history and closed since the 2012 season. The team also moved to 2-0 all-time against the Mountaineers.

West Virginia started the dual with a 6-0 lead, as Zach Moore earned the first-period fall over Cowboy redshirt freshman Jed Loveless at 157; however, the Pokes ran off 15-straight points over the next three bouts.

Branson Ashworth got the Cowboys on the board at 165 pounds, dropping No. 19 Nick Kiussis in a 2-0 win. Andrews elected to start the final period in the neutral position, needing a takedown to tie the match. Getting in on a couple of single-leg attacks, he was unable to finish as the time ran out. Nevills would take the 4-2 decision and put the Bulldogs up, 3-0, to start.

The Cowboys tied the score up at three apiece as Cole Verner held off Robert Garcia in a 5-4 decision. After the two wrestlers traded takedowns in the first, Verner carried a 3-2 lead into the second. Verner earned a quick escape from the down starting position to open the third following a scoreless second to push his lead to 4-2, but gave up a tying takedown with about 30 seconds to go. Needing an escape to secure his win, Verner was able to get out with 15 seconds to go and fight off a few Garcia attacks to lock up the win.

Redshirt sophomore Montorie Bridges gave the Cowboys their first lead of the day at 133 pounds, holding off Fresno State's Gary Joint, 6-2. Trailing, 2-1, heading to the third period after Joint was able to score a two-point nearfall in the second, Bridges put together a strong ride over the final two minutes, scoring a four-point nearfall of his own during his full-period ride out to wrap up the bout.

The Cowboys stretched their lead to 9-3 with a 5-2 Sam Turner decision over Chris Deloza at 141 pounds. Turner was able to convert on two takedowns in the bout while holding Deloza without an offensive score.

Fresno State picked up its second win of the day at 149 pounds as No. 16 Kristian Olivas edged Cowboy Jaron Jensen in a wild bout. Jensen was able to reverse Olivas a couple of times, but Olivas pulled away with a reversal of his own in the final period to grab the 9-6 win.

Fresno State regained the lead at 157 pounds as Jacob Wright pinned Cowboy Jed Loveless midway through the third period.

Senior Branson Ashworth tied the score back up at 12 with an 8-3 decision over Isaiah Hokit at 165 to tie the team score back up at 12 apiece. With the win, Ashworth picked up his 12th-straight win and moved to 16-0 in dual matches.

The Bulldogs would go on to win three-straight bouts at 174, 184 and 197 to secure the dual victory over the Cowboys.

BAKERSFIELD, Calif. - The Cowboys bounced back from a tough loss earlier in the day on Sunday night, handling CSU Bakersfield, 25-6. Wyoming won eight of 10 bouts on the way to its 13th win of the season.

Again starting at heavyweight, Brian Andrews got things rolling early for the Pokes with a 10-2 major decision over Jarrod Snyder. Andrews recorded takedowns in the first and second periods, along with a four-point nearfall in the opening frame to lock up the major. Now 26-8 on the year, the Cowboy sophomore has turned in three major decisions on the year and nine bonus point wins total.

Cole Verner snagged his second win of the day in an 8-3 decision over Edward Flores and boost the Wyoming lead to 7-0. Verner led throughout the match, scoring a takedown in each of the three periods while denying Flores any offensive points to take the win. With his two wins on Sunday, Verner eclipsed the 20-win mark on the year.

Redshirt sophomore Montorie Bridges came out of a wild bout against No. 17 Sean Nickell with a 10-9 decision. The two traded takedowns in the first period, with Nickell scoring two of his own for a 5-3 lead heading into the second. Bridges outscored Nickell in the second, 4-1, with a takedown and nearfall to seize a 7-6 lead after two. Both wrestlers were able to score an escape and takedown in the final frame, with Bridges getting the final score of the bout by way of a takedown in the final seconds. The Cowboy, who also won both of his matches on Sunday, pushed his win streak to eight with the victory.

Cowboy Sam Turner fought off a late push from Roadrunner Carlos Herrera in the 141-pound match. Turner pushed his lead to 8-0 midway through the second period, but a reversal to end the frame and a seven-point offensive flurry by Herrera in the third kept the match too close for comfort. Nonetheless, Turner would come out with the 10-9 decision to give Wyoming a 13-0 lead.

The Roadrunners wouldn't go away quietly, as they picked up decisions at 149 and 157 pounds to cut the Cowboy advantage to seven at 13-6.

From that point it was all Cowboys, as the Pokes rattled off four-straight wins to wrap up the dual.

Senior Branson Ashworth added another win to his day with an 8-2 decision over Jacob Thalín at 165 pounds. Ashworth scored a couple of takedowns and a nearfall in the win to push his overall record this season to 27-3. He also moved into 10th place on the school's all-time wins list with 115 for his career.

At 174, Hayden Hastings saw his first action of the day in an 8-5 win over Bryan Battisto. Hastings scored a couple of takedowns and a reversal in the win. The victory marked his 20th of the season thus far, making the redshirt freshman the seventh Cowboy starter to crack the 20-win mark this year.

Freshman Tate Samuelson got back on track after giving up the first dual loss of his career in the Cowboys' battle with Fresno State earlier in the day. Samuelson was impressive against Dom Ducharme, shutting out the Roadrunner in a 4-0 win—his 19th of the season.

Bumping up to 197 pounds after wrestling at 174 earlier in the day, Anthony Lombardo picked up a win over Mark Penyacsek in a 7-2 bout. Lombardo snagged a takedown in the first, followed by reversals in the second and third to pick up the win that moved him to 10-4 overall this year and 3-1 in duals.
