2020-21 NOTES

- The Cowgirls begin their 21st season of Mountain West play on Saturday. UW is 190-146 all-time in MW play.
- The Cowgirls have had double-digit wins in Mountain West play for four consecutive seasons. Wyoming has finished top-three in the league in each of those four seasons.
- Through two games this season, sophomore McKinley Bradshaw leads the Cowgirls in scoring at 12.5 points per game and is shooting 4-of-8 from 3-point range. Bradshaw averaged 4.7 points per game last season and shot 39 percent from beyond-the-arc.
- Junior **Quinn Weidemann** begins the 2020-21 season with a streak of 32 consecutive made free throws, dating back to last season's road game against Colorado State on Feb. 15, 2020. Weidemann took no free throws Saturday
- The Cowgirls have student-athletes from seven different countries: The United States (8), Australia (1), Croatia (1), Greece (1), Iceland (1), Poland (1) and Spain (2).
- The 17 wins in Gerald Mattinson's first year at the helm of the Cowgirls are a program record for the most by a first-year head coach.

LARAMIE, Wyo. (Dec. 8, 2020) – 25th-ranked Gonzaga shot 55 percent from the field and held Wyoming to just 34.6 percent shooting as the Cowgirls fell in their non-conference home finale Tuesday night in the Arena-Auditorium, 89-50.

Wyoming (1-1) trailed by just two, 20-18 after the first quarter but was outscored in the second 22-12 and found themselves trailing at the half, 42-30. The Bulldogs (2-2) shot 9-of-12 from the floor in the second while UW was just 4-of-12. In the second half, Gonzaga picked up right where it left off to end the first and outscored the Cowgirls 47-20 in the final 20 minutes. UW shot just 7-for-25 (28 percent) in the last two quarters.

"Gonzaga's good players were the difference tonight, their length and physicality caused us to double down in the post and then their ability to shoot the ball let them get on a roll, they played like a top-20 team tonight," said Head Coach Gerald Mattinson.

The Bulldogs shot 12-of-20 from 3-point range, a 60 percent clip while Wyoming hit 7-of-24 (29.2 percent) from GU also had a 38-22 scoring edge in paint points while also getting 16 second-chance points and 40 points off the bench. The Cowgirls meanwhile, had three second-chance points and 16 from their bench.

Quinn Weidemann led the way for the Cowgirls with eight points on the night and hit a pair of 3-pointers. McKinley Bradshaw, Dagny Davidsdottir and Alba Sanchez Ramos all added seven. Davidsdottir led UW with six rebounds while Sanchez Ramos dished out three assists. Tommi Olson led Wyoming with four assists in the loss.

Jaye Johnson led the Cowgirl bench with six points as she went 2-for-4 from 3-point range while Marta Savic, in her first action with the

Brown & Gold, scored five points and grabbed four boards. Paula Salazar also made her career debut and chipped in with a pair of buckets and recorded the Cowgirls' lone block.

Jenn Wirth led the way for the Bulldogs as she scored 16 points on 7-of-8 shooting and had 10 boards and three assists on the night. Cierra Walker added 12 and went a perfect 4-for-4 from 3-point range.

UW got out of the gates strong, shooting 7-of-13 in the first quarter, but a 16-0 run from the Bulldogs to end the first and begin the first 3:29 of the second quarter put them up 32-18 and they would not look back, leading by as many as 16 in the half, 28-22 with 3:24 to play.

BRADSHAW'S BIG GAME

Sophomore **McKinley Bradshaw** led the Cowgirls with 18 points in her first-career start Saturday in UW's 79-67 win over Denver. Bradshaw made seven field goals and went 3-for-5 from 3-point range. Bradshaw also added five rebounds, an assist and a steal in the win.

DAVIDSDOTTIR'S DEBUT

Senior transfer **Dagny Davidsdottir** recorded a double-double in her Brown & Gold debut. The Niagara transfer scored 14 points on 5-of-7 shooting while grabbing a game-high 11 rebounds against DU. Davidsdottir also led the way with a pair of blocks on the day.

USTOWSKA POWERS COWGIRLS BENCH

In her first career game, freshman **Ola Ustowska** led Wyoming's bench with nine points in the win over Denver. The Kartuzy, Poland native made a trio of 3-pointers in 16 minutes off the bench while also adding three boards and a pair of assists.

COWGIRLS SURGE LATE IN WIN

Wyoming scored the final 10 points of its season opener against Denver and ended the contest on a 13-3 run over the final 4:09 of the game while hitting 9-of-10 shots down the stretch. The Cowgirls held the Pioneers scoreless the final 3:53 of the contest and outscored DU 25-13 in the fourth quarter while hitting 10-of-14 shots in the final frame.

A LOOK AT THE WYOMING COWGIRLS

The Cowgirls finished the 2020-21 season with a 17-12 record overall and a 12-6 record in Mountain West play. Sophomore **Tereza Vitulova** led the Cowgirls in scoring and rebounding with averages of 14.2 points and 5.6 rebounds per game. Senior **Taylor Rusk** and sophomore **Quinn Weidemann** each averaged 10.2 points per game this year. Rusk also averaged 4.9 rebounds and led the Cowgirls with 75 total assists. Weidemann averaged 2.6 assists and made a team-best 46 three-pointers. Sophomore **Alba Sanchez Ramos** averaged 7.2 points and 4.9 rebounds per game, while freshman **Jaeden Vaifanua** averaged 7.1 points and 4.1 rebounds off the bench. Defensively, Vitulova led the Cowgirls with 20 blocks, while sophomore **Tommi Olson** led Wyoming with 36 steals.

The Cowgirls shot 42.9 percent (700-1,633) from the field, 33.8 percent (198-585) from three-point range and 78.3 percent (271-346) from the free throw line to average 64.4 points per game. Wyoming averaged 12.8 assists and 13.0 turnovers per game. Opponents shot 39.2 percent (654-1,668) from the field, 32.0 percent (157-365) from three and 75.6 percent (276-365) from the free throw line to average 60.0 points per game. Cowgirl foes averaged 10.5 assists and 11.5 turnovers per game.

Head coach **Gerald Mattinson** finished his first year as head coach of the Cowgirls and owns a 17-12 record. He spent the previous 16 seasons on the Wyoming bench as an assistant and associate head coach.

SPREADING THE SCORING

The Cowgirls had three different players average double-figure scoring in 2019-20, marking the first such occurrence since the 2015-16 season. This year, **Tereza Vitulova** (14.2), **Taylor Rusk** (10.2) and **Quinn Weidemann** (10.2) all averaged double figures. In 2015-16, **Marquelle Dent** (15.5), **Marta Gomez** (10.7), **Jordan Kelley** (10.5) and **Liv Roberts** (10.1) all averaged at least 10 points per game.

LONG RANGE SUPERSTAR

Junior **Quinn Weidemann** is a top-five all-time three-point shooter at Wyoming. She ranks fourth all time converting 41.0 percent (93-227) of her long range attempts.

IN THE RECORD BOOK

Junior guard **Quinn Weidemann** is now 18th all-time at Wyoming in made three point shots with 95 makes, and 22nd all-time in attempts with 231. Her three-point field goal percentage of .411 is fourth all-time among Cowgirls. With one more free throw attempt, she will qualify for the free throw percentage all-time list, where she would be fourth right now with a .848 career mark from the charity stripe.

Weidemann's career-high of seven made three pointers is tied for second in a single game in school history.

Junior guard **Tommi Olson** has a career-high of seven steals in a game, which is tied for fifth most in a single game in school history.

of her career. The Rams dared the Worland, Wyo., native to shoot, and she answered the bell with a career game.

A START TO REMEMBER

Sophomore **Tommi Olson** made her first career start against Utah State (1/29/20) and had the best game of her young career. She played a career-high 39 minutes and recorded career highs in points (4), rebounds (8) and assists (7). She also added two steals, including one late in the fourth quarter that led to a fastbreak layup to seal the win.

THE OLSON DIFFERENCE

Junior **Tommi Olson** was a shot of adrenaline for Wyoming's offense last season. Before she joined the starting lineup, the Cowgirls were 9-9 overall, shot 41.6 percent from the field and averaged 65.6 points, 36.3 rebounds and 12.6 assists per game. Because of state and city regulations due to Covid-19, UW basketball attendance will be set at a maximum of 2,000 fans per game through the end of December 2020. This attendance number equates to 17 percent of capacity of the Arena-Auditorium.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENT - UNLV

SCOUTING UNLV

The Lady Rebels enter the conference slate with a 1-2 mark on the season so far. UNLV is averaging 70 points per game and allowing 82.3 points per through three games while shooting 34.8 percent from the floor and 35.6 percent from 3-point range. UNLV opponents are shooting nearly 50 percent from the field (48.7) and hitting 36.5 percent of their shots from beyond-the-arc.

Bailey Thomas leads the Lady Rebels in scoring at 15.3 points per game and is one of four players averaging in double figures. Delaynie Byrne and Desi-Rae Young are both averaging 10.3 points per contest while Byrne leads the team averaging 5.3 rebounds per game. Jade Thomas is also in double figures averaing 10 a game.

UNLV was picked to finish ninth in the league in the preseason Mountain West poll and will be playing its third and fourth contests at home this season when it hosts the Cowgirls. The Lady Rebels are 0-2 in Vegas so far this year.

Lindy La Rocque is in her first season as the head coach of UNLV.

LAST TIME AGAINST UNLV

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (January 11, 2020) – For the second-consecutive game, the Cowgirls held a halftime lead on the road, but struggle din the third quarter on their way to a Mountain West loss. Wyoming (7-8, 3-3 MW) fell on the road by a final score of 65-53 against UNLV (8-8, 4-1 MW). The Cowgirls have now lost three in a row, while the Lady Rebels have won five straight.

The Cowgirls were led offensively by senior Taylor Rusk and sophomore Tereza Vitulova. Rusk scored a season-high 16 points on an efficient 6-of-9 shooting, including making three shots from beyond the arc. Rusk also had a team-best four assists and a team-high three steals. For Rusk, it is the third game in a row reaching double-figures and the sixth time this season.

Vitulova matched Rusk’s scoring with 16 points, and grabbed five rebounds on the day. Vitulova tied her career high with two made three-point field goals. Vitulova has now reached at least 10 points in three straight games and 12 times overall this season.

Quinn Weidemann scored eight points and had three assists, a block and steal for UW. Jaeden Vaifanua had seven points and seven rebounds to go along with an assist.

Overall, the Cowgirls shot 40.4 percent (21-52) from the field, 32.0 percent (8-25) from three and went a perfect 3-of-3 from the free throw line. It is the third time this season the Cowgirls haven’t missed a free throw in a game. Wyoming had 15 assists and 18 turnovers in the loss.

UNLV had pair of double-digit scorers in Latecia Smith (19) and Rodjanae Wade (22). Wade had a double-double with a game-high 10 rebounds.

The Lady Rebels shot 44.2 percent (23-52) from the field, 21.1 percent (4-19) from three and 93.8 percent (15-16) from the free throw line. UNLV had 14 assists and 11 turnovers on the day.

SERIES HISTORY AGAINST UNLV

Wyoming holds a slight edge in the all-time series, having won 25 of the previous 49 meetings. The two teams met just once in 2019-20, a 65-53 victory for UNLV in Vegas. The Cowgirls are 7-16 all-time on the road against the Lady Rebels.

GERALD MATTINSON

University of Wyoming
Head Women's Basketball Coach

Gerald Mattinson has been named the seventh head coach in the history of University of Wyoming Cowgirl basketball. Before being named the head coach, Mattinson spent 16 total years on the Cowgirl bench as an assistant coach, including the last 13 of those years as the associate head coach.

In his first season at the helm of the Cowgirls in 2019-20, Mattinson led UW to a 17-12 record, which is the most wins by a first-year head coach in program history. Wyoming earned the No. 3 seed in the conference tournament and advanced to the semifinals. The Cowgirls led the Mountain West in free throw percentage, making a school-record 78.3 percent of their shots from the free throw line. Additionally, the Cowgirls finished top-three in the league in eight other statistical categories.

Mattinson also guided sophomore Tereza Vitulova to all-Mountain West honors as she averaged 14.2 points and 5.6 rebounds per game while leading the league in field goal percentage, making 54.8 percent of her shots. Freshman Jaeden Vaifanua was named to the league's all-freshman team after averaging 7.1 points and 4.1 rebounds per game in her first season at UW. Senior Taylor Rusk became the latest member of the 1,000-point club, and is just the fifth Cowgirl to have both 1,000 points and 300 assists.

Mattinson was a key figure on the bench during the most successful era of Cowgirl basketball before being elevated to head coach, as Wyoming has a record of 314-186 (.628) with Mattinson on the staff. He has helped coach 21 players to All-Mountain West honors and helped mentor five All-Americans and two MW Players of the Year. He has also been on the staff of 10 teams that have recorded at least 20 wins, including each of the last three seasons. In 2007, Mattinson helped guide the Cowgirls to the first WNIT Championship in program history, and his teams reached postseason play a total of nine times during his 16 seasons.

Off the court, 74 Cowgirls have earned academic All-Mountain West honors during the 16 years Mattinson has been at Wyoming, and 46 have been named Mountain West Scholar-Athletes. Clara Tapia has also earned a pair of Academic All-America honors, and she is the only Cowgirl to have more than one such honor.

The 2018-19 season, Mattinson's final season as an associate head coach before taking over as the head coach, was a tremendous one for the Cowgirls, as they won 25 games, the second-most in school history, played in their first MW Championship game and reached the quarterfinals of the WNIT for just the second time in program history. Bailee Cotton was named the league's Defensive Player of the Year and picked up All-Conference and All-Defensive team honors. Marta Gomez led the nation in three-point field goal percentage and was named All-MW. Karla Erjavec was added to the MW All-Freshman team after setting the program's freshman single-season assist record with 124.

During his time on the Cowgirl bench as an assistant coach and associate head coach, Mattinson has seen six of the top-10 scoring teams, six of the top-10 free throw shooting teams, all of the top-10 three point total teams, seven of the top-10 three-point percentage teams, five of the top-10 rebounding teams, six of the top-10 assisting teams and six of the top-10 shot blocking teams in Cowgirl history.

Of the top-10 players in the Cowgirl record books in scoring, rebounding, assisting, stealing and shot blocking, Mattinson-coached players appear 20 times in the 50 spots.

In the past sixteen seasons, the Cowgirls have had 13 winning seasons and reached the postseason nine times. Those 13 winning seasons represent just over half of the total number of winning seasons in 46 years of Cowgirl basketball.

Mattinson's professional coaching career began at Weber State as a graduate assistant coach with the men's basketball program during the 1981-82 season. From 1982-1987, he was the head boy's basketball coach at Rock Springs High School. He earned Wyoming State Coach of the Year honors and was named Conference Coach of the Year twice. From 1987-90, Mattinson was an assistant men's coach at Western Wyoming Community College. He was elevated to

an Assistant Athletics Director and the Head Men's Basketball Coach in 1991 and held the position until 1998. For the 1998-99 season, he became an assistant with the women's program for one year. Mattinson was a business education teacher at Rock Springs High School since 1982 before taking the position of Principal at East Junior High School in June of 2001. He joined former head coach Joe Legerski's staff here at Wyoming following the 2002-03 season.

Mattinson began his college basketball career as a student-athlete at Casper College for head coach Oscar "Swede" Erickson. While there, he played on a team that went 36-4 with a sixth-place finish at the NJCAA Tournament. Mattinson then moved on to a three-year career at Weber State University in Ogden, Utah, where he played for legendary head coach Neil McCarthy. At Weber State, Mattinson played on teams that competed in two NCAA tournaments. He graduated from Weber State with a bachelor of science degree in business education in 1981. He then completed a master of sports science degree from the United States Sports Academy in 1988 and earned his principal endorsement from the University of Wyoming. Mattinson, and his wife, Carey are the parents of three children, stepson Morgan Spichal, stepdaughter Tiffany Paradis and son Ashton.

HEATHER EZELL

Associate Head Coach, Iowa State ('09)

Heather Ezell is entering her sixth season with Cowgirl basketball and her second as the associate head coach in 2019-20. She came to Wyoming after spending four seasons at Southeast Missouri State. She joined the staff in 2011 and was responsible for working with the guards along with organizing practices, game day preparation and running summer camps. In 2012-13, she helped mentor Kara Wright to an Ohio Valley Conference All-Newcomer selection, marking the first Redhawk to earn postseason honors since the 2008-09 season.

Ezell spent the 2010-11 season as an assistant coach at Fairfield University, where the Stags posted a 17-13 overall record and a 10-8 mark in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. She worked primarily with perimeter players while assisting in the day-to-day operations of the program, including practice and game planning, recruiting and coordinating the team's community service efforts.

Ezell had a highly decorated career both collegiately and professionally which began as a four-year letterwinner at Iowa State University (2005-09). She finished her career tied for the Cyclones' career record with 287 made three-point field goals and finished 10th in program history with 1,339 points. In her senior season, Ezell earned Second Team All-Big 12 honors. She ranked 27th nationally with 2.5 three-point field goals made per game and eighth in the Big 12 with 3.5 assists per contest. Ezell also earned a spot on the 2008 Big 12 All-Tournament Team and helped the Cyclones to three NCAA appearances including the Elite Eight in 2009.

Ezell moved onto the professional level in 2009-10, playing in Iceland for Haukar where she was named Best Player in the Iceland Express League. She led the league in points and steals while finishing second in assists and rebounds. She also earned Most Valuable Player recognition in the league's All-Star Game.

A native of Springfield, Mo., Ezell led her Kickapoo High School team to two state championships and a 113-7 record during her prep years. She was named Miss Show Me Basketball as Missouri's top player in 2005. Ezell graduated from Iowa State in 2009 with bachelor's degrees in management and marketing.

FALLON LEWIS

Assistant Coach, Wyoming ('14)

Fallon Lewis is entering her second season as an assistant coach for the Cowgirls, after spending four seasons in an operations capacity for the Wyoming women's basketball team. In total, Lewis is starting her fifth year with the Cowgirls.

Lewis joined the Cowgirl staff as the Director of Recruiting beginning in September 2015. She was recently named the Assistant Director of Player Development. Lewis returned to her alma mater after spending eight months playing for CB Arxil in Pontevedra, Spain. In 24 games, she averaged 11.9 points and 6.5 rebounds in 27.8 minutes per contest. She also spent time over the summer as a private basketball trainer.

Lewis had a highly successful two-year career (2013-14) with the Cowgirls. An Honorable Mention All-Conference selection during her senior campaign, she played in 62 games with 31 starts. In her final season with Wyoming, she averaged 14.3 points and a team-leading 8.9 rebounds. Lewis also recorded 20 points and 21 rebounds in a game becoming only the second player in school history to achieve that. As a junior, she came off the bench and averaged 6.1 points and 3.6 boards in 31 contests. Prior to UW, she spent two seasons at Sheridan College from 2011-12. Lewis was an Honorable Mention NJCAA All-American selection in 2012 and a two-time Region IX All-Conference selection. She helped the Lady Generals to a 45-21 mark and a NJCAA North Sub-Region IX title over her two years.

A Dayton, Wyoming native, Lewis graduated with her degree in business administration from the UW in May of 2014 and was a two-time Academic All-Mountain West selection.

RYAN LARSEN

Assistant Coach, Minnesota State-Moorhead ('02)

Larsen joins the Cowgirls in 2019 after a six-year stint as the head coach at the South Dakota School of Mines. He compiled a 73-87 (.456) overall record and helped guide the Hardrockers to a pair of appearances in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference (RMAC) postseason tournament in 2017 and 2018.

Larsen coached five student-athletes to seven all-RMAC honors during his tenure at South Dakota School of Mines, while seven student-athletes earned 10 academic all-conference accolades. His team also set a single-game school record with 27 assists against Montana State-Billings during the 2016-17 season. The next year, his team set the school record with 242 made three pointers while committing the fourth-fewest personal fouls per game in Division II.

Larsen became the head coach of the Hardrockers after serving five years in Vermillion, S.D., as the assistant women's basketball coach at the University of South Dakota. In his role as an assistant coach for the Coyotes, he was the recruiting coordinator, scouting director, position coach for guards and posts, assisted the head coach with scheduling games and coordinated several off-season camps for the program. Larsen was instrumental in helping the Coyotes to a 75-47 (.618) record during their transition from Division II to Division I basketball. South Dakota competed in two consecutive postseason tournaments, earning a win in the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI) in 2011 and another victory in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT) in 2012.

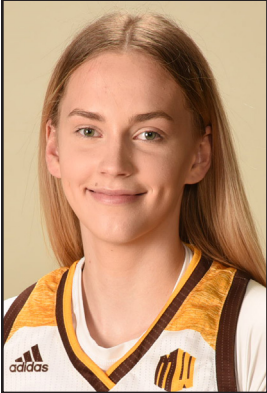

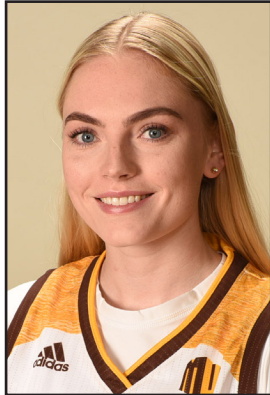

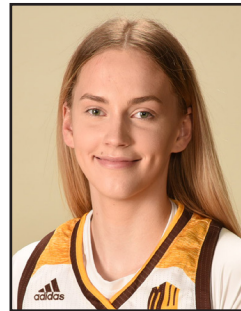
