COLLEEN CORBIN

(Oregon State, '12), Second Season
Cowgirl Soccer Head Coach

Colleen enters her second season as head coach of the Cowgirls' soccer program. She guided Wyoming to an 8-10-1 overall record in her inaugural year, which matched the most wins by a first-year head coach in school history.

Within Corbin's first-year lie many impressive feats. The Cowgirls 3-0-0 start to the season represented the best start in school history. Wyoming netted six goals in a 6-1 win over Nevada (10/17/21) and that marked the most goals scored against a Mountain West Conference foe in program history. The five-goal margin of victory over the Wolf Pack was the largest against a league opponent, as well. In that victory, six different Cowgirls found the back of the net, matching the most against a MWC team and representing the second-most goal scorers ever in a game.

Prior to Wyoming, Corbin was an assistant coach at several different stops. She was the associate head coach at James Madison from 2018-20, an assistant coach at Arizona State for the 2016 season and an assistant coach at CSU-Northridge from 2014-15.

With the Dukes, Corbin helped them win a 2018 Colonial Athletic Conference regular-season championship with a league record of 7-1-1. She coached the JMU goalkeepers who led the league in shutouts, which included Hannah McShea setting the program record for a junior with seven solo shutouts in a single season. McShea was named second-team All-CAA that season. Over Corbin's three years, James Madison boasted a CAA record of 12-8-3.

In Corbin's one season with the Sun Devils, the team went 6-11-2. The summer of 2016 was highlighted by Corbin being named to the National Soccer Coaches Association of America 30 under 30 program.

Corbin began her coaching career at CSU-Northridge. She helped the Matadors combine for 13 shutouts in her two seasons. CSUN went a combined 8-6-2 in Big West Conference play in Corbin's two seasons with the team.



Corbin played collegiately at Oregon State where she was a two-time All-American at goalkeeper. She holds the school record for most shutouts and goals-against average. In her final two seasons with the Beavers, the team went a combined 31-9-4 with one NCAA Tournament appearance that included one victory. Corbin attained a bachelor's degree in education in 2012.

Following her collegiate days, Corbin played professional soccer for a couple seasons. She played for the Western New York Flash of the Women's Premier Soccer League and helped them to a league championship. Corbin also played for the Boston Breakers of the National Women's Soccer League.

Corbin is a native of La Canada, California. She's married to her husband, Nick, and the two reside in Laramie with their two dogs, Tahoe the Great Dane and Mannie the Beagle, and earned his bachelor's degree in marketing in 2000.



JULIE SPRACKLIN

Cowgirl Soccer Assistant Coach



Julie enters her second season as an assistant coach with the Cowgirls' soccer program. She helped guide Wyoming to an 8-10-1 overall record in her first season with the team, which matched the best start in school history under a new head coach.

Spracklin primarily worked with the offensive third in her first season. She helped lead the Cowgirls to a season where they netted 30 goals, which was third best in the Mountain West Conference. That offensive output included a six-goal effort against Nevada, which was the most goals scored ever for the Cowgirls against a league foe. Wyoming tallied at least three goals on five different occasions.

Prior to Wyoming, Spracklin was an assistant coach at James Madison University where she first worked with head coach Colleen Corbin. Before that Spracklin spent three seasons at Misericordia University -- a Division III institution in Pennsylvania -- as a graduate assistant coach. She helped lead the Cougars to over 40 wins in those three seasons and helped guide her team to the Elite Eight in 2018. Her staff was also named the top coaching staff in the region that season.

Spracklin was a 2016-17 NCAA Woman of the Year Award nominee and was named second-team NSCAA Division I Women's Scholar All-American. She was also one of 30 NCAA women's soccer student-athletes named as a candidate for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award and was named first-team NSCAA

Division I All-Northeast Region.

Spracklin attained a bachelor's degree in health studies in 2017. She's a native of Eastampton, New Jersey, and currently resides in Laramie.

In her Cowgirl career, Burton helped lead the team to its first-ever Mountain West Conference regular-season title in 2018. That season saw Wyoming match a program-best 12 victories. As a senior, Burton was named MWC Defensive Player of the Year along with garnering first-team All-MWC honors. She was also named a third-team Scholar All-American by the United Soccer Coaches Association. Burton played nearly 6,500 minutes in her collegiate career and ranks in the top 11 in school history in games played, games started and game-winning goals.

Burton graduated from Wyoming in 2019 with a degree in elementary education and teaching. She originally hails from Centennial, Colorado, and currently lives in Laramie.

University of Wyoming women's soccer head coach Colleen Corbin announced the hiring of assistant coach Kathy Prescott on Friday. Prescott will join the Cowgirls' coaching staff primarily working with goalkeepers.

"I'm thrilled to welcome KP to our already talented and dynamic staff," Corbin said. "It was important to us to bring in an assistant coach who was passionate, motivated, driven, knowledgeable and excited about our culture and the program we are building here in Laramie."

"KP checked every box and then some."

Prescott comes to Laramie from Fordham University. In her two years with the Rams – one of those being a COVID-19 spring season – her goalkeepers boasted a total of five shutouts.

Prior to Fordham, Prescott coached at the University of Pennsylvania for one season. Before that, she spent two seasons at Bryn Mawr College in addition to a short preseason stint at Colgate University.

"I'm incredibly grateful to be joining the Wyoming soccer staff," Prescott said. "I would like to thank Colleen and her staff as well as the administration for giving me the opportunity to contribute to this program as we continue to build a competitive environment. It's a privilege to join such a dedicated, energetic and passionate coaching staff."

Prescott played collegiate soccer at Haverford College. She was the full-time starter her final two years with the Fords. In her last season, Prescott helped her team advance to the NCAA tournament and earned second-team All-Centennial Conference honors.

She attained a bachelor's degree in economics from Haverford in 2017 and followed that up with a master's degree in sports business from Temple University in 2019.

Wyoming Soccer Facilities

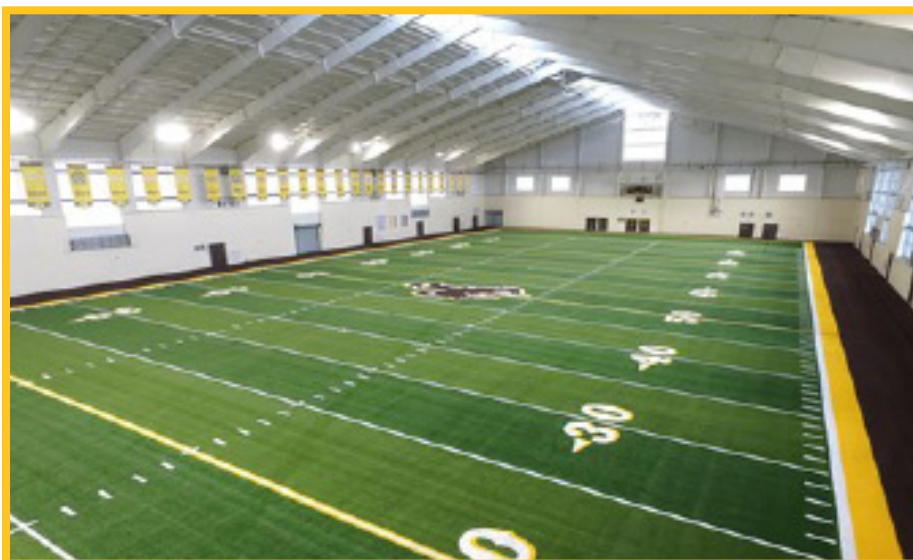


The Louis S. Madrid Sports Complex is one of the most attractive soccer complexes in the nation. It is located a block east of the Wyoming Athletics Department, has a view of the beautiful Laramie Mountain Range to the East and is surrounded by mature pine trees. The complex seats 1,500 fans for soccer as well as for track and field.

The complex is named for Louis S. Madrid, a former Wyoming track letterman who competed for the Cowboys from 1952 through 1955. Thanks to a generous gift from the Madrid estate, as well as contributions from families and fans honoring eight Wyoming track athletes that were tragically killed in a 2001 car accident, a track was constructed around the perimeter of the soccer field in the summer of 2006. The track, named the Memorial Eight Track, is named in memory of those eight track athletes. Beginning in the fall of 2006, the Louis S. Madrid Complex became the outdoor home to the Wyoming track and field team.

The Madrid Complex has been friendly to the Cowgirls as they have won more than 65 games in its 17 year history.

The Cowgirl soccer team now has the luxury of an indoor practice facility. In the fall of 2007, construction was completed Wyoming's new Indoor Practice Facility, located adjacent to Jonah Field at War Memorial Stadium. The field is mostly used by the Wyoming football and soccer teams but ultimately benefits all student athletes at Wyoming. The facility was constructed at a cost of \$11 million, and includes approximately 80,000 square feet of practice area. The field is covered with Desso Challenge Pro 60, a state of the art artificial surface which was also installed at Jonah Field at War Memorial Stadium in the summer of 2005.
