2024-25 NOTES

- **Allyson Fertig** was named the MW Preseason Co-Player of the Year, as well as named to the Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year Watchlist and the Lisa Leslie Award Watchlist.
- The Cowgirls' November 4 season opener against Colorado is the earliest opener for Wyoming in program history.
- **Allyson Fertig** became the 28th member of the 1,000-Point Club in program history January 20 of last season in Wyoming's 67-63 win over Colorado State. **McKinley Dickerson** became the 29th member in the March 24 victory against UTSA.
- **Allyson Fertig** and **Emily Mellema** both received All-Mountain West honors in 2023-24. Fertig was named to the All-Mountain West Team for the second consecutive season while Mellema was selected to the All-Defensive Team.
- 2024 was the Cowgirls' 12th trip to the WNIT in program history. Wyoming is 22-11 all-time at the tournament and was the 2007 champion.
- With its upcoming game against BYU, Wyoming will play a Big 12 opponent in back-to-back contests to start the season.
- Wyoming is six wins away from 800 victories in program history.

LARAMIE, Wyo. (Nov. 4, 2024) – The Wyoming Cowgirls opened the 2024-25 season with a defensive slugfest against Colorado Monday night inside the Arena Auditorium. Unfortunately, the Buffs prevailed in the physical, hard-fought contest, 56-50.

After Colorado opened the game with the first hoop, five-straight points from Ola Ustowska gave the Cowgirls an early lead. Wyoming led 9-6 at the first media timeout. Out of the timeout, both teams continued to feel each other out as the Cowgirls led 15-10 after one.

The second quarter began with the continuation of the defensive struggle before the Buffs started to find their rhythm as the turnover bug started to bite the Cowgirls. Wyoming held onto a 19-18 at the media. The rest of the first half saw UW build the lead back up to 24-18 going into halftime as both teams continued to slug it out to end the second quarter.

Colorado came out and controlled the start of the second half, tying the game up a couple of times before four-straight points from Tess Barnes gave the Cowgirls a 30-26 lead with 5:50 left in the quarter. The Buffs started crashing the offensive boards hard and going to the free throw line in the third quarter. CU took its first lead since it was 2-0 shortly after the third quarter media timeout at 31-30. The Buffaloes lengthened their lead to end the frame and led 38-34 going to the fourth.

Wyoming opened the fourth with a pair of free throws before Colorado reasserted itself on both ends of the court. The Buffs pushed their advantage up to 44-36 with 6:44 left to play as the Cowgirls called a timeout. Following the timeout, a Barnes 3-pointer got the deficit down to five before the Buffs would respond. After back-to-back layups from Allyson Fertig cut the CU lead down to 48-46, Colorado would take a timeout with just 2:44 left.

The final 2:44 saw the two teams exchange layups before a key Cowgirl turnover gave the Buffs the ball back with just over a minute remaining. Wyoming was plagued by turnovers in the loss, committing 19 in the game. Colorado got a big hoop the next time down the court, which all but sealed the contest. CU got a block on the next Cowgirl possession before heading to the line a few times in the final 34 seconds.

"I thought in the third quarter their pressure really started to ramp up and we had a hard time making some entry passes," said Heather Ezell postgame.

"Right after we start to get things rolling, then a turnover would happen. Defensively, when I look at the statsheet and see that only one player got into double figures for

them and she did it by hitting tough shots and not making a lot of 3-pointers, I would have said that's exactly what our scout was. I thought we did everything we needed to defensively, but we shot ourselves in the foot by giving up too many offensive rebounds."

Neither team shot the ball well in the contest with both squads shooting below 40-percent. The Cowgirls shot just 3-of-15 from 3-point range while CU was just 1-for-10. Both teams shot the ball poorly from the free-throw line as well. Wyoming shot 9-for-15 (60-percent), with the Buffs going 13-of-24 (54.2-percent).

Colorado had a big advantage on the boards, especially on the offensive glass. CU out-rebounded the Cowgirls 45-34 on the night and had a plus-12 advantage on offensive rebounds, leading to a 12-5 second-chance point edge. The Buffs also had a 32-28 edge in points in the paint while scoring 15 bench points to Wyoming's two.

Despite being in foul trouble for most of the second half, Fertig led the Cowgirls with 18 points on 7-of-11 shooting. Fertig pulled down five rebounds and had a pair of blocks. Barnes also finished in double figures with 13 points to go along with seven boards. Emily Mellema ended with eight and had four steals. Malene Pedersen led the Cowgirls with four assists in the loss while Ustowska added three.

2024-25 NOTES

WATCH HER

Allyson Fertig was named the Preseason Mountain West Co-Player of the Year in October. Fertig was also named to the Becky Hammon Mid-Major Award Watchlist later in the month. November 1, Fertig was named to the Lisa Leslie Center of the Year Award Watchlist as well.

ELITE COMPANY

Allyson Fertig became the 28th member of the 1,000-Point Club in program history in Wyoming's victory January 20 against Colorado State. Fertig became the 14th Cowgirl to reach 1,000 career points before her senior season. She also became the first Wyoming native since Kayla Woodward (2015) to reach the milestone.

TRACKING DOWN A MILESTONE

McKinley Dickerson became the 29th member of the 1,000-Point Club in the March 24 victory over UTSA in the WNIT. Dickerson scored nine points in the first quarter of the contest to surpass 1,000 career points and had 16 for the game.

ALL-MOUNTAIN WEST HONORS

Allyson Fertig and **Emily Mellema** both received All-Mountain West honors announced prior to the conference tournament last season. Fertig was named to the All-Mountain West Team for the second consecutive season, becoming the first Cowgirl since Liv Roberts in 2016-17 and 2017-18 to be named to the all-conference squad in consecutive seasons. Mellema, meanwhile, was named to the All-Defensive Team, marking the fourth-straight season a Cowgirl has been named to the team.

DYNAMIC DUO

Last season at CSU, **Tess Barnes** (21) and **Emily Mellema** (25) became the first pair of Wyoming teammates to score 20-or-more points in the same game since Alba Sanchez Ramos and Quinn Weidemann both scored 21 points in the Women's NIT contest against UCLA in March of 2022. Barnes and Mellema combined to 16-for-30 overall from the floor and hit 9-of-17 from beyond-the-arc.

IN THE RECORD BOOK

McKinley Dickerson is tied for 14th in program history with 125 career made 3-pointers. Dickerson's 369 career 3-point attempts ranks 15th all-time. She also ranks 15th all-time with a 76.8-percent career free-throw percentage.

Dickerson's 33 points February 14, 2022 at San Jose State are tied for the seventh-most in a single game in program history. Her 13 made field goals in that contest are tied for sixth-best all-time.

Allyson Fertig's 32 career double-doubles are seventh in program history. Fertig's 153 career blocks are fourth all-time. Fertig is also seventh in UW history with 838 career rebounds. Her 514 career made field goals rank 11th all-time. The 1,256 career points from Fertig are 18th. Her seven blocks March 11, 2024 against Boise State are tied for the sixth-most in a single game all-time.

Emily Mellema's seven made 3-pointers January 20, 2024 against Colorado State are tied for the second-most in a single game in program history.

McKinley Dickerson is the current active leader in made 3-pointers with 125 and games played with 112. Dickerson's 169 free throws and 1,030 career points are second-best amongst active Cowgirls. **Allyson Fertig** is first in points (1,256) and is the active leader in rebounds (838), field goals (514) and blocks (153). **Emily Mellema** has a team-best 199 career assists and 90 career steals.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENT - BYU

SCOUTING BYU

BYU opened the season with a 67-62 home victory over Idaho Wednesday evening. The Cougars return a pair of starters from last season's squad in Emma Calvert and Amari Whiting. Whiting is BYU's leading-returning scorer after averaging 10.6 points per game last season. Whiting led the Cougars with 123 assists and 50 steals in 2023-24. Calvert, meanwhile, started in 13 games last season and averaged 7.4 points and 4.1 rebounds per game. BYU had three scoring in double figures in the season-opener with Delaney Gibb's 17 leading the way. Gibb and Whiting led the team with five assists each. Kemery Congdon and Calvert scored 12 and 10, respectively in the win.

The Cougars averaged 65.4 points per game last season while allowing 65.7 a contest. BYU shot 43.4-percent overall from the floor a season ago and hit over 36-percent from 3-point range. BYU had a plus-5.6 rebounding advantage last season and recorded over 100 more assists than its opponents. The Cougars did average 17 turnovers per game while forcing just over 12 a contest. BYU shot 62-percent as a team from the free-throw line in 2023-24 while posting a 10-5 record at home in the Marriott Center.

LAST TIME AGAINST BYU

LARAMIE, Wyo. (Nov. 28, 2023) – The Wyoming Cowgirls led for most of the contest Tuesday night and then withstood a BYU rally late on their way to an 86-74 win inside the Arena-Auditorium. It was Wyoming's first win over a Power 5 opponent since December of 2016 against Colorado. The Cowgirls led for over 37 minutes in the contest and closed the game on a 23-10 run in the final 3:49 after the Cougars took a 64-63 lead.

"After they took the lead there, I called a timeout to settle us down a bit and reminded the girls, 'hey, this is what we prepared for,'" said Head Coach Heather Ezell postgame.

"We knew they were going to have a run, but the teams we've played so far in the non-conference has prepared us for this moment. I thought the girls took that to heart and made that change right there and decided to make a run of our own."

The two teams started off trading buckets to open the game, but the Cowgirls (4-2) were very sharp, taking an early 12-6 lead. Wyoming led 16-10 at the first media timeout. After the timeout, the Cowgirls extended their lead up to as many as 11 multiple times in the frame before BYU (6-1) made a pair at the free-throw line to end the first and UW led 28-19 after one.

In the second quarter, both teams' offenses dried up in the early stages as both turned the ball over multiple times. Following the media timeout though, BYU was able to make a run and cut the deficit down to five before a Malene Pedersen corner 3-pointer got UW going again. The Cowgirls went up by 14, 37-23 with a little under three minutes to play in the half, forcing a BYU timeout. The Cougars ended the half with a three after the Wyoming lead was up to as many as 16 as UW led at the break, 41-28.

BYU came out in the third quarter and scored the first five as the Cowgirls opened the second half with three-straight turnovers. The Cougars continued to chip away as the frame went on and the Wyoming lead was down to 47-39 at the media timeout. Out of the timeout, a couple of Marta Savic layups got the lead back up to 12 but BYU would counter down the stretch of the quarter to make it just 55-47 after three quarters of action.

An Ola Ustowska 3-pointer opened the scoring in the fourth to get UW back up by 11. After a BYU hoop, a Tess Barnes corner three pushed the lead up to 61-49 with a little under eight to play. The Cougars would claw their way all the way back, however, and took a 64-63 lead with just 4:11 to play as UW called a timeout. It was BYU's first lead since early in the first quarter.

Following the timeout, a McKinley Dickerson driving layup pushed Wyoming back in front before another Barnes 3-pointer made it 68-64 with under three to play. UW wouldn't trail again from there as Dickerson scored nine of her 17 points in the final 3:49 of the contest. Another Dickerson layup through contact made it a six-point advantage after a defensive stop. After the Cougars got a pair of free-throws, Dickerson drained a 3-pointer the next time down the floor, and it was 73-66 with 1:38 remaining. With a foul away from the ball on Dickerson's make, UW retained possession and canned another three, Barnes' third of the night and it was 76-66.

"I thought that was the McKinley we saw from two years ago tonight. She just kind of took over a couple of times there and then I thought Tess at that look too, the confidence was very high. The way those two stepped up when we really needed them to was huge for us tonight."

Following another defensive stop from Wyoming, Dickerson made a pair at the line with 47.7 seconds left as BYU called a timeout. The Cougars made a jumper with 36.4 seconds to go and the Cowgirls called a timeout to advance the ball into the frontcourt. After Barnes made two at the stripe, BYU called its final timeout. From there, the Cougars got a couple of hoops and then kept sending the Cowgirls to the free-throw line, but the nation's No. 1 free-throw shooting team salted the game away from there.

The Cowgirls ended the contest with four scoring in double figures and were led by Pedersen's season-high 19 on 6-of-11 shooting, including a perfect 6-of-6 at the line. Dickerson shot 6-of-11 as well off the bench for her 17 while Barnes tied a career-high with 13 points. Allyson Fertig added 12 and along with Maren McKenna, led UW with five rebounds. Savic gave the Cowgirls stellar minutes off the bench, going for eight points on 4-of-4 shooting. Emily Mellema led the way with four assists in the win while Fertig and Kati Ollilainen had three each.

Wyoming shot 53.2-percent from the field and made 7-of-22 from 3-point range with five of those treys coming in the fourth quarter. UW finished the game 13-of-14 at the free-throw line and went 8-for-8 in the final minute. The Cougars shot nearly 54-percent for the game and hit 6-of-13 from beyond-the-arc.

The Cowgirls out-rebounded one of the nation's top-rebounding teams, 28-27 in the contest and pulled down 10 offensive boards as Wyoming enjoyed a 20-4 second-chance points advantage. UW also had a 48-38 edge in points in the paint and got 31 from the bench. The Cowgirls also turned the ball over a season-low eight times against BYU.

SERIES HISTORY AGAINST BYU

BYU leads the all-time series 50-22 and has a 26-8 advantage in games played in Provo. Wyoming's 86-74 victory last season in Laramie snapped a four-game losing streak in the series for the Cowgirls. UW last won in Provo in 2009, 57-55 in overtime.

HEATHER EZELL

University of Wyoming
Head Women's Basketball Coach

Heather Ezell will be in her second season as the head coach of the Cowgirls in 2023-24 after spending seven seasons on the UW staff, including three seasons as the associate head coach. In her inaugural campaign leading the Cowgirls, Ezell set a program record for wins by a first-year head coach with 23. Wyoming

finished second in the Mountain West and made an appearance in the MW Tournament Championship Game, as well as the Women's NIT. Ezell helped guide a trio of All-Mountain West student-athletes in Allyson Fertig, Malene Pedersen and Quinn Weidemann in 2023.

Fertig and Weidemann were both named to the All-Mountain West Team, becoming the first pair of Cowgirl teammates to be named to the all-league team since 2018-19. Weidemann was also named to the league's All-Defense Team while Pedersen was named the Mountain West Freshman of the Year.

In her first seven seasons with the program as an assistant, the Cowgirls won 130 games, including a run of three-straight 20-plus win seasons from 2017-19 and a Mountain West Tournament title and NCAA Tournament appearance in 2020-21. UW has played in the postseason five times (4 WNIT, 1 NCAA) with Ezell on staff, has had 18 All-Mountain West performers and 48 MW Scholar-Athletes.

She came to Wyoming after spending four seasons at Southeast Missouri State. She joined the staff in 2011 and was responsible for working with the guards along with organizing practices, game day preparation and running summer camps. In 2012-13, she helped mentor Kara Wright to an Ohio Valley Conference All-Newcomer selection, marking the first Redhawk to earn postseason honors since the 2008-09 season.

Ezell spent the 2010-11 season as an assistant coach at Fairfield University, where the Stags posted a 17-13 overall record and a 10-8 mark in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. She worked primarily with perimeter players while assisting in the day-to-day operations of the program, including practice and game planning, recruiting and coordinating the team's community service efforts.

Ezell had a highly decorated career both collegiately and professionally which began as a four-year letterwinner at Iowa State University (2005-09). She finished her career tied for the Cyclones' career record with 287 made three-point field goals and finished 10th in program history with 1,339 points. In her senior season, Ezell earned Second Team All-Big 12 honors. She ranked 27th nationally with 2.5 three-point field goals made per game and eighth in the Big 12 with 3.5 assists per contest. Ezell also earned a spot on the 2008 Big 12 All-Tournament Team and helped the Cyclones to three NCAA appearances including the Elite Eight in 2009.

Ezell moved onto the professional level in 2009-10, playing in Iceland for Haukar where she was named Best Player in the Iceland Express League. She led the league in points and steals while finishing second in assists and rebounds. She also earned Most Valuable Player recognition in the league's All-Star Game.

A native of Springfield, Mo., Ezell led her Kickapoo High School team to two state championships and a 113-7 record during her prep years. She was named Miss Show Me Basketball as Missouri's top player in 2005. Ezell graduated from Iowa State in 2009 with bachelor's degrees in management and marketing.

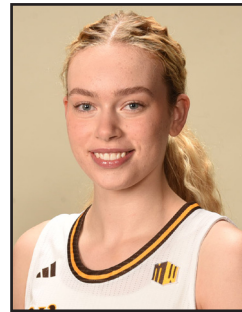
