MARK BRANCH 18TH SEASON - HEAD COACH



Mark Branch enters his 18th year with the program. He has taken Wyoming wrestling to new heights in nearly two decades at the school.

Branch's resume includes a record 151-94, making him the winningest head coach in program history. He has coached two NCAA finalists, 18 All-Americans, 85 NCAA qualifiers and 29 conference champions. On the team side of things, Branch was named 2018 Big 12 Coach of the Year and guided the Pokes to six team conference championships.

The 2024-25 season saw Branch help guide Joey Novak to a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships and an All-American honor. Novak was joined by four other Cowboys who punched an NCAA ticket, one of which was freshman Eddie Neitenbach. He represented the third consecutive year where a Cowboy freshman has advanced to NCAAs, making Wyoming one of only two programs to accomplish such a feat. On the team side of things, the Pokes finished 22nd at NCAAs, the eighth top 25 of the Branch era. Wyoming went 12-6 in duals, winning seven of their final eight, and were a perfect 5-0 at home. The victory over Drexel at the NWCA Duals made Branch the winningest head coach in program history and it was also the largest comeback in school history, rallying from 14-0 down to win 20-18. Wyoming was 4-0 in duals decided by three points or fewer, the most such wins in a single season in program history. The Cowboys finished 10th at the Big 12 Tournament.

The 2023-24 season saw the Pokes bounce back in a big way. They went 7-7 in duals and finished in a tie for seventh at the Big 12 Tournament. Seven of the 10 Cowboys outperformed or finished on their seed line. Jore Volk headlined the group, winning his first Big 12 title as the No. 5 seed at 125 pounds. Volk wasn't done as he earned All-American status with a seventh-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Gabe Willochell and Joey Novak also qualified to the Championships and each of them pulled a pair of upsets, helping the Cowboys finish 33rd as a team.

The 2022-23 season saw Branch and the Cowboys peak at the right time, coaching five Cowboys to top-eight finishes at the Big 12 Tourney, which qualified three athletes for the NCAA Championships. Branch trained and coached Volk to an outstanding true freshman season, while also helping Jacob Wright and Cole Moody cap off their Cowboy careers with an NCAA Championship appearance.

The 2021-22 season saw Branch vault to second on the all-time wins list with 131, surpassing Steven Suder to sit only behind Everett Lantz. Branch coached four Cowboys to the NCAA Championships and came away with one All-American and Wyoming's first top-25 finish at NCAAs in four seasons. Branch coached Stephen Buchanan (197) to a third-place finish and his second straight All-American award.

The 2020-21 season saw Branch lead the Cowboys to a historic postseason. The Cowboys had a record-tying fourth-place finish at the Big 12 Tournament while scoring a record-breaking 105.5 team points. The Big 12 Tourney was highlighted by four Cowboys appearing in the title bout. For only the second time in his tenure at Wyoming, Branch sent seven wrestlers to the NCAA Championships. While there, Branch produced Wyoming's 36th All-American in Buchanan (197) who placed eighth.

The 2019-20 season saw Branch lead five more Cowboys to qualification to the NCAA Championships as Buchanan, Brian Andrews, Montorie Bridges, Hayden Hastings and Tate Samuelson all received bids to the championships that were to be held in Minneapolis, Minnesota but were cancelled due to COVID-19. Andrews became the third Cowboy to win a Big 12 title since the Pokes joined the league in 2016. He was also just the 12th student-athlete in program history to win the crown at heavyweight. Andrews upset three higher-ranked opponents during his run and won two overtime bouts.

The 2018-19 season saw Branch guide seven Cowboys to the NCAA Championships for the first time since 2013, which also tied the most qualifiers in a season in the Branch era. During the dual season, the Cowboys racked up 16 wins for the first time under Branch, as well, despite fielding a lineup consisting of just three returning starters from a season ago. The Pokes' 16 dual wins in a season were the most since winning a school-record 17 in 1966-67. During the dual campaign, the Cowboys reached as high as No. 8 in the national rankings and took down No. 4 NC State—the highest-ranked dual win in recorded history. Branch also coached Bridges to his first Big 12 title bout appearance.

The 2017-18 season saw Branch get named Big 12 Wrestling Coach of the Year. The Cowboys went 13-3 overall with a 7-2 mark against conference foes. The Pokes' 13 dual wins were the fourth-most in a season in program history. Wyoming finished fourth at the Big 12 Tourney as seniors Archie Colgan and Bryce Meredith were awarded the program's first two Big 12 individual titles. At the 2018 NCAA Championships, Meredith was able to claim national runner-up at 141 pounds for the second time in his career while Bridges earned All-American honors for the first time in his career. As a team, Wyoming tallied its best finish under Branch as the Cowboys placed 17th. It was the 20th top-25 finish and third in a row for the Pokes.

The 2016-17 season saw Branch and Wyoming finish fifth at the Big 12 Tournament following a 7-3 overall dual record and 4-4 mark in conference action. Branch led five Pokes to the NCAA Championships. Meredith became Wyoming's second finalist at Big 12s, while Drew Templeman, Branson Ashworth, Cole Mendenhall and Archie Colgan joined Meredith at the Championships. It was the first trip to NCAAs for Mendenhall, Colgan and Ashworth. The Cowboys brought home their 19th top-25 finish as they tied for 21st at the NCAA Championships. Led by Meredith, the junior earned his second consecutive All-American award.

Meredith finished fourth at 141-pounds. His fourth-place finish was the 16th top-four finish for a Poke at NCAAs. The Cowboys placed seven team members on the 2017 Academic All-Big 12 Wrestling team. Meredith, Tanner Miller, Luke Paine, Kyle Pope and Brandon Tribble earned first-team honors, while Templeman and Nate Shaw earned second-team recognition.

The 2015-16 season saw Branch lead the Pokes to a 6-6 overall dual record in its first season as a member of the Big 12 Conference. He guided three competitors to the NCAA Championships. Tanner Harms earned his second trip to NCAAs, while Meredith and Templeman made their first trips for Wyoming. Meredith fell in the 141-pound final's match but became the first Cowboy to wrestle in the finals since Reese Andy in 1996.

The 2014-15 season saw Branch and the Pokes go 11-4 overall, which included a seven-dual win streak. Branch led six Cowboys to the NCAA Championships and had nine wrestlers earn All-WWC honors. He also guided Shane Woods to his third NCAA West Regional/WWC Championship.

The 2013-14 season saw Branch help guide the Pokes to a WWC regular-season title. The Cowboys knocked off No. 19 North Dakota State in the season finale to win the crown. In tournament action, UW brought home two Reno Tournament of Champions titles and placed two at the Las Vegas Invitational. Beginning the postseason in the West Regional, Wyoming claimed three more crowns to up Branch's total to 23 in six seasons. The Pokes were second in the event, as the squad placed first or second in each of the previous six years. Currently, 45 Cowboys have been named to the All-WWC squad. Four Pokes earned bids to the NCAA Championships, bringing the head man's total to 31 over six years.

The 2012-13 season saw Branch and the Pokes go 9-6 and 4-1 in the WWC. They claimed a conference crown with four conference champions – McCade Ford, L.J. Helbig, Shane Woods and Alfonso Hernandez. Wyoming went 9-6 overall in duals.

The 2011-12 season saw Branch help Joe LeBlanc cap off a stellar career, as he earned four All-American honors, the first wrestler in school history to do so. The Pokes finished 19th at the NCAA Championships, the first top-20 finish since 1996. The dual season was a successful one, as the Cowboys were 10-3, which included a 6-0 mark in WWC action. Wyoming won its third-straight West Regional tournament team title, as four Cowboys won crowns.

The 2010-11 season saw Branch and Wyoming win its second consecutive West Regional title with five individual champions. Branch was named Western Wrestling Conference Coach of the Year for a second time in his career. Branch also helped six Cowboys earn tickets to the NCAA Championships. Shane Onufer (165) and LeBlanc (184) reeled in All-America awards by placing fifth and sixth, respectively, leading Wyoming to a 28th-place team finish. The Cowboys compiled an 11-7 dual mark and a 5-1 record in the WWC.

The 2009-10 season saw Branch direct the Cowboy wrestlers to the West Regional team title over 24-time defending champion Northern Iowa. The come-from-behind championship was Wyoming's first-ever West Regional team title and the Cowboys first tournament conference championship since 1992. Four Wyoming wrestlers went to the NCAA Championships, as LeBlanc went on to finish fourth at the event to earn his second All-America accolade and was named the WWC Wrestler of the Year. The Cowboys finished 33rd and Branch was named the 2010 West Region Coach of the Year. Wyoming also had a successful dual season in, claiming the WWC regular-season dual title for the second-straight year with a record of 12-3 and a WWC mark of 6-0.

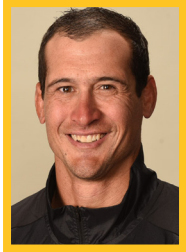
On July 14, 2008, Branch was selected as the 14th head coach in the history of University of Wyoming wrestling. Branch's first season guiding the Cowboys (2008-09) signaled an immediate turnaround for the program. The Pokes earned a share of the WWC regular-season dual title with a 5-0 record. At the West Regional Tournament, Wyoming finished second with four champions and sent four Cowboys to the NCAA Championships. LeBlanc finished fifth to become the first freshman in program history to earn All-America honors. Branch was named WWC Coach of the Year, the West Region Coach of the Year by D1CW and the Top Rookie Coach in the nation by Amateur Wrestling News. Branch also oversaw a squad which earned nine All-WWC honors, the most of any WWC member institution. He was nominated by his peers to be a part of the 2009 National Wrestling Coaches Association Leadership Academy Class.

Branch came to Wyoming from Oklahoma State where he was the associate head coach for six years, as well as a four-time NCAA finalist as a student-athlete. He was part of five NCAA team championships as a coach and student-athlete at OSU. As a college wrestler, Branch was a member of the Cowboys' 1994 NCAA Championship team, and served on the coaching staff for OSU's 2002, 03, 04 and 05 NCAA titles. While competing for OSU, Branch was a four-time NCAA All-American (1994-97), four-time NCAA national finalist (1994-97), two-time NCAA national champion at 167 pounds (1994 and 97) and a two-time national freestyle All-American (1998 and 99). In 1997, he was named the Big 12 Athlete of the Year, OSU Student-Athlete of the Year and the top graduating senior for OSU wrestling. He was a four-time NWCA Academic All-American, received an NCAA postgraduate scholarship and a Big 12 post-graduate scholarship.

As a member of the Oklahoma State coaching staff, Branch was named the NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2004. He helped coach OSU to seven Big 12 titles, four NCAA Championships and three Dual Team Championships. He was named the Associate Head Coach at OSU in 2002. He coached 57 All-Americans and 16 NCAA champions.

Branch earned his bachelor's degree in secondary education from Oklahoma State in 1997 and earned his master's degree in athletic administration from OSU in 2000. He's a native of Newkirk, Oklahoma. Branch is married to former Miss Alysia Paulson and they have four children Calvin Germinaro, Maggie Branch, Charlie Germinaro and Mason Branch.

MCCADE FORD - 12TH SEASON ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH



McCade Ford enters his 12th season as an assistant coach. He spearheads the recruiting efforts and primarily works with Wyoming's light and middleweights. In Ford's time as a coach, Wyoming has produced two NCAA finalists, 10 All-Americans, 54 NCAA qualifiers and six conference champions.

The 2024-25 season saw Wyoming finish 22nd at the NCAA Championships following a 12-6 dual season. Joey Novak (197) captured an All-American honor with a fifth-place finish. Four other Pokes punched a ticket to NCAAs, as well.

The 2023-24 season saw Ford help Jore Volk (125) capture a Big 12 title along with All-American status at the NCAA Championships. Gabe Willochell (149) and Novak (197) also made it to NCAAs, both logging a pair of wins once there.

The 2022-23 season saw Volk place fifth at the Big 12 Tournament and qualify for his first NCAAs. Jacob Wright (157) capped his career with a third-place finish at the conference tourney and another Championships appearance. Cole Moody (165) also punched a ticket to NCAAs.

The 2021-22 season saw an All-American in Stephen Buchanan (197) who finished third at the NCAA Championships. That was the tip of the spear where a total of seven Pokes made it to NCAAs, as Wyoming logged a 23rd-place finish.

The 2020-21 season saw the Cowboys finish fourth at the Big 12 Tournament with a record number of four Pokes competing in the title bout. Ford was also instrumental in Buchanan's run to becoming the 36th All-American in program history.

The 2019-20 season saw Brian Andrews (HWT) win a Big 12 title. Wyoming sent five to an NCAA Championships that was cancelled due to COVID.

The 2018-19 season saw the Cowboys boast a 16-4 dual record and a 7-2 mark against Big 12 opponents. The Pokes' 16 dual wins were the most during head coach Mark Branch's time and marked the highest dual win total by a Wyoming team since 1967. Ford helped oversee seven Cowboys qualifying for the NCAA Championships, which also tied the most in the Branch era.

The 2017-18 season saw Wyoming go 13-3 in duals and 7-2 against the Big 12. The Pokes' 13 dual wins go down as the fourth-most in a season in program history. At the Big 12 Tournament, seniors Archie Colgan and Bryce Meredith earned the program's first two Big 12 individual titles, on the way to a fifth-place team finish. At the 2018 NCAA Championships, Meredith was able to claim national runner-up at 141 pounds for the second time in his career while redshirt freshman Montorie Bridges earned All-America honors for the first time in his career. As a team, Wyoming tallied its best finish under Branch, as the Cowboys took 17th.

The 2016-17 season saw Wyoming finish fifth at the Big 12 Tournament after going 7-8 in duals and 4-4 in conference action. Five Pokes advanced to the NCAA Championships. Meredith became Wyoming's second finalist at Big 12s, while Drew Templeman, Branson Ashworth, Cole Mendenhall and Archie Colgan joined Meredith at NCAAs. The Pokes brought home their 19th top-25 finish, tying for 21st at the Championships. Led by Meredith, the junior earned his second consecutive All-American award, finishing fourth at 141 pounds. His fourth-place finish was the 16th top-four finish for a Cowboy wrestler at NCAAs. The Cowboys placed seven team members on the 2017 Academic All-Big 12 Wrestling team.

The 2015-16 season saw the Pokes go 6-6 in duals in their first season as a member of the Big 12 Conference. Three made it to the NCAA Championships. Tanner Harms earned his second trip to NCAAs, while Bryce Meredith and Drew Templeman made their first trips. Meredith fell in the 141-pound final's match but became the first Cowboy to wrestle in the title bout since Reese Andy in 1996.

The 2014-15 season saw Wyoming possess an 11-4 dual record and that encompassed a seven-dual win streak. Six Cowboys advanced to the NCAA Championships in what was the Pokes final year in the Western Wrestling Conference.

Ford is a former Wyoming wrestler. He helped the Pokes win the Western Wrestling Conference team title with his 141-pound crown as a senior. He was a very accomplished wrestler in junior college, as well, becoming a two-time NJCAA All-American at Northwest College.

Ford is a 2013 graduate of Wyoming, attaining a bachelor's degree in sociology. In 2019, Ford received his master's degree from Wyoming in educational administration.

BRANSON ASHWORTH - 6TH SEASON ASSISTANT COACH



Branson Ashworth enters his sixth season as an assistant coach. He spearheads most of the operations of Wyoming wrestling and primarily works with the middle and heavyweights. In Ashworth's time as a coach, Wyoming has produced four All-Americans, 22 NCAA qualifiers and two Big 12 Champions.

The 2024-25 season saw Wyoming finish 22nd at the NCAA Championships following a 12-6 dual season. Joey Novak (197) captured an All-American honor with a fifth-place finish. Four other Pokes punched a ticket to NCAAs, as well.

The 2023-24 season saw Jore Volk (125) capture a Big 12 title along with All-American status at the NCAA Championships. Gabe Willochell (149) and Novak (197) also made it to NCAAs, both logging a pair of wins once there.

The 2022-23 season saw Volk place fifth at the Big 12 Tournament and qualify for his first NCAAs. Jacob Wright (157) capped his career with a third-place finish at the conference tourney and another Championships appearance. Cole Moody (165) also punched a ticket to NCAAs.

The 2021-22 season saw an All-American in Stephen Buchanan (197) who finished third at the NCAA Championships. That was the tip of the spear where a total of seven Pokes made it to NCAAs, as Wyoming logged a 23rd-place finish.

The 2020-21 season saw the Cowboys finish fourth at the Big 12 Tournament with a record number of four Pokes competing in the title bout. Ashworth was also instrumental in Buchanan's run to becoming the 36th All-American in program history.

While coaching the Cowboys his first couple of seasons, Ashworth also competed on the freestyle circuit. He picked up an impressive win over Dan Vallimont at the Summit 1 freestyle event. At the Last Chance U.S. Olympic Trial Qualifiers, Ashworth went 3-3 with a win over the No. 1 seed.

Ashworth is a 2019 graduate of Wyoming. He enjoyed a decorated career as a Poke, finishing his career with 121 wins, which ranks sixth all-time in program history. Ashworth also made three trips to the NCAA Championships. Ashworth graduated with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice and a minor in sociology.

JOSH HEIL - 1ST SEASON ASSISTANT COACH



University of Wyoming wrestling head coach Mark Branch announced an addition to his coaching staff on Friday. Josh Heil is joining the Wyoming wrestling program as an assistant coach.

"Walking into this situation with a really solid team and an awesome coaching staff, I'm looking to make an instant impact and help propel the program to the next level," Heil said. "There is a ton of momentum coming off of two consecutive years with an All-American, and on top of that an announcement for a new wrestling facility."

Heil arrives in Laramie from Campbell where he was assistant coach each of the last three seasons. He helped the Fighting Camels capture a SoCon regular-season title in 2024 and coached a total of eight NCAA qualifiers and one All-American over his three years.

Heil was an All-American himself as a student-athlete at Campbell at 141 pounds. He was a five-time NCAA qualifier – three as a 141-pounder and twice as a 149-pounder – and a three-time SoCon champion. He accumulated over 100 wins in his Fighting Camel career.

Heil is originally from Brunswick, Ohio. His brother, Dean, is also in the collegiate coaching ranks as an assistant at George Mason.

Heil will primarily work with Wyoming's light and middleweights. The Pokes welcome back four NCAA qualifiers – Gabe Willochell (149), Jared Hill (157), Eddie Neitenbach (184) and Joey Novak (197) – and one alternate, Cole Brooks (141), ahead of the 2025-26 season.

"Joining the Wyoming wrestling family is a great opportunity," Heil said. "I'm excited for the future for my wife and I. She's been very supportive, as we made the decision to move across the country to be part of this great program."

UNIVERSITY OF WYOMING ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME WRESTLING INDUCTEES

The University of Wyoming Athletics Hall of Fame was established in 1993, in order to honor individuals and teams who have brought honor and distinction to the Intercollegiate Athletics Department of UW over its long and storied history.

The inductees must fit into one of five categories: student-athlete, coach, team, athletics staff members or special achievement. Special achievement includes individuals who have contributed to the ideal of sports at the University. Each nominee must receive at least 75 percent of the committee's vote to be eligible for induction.

Dick Ballinger (1958-60) - Class of 1993

Dick Ballinger is the only wrestler in University of Wyoming history to win an NCAA championship. A native of Cody, Wyo., Ballinger won the 1960 NCAA Wrestling championship at 167 pounds. During his outstanding career he was named an All-American three times. He placed second in the 1958 NCAA Championships and fourth in the 1959 NCAA Championships. Ballinger guided Wyoming to a sixth-place national team finish in 1959 and a Wyoming all-time best third-place team finish in the 1960 NCAA Championships.

Dr. Everett D. Lantz (1937-65) - Class of 1994

Everett Lantz served Wyoming wrestling for 25 years as head coach, the longest tenure of any coach in the UW history. Over that period, Lantz compiled a 141-75-9 dual record, 11 Skyline Conference championships and two WAC titles. His teams won eight titles in a row from 1955 to 1962. He notched seven top-15 NCAA finishes, including a third-place national showing in 1960, the best in team history. Lantz was named the NCAA Wrestling Coach of the Year in 1960. He coached six NCAA place-winners, 10 three-time conference champions and 30 other conference winners.

1959-60 team - Class of 2003

The 1959-60 Wyoming Cowboys became the first and only wrestling team in school history to finish in the top five at the NCAA Wrestling Championships. The Pokes won the Skyline Conference and finished the season with an 11-1 dual record. The team boasted five conference champions and seven Cowboys competed at the 1960 NCAA Wrestling Championships where UW came only 13 points away from the title, finishing third. Dick Ballinger won the national championship at 167 pounds, Jerry Frude finished second at 147 pounds and Dave Hansen placed third at 123 pounds, all earning All-American honors. Wyoming head coach Everett Lantz earned 1960 NCAA Coach of the Year honors from the National American Wrestlers Association.

Reese Andy (1993-96) - Class of 2004

Reese Andy was a three-time NCAA All-American. Wrestling at 177 pounds, he placed second nationally in 1994, sixth in 1995 and second in 1996. He was a three-time Western Athletic Conference champion and was named Outstanding Wrestler in the conference three straight years (1994-96). Andy's overall record at Wyoming was 110-29, and he compiled a record of 38-4 in his senior season.

Joe Dowler (1973-87) - Class of 2005

In his 14 seasons as head wrestling coach at Wyoming, Joe Dowler led the Pokes to a 104-64-1 dual record while capturing four straight Mountain Intercollegiate Wrestling Association (MIWA) Championships, and three Western Athletic Conference titles. Dowler coached 35 conference champions, two NCAA placemen, and two All-Americans at Wyoming. Named WAC Coach of the Year three times (1983, 1985 and 1986), he was a finalist for 1986 NCAA Wrestling Coach of the Year. Dowler was an Associate Athletics Director at UW from 1987-2001. Following his retirement, he initiated and coordinated the "W" Club for all UW athletic letterwinners.

Dave Myers (1989-92) - Class of 2008

One of Wyoming's only four-time conference champions, Myers won Western Athletic Conference titles at three different weights and represented Wyoming at the NCAA Championships four times. He was named Outstanding Wrestler of the WAC Tournament in both 1991 and 1992. He led the Wyoming wrestling team to conference championships in 1990 and 1992. In his senior year (1992) he earned All-America honors by finishing eighth at the NCAA Championships. He won 121 matches as a Cowboy, tied for sixth on Wyoming's all-time victory list.

Jerry Frude (1959-60, 1962) - Class of 2010

Jerry Frude was a two-time All-America, earning the honors in 1959 and 1960. In 1959 as a sophomore, he won the Mountain States/Skyline Conference title at 147 pounds and then went on to a second-place finish in the NCAA Championships, helping the Cowboys to a sixth-place team finish. He again finished second in the nation in the 147-pound weight class in 1960, while Wyoming finished third as a team. After sitting out a year in 1961, Frude rejoined the team in 1962 and was named co-captain. He won his second Skyline Conference championship at 147 pounds and won his first two matches at the NCAA Championships before falling to eventual national runner-up Kirk Pendleton of Lehigh. A native of Laramie, Frude was never pinned by an opponent during his college career. Wyoming's wrestling teams finished sixth (1959), third (1960), and 11th (1962) in the nation during Frude's time at UW and won the Mountain States/Skyline Conference team championship each year (1959, 1960 and 1962).

Dr. Robert Mason (1949-51) - Class of 2011

A high school football and basketball star, Bob Mason had never seen a wrestling match before he came to the University of Wyoming. After watching the sport and talking to wrestling coach Everett Lantz, he decided to join Wyoming's wrestling team. A native of Burns, Wyo., he won the conference championship in his first year of competition. Wyoming's first wrestling All-America, Mason placed fourth in the nation at 155 pounds in 1950. He repeated that feat in 1951 to gain his second All-America honor. In the Mountain States Conference, Mason won championships at 165 pounds in both 1949 and 1950 and, as team captain both years and led his team to conference titles in 1950 and 1951. At NAAs, the Cowboy wrestling team finished 12th in 1950 and 13th in 1951. Mason was a three-time letterwinner for the 'Pokes and earned his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Wyoming. He went on to a distinguished career as a high school and college wrestling coach and official and earned a doctorate in education from the University of Washington. He was inducted into the National Junior College Athletic Association Hall of Fame in 1980 and inducted posthumously into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2008. Mason died on March 18, 2000, at the age of 70.

Ray Sanchez (1967-68) - Class of 2012

One of the greatest Wyoming high school wrestlers in state history, Ray Sanchez came to the University of Wyoming after compiling an amazing record of 98-0 and winning four state championships at Cheyenne Central High School. He was a two-time senior men's National AAU champion in 1965 and 1966 and a two-time Great Plains National Champion representing Wyoming in 1966 and 1967. Sanchez was undefeated competing for the Cowboys' Freshman Team in 1966. As a Cowboy sophomore on the varsity in 1967, despite battling an elbow injury, Sanchez finished fourth in the nation at 115 pounds and earned All-America honors. Unfortunately, he suffered a back injury the following year and was forced to give up wrestling. He went on to a successful career as a teacher, coach and high school administrator.

Mike Hamel (1983-86) - Class of 2017

Wyoming's all-time leader in pins, Mike Hamel was a two-time Western Athletic Conference champion and a three-time Mountain Intercollegiate Wrestling Association champion. As a freshman, he was named to the Amateur Wrestling News Freshman All-American team and earned "Rookie of the Year" honors in the WAC. A two-time NCAA qualifier, Hamel won 12 tournaments during his time at Wyoming. He was the co-captain of the 1986 undefeated Cowboy wrestling team. He led the 'Pokes to WAC team titles in 1983, 1985 and 1986. Hamel was honored with the Admiral Land Award as UW's top student-athlete in 1986.

Steven Suder (1975-77, 1979 -- Wrestling coach, 1989-2008) - Class of 2018

Suder completed an outstanding career as a UW wrestler by earning All-America honors during his senior year of 1979. Wrestling at 150 pounds, Suder had an overall record of 62-37-2 as a Cowboy. He placed in the top four each year in the conference and was a team captain his senior year while placing at every major tournament in the Rocky Mountain Region. He returned to his alma mater as the head coach in 1989 and served in that capacity for nineteen years. He led Wyoming to two Western Athletic Conference team titles while being named Coach of the Year four times. He also earned NCAA West Regional Coach of the Year honors twice.

Wes Gasner (1983-84) - Class of 2019

An All American and two-time conference champion, Gasner had a remarkable two-year career at Wyoming, highlighted by his 6th place finish at the 1983 NCAA Tournament to win All-America honors. In 1983 and 1984, he logged two of the greatest seasons in Cowboy wrestling history, winning back-to-back conference titles at 150 pounds and qualifying for the NCAA Tournament both years. Coached by Joe Dowler, he earned 44 victories, including 19 pins, in the 1982-83 season while leading the Cowboys to a Western Athletic Conference Championship and a 10-2 dual record, and gained 45 victories in 1983-84. He won the Everett Lantz Most Outstanding Wrestler Award each of his two seasons. A native of Cheyenne, Gasner was awarded the Admiral Emory S. Land Award in 1984 as UW's top student-athlete.

Jon Cogdill (1986-90) - Class of 2020

An accomplished two-sport athlete, Cogdill was a long snapper and offensive lineman for the Cowboy Football team and wrestled at heavyweight for the Cowboy Wrestling team. As a wrestler, Cogdill was a three-time Western Athletic Conference champion, qualified three times for the NCAA Championships and was voted Outstanding WAC wrestler in 1990. He had a career record of 82-29-4 and was a member of three WAC champion teams. A native of Kemmerer, Wyo., he also lettered three years in football, was an important part of two undefeated WAC championship teams (1987-88) and played in two bowl games.

Team (1984-85, 1985-86) - Class of 2024

Hugh Lowham (1961-64) - Class of 2025

Hugh Lowham lettered four years for the UW Wrestling Team and helped the team to three conference titles (1961, 1962, and 1964). He was scheduled to redshirt his freshman year but Coach Everett Lantz asked him to give up his redshirt and compete to help the team. He ended up as the runner-up Skyline conference champion that year, and followed that up with three straight conference championships at three different weights. His sophomore year, he was the Skyline Conference champion at 177 pounds, his junior year he won the WAC championship at 191 pounds, and followed that up by winning the WAC championship title at heavyweight as a senior. Lowham left Wyoming with a degree in Engineering and began a distinguished career with the U.S. Geological Survey, later forming Lowham Engineering, a company specializing in water and environmental projects. Lowham has continued to be a strong supporter of the UW Wrestling program.
