## Yale Goes to Capital District

The Bulldogs are back in conference play this weekend with a set against the Capital Area squads. Yale takes on RPI on Friday at Houston Field House before heading to Achilles Rink for Saturday's game against Union. Both puck drops are 7 p.m. on ESPN+.

### BULLDOGS

Yale is coming off a 6-2 loss at No. 12 Boston College on Nov. 26 and had last weekend off to get ready for some ECAC play. Tyler Welsh, who had two points, and Justin Pearson had the Eli goals while Nicholas MacNab and Corbin Kaczperski combined for 24 saves at Conte Forum. BC had a 30-25 edge in shots and converted two of four advantages to keep its win streak alive.

### RPI

The Engineers (5-8-1, 2-4-1) ended a four-game winless string with a 3-2 victory over Canisius on Nov. 23. They are now coming off losses to UML (4-0) and Merrimack (5-1) last weekend.

### UNION

The Dutchmen (3-11-0, 2-4-0) play for the first time since Nov. 16 when Brown comes to town on Friday. Union earned a 2-1 win over Princeton in its last outing and has played in three straight one-goal games heading into this weekend.

### SERIES

Union has a 26-25-5 edge on Yale since the first game in 1991-92, the year the Dutchmen replaced Army in ECAC Hockey. The Bulldogs and Engineers first played in 1908-09, and RPI has a 56-47-6 lead.

### KEITH ALLAIN '80, YALE'S MALCOLM G. CHACE HEAD COACH

Keith Allain, the coach with the third-most victories in the history of the Yale program, whose position is named after the first captain in 1896, is the most successful mentor among the Bulldog bench leaders. Allain has a 2013 National Championship trophy along with two regular-season ECAC titles and a pair of conference tournament championships. His teams have also captured seven Ivy League Championships while making six NCAA Tournament appearances in his 13 seasons.

## CT ICE 2020

Yale has established a recent tradition with hockey in Bridgeport and the Webster Bank Arena. That trend, which includes playing and hosting NCAA Tournament games, continues with a Jan. 25 contest against Sacred Heart on the first day of Connecticut Ice 2020. The first-ever tournament for the state's four Division I hockey schools has the Bulldogs and Pioneers squaring off at 7:30 p.m., following a 4:30 matchup between Quinnipiac and Connecticut. The winners meet at 7 on the 26th, while the third-place game is 3:30.

## CLASS OF 2019

Three seniors from last year's squad are playing hockey this winter, but only one took a traditional path. Joe Snively, an All-ECAC forward and Washington Caps signee, is playing forward for the AHL Hershey Bears. Sam Tucker (G) and Andrew Gaus (F) may be breaking ground for Bulldogs as grad transfers. Tucker (BU) and Gaus (Colorado College) had a year of eligibility, so they took scholarship offers to play one more season. Of course, they are working towards new degrees, Gaus for a master's in teaching and Tucker in Metropolitan College's graduate program for financial management. The captain of the 2018-19 team, Anthony Walsh, is back in the program as the operations director.

## CLASSROOM

Yale MIH earned an NCAA Public Recognition Award for the 2018-19 academic year by having an NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate in the top 10 percent of all squads.
