Toledo CYO | BASKETBALL HIGH SCHOOL

Toledo CYO is a faith-based youth league for the Diocese of Toledo parishes and schools. Basketball is offered for third grade through high school. CYO has a developmental approach, focusing on fostering lifelong engagement and holistic development in sports, rather than emphasizing competitive performance alone. CYO emphasizes the long-term growth of student athletes, considering physical ability, mental, and social aspects. This is achieved by structuring our divisions into stages, which guide athletes through various stages of active participation, from learning the sport to having fun, maintaining engagement, and participating under the guidance of our Catholic faith and sportsmanship.

General Rules |

- National Federation High School rules will govern CYO leagues, unless stated otherwise. NFHS rule books may be purchased online at www.nfhs.com
- Scorebooks are kept by each team for each game, and the official book will be the book of the home team.
 - The home team is the second team listed on the schedule. *(Example: Christ the King at Saint Rose)*
- Lineups are to be submitted to the scorers' table with the team's full roster, starting lineup, and coaches' signatures.
 - Officials will record game-day scores and record on CYO game-day cards & team lineup sheet.

Pre-Game Procedures |

Pre-Game Conference

- The officials, coaches, and team captains will meet in front of the scorer's table to go over rules, sportsmanship, and the home team will provide the game ball.
 - The home team is the second team listed on the schedule. *(Example: Christ the King at Saint Rose)*
- Game roster and starting lineup will be verified, and updates/changes may still be made.
- **CYO All Play Rule** will be reviewed, and any "dressed" player who is not playing due to injury or other justification must be reported at this time to the officials and opposing team.
 - **Failure to Report** / Failure for a coach to report an injury or a justified reason for not playing a rostered player may result in a forfeit for the team and suspension for the coach.



Pre-Game Prayer |

- All teams will line up at center court to recite the “CYO Prayer” and Pledge of Allegiance.

Post-Game Procedure

- Postgame handshake to show sportsmanship and respect for the opponent and the game itself.
- Coaches from both teams are to review and sign the official scorecard and report the score and outcome of the game using the CYO League Score Submission Link.
- Coaches and players, we kindly ask that you clear your bench area immediately after the game. Please gather your belongings quickly so the next teams can prepare for their game.

Running Clock | Toledo Metro HS JV Boys only – running clock.

- Clock stoppage | The clock will only stop for the following:
 - For free throws/technical fouls
 - Team and official timeouts

Stopped Clock | Girls HS, Toledo Metro Varsity Boys, and Hearthstone League will play with a stopped clock.

- The clock stops for the following reasons on the referee's whistle: a foul, a timeout, or out-of-bounds plays “dead ball” play.

Standings | High School will have standings for the regular season

- Coaches from both teams are to report scores using the league/division Score submission link
- Standings will be updated weekly with or without updated scores/outcomes.
- Any controversy with the reported score, the CYO Office will refer to the official scorecard, with both coaches' signatures.

Timeouts |

- Regulation
 - Each team has five timeouts
 - Three 60-second (Full) & Two 30-second (Half)
- Overtime
 - One additional 60-second timeout is granted for each overtime period
 - Carryover - Unused timeouts from regulation can be carried over into overtime.



POST-SEASON TOURNAMENTS

Hearthstone Tournament | Hearthstone will host an end-of-season divisional tournament to determine the Donovan Division Champions and the Hoffman Division Champions. Participation in this post-season tournament is optional. The results of the divisional tournament will be used to determine seeding for the Diocesan Tournament, should a team choose to enter.

Toledo Metro JV Tournament | This is a postseason tournament for the JV division only. Participation is optional, and the tournament will take place during the Toledo CYO Diocesan Tournament. Teams that choose to enter this tournament will not be eligible for participation in the Ohio CYO State Tournament.

Tournament Fee: \$75

Behavioral Tournament Deposit: \$200

Toledo CYO Diocesan Tournament | Participation in the Diocesan Tournament is optional, and teams wishing to participate must register before the stated deadline. To be eligible, teams must compete in either the Hearthstone League or the Toledo Metro Varsity division during the regular season. **Teams entering the Diocesan Tournament must agree that, if they advance to the Final Four and become eligible for the Ohio CYO State Tournament, they will represent Toledo CYO and the Diocese of Toledo by participating in the Ohio CYO State Tournament. Teams will forfeit their tournament deposit if they withdraw from or fail to participate in the State Tournament.*

Tournament Fee: \$100

Behavioral & State Tournament Deposit: \$200

Toledo CYO Diocesan Girls Tournament | Participation in the Diocesan Tournament is optional, and teams wishing to participate must register before the stated deadline. To be eligible, teams must compete in the Toledo CYO Girls HS Division. **Teams entering the Diocesan Tournament must agree that, if they place in the top three and become eligible for the Ohio CYO State Tournament, they will represent Toledo CYO and the Diocese of Toledo by participating in the Ohio CYO State Tournament. Teams will forfeit their tournament deposit if they withdraw from or fail to participate in the State Tournament.*

Tournament Fee: \$100

Behavioral & State Tournament Deposit: \$200

Behavioral & State Tournament Deposit is required at the time of registration. Checks must be separated from the tournament fee, made payable to **Toledo CYO**, and will be secured in the Diocese of Toledo Safe (they will not be cashed).

Deposits will be returned provided there are no behavior issues involving coaches, players, or spectators throughout the tournament. Any incidents—including technical fouls, which will be reviewed—occurring before, during, or after games may result in the forfeiture of the \$200 deposit and immediate removal of the team from the tournament.

Ohio CYO State Tournament | A boys' and girls' high school basketball tournament featuring teams from the Diocese of Cleveland CYO, North Valley CYO (Cincinnati), and Toledo CYO. Each organization hosts the tournament once every three years. Toledo CYO last hosted in 2025.

Overtime | OT period in the Regular season VS OT period in Tournament play.

- Regular season will have one 4-minute OT period. If teams are still tied at the end of regulation and OT, the game may end in a tie.
- Tournament Play | Overtime periods will continue if teams are still tied at the end of regulation until there is an overall winner.



Standings | Will be updated weekly

- It is the responsibility of both coaches to report the final score of the game by using the provided CYO score submission link.
- Regular season standing will be calculated by winning %
 - Win = 1, Lost = 0 , Tie = ½
- Tie in standings
 - **For a two-team tie**
 - Head-to-head record: The team with a better record in games played against each other wins the tiebreaker.
 - Common Opponents: If the tie continues, teams' records are compared against common opponents, starting with the highest-ranked teams and then moving down the standings.
 - Points Allowed: The tie will be broken by comparing the total points allowed; the team that allowed fewer points will have the higher seed.
 - **For a three-team or more team tie**
 - Head-to-head record:
 - Common Opponents
 - Points Allowed
 - **If a tie remains**
 - Draw or coin flip: If all other tiebreaker rules fail, a random draw or coin flip is sometimes used to determine the final standings.

5 Seconds Closely Guarded	<p>An offensive player is holding or dribbling the basketball within 6ft of an opponent.</p> <p>A player can legally hold the ball for up to 5 seconds, dribble for up to seconds, and hold it again for up to 5 seconds before a violation is called. These actions cannot all exceed five seconds combined.</p> <p>The count continues even if the defenders switch.</p>

Running up the score doesn't teach good sportsmanship, player development, or competitive balance. Instead of challenging players, it can lead to complacency, disrespect, and a decline in skills, while also risking injury and demotivating the losing team. Proper handling of a blowout involves focusing on skill development and sportsmanship, often by substituting less-skilled players to give them game experience.

Team "Bonus" | The "bonus" refers to a penalty situation where a team that has committed a certain number of fouls in a quarter sends the opposing team to the free-throw line for fouls that would normally only result in an inbound pass.

- When a team commits its **fifth foul** in a quarter, the opposing team is in bonus, all common fouls result in two free throws, and the team's foul count resets at the start of each quarter.

Technical Foul | A penalty for unsportsmanlike conduct, rule infractions, or a non-contact violation by a player, coach, team, or spectator. All technical fouls will be recorded and reported back to the CYO office.

- **Players Conduct and Game Management Procedure**
 - ***First technical***
 - Removal from game – may remain on bench
 - Suspended for the next game
 - ***Second technical*** (of the season)
 - Removal from game – may remain on bench
 - Suspended for two games
 - ***Third technical*** (of the season)
 - Removal from game – may remain on bench
 - Suspended for the remainder of the regular season and postseason play
- **Coaches Conduct and Game Management Procedure**
 - ***First technical***
 - Ejected from the game and must leave the gym before the game can resume
 - ***\$50 Coaching Fine Paid to parish athletics***
 - Suspended for the next game and future games until the fine is paid and approved by the AD.
 - ***Second technical***
 - Ejected from the game and must leave the gym before the game can resume
 - ***\$75 Coaching Fine Paid to parish athletics***
 - Suspended for two games and future games until the fine is paid and approved by the AD
 - ***Third technical***
 - Ejected from the game and must leave the gym before the game can resume
 - ***\$100 Coaching Fine Paid to parish athletics***
 - Suspended for the remainder of the regular season and postseason play
 - Unable to attend the Ohio CYO State tournament in any capacity for that season
 - Must retake the Toledo CYO Coaching Class



Technical Foul | *Continued*

- **Spectator Conduct and Game Management Procedure**

If an official must stop a game at any time due to misbehavior from spectators or fans, an official timeout will be called. The officials will then address the issue with the coaches only. At that time, the officials will issue either a warning or a technical foul to the team associated with the misbehavior.

Officials should never directly address spectators. It is the coach's responsibility to communicate the warning or technical foul to their spectators and to ensure the behavior stops immediately.

- ***First Incident:***

The officials will stop playing and issue a warning to the coach regarding the spectator behavior.

- ***Second Incident*** (any spectator on that team):

A team technical foul will be issued. The coach must ensure the offending spectator is informed and removed from the facility.

- Spectator is suspended for two games

- ***Third Incident*** (any spectator on that team):

The game will be terminated immediately and recorded as a forfeit loss for the offending team, regardless of the time remaining or the current score

- ***If a spectator is removed from a game/gym twice in one season***

- The spectator is suspended for the remainder of the regular and postseason play. This includes the Diocesan and Ohio CYO State Tournament.

○

- **Post Game Code of Conduct**

Once the game has concluded, there is absolutely no reason for anyone to argue with or berate a referee, coach, staff member, or opposing parent. Anyone who approaches a referee, coach, staff member, or another spectator in an aggressive, threatening, or disrespectful manner **after a game** will receive an automatic suspension of **at least one (1) game**.

Coach & Player Conduct |

The CYO Official(s) oversee the game and have the authority to disqualify players, coaches, or spectators for unsportsmanlike conduct.

- This includes warnings and could result in immediate removal from the gym.
- Any coach, spectator, or player being removed will be removed from the gym for the remainder of the day.
- An official has the authority to stop a game, and if the individual refuses to leave, it could result in discontinuing the game and automatic forfeit for the team that the individual is representing.
- An official report will be made, and the player, coach, and/or team may be suspended after review by the CYO Administration/Office.
 - This includes damage to the property or misconduct with the building.



Violations and Penalties |

Violations of CYO rules and regulations shall subject a member parish/school to any or all, but not limited to, the following: censure, probation with competition, probation without competition, forfeiture, suspension, and expulsion

Good Sportsmanship |

As a coach and/or spectator, leading by example through sportsmanship means demonstrating respect, fair play, and positive behavior both on and off the court. This includes showing respect for opponents, officials, and teammates, as well as handling both victory and defeat with grace. By embodying these qualities, coaches and spectators inspire our young athletes to do the same, fostering a positive and ethical sporting environment.

MOST REV. DANIEL E. THOMAS

- Pope Francis appointed him Bishop of Toledo in America on August 26, 2014, and he was installed on October 22, 2014, as the current Bishop of the Diocese of Toledo.

MOST REV. LEONARD P. BLAIR

- He was appointed Bishop of Toledo on October 7, 2003, by Pope St. John Paul II and installed on December 4, 2003. Later, he was named the Fifth Archbishop of Hartford, CT, on October 29, 2013, and installed in the Cathedral of Saint Joseph on December 16, 2013.

MOST REV. ROBERT W. DONNELLY

- Bishop Donnelly was born on March 22, 1931, in Toledo, Ohio. He was ordained a priest on May 25, 1957, for the Diocese of Toledo. He was appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Toledo on March 14, 1984, and ordained Bishop on May 3, 1984.

MOST REV. JAMES R. HOFFMAN

- He was named the Sixth Bishop of Toledo on December 16, 1980, and installed on February 17, 1981.

MOST REV. JOHN A. DONOVAN

- He was appointed Bishop of Toledo on February 25, 1967, and installed on April 18, 1967. He resigned on July 29, 1980, due to health.

MOST REV. GEORGE J. REHRING

- He was appointed Bishop of Toledo on July 18, 1950, and installed on October 17, 1950. He attended all four sessions of the Second Vatican Council. He resigned on February 25, 1967, due to age.

MOST REV. KARL J. ALTER

- A native son of Toledo, he was appointed the Third Bishop on April 17, 1931, and consecrated on June 17, 1931. Later, he was appointed Archbishop of Cincinnati on June 21, 1950.

MOST REV. SAMUEL A. CARDINAL STRITCH

- He was appointed Bishop of Toledo on August 10, 1921, and consecrated on November 30, 1921. Later, he was appointed Archbishop of Milwaukee on August 26, 1930, and installed on November 19, 1930.

MOST REV. JOSEPH SCHREMBES

- He was named the first bishop of the diocese of Toledo on August 11, 1911. He held a position on the administrative committee of the National Catholic War Council during World War I. He was named bishop of Cleveland on September 8, 1921. He was given the honorary title of archbishop in 1939.
